The 11th Annual Winter SWL Fest in Kulpsville, Pennsylvania is fast approaching. The Fest is slated for March 12-14, 1998. Meese says, "Better make your reservations now; I understand space at the Kulpsville Holiday lnn is filling up fast."

FCC Busts Pirates in Tampa ... From David Sharp <ddsradio@earthlink.net>:

"It took TWO years, but finally, the FCC has made sweeping raids in the Tampa area. Beginning this morning, they busted three prominent pirates: 87-X on 87.9, Patriot Radio 0n 96.7 and the Party Pirate 102.1.

"All stations are off the air, and 102.1 was especially hard hit. I talked with the operator today, a Doug Brewer, for a story on WHNZ radio. His account of what happened:

"Federal Marshalls and the FCC came to his door at about 6:30 or 7am, gained entry to his residence and cuffed him, then said they had a warrant or somesuch to take his equipment. Then, a Ryder truck pulled up front, and they cleaned out the station, located in the his home's garage. All told, the Feds got away with over \$50 K worth of stuff, including, so Brewer says, items that are "his personal property and the property of others...including a sound recording studio which had NOTHING to do with the radio station."

"Perhaps even more disturbing: They also dis-

mantled his 150-foot tower. However, what the FCC didn't realize is that the tower was licensed and LEGAL, with several public service agencies and a HAM repeater using space. The U.S. Attorney for Florida's Middle District

in Tampa says in a press release, 'Leslie D. Brewer, 43 of Tampa, allegedly operated an unlicensed radio station...' and faces civil actions.

"Another station, Patriot Radio on 96.7 in Lutz (just a mile or two from my house), is also silent; the operator, 53 year old Arthur Kobres of Lutz, is, according to the Department of Justice, 'Charged in a fourteen-count indictment with operating a radio station without a license, in violation of Title 47, United States Code, Sections 301 and 501 ... maximum penalty is two years imprisonment and a fine up to \$250,000.'

"Finally, 87-X on 87.9, in the Sulphur Springs area of Tampa, is also silent, with charges pending against 22-year-old Kelly Benjamin, known as 'Kelly Combat' on the air.

"Other pirates, ironically all Spanish-language; on 89.3, 90.1 and 106.1 remain on the air and full

strength as of this writing."

Here is the Texaco Metropolitan Opera International Radio Network for the 1997-1998 broadcast season. Most of the stations in the U.S. and Canada are FM; here are the AM stations. Some/all of the operas are also broadcast in Europe (both eastern & western) in 28 countries; the number of broadcasts varies by country. The broadcasts are also heard in Australia and New Zealand. In Canada, the broadcasts may be carried on some CBC English and French AM stations. The Saturday broadcasts run from November 29 through April 18; most begin at 1:30 PM ELT (the March 21 and April 11 broadcasts begin at an earlier time). This information comes from Opera News December 6, 1997; the network list is dated October 21, 1997.

TN Humboldt - 11/19 ~1500 - Noted with CNN Headline News. (DS-TN1) 740 WIRI

860 KPAM OR Troutdale - Per the Portland Radio Guide on the Internet, this station signed

on 10/21 with a Christian Hit Radio format. Station is named for owner Robert Pamplin Ir., owner of a Christian record label and several Christian bookstores among other things. The PD is Scott Thunder. Station studios are on Division Street near the I-205 freeway while the transmitter site is shared with KVAN-1550. (DP-HI)

HI Honolulu - 10/27 - Noted on past midnight local time with Christian 870 KAIM contemporary music, instead of being off. A station spokeswoman wasn't sure when 24-hour operation started. Former schedule was 5 AM to midnight local daily. There goes WWL! (DP-HI)

930 WAUR IL Chicago - Per the Chicago Sun-Times, WAUR will stop broadcasting the Radio Aahs format on 1/30/1998, when Childrens Broadcasting Corp pulls the plug. Previously it was reported that WAUR was sold to Global Broadcasting Co. (CR-IL)

940 KIPN HI Honolulu - 10/20 - Noted on past midnight local time instead of being off. Per station spokeswoman, station is now testing 24-hour operation. Former schedule was 6 am-8 pm local daily. Chief engineer is Ralph Wilson. KFRE now blocked! (DP-HI)

IL Decatur - Has changed from satellite CNN to Real Country. Their new 1050 WDZ slogan is Farm Radio 1050 WDZ. Their promos indicate that they will continue to carry the Bulls and Cubs. Illinois' first radio station has a new format! These guys started as WDZ Tuscola, Illinois back in 1921. (SB-IL)

1080 KOTK OR Portland - Per the Portland Radio Guide on the Internet, KWJJ has stopped simulcasting its FM Better Country format and became Hot Talk 10-80 on 10/27. The calls and format used to be on 620 before the station was sold and became news-talk KEWS. Among the personalities re-emerging on KOTK are Don Imus and Tom Levkis (1807-2200 weekdays). (DP-HI)

1210 WGSF TN Bartlett - 11/17 ~1200 - Heard with Spanish-language program of oldies rock (Spanish lyrics). (DS-AR2)

1240 WSBC IL Chicago - Per Chicago Sun-Times, WSBC was purchased by Newsweb Corporation (owners of WPWR-TV 50) for \$5.55 Million. (CR-IL)

1240 KMZK MT Billings - Changed to these CLs (ex: KMAY) on Monday November 17, 1997. Format was rap, now Contemporary Christian. New mailing address is P.O. Box 31038 Billings, MT 59107. (JcJ-MT)

1270 WKZT KY Fulton - 11/19 ~1500 - Noted with slogan Border Country. (DS-TN1) IL JOLIET - On 11/17/1997 the Chicago Sun-Times reported that Crystal Lake, 1340 WIOL IL based Pride Communications agreed to acquire five southwest suburban stations owned by Barden Broadcasting. Pending FCC approval, Pride will add WJOL-AM (1340), as well as FM stations WLLI, WJTW, WKBM, and WKOT. The company already owns WAIT-AM (850, Crystal Lake, IL),

1370 KCRV MO Caruthersville - 11/3 - Adds Ken Hamblin Show per program today. (DP-HI)

1390 KLTX CA Long Beach - Back in Issue 5, John Sampson reported a "bad" address was listed in The Log for this station. The FCC now posts addresses for all AM, FM and TV stations. No phone, no food, no pets. The feds say KLTX is licensed to: Salem Media of California, Inc. 4880 Santa Rosa Rd, #300 Camarillo, CA 93012. I cannot guarantee a letter addressed to this address will garner you a verie, but it may. These addresses are possibly for corporate headquarters or a lawyer who takes care of all the companiy's legal doings. It's worth a try. [Ed.-TX]

- MEXICO XEOK Monterrey NL (?), NOV 9 0045-0230 Ranchera music, frequent "Ésta es Fonista XEOK" ID's. Futbol programs from 0100-0200, then more music. Mentioned phone numbers 367-9563 and 369-8829. Generally poor under XEW and CKBI. Surprised to hear another XE station other than XEW on 900. I'm assuming this is the station formerly on 920 in Monterrey, XE #139 here. [Wilkins-CO]
- MEXICO XETAA Torreon COAH, NOV 18 0132 Full ID in heavy QRM, also mentioned XHTAA (FM) and Grupo OIR. [Wilkins-CO]

#### STATION NEWS

- MEXICO: "What are the official call letters of X-Bach-540 Tijuana? I have seen reports in both IRCA Monitor and DX News with call letters of XEBCH, XEBACH and XEACH. Although my Spanish is not what it used to be, when I have heard their ID at the top of the hour, it sure sounds like XEBCH to me. As for XEBACH, I'm not aware of the use of 6-letter call signs in Mexico, and according to the latest Mexican Log, XEACH is already assigned to 1590 in Monterrey. Help! Your assistance appreciated and many thanks." [query to Tim Hall by Bob Pietsch, Foster City, CA] "I finally spent some time on this recently, and I have heard several IDs that use 6 letters "XEBACH" and no IDs that use anything else. There are reports of another station in Mexico with calls XEETCH, but I can't hear them due to a local pest on that channel. That one would be hard for me to be sure about (distinguishing one "E" from two), unless the announcer had really good diction. Not really sure what the Mexican CRTC is up to. I've tried to obtain a fresh directory from the CIRT (Mexico's equivalent of the NAB), but so far no luck." [Tim Hall, San Diego CA]
- RUSSIA: Here are some important changes in the GPR-s W97 Kaliningrad mediumwave schedule: 1) Our transmitter on 1215 kHz uses a NEW azimuth of 245 degrees (except 230) beamed to Central Europe - daily between 1600 and 2000 UTC with 1200 kW (except 600 kW). 2) Our transmitter on 1386 kHz uses a NEW azimuth of 275 degrees (except 245) beamed to North-West Europe - daily between 1600 and 2300 UTC with 1200 kW. We very need to know about the reception quality of all our transmissions on these frequencies (Voice of Russia in German and English and Universal Life) and we will be very glad to receive any comments about it. We suppose that some interference take place on 1215 kHz from Virgin Radio (UK) especially in the western parts of Germany. It is very important for us to know what kind of reception with simple portable MW receivers in use. If you will send us some observations please indicate your exact location or nearest big city. All your information is very important for our technical department here at St. Petersburg and for the chief engineer of our Kaliningrad transmitting centre. #### WCMQ WORLDWIDE

"You can add NZ to the list of places where WCMO has been heard! Wasn't that great a night either! CA's were very good with plenty of activity on the 5kW regional channels...found a station carrying "One on One" sports on 1490 (// 1140, 1270, 1280) and discovered that KMEN is now KMRZ - don't know how long ago they changed! Same freq KNSN was running Art Bell, then there was a second station with MOR/T40 and on 1300 someone with inspirational music and very soft announcer ... pity I had to go to work today or I could have been up to 3:40 a.m. like last month!" #### UNIDS, QUERIES, ETC.

The 830 UNID is almost certainly the CBC Radio One network overnight relay of the World Radio Network, which often IDs as "WRN Network One". CBC takes it down from the Galaxy 5 satellite. The audio is sent on transponder 6 along with TBS -Turner, not Trinity. I understand that all CBC Radio One stations carry it from 1 to 6 am. Don't be surprised to hear IDs for Radio Netherlands, Radio France International and Radio Australia. Sometimes WRN has a problem with a feed from the station being relayed. When that happens, they often run a tape loop until its restored. Without a log book handy at work, I can't recall what CBC has on 830, but I don't know of any other terrestrial relays. [John Marx, Madison WI] (Thanks, John, but there are no CBC stations on this frequency! - Jim)



# Target DX

DX'ing 'smart', with shared tips and requests by NRC members

Night-Time Medium Wave Bandscan: Cape Cod, MA, USA Prepared 4 SEP 1997 by Mark Connelly - WA1ION

The list below contains medium wave broadcast stations that are audible from sites on Cape Cod at night. Many of the stations can be heard just about every night. Others are somewhat tougher DX that might take a few months of serious listening to uncover. I have tried to exclude "super rare" once-in-alifetime type stuff. The Newfoundland reports (for foreign DX) and the past 20 years or so of Ernie Cooper's loggings from Provincetown (largely of unusual domestic DX) can point the dedicated DXer to targets too uncommon to cover in this list. My main emphasis here is on the "stable mid-evening period", roughly from two hours after local sunset to two hours after local midnight. Sunset and dawn openings bring forth many additional stations, but many of these cannot be heard on a consistent basis.

Besides being a world-class resort area, Cape Cod has a large full-time population, including many retirees. Some sections are heavily developed - overbuilt in the opinion of more than a few. But the area retains much of its traditional feel along old Route 6A where many houses built in the 17th and 18th centuries can still be found. There is still a good deal of undeveloped conservation land, especially in the Cape Cod National Seashore. Typical landscapes include beaches, dunes, pine & oak woods, cranberry bogs, and fresh and salt water marshes. Cape Cod sits below the airline paths from most of Europe to New York and Washington. It is also America's "front door to Europe" when it comes to incoming radio signals. That fact was not lost on Guglielmo Marconi when he established the first USA to Europe wireless communication from his site in Wellfleet. Amateur radio pioneer Irving Vermilya (W1ZE) and the famous WCC maritime communications facility also wrote important chapters in the area's radio history book. Right up through the Cold War years, just before satellites took over, the sky over the Massachusetts coast was the high-speed lane of the Europe - USA information superhighway. The communications traffic ranged from ordinary broadcasts to the most strategic military data.

Over the years, numerous medium wave DXers have recognized the same propagational advantages of locations such as Cape Cod and Long Island that the big commercial and government users knew about.

Although I am not a full-time resident of Cape Cod, I do have access to family homes at East Harwich and West Yarmouth. The East Harwich receptions were used as the "baseline" for this list. Some of the Latin American (especially Brazilian) logs were made from beach DX sites such as Windmill Beach in South Yarmouth: such receptions are more common there than at the more-inland house sites and, in any event, often require auroral activity to weaken co-channel US / Canadian domestics. Auroral conditions and the use of Beverage antennas at beach sites will actually provide Latin American and African DX beyond what I have listed here. The same is true for Florida and other southern domestics: Ernie Cooper has heard many of these on "graveyard" channels during aurora, but I haven't tried to include them

European DX is best from September to March. Some of the higher powered Trans-Atlantic stations, especially from Spain and the Arab countries of North Africa, can be heard year 'round. Best results will be at an eastward-facing beach right after local sunset. An antenna system that can provide a cardioid pattern (such as a loop phased against a whip) will go a long way in reducing interfering stations coming from the opposite direction of desired DX.

For each frequency, stations are listed with the most common one first and then onward in decreasing order of dominance.

It's been quite a while since I mused last. It's good to be an NRC member and back in the DX season. Fortunately, I should be able to take advantage of the latter portion of the season, now that my car is back. My radio listening has been severely cramped by problems with my '98 Ford Contour. Right after purchase in May, a horrible static problem developed on medium wave. It only occurred when the car was in motion in dry weather. There were some "atmospheric" aspects of the noise as well. I had it to the dealer a couple of times and they could not identify the problem (nor did they try anything). I called the 1-800-service number a couple of times without any information or response. I also checked the WEB for anything resembling Ford Contour radio static and did get a hit but it had to do with amplification problems in the premium stereo system. I have the standard radio cassette.

Unfortunately, by mid summer, I realized I was on my own in getting this thing fixed. I finally tape recorded the noise in the car while driving using the scan mode so only the effect on the loudest stations was demonstrated, which was pretty bad. (to complain about the inability to pick up off-channel DX would be a declaration of obscurantism, the kiss of death for getting help. Better to complain that you can't get Rush on the local talk station!) I worked out a deal with my dealer that he would get me a loaner car and get it fixed no matter what. I brought the car in with the tape and they had it for almost two weeks.

After a few days, they were finally able to get ahold of the dealer audio help line. They indicated that there was a radio static problem with Taurus resulting from static buildup on rear tires and hub. Ford suggested rotating the tires and/or putting a cheaper set on! That did nothing. The technical service bulletin out on Taurus also suggested the installation of static collectors in the rear. This is P.N. F4PZ\*18938\*A Spring Assembly. Two of these were installed, with a notable difference. They had to be modified to fit the Contour since they were designed for Taurus. (They ought to design a set for all their vehicles !). In the few days that I have had the car, the static problem has been reduced. Instead of a random discharge noise, which can be continuous in some instances, the static is lower pitched and corresponds to wheel revolution. The problem is still bad on 700 mhz and below but much better on the higher end where I do most of my listening. It is far from perfect and still inferior to the Delco. I did wind up with new tires (slightly cheaper than the originals) and the original set, which had 9000 miles. All of this was at no charge and I hope Ford got stuck with it all, including the \$500 car rental.

So, one must be ever vigilant against the constant encroachment of our electromagnetic environment. Thoroughly test out the car radio and demand satisfaction when performance is inadequate. Prepare documentation that is easily sent to Consumer Report, auto review mags, etc. if the dealer and the company are balky. I would be interested in hearing from any of you with similar stories. Have fun and good listening. (Seems like I heard of one similar case in which improper design of the radio antenna resulted in static buildup due to wind resistance and static discharge. An addition of a knob or something obtained satisfactory results -pls.)
