
DX Time Machine From the pages of DX News

50 years ago ... from the November 30, 1957 DXN: A number of members reported receiving nice verie letters in English from XERC-790, Radio Éxitos, Mexico City. Stan Morss, Bradford, MA, reported that XERC was a sister to XEQR-1030 and used the same stationery.

25 years ago ... from the December 6, 1982 DXN: Carl Dabelstein, DX'ing in Fairbanks, AK reported extremely poor reception on his TRF: only the three locals plus KJNP in North Pole during early October, plus KFQD-750 Anchorage while driving in a higher location near the university complex.

10 years ago: ... from the December 1, 1997 DXN: Jim Weber, Lancaster, PA reported a problem with static on the radio in his new '98 Ford Contour, which was alleviated by installation of static collectors in the rear of the car. He reported, though, that he could hear some static, especially below 700 kHz but could still hear enough to DX on higher frequencies.

- A John Wilkins of Wheat Ridge CO has kept us updated on the Denver/Boulder market's IBOC situation for a long time. This week John has some good news and some bad news about the situation there. The bad news first: KMXA 1090 has started up their adjacent channel hash-maker, the 14th market AM to do so (currently the station is running it daytime only). Now for the good news: on or around 11/9 John noted that three locals, KHOW 630, KKZN 760 and KLDC 1220, had their IBOC turned off. John reports that on 11/15 KKZN turned its IBOC back on (but not before he logged a couple of stations on 770, including a needed call change-- see "Regular Loggings" below). As was true before its IBOC downtime, KKZN is running it daytime only. As of the morning of 11/16, John reports, the other two remain IBOC-less; whether for good (or if not for how long) is anyone's guess.
- ▶ Besides John's contribution, there are several other interesting items in the "Station News" section and more news on the 1181 "mystery signal" in the "TIS, HAR, etc." section of this week's column. This is a good opportunity to remind all readers that you don't have to send in loggings to contribute. If you have station news, please send it in. This is being done so that WCPT (Air America Radio) will have a stronger signal. (BF-IL) Per Chicago Tribune and Chicago Sun-Times, owner Newsweb will switch its stations' frequencies 11/26, with WCPT and its liberal talk moving to 820 and WAIT going to 850. This will double WCPT's power to 5 kW and extend its reach to Milwaukee and Kankakee. It will be the second time the WAIT callsign will be on 850. Also, Relevant Radio's contract to lease WAIT for Catholic programming ends 11/25. (DP-HI) (With Relevant

- Radio gone, Chicago Sun Times media columnist Robert Feder reported on 11/9 that WAIT 850's new format will be brokered programming. **Ed.-WI**) 970 **KHTY CA Bakersfield.** Noted in amlogbook.com as changing format to SS newstalk. Heard here with non-ID as "Doble-U Radio, Bakersfield, California" (perhaps a call change is coming?) during a call-in program sounding a lot like the "saludos" and "mensajes" programs that used to be on some South American shortwave stations. (DS-CA) (No call change as of this column's deadline. Ed.-WI) **KKEE OR Astoria.** Adds Stephanie Miller and Randi Rhodes per their shows 11/1; 1230 format change from sports? (**DP-HI**) (Yes. According to the station's website http://www.kkee1230.com, the station's new slogan is "The Talk Alternative" and the lineup is very much liberal talk. Besides Miller and Rhodes, the station carries Ed Schultz, Thom Hartmann and Alan Colmes. Ed.-WI) 1260 **KGIL CA** Beverly Hills. 10/10 1915-2000. Noted in amlogbook.com as having changed to these calls, ex-KMZT. Heard here with a new format, ex-classics "K-Mozart." They are now newstalk weekdays, "LA's News-Talk Radio," and standards weekends. Sunday afternoon/early evening programming on 11/11 was standards, with slogans like "This is Southern California's home for the Great American Songbook, 1260-AM KGIL" and "The songs you love are right here on KGIL." (KGIL were the calls of the station when I started MW DXing in the early '60s. Back then the CoL was San Fernando, not Beverly Hills.) (DS-CA) Per Los Angeles Times and Inland Valley Daily Bulletin, KMZT dropped its callsign and classical format 10/29 and brought back its old call letters and not one but two previous formats, newstalk and adult standards. The station features longtime talker Michael Jackson plus "Larry King Live," "Wall Street Journal This Morning," Neil Boortz, Dr. Joy Browne, and news from the AP and Metro networks. Adult standards are aired weeknights at 2200-0900 and weekends. (**DP-HI**) **KUMU** 1500 HI Honolulu. 10/27. Noted airing Sporting News Radio's "Sporting Newsflash" at ToH instead of CNN Radio news. Found out later CNN news has been cut back to daytime hours weekdays only. The only other stations in Hawaii with CNN are KAHU1060 (on tape delay, no less) and KHNR 650 (Headline News used as filler). (DP-HI) 1560 **WMBH MO Joplin.** Silent station noted back on the air again (see DDXD-W #75-6 Ed.-WI), but not on full schedule. (JRT-MO) **DX** Tests 940 WFAW+ WI Fort Atkinson. 11/12 0100-0400. DX test heard on recording with CW ID around 0101:40 into sweep tones. Sweep tones also heard at 0125, but nothing heard on later recordings. QRM from KPSZ IA and CJGX SK. Thanks to all who arranged and conducted the test! (BW-OK) WI Fort Atkinson. 11/12 0100-0400. Heard, but surprisingly poorly given my 940 WFAW+ location only maybe 35 miles from Fort Atkinson. CINW Montreal was by far the dominant signal (with Rollye James / Coast to Coast) with CJGX Yorkton fair when CINW was looped. Heard two sets of sweep tones at 0101 and 0105. May have heard some rather fast Morse around 0110, then another set of sweep tones at 0117. To be honest I've heard WFAW better back in Nashville! (DS-WI) 940 WFAW+ WI Fort Atkinson. 11/12 0100-0400. The overall quality of the reception of the AM 940 WFAW DX Test was unfortunately poor. Due to the very weak signal quality, I was unable to observe any voice identifications or the "Christmas Music" as indicated through radio club web sites. I was able to copy many Morse code identifications and sweep tones. Man-made interference (QRM) was also rated as poor and was caused by the following stations: WCND Shelbyville KY; KPSZ Des Moines IA; WMIX Mount Vernon IL; KIXZ Amarillo TX and an unidentified station with Spanish/Mexican format. CHWO-AM 740 Toronto, which has been family run since 1956, has been sold (pending CRTC approval) and no doubt some changes will be coming. We have heard that the general format will not change for now but that's about it. The new owner may not want to continue having someone issuing QSL cards on their behalf. I will certainly do my best to convince them in hopes this will continue.

Last year they celebrated their 50th birthday since the station first started up on November 17th, 1956 on 1250 kHz and the 6th anniversary since moving onto 740 kHz back on January 8th, 2001. It has been in the same family all this time and NEVER changed format.

- (a) Program material (at least 10 minutes of specific program material heard: e.g., name of announcer, commercials heard, news items, song title and artist, etc. You can also make a short recording of the sta-

tion and send it as an MP3 provided it contains some of the specific program material noted earlier);

(b)Signal/sound report (a general overview of how well you heard the signal at your location and the sound quality of the program.);

(c)Mention of the type of equipment and antenna you were using to hear the signal is helpful information as well.

- 4/ You can send the reports in after each date or together after January 8, but I must have both for the special QSL.
- 5/ If you plan to go after the special QSL, mark your reports as 'Special QSL.' A report for November 17th but not followed up by one on January 8th will receive a regular QSL only (unless you already have received one in the past.) I will post repeat announcements prior to each date.
