Common Mode Chokes … From Fred Vobbe: "A note from Tim Duffy K3LR suggests NRCers with some technical abilities might want to read an article by Chuck Counselman W1HIS about common mode chokes. These fairly inexpensiveto-make units when installed on antenna feed lines, power cables, etc may "sustantially reduce your received noise level". That construction cannot be completed until KKJY no longer occupies the site, and <u>Clear Channel</u> has requested that KKJY move to its new location as soon as possible so as to resolve the STA. Expedited processing of this and the KRKE applications will enable <u>Vanguard Media</u> (KKJY and KRKE's owner) to continue providing uninterrupted broadcast service to its community of license by both KKJY and KRKE. #### HEAR AND THAR

□ Fines: WLTH-1370 Gary, Indiana has been assessed \$4,000 for tower lighting violations. And also on 1370, WWCB in Corry, Pennsylvania has been fined \$8,000 for 'repeated violations' of not maintaining their Emergency Alert System.

□ One of the first shortwave stations I remember hearing was HCJB, 'The Voice of the Andes'. On May 6th, per the station, they aired their final English-language broadcasts on international shortwave. The Christian station's English Language Service, the organization said, is shifting its em-

phasis toward teaching English as a second language. "English was one of the first two languages, along with Spanish, to air when the station began broadcasting in Quito on Christmas Day, 1931," it said in a statement. It quoted station Director Doug Weber calling the move a refocusing or "taking some of the resources that we've been using on the broadcasts and focusing that into English-as-a-second-language (ESL) things-programming that will go out on our other (mostly Spanish) outlets." The statement continued: "We've had a very loyal audience and we're grateful to them," Weber said of the nearly 75 years of relationship via the radio. "And we're grateful to the Lord as well for the opportunity to be able to minister to so many people through our English-language broadcasts for so many years." - [From Radio World Online]

### **Newfoundland DXpedition #16** April 11-19, 2006 Round Cove, Cappahayden Preliminary report by Bruce Conti

Although I spent almost as much time in transit between Boston and Cappahayden as I did at the DXpedition, it was well worth the trip. Mechanical problems and the St. John's fog devil made air travel a challenge, but the reward was some exotic African DX - the primary focus of this DXpedition. Although not quite as impressive as Africa, Latin American reception produced a few nice catches too, including a new *Radio Nacional de Colombia* outlet on **680 kHz**, HJZO Sabanagrande per the Ministerio de Comunicaciones website station list (www.mincomunicaciones.gov.co). Under rather auroral conditions, not much effort was directed toward Europe, essentially dominated by short-haul signals from France, Portugal, Spain, UK, and others typically received at home in New Hampshire.

One other note of interest: My rental car in Newfoundland was equipped with XM Satellite Radio. Reception must have been via terrestrial boosters located in St. John's as frequent dropouts rendered it unlistenable en route outside the city.

While the process of compiling logs from notes and recordings is underway, here's a hit list of entries from my logbook. Some of these might be worthy targets for DX ventures to coastal locations this summer.

# **DXing in French Polynesia** By Ben Dangerfield

In April my wife and I flew to Tahiti and took a two week cruise on the Paul Gauguin that took us northward through the other Society Islands through the Tuamotu group to the Marquesa Islands and then back. I had with me my recently acquired Degen-1103, good headphones, my Quantum-Q-Stick ferrite antenna and some pages from the WRTH. The DE-1103 is very sensitive, has continuous - not digital- tuning and can fit into one's pocket. It cost me only \$75 but is far superior to the Sony 100S that cost \$365. It does very well on all bands but I used only the MW band. The Q-Stick augments weak signals to varying degrees but I plan to have my Kiwa pocket loop repaired for future use. It was impossible to DX from inside the cabin so I went out each night on deck after 2130 local time to do my listening when it was late enough to catch New Zealand and Australia. Our location was six hours behind EDST. I was able to log eight countries plus two tentatives. Average mileage from our ship's positions to New Zealand was 2600 to 3300; to Australia, 4000 to 4600; to Hawaii, 2600; to West Coast North America, 3600 to 4600; to Calgary 4600; to San Antonio, 4000; to Salt Lake City and Denver, 4300; to Tulsa, 4600; to Ecuador, 4300; to Chile, 4600. Those were the places I heard from. I have listed below most of the stations heard, by frequency, although the loggings were throughout the cruise, not all on one night.

- 594 **PORTUGAL** *R.Renascença*, Muge Full data QSL card received in 6 weeks for one IRC. The signer's name is illegible, but the title is "Director." My second QSL from Portugal. I sent a letter in English, as well as a computer-translated version in Portuguese (yes these are almost laughable!). The QSL card looks as yellowed as some of my shortwave QSL cards from the 1960's, so an incorrect address there. But the return address on the envelope is as in the 2006 WRTH: Grupo Renascença, Rua Ivens 14, 1249-108 Lisboa. This is MW/LW TA QSL #50. [Renfrew-NY]
- 1125/1134 **CROATIA** Full data QSL received from *HRT* in less than a month for a reception from the Croatian shortwave transmitter site in Deanovec. The same contact ought to work for any-one looking for an *HRT* 1125/1134 QSL. I included a prepared card (which was used), SASE and an IRC. Here's the address and contact: Dane Pavlic Head of Station, Hrvatska Radio, Prisavlje 3, 10000 Zagreb, Croatia. I have previously received a QSL for the MW station, but it took a number of years, with multiple follow-ups to get it. This ought to be an easier avenue. [Renfrew-NY]

#### International News

- WESTERN SAHARA: From some months ago I have been reading DX reports placing the 711 Saharan station in Dakhla (Villa Cisneros when it was part of Spain) instead Laâyoune (El Aaiún in its Spanish times). I think this is not correct. Laâyoune-El Aaiún is/was the main city of the territory. *RNE* placed there the main radio station with a second station (mainly a relay) in Dakhla-Villa Cisneros. For the record, the ITU International Frequency List, 4th edition, Volume I, 1 Feb 1967 only shows the Laâyoune-El Aaiún station: AOE EAJ203 651'5 kHz 100 kW. So the EAJ202 station in Dakhla-Villa Cisneros had to be registered later. Morocco invaded the Western Sahara in 1975 taking the control of RTVE stations. Historically these stations have maintained its respective frequencies (with minor changes to agree with the ITU plans). Laâyoune powerful (it is the Capital) and Dakhla lower (it is a smaller city). Then, why it seems that they have interchanged now? I have found some references to a *RTM* web site giving that information. But I have not found that site! Anyway I think (really: I'm sure) that info is not correct. You can check the official RTM-Radio Laâyoune site to discover that nothing has changed. They announce its traditional MW frequency: 711 kHz and 91.1 FM. You can find the schedule for its programs in Spanish too. www.radiolaayoune.ma/ carte.htm. [Mauricio Molano, NRC e-DXN]
