From the publisher ... It is our sad duty to report Mail is being X-Rayed and visually inspected... the death of Henry "Hank" Holbrook, Tracy's Landing, MD. Hank had been an active DX'er in various radio clubs for many years and had worked for American University as a purchasing agent for 28 years before retiring in 1993. Hank died of leukemia on April 15 at the age of 69.

As MT assistant editor Larry Van Horn put it, "Hank was an avid DXers (all band/DC to light) and chased after wallpaper like no other in our hobby. He DXed it all and collected QSLs from everything he heard. VHF draw bridges, ships, broadcasters, TISs, VHF/UHF comms, etc. If Hank could hear it, he would QSL it." Hank was also a bicyclist who had ridden 195,000 miles since 1971. (Thanks to the numerous DX'ers who sent notice of his death.)

We've included in this DXN as much information as we have on various conventions this summer strange new area code (there's too many these which would welcome AM DX'ers, including our days!). It's an area code map, and it's pretty up-toown convention in San Antonio. Most (Nearly all) other countries have been designated 1 (ONE) point of entry." So if Canadian members experience poor deliveries of DXN, don't be surprised.

50 years ago ... from the May 8, 1948 DXN: WVCG-1070, Coral Gables, FL, wrote, "Despite the fact that the station is using NEW EQUIPMENT, we have had considertable technical difficulties through equipment failures; it seems that few items leave the factories in good condition these days." Despite their problems, veries were promised in the next 10 days.

25 years ago ... from the May 2, 1973 DXN: After just short of five years of publishing DXN, the BPC asked for volunteers to step forward to take over publication duties, noting that minimum qualifications included "at least three adults within practical travelling distance of one another".

10 years ago ... from the May 2, 1988 DXN: NRC Information Services announced the publication of the "FM Station Address Book".



MEDIUM WAVE RAMBLINGS

- ☐ Thanks to Steve Kennedy for adding his totals and some impressive loggings to our Graveyard lists. As a reminder to all, here are the guidelines for Graveyard DX submissions; Separate by frequency, in state/province and city order; if you DXed from more than one location while logging these stations, please designate; it is not necessary to send in complete logging details, i.e., time, what you heard, etc. If all were logged after 1960, just state that fact. I figure all distances using geographic coordinates obtained from a ZIP Code-based site (US) and a gazetteer (Canada) on the Internet, which I then load into a computer program. However, if you have other coordinates (GPS, etc), let me know.
- John Hanz of Old Bridge, New Jersey relays an Associated Press article from his local paper (The Star-Ledger) about an incident at WFMB Springfield, Illinois. The article (about an axwielding nut case threatening the DI) mentions a country format. John says the AM Log indicates a sports and talk format, and questions whether they have changed formats. I have an FM Atlas which, I admit, is a couple of years old, but there is a WFMB-FM 104.5 that is listed as having a country format. I think the AP just didn't relate that it was the FM station, John. New member Andy Kahn of Vancouver, Washington writes: " ... 1520 KFXX, in Portland and 910 KKSN have swapped frequencies. Both stations are now owned by Entercom. This means that the Sports format from 1520 is now on 910 and the Nostalgia format moves to 1520. What I've heard is that the sports station wanted a better night signal for the Seattle Mariner's games Also, look for the new 660 in Junction City to simulcast KPAM 860 out of Portland. KPAM is already including the KZTU Junction City ID in their top of the hour ID." Pat Griffith of the Mile High City reports: "I finally managed to hear enough of KYIZ to positively ID them on April 3, 1998 at 0239 ET. I sent them a report and received a very brief letter of confirmation and a KRIZ/KZIZ bumper sticker. The verie signer was Frank P. Barrow, PD." And Pat later writes: "CBS This Morning just aired (4/27) a very interesting report on the popularity of pirate radio in the US including visits to two well-equipped and very popular pirate stations in California and Texas. They also interviewed the head of the FCC, who promised large scale crackdowns."
- On a recent visit to the San Antonio area, I noted that KTKR-760 failed to ID legally every time (about 20) I listened. Just "The Ticket" or a variation thereof was heard. Maybe they need a visit by the FCC?!?
- Echoing what the Publisher said last month about formatting your reports in a sensible manner ... I must beg (and I hate to "beg") that those of you who absolutely refuse to format your reports as you see them printed here will sometime in the very near future comply with this simple request: format your reports as you see them here. Beg, beg, beg. I can't say it any other way. It makes my job just a little easier. Remember, we are on a monthly schedule until October. So keep your DX reports current . . . and formatted! (Do it! Or we'll have to double Bill's stipend and increase dues by that amount to cover the extra time he spends in unscrambling your submissions. And remember - go easy on abbreviations. If in doubt, don't abbreviate: let Bill take care of it -pls)
- This might be a good time to promote the CPC. Since taking over the reins about six months ago, I've mailed out 151 requests, and received 10 responses of which six were positive. Now is the time to start formulating your "wanted list" for next season. But remember, for each station it takes: two stamps (one going out, the other on the SASE for the response); two envelopes (one #9, one #10); two pieces of paper. So when you send your list, include either two stamps per station, or a monetary contribution to cover expenses. I have enough stamps left over to send out 42 requests (folks have really been generous!) If there are some stations you'd like to request to run a CPC test for the NRC, get busy on the list and get it to me. I'll start mailing requests right after the convention . . . where I may see you!

THE CAPEMAN COMETH

Summary of MW DX (25/26 April 1998) by Mark Connelly - WA1ION; and a few other comments. Full-detail loggings will be issued in about 2 weeks (with some later logs added in).

This past weekend (25/26 APR) had slightly auroral conditions in the early evening with a drift to more normal DX as it got later.

Sahara?) - 1550, Morocco-1044, Lesotho-1197, Senegal-765, Morocco-612. Duxbury (continued) - 26 APR 1998 / 0000-0102 UTC: Brazil-760 beautiful ID "Radio Record en Fortaleza" LOUD!, duelling Brazilians on 860 (Cidade-Fortaleza & CBN-Rio), R. Coro Venezuela - 780 nice ID, Spain-774, Venezuela (Mundial) - 880 destroying WCBS, Canaries-882, Algeria o/ other - 891, Canaries-837 & Azores 836 het, Venezuela-750 o/ possible Brazil & a 747 het from Canaries & Burkina Faso, Western Sahara - 711.05 & Libya - 711.0 creating 50 Hz het, Spain-1215, Libya-1251, Bermuda-1280 religion, St. Pierre-1375, Spain-1296 loud!, Algeria-1422, Spain-1485, Anguilla-1505, unID-1520.2 & also a 1521 het pres. Apparently the info was sent as plain text instead of attachments, the formatting of which aren't affected by transfers -pls)

In all not a bad session for this late in the DX season. The next 4 months should focus MW DXers' sights on stations near, and across, the equator.

Greetings. Here are some highlights of this past season and a few comments. For those of you who are not familiar with Auburndale, it is a village within the city of Newton and is located 10 miles due west of downtown Boston. With so many powerful local stations, it is certainly a challenging DX location! My closest locals are WRCA-1330 (5 kW @ 1 mile), WEEI-850 (50 kW @ 4 miles), and WNTN-1550 (10 kW @ 1/2 mile but daytime only). DX equipment is a JRC NRD 525 purchased used from Mark Connelly and a Quantom Loop from Gerry Thomas. I am quite happy with both. Once again this year the most reliable TA's here were Algeria-549 shortly after local sunset and Denmark-1062 between roughly 2300 and 0100 local time. A major highlight was country #86 heard in Slovakia-1098. Their signal was loud and clear on the evening of 10/17 with 1950's "doo-wop" music and "Rozhlas" ID. While surfing the X-Band on 11/16 I noted someone on 1700 kHz playing Spanish ballads. At first I thought it was an image from one of my locals, but they all checked out negative. For me, this hobby was put on the sidelines for quite a while so I have a lot to re-learn, but that's all right. I've been fairly successful with Oregon daytimers and some of the smaller Washington and Idaho stations. 1998 Mexican DX Convention Information

Hello again everyone, and here's the latest on the Fourth National Meeting of Mexican DXers in Tehuacan, July 30-August 2, 1998.

We've had a tremendous amount of interest from DXers in various countries who are thinking of attending the event. We've had serious inquiries from places like Argentina, Venezuela, Denmark, Spain, the United States, etc. (as well as all over Mexico of course). And some of these have already confirmed their attendance.

Some people have asked about the weather in Tehuacan in late July /early August. Yes, it can get very hot -- sometimes over 90 degrees Fahrenheit (i.e. over 30 or so Celsius). However, the high altitudes of much of Puebla state keep the temperatures moderate a lot of the time. You may even find it chilly at times, particularly at night. So it would be a good idea to pack a light jacket or sweater. Incidentally, the Hotel Mexico -- like most hotels in Tehuacan -- does NOT have air conditioning in the rooms. If this is something essential to you, we recommend you reserve a room at the only hotel we've been able to find in Tehuacan which has air conditioning in the guest rooms. It is the Casa Cantarranas, a five-star hotel. The address is: Avenida de las Americas No. 2457, San Nicolas Tetitzintla, Tehuacan, Puebla. The telephone number is +52-238-34922, and the fax is +52-238-34849. The price of the Cantarranas is a bit higher than the Hotel Mexico. A single room is 292.50 pesos (about US\$34), and a double room is 351 pesos (about US\$41), and it is possible that there will be a price increase between now and the end of July (although if you guarantee your room with a credit card, they will guarantee the price at the current rate). The features and amenities at the Casa Cantarranas are basically the same as at the Hotel Mexico, except for the addition of air conditioning in the rooms. The Cantarranas is located about five minutes by car or taxi from the Cultural Complex where the meetings will take place, whereas the Hotel Mexico is within easy walking distance of the Cultural Complex (about a block and a half).

Another question we received is about extra costs for children at the Hotel Mexico. The hotel has informed us that there is no extra charge for children under 10 years of age in hotel rooms with their parents or guardians.

Now the information that I know you have all been waiting on -- how to get from Mexico City to Tehuacan by bus. You have two options for this trip. There is a bus line called "Estrella Roja" (which means "Red Star") that runs from the Mexico City Airport to the city of Puebla. This is an excellent service which I used a few months ago, and takes about 90 minutes. After you pick up bags and go through customs at the Mexico City airport, look for ground transportation, or better yet just ask someone where Estrella Roja is. There you buy a ticket to Puebla. The price is (currently) 60 pesos (about US\$7.00) one-way in first class, and the service and comfort level is about like being on an airplane flight. This service operates every day from 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight, Every hour on the hour a bus goes to the main bus station (called CAPU) in Puebla, and every hour on the half-hour a bus goes to Estrella Roja's terminal in Puebla. If you want to immediately catch a bus continuing on to Tehuacan, you will want to go to the CAPU and connect to a bus on the ADO line. If you want to stay a night or so in Puebla, you should go to Estrella Roja's terminal (also known as "Cuatro Poniente" -- the name of the street it's on), which is closer to the downtown plaza area where the hotels, shopping and restaurants are. Incidentally, on the return route from Puebla to the Mexico City airport, service is daily from 3:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. And again, on the hour it leaves from the CAPU, and on the half-hour it leaves from Cuatro Poniente.

If you take the Estrella Roja bus from Mexico City Airport to Puebla, you can take the ADO line (Autobuses del Oriente) from Puebla to Tehuacan. The ADO buses leave from the CAPU (main bus station) in Puebla daily from 6 a.m. till 10 p.m., and the cost is 36 pesos (about US\$4.24) one way in first-class. (Round trip fares are always double the one-way fares on Mexican buses.) I'm not sure exactly where the bus stops in Tehuacan, but it's almost certainly at the main bus station there, and Tehuacan is a small place so you can easily take a taxi from there to the hotel.

The other option is to take a taxi from the Mexico City airport to the TAPO bus station, and then get an ADO bus direct to Tehuacan. If you decide to do this, you should take a taxi from the Mexico City Airport to the TAPO (Terminal de Autobuses de Pasajeros de Oriente), which is the main bus terminal for buses going to the eastern part of the country. (There are other large bus stations in Mexico City, so make sure the taxi knows you want to go to the "TAPO.") The taxi ride costs about 50 pesos (about \$6.00). Then take the ADO bus from the TAPO to Tehuacan. We are told that these first-class buses leave "every two hours from 6 a.m. till 7 p.m." daily in both directions, and the cost is 81 pesos (about \$9.40) one-way. We have heard rumors about the ADO bus from Mexico-Tehuacan sometimes being filled up, so it may be best to opt for the combination of Estrella Roja and ADO from Mexico City-Puebla and Puebla-Tehuacan, unless you plan to spend a night or more in Mexico City before continuing to Tehuacan.

Just in case, here are the phone numbers for Estrella Roja and ADO in Puebla: Estrella Roja +52-22-497099 ADO +52-22-497572

(52 is the country code for Mexico, and 22 is the city code for Puebla.)

There are two other non-bus options that some people may want to consider. At the Mexico City airport, you can rent a car and drive to Puebla and Tehuacan. It should take about the same amount of time as the bus. But rental car rates start at around \$35 a day (for the Volkswagen), and tolls in Mexico are outrageously high. (I don't remember exactly, but it must be around US\$15 or so one-way from Mexico City to Puebla on the tollway.) You can always take the "freeway," which has no tolls, but it is not in as good condition and it takes longer. If you want to see other sights though and want to have freedom of movement, a rental car can be a good form of travel.

The other possibility that you might want to check on is this: Check with your travel agent or airline, because some airlines offer the same round-trip price to Mexico City or to Puebla. In other words, it often doesn't cost any extra to fly on to Puebla (after making a stop at Mexico City) and vice versa on the return trip. In which case you would only need to take a bus from Puebla to Tehuacan. (I'm not sure if there are buses from the Puebla airport; you would possibly have to take a taxi to the CAPU (main bus station) in Puebla to catch the bus to Tehuacan.) But, beware of one thing. Sometimes you may have to wait several hours at the Mexico City airport before the continuing flight to Puebla leaves. So check your airline's schedule, and in case of a long layover it may be better to take the Estrella Roja bus to Puebla.
