I hate to be a nag, but two things ... first, address changes: the USPS is even slower than a few NRC members about sending address updates, taking 2-3 weeks to get them to us, BUT if you don't so see you then. send your address update to the publisher (see back page) BEFORE you file an address change with the USPS, it is going to cost your club 70¢ each week until I receive the update, either from vou or the USPS, and make the change on your call, or e mail me <<kb1eyx@earthlink.net>>." label. PLEASE send in your changes as soon as you know what your new address is going to be.

Second, Log editor Wayne Heinen has pointed out that a few DX'ers who are too cheap to invest in the new Log nevertheless send in reports that include some statement like "not shown in the NRC AM Log", when indeed it is, but the DX'er is still using an old, outdated Log. Makes us look like the FCC in keeping up with changes, and that's NOT a good thing. So I've directed DDXD editors simply to edit out all statements referring to the Log as not containing material. And remember, if you do note changes in station status, send them to Bill Hale; in programming changes, send them to Wayne (see back cover). (No need to send clippings to the publisher about station sales, format changes, etc., unless they're really unusual, like WLS-890 switching to an all-hog-calling format, or Clear Channel buying all stations in Delaware, or the like.)

I apologize to those who've sent clippings to me over the last few years (unless you're just being nice and trying to let me know what's going on in your community) and have not seen them in print. Of course, there just isn't room for all of them, and since we've increased the size and number of columns, we really haven't needed very many for "filler" purposes. 10 years ago ... from the November 8, 1993 DXN Chuck Reh reported that CHYR-710's final day was September 17 ... Barry Wasylik, Winnipeg, reported hearing Tahiti-738 and Tonga-1017 on 10/9 with the help of several beverages (wires, not liquid!).

ODDS AND ENDS

- CKLW-800 KHz in Windsor, Ontario is undergoing a complete rebuild of their antenna system. With a five tower system, CKLW transmits 24/7 with 50 kW. Four of the towers were brought down this past week after nearly 60 years of use. For several more weeks, CKLW is using reduced power of 10 kW fed into a single omni directional antenna. The four towers currently down are to be replaced a.s.a.p. and after they are up and the transmitter is switched over to them, the fifth tower will also be replaced. When that is done, the station is to return to its full 50,000 output. No changes are to be made to the current antenna configuration, simply a complete rebuild of the antenna structure. [From the AM List on NRCDXAS]
- The FCC has dismissed two applications for experimental stations which I can find no further details on except one was in Waseca, Minnesota and the other in Sacramento/El Dorado, California. I dug as hard as I could, but came up empty.

Walter (Volodya) Salmaniw, Victoria BC.Here are the logs from our semi annual biannual Grayland DXpedition from October 3, 4 and 5, 2003.

Bruce Portzer: This was one of my most productive DXpeditions of the past several years. Many Japanese stations were audible, and there was a nice cross-section of other Far East stations. The most impressive logs this time were those on the even channels. JOWF-1440 dominated the channel for hours, and first-time-heards China-630 and JOER-1350 were welcome additions to the log. Many low-powered Japanese stations were also audible, including the *NHK* outlets on 1341 and 1584, where almost everything is listed as 100 watts. Thailand-891 and three Filippinos were nice catches as well. Down unders were few and far between; the only ones I heard were 4QD, 4BC, and Tahiti. As always, I enjoyed the camaraderie and the discussions about DXing. It was also a pleasure meeting Finnish DXer Mika Makelainen.

Chuck Hutton: We don't need no stinkin' split frequencies to DX China, Korea, Pacific Isles and Japan! Off the top of my head, we had TP's on 630, 720, 810, 990, 1170, 1260, 1350, 1440 and 1530. Hawaii is always there on 900, but no one bothered to log it. On other DXpeditions we've had stuff on 540 so perhaps only 1080 remains to be conquered. You'd have been amazed at the strength of Japan on 1350 and 1440 plus that of China on 630 and South Korea on 1170.

[Portzer] OCT 4 1421 - Loud Chinese talk. [Bytheway]

[Hutton] OCT 4 1346-1400 Something mixing with China FS, seemed have pop music, distinctive musical notes 1347:30, seemed to have jingle 1359:40, then Korea took over (unless the unID was Korea). And November is the month for members from the Northeastern US to check in with us; your reports are welcomed! Here we go:

John Vervoort - 343 101st Street Apt. 2K - Brooklyn, NY 11209-8213

I'm now back at my Brooklyn NY location, I had to leave Murray, KY rather abruptly due to personal issues (it's a LONG story!). I managed to log about 153 domestic stations at the KY location. When I left NYC, I had logged 259 domestics. I resumed DXing here on 9/8 and my total now stands at 266 as of this writing (10/27). 1 like to discuss "pests"; I am sure this is an item any DXer can identify with. Here are some of the 'heard almost every night" stations: WTEM-980, WJFK-1300, WTOU-1350, WOYK-1350, WSPD-1370, WDCW-1390, WAKR-1590 and WHKT-1650. Do X-Band stations qualify as pests? On 1690, I did get WPTX almost every night until WHTE signed on. This station has destroyed any posibility of me logging anything else on 1690. Often times, WHTE sounds more clear then the 'real' clear stations. Whats up with regional stations now running 50000 watts on these channels? WWI-950 and WXYT-1270 are among some of these. (The station has to maintain the signal at a certain level in the nulls as it was with its former power level. In a lot of cases, the signal is actually less then previous in the nulls but there is an increase in the main lobe of the signal-DWS). The regionals also lose their identity because of this new practice. One of my favorite parts of DXing is receiving stations that use very low power levels, like only 5 watts (when I was engineer at WSER-1550 Elkton, MD, we used 2.2 watts night power and it actually covered the city of license pretty well!-DWS). Graveyarders are also fun at night because of the challenge it offers and not to mention the strange effects of signals mixing with about 200 other stations on the same frequency. On another subject, my listening is now subject of not one but two elevators in my building; they were overhauled from being electro-mechanical to all computerized units. Now every time a person uses the elevator, I experience the most horrific noise known to mankind on the LF, MW, and HF bands; the VHF high and low bands are not affected. (Time to find out who made the system and start asking why you're hearing it, John; they are still suppose to be free of any signals such as you are picking up-DWS)
