

50 years ago ... from the March 28, 1959 issue of *DX News:* It was reported that Canadian facilities were upgraded as follows: CKY-580 to 50,000w U4; CKUA-580 to 10,000w U4; CKSO-790 to 10,000/5,000w U-4; CKBB-950 to 10,000/2,500w U4; CFPA-1230 to 10,000/250w U1; CHLP-1410 to 10,000w U3; and CHEF-1450 to 1,000/250w U1. From Aprl 4: Stan Morss, Bradford, MA, reported hearing a station on regular sked with woman announcer under XERF; it had news on the hour but he couldn't ID it. He receved a verie and tourist folder, both in English, Ffrom CMBN, Isle of Pines, however.





Shared tips and information from NRC members, both new and old

Greetings once again from the Heart of the Continent.

This month we will be taking a look at resources that can help you DX that are not on line. Yes I am referring to books. They have been around for hundreds of years and still serve a great purpose in our daily lives. The Internet has lots of uses but books still have a valuable place in the hobby. Here are some that I feel you can use to better your DX'ing experience.

NRC AM LOG This is an annual publication by the National Radio Club and lists all of the AM radio stations in Canada and the USA by frequency. There is a lot of information for each station including Frequency, callsign, address, power(s), antenna pattern(s), format slogans etc. This is a must have book for every North American DX'er or DX'er who is trying to DX North America. I would rate it five (5)

stars out of five (5). There are many DX'ers who contribute each year to the AM LOG to insure it is as accurate as possible. And if you read *DX News* you can update it each issue to make sure it is as good as it can be. I do all the call changes each issue so the LOG is accurate when I DX.

World Radio TV Handbook This book too is an annual publication and has been around since 1947. It started out as the World Radio Handbook but added the TV to the title in 1962. The book lists AM FM TV and Shortwave stations by country and by frequency. The publisher calls it a "Directory of Global Broadcasting". There is information such as frequency, callsign (where one is used), power used etc. The information is not as detailed as the NRC AM LOG for Canada and the USA but is an excellent source of information for stations around the world. They do put out updaters on line at: http://www.wrth.com/

The WRTH makes a great companion volume for DX'ers looking to DX stations outside of North America. As well as a listing of stations world wide each issue has reviews of equipment, various articles of interest to DX'ers, and a set frequency guides for various types of radio stations and by regions of the world. For those of you looking for Longwave broadcast stations this book has an excellent listing of stations from around the globe.

The Radio Book: The Ultimate Radio Station Desktop Reference This large reference guide (900 pages) claims to have information on 14,000 USA and Canadian radio stations. The publication has all sorts of information on each station including the Arbitron ratings. They cover AM and FM stations. One word of caution this is not a cheap book. The web site is <u>http://www.insideradio.com/radiodirectory.asp</u>

FM Atlas and Station Guide by Dr. Bruce F. Elving This is a time honoured publication that lists all the North American FM stations by frequency or by state/province. There are also maps of each state or province showing the location of stations. This book can be a great reference to identify FM stations parallel to the AM stations you are DX'ing.

A DX'ers Technical Guide by N Hall-Patch This is a compilation of technical information expressly for the medium wave DX'er. The book has extensive coverage of receivers, accessories, antennas (including loops) and circuit modifications for those of you who are technically minded.

I also would strongly encourage all of you to go The NRC publications section or review the list that comes in the DXN to see what other great books or pamphlets NRC has to sell. Some of them include:

National Radio Club Antenna Pattern Book - 6th Edition This is a great tool to see if you have a good chance at hearing the station you are targeting based on its transmission pattern. The night patterns of stations in the USA and Canada are mapped out.

Beverage and Longwire Antennas Design and Theory If you are looking to put out a beverage other than a BOG (Beverage On the Ground) as discussed in a previous column this is the book for you.

Antenna Reference Manual Volumes 1 2 and 3 These three books provide a wide variety of information on all types of antennas to improve your BCB DX'ing.

The County Cross Reference Here is an excellent resource to help you ID stations. There is a full listing of counties parishes etc. in Canada and the USA. If you here local news and they mention a county you can cross reference it here and help find out what station is a good match to what you are hearing.



Fun with Ultralights - with Gary DeBock

The first wave of the Chinese analog portable invasion has hit the west coast, and the Tecsunmanufactured models like the R911, R9012 (and others) are being received eagerly. DXers are having fun nulling out their semi-locals and even locals, receiving other stations right on the fundamental frequencies.

For those of you who have ordered one of these extremely cheap (around \$10, or under \$17 shipped) but highly capable portables, here are a few tips to help you get the maximum performance.

- 1) Place the whip antenna in the vertical position, before attempting AM DXing! This is EXTREMELY important in obtaining maximum sensitivity!
- 2) Perform the alignment procedure according to the pictorial uploaded to the Yahoo group site "Ultralightdx," in the photo section ("Chinese Analog AM Radio Alignment"). The procedure is extremely simple, and will help you not only get maximum AM sensitivity and selectivity, but also have coverage extended to 1700 kHz.
- 3) When using these radios' amazing nulling ability, use the tuning LED control to ensure that the local is fully nulled. When the LED goes out completely, the local is nulled. Tilting the radio slightly can sometimes improve nulling of the local.
- 4) Although locals and semi-locals can certainly be nulled in the daytime, your chances of receiving another station on your pests' frequencies increases at night, when the pests can have serious competition.
- 5) When fully aligned (AND with the whip antenna in the vertical position), these radios typically have sensitivity and selectivity comparable to the Sony SRF-59 and SRF-39FP analog models.
- 6) By the way, these \$10 radios also receive FM, and have multiple SW band coverage. Be thankful for the demographics of the Chinese domestic market, where Tecsun finds it profitable to sell these highly capable analog radios for a ridiculously low price. 73 and Have Fun.

The Kaito WRX911, Tecsun R911, Tecsun R9012 and other very inexpensive Chinese analog portables have been eagerly ordered recently, with hobbyists attracted by their superior nulling ability (not to mention the price of under \$10). To be honest, the factory alignment for these portables is rarely set at the optimum positions, and the Chinese-market units like the Tecsun R9012 do not cover the full X Band, and must be adjusted to cover up to 1700 kHz.

Uploaded to the Yahoo Group Site "Ultralightdx" is a pictorial of the alignment procedure for any of these Chinese portables, along with the procedure for adjusting the frequency coverage to include the entire X band. Both procedures are remarkably simple, and involve only removing the back panel, and making a few very accessible adjustments for peak performance.

If you have ordered one of these analog radios and have never done an alignment, the time to jump in and start is now! There will probably never be another model so easy to align, not to mention so cheap to replace.
