


Music Radio: A Review

The enjoyment of old time radio (OTR) is not the same as the enjoyment of the DX hobby, but the hobbies are related through the programming aspects, and some of us enjoy interests. The enjoyment of OTR can take the form of remembering the actual good old days of the golden age of radio (about 1930 into the fifties) if one was born soon enough, listening to reruns of some programs on some broadcasting stations, listening to OTR audio streams on the Internet, or listening to and collecting your own OTR product.

Like any hobby, OTR has developed a library of current and prior books about radio programming. One that I have enjoyed will be covered in this review.

The book's complete title is: *Music Radio The Great Performers and Programs of the 1920s Through Early* <u>1960s.</u> The author is Jim Cox. Jim, whom I met at an OTR convention in El Segundo, CA three years ago, is not only a very pleasant man, but he is a prolific author of OTR books. I won't list them all here, but they include books about radio soap operas, crime fighters, audience participation shows, and the fading of the golden age of radio into the early stages of what we know now as broadcast programming.

Music Radio is basically a history of music as it was programmed by American radio broadcasting. Many names of artists and groups are found in the book as well as sponsors, dates and times of broadcasts, and the networks carrying the programs. It not only contains history, some anecdotes, and insider viewpoints, but in the book Jim introduces the various covered subjects by some informed and expert analysis of the material covered in that chapter.

I will list the chapters here so that the variety of musical themes he covers will be better understood: The Bell Telephone Hour; The Big Bands; The Bing Crosby Show; The Chamber Music Society of Lower Basin Street; Cities Service Concerts; The Classics; The Contests; The Disc Jockeys; The Fred Waring Show; Grand Ole Opry; The Horse Operas; The House Bands; The Hummert Musicales; The Kate Smith Show; The Railroad Hour; The Sacred Singers; The Vocalists; The Voice of Firestone; and Your Hit Parade.

I will cheerfully loan this book to any AWA member if someone else is not using it, so let me know if you are interested in borrowing it, and let our editor know if you want more book reviews. My small radio library includes mostly OTR subjects, although I also have some antique radio histories and price guides.

DDXD-West

FROM THE VAST WESTLAND

- You may remember that in the last DDXD-W **John Tucker** described a recent DXpedition that he made to Utah. Among his activities, John made a station visit to KMTI 650 Manti UT. As it turns out, this visit resulted in a very positive development for DXers. Working with station engineer Doug Barton, John arranged for KMTI to run a DX test! The test will be on Monday morning 3/19 at 0200-0400 ELT, and details will be found on the Front Page of this issue. A big "THANK YOU," John, and may this test be very successful! And as always, we welcome and appreciate *your* loggings of this test.
- A reminder—this current issue of *DX News* is the last weekly for Volume 74. The next three issues are biweeklies. DDXD-West deadlines (all Thursdays) for these three issues are: #23 3/8, #24 3/22 and #25 4/5, for e-mail received by 1300 ELT and snail mail received in that day's USPS delivery.
- And speaking of ELT, on 3/11 Daylight Savings Time returns, a full three weeks ahead of past years. This means that it is time for our twice-a-year reminder of how we keep logging times in DDXD-West. All loggings that appear in DDXD-W must be reported in Eastern Local Time, or ELT. That means reporting them in Eastern Daylight Time when it is in effect and Eastern Standard Time the rest of the year. For most of us, this is a seamless process: the difference between Eastern Time and our local time remains constant year round. However, there are exceptions. In those areas that do not observe Daylight Savings Time, the difference increases by one hour during the DST period.
- A The common theory of why *DXN* goes to biweeklies this time of year is that the AM DX season is winding down. Au contraire, my fellow **Vast Westlanders**! The *real* reason is to give you more time to write up and send in the big bonanza of loggings that this part of the year brings! So here is looking forward to seeing *your* loggings in the next three *large* columns! **73 Bill**



It has been many years since my observations have graced these pages. I am elated to give Dave some work, and to reconnect with DX friends. While living in metropolitan New York, with few open frequencies, and other hobbies, DX'ing took a back seat. However, after 30 years, I have retired from my training manager's job at Metro-North Railroad, and Ann and I moved to from southwestern CT to our condo up here in the White Mountains of New Hampshire. We are building a small house several miles away, and the DX'ing will be superb. I have already walked all over the property with my Grundig S350, and even during the day the radio pulls in stations from Rhode Island, New York State, and beyond. The Montreal and Boston radio stations compete in strength here. Only one local station is here, WPNH-1300. The station is actually from a PC at WFTN-1240, Franklin, and it totally simulcasts that station, with absolutely no local news or information. At night, the station goes to 82 watts, and 1300 is dominated, usually at local strength by WTMM, Rensselaer, NY with ESPN sports feed. WTMM's night pattern is due north from six towers next to the Amtrak line just south of the Albany - Rensselaer station, but the signal certainly rolls east! Back in the early 1980's, when living in Chalfont, PA, I would pick up WPNH's 5:57am detailed sign on, and three minutes later, WIMG-Trenton would sign on, burying WPNH. WPHN never bothered to verify my reception reports, even then, when the station had employees, studios and offices in an old house. The former radio station's building now houses the Plymouth State University campus police. I doubt if WPNH would now verify reception reports. The station is automated from 35 miles south of here, in Franklin, an all that is in Plymouth is the transmitter shack, and a short 150 foot tower behind a trailer park north of town. At the Franklin facility is the automated WFTN-1240 computer (WFTN stands for "Franklin - Tilton"), and several FM stations. With retirement, I am enjoying all of my hobbies, including DX'ing, and railroad travel and photography, mountain climbing and hiking, and travel, as well as doing work for the church.
