

FROM THE VAST WESTLAND

- ▲ For at least the third time this winter, an ice storm has toppled at least one broadcast tower in the **Vast Westland! Patrick Griffith** reports that the 500-foot tower of KRBC TV9 Abilene TX came down on Sunday night 1/15.
- A This ice storm (really several individual ones) was severe. From about January 12 through 15, it coated many areas from the Southwest to New England with up to several inches of ice. **J. E. Lewis** was in Fayetteville AR during the storm, and reports on his trip back to Kansas City: "I got back to KC around noon on 1/16. From Bella Vista AR (the last city in northwest AR before entering MO) all the way past Carthage MO and north I witnessed the most complete devastation with trees destroyed or bent, scores of abandoned vehicles, truckers who had just given up and were stopped, buildings with caved-in roofs, and many residences and businesses without power." Look below for J. E.'s station observations in the aftermath of the storm.
- A Besides the disastrous ice storm, weather has been a problem in other ways. From Winnipeg on 1/14, **Shawn Axelrod** reports: "Been very cold here, -20 to -38 C. I thought the DX froze up but managed two new ones at sunrise. Hoping the temps and the DX both warm up." Nothing like a little hot DX to chase away the winter cold!
- All this talk of winter, and this is DX News' last publication date before Groundhog's Day. I for one will be cheering for the clouds! 73 Bill

There was a visible aurora in Chicago in mid-December. I went out to a relatively dark area late in the evening, but didn't see anything. The AM band sounded surprisingly normal, except that WLOC was dominating 1150. One of the last trips of 2006 was in that direction with a drive around Lake Superior in early October. Not much radio activity up there, but I was pleased to hear that CKPR-580 was still on the air. I've since read that this station's days, like so many familiar Canadians, are numbered. I haven't done that much modern-day DXing this season, but conditions seem better this year than last, and there have even been a few new stations heard. Locally, the big news recently was the WVON/WRLL 1450/1690 switch. It reminded me of the WVON move from 1450 to 1390, replacing WNUS. I remember the snowy afternoon in February 1975 that this dramatic change took place (it was on one of my tapes!). Also, WSQR is a daytime regular on new 1180. I haven't gotten them yet on the one-watt night power. This year's big year-end project was to transfer many of the old cassette tape DX recordings to digital audio files, using a software and connection package called Inport. I did many of the 1970s and early 1980s AM tapes, and a sampling of shortwave. It was more fun than I thought it would be, and more than once I found myself saying, "Wow, I really did hear that!" The quality of recording was surprisingly good (the oldest tapes were from 1972) but the audio level was low on some of the oldest recordings. There were also a few problems with cassettes, such as difficulty in rewinding, uneven playback speed and the end of the tape separating from the spool. A note for history buffs: I bought a few RADEX magazines from the 1930s on eBay. Very interesting if you're interested in the history of DXing. 73 and best wishes to all in 2007!
