went silent. NewCap Radio's, *The FOX 970AM* Edson is no longer active. The station moved to the 94.3 FM Frequency earlier this summer with a much

better signal for Edson and area. 970AM has a long history in Alberta. It initially went active at 10,000 watts on April 4th of 1968 as the first Transmitter for Yellowhead Broadcasting. Yellowhead Broadcasting then added an AM repeater in Jasper and eventually expanded further with transmitters in Grande Cache, Whitecourt & Hinton. In 1999 Yellowhead Broadcasting sold the YR Radio Group to Nornet Broadcasting/Okanagan Skeena Group. Several transfers of ownership happened since then with Newcap taking the majority interest in March 2002. NewCap has made major investments since then upgrading Jasper & Hinton to FM Frequencies. Whitecourt was granted originating station status and is now a stand alone operation with a full compliment of staff. Edson moved into a new larger studio facility in December 2004 and flipped to a Classic Hits Format in the spring of 2005. In 2006 the Edson facility became a regional hub for NewCap Alberta and doubled its staff to 16 employees. On February 1st 2007 NewCap received approval to flip 970AM to FM. Testing of the FM Frequency started in July with a very positive response from both listeners and advertisers. [via Shawn Axelrod]

If any member might wish to consider taking on a portion of the job, I would encourage them to contact Paul or any board member.

We would hate to see the NRC end up in a position where publishing the DX News magazine would become impossible due to the lack of volunteers to assist the club in accomplishing the task.

We'd like to urge those in the membership that may be able to fill all or part of the position that Paul has held to give serious consideration to the future of *DX News* and the National Radio Club.

(Allow me to add a few words to what Wayne has written. It goes without saying, almost, that I would serve as a sort of defacto consultant to the person or persons who took over my job. Laying out and publishing the magazine is relatively easy for anyone who has any kind of DTP experience; prepping the magazine for mailing is another matter, and right now I employ two "mailing technicians" [as I call them, when they ask for job references] who can label and tape DXN within about 90 minutes. Altogether, my publishing activities take perhaps 5-7 hours a week: downloading articles sent to me via e-mail attachments; laying out DXN, updating the mailing database and printing labels, and supervising mailout and transporting DXN to the local BTDC [bulk mail center]. Maintaining e-DXN and serving as membership manager add a few more hours. In other words, it may be time and not skill which ultimately determine whether or not YOU might be the one to become DXN publisher -pls.)

### FROM THE VAST WESTLAND

- △ Clocks are now set back to Standard time, and with the latest changeover has come another backtracking in the size of the **Vast Westland**. DDXD-W readers may recall that in April 2006 the **VW** experienced a territorial expansion when eight Indiana counties switched from Eastern to Central time, to coincide with the start of that year's DST (see DDXD-W #73-25). However, at the start of this year's DST (3/11), this expansion was partly reversed. That's because one of the eight counties, Pulaski, returned to Eastern Time (see DDXD-W #74-29). Now we have learned of more sad news for the Vast Westland. Effective 11/4 with the end of 2007 DST, five more counties-- Daviess, Dubois, Knox, Martin and Pike (all in the southwest tip of the state) crossed back to the Eastern zone, leaving only two, Starke and Perry, still on Central time. The reason for this back-and-forth switching has to do with the role that the US Department of Transportation has in setting time zones. Under the Uniform Time Act of 1966 it is the US DOT that has the responsibility and authority to do just that. It was the decision of the US DOT, not the state or the local counties, to change the time zone of the eight. It is the US DOT that, upon petition of the counties, has reversed its original decision for six of the eight (Perry's petition was denied; Starke never petitioned). If one lesson is to be learned, it is that time zoning in the State of Indiana remains a contentious, sensitive issue, as it has for many years. As for the **Vast Westland**, things could be worse. According to a Wikipedia article on the topic, from 1918 to 1961 the whole state was in the Central time zone. In 1961 the east half of the state was moved to Eastern Time, and by 1967 all but 10 counties were in the Eastern Time zone. So at least the westward trend has been stopped, and we have had a net gain of two counties.
- ▲ In last week's issue we reported that a DX test (WCXH) went off one hour later than scheduled. This week we must report that there was a last-minute change in the timing of the 11/4 WIGG test, moving it up one hour from its published time (from 0500 to 0400 ELT). As big an inconvenience as these changes were, we must recognize that they can and do happen. I urge you: if you have internet connection, keep yourself updated through any of several sources to make sure a test is going off at its scheduled time. Good sources: the various club listservs, including the NRC's, the e-DX News website http://e-dxn.com (you do *not* have to be an e-DXN member to view the "Broadcast Tests" section), or (my personal favorite) the DX Tests.Info site http://www.dxtests.info. And-- if you learn of a change by one of these methods, please pass the word along to any DX friend who might not know.
- ▲ In this issue **Dale Park** of Hawaii and **René Auvray** of Nevada both send along loggings from the latest of their periodic visits to California, Dale in the North and René in the South. René observes: "As I file from Los Angeles the AMs here doing IBOC are KLAC 570, KOGO 600 (San Diego), KSPN 710, KBRT 740, KABC 790, KFWB 980, KNX 1070, KDIS 1110." Dale too paid close attention to HD during his trip, and has HD observations in many of his loggings-- who are running it and how bad it interferes. This is only some of the great information to be found in this week's column.
- △ This issue of *DXN* is the last to reach your mailbox before Thanksgiving. It affords me an ideal opportunity to thank all the great contributors to this column. It is you who are proving in issue after issue that, in this brave new world of harsh listening conditions, DX is still a vibrant, viable hobby. Your loggings document that fact. Thank you, and may this be the start of a great Holiday season for us all! Bill 73

Even good old 1134 Croatia is often buried up to its neck! The NRC Long Distance Contest interests me and I will try and dig out some entries. I can come up with Australia, New Zealand, North Korea and South Africa. India, too, if I am allowed an unverified entry. I trust Bruce to calculate the correct distances. All long ago, of course.

It should peak in December with good audio, at least down here in Florida. I'd be interested in how it fares in other parts of the country. At 9700 miles it's a good catch. Nov 8 - Far East carriers noted 1120-1150 UTC; 963, 747 strong, 567, 693 good carriers. LSR 1142 UTC.

A periodic update of station testing activities

The results are in from the WIGG test last weekend. It looks like 1420 kHz was a tough frequency for many of us, but the test still made it out fairly well to the Midwest, the South, and somewhat to the East.

Bill Dvorak in Madison, WI says that after a careful review of his tapes he picked out some 1,000 Hz tones and several Morse code IDs from the test.

Up the road in Oak Creek, WI Tim Noonan reports, "I did hear the WIGG test – not very strong, but definite "WIGG" code.

Over in Taylors, SC, Chris Johnson says he had to dodge QRM from WHK, WKSR, and WVOT in order to pull out some Morse IDs and a long tone.

Taking advantage of the advertised phone number, Tom Jasinski in Shorewood, IL called and spoke with CE Paul Turner during the test. Tom copied code and tones through QRM from WHK and WVJS.

Bill "Philco Bill" Harms in Elkridge, MD says, "Got it! Clear Morse code ID ... lots of WHK and WVOT."

In St. Louis, MO Joe "Woz" Wozniak had trouble posting his results to the IRCA list on Sunday morning but no trouble hearing WIGG in spite of QRM from WOC, KTOE and co-channel local WIRL.

Not too far from Woz, Curtis Sadowski in Paxton, IL says "Hearing tones, code and music from WIGG AM 1420 DX test. The channel is crowded, but it's coming through well enough to be distinguished."

Brett Saylor in Central Pennsylvania says 1420 sounded more like a graveyard to him at times, but he still pulled out some tones and CW to add another Mississippi station to his log thanks to WIGG.

In Alcoa, TN, Steve Francis reports Floyd Cramer music along with tones and Morse code all combined to bring WIGG's signal into his shack, not heard since March 26, 1971, probably on a frequency

To the south, J.D. Stephens in Hampton Cove, AL (near Huntsville) says he had good copy of the WIGG test.

And your BTC Coordinator – Jim Pogue – visiting family in Durham, NC logged some tones and a Morse code ID, plus had a brief phone conversation with Paul during the test.

And finally, I got one e-mail (which I mistakenly deleted) from a DXer in Australia who said he heard some of the test via a recently reestablished DX Tuner in Florida!

Now the bad news: Lots of folks tried but were unable to hear the test due primarily to high QRM levels. These included Walt Salmani in Victoria, BC, Canada, Saul in Burnt River, ON, Canada, and Barry McLarnon in Ottawa, ON, Canada, who copied a mush of WHK, WACK, WBEC and WBSM but no WIGG. Others trying for the test were Jim Renfrew in Holley, NY, Rich Brock near Pittsburgh, PA, Mike Stonebridge in St. Isidore, AB, Canada, Phil Bytheway in Seattle, WA, Patrick Martin in Seaside, OR, Jerry Ervine in McAllen, TX who had lots of Radio Formula but no WIGG, and Paul Walker in SC.

Thanks to everyone who tried for the test, and congratulations to those who logged it.

We still have several more tests in the works in addition to those which have already been announced, plus another whole slug of requests to go out. Check the DXTESTS.INFO Web site frequently and listen to the BTC Podcasts for news and late-breaking developments.
