

From the publisher ... The NRC is publishing The National Radio Club DXAS AM List on a 3.5-inch floppy disk, PC format, primarily for sight-impaired DX'ers who plan to use voice-synthesized software to access the list. The AM List disk comes with a Code.txt file that has the codes for the various columns included. The disk is available to NRC/DXAS members only for \$6.00 postpaid from the National Radio Club Publications Center. The AM List contains Frequency, Call letters, State, City, Antenna, Day Power, Night Power, Additional Powers, Permits, Time Zone, and Stereo Operation.

From the pages of DX News:

50 years ago ... from the June 10, 1947 DXN: The "AM Switch" of its day consisted of three full-page lists of new stations, new calls, call changes, changes in power or frequency, location changes, and deletions .. "Broadcasting" raised its subscription and renewal rates. the latter becoming \$8.00 for two years.

25 years ago ... from the June 3, 1972 DXN: The NRC numbered about 600 members, nearly double the count from five years previous when publication of DXN came to Boston ... The NRC Night Pattern Book was to be sold for \$5.00, first-class mail.

10 years ago ... from the June 8, 1987 DXN: Peter Weeks, Fredericton, NB reported 1555-Cayman Islands with rock music on 4-16 at 0300.



MEDIUM WAVE RAMBLINGS

□ In addition to all the new U.S expanded-band entries in the FCC Data Base, there are 21! proposals for new stations in Mexico. Very interesting!?!

□ Shawn reports the water is going down and so far, the Axelrods are safe, and that "CJOB was on low power at night due to technical problems making 680 the frequency to try. Could null them out almost completely even though they are 10 miles from the house" plus CBW was off completely for an evening just so's he could bag a couple of newbies!; Thomas Reiser says he's heard the Bill Mack Trucking Show on WJR-760; Idaho buddy Frank Aden reports that KTIK-1340 (soon to be 1350) has "3 new towers up, triangle pattern, two on west side. They are very short, would guess less than 70 ft. Still on 1340 and using main tower which looks much taller than the new ones." Well, now. The FCC database shows their main (original) tower to be 364 feet (which I have eyeballed), while their numbers 2, 3 and 4 towers are to be 364, 201, and 190 feet, respectively from their site due south of Meridian; speaking of Boise, KBOI has an application in to make their pattern U3 with two major lobes at 015 and 255 degrees. If approved and implemented, reception of their signal "back east" will be next to impossible. Better get 'em now; along with his loggings rejoined member Jim Boehm (whom we welcome) sends his updated Graveyard lists. Yup. New records as seen later.

☐ I found this on the Canadian Broadcast Directory site on the Internet . . . some may find it humorous: "Toronto's 680 News is Smokin'! Seems Newsmaker 680 News was IN the news last Saturday night. According to an insider at the station, audio editor/reporter Jason Gennaro decided to cook a meat pie in the microwave, on a paper plate. - 650 WRPT MA Ashland This station is co-located with WKOX-1200, WJLT-1060, and a couple of FM's (I assume). Use the WKOX address as it seems the three are tri-plexed into the same towers. V/s is Carl Abrams, G.M. (RM-CT)
- 670 WVNS VA Clarmont 6/12 Presumed testing with OC this afternoon, off around 1830. (AM-VA)
- 790 WTAR VA Norfolk Per web page, station is now all talk, including the Tom Leykis Show, which has moved here from sister station WNIS-850. (DP-HI)
- 930 WBEN NY Buffalo 5/28 Adds "Coast to Coast with Art Bell" per show today. (DP-HI)
- 940 WCIT

 OH Lima "Newsradio 940" died today (6/3). They made the abrupt switch this afternoon, and are simulcasting sister station WLJM-104.9 "105 Jams" with UC music. I have it from a good source that the AM will be Urban from now on, but that the calls probably will not change. (FV-OH)
- 990 WALE RI Providence CP for U4 50000/5000 is on. Still doing SS religion at night as heard by Bruce Conti and Mark Connelly. (DG-RI)
- 1210 WPHT PA Philadelphia 5/28 Adds "Coast to Coast with Art Bell" per show today. (DP-HI)
- 1330 WASA MD Havre de Grace 5/21 1503 Is indeed the one playing nonstop classical, religious with absolutely no announcements heard in my monitoring since PT-NJ's report in No. 26. (DB-DE)
 - + 5/31 No, this is still // WWLG-1360, NOS daytime and SPT at night, as noted this evening. But I did hear WWRV-NY with one solid hour of religious

music with no breaks, and a brief legal ID on the hour. (SK-PA)

WYSN PA Somerset - 6/4 2040 - Noted with soft rock oldies, many mentions of 101.7 FM. Presumed to be this one, ex-WADJ, but no calls heard. (DB-DE)

1360 WWLG MD Baltimore - 6/2 2200 - Noted with One-on-One Sports through the evening. (DB-DE)

1370 WKFD RI Wickford - Station is silent, as owner ran out of money and is also ill. Calls "WEGM" were never formally applied for and the legal calls never used at the top of the hour. (DG-RI)

1410 WING OH Dayton - 5/28 - Adds "Coast to Coast with Art Bell" per show today; (DP-HI)

1440 WNPV PA Lansdale - 5/23 2158 - Noted with full-data sign-off at this time, to return at 0600. No longer 24 hours. (DB-DE)

1550 WCGR NY Canandaigua - 5/20 1200 - Previously reported frequency change to 1310 kHz. Actually, it is still operating on 1550 with same program as on 1310. Failed to check this before. (JR-NY)

PA Columbia - Has commenced broadcasting over the Memorial Day weekend, ex-WNZT, and IDing as "Vision 1580" with adult contemporary music. Owned by SABVI, which is part of the Susquehanna Association for the Blind. Program Coordinator Jay Doudna indicates that they will increase their programming directed to the blind and vision impaired, but probably will otherwise keep that general format. They will simulcast WPDC-1600 at night and on weekends starting at noon, and with WPDC's help, will cover western Lancaster County sporting events on 1580 only. Jay had very complimentary things to say about the DX Audio Service and Fred Vobbe in particular; we should be proud of our club's efforts in this area. Reports and

The opening bars of Jimmy Buffett's "Margaritaville" is followed by a telco-voiced Buffett, "Hi, this is Jimmy Buffett for the Florida Bay Research Radio." Also, Buffett's instrumental "Banana Wind" is used (on the cycle version monitored) over one segment. Possibly the only TIS with a request for 7111 Park Avenue . The Postheres listeners to fill out a survey (at the Key West Visitors Center, mile marker 106). They even offered "for a limited time" a nice, water-resistant fish ID guidebook for all who participate, which of course I did. (TLK*FL)

TIS KY Corbin (WPAB672) - 5/18 0218-0350 - Usually atop 2 other stations but a bit difficult to copy. Noted evenings 5/21 and 5/22 from 2100. Seems nightly at distance of about 150 miles from QTH in Marietta GA. Call as per QSL. (HH*GA)

TIS NC Bodie Island (KPC711) - 5/29-30 around 1800 - Poor at Buston, mixing with KPC755, better next day driving north on Rt. 12, Weak Pea Island, in and out going up the coast. Strong at Bodie Island Visitors' Center, later covered by KIE651 Eastern Shore Wildlife station in the Norfolk, VA area. (HH*NC)

TIS NC Ocracoke (KPC755) - 5/29-30 1455 - First heard at Cedar Island Ferry terminal at this time, where fair, strong at Ocracoke, poor at Buxton, spotty up Rt. 12. Both these stations for the Cape Hatteras National Seashore. (HH*NC)

TIS NC Raleigh (WNBR326) - 5/14 130 - Starting coming in approaching Raleigh; in the Durham area the Duke University station (WPHE255) was by itself. Atop about 18 miles to Raleigh. Raleigh-Durham Airport TIS station. (HH*NC)

TIS TN Benton - 5/18 0218-0350 - Pope County Chamber of Commerce station, usually unreadable under Corbin KY station, but popped atop channel for a minute or so. Also heard at other times. Carries information on Cherokee National Forest. Distance about 100 miles from QTH in Marietta GA. (HH*GA)



Another weak carrier on 1644.2, fading, and freq varying slightly occasionally, no idea what that might be. 120 meter Aussies were coming in OK but not exceptional, and 90m PNG stations were strong today. MONTSERRAT: Montserrat's Radio Antilles, which survived a hurricane eight years ago, will close at the end of May due to problems caused by the island's active volcano, the Caribbean News Agency reported on Friday. The Barbados-based agency, quoting a radio station official, said the board announced the decision to close to management and staff after a meeting on Wednesday. The official attributed the closing to financial problems and the difficulty of operating since the volcano forced the station to relocate. Staff at the station, which had relayed the Voice of America and the BBC to much of the Carribean, had managed to keep it operating in the months since the British island colony's Soufriere Hills volcano roared to life in July 1995. The station was forced to relocate from its base in the southern part of the island, considered most threatened by the active volcano, but was able to stay on the air and keep eight staff members working. Scientists last weekend raised the

island's volcano alert level after its activity increased. It remained at the "Orange" level in Friday. [Reuters World Service via Fleming May 27 in Cumbre DX]

- 530 TURKS & CAICOS RVC with religious program in SS 0238 on 3/28. Very good.
- 600 PUERTO RICO R. 600 Mayaguez with pop music and some news at 1615 on 3/29.
- 600 VENEZUELA R. Sucre, Cumana IDing at 0100 on 3/28, and then a religious program.
- 630 VENEZUELA R. Nacional de Venezuela, Caracas, with news, time check, safety warnings for travelers.
- 680 PUERTO RICO R. WAPA San Juan with religious program at 0104, 3/28. Ads for Toyota at 75 de Infanteria Avenue, Rio Piedras, timecheck, calls from listeners.
- 680 VENEZUELA R. Continente, Cumana, with a religious drame about the Israelites crossing the Red Sea. [Or Shawn Axelrod crossing the Red River! Jim]
- 700 COLOMBIA R. Net (Caracol Pacifico, Cali?) heard speaking about musicians and announcing a concert by the Bogota Symphony Orchestra at 0256 on 3/20. Only ID as "Radio Net" several times.
- 750 VENEZUELA R. Caracas Radio with some news and pop music, news from the Beatles at 0112 on 3/28; like a local station day and night.
- 760 COLOMBIA RCN Barranquilla, very good, ID as RCN at 1435 on 3/28, many ads, also world news; good.
- 770 COLOMBIA RCN Bogotá, with a religious program from Pereira at 0114 on 3/28. Very strong, same program heard on 760 but weaker.
- 780 COLOMBIA R. Almirante, Riohacha, at 0117 on 3/28 with a program of tangos, Alberto Castillo sings "Santa Lucia", then "Luna de Arrabal"; at 0119 another unID station came in with the music of Andalucia, "The Breeze and I" by Ernesto Lecuona, a Cuban composer.

- 830 COLOMBIA (HIJB off), I heard a station with an emotional speaker narrating for futbol (soccer) game with Colombia winning against Argentina six to four, at 0119 on 3/28. Another goal for Colombia at 0120; probably R. Deportes, Medellin. Finally won by Colombia, no ID heard.
- 830 ST. KITTS TBN, all EE with a religious program at 0015 on 3/29. No ID heard, but probably TBN. No one else speaks EE in the near area. [Except for a station in Nicaragua Jim]
- 850 PUERTO RICO "WABA La Grande" Aguadilla, IDed at 1658 on 3/29, announcing the death of a person in town to be buried in Aguadilla cemetery. Also ads for cars. Other ads for Aguadilla.
- 850 VENEZUELA "8-50 Fe y Alegria", Campo Mata, IDed this way at 0022 on 3/29. A move from 940? Good.
- 860 NETHERLANDS ANTILLES R. Curom, Willemstad, Curacao, with ads in Papiemento, good with R. Clarin off, at 1632 on 3/29.
- 870 DOMINICAN REPUBLIC R. La Vega in a net with news from all over the country. At 1428 on 3/28.
- 890 PUERTO RICO WFAB Las Piedras, many ads, announcing sales of houses in Villa Alvarez. Other real estate ads, some noises. At 1635 on 3/29.
- 900 VENEZUELA Mara Ritmos Novecientos, Maracaibo, ID at 0132 on 3/28, but their time was 0030 pm, pop music, Gloria Estefan sings, very strong.
- 940 VENEZUELA R. Punto Fijo, welcoming "los vacacionisas" to the Paraguana peninsula at 0135 on 3/28. Good, local R. Popular 950 off.
- 960 ARUBA R. Victoria, Oranjestad, heard with religious program in EE at 1424 on 3/28.
- 960 COLOMBIA Caracol Caribe, Magangue, Colombian news, good at 0025 3/29.
- 960 DOMINICAN REPUBLIC LV del Atlantico, Puerto Plata, heard relaying news about accidents on the highway during Holy Week with Monumental de Seguros, rarely heard from here.
- 980 COLOMBIA RCN Cali, relaying R. Santa Fe, Bogotá, 1070. Religious program describing a church and celebrations in the city of Popayan and the Porciuncula church. Talking with the people coming to the church, then went to Medellin, San Benito church, no ID heard, very strong.
- 1020 TURKS & CAICOS IS CCR, with religious program all in EE. Gave address in PA for free literature. Very strong despite R. COmercial 1010 on the air. No need to rotate the receiver, always strong in any direction; at 0148 on 3/28.
- 1100 COLOMBIA Caracol Barranquilla, with tennis and sports news mentioning Monica Seles and Stefi Graf. Program entitled "Cuarto de Hora Caracol", at 0305 3/30.
- 1140 VENEZUELA R. La Margaritena, with pop music, ID at 0308 on 3/30, but did not mention location. I think it must be Porlamar, Isal Margarita. Music by La Sonora Matancera, old Cuban music records. Good. No station listed for Venezuela on this frequency. Some good jokes. Announced 24 hours operation. At 0313 announced being on Margarita island, so this is a new station. [Has been on for several years Jim]
- 1160 DOMINICAN REPUBLIC Radiolandia, Santiago, pop music but also in on one of the networks relaying Holy Week traffic news, 1643 3/29.
- 1200 DOMINICAN REPUBLIC, unID station heard here very strong in Santo Domingo. No ID heard, as was (like many others) relaying news of accidents during Holy Week. I don't think it is R. Caracol, Azua, the only one listed here, as it is too weak. "Cadena de Noticias" heard at 1647 on 3/29.
- 1210 COLOMBIA Antena Dos, Cucuta, IDed at 0426 3/20 with boleros, Latin American music.
- 1210 VENEZUELA R. Universidad, Merida, students speaking about Human RIghts in the Americas; IDed at 0325 3/29. This seems to be a move from 1160.
- 1240 VENEZUELA R. Nacional, Antena Popular, with information about care of people in Holy Week, including institutions like Defensa Civil. Heard very well at 1408 on 3/28, did not mention location.
- 1240 PUERTO RICO W. WALO Humacao, with commentary on horse racing, at 1650 on 3/29.
- 1250 DOMINICAN REPUBLIC LV del Progreso, San Francisoc de Macoris, also with news about Holy Week accidents, relaying "Semana Santa Universal" at 1652 on 3/29.
- 1300 PÚERTO RICO R. Util WTIL, Mayagüez, ID at 1816 on 3/29, pop music and ads, with Radio off. Ads fro Garage Junior car repair in Mayagüez.
- 1350 VENEZUELA R. Falcon, Puerto Cumarebo, welcoming "temporadistas" coming to this town during Holy Week. At 1345 on 1328, ads for different concerns. Very good in daylight.
- 1360 PUERTO RICO, IDing as "Desde Camuy, Ciudad Romántica CHQ", WCHQ, with boleros and announcing "mas música", giving time as 10 pm. Also announced s/off, but no anthem

heard, just off at 0201 on 3/28, good.

- 1360 COLOMBIA R. Reloj, Barranquilla, with a long program with LA singers, old Latin American pop music, 0330 3/29.
- 1370 DOMINICAN REPUBLIC R. Seibo, seldom heard as it is very weak, but on the air now for Holy Week.
- 1380 COLOMBIA RCN relaying CNN Radio Noticias, very good, even though it did not ID anything but RCN at 0204 on 3/28, news from different places, including one from San Diego CA, about the mass suicide.
- 1400 COLOMBIA Antena Dos, speaking about futbol game in which Colombia beat Argentina, at 0208 on 3/28.
- 1410 UNID, "Radio Progreso, una radio para crecer" (A station to grow up), but did not herar anything else, do not know where it is. Instrumental music. Frequency usually covered by Radio Oasis in Santo Domingo.
- 1420 VENEZUELA R. Marabina, Maracaibo, ID at 0211 on 3/28, pop music after that.
- 1430 PUERTO RICO R. Tiempo, Caguas, IDed at 0212 on 3/28, then a pop song by Daniel Santos, a very popular Puerto Rican singer from the 30's, 40's and 50's. More pop music after this song, more boleros, but later it announced instrumental music on Good Friday.
- 1430 VENEZUELA "R. Bahia, la primera en sintonia", Puerto La Cruz, IDed this way at 0216 on 3/28. Very good, it announced the drug stores open for the whole night.
- 1460 DOMINICAN REPUBLIC R. Magua, Hato Mayor, heard back on the air at 1352 on 3/28, it changed name back to R. Magua from R. Renacimiento.
- 1500 VENEZUELA R. 2000, Cumana, with Venezuelan music, joropo, especailly with guitar and harp. "En Dos Mil las doce y diez minutos", ID at 0410. One of the melodies played was "Cosita Linda", a beautiful Cuban melody from the 50's.
- 1540 BAHAMAS R. Bahamas, Nassau, very good after nulling local Radio Oasis (belonging to Radio Cadena Comercial). Program was a speaker receiving telephone calls from listeners at 0221 on 3/28.
- 1550 VENEZUELA "Haciendo Radio Metropolitana 15-50", Los Teques, ID at 0407 on 3/30 at the end of a record.
- 1610 ANGUILLA Carribean Beacon, The Valley, very good, alone on the frequency with instrumental music at 0400 on 3/30. At this time started with a program entitled "Sunday at the Cathedral", much applause, whistles, and more music.

DX FILES: KRUEGER IN THE KEYS

- These logs were made during a trip, via auto, from my Clearwater home to Key West. Several specific monitoring sessions are designated at the end of each log (LONG KEY STATE RECREATION AREA, KEY WEST, etc.). All unspecified locations were mobile logs. All "common" Cubans are intentionally omitted from the logs.
- 580 CUBA Radio Rebelde, Sancti Spiritus; 13594 ID, good. (Krueger-FL KEY WEST 6/6)
- 590 CUBA Radio Musical Nacional, Santa Clara, Villa Clara; as I've previously noted, this network feed remains here, ex-Rebelde. Excellent with classical music, female with ID, parallel 1000, 1400 kHz. (Krueger-FL at LONG KEY STATE RECREATION AREA 6/2)
- CUBA COCO, Sapo, Ciudad Habana; 1420+ "Primera Plana" program with SS pop music, man with long list of phone numbers and addresses of places such as Habana Electrico, centro Habana cocinas, Radio Centro (broadcast for any needed info--essentially an "on-air" Yelow Pages" pprogram. Later in the day, 1845+, this station was relaying a Radio Nacional de Espana transcription, punctuated briefly (to my surprise) by a local woman announcer who in EE said "Good afternoon" at 1852, and referenced "97.7 FM" frequency for COCO. (Krueger-FL KEY WEST 6/6)
- 980 UNIDENTIFIED (HAITI?) looping SE/NW, definite Kreyol programming with man refering to "Haiti" and "Caribe", very poor under the Cuban. Nothing listed here. (Krueger-FL KEY WEST 6/6)
- 990 CUBA Radio Guama (unidentified site); 1330+ fair, parallel all other audible outlets with SS pop, ID's. No 990 entry in any source that I've located. (Krueger-FL KEY WEST 6/6)
- 1000 UNIDENTIFIED 'marimbas'; 1433+ (for over an hour of monitoring) nonstop marimba instrumental music here, very very poor, under Cuban's Radio Guama and Radio Musical, as well as the 996 kHz beacon harmonic. Several months ago I discovered Radio Nacional de Guatemala on 6180 reactivated. While 1000 kHz from Guatemala daytime seems tough (a

RNG frequency), this sounds identical, and bears watching for the multitudes of DX'ers at any given time in Key West. (Krueger-FL, KEY WEST 6/6) (Need to arrive early to reserve DXing space! - Jim)

1180 FLORIDA (CLANDESTINE) Radio Marti, Marathon; 1345+ mixing equal level with Radio Rebelde. A check in front of the locked gates of the VOA site a couple of hours later still had Rebelde easily audible under Marti. Kudos, Fidel. (Krueger-FL LONG KEY STATE RECREATION AREA 6/2)

1240 BAHAMAS ZNS-2, Nassau; 1347+ Caribe-accented woman reading an endless list of local church and community event happenings on New Providence for the upcoming week, finally into gospel vocals. Really tight null with Cuban Radio 26 co-channel. Not parallel 1540, 810 ZNS outlets. (Krueger-FL at LONG KEY STATE RECREATION AREA 6/2)

1330 CUBA Radio Jaruco (la Habana?); 1448+. Not listed for this frequency (Radio Artemisa listed), listed as on 1390-only in WRTH-97. Since I've noted this on TWO frequencies, I presume this is no longer a "Local" but rather a "Provincial" network. Powerhouse signal from Key West with TC/ID, long lineup of TeleRebelde and CubaVision TV programs for the afternoon/night. Another ID live by woman at 1459. (See 1390 kHz.) (Krueger-FL KEY WEST 6/6)

1390 CUBA Radio Jaruco, la Habana; 1500+ excellent, //1330. (Krueger-FL KEY WEST 6/6)

1400 CUBA Radio Musical Nacional, Matanzas; fair, parallel 590, 1000. First time log of this freq for me. (Krueger-FL at LONG KEY STATE RECREATION AREA 6/2)

1540 BAHAMAS ZNS-1, Nassau; 1330+ "Good Morning Bahamas" lame program with M&W with news, soul music. Seriously QRM'ed abruptly (see below) by Cuban from 1400. (Krueger-FL at LONG KEY STATE RECREATION AREA 6/2)

1540 CUBA unidentified (Radio Sagua?); *1400 suddenly on, atop ZNS-1 with Cuban merengue, badly overmodulated, chipper SS man and woman live between most songs, but never could cull any ID (didn't seem to be any, actually). Suddenly off 1450*, leaving ZNS-1 in the clear again. Not to reappear through 1520 GMT monitoring. (Krueger-FL at LONG KEY STATE RECREATION AREA 6/2)

1610 FLORIDA (PIRATE) unidentified, Miami; 1456+ impassioned Kreyol radio drama, complete with sound effects (certainly a transcript or satellite feed) nonstop. First appeared underthen overtook--the disco pirate. Peaking on the Palmetto Expressway/826 around the US-1 exit, but still weak around the Broward line; a pretty big signal. Could this be David Crawford's "Radio Tropicale"? (Krueger-FL 6/7)

1610 UNIDENTIFIED; 1215+ threshold, seemingly gospel vocals, impossible to tell if EG or Kreyol. Presume much too late for Caribbean Beacon, Anguilla. Maybe the Miami Kreyol pirate with Sunday pxing, or something totally different. (Krueger-FL at Bob Wilkner's QTH, Margate 6/8)

96.7 MHz FM CUBA Radio Rebelde (la Habana?); STEREO don't recall this in any FM listing, first noted during my LONG KEY STATE RECREATION AREA session on 6/2, fair level with canned rambling by Raul Castro Ruiz followed by all of the provincial leaders regarding respective economic reform compliances, parallel 1180, 620 et. al., my first Cuban FM'er. As it turned out, this ended up being an absolutely huge signal throughout the Keys (from Marathon south). Audible to north Key Largo, albeit poorly. This was my primary car station for five days: neat to hear Rebelde in full-stereo. (Krueger 6/1 through 6/8) (Added as a special treat for FM DXers - Jim)

DX FILES: CONNELLY VISITS MOM

Greetings to all. I took Monday off to help with a number of necessary projects at my mother's house. One benefit of this is that I got to do some DXing on Sunday and Monday evenings. Sunday night between 8.45 and 11.15 p.m. EDT was very "hopped up" to Latin America during a mini-DXpedition that I did from the lighthouse in Chatham. Many of the low-band (under 1200 kHz) channels had multiple-station Latin American pile-ups. In fact, a main limiting factor was co-channel interference by South Americans to other South Americans (rather than problems from domestic QRM). Some of the jumbles took a while to untangle and often a clear-cut dominant was hard to find. A Brazilian came in on 720, but I didn't determine the exact ID (two stations are possible). The Chatham site is certainly "primo" for South America. The fact that the best Trans-

Atlantic was Lesotho-1197 (!) underscored the auroral nature of conditions at the time. I heard a few more stations at the Harwich house before turning in for a night's sleep. On Monday (19 MAY / EDT: 8-9 p.m.), I did a quick on-the-way-home DX stop at North Scituate Beach. Some of the North Africans and Spaniards were coming in well, then South Americans started to show. The highlight was Rio de Janeiro, Brazil rising above the rabble on 860. The N. Scituate site has been used successfully before for Brazilian receptions just after sunset during moderately auroral conditions. Logs will be issued soon.

DX FILES: HONDURAS

4930.62, FM Internacional, 0420+ on May 25, xlnt w/ SP ballads, annoying canned ID's by M atop songs and between. Two very slightly different canned ID's 0500 and 0530, (partenthesis are variants of the phrases immediately prior to those beforehand, as heard on the 0530 ID from the top of my head, so not 100% accurate) "Esta es HRQO2, Radio Internacional, en San Pedro Sula, Honduras. Transmitiendo noventa uno punto nueve [91.9], frecuencia modulada (FM estereo), mil ciento viente [1120] kHz (amplitud modulada) y cuatro mil noventa trienta en la banda tropical (en la banda internacional)..." Whatever, interesting to hear the MW and FM frequencies (both possible from Florida-- latter on summer e-skip). Maybe the MW/FM frequencies--and IDing as "FM Internacional"-- have been published in previous logs or QSL's, if so I just missed them. Final canned s/off anmt at 0551 ment'd the "barrio" (uncopied) that the station is located at, 0553* w/out NA. Probably old-hat for Don Moore, eh? (Krueger-FL) [in Tocabaga DX e-mail]
