And this month's DXAS will be a bit delayed while Fred Vobbe recovers from some nasty bug that put him in the hospital and caused his doctor to order him to take it easy for awhile. Makes my head cold of a couple of weeks ago (which caused a slight delay in the delivery of #18) minor stuff, but apparently nearly everyone has suffered from some debilitation this season. Hope the rest of you are healthy, or getting better!

Seems that the two TIS stations at Dallas-Ft. Worth airport are being reported nationwide. Gary Jackson in Sacramento, CA reported to Mike Hardester that after three hours of phone calls a possible verie signer address: Mr. Art Blair - P.O. Box 619428 - DFT Airport, TX. 75261. Power for each is apparently 60 (sixty) watts fed into 50-foot towers, according to Doug Smith and others. The story is that, after American Airlines was successfully sued for big bucks by a motorist who was injured in an auto accident while reading arrival/ departure signs enroute to DFW, AA dumped the signs and installed the twin TIS stations. I'm hearing on @1614 the 1590 station in Rolla, MO, KDAA, loud and clear from about an hour before sunset to the time that they pull the plug (usually in the middle of a song), and apparently it also is getting out quite well. Audio is slightly distorted, so John Tudenham and I suspect a spur, rather than a wholesale wandering of the transmission up the dial. Makes you wonder if engineers really pay attention to what's happening!

I mailed out only 761 DXN's for #20; we're 38 members short of what we were last year at this time, but still 21 ahead of the previous year. Some of the shortfall is apparently due to QST readers who joined for just one year to check us out and never renewed; some may be to rather poor DX conditions the past few months. At any rate, now is the time for NRC'ers to help us recruit new members. I'll send current copies of DXN to anyone that you recommend, and if you are attending a gathering in the near future and would like some copies of DXN to spread around, just let me know how many copies you need, a couple of weeks ahead of the event, and I'll send them out Printed Matter Rate.

DX Time Machine From the pages of DX News:

50 years ago ... from the March 1, 1947 DXN: Bill Stone, Toronto, ON reported that he had reports out to 2DU and 7BU, both 200-watters, as well as to HJCU, ZYG3, PRA8, PRH2, and PRB9; previously verified CX6-650 and CX16-850 were heard on the morning of Nov. 25 with election returns. (And thanks again to Kermit Geary for compiling the 50-year-ago reports, and to former NRC member/current DXAS member Skip Dabelstein for the long-term loan of his DXN's so that we can research the 25-year-ago happenings in the NRC.)

25 years ago ... from the March 4, 1972 DXN: Page Taylor and Russ Edmonds warned that XERPM-660, Mexico City, ran EE programming from 0330-0400, confusing some who were listening for KFAR, Fairbanks.

10 years ago ... from the March 2, 1987 DXN: The FCC was considering lifting restrictions on placing "K" and "W" calls west and east of the Mississippi River.

"I noted some very strong heterodynes - and, in some cases, audio - from Trans- Atlantic medium wave stations on the car radio during my drive home from work between 2230-2315 UTC

(5.30 to 6.15 p.m. EST) on Thursday, 27 FEB '97. France-1467, Algeria-549, Spain-1359, and several others were getting audio through and many of the other stations (especially from southwestern Europe and northwestern Africa) were QRMing the domestic 10 kHz multiple stations. Although the area through which I drove (Chelmsford/Carlisle/Billerica) is about 15 to 20 miles (24 to 32 km) from the ocean, the strength of the stations was quite good. As usual, open flat wetland areas near the Concord and Shawsheen Rivers offered the best reception. I almost thought I was on Cape Cod (where loud European signals at sunset are not unusual). The more northerly stations such as Ireland-567 and UK-1089 seemed to be weaker "per watt" than Spain, Morocco, Algeria, etc. That is not an uncommon condition. It was interesting that strong signals extended all the way from 531 to 1602 kHz. Many of the recent openings have been on one end of the dial or the other. I hope that some of you were listening on "real" equipment during this period. Best of luck and good DX to all." Mark Connelly, WAIION

A TASTE OF MOSCOW

Review of Moscow Information DX Bulletin # 54-55 (January-February ' 97) (Times - UTC, Frequencies - kHz)

This issue begins with article "BBC: 10 years without jamming" where is listed main facts from the BBC Russian service history and several opinions about past and present of BBC activity. Then we announce a great event in the history of Russia's DX movement: First Russia's DX Contest. Here are the details:

The Contest period from 00.00 MSK March, 31, 1997 till 00.00 MSK June, 1, 1997 (It will be summer time in Moscow when UTC=MSK-4). Everybody can take part in this contest. The program: you should listen to the broadcast stations which are broadcasting from the territory of Russia.

The whole band range is available between 150 kHz and 108 MHz in any mode: AM, SSB or FM. Every station in spite of the language of the program should be picked up at least 15 minutes and not more than one time on the same frequency. The report for the contest should contain the following: type of receiver and antenna, place of reception, your name and postal address, the sentence: "I confirm that I myself listened all these stations during the contest period. (Signature)". In the report you should list (it is desirable in table form): - frequency; - station name; - time of reception in MSK; - language of the broadcast; - signal quality using SINPO code; - program details. The count system: - the first reception of the station on LW, MW, SW gives 10 points; - the second, third, etc reception of the same station but on another frequencies and time gives you extra 5 points on LW, MW and 2 points on SW each time; - the first reception of the station on UHF located in the place of reception gives you 5 points, the same station but on another frequencies and time gives you extra 1 point each time; - the first reception of the station on UHF located outside your region gives you 25 points each time; (A second reception of the station on the same frequency doesn't take in account.) - inclusion of the station address, phone and fax numbers in your report gives you extra 10% to the points for this station; - inclusion of the full frequency schedule of the station in your report gives you extra 25% to the points for LW & MW reception, 50% to the points for SW reception, 10% to the points for UHF reception of this station. The participation fee is 5000 rubles or 2 IRCs for MIDXB subscribers or 15 rubles or 5 IRCs for the others. The report with the participation fee should be send before June 15 (according postmark) to the following address: Russia 125581, Moscow A-581, P.O.Box 65, c/o Vadim Alexeew, Club of DXers. The results will be published in the August edition of MIDXB.

Every participant will receive a certificate with the place and points. First five places will be awarded with WRTH-97, annual MIDXB subscription, annual subscription on our reference book "Broadcasts from abroad in the Russian language" and another prizes. Welcome to our competition!

Next in this bulletin we remind our readers about coming of the 40th anniversary of the Radio Budapest DX-show and inform about several events in connection with this. "Funny air" is our new trial heading. It shows funny moments which you heard on the air. In this issue we've resumed our regular heading devoted to the Russia's stations with the new name "Russia's air". In it this time: - Astrakhan: new UHF stations; - news from Vladivostok; - changes on 1332 in Krasnovarsk; - Voice of Russia new time for broadcast; - Radio Liberty relays; - full schema of Moscow air: - changes in "Radiostantsiya Samara"; - and another news. "Band news: MW-LW" includes: - ERF via Albania; - regular reception of Radio Varna; - Mothers of Battles Radio on MW; - Latvia again on 1539; - new programs relayed via 999 in Moldavia; - 3rd program of local Ukrainian Radio has broadcasts in Russian; - Estonian Radio again on 1566; - and another news. AREA CODES PART III - New codes for 1997

by Christopher R. Cuomo

In what is becoming a yearly tradition, several new area codes are being introduced during 1997. The increasing popularity of FAX machines, modems, and cellular phones, often combined with rapid population growth in certain areas of the country have caused a shortage of available phone numbers in many areas.

The changing of an area code requires extensive publicity to accustom phone users. PSA's will often be heard on radio stations in affected areas. It should also be a hot topic on talk radio.

Consult your long distance operator in the event of any confusion.

NPA stands for Numbering Plan Area, which is simply the geographic area using a specific area code. Keep in mind that in no instances (except in some sparsely populated Canadian provinces) does an NPA boundary cross a state or provincial border.

ARKANSAS

501 / 870 Split occurs April 14, 1997: Metropolitan Little Rock and the northwest portion of the state will retain area code 501. All other areas of the state including the cities of Texarkana, Jonesboro, Pine Bluff, El Dorado, and Helena.

CALIFORNIA

619 / 760 Split occurs March 22, 1997: Metropolitan San Diego will retain 619. The remainder of this oddly shaped NPA, will get the new 760 a.c. The 760 NPA includes Oceanside, Palm Springs, El Centro, Bishop, Barstow, Twentynine Palms, and Indio.

818 / 626 Split occurs June 14, 1997: The San Gabriel Valley -- Pasadena and all cities to the east -- will switch to a.c. 626.

415 / 650 Split occurs August 2, 1997: All of Marin County, plus the cities of San Fransisco, Brisbane, and Daly City will retain 415. All other areas of this NPA, including the cities of San Mateo, Palo Alto, and Menlo Park, will swich to a.c. 650.

714 / 949 Split date TBA: Southern Orange County, including the cities of Costa Mesa, Irvine, Huntington Beach, and Mission Viejo will switch to a.c. 949.

916 / 530 Split date TBA: Metropolitan Sacramento will retain 916. All other areas of this NPA which extends north to the Oregon border will switch to a.c. 530. The 530 NPA will include the Mount Shasta and Lake Tahoe regions, plus the cities of Chico, Redding, Susanville, Yuba City, and Yreka.

510 / 925 Split date TBA: I'm not sure of the exact boundary, but I am certain that all cities to the east of I-680 in Contra Costa County, plus all of Alameda County to the east of the Hayward Hills will be getting the new 925 a.c. This new NPA includes Concord, Walnut Creek, Livermore, and Pleasanton.

INDIANA

317 / 765 Split occurred February 1, 1997: The Indianapolis area retains 317. The remaining area including Richmond, Muncie, Anderson, Kokomo, Lafayette, and Marion now use 765. The remaining 317 area will be split again at a later date.

MASSACHUSETTS

617 / 781 Split date TBA: The boundaries of this split have not been determined. Expect the city of Boston to retain 617. Some bordering suburbs may also retain 617.

508 / 978 Split date TBA: The boundaries of this split have not been determined.

MICHIGAN

810 / 248 Split occurs May 10, 1997: Oakland County will switch to a.c. 248.

313 / 734 Split date TBA: Detroit and its inner suburbs like Highland Park, Hamtramck, and Dearborn will keep 313. The outer suburbs including Wayne, Livonia, Ypsilanti, Plymouth, and Ann Arbor will switch to a.c. 734.

NEW JERSEY

201 / 973 Split occurs June 1, 1997: Bergen and Hudson Counties retain 201. Morris, Essex, Sussex, and Passaic Counties will switch to a.c. 973. The 973 NPA will include Newark, Passaic, Patterson, Orange, Wayne, and Parsippany.

908 / 732 Split occurs June 1, 1997: Warren, Union, and Hunterdon Counties plus northern Somerset County will retain 908. Southern Somerset County, plus Middlesex, Momouth, and Ocean Counties will switch to a.c. 732. The 732 NPA will include Toms River, Long Branch, and East Brunswick.

OHIO

216 / 440 Split occurs July 5, 1997: Exact borders have not been determined, but Cleveland and perhaps some neigboring suburbs will retain 216.

SOUTH CAROLINA

803 / 843 Split date TBA: The Atlantic Coastal region will be switching to a.c. 843. Exact boundaries have not determined.

TEXAS

214 / 972 Split occurred September 14, 1996: Only the city of Dallas retains 214. The 972 NPA surrounds the city and includes a small portion of the city itself. The 972 NPA includes (clockwise starting with due north) McKinney, Plano, Richardson, Rockwall, Terrell, Ennis, Waxahachie. Irving, and Grande Prairie.

713 / 281 Split occurred November 2, 1996: I'm not sure of the boundaries here (local members?) but I believe the region within the I-610 beltway retains 713, while areas outside that highway loop now use 281.

817 / 254 / 940 Three-way Split occurs May 25, 1997: Fort Worth and Arlington will retain 817. All or part of the 23 counties to the south including the cities of Waco, Temple, Hillsboro, and Stephenville will switch to a.c. 254. The remaining northern section including Gainesville, Wichita Falls, and Mineral Wells will switch to a.c. 940.

210 / 830 / 956 Three-way Split occurs July 7, 1997: Metropolitan San Antonio will retain 210. All or part of 34 counties to the north including the cities of Uvalde, New Braunfels, Fredericksburg, and Kerrville will switch to a.c. 830. The remaining southern portion which includes the Rio Grande Valley cities of Laredo, McAllen, Harlingen, and Brownsville will switch to a.c. 956.

WASHINGTON

206 / 425 / 253 Three-way Split occurs April 27, 1997: Seattle and Richmond Beach, plus Mercer, Bainbridge, and Vashon Islands will retain 206. The Southern Tier including Tacoma, Auburn, Puyallup, Des Moines, and Kent will switch to a.c. 425. The Northern Tier including Renton, Bellevue, Bothell, Lynwood, and Everett will switch to a.c. 253.

WISCONSIN

414 / 920 Split occurs July 26, 1997: Metropolitan Milwaukee and areas south to the Illinois border, like Kenosha and Racine, will retain 414. All other areas will switch to a.c. 920. The 920 NPA includes Green Bay, Manitowoc, Appleton, Oshkosh, and Fond du Lac.

U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS

809 / 340 Split occurs Summer 1997: All cities will switch to a.c 340.

GUAM, AMERICAN SAMOA, and NORTHERN MARIANA ISLANDS

These U.S. territories in the Pacific Ocean will be joining the NANP during Summer 1997. The NANP, or North American Numbering Plan, is a treaty that groups the U.S., Canada, and various Caribbean islands under international direct dialing country code "1" and divides area codes between them. Each of the aforementioned U.S. territories will use their current country code as their new area code: Guam-671, American Samoa-684, and Northen Mariana Islands-670.

The recent profile on WWSW brought back memories to me, and I couldn'tresist Musing a bit about those Pittsburgh radio stations of the Thirties, the decade of my youth and first of many as a DXer. Mention was made of the studios WWSW had in the Hotel Keystone. Well, the only time in my life that I broadcast on the radio was there, where around 1936 I joined a group from my school to sing Christmas carols. It was one of those live broadcasts that all the stations liked to put on in those days. In the mid Thirties three of the five Pittsburgh stations had studio orchestras. WWSW had the Gloom Chasers, KQV the Blues Chasers, and KDKA the Strollers. And yes, WWSW was first to broadcast Pirate baseball [later joined by KDKA] via recreations of away games via tickertape. But KQV forced the issue on broadcasting home games when around 1938 they put a spotter on top of a roof across the street from Forbes Field and between innings described the action. [You could say they were pirating the Pirate games.] The ball club didn't like it and sued the station. KQV won and home games could be broadcast from within the park. WWSW and KQV were independent stations and thus rivals for years. Before going AN WWSW was on from 8:00 A.M. to 11:00 P.M. KOV had to share time evenings with WSMK. Davton, and in winter was off from 6:00to 7:30 P.M, on until 10:00 P.M., and then off for the night. In the summer they could stay on until 10:00. They did depend on phonograph records to fill in the gaps between the live programs. The disc jockies would go to a record store and bring back a stack of records to keep them going for a few days. They would buy a few and return the rest. The music stores didn't mind having their new releases played over the air. I once was sent by a Pittsburgh music store to the KQV studios to purchase some records I

wanted, and I bought them directly from the disc jockey. Does anyone realize that of the 5 stations operating in Pittsburgh from 1931 until after WW2 the call letters of 4 are same as then, [KDKA, WJAS, KQV, WWSW] and the 5th just a one letter change [WCAE to WTAE]. One last thing. In early 1937, WWSW's frequency, 1500, had 29 stations on the air at night after adjusting for sharetimers. Today, 1490 [1500's successor} has 191 in U.S. and Canada. WCAE's frequency, 1220, had 7, with only 4 of these on at night after eliminating a daytimer and 2 share-timers, Now, 1250 [1220's successor] has 63 stations including 3 daytimers. That's where the DX of the Thirties has gone! I'd better end this and give someone else a chance. Going to Athens, Greece for two weeks on Feb. 23rd.
