*From the pages* of DX News 50 years ago ... from the "lost" listings: September 17, 1958: There were enthusiastic comments from members, including Dick Cooper, Kittanning, PA, and Frencis Nittler, Denver, CO who had attended the NRC Convention over the Labor Day weekend at Findlay, OH, hosted by Mr. and Mrs. Elbert Tewell. Stan Morss, Bradford, MA, said that it must have been the best convention ever because he got less sleep than ever before ... From the February 14, 1959 DXN: Len Kruse, Dubuque, IA reported that the DX broadcast from WDBQ-1490 on 1/26 garnered about 50 receptions reports, including 9 from New Zealand, and that a tape recording by Ken Mackey, Dunedin, NZ, of a portion of the broadcast was "amazingly clear".

25 years ago ... from the February 13, 1984 DXN: The death of Carleton Lord, "Count de Veries", on January 24, 1984, was noted.

10 years ago ... from the February 15, 1999 DXN: IDXD editor Jim Renfrew commented on how strange it was for him to listen to SRS-725 from Suriname in the '60's, with a language he couldn't understand, and playing "White Room" by the Cream as he listened in his white room in Connecticut!





### A New Slider Loopstick for the Sangean DT-200VX A Revolutionary Sensitivity Boost for Another Ultralight Model By Gary DeBock

<u>Introduction</u>: Last summer, a group of determined Washington state experimenters combined resources in pursuit of a single goal-- greatly improving the DXpedition performance of the Eton E100 Ultralight radio. Major breakthroughs were gained in boosting both sensitivity and selectivity, with thrilling DX results. The major sensitivity boost was obtained by the development of the "Slider" loopstick, an innovative antenna design in which a movable coil can slide along a large ferrite bar, allowing DXers to peak weak AM signals on the loopstick itself (as opposed to securing the coil at the 600 kHz

peak position, which is the standard alignment procedure.) This provides not only a huge sensitivity boost over the stock unit, but an extra tuned circuit to aid in selectivity, and filter out unwanted image and spurious signals. The experimental breakthrough of the Eton E100 "Slider" loopstick has brought extreme sensitivity within the reach of Ultralight radio DXers, and provided a final solution to the problem of limited high or low-band AM sensitivity in digital pocket radio designs.

The Sangean DT-200VX is another digital Ultralight radio with a medium wave front end design very similar to that of the Eton E100, and it also suffers from limited sensitivity bandwidth, in stock form. Throughout the



highly successful E100 experimentation, I was certain that the same concepts would apply equally well in transforming the DT-200VX receiver into an ultra-sensitive DX chaser, and was eager to carry out such experiments at the earliest opportunity.

Why a DT-200VX Slider model? With the fully modified E100 such a stellar performer, some may wonder about the necessity of transplanting a Slider loopstick into this 450 kHz IF model, given the lack of premium IF filter upgrades, and the recent decision of Sangean to terminate this model in favor of the new DT-400W Ultralight radio. The most logical reason is that the DT-200VX is identical to the DT-400W in loopstick design, and that the Slider model developed for the DT-200VX will surely be a stellar performer in the new DT-400W design. And with both the E100 and DT-200VX no longer manufactured, the DT-200VX / DT-400W Slider design is likely to be increasingly important as dealers exhaust their stock of the discontinued models, leaving the DT-400W as one of the very few Ultralight radios in production benefiting greatly from the Slider loopstick modification. Although this transplant task is certainly more challenging than the E100 Slider loopstick project, it should be well within the capability of hobbyists with moderate technical experience.

<u>The DT-200VX stock loopstick</u> Although it is unfortunately buried at the bottom of the radio in both the DT-200VX and DT-400W models (to avoid digital hash in the upper cabinet), the stock loopstick's design is commendable, and it has the most ferrite in the Ultralight class at 2.15" x .3" (54 x 7 mm). It would be far more effective in an isolated position, and experimenters have discovered a major boost in DT-200VX sensitivity results from simply mounting the stock loopstick outside the cabinet. Four loopstick coil leads connect to two separate coils, one of which is wound piggyback on top of the other. The base coil has an inductance of .196 microhenries at the 600 kHz peak position on the stock loopstick, while the much smaller piggyback coil has an inductance of .016 microhenries at the same 600 kHz peak. The four stock Litz wire connections from the loopstick to the RF circuit board are notoriously flimsy, and easily separate from their miniscule connecting terminals (as the author has repeatedly discovered to his regret, during loopstick transplant experiments). Despite this, the replacement 40/44 Litz wire is both sturdy and extremely effective, with optimum results on all AM band frequencies.

<u>Plan of attack</u> A Slider loopstick system consisting of a 7.5" x .5" Amidon type 61 ferrite bar wound with a movable system of two 40/44 Litz wire coils should provide a huge sensitivity boost for this DT-200VX design. Optimum sensitivity should be uniform throughout the AM band, and the Slider system should also provide a measure of selectivity to compensate for the huge sensitivity boost, with some additional spurious signal rejection. The new Slider loopstick will be mounted in an isolated position well separated from the upper cabinet's digital hash, and should provide greatly enhanced nulling ability relative to the buried stock loopstick.

<u>Tools, materials and skills required</u> The major challenge of this project will be soldering the 40/44 Litz wires to extremely tiny terminals on the RF circuit board. A bus wire coil attachment on the tip of

a standard soldering iron will be necessary, to avoid frying adjacent components, or creating unwanted solder bridges. The four Litz wires will be routed through a hole in the cabinet's right side, created by removal of the "Lock" function plastic switch panel. The following tools will be required: Standard soldering iron with bus wire tightly wound at the tip, extending to a short point for actual

soldering (see photo)

Phillips screwdriver set

Diagonal cutters

Needle-nose pliers

The following materials will be required, in addition to a stock DT-200VX, plus belt clip:

One Type 61 Amidon 7.5" x .5" ferrite bar (available from http://www.amidoncorp.com for \$20 plus shipping, part # R61-050-750)

Approximately 20' of 40/44 Litz wire, available from Dave Schmarder at <u>thefiercerabbit@1n34a.com</u> (contact Dave first, to arrange the order, and confirm the material availability and shipping cost)

Coil form material (Johnson and Johnson 1" or 2" waterproof tape, or 5/8" black vinyl tubing, available at major hardware stores). Black vinyl coil forms will require adhesive to hold the coils on the forms, whereas waterproof tape forms will require a thin spacer (a cut-up credit card thin section works well) to place between the coil and .5" diameter base material (a router bit shank is ideal), when winding the coils. The spacer (pulled out and discarded after coil winding) ensures that coils will slide easily on the ferrite bar.

One or two plastic tie-wraps, depending upon the loopstick mounting system desired

- A plastic or plywood mounting system for the Slider loopstick. The photos show a plastic frame system, **attached by super-glue to the belt clip, inverted in the back slot**. This plastic frame was cut from a 48" plastic level offered by Ace Hardware (for \$10.)
- Rubber air hose shock mount sections, 1" long and .5" inner diameter (one or two, as desired by chosen design)

Shrink tubing as desired, to neatly route the four Litz wires to the Slider loopstick coils



Creating the Slider loopstick From the desired coil form material, cut a 2" long section and place it on the .5" diameter base material (router bit shank, or other slippery metal surface). Leaving 6'' lengths of Litz wire at the ends of each coil, wind a coil of 47 turns for the base coil, and 11 turns for the piggyback coil (which should begin 4 turns from the left edge of the base coil, the base coil edge which will be closest to the center of the ferrite bar). This will create a coil having a tuning range of approximately 3/8" (90 mm) from 530 kHz to 1710 kHz on the ferrite bar, with the 1710 kHz peak position about 1" (25 mm)

from the right end of the bar.

The stock loopstick has color-coded Litz wire connections to the circuit board, which are as follows:

Gold: base coil right lead (closest to the edge of ferrite bar) Black: base coil left lead Green: piggyback coil right lead (closest to the edge of ferrite bar)

Red: piggyback coil left lead

Cut the Litz wires fairly close to the stock loopstick, and remove the loopstick from the radio. The connections from the Slider loopstick to the circuit board will be made using the color coded stock Litz wires as a guide. Route the four Slider loopstick Litz wires through a 3" long shrink tubing section if desired (for a neat appearance), and pre-tin a very short section of bare wire on the ends of the Litz wires to aid in circuit board soldering. Using the color codes and the above list of coil connections, individually desolder each stock Litz wire and immediately connect the corresponding Slider loopstick lead in its place. The two connections for the piggyback coil are in an extremely tight area of the circuit

board, and will require steady nerves, and a bus wire attachment on the soldering iron (which should be held horizontally, to avoid having the bus wire attachment fall off accidentally). The four Slider loopstick wires are routed through an empty hole left by the removal of the "Lock" plastic switch plate, on the right side of the DT-200VX cabinet.

Securing the Slider loopstick For hobbyists using a plastic mounting frame, there are two options for mounting the loopstick, as shown in the photos. Two short rubber air hose shock mounts may be placed at the ends of the loopstick, secured by plastic tiewraps to the frame. Alternatively, one longer shock mount may be used on the left side of the loopstick, placed to ensure that the headphone jack is not obstructed. The plastic frame is glued to the flat surface of the belt clip, which is inverted and glued to the mounting slots near the top of the back panel.

Builders preferring a plywood mounting system can presum-



ably use a Velcro mounting system for the DT-200VX, like that described by John Bryant in the E100 Slider Loopstick article (currently posted on , in the Ultralight Radio File section). John has also published subsequent articles describing various ways of mounting the Slider loopstick, which would also apply for this DT-200VX Slider loopstick model in a plywood frame system..

<u>Resulting DX performance</u> The goal of this project was to provide a major sensitivity boost for the DT-200VX and DT-400W designs, making them competitive with the new E100 Slider units in weak-signal DX capability. Such a high sensitivity level is a very tough act to duplicate, with the new E100 Slider models demonstrating sensitivity equal or superior to even full-sized classic AM-DX portables. However, since identical loopstick material (type 61 ferrite and 40/44 Litz wire) was used, it was hoped that the resulting weak-signal ability would be similar.

No attempts were made to improve upon stock selectivity during this project, although Guy Atkins and others have published articles describing 450 kHz IF filter upgrades suitable for the DT-200VX. These filter upgrades will surely improve overall DX performance in the DT-200VX , but for the purposes of this project, the selectivity of the new DT-200VX Slider model will only be compared to that of the stock model (to judge whether the huge sensitivity boost has had any detrimental effect on selectivity), and to that of the E100 Slider-only model, the logical competing Ultralight design.

DT-200VX Slider vs. E100 Slider During the short period since its development, the E100 Slider model has already gained a rather impressive DXing reputation in the Ultralight Community. The newly designed DT-200VX Slider was tested thoroughly against this model, and a stock DT-200VX. For the purposes of this transplant experiment, the new DT-200VX Slider loopstick would ideally equal the new E100 Slider loopstick in sensitivity, and also not degrade the selectivity of the stock DT-200VX. For reference purposes, a stock ICF-2010 was also included in the sensitivity tests. The stock ICF-2010 is obviously superior to the other units in selectivity (with switchable filters), and was not included in the selectivity tests against these Ultralight models with only basic stock IF filters. Fresh batteries and alignments were provided for the units, prior to the Shootout (note that the ICF-2010 loopstick is fixed, and cannot be aligned).

<u>Slider Sibling Shootout</u> All four radios were tested during enhanced daytime DX conditions from 12:00PM to 2:00PM, December 28, 2008, in the typical suburban location of Puyallup, WA (35 miles south of Seattle). The stock ICF-2010 used the synch function during all testing, and both Slider loop-stick models had the coils carefully peaked on each received signal.

<u>Sensitivity Summary</u>: **Both Slider loopstick models had equal sensitivity across the AM ban**d. These models had a slight sensitivity edge over the stock ICF-2010 on the low end, which became more pronounced on the high end (especially on the X-band). The stock DT-200VX was not competitive with the other units, although its high band sensitivity was better than its low band performance (a common situation with stock DT-200VX models).

<u>Selectivity Summary</u>: **The E100 Slider model has a** *slight* **selectivity advantage over the new DT-200VX Slider unit**, because of the superior IF filter in the E100 stock unit. The DT-200VX Slider model has equivalent selectivity with the stock DT-200VX, however, avoiding any degradation due to the huge sensitivity increase provided by the Slider loopstick.

<u>DT-200VX Slider Model Verdict</u> The experimental goal of a huge sensitivity boost for this model has been entirely successful, with no degradation to the level of selectivity provided by the stock unit (which is typical of Slider loopsticks, which provide a slight measure of selectivity due to the additional RF tuned circuit, compensating for the greatly increased sensitivity). The ultimate DXing performance of this DT-200VX Slider model depends greatly on upcoming experimental efforts to upgrade the stock 450 kHz IF filter, which hopefully will be successful in providing a great selectivity boost in combination with the Slider loopstick's sensitivity boost (as was successfully performed in the E100, with the Murata CFJ455K5 455 kHz IF filter transplant). Without such selectivity improvement, the DT-200VX Slider model would still provide exciting weak-signal DXing opportunities for domestic DXers in rural locations, and moderate performance in urban and suburban locations. It would not quite equal the performance of the E100 Slider-only models with their superior IF filter, however, and would certainly fall far short of the fully-modified E100's (Slider + Murata IF filter) in transoceanic 9-kHz split performance.

<u>New Class of Supremely DX-Capable Portables</u> The successful combination of major sensitivity and selectivity improvements in the E100 Ultralight radio created an unusual DXing portable which is somewhat of an oddball—a commercially non-viable ultra-compact portable radio with overall AM-DXing performance exceeding that of any traditional stock portable. Obviously no manufacturer will design a new AM-DXing portable with a \$50 premium IF filter, or a 7.5" sliding-coil loopstick. Our market presence is not considered significant enough for such an investment.

With Eton's termination of the E100 model, experimenters are turning their attention to other Ultralight models which may be suitable for such a radical transformation, and this Sangean DT-200VX project (and ultimately the DT-400W) is one of these efforts. The C.Crane SWP model is also getting a great deal of attention as a candidate for radical transformation. Eventually, the experimental breakthroughs will provide many domestic and transoceanic DXers with access to these new supremely-capable compact

portables, regardless of our presumed irrelevance in the commercial market. As compact travel portables or even as basic DXpedition receivers, the newly transformed Ultralights have a lot to offer throughout this exciting New Year!
