Listeners are cautioned that WDSS, Ada MI also runs the Radio Disney Format. So ID's, local spots, etc will be needed for a QSL. A cassette or CD included with a report will be much appreciated, as it will be easier to tell for sure they heard KAVT, rather than WDSS. The use of Phasers or directional antennas such as loops will likely be needed by DX'ers in the Eastern US to null WDSS. DX Time Machine From the pages of DX News:

50 years ago ... from the December 31, 1955 DXN: Bernie Duffy, Staten Island, NY cited a report that there were approximately 3800 U. S. BCB stations on the air, about 125 under construction, and about 200 applications for new stations pending with the FCC.

25 years ago ... from the January 5, 1980 DXN: Gerry Thomas and Armand DiFilippo previewed the Sony ICF-S5W, noting that Sony was interested in feedback from DX'ers on the receiver (and your publisher was one of a group of DX'ers who received S5W's for the purpose of evaluating its performance).

10 years ago ... from the December 25, 1980 DXN: Shawn Axelrod, Wayne McRae, and Lorne Chestnut, DX'ing from Valhalla Beach, MB in early December, reported such catches as RFO Tahiti-738, JOAB-693 Tokyo, and various Russian longwave stations.

□ Reported to have returned to the airwaves: **KBRV-790 Soda Springs, Idaho** with a C&W format, and **WHGT-1590 Chambersburg, Pennsylvania** with Contemporary Christian. But reported OFF the air: **WLOP-1370 Jesup, Georgia** and **WLUA-1390 Belton, South Carolina**.

□ Jerry Starr reports: "I haven't been able to determine exactly how WHGT-1590 returned to the air, their towers/studios/etc have been bulldozed. I was able to determine that they have a recently issued STA which, of course, can't be read online. They have evidently sold the license to some church group from VA and have a LMA with them until the sale is approved. I would guess, but don't know for sure, that they might be diplexed into the new tower at WCBG-1380 which is the station they moved the WCBG call and programming to after 1590 went off the air. This is only a guess, they may have some sort of temporary facility on 1590 like a skirted tower or somesuch but I know the old 1590 facility is totally leveled . . ."

□ FCC Grants Experimental Licenses - If you live in Southern California near the El Centro Naval Air Facility, look for WD2XUM, an experimental station licensed to operate on 530, 890 and 1680 kHz under a Space and Naval Warfare Systems Center contract "to modernize and transform psychological operation equipment." The license was issued to the consulting engineering firm Hatfield and Dawson and noted by TV Tech columnist Doug Lung. (Radio World Online)

over the week of Thanksgiving when we were visiting Victoria, Texas. Victoria is about 100 air miles southwest of Houston just off the Gulf Coast. Also 100 air miles away but to the northwest is San Antonio. I was amazed at how poorly WOAI-1200 came in at night. A fair signal during the day, but after dark it faded in and out horribly. I heard SS behind WOAI at night, but never good enough to discern where it was coming from. By far, the best signal during the day (other than the two locals on 1340 and 1410) was KTRH-740 Houston. KCTA-1030 Corpus Christi, at about 80 miles, lit up 7 LEDs on the ICF-2010, and KTMR-1130 Edna, at 25 miles, lit 8. But KTRH was a solid 9, day and night. The most surprising catch while there was KGYN-1210 Guymon, Oklahoma at 600 miles. I heard it one morning at 0600 CST with their unmistakable ID. This was prior to their November pattern change time of 0730. Victoria AM radio is pretty lame. The 1410 station has a very irritating hum behind the signal 24 hours. I tried to visit them on a couple of occasions, but the studio was locked tight at what I thought would be regular business hours. In contrast, I found the chief engineer of Victoria's major TV facilities very friendly and amicable. They operate five stations out of one building. Two full power stations (19 and 25) and three LPTVs. That's all for now. Wishing all the best of DX. BILL
