


25 years ago ... from the December 7, 1972 DXN: G. P. Nelson explored "The Limits of Midday MW DX" in a

lengthy article.

10 years ago ... from the December 7, 1987 DXN: Don Kaskey compiled a list of 56 stations in the U.S. and Canada which, to his knowledge, had never been reported as being heard by "any member of the National Radio Club or the International Radio Club of America" for the previous 13 years. Three 10 kW stations were included: WLVI-640 Royal Palm Beach, FL; WGMM-1100 Woodbine, GA; and CKWK-1340 Corner Brook, NF, and two 5 kW stations: KIMM-580 Tucson, AZ; and KTIB-640, Thibodeaux, IA.



MEDIUM WAVE RAMBLINGS

After logging 1650 from California, Pat Griffith of Federal Heights, Colorado reports: "This station (KXGL) was on the air testing with a GREAT signal into Denver tonight (11/21) from 6:50 PM to 7:46 PM ET. The signal was far superior to KXBT even though KXBT should have still been on day power at the time. They IDed this as a test transmission and alternated between tones and big band music. Costa Mesa directory assistance had no listing for them. Anyone have an address or telephone number?" John Wilkins says: "285 stations logged thus far this season, and counting . . . 6 new ones (3 of those from Mexico) and a few call letter changes." Dennis Elya utters: "My web page - http://www.geocities.com/capecanaveral /lab/3426 - has been updated. I've added 2 pages. One called AFFILIATES, which has links to show sports networks, etc lists of affiliate stations. I thought this would be a good help, even though some are out of date. I've also added a DXERS page, which will have links to other DXers who have web pages. As you can tell when you go there, I need people to send me their links!" Enuf said.

☐ This story from the Canadian Broadcast Directory is really an "FM" item, but impacts the rebroadcast of an AMer, so . . . : "The CBC has been given the go-ahead to establish a new English radio station at Victoria on the frequency 90.5 MHZ, with an effective radiated power of 3,190 watts, along with a 38 watt rebroadcast transmitter at Metchosin/Sooke, on 99.5 MHZ. CBC transmitters CBRY-FM Alert Bay, CBYT-FM Campbell River, CBKO Coal Harbour, CBKJ Gold River, CBTQ-FM Port Alberni, CBUX Port Alice, CBUY-FM Port Hardy, CBUW-FM Powell River, CBKU Sayward, CBXP Tahsis, CBXZ-FM Tofino, CBXQ Ucluelet and CBTW-FM Woss Camp which were originally fed from CBU Vancouver, will now be fed from the new Victoria station." And a couple more from CBD: "CJWW Saskatoon hopes to improve its daytime coverage. The station was recently granted approval to increase day-time power from 10,000 watts to 25,000 watts. Night-time power will go down from 10,000 watts to 8,000 watts, and the transmitter site will have to be relocated to a new nearby facility." And this one ... "In Sept-lles, Quebec, the race for a new FM station is heating up. Radio Sept lles Inc. wants to flip their current AM station [which is CKCN-560] to 94.1 FM operating at 4.88 KW. Meanwhile, Radio Communautaire De Sept Iles has launched a competing application for a Type B community station. RCSI proposes a 1.25KW signal, also on 94.1 FM."

After seeing that WOAI was issued a CP for a new antenna, I asked Jim Boehm to go and take a peek to see what, if anything, was going on out there. His report is in Special.

Wasn't it Socrates who said "When the temperatures go down, the DX heats up"? I believe he was right. A great turnout this week. Let's keep it up!

With respect to Argentina, look for a new Argentinian on 1620 (no typo) with soft-sell religion/phone-ins. This seems to ID as Cardinal FM and often mentions Esmeraldas (I think is a suburb of BA). This should "get out" if you can skirt TIS and beacon QRM. SW sucks! Subcontinental signals are in a ditch, and the LA signals are weak on 60 m. We are going to try remote towards Africa tonight, and remote for west coast SA/Central America on Thursday. The 1-km Byan to Brazil is not working, in spite of 6 radials ranging from 10 to 50 meters." [Jean Burnell (with Neil Kazaross), Cappahyaden NF] (By "remote" Jean and Neil that they will leave the warmth of their rooms at the DX Inn and DX from a car in an area that allows the antenna to be laid out in a more favorable direction - Iim)

"Here's a quick summary of listening I did from Plymouth, MA (Nelson Street Beach) on 23 NOV. Full reports will be issued later. This DXing was done during the period of the 1997 Newfoundland DXpedition. Chances are good that Jean and Neil are hearing much more interesting material than I'm listing here. I was on site for about an hour and 10 minutes: 2249-2359 UTC. Morocco/Spain even mix on 1044, Spain-999, Algeria-981, Portugal-963, Spain-954, Algeria-891, Canaries-Spain-882, Spain-864, Spain-855, Canaries / Azores even mix on 837 (note Azores back to "correct" 837 from previous 836), growI / mess on 828 (Azores or Portugal in there I think), Spain / Egypt even mix on 774, Senegal-765 dominant, "pig pile" on 747 finally yielded Canaries-Spain, Morocco-819 (// 612), Morocco-612 local-like!, Canaries-Spain-621, Spain-648, Spain-684 huge!, Western Sahara / Libya - 711 even mix w/ 50 Hz growl, Portugal-666, Azores-693 (// 837), Spain-603, Portugal-594 (// 963) dominant, Spain-585, tentative Portugal-576 (apparent // 594) in mix w/ Algeria / Spain, Algeria-549 excellent, Algeria-531 slightly over Spain & Madeira, Morocco-540 (tentative) in jumble, Morocco-1053 and a JAMMING-LIKE buzzsaw signal (what's this ?), Spain-873, Spain over probable Syria-918, Morocco-1044 at MONSTER level (2342 UTC) with rustic African music, Canaries-1008 (non-SER), Spain- 1134 over Croatia, Canaries-Spain-1179, Spain-1116, Spain-1125, Madeira-1125 low power station // 693, Spain-1215, Libya-1251, Spain-1287, Spain-1296, Spain-1305 in growl, Spain-1314, Mauritania-1349, Spain-1359, Spain-1413, Algeria-1544. Low band signals were better than high-banders and northern Europeans were conspicuous by their absence. I noted a low growl against WSKO-790 (RI). The "offending signal" seemed to be on 789.8 and could have been either another domestic or Barbados. [Connelly-MA]

STATION NEWS

AUSTRALIA: 1629 Greek Radio (Melbourne) has started last weekend, running // 1665 Sydney, so maybe sayonara to 2HRN! [DM via David Clark e-mail] At the Grayland '97 DXpedition ('Sleepless in Seattle') we heard HRN (Hospital Radio Network) in Newcastle, running 100 watts at the time, although it was intending power increase to 500 watts as of end-AUG 97. Nominal 1629, we had it on 1628.94. At the Grayland DXped, 2MN Greek Radio, 1665 in Kingsgrove was heard very well with power near 400 wafts. Its new outlet on 1629 seems likely to dominate the channel, making HRN much more difficult, if indeed it remains on that channel. [Clark-ON]

ICELAND: The exact schedule for the program on the new 189 longwave transmitter: Rs 1: 0900-1305, 18-19, 22-00 (M-F), 06-16, 22-00 (Sa), 09-16, 22-00 (Su); Rs 2: 00-09, 1305-1800, 19-22 (M-F), 00-06, 16-22 (Sa), 00-09, 16-22 (Su). [BT in ARC NOV 17 1997]

MEXICO: From 0500-1000 UTC, XEWA 540 San Luis Potosi, XEWK 1190 Guadalajara and Radio Ke Buena 91.3 in Guatemala City relay a program on XEW 900 Mexico City named La Gran Cadena W. 540 XEWA is now using slogan "La Ke Buena W". [Hector Garcia Bojorge, in ARC NOV 17 1997]

TUVALU: According with a report appeared on "Radio World" (15 Oct.97, signed by Neil Sanderson), Radio Tuvalu (T2U2 621 KHz 5Kw) has been off the air for more than one year now. The MW station was replaced by a network of 8 FM transmitters fed by satellite. This "state-of-the-art" system is a component of a donation by the Australian Agency for International Development (AusAID). AusAID gave the Tuvalu Telecom. Corp. a 7.5 meter dish satellite earth station for the main island of Funafuti, and 4.6 meter dish for each of the eight distant atolls. AusAID also gave Tuvalu Telecom an FM transmitter and associated equipment for each atoll. The broadcast equipment was to be used by the gov. station Radio Tuyalu, but the equipment would be owned and maintained by the common carrier Telecom. Under the new arrangement, Radio Tuvalu lost control of its long-range transmitters. But Pusinelli Laafai (Manager of Radio Tuvalu) speaks: "When we first switched from AM to satellite FM, everyone was very happy with the quality. Then it all fell apart". At each transmitter site, the story is the same. A power supply module in the broadcast downlink receiver overheated in the tropical conditions. Even though the fault was identified before the project was completed in September last year, it still has not been fixed. The last of the distant islands lost its FM signal in February. Funafuti residents would tune to a new 20 watt FM transmitter donated by Canada but the rest of the country has not radio at all. There are people critical of the switch to modern FM from aged AM who also noted that fishermen at sea would no longer hear the station, which had been an important vehicle for sending messages from shore. Since the problem After 12 months the power modules still have not arrived and landing the components in Tuvalu will not be the end of the problem. None of the eight outer islands has an airstrip. The inter-island ship that connects the country is slow and unreliable: "It is supposed to do a trip every once every six weeks, but it rarely makes it as often as that". "It is possible to wait up to three months". Words of Bruce Boardman of LSE Tech., the Australian company that installled the satellite an FM equipments. He also pointed out that a Tuvalu Telecom technician may only get two hours ashore before the ship departs for the next island. Is this another story of big-citydeveloped-countries minded people triying to solve the problems of (poor!) people of undeveloped countries? [M.Molano, Spain via Hard-Core-DX]

KHNC-1360 destroyed by fire of unknown origin

A controversial Johnstown (CO) radio station associated with the rightwing Patriot movement burned down Saturday evening. Arson investigators were on the scene at station KHNC-AM 1360, around 8 p.m. where witnesses said area fire departments tackled flames leaping high into the sky for more than 2 hours.

Droves of residents watched the blaze, concerned about the proximity of the fire to other business and gas stations on Colorado 60 in Weld County, which runs through town. The highway was closed to traffic. The fire was reportedly contained around 10:30 p.m.

Few details were immediately available from fire or law enforcement officials, but a witness described the scene. "I went to see what was going on, and I saw a lot of fairly high flames shooting out the radio station and a lot of smoke," said Loretta Judson, 42. Judson owns two local businesses, including the blue Horizons Travel agency across the street from the radio station.

Residents were huddled in the agency parking thanking the heavens for little wind that evening, Judson said. Firefighters were shooting water from all directions around the building to control the flames. "The center part of the building facing southwest over the main door into the radio station had collapsed," she added.

KHNC operated out of a refurbished farm implement store in Johnstown, a community of 1,600 about 45 miles northwest of Denver. According to a July 1996 Associated Press article published in the *Denver Post*, the station broadcast its message for the American Freedom Network to much of the globe using shortwave frequencies. The article said owner Don Wiedeman founded the station in 1993 to spread the word about the Patriot movement. The station boasted that it covered topics other news media wouldn't touch.

From Wayne Heinen: "Monitoring 11/30 indicates KHNC-1360 is silent, as well as KTMG-1370 Deertrail, CO which relayed KHNC's programming. The current FCC data base shows that the station's license was cancelled in May, 1997 and was operating while a petition for reconsideration was awaiting a hearing."

It looks like 1998 may be the beginning of a fair number of stations popping up in the Expanded band. With the FCC finally issuing construction permits, we could see the X-Band begin to sprout by this time next year. Surely this will provide DXers with some very juicy catches, perhaps the best opportunity in decades! While DXers may enjoy the X-Band opportunities, I have to wonder if the stations involved know what they're getting into. 10 kilowatts daytime will provide most stations with decent coverage, but the 1000 watts night time limit may have to be modified. If large amounts of stations opt for the quarter-wave antenna (ie: lots of skywave potential), the X-Band stations may find it impossible to cover all their desired target areas at night, using only 1000 watts. With the FCC increasingly unable to effectively police the broadcast frequencies, I have to wonder how long it will be before significant numbers of X-Band stations start to 'forget' to power down at night, in order to boost night time coverage, which would be hampered by the low groundwave/high skywave characteristics of the frequencies above 1600. This, in turn, would create even more interference for stations still playing by the rules, and a 'cascade effect' may end up causing ALL the X-Band stations to operate with much higher powers at night. Sooner or later, the FCC would probably give in and allow either directional antennas or even maybe something like 5000 watts at night non-directional. This, combined with the inevitable addition of more stations not on the original list (it WILL happen) almost guarantees the X-Band will be a total mess in about 5 years. The moral for DXers? Get all the stations you can early on; the band will probably deteriorate rapidly after the first year or two. By the middle of the next decade, it will probably be just as messy as the rest of the AM band.

Phil's above report brings a couple of interesting items to light regarding the X-Band, from an engineering side of the fence. In looking at the original reasoning for the X-band, it was to help relieve some of the restrictions placed on some stations which operate with restricted coverage areas, due to tight directional patterns and the growth of population areas. A couple of the stations which I provide engineering service for could have benefited greatly by this, but, for some reason, a lot of the east coast was left out on the final draft, so they're stuck with restricted signals. In another case, an east coast station which was given an X-band grant, found out they could increase their power by 10 times on the frequency they are operating on now, day and night, at a LOWER dial position, which would benefit them greatly even now! One station in VA that I know of has a HUGE daytime coverage on the low end of the dial and was given the UPPER end of the X-Band! Benefit? Probably not much, especially at night. And one final item I've heard is the cost factor in doing this; it isn't cheap! My estimate is that you'll see about 1/3rd of the stations given grants actually show up on the X-Band, the rest will then go up for 'grabs', and maybe even a few stations that could actually benefit by being up-there will get some decent coverage. 73
