Publication ... Universal Radio sent us a review copy of the second edition of a neat little book entitled Discover DXing! by John Zondlo. Designed to get a beginner started in AM, F, and TV DX, it would make a nice gift especially for a younger person unfamiliar with the hobby. However, two glaring errors stood out: the mis-spelling of "Hammarlund" under photos of that venerable receiver, and the incredibly out-of-date listings of stations in the book's AM clear channel section (KOAM has not been the current call on 860 for eons!) But then John recommends NRC's log as "far and away" the best, so we can forgive him, and these errors don't denegrate the books's usefulness. ☐ Welcome to first-time reporter Mike Oswald of Houston, Texas. It's good to hear some firsthand news from down that way, again!

☐ With ear flaps in the upright position, Shawn gives this unsolicited testimonial: "What a great evening and morning. As you can see there were TISs coming out of the woodwork. The big surprise and a pleasant one at that was the lack of the Anchor Lake MN TIS on 1610 that has become a huge pest here. Two new countries and lots of new ones was very nice. The walk to the DX bus about 1500 was a rough one. Due to fresh light new snow the toboggans sank. This meant splitting loads and it took two to move the sleds to the bus. Anyone who thinks this hobby is for wimps should come out with us some time. After an hour of very tough going all the equipment was unloaded set up and away we went DXing. About two hours in my battery that powers the radio packed it in. Finally died. Thankfully Wayne had a spare we use for the cell phone so we could still keep both the ICOM and the Drake going. As for the MFI 1026 all 1 can say is BUY IT NOW!!! As you see above the locals about 50-60 miles away and all beamed at us (almost all Winnipeg stations beam north at night and Valhalla Beach is North of Winnipeg) were nulled except CKY on 580. The MFJ is worth every cent and once again a HUGE thanks to Mark Connelly for his modification notes. This was easy to do and lets the signals flow in. It was amazing to hear DX under even or over our locals while they were still on air. If you BCB DX and have locals (all of ours are NSP) you need one of these MFJ 1026 units. The only disappointment was a lack of TPs and TAs save for the Iceland station on 189. Oh well lots of good domestic DX made the walk all worth while. Great way to start 1998!"

David Gleason, PD at KTNQ News/Talk 1020 AM Los Angeles writes: "Noticed several mentions of Spanish programming heard on 1540. This station, which is apparently getting/got call letters of KCTD (California's Touchdown) has been 24-7 with One-on-One sports since 9/19/97. It is not ever in Spanish, as it was sold to One-on One. Also of interest. on the 5th of January, the Radio Unica Spanish talk net started, based in Miami. If anyone hears a Spanish Radio Unica, it is an affiliate. They include 880-KTMP (outside Portland), 1010-KIKI in San Francisco, KTRB-860-Modesto, KVCA-670-Simi Valley, CA., 1220-KBNO-Denver, 1230 station in Odessa or Lubbock (I missed the ID promo . . . bad signal where I live), 1360-WKAT-Miami, 1380 WKDM-NYC, 1540-Gretna, LA, 1500-Charlotte, NC, 1440 in Lehigh Acres (Ft Myers), KXYZ-1320-Houston, 840-Brownsville/Harlingen, 1250-San Antonio, 1550-Hartford CT, 1600-KGST-Fresno, 860-WTEL-Philly and a number of others I could not figure out from the 'we are a big network' promos. Some stations actually called Radio Unica, some still use Unica programs and their old name. There are Radio Unica jingles and mentions constantly. Some stations take 24 hours a day, others take certain shows. Unica is pronounced 'OOH-nee-kuh' with the accent on the U."

Ron speaks: "I too took advantage of the TA openings but I didn't log as many new ones as I should have. I have to give thanks to Al Merriman for nagging me into installing two slopers running NE and NW about 30 feet high and at least 120 feet long (he also built my phasor). I spoke with him several times during the openings and he helped me log some new ones. I even got up to 50 countries heard."

Mark speaks: "The last few days of December have seen the best conditions in over two decades for long distance reception on the AM broadcast band (540 to 1700 kHz). One of the most remarkable reports comes from Jan Alvestad, who heard the arriving and departing flight information stations on 1640 and 1680 kHz operated by American Airlines at the Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport! These two stations each operate with 60 watts of power, and Jan heard both in Norway on December 27 and 28. These stations were also heard by Stefan Wikander in Sweden on December 26. In Manitoba, Canada, Shawn Axelrod reports reception of AM band stations from the Azores, Morocco, Croatia, Norway, France, Algeria, and Holland on December 27 and 28. Shawn describes this period as being the best in his experience for reception of trans-Atlantic AM stations from his location in western Canada. He reports signal levels were very strong during this period; Norway on 1314 kHz was audible even before sunset!"

Bruce speaks: "I came in at the tail end of the late December Scandinavian feeding frenzy with only a glimpse of Finland on 963 and an early morning het on 531 that could've been from the Faros. Argentina on 1620 hasn't been definitely heard yet, due to PCH and a number of TIS stations on the frequency. But a January 3 - 4 Saturday night session at the Parker River NWR produced some interesting logs, although conditions were back to normal by then with Spain dominant across the dial."

Rob speaks: "Well.....another evening with good TA reception....gotta love it!! Hets and/or weak audio on almost every TA Freq. Managed to pull out one station that peaked very nicely as I tuned into it. Turns out to Be TWR Romoules, France.....Country # 35 on BCB for me!!"

Doug speaks: "My first IDd TAs! The beacon band was jammed with signals, but when I heard French audio on 162 kHz I just about fell out of my chair. Except for DLR, the longwave signals were all excellent; I would have IDd all of them if I understood French. Talk Radio-1089 was pretty good for a while too. Carriers could be heard on just about every 9 kHz channel."

Shawn speaks: "Over 4 and a half hours of TA's!! That was the best bar none night of TA DX I have had ever. Two new countries and lots of new stations. Wayne McRae alerted me to 1314 booming in while it was still daylight here. That is a first for us. Now if we had been at the DX site at Vallhalla Beach we would have heard even more. We spent the time on the phone chasing the DX. We had HETS on EVERY split frequency at one time or another from about 650 right through to 1600. This was also a first. The biggest problem was choosing a HET to listen to. 1314 and 855

were so strong that they were like a local with S meters at levels never seen before for TA's. Wayne and I thought we had moved to the East coast. Hope that some of you in the mid west especially got some new ones that night as they were there for the picking."

Randy speaks: "It's been a wild roller-coaster ride this week, with TAs all over the dial on UT 12/29 but aurora-like last night (UT Wed. 12/31). Both nights conditions petered out by 0400 or so. The TA night was very good but not spectacular, as many frequencies produced just weak carriers, and those with audio were generally weak. On the auroral night (last night), I managed to bag a couple of long-elusive Venezuelans... indeed, I often wonder if, with its mountainous terrain, there isn't some sort of horizon-blockage effect going on, because YVs are EXTREMELY difficult to log here... Rumbos on 670 can sometimes be heard weakly behind Cuba; R.Oriental-720 has been heard in auroral conditions in years past, but has been more difficult lately, especially with R.Catolica (Nicaragua) hetting the frequency badly on 720.19... and the mysterious Radio Paraguana on 880 surfaces occasionally. Otherwise, forget it. Colombians are FAR easier to hear at my QTH (indeed, the RCNs on 760/770 were booming in all evening)."

Al speaks: "The good cx are not over. Not much from Norway tonight but everyone else is trying to make up for it. Spain is booming including not common freqs such as 819, 1071 etc. Strong Arabic on 594 is not often heard Morocco //207, 774 has Spain/Egypt fighting it out with Morocco behind. Weak carrier on 1493 likely Ivory Coast. How long can this possibly last?"

Al speaks some more: "Thanks to Mark Connelly's tip I've got a new one! Finland-963 has been in/out since 2230z on DEC 27. Now 0420 DEC 28 and they're better than ever and someone is running tone under them. 0415z Denmark-1062 was booming and Norway-1314 has been big all evening. Ireland-567, 612 have both been good most of the evening along with a bunch of others. Cx favoring Northern Europe although some Spaniards good. Belgrade just tearing up Spain-684 at times. Some of the best cx I've ever seen to Northern Europe. Too bad Faroes-531 doesn't s/on until late on Sunday or I might add them. Lets hope things stay like this until Monday. Both A & K Index have been zero for the past couple of days."

Renfrew speaks: "I was in California, and missed all of this!"

John speaks: "Audio was also heard on 162, 171, 198, 207, 216, and 252 but unable to copy for a report. However, for the last few days, I'm not even hearing a "depression" in the dial for 1314. "

Presume via one of the listed 1290 (non-Taino) outlets in the Habana area. Interestingly, the next day, Dec 19, the signal was very poor and under at least two unID domestics. Caught several slogans which sounded like "Esperanza", rather than "Esmeraldas". ID at top of hour giving full station name. NEW STATION, NEW COUNTRY. [Stephens - AL] DEC 19 0502 - In like Flynn over the TIS stations. Heard first a ballad sung in SS by a male group with string accompaniment. Then a man in SS with dramatic talk, seemingly religious, with woman in \$S joining in at 0507. This all faded around 0517. Maybe I'll write to the address furnished by Jean, but would like more info. DEC 15 0503 - Loud and clear with an instrumental musical interlude followed by a man in SS who very shortly was talking to a SS woman. Tele-talk I suppose. But very soon the TIS stations had taken over. Have tried every night since but got nothing I could clearly call the Argentinian. [Dangerfield-PA] DEC 19 - presumed, UNID rlg station, 0505+ SP M evangelical talk interspersed w/ piano mx, lots of schedule-type info but not sure for what. Long, deep fades with readable peaks over the TIS rabble. 0517 fadeup had chorus mx. M accent sounded somewhat Uruguayan (i.e. with a hint of Brazilian twang to it). 0520 SP W talk, then man again, past BoH with no ID noted. Couldn't stick with it any longer, gotta sleep sometime. Belize via their 90 metre parallel. This one is equally bad but it does sound like SS gospel alright! [Funkenhauser-ON]

TRANS-PACIFIC DX

Patrick speaks: "I had another good morning for TPs. Lots of 5KW commercial JJs in on 864 Khz, 765 Khz, 936 Khz. Taiwan-738 and 1143 were almost "local-like" at times. I heard an odd SE Asian type language again on 918 Khz, but still not strong enough to ID. DZXL-558 was mixing with

JOCR/ KOREA. The strong cx seemed to just affect the bottom of the band, as by 1000 khz, the signals dropped off alot. CX seem to still be good even though it is Mid January. Really different this year! [Martin-OR]

2640 MEXICO XERJ, Maztalan, JAN 9 1155-1222 - Mix of romantic pops and ranchera music. Long ad string at hour. Finally three IDs as "La RJ" in the space of one minute at 1220. 2x1320. This station has been heard here a few times every winter for several years. [Moore-IA]

CARIBBEAN INFO by John Sgruletta and Ted Powers

John Sgruletta: I was on vacation to Tortola the first week of December, and visited ZBVI while there. They showed me where they do the commercials, the room holding the stack of cassettes for their play list, and the studio. Unfortunately, it was a Friday afternoon and the main offices were closed. The Chief Engineer, Olin Hester was not there and, in fact, lives in the American Virgin Islands. He visits the station 3 or 4 times a week. I have been trying desperately for this station from New York for a number of years. It was very depressing hearing it so clearly from my villa, about 15 miles away. I listened to 3 stations in particular as DX targets up here. This is the info I obtained using my DX-440 and 15 feet of wire:

780 BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS ZBVI Identifies as "AM 780 Zed BVI" or just "Zed BVI". They have BBC World Service news on the hour sponsored by Cable & Wireless. They close at 02.00 UTC (+/- 2 minutes) by saying they broadcast from "Vargas Bay" given in an echo format and then playing God Save the Queen.

1000 U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS - WVWI is listed in my 1998 WRTH as being inactive, but it was very much active when I tuned them in. They ID as "Radio 1 AM 1000 WVWI St. Thomas" and "KISS 101.3". They had a daily show at 21.15 UTC called "BBC Caribbean Report" and are part of the CBS Radio Network, broadcasting the Jim Bohannon Show live at 04.00 UTC.

1340 U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS - WSTA identifies as "WSTA St. Thomas". They are part of the Talk Radio Network and broadcast NBC Radio News on the hour. Local news follows at 4 minutes past the hour.

1540 BAHAMAS - I have picked up Radio Bahamas only once in New York in many tries, and I can see why! For a 50 kw station, they were actually weak to inaudible most of the time in the BVI. If I don't hear them well in New York to the north or in Tortola to the east, where is their signal going?

Jim's comments: 1540 does have a tight directional pattern, according to correspondence I received from Tom Bryant some years ago. Did you hear any news of the X-band station that is allocated for the US Virgin Islands? Thanks for the research.

Ted Powers: My report on a couple of Caribbean stations I heard while on cruise. Jay Novello was on the same ship.

- 1205 CAYMAN ISLANDS Radio Cayman One, NO DATE, 1103 carrying BBC Carribean Magazine on using employment tests in hiring personnel. At 1129 ID by two women sining "Radio Cayman in the Cayman Islands", into religious program at 1231. (50 miles off Grand Cayman Island)
- 1340 GUANTANAMO US Naval Station, Jan 8 2055 ID as "armed Forces Radio Network" and "National Public Radio Worldwide". LATVIA: The second program of LATVIJAS RADIO has been reactivated on 1539 kHz (// 945) [I Zhurkin in MediDX

NORTH KOREA: 1613v 1445-1515 KK Frontline Soldiers Radio broke a 3-week silence and resumed transmission Jan. 7 for what appears to be the first time since DEC. 18, which was the only time the station was heard in DECember. ID at 1505 "Chonyon Chobyondurul wihan Bangsong imnida." Usual North Korean songs and political slogans. The station was suddenly blacked out at 1515. North Korea's power supply may have 'improved' slightly these few days. Compared to the last few weeks of DECember, much more of Radio Pyongyang's foreign service transmissions have been observed active since last week. Frequent brownouts still interrupt transmissions, however, and feeders from Pyongyang to the transmitters are still terribly unreliable and erratic. Radio for the Soldiers at the Frontline on 1613-1614v kHz has been on the air every day since Jan. 10, and now the broadcast time seems to be 1400-2100, extended one hour from the previous 1400-2000. TURKS & CAICOS ISLANDS: I did receive a QSL letter from RVC1 verifying not only the switch to 530 but also stating that their power is now 40 kw using a powered down Nautel 50 kw transmitter. It also states that they are using a single 485 foot non-directional tower. I believe they were 100 kw on 535 (as listed in the 1998 edition of the WRTH) which explains the drop in signal strength Kennedy noted. [Griffith-CO]
