
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VOA Europe falls silent

WASHINGTON D.C. — Voice of America's 24 hour CHR station VOA Europe was due to go off-air in the early morning hours of Monday, February 3—a victim of the changing political climate in Europe.

The station's nine employees, including six full-time presenters—all based in Washington D.C.—have been made redundant. The closure of the station marks an end to a two-year

period during which efforts were made to privatise VOA Europe, after the U.S. government subjected the station's parent company to considerable budget cuts.

"Several parties showed interest in the station, but VOA could not close a deal," says VOA Europe programme director Eric Phillips. The final round of negotiations fell through on January 20.

With the Cold War long gone and Eastern Europe seemingly ranking low among U.S. foreign policy priorities, VOA is shifting its attention to other areas in the world and re-allocating its dwindling resources.

"The decision to close has more to do with a change in thinking than actual budget cuts," says Phillips. "VOA apparently decided there are certain areas in the world that do not require special attention any longer."

VOA will not retreat completely from Europe, however. The station will replace VOA Europe with its news/talk programme, Worldwide English.

IFPI mines more Platinum Awards

LONDON — Since the launch of the Platinum Europe awards last July, a total of 21 new albums have qualified for the IFPI award, which recognises combined European sales of over one million units, writes Christian Lorenz.

In addition, according to the IFPI secretariate in London, 21 Double Platinum, 18 Triple Platinum and 16 Multi Platinum awards have been made.

The continent's biggest selling

albums, as recognised under the IFPI scheme, are: Bon Jovi's Crossroads (Mercury), Céline Dion's Falling Into You (Epic) and Michael Jackson's HIStory (Epic). Each of those albums has sold a total over six million units in Europe The only European artists to come close to the sales of this trio are Oasis, with their 1995 release (What's The Story) Morning Glory? (Creation/Sony).

Continental European talent does get a boost, however, with three albums picking up Platinum Europe awards in January, namely Florent Pagny's Bienvenue Chez Moi (Mercury), Zucchero's Best Of... (Polydor) and Andrea Boccelli's self-titled 1995 debut on Polydor/Sugar.

Europe's rising stars of the moment are, without doubt, the Spice Girls.

EMAP drops gold standard

Emap Radio has introduced a new soft AC music policy at all nine of its AM services in northern England and Wales.

The change is the latest in a series of moves by the radio group during the past year to shift its AM operations away from the gold format. The stations which still had the "Gold" moniker attached to them have also been given new names and brand images. The former Great Yorkshire Gold stations in Sheffield and Hull have been relaunched as Magic AM and Magic 1161 respectively, while Preston's Red Rose Gold becomes Red Rose 999.

"As far as our listeners are concerned, gold is old," says Emap radio's chief executive Tim Schoonmaker, who explains that the changes are being implemented to change the profile of the stations' audience demographic.

"I wouldn't be surprised that, in some cases, our overall reach declines from doing this," he adds. "That's okay, because we will be reaching more of the people our advertisers want us to." Gold's future in the U.K. and elsewhere

Spanish industry launches music academy

MADRID — The New Year has brought with it a surge of optimism within the Spanish music industry, in contrast to the air of decline which has surrounded it in recent years.

With insiders predicting a record sales year for 1996, the IFPI affiliate AFYFE, the authors' society SGAE, and the artists' association AIE plan key initiatives this year.

The first ever Spanish Academy of Music is to be set up in what is described by SGAE spokesman Carlos López as "the most important initiative in the 40 years that Spain has had a music industry". The Academy is being formed by members of the SGAE and

AIE as well as producers and arrangers.

Equally important will be the organising of two major music award ceremonies. The Spanish market at the moment has no national music awards apart from a section in the Premios Ondas awards held by Grupo Prisa, the owners of the country's largest private radio network Cadena SER.

The Spanish Academy of Music plans to hand out 17 awards in a ceremony this April. Members of the future Academy are already voting to select nominees in each of the 17 categories. In a parallel move, AFYVE is to arrange an industry awards ceremony for October or November.

According to Lopez, the SGAE/AIE project has a specific aim to export

Spanish music abroad. "Our first goal is to promote Spanish music in any of the languages of the Spanish State: Basque, Catalan, Galician and Castilian."

Unlike the SGAE/AIE supported Academy of Music awards, the AFYVE competition will also involve non-Spanish repertoire. Saul Tagarro, president of both AFYVE and Warner Brothers Spain, adds that the AFYVE project will be held on the lines of the Brit Awards. About 800 industry figures will select the winners.

Lopez and Tagarro agree that their projects are a welcome development for the industry, and that 1996 displayed all the signs of having been a record sales year. Annual AFYVE sales figures are scheduled to be

released in March.

"You've only got to look at all the gold (50,000) and platinum (100,000) sales in the charts," comments Lopez. The top ten albums in the AFYVE charts in the week ending January 18 included a sextuple-platinum disc, two quintuple-platinums, four triple-platinums, and two platinums—that is, more than three million units sold among the top ten titles.

Tagarro points out that also for the first time, unofficial figures show that Spanish-produced records made up 50 percent of the important pre-Christmas sales in December. "This is spectacular," he says, "and the two new awards ceremonies can only improve the situation vastly."

Motor unveils its new model

HAMBURG — PolyGram Germany's Motor Music division is turning its Elektromotor imprint into a stand-alone department to complement the company's dance, progressive and jazz units.

The move comes against a background of announcements of further job cuts in Holland as part of PolyGram's international re-structuring drive.

Elektromotor handles progressive dance/rock crossover artists. The department is headed by Charlotte Goltermann, who will continue to be involved in the running of Motor-associated independent label Ladomat.

Along with German electronic acts Whirlpool and Andreas Dorau, Elektromotor will handle Go!Disc-signed Portishead and ffrr act Goldie as well as all releases on James Lavelle's highly regarded MoWax label.

Motor MD Tim Renner says he believes that, "To market these artists successfully, you need to approach pro-



motion from two angles. Next to club promotion, Elektromotor will focus on touring and print media which are classic rock promotion tools."

The launch of the Elektromotor department

is one step in a series of structural changes to accommodate the repertoire of ffrr, London, Motown and Go!Discs, distribution of which was taken over by Motor after the closure of PolyGram's Metronome division last December (Music & Media, November 30).

Renner comments that, "The addition of international repertoire makes the existence of a separate Elektromotor department viable at this stage." Further details on Motor's new structure are expected to be revealed soon.

Ritto heads EMI in Scandinavia

LONDON — EMI Music has appointed Michael Ritto as its new president and regional managing director for Scandinavia and Finland, effective April 1. He will continue to be based in Copenhagen, from where he will oversee the creative and business activities of the EMI companies in the region.

Ritto remains managing director of EMI-Medley in Denmark, which he founded with Poul Bruun in 1978, and sold to EMI in 1992. In his new regional role he will replace Rolf Nygren, who

is retiring after 31 years with EMI.

Despite stepping down from his regional role, Nygren will remain managing director of EMI Sweden until a successor is found for that post. At that point, he will become chairman of the Swedish company, while also being free to accept

responsibilites outside the company. As long as Nygren remains head of the Swedish company, he will report to Ritto, as will Michael Manasse in Norway and Hobo Puhakka in Finland.



Ritto's appointment to a regional role is the penultimate piece in the tier of management below EMI's European president Rupert Perry. Ritto joins a team that comprises GSA president Helmut Fest; France, Belgium, and Netherlands head Gilbert Ohayon and Eastern European president Jo Govaerts.

The Iberian post has been vacant since Rafael Gill's move to EMI Latin America in Mexico in October. EMI Spain managing director Miguel Gomez is currently the senior executive there.



German techno act Scooter have established themselves as consistent performers in the dance market. Music Control inks Norwegian airplay deal

OSLO — Dublin-based company Music Control has signed a national airplay monitoring deal in Norway with music industry body GGF.

Music Control will start by monitoring of eight stations, mainly based in Oslo, but the company's European Marketing director Marc Russell, says he aims to raise the number of stations to 16, "as soon as possible." Warner Music Norway MD Mats Nilsson says he is pleased with the accuracy of the system and comments, "We still have to deter-

mine how many stations we actually want to be included in the sample."

GGF uses the airplay data to produce a weekly Top 40 airplay chart. According to Nilsson, the chart is, "Distributed every Tuesday through national media partners TV2, full service radio station P4 and daily newspaper Dagbladet."

The Norwegian deal adds to a previous deal signed by Music Control with Sweden and Russell says negotiations are going on in Finland and Denmark. "Altogether, we monitor 54 stations in Scandinavia," says Russell who adds that one of his goals is to produce a pan-Scandinavian airplay chart.

Russell says all European territories are now covered by Music Control operations, with over 500 stations throughout Europe monitored on a daily basis. He says the next step will be to move into Eastern Europe markets, with the Czech Republic and Hungary as primary targets, "For the second half of 1997."

Another prize for Eboman

After winning the Dutch Popprijs award on January 11 (Music & Media, January 25), progressive dance music artist Jeroen Hoffs-a.k.a. Ebomanwill take home a Silver Harp as one of Holland's most promising young talents on February 24. The Silver Harp awards are organised by the Conamus foundation for the promotion of Dutch music. Eboman will share the honour with fellow winners Total Touch and Skik, Conamus also hands out Golden Harp awards to personalities who have contributed to the development of Dutch popular music throughout their career. This year's Golden Harp winners are Youp van't Hek, Ruth Jacott, ex-Conamus director John de Mol Sr. and rock band The Scene.

INTERNATIONAL Island prepares for anniversary

Island Records has announced details of a three year campaign, working up to the label's 40th anniversary in October 1999. As part of the campaign, Island plans to release seven compilation albums highlighting the label's development from its very first single, a jazz side by Jamaican guitarist Ernest Ranglin in 1959. The first of the compilations, covering the years 1959-63, will be released in June. The second album is scheduled for release in October. In addition to the compilation series, Island plans to issue three tribute albums of contemporary artists covering the hits of the label through the ages. The first tribute album will be released in September.

ITALY MCE extends European network

Digital cable music service Music Choice Europe (MCE) has launched in Italy, initially in Rome. The service is a partnership between MCE and cable provider Stream—itself a joint venture between the domestic telecommunications holdings company STET and Telecom Italia. MCE will be a core part of Stream's digital cable package as it rolls out to 19 other cities over the next several weeks. By the end of this year, MCE and Stream hope the service will be available in 41 additional cities. MCE has now extended its reach to 11 European countries.

RNE celebrates anniversary

Public broadcaster Radio Nacional de Espana (RNE) turned 60 on January 19. RNE, which now has four national nets, was born in the middle of the 1936-39 Spanish Civil War in Fascistheld Salamanca. After the war, RNE gradually opened studios across the country but did not become a national net until 1951. Until 1977, two years after the death of dictator General Franco, every station in the country had to link up to RNE at certain times of the day to broadcast the only news allowed to be heard on the air.

Dutch stations clash in Borsato 'ads' row

AMSTERDAM — Private CHR broadcaster Radio 538 has accused public station Radio 3FM of sneaking advertising spots for Polydorsigned singer Marco Borsato's new album *De Waarheid (The Truth)* onto public TV.

Radio 538 managing director Erik de Zwart has filed a complaint with the Dutch Media Commissariat, claiming that CHR-formatted Radio 3FM illegally plugged the new Borsato album during the week of January 13-17 by using public TV set aside for programme promotion.

Public TV stations in Holland run advertising spots in dedicated blocks, administered by independent sales house STER. Between those blocks of advertising, the TV stations are allowed to run promotional trailers for radio or TV programmes. Radio 538's complaint is

based on a series of trailers promoting Radio 3FM's exclusive preview of Borsato tracks preceding the January 18 release of *De Waarheid*.

"It is not the premiere (of Borsato's



new album) that bothers us," claims De Zwart, "it is the way it was presented, with pre-release commercials on public TV—not in STER-time but during official public airtime." Media Commissariat co-ordinator Hans Ottenhof says that the regulator's verdict will depend on, "What kind of deals have been made between Radio 3FM and Polydor." He adds, "If we feel that the spots are only promoting the station, we will not take any measures."

Radio 3FM co-ordinator Paul van der Lugt insists that, "The TV spots promoted our Borsato Week and not the new album itself. A new Borsato CD is an important journalistic event. Even if we would not have had the exclusive preview rights, we would have done something big about it."

A similar complaint by Radio 538 against Radio 3FM spots preceding the release of the Beatles' Anthology Volume 1 (Apple/Parlophone) was turned down by the Media Commissariat. This time, De Zwart is more optimistic about the

outcome and hopes that, "At least the Commissariat will come up with a guideline." In the meantime, Borsato went on to sell 330,000 copies of *De Waarheid* in Holland in the week after release.

Jenkins joins RAJAR as Arbitron clocks in

LONDON — Peter Jenkins, a former BBC researcher and TV ratings executive, is to take over at the helm of Radio Joint Audience Research (RAJAR). At the same time, U.S. ratings giant Arbriton has unveiled plans to conduct research in three major U.K. markets currently covered by RAJAR's contractors.

Jenkins will succeed Roger Gane as executive director of the U.K. radio industry ratings body in early March. He will report to RAJAR's board, which is comprised of senior executives from the public and commercial radio sectors. He brings to the growing radio industry a background in market and media research.

From 1982-1990, Jenkins worked at the BBC, where he was responsible for its audience reaction service, and subsequently moved to RSMB Television Research as operations director. Currently, he is working as a consultant on media and transportation research projects.

Gane is leaving RAJAR after almost five years to become interna-

tional media director of Paris-based research group, IPSOS, the parent company of RAJAR research contractor, Research Services Limited (RSL), in London. His brief will be to implement IPSOS's development plans for western and eastern Europe radio, TV and print markets.

The last release of RAJAR results overseen by Gane—for the fourth quarter of 1996—is scheduled to be sent to radio stations on February 6. The figures will be made public the following day.

Meanwhile, leading U.S. ratings company Arbitron is planning to conduct research in three major U.K. markets parallel to RAJAR's fieldwork during the second quarter of this year. RSL's contract with RAJAR expires at the end of the third quarter 1998. However, the bidding process for the U.K. radio ratings contract is expected to get under way before that time.

Last November, Arbitron stated that it is pursuing expansion outside the U.S. (Music & Media, November 30, 1996), and that it intends using the U.K. as a springboard into other countries, including Germany, Italy and China.

Sales house adds 54 stations



BRUSSELS — RMB, the sales house of Belgian French-language public broadcaster RTBF, now represents 54 private stations in Flanders, grouped under the Spirit banner.

The move follows an EC ruling that sales house VAR—associated with Flemish public broadcaster BRTN—is no longer allowed to represent both Spirit and BRTN in Flanders. The ruling is in response to complaints by private sales house IP, commercial broadcaster Radio Contact and Belgian radio associations VEVORA and VFLR. They claimed VAR had acquired a position in the Flemish radio advertising market which could result in the sales house being able to offer better terms for spots on private stations than its competitors.

Prior to taking over sales for the Spirit group, RMB gained experience in the private radio market by handling advertising for French language NRJ Belgique network in Wallonia.

"For RMB, this is a very important strategical change, as it gives us access to the Flemish audience for the first time," says RMB director of radio Catherine Servaes. "From now, we will be able to offer combined advertising packages with the 14 NRJ stations in the South and the Spirit group in the North."





Loud to head ffrr; London Motors on

LONDON - The U.K.'s London Records has beefed up the staffing of its ffrr imprint with the appointment of club promoter Lisa Loud as label manager (Music & Media, February 1). Also joining the label, as an A&R manager, is DJ and remixer Phil Faversham, who has already brought the label the single Ride A Rocket, by Lithium, featuring Echobelly's Sonia Madan.

The appointments follow the departure last year of five staff, including ffrr label manager Nick Raphael and Christian Tattersfield, head of London's Internal imprint. They have now set up Northwestside, a label within BMG U.K.

London Records is independently owned by a company in which PolyGram Music Group president Roger Ames holds a stake; in the U.K., it is distributed by PolyGram. ffrr handles all of

London's dance-related product as well as acts on the Systematic and Internal imprints, such as Orbital. The Advent and CJ Bolland.

Pete Tong, head of A&R for ffrr and a director of London Records, says Loud's first priority will be "to guide the records through the company. Previously all the people we've had here have been A&R driven." Loud has run independent club promotions company Loud & Clear for the last six years. Two of her co-workers will also join ffrr.

In the longer term, Tong says ffrr's new signings Life's Addiction a new

priorities will be to concentrate on album acts. In working with artists such as drum bass act Goldie and stadium techno duo Orbital, ffrr has been successful in creating album acts from genres which are driven by singles.

Upcoming priorities clude the new album by its biggest-selling act, the Brand New Heavies, album from Goldie in the summer and Orbital's theme for the forthcoming Val Kilmer film, The Saint.

After London's German distribution partner within the PolyGram group, Metronome, closed down on December 31 (Music & Media, November 30), the label switched to Poly-Gram's Motor Music. Tong says he and Motor MD Tim Renner will cooperate closely: "Based on what we've heard so far, there's a lot more records that will travel," says Tong. "Not all European things will make it here, just as not all British dance music makes it there. But I hope that now we're working together [Renner] should feel more confident about signing things for more territories.'

ffrr has already put out Darkman by Nana, a top 20 hit for Motor, and will look at other material handled by Motor. "We will promo everything they give us," says Tong.

Spain's live launch pag

MADRID - The second Artistas En Ruta (Artists On The Road) programme, organised by Spanish artists' rights association AIE, is under way.

A string of concerts featuring Spanish performers is being held, covering at least 14 venues in eight cities and running until the end of June. One long-term aim of AIE's project is to set up an exchange system with similar organisations in France, Portugal and Italy, whereby acts from those countries would perform in Spain and vice versa. According to AIE chairman Luis Cobos, the French artists' association ADAMI and the Reseau Printemps talent scouting network-linked with annual music festival Printemps De Bourges-have already promised financial assistance.

Artistas En Ruta, organized jointly with Spanish authors' society SGAE, not only aims to boost the popularity of live music but also aims to induce artists to play in areas of Spain which are far removed from their home territory.

The first Artists On The Road project in 1995 attracted some 18,000 fans to about 100 concerts in 33 venues, spread over 18 cities. This year's programme already involves more than 40 acts.

New format for Italia

MILAN - Following an injection of capital from new shareholders, Radio Italia Vera has introduced a new music format and live presentation for the first time since its launch in 1993.

The syndicated network, which broadcasts across Italy from Milan via a network of regional affiliate stations, had previously been operating a Italian music-only format, with just one international hit featured each hour. The new format will see a 70/30 split between domestic and international artists. With the introduction of live presenters, the station is also moving away from its previous total reliance on automation.

Radio Italia Vera's station manager Mauro Dani says the network's prime target will be the 15-25 demographic. "We will be playing over 90 percent new

music and supporting emerging artists," he promises. "We invested in market comprehensive research to create an original format which would effectively compete with the other networks who are targeting the same demographic." He adds, "The introduction of live presentation will not interrupt the daytime

music flow too much-the presenters are there to add value to the music, not to detract from it.'

The station has hired ex-Radio Deejay and Radio Capital jock Mila to host mid-mornings, while newcomer Lazzaro is presenting the mid-afternoon show "Yo-Yo" in rap style. Former RTL 102.5 Hit Radio presenter Beppe Cogliandro is hosting the breakfast show, while evenings are taking on a more talk-oriented emphasis with satirical news, vox pops and a live phone-in show from Rome called "Talk Radio."

Italia Vera's management is hoping that the radical format changes will boost recent disappointing ratings figures. Despite critical acclaim for its polished music programming from both Italy's record and radio industries, the network attracted an average daily audience of just over 600,000 listeners in the Audiradio survey for the third quarter of 1996.

The changes in format coincides with recent changes in Italia Vera's ownership structure. A Luxembourg holding company (owned by Turin-based publishing group Monasterolo) has acquired a 35 percent stake in the network through a buy-out of minority partners and part of the stake owned by the station's founder Enzo Palazzolo, who has reduced his former majority shareholding to 45 percent. The remaining 20 percent of the company remains in the

hands of the independent Italian music publisher Cappuc-

cino Music.

Italia Vera is one of several national syndicators currently exploiting a loophole in existing broadcasting regulations in order to circumvent restrictions which would otherwise limit them to supplying just six hours a day of live networked programming to their affili-


ate stations. The network's affiliates currently employ a three second delay before re-broadcasting the satellite feed from head offices in Milan, enabling them to claim that they are not relaying live broadcasts.

New broadcasting legislation, expected before the end of July this year, is expected to close those loopholes. However, at time of going to press, no one from Italia Vera was prepared to comment on how the network would deal with such changes.

The respected French daily looks behind the success of radio group NRJ, in a piece titled "NRJ chooses marketing against regulation." The recipe for success, according to writer Françoise Chirot is simple: test the records played according to the demographics targeted: invest massively in promotion and marketing (FFr140 million in 1996); seduce aggressively advertisers; and play games with radio regulations. In 1996, the group's revenues jumped 20 per cent to FFr854 million (\$158.1 million) with profits of FFr93 million (\$17.2 million). But according to Chirot, the international development of the group doesn't match yet the expectations of its founder, with yearly losses of FFr50 million (\$9.25 million) in 1996.

The February edition of the U.K. style and music monthly re-prints in full its first-ever issue, which originally appeared on news-stands in May 1980. A piece in the 1980 issue by Julie Burchill on the state of U.K. pop public broadcaster BBC Radio 1 makes for interesting reading 16 years on-Burchill argues for the kind of changes at Radio 1 it would take the BBC another 13 years to make, under the leadership of Matthew Bannister. Naming Paul Gambaccini, John Peel and Tony Blackburn as Radio 1's only "credible" DJs, Burchill writes, "Perhaps the biggest barrier between English radio and a Rock Dream is the irretrievable age of the DJs-the established ones are on their way to 40, and the bright young things will never see 30 again. A token youth isn't the answer either... but a massive overhaul probably is.'

The fortnightly French trade publication celebrates its tenth anniversary with a cover featuring Jean-Michel Jarre, and with a new owner. First launched by Richard Charvet as a tipsheet, reporting on independent radio stations' programming, the magazine mainly covers A&R and business developments on the French scene with artist and music industry executive interviews. At the end of 1996, Charvet and his partners sold the majority stake in the magazine to Jean-Paul Vuillin, who has several business interests in communication.

Libération

Le Palace, along with Les Bains one of Paris' main night clubs, is going through tough times, according to the daily. Its current owner is Régine, who bought it in 1992 from U.K. group

European Leisure for FFr44 million (\$8.1 million). But although the club made some profit in 1994, it has since been losing money and Régine called in the receivers at the end of 1996. One of the potential buyers, says Libération, is none other than Simply Red frontman Mick Hucknall, who is believed to have already made substantial investments in Le Palace. Another contender is Philippe Fatien, who, in Paris, already owns the Queen, the Bus and the Cabaret.

MusicWoche

Hamburg's Music Industry is due to benefit from initiatives aimed at the entertainment and media sectors, says Senator Dr. Kristina Weiss in an interview in the German trade weekly MusicWoche. Weiss says that Hamburg cannot compete directly with cities such as Cologne, the site of broadcaster WDR and the recipient of massive state investment. However, the Senator says Hamburg can achieve full potential despite what she calls the "strict traditional commercial spirit which prevails" in the city. Rather than investment programs, she advocates citizens embracing a new attitude, including more networking among entertainment and media companies. MusikWoche, (Germany), January 27

The troubles of the music industry were at the centre of a piece in the business pages of the daily. "PolyGram will next month [February] unveil drab figures for 1996 (even though the second half of the year has shown some rebound), setting the tone for a period of unhappy performances from major music groups," wrote the daily's City analyst Lisa Buckingham who added, "The question facing the sector is whether the stagnation is more than a blip." Buckingham says "the music business is about to face the prospect of hacking back costs," citing Goldman Sach's analysts who consider "this will have to take place, even though more money and effort should also be channelled into the A&R departments to revitalise ageing catalogues.

Are the 'golden years' ending?

The original gold format might not be dead yet, but its pulse in the U.K. certainly seems to be weakening. Major radio player Emap Radio is dumping the gold moniker attached to the names of its AM stations and is revamping the stations' music programming to include more current and soft AC tracks, accompanied by new brand images for the stations. Music & Media asks whether this is the beginning of the end for the U.K.'s gold format stations.

s far as our listeners are concerned, gold is old." So says Emap Radio's chief executive Tim Schoonmaker. Over the past year or so, the company's gold outlets in major markets such as Manchester and Liverpool have taken steps to freshen both their output and images to boost sluggish audience ratings.

Over the coming months, Emap Radio will extend that process to Red Rose Gold in Preston and the Great Yorkshire Gold stations in Sheffield and Hull, which will be relaunched with the "Magic" moniker currently used by Emap in Leeds. In addition, all nine of Emap's AM stations (which include Pic-1152/Manchester, City/Liverpool, Touch AM/Cardiff and Great North Radio/Newcastle) will be implementing a new-sound soft AC music policy, with some local variations.

Schoonmaker claims audience research prompted the changes at the

group's AM stations. "Most of our programme directors at these stations are thinking best only if it is relevant about a 39 year-old person-whether a to today" man or womanand getting their heads around

what that person wants from a radio station," he says.

"Like anyone in media, we want to focus our brands more clearly. A 39 year-old listener is very valuable to an advertiser." The Emap executive notes that, "a big part of our thinking in these changes," was the feedback from advertisers after Emap Radio consulted them on the revamp.

The main changes are alterations to presentation style and more current and recent music, often featuring older, established artists such as Phil Collins and Elton John who, in the BritPop era, are increasingly getting squeezed out of Emap's CHR formatted FM services.

The way each hour-clock of programming is put together will, according to Schoonmaker, "better suit the listener we are targeting." Although the general platform of the revamp applies to all nine of Emap's AM outlets, individual programmers will tailor programming to suit their listen-

ers. Explains Schoonmaker, "The consistent thing across the group is the 39 vear-old. That is what advertisersand our sales people-are telling us they want more of.'

Adult, not old...

Emap Radio group programme director Paul Kavanagh explains the group's changes in music policy. Instead of catering for old people, we are now catering to adults," he says. "You won't be hearing the standard rock'n'roll tracks.

"This is good news for the record companies," he continues, "because the door will be opened for some new music. Before, the record industry just plugged our FM stations. Now there's a chance for us to talk with the record companies about our AM stations."

Ironically, Schoonmaker says the changes are not an exercise to attract

more listeners. "I wouldn't be surprised, that in some cases, our overall reach declines from doing this," he "That's says. okay, because we will be reaching

more of the people our advertisers want to. It will be a more efficient [advertising] buy for them."

Emap has renegotiated the "promises of performance" of the stations concerned with the U.K.'s Radio Authority, enabling it to change the music output. The Radio Authority's head of programming and advertising, David Lloyd, explains, "It is a slight shift in their promise of performances. How they choose to market the services is their own business." He adds, "A number of stations do this. We have to look at whether it is actually a change of format or a sensible adjustment.'

Rachel Steel, managing director of audience and market research company Questionair, says gold has lost its impact. "The format as it was established in the late '80s is dead," she says.

Steel argues that it makes sense for gold stations' output to change with the listeners. "The gold format that has progressively moved with its audiences still

has a role to play in certain markets, probably in the less competitive ones."

No more pure gold

Essex Radio/Southend programme director Paul Chantler, who last summer re-tooled AM station The Breeze from gold to soft AC, comments, "The gold format in a pure sense is dead.'

"The idea of presenting gold tracks and music from the '60s in today's style of radio doesn't work anymore. agreespresenter Richard Allinson VH-1 and 95.8 Capital FM/London. "Gold was a nice place to visit," he continues, "but radio works best only if it is relevant to today. It also has a major image problem with advertisers.'

Chantler says there is life for some gold music, but only on FM, and even then, it has be delivered uniquely. "If you gave me a new FM [station] in a market where there was already AC, CHR and dance, I would programme '60s music, but it would have to be presented in full-blooded nostalgia style."

Not everyone in the U.K., however, believes the gold AM station has had its day. At the same time as Chantler was dropping the gold format in Essex, the GWR Group was busy extending its Classic Gold network to a total of ten AM outlets across the country, with a potential audience of six million adults.

The service is personality-driven, with veteran presenters such as Johnnie Walker, Dave Lee Travis and Emperor Rosko. However, GWR last week disposed of three of its Classic Gold stations (in Northampton, Gloucester and Peterborough) to the Radio First group, following pressure from the Radio Authority to reduce its ownership "points." There is already speculation that Radio First could replace the gold format in these areas with the type of soft AC/gold sound it currently programmes on Mellow 1557 in Colchester.

In the immediate future, a hint as to

latest RAJAR audience figures are released on February 6. However, in some other European territories, the gold standard is still solid.

France, Holland shine on

In the Netherlands, national commercial outfit Radio 10 Gold (launched in 1990) is keeping its format intact.

Head of music Peter Rijsenbrij explains: "Our radio culture is different from the U.K.'s. The Dutch still like to hear cheerful hits from the past." He adds that Radio 10 Gold's AM frequency is a factor in the thinking behind the station's "upbeat" sound. "Soft AC wouldn't work on the AM band," he predicts. "You would lose too much of the songs."

Pointing to an 8.3 percent marketshare in the most recent Dutch radio ratings, which puts the station in third place behind soft AC Sky Radio 100.7 FM and CHR pubcaster Radio 3FM, Rijsenbrij argues, "There's no need to change our format, which is basically the greatest hits of all time.

"Apart from dance and novelty records," he continues, "most contemporary hits are in a soft pop or ballad style, which could certainly justify a station adjusting its format in favour of soft AC. But for us, there's no need to do that. By sticking to our format we won't harm other stations, and they won't harm us."

In France, it is now impossible to operate a totally gold format because of a legal requirement under the radio quotas regime to programme a minimum of 20 percent of new French talent. But this requirement for new music content is not generally believed to be the reason why the gold-orientated stations are more successful in France than they were five years ago.

Jean-Pierre Millet, music director at the soft gold network RFM, reports, "We chose the gold format two years ago, and since then our audience has grown from 1.4 to 3.1 percent." Millet, whose station is heavily '70s orientated, says the gold format has a healthy future provided that it is well programmed. "You have to update regularly, but avoid making 360degree changes in your programming. No strategy is for ever, and as the music and listeners change, so do you."

Although RFM is the only clearly recognisable "gold" service in France, there are a number of networks which blend gold with AC, such as Nostalgie, Cherie FM and RTL 2. These nets, it seems, are not reducing the amount of gold which sits alongside their AC tunes.

"The concept of nostalgia is stronger than ever, and more than ever I think people need nostalgia," says Yves Mayet, music director of Nostalgie. "However, we always have to move the

music in line with our target audience."

Mayet says that, a decade ago, around 70 percent of his station's oldies were taken from the '60s. Today, a similar percentage come from the '70s.

"Nostalgie targets 30-45 year olds, so we have to play the records they loved as teenagers. Most of these are from between 1972 and 1982, but within the next ten years you will see us programming oldies from the '80s to the '90s. Unless we change the target demographic.'

Iglesias cellar yields a new vintage

It usually takes two to tango, but in the case of Julio Iglesias, the invitation to dance extends to several million people around the world. The Spanish singer (and serial wine collector) is in buoyant mood: his latest Sony Music album, Tango, has so far sold three million copies since its release last November, with over one million sold in Europe. In an exclusive interview, Iglesias talks candidly to Music & Media about his long career, his plans for the future and, of course, his love of wine.

y anyone's standards, the sales figures for Tango (particularly strong in France, Portugal, Italy and Sweden) are an impressive achievement at a time when the sales of other superstars from Julio Iglesias's era are falling off dramatically. It is also an answer to all those who had written off the Latin champion of romantic singing as a figure from the past.

After 27 years in the music business, Iglesias still enjoys being at the top. "It's great to be back," says the relaxed figure who greeted visitors (mainly Sony Music executives) in his suite at the Rochester Hotel in London on January 25. He looked in perfect condition, particularly considering he had arrived at four o'clock in the morning and was about to fly off to another promotional gig, having performed in front of 15 million TV viewers on the BBC's National Lottery show.

The magnitude of the success of *Tango* has surprised even Iglesias. "It seems that the timing was perfect," he says. "For the past six months it seems like everybody has been dancing the tango—I'm even going to China, where they are organising tango contests. But 18 months ago, when we were in a recording studio with my producer Roberto Livi, we had no idea how it would work out."

Although the tango dates back to 1920s Argentina, Iglesias believes it still has, "that sort of rock'n roll flavour" for the Latin audiences. Asgreat admirers of Carlos Gardel, the "godfather" of tango, Iglesias and Livi chose to record 12 songs out of 200 they had selected for the album.

During the recording process, traditional instruments such as bandoneon were mixed with more modern sounds. That mix might have offended the tango purists, but for Iglesias, both tradition and modernity had to be respected. He explains, "We decided to put together the songs in a simpler way than traditional tango—less 'baroco,' and less jazzy. I tried to make it easier for the public to understand and dance to."

Maximum exposure

Iglesias says the success of *Tango* was "like bringing new blood into me—I feel like I'm born again." He admits

that, although he should by now be more relaxed about it, it's still not easy for him to assess the value of his own work. "When I first brought the record to the record company, I wasn't sure whether it was going to be welcomed," he says. "But the feedback was great and suddenly I realised I had a big album, although I never expected the album to sell so quickly. In fact we only really started doing promotion at Christmas."

When on a promotional tour, Iglesias usually appears in the main markets on selected TV shows which can help him reach a wide audience. He also occasionally does some press and radio interviews. Not surprisingly, given the dominance of CHR and AC formats across Europe, his records receive limited airplay.

"Radio stations don't play my songs much, so I have to go to other places to find the audience. I don't have problems with radio stations not playing my music. I understand they have formats. I don't complain. But you know, if you look at the success of Céline Dion, it shows people are hungry for ballads. It's the same with tango."

Iglesias takes time to praise the work in the field done by the various Sony Music branches around the world. He has spent all his recording career with the same company, which was known as CBS Records when he started out.

"After so many years," he says, "I am lucky to have a record company that still believes in me and does a great job," he reflects. "I appreciate

dea year, which can still be attractive for
a record company, don't you think?"

"Selling records is something
unique. Of course, playing live is a
great pleasure but after a show, it's all
y, gone. When people keep on buying your

records, you know that you are still in touch with the public. It's not easy at my age to continue selling records. Try to name other artists of my generation who continue to sell millions of albums.

There aren't many! Selling records keeps you alive, in a way."

Iglesias is set to sell even more records at the end of this year, when Sony Music releases the first ever compilation album from the Spanish singer. The album will also include three new songs, for which Iglesias will be teaming up with David Foster and BabyFace.

Says the Spaniard, "I didn't want to do a greatest hits because it doesn't mean much to me, but the record company thought it was the right time."

Back to the roots

Another project, however, is keeping Iglesias excited—an album which will bring him right back to the heart of music from his native land.

"There is still an album I haven't made and would like to do," he explains. "I want to record a flamenco album. I have discussed with Paco de Lucia and it seems that it is going to happen. He is such a talented musician. With him, we'll be able to get deep into the soul of flamenco."

With so many projects on the boil, Iglesias clearly deserves his reputation as one of the music industry's hardest working stars. However, he claims, "I am a very disciplined man with a very boring life. I take care of my own business. I like to make my own mistakes!"

Asked what he has learned about the music industry during his 27-years career, he answers bluntly, "That you are as good as your last album, as good as your last hit or your last concert in the eyes of the public and the record company. Learning is the basis of the career of any artist."

Learning and enjoying are also the words which come to mind when Iglesias talks about one of his other great passions in life—wine, especially the Bordeaux vintages.

His cellar in his Miami house is renowned, and there is nothing Iglesias enjoys more than spending time hunting for the right vintage. "I love wine," admits the singer. "One of the most enjoyable things in my life is discovering wines. A good wine is the one you discover and you open a few years later, and it has fulfilled all its promises."

"The good thing about wine is that is makes you feel cool and takes discussions onto another plane," Iglesias continues. "Tve become a sort of professional in my methods of testing wine. I do trips to Bordeaux, I keep myself informed, probably more than I follow the music scene! Wine is definitely one of the great things in life."

Iglesias is currently in the middle of a promotional tour which has already taken him to the U.K., France, Sweden, Italy, Spain, Sweden and the Netherlands, and which will be continued in Mexico, Argentina, Brazil, China, Japan, Korea and Australia.

Asked why he still commits to such a heavy promotion schedule, Iglesias asks, "What do you expect me to do? Stay home in Miami playing the piano? Or in Bora Bora drinking wine? It's not a sacrifice. I like what I do. Why should I complain? I'm enjoying the magical things which life has given me. I do it because I like it. It's my job." He adds, "Look at the cinema stars. When a movie with big names such as Tom Cruise or Madonna is released, they do promotion. Artists have to sell themselves. You always have to look after the public."

the commitment from the Sony Music people around the world. Sony—and before that CBS—have always cared about me, and I have always cared about them. It's like in a marriage; you live with someone for 25 years, and although it might not always be easy every day, at the end of the day, you look at the person you are with and think 'yes, I am happy to be with that person'."

The hits and more

As a man who has sold over 200 million albums throughout his career, Iglesias is candid about his appeal to a record label. "I have been an established artist for many years, and even if I don't sell as many records as I used to, I still sell around 3 million albums





Bocelli's sweet sound seduces Germany

talian tenor Andrea Bocelli has crossed national and musical borders with his seamless combination of light opera and pop melody. However, it was the adoption of a Bocelli duet with Sarah Brightman by a German boxer-and a unique collaboration between two record companies-which established him as a megastar in that country over Christmas.

Now the U.K., France and Spain are targets for the formula which has already reached mass audiences in Germany, Benelux and Italy. The ballads with which Bocelli has established an international reputation draw on Italy's strongest musical elements; sweet melody, the swelling emotion of opera and virtuoso performances.

Almost three years after winning the 1994 edition of the annual Sanremo Song Festival, the country's prime televised music showcase, with a slow love ballad, Con Te Partiro, which was a hit in Italy, Bocelli has become a household name in Germany.

A version of the song in English and Italian, entitled Time To Say Goodbye, has become Germany's most successful single release ever, selling over 1.65 million copies on EastWest Germany, according to the label. At the same time, his eponymous album *Bocelli* (Sugar/Polydor), which features the song, has sold over a million copies in Germany. Both topped their respective charts over

the Christmas period for several weeks. At one point Bocelli had three albums

in the German Top 10: his two other albums, Viaggio Italiano and Il Mare Calmo Della Sera (both on Sugar/Polydor) have sold 150,000 and 75,000 respectively there.

Bocelli's German success followed conquests of Holland and Belgium (M&M, August 17, 1996). Bocelli has sold 350,000 in Belgium and 400,000 in Holland, while Viaggio and Il Mare... have sold 100,000 each in Belgium and 80,000 and 90,000 respectively in the Dutch market.

Polydor International has signed up world-wide rights for Bocelli from Milanbased label Sugar Music, whose managing director Caterina Caselli Sugar says that, unlike Luciano Pavarotti's recent operatic-pop excursions, Bocelli is more comfortable slipping between light melody and opera.

"Pavarotti is tenor and embellishes his pop duets with operatic flourishes. Bocelli

comes from a light music background and then learned to sing opera," says Sugar. "He can now sing both pop and opera, effortlessly combining the two genres in one song," she continues, adding: "He has created his own trademark singing style and image which transcends frontiers."

Bocelli, who has achieved this success despite being blind, had a compilation of his career thus far released across Europe in January. Romanza (Sugar) includes live recordings with John Miles and the duet with Sarah Brightman, plus three new tracks

In Germany, Bocelli also duets with local star Judy Weiss on the local version of Vivo Per Lei (I Live For You), also released on Sugar/Polydor and featured

on Bocelli, Classical crossover stations such as Hamburg's Klassik Radio have listed several of Bocelli's tracks, but his appeal is broader than the core classical listeners.

Klaus Peter Otto, Head Of Music at the ACformatted public service regional sta-tion NDR :1 Radio MV in Schwerin North Eastern Germany says that the duet with Weiss initially bought

Bocelli to the attention of German TV viewers. But, he adds, it was the adoption of Time To Say Goodbye by one of the country's most popular sports stars as his anthem which bought Bocelli mass recognition.

Germany's middleweight world boxing champion Heinrich Maske-a national idol-adopted the song as his anthem for his final fight last November (previously, he had used Vangelis' Conquest Of Paradise, which also subsequently became a huge German hit). He lost the fight and his title, but since then Andrea Bocelli has become a massive star in Germany and Time To Say Goodbye (which was very appropriate for Maske!) has become an enormous hit.

We officially playlist it twice a day but have to play it more often because of the constant requests for it from our listeners," says Otto. He adds, "It is the right song at the right time, a very reflective, nostalgic song which seems to have caught the mood of the German people."

The duet is also on the Sarah Brightman album Fly (EastWest) which came out in 1995 and was re-released on the back of the duet's success. So far the two versions of the album have sold 180,000 copies between them, says EastWest.

Steffi Prem, head of international exploitation at EastWest Germany says the Brightman album is, "a priority in every territory. They're all releasing the new album." The song is already going to radio in Italy and Spain, and a release in the U.K. is being finalised.

Both artists are going on a promo tour of Europe between March 7 and 15. Cooperation between PolyGram and East-West has been exemplary, says Prem, with Polydor refraining from releasing their Italian version of the song.

lew talent to the fore at Echo Awards

he Fugees and Aerosmith will rub shoulders with top acts from the GSA region at this year's Echo awards. Veteran rocker Peter Maffay, Swiss dance star D.J. Bobo and German punk jokesters Die Toten Hosen will appear at the show, which takes place on March 6, 1997 at the Hamburg Congress Center. The Echo ceremony will be broadcast on German television channel ARD on March 8 and is expected to attract over eight million viewers.

Werner Hay, managing director of the German Phonographic Academy which organises the event, says: "We have received more enquiries by artists who would like to perform at the awards than we can fit into the schedule."

The awards now command greater attention abroad than ever before, Hay adds. "The TV coverage has certainly helped us to attract international artists," he reflects. "In the early years, we had a hard time convincing people to send us their top acts, now all labels put in a great effort to make sure we have an exciting line-up of performers.'

Despite those offers, Hay and Phonographic Academy chairman and Warner Music Germany MD Gerd Gebhardt are resisting the temptation to let the top

names rule the show, and are reserving time for new talent. Hay explains, "Introducing new artists to our audience remains our prime target".

Gerd Gebhardt, Chairman of the German Phonographic Academy and managing director of Warner Music Germany, says that "in its sixth year, Echo has become a major forum for German artists". He adds that "young artists from Germany have frequently achieved international success after being nominated for Echo.'



MICHELLE GAYLE Do You Know

Producer Shep Solomon International release January 27

Gayle gets to the chorus of this acoustic guitar-driven number within half a minute, and the "Do You Know" refrain dominates the song. A fresh, folky sound grafted onto a pop/r&b crossover beat suits Gayle's voice—lighter in texture than Whitney Houston and Toni Braxton, to whom she's inevitably compared. Less immediate than previous hits Sweetness or Freedom but with RCA mounting a huge promo, this could be her biggest yet.

PATRICIA KAAS QUAND J'AI PEUR DE TOUT

Columbia France/Sony Music Producers: Phil Ramone/Patrica Kaas French release February 11

A moody start to this slow-building song, penned by the ubiquitous Jean-Jacques Goldman and Diane Warren. Heart-rending close harmonies on the chorus will ensure this finds a European audience well beyond francophone territories, and even where Céline Dion has scored with her balladry. Phil Ramone's production ensures an epic quality. From the album Dans Ma Chair, due March 18.

JOVANOTTI

BELLA

Mercury/PolyGram Producers: Michele Cantonza, Jovanotti International release January 13

His last single L'Ombelico Del Mondo marked a move away from rap, but with this first release from the upcoming Lorenzo 1997-L'Albero album is a beautiful love song. A mid-tempo hip-hop shuffle propels it along, while mandolins, slide guitar and female vocals ooze an easy-going poppiness the Cardigans would have been proud of.

MUSE INNOCENT VOICES

CNR Music

Producer: FMT Posse

European release (excl. U.K.) January 29 The Bulgarian female choirs which astonished the world in the '90s on the Disques Cellier release Le Mystère Des Voix Bulgares are back, now set to a fluid beat in a Deep Forest/Enigma vein. The bizarre tonality-which made those recordings unique is mostly absent from these mixes, a fact which will no doubt enable it to gain mainstream airplay across a variety of formats. The Mega'Lo Mania hard trance mix makes little use of the sample, but Jens Lissat's Club version weaves the voices in a spellbinding mix. An album is due February 26.

ICE CREAM GENIUS

When/Castle Communications Producer: Craig Leon/h European release February 17

First impressions are of an album of gentle evocative songs in the same vein as babybird, so it's a surprise to find that this "mystery" singer/songwriter is actually Steve Hogarth, lead singer of Marillion. Standout hit is the anthemic Your Dinosaur Thing, with a huge chorus with surging strings which would suit rock and AC stations. Another strong, guitar-driven track is Until You Fall. Less immediate but no less worthwhile are slower, more intricate numbers such as Really Like and the haunting The Deep Water. Better Dreams is a lament about suburban life which would do Blur proud, and Nothing To Declare, (about watching planes at London's Heathrow airport) caps this collection of minature vignettes of individual life.

MANSUN

ATTACK OF THE GREY LANTERN

Parlophone/EMI

European release February 17

Producer: Mansun

The Northwest of England quartet fronted by songwriter Paul Draper reward their many tipsters with this self-assured debut album. Their two biggest singles to date, the quirky Stripper Vicar and December's Eurochart Top 40 hit Wide Open Space are laid back to back in the middle of a continuous stream of multi-layered songs with sharp lyrics which stop listeners getting carried away by the album's almost hypnotic sound quality. The updated psychedelia of Taxloss with its nod to the Beatles and the Tears For Feats-meet-Depeche Mode feel of Disgusting suggest there are more potential singles here. The rock guitardriven, radio-friendly fifth single She Makes My Nose Bleed and the current U.K. tour with Suede should help propel this into a healthy chart position.

NICK CAVE THE BOATMAN'S CALL

Producers: Cave & The Bad Seeds/Flood European release March 3

First single Into My Arms, released February 10, sets the tone for this subduded album, which sees Cave channeling his intensity. Into My Arms takes off with a religious declaration, but soon slips into a chorus with swirling melodies. Cave becomes darker and more melancholy on (Are You) The One That I've Been Waiting For? where he clearly displays his admiration for Leonard Cohen. Starker and more threatening is West Country Girl, a chilling tale of female anguish. Don't get fooled by the low-key production: Cave remains the king of edgy drama, but he's become more subtle about it. A European tour is expected this spring.


TEYAS WHITE ON BLONDE

International release: February 3

With this album, Texas prove it's possible to turn your back on the media for several years and still make an impact First single from the album, Say What You Want is already on its way towards becoming a Europaen radio smash. This album is filled with equally impressive songs, such as the towering Drawing Crazy Patterns, or the guitar and string-driven Halo, and Sharleen Spiteri's vocals are given room to breath despite the lushness of the arrangements. This year's MIDEM saw a proliferation of non-commercially-available sampler albums, many designed to promote national music industries. Among the best were the following collections:



DUTCH LIGHT & POP MUSIC 1997

(Netherlands)

Together with its related releases Dutch Rock Music 1997 and Dutch Dance Music 1997, this compilation is the most diverse of this selection in terms of high quality export product. The Dutch are well-known for absorbing outside influences, and this sampler is an excellent example of that approach. Gregor Theelen blends Arabic and Jewish sounds with Western arrangements, while-upand-coming young singer Alma Nieto provides some Tales Of The Ancient Celts and Moluccan Marcel Manuhutu gives the old Massada hit Sageru a funky merengue spin. Dutch Rock Music 1997 contains some of Holland's hottest acts (Johan, Caesar, Benjamin B.), all signed to alternative rock hotbed the Excelsior label. Dutch Dance Music 1997 reflects Holland's role as a leader of the dance scene, with six different sections: house, techno, trance, urban, commercial dance and happy hardcore.

ACCESS: NIPPON

(Japan)

A myriad of styles is presented on this sampler, ranging from jazzy funk-rock (Psychedelix) to melodic grunge (The Yellow Monkey). The appeal of the hardcore grind of the appropriately-named Mad Capsule Markets-whose Crack (released by the Invitation label) blasts away aggressively-could be international, thanks in part to their use of English lyrics. Bow Wow's guitars are cranked up equally loud, but they have a more nostalgic, almost Led Zeppelin sound, while the female singer of Dreams Come True is reminiscent of Celine Dion appeal on the ballad Suki, which features a gospel choir.

70 YEARS OF DISCOGRAPHY IN CROATIA

(Croatia)

Much of the music here could well find a niche in the world music market. The up-tempo, ethnic-flavoured folk songs such as Severina or Berekini could appeal to those who like Celtic music or acts like Finland's Värttinä. Slavic melancholy may also strike a note somewhere: check out Gazde as a Croatian version of Georges Moustaki. Judging from this two-CD compilation, the strength of Croatian music lies in instantly addictive melodies, driven by folky guitars. Prljavo Kazaliste's S Vremena Na Vrijeme could be a hit anywhere when translated into English. The CD also features some high quality dance contributions (Dino Dvornik, Stampedo).

SUNSET MUSIC FROM PORTUGAL VOL.1

(Portugal)

This release from the Sociedade Portuguesa de Autores, first-time exhibitors at MIDEM, is obviously aimed at the MOR market. Seventeen instrumentals revisit songs made famous by Amalia Rodrigues, Dulce Pontes and Madredeus. The absence of vocals highlights its global crossover possibilities: most tracks are heavy on the dramatic melodies, with relatively little emphasis on rhythm. Excellent stuff for lounge lizards.

MUSIC FROM DENMARK

(Denmark)

This luxuriously packed 5-CD sampler, including four hard-backed books, gets the award for most impressive MIDEM packaging, and on the discs focusing on world music, rock, jazz and folk, the Danes match the packaging with musical content. On the two rock CDs, the emphasis is on melodic, grungy guitars and impressive harmonies. Several Danish rock artists have already been snapped up by majors, but there are many other indie goodies on the sampler. Denmark's own Diamanda Galas appears in the shape of classically trained Catherine Sadolin, whose vocals are adorned by classic hard rock riffs. Family produce sexy grooves with a hint of latin style, while the rocky soul of Ole Friis reeks of smoky Texas bar-rooms.

AMERICA GETS GROOVING

After years of watching Europe with envy, the dance industry in the U.S. is expecting to see dance music gain major territory on the national sales charts this year. In January, The Prodigy, Chemical Brothers and Livin' Joy all penetrated the Billboard Hot 100 Singles chart, and key radio stations such as WKTU in New York and Groove Radio in Los Angeles (KACD) are playing increasingly important roles in getting dance music out to the masses. Meanwhile, the industry is beginning to support dance music on all levels.

Island Records' president Chris Blackwell has announced plans to form a label deal with dance music veteran Vince Pelligrino. "I've always seen dance music as universal, because everyone around the world loves to dance," comments Pelligrino, "Chris realises the potential that dance music has. The fit with Island Records couldn't be better." Pelligrino built up his experience and international network via high profile positions at CBS, Polygram, RCA, Chrysalis, as well as his own companies Pelligrino Promotions and Street Information Network (S.I.N.). Established by Pelligrino seven years ago, S.I.N. has developed into an essential U.S. network of dance radio, mix shows, clubs, record pools and specialty retail shops. "With S.I.N. behind us, we will have the support in the market to be able to push the boundaries and foster the development of this genre," says Pelligrino.



Breakin' & Entering

A weekly Eurochart analysis by Bob Macdonald The Material Girl is back in Vogue.

Madonna jumps to the top of the Eurochart Hot 100 Singles this week with Don't Cry For Me Argentina (Warner Bros.), her first number 1 since Erotica ruled the roost for three weeks in autumn 1992. On the chart as in the movie, the Evita star has risen swiftly through the ranks in recent weeks, her last four placings being 24/7/3/1. This week Madonna achieves a whopping 82 percent increase in chart

points, fuelled by such spectacular leaps as 21-1 in France and 12-4 in Germany, picking up the Sales Breaker award in the process.

All of the above points to a lengthy stay at the summit for Argentina, but there are potential February challengers but there are in the shape of U2's forthcoming single Discothèque (Island) and No Doubt's current number 3 hit

Don't Speak (Trauma/Interscope), which is still on the rise in several markets and gets a U.K. release on February 10.

The musical chairs at the top of the Hot 100 mean that Robert Miles and Maria Nayler are finally pushed down from 2 to 4 with One & One (DBX), but this week's all-American top 3 means that the duo remain the highest ranked European act.

This week's highest new entry is a Franco-American alliance between Supreme N.T.M. and Nas, the latter rapper being more successful in France than in any other European territory (Music & Media, December 21, 1996). Affirmative Action (Columbia) crashes onto the French chart at number 2 and the Hot 100 at 14.

As his duet with Sarah Brightman, Time To Say

Goodbye (East West), becomes a European top 5 single, Italian star Andrea Bocelli (see page 18) is making his presence felt in no uncertain terms on the Top 100 Albums list. His latest release Romanza (Polydor) enters the chart at 30, joining his two other titles, Bocelli (number 6) and Viaggio Italiano (number 35). Céline Dion (Epic/Columbia) also has three albums on the top 100, but only Bocelli has three inside the top 40.

Strong re-entries on the albums survey are staged

two diverse British groups, the Prodigy and Queen. The former's 1994 album Music For The JiltedGeneration (XL Recordings) is back at 64, soaking sales from un consumers recently converted to the act by the smash singles

Firestarter and Breathe; such pent-up demand suggests that, when those tracks finally appear on the new Prodigy album in the spring, a retail bonanza will be the likely result. The first volume of Queen's Greatest Hits (Parlophone) re-enters at 67, but does not carry an IFPI Platinum Europe symbol on the chart, as only albums issued after January 1, 1994 are eligible for certification.

By the time this magazine began publication in 1984, Abba were already a thing of the past. But the supergroup's creative core, Benny Andersson and Bjorn Ulvaeus, are making waves on the European chart in 1997. This week they re-enter the chart at number 95 with the original cast recording of their current Swedish stage musical, Kristina Fran Duvemala (Mono Music/Sony).



Europe **Philippe** Generali, who is working on a special project for RCS in New York.

GERMANY: Polydor Germany has promoted Petra Heimberg to the position of senior product manager musicals and entertainment. Having taken on the new position, Heimberg will continue to work with artists Andre Rieu and Andrea Bocelli.

SWEDEN: Mega Records has divided the top executive post at its Swedish and Norwegian affiliates and appointed Anna-Lena Ahlstrom as managing director for Mega Records Sweden, effective immediately. Terje Engen, former MD of both affiliates, returns to Oslo as MD of Mega Records Norway (for more details on Mega Records' new structure, see next week's Music & Media).

As predicted in Off The Record last week, concert promoter Jonas Siljemark has joined Arcade Sweden as MD. Siljemark is one of the founding fathers of the Swedish Dance Music Awards. Last year he launched his own label, Siljemark Entertainment, which scored a number one hit with Lutricia McNeal's Ain't That Just The Way. The catalogue of Siljemark's label will be transfered to Arcade as part of the move.

U.K.: EMAP Radio chief executive Tim Schoonmaker has been elected to serve as chairman of the Commercial Radio Companies Association (CRCA). Schoonmaker established EMAP Radio in 1989 and is a founding director of the U.K. Radio Advertising Bureau.

At BBC Worldwide Publishing, John Willan has been appointed director of BBC Worldwide Music. The former EMI classical productions manager joined the BBC in 1995 as head of worldwide music. Willan is replaced in that role by Mike Cobb, who will be responsible for publishing rights and royalty collections. Cobb joined the BBC last May, working on copyrights.

IFPI mines more platinum

Their debut album *Spice* (Virgin) sold over two million copies in less than three months. Released in November 1996, *Spice* shoots straight into the Platinum Europe hall of fame with a Double Platinum award in January.

The fast growing number of nominations reflects the spectacular development of the European music market, which is now the single biggest market for pre-recorded music in the world, accounting for \$13.4 billion—a third of global music sales.

IFPI plans to hold the next official Platinum Europe ceremony in 1998. A city and a venue for the event are yet to be confirmed. IFPI members are currently looking into ways of extending the programme for future awards ceremonies to include live performances by participating artists.

Billboard unveils daily music news service

NEW YORK — Billboard magazine entered the daily news business this week with the January 29 launch of Billboard Bulletin, a two-page fax report covering the international music business.

Each workday, the Bulletin will include dispatches from Billboard's correspondents around the world, as well as reporting by the U.S. staff of the magazine and its fellow Billboard Music Group publications—including Music & Media. On Thursdays, the Bulletin will add a third page for a special chart preview.

"As interest in the music business has increased around the world, it became imperative that Billboard develop a vehicle for fast-breaking news," says Ken Schlager, the Bulletin's editorial director in New York.

"With Bulletin, we can offer a quick

read of the day's key developments," explains Schlager, "while Billboard will continue to provide weekly in-depth coverage and analysis."

The Bulletin staff includes Michael Amicone, the managing editor in Los Angeles, and Carolyn Horwitz, the New York-based associate editor. For the launch, International coverage is being overseen by Adam White, vice president of the Billboard Music Group and international editor-in-chief of Billboard. A London-based international editor for the Bulletin will be named soon.

BBC feeds breakfast show hosts

LONDON — BBC World Service affiliate Radio International has launched a worldwide information service aimed at music radio breakfast shows.

The infoNET service, which came into service on January 27, delivers overnight breaking news in the music, entertainment and film industries, via fax or e-mail to subscribing stations. It is available every weekday, 52 weeks of the year. Eventually, soundbites will be provided with the service via the Internet. Subscriber stations will be able to access infoNET material with a password.

Currently, the service is being offered to broadcasters on a trial basis. Eventually, subscribers will be guaranteed exclusivity in their markets, according to Alan Stratton, a senior marketing director at the World Service. He says, "We have already had about thirty enquires from stations in territories such as Switzerland, Hungary, Belgium and Denmark."

Anthony Pugh, BBC Radio International music editor, claims the infoNet is distinct from other such information services available because of the vast BBC resources at its disposal. He explains, "The aim is to have something which is right for breakfast shows. Other services are much more broad. Also the BBC is breaking so many stories. For example, bands are constantly coming into the BBC studios."

Record companies and artist managements will benefit from infoNet, according to Stratton, because the service delivers accurate information on their acts—including pre-release information—to the listeners as well as keeping programmers up to date on the acts' activities.

Short Takes

PAINTING THE TOWN WHITE

When Jyoti Mishra, a.k.a. White Town, scored his U.K. debut No.1 single in January with Your Woman, there were celebrations all round at Chrysalis and EMI and for Neil Ferris and the team at promotion company Brilliant!. And yet some industry watchers suggested that, in the fight to break new acts, the British top slot represented merely a won battle and not a total victory.



Haunted by the spectre of Bablyon Zoo, an act which debuted at No.1 in 1996 and has been on a downward career path ever since, the British industry as a whole is mindful that creating overseas hits and long-standing albums acts are as much a part of artist development as high-flying chart debuts.

There are signs, however, that on the overseas front White Town is starting to make inroads. This week's airplay reports show *Your Woman* added by 13 stations in Europe, with a total of 29 monitored stations playing the song. Key German broadcasters such as Radio Regenbogen and Eins Live are playing the record in the first week of it going to radio, and several U.S. broadcasters are picking up on the song, which started its commercial life by being picked up by Brilliant! and Chrysalis after Radio 1 DJ Mark Radcliffe played the demo.

If the album, Women In Technology, out in the U.K. February 24, can by-pass the critics and win over the public in the same way that the first single has, then there will be cause for chilling down more champagne at Chrysalis.

CHANNEL HOPPING

Hot on the heels of news that Ophélie Winter will be recording an English-language album (Short Takes, February 1) Patricia Kaas is doing likewise. Kaas is no stranger to recording in la langue Anglaise, as her 1993 album *Je Te Dis Vous* was presented to international audiences as *Tour De Charme* in English. Columbia France says not to expect a second quarter release, however—close co-operation with Sony Music in the U.S. suggests a weighty international push sometime later this year.

FAITHFUL FANBASE

Marianne Faithful's album 20th Century Blues (RCA Victor) slipped out quietly last year with critical approval and more than a hint of nostalgia in the press coverage. Since then she has taken her Evening In the Weimar Republic tour around the world, playing in all major European territories and Australia and captivating audiences with her rendition of the songs of Weill, Brecht and Coward. She returns to Europe in May after U.S. dates.

VICTORY CELEBRATIONS

And on the subject of RCA Victor, the label celebrates its 80th anniversary this year with a set of releases which should have jazz aficionados salivating. Key releases include celebratory sets from Duke Ellington, Jerry Mulligan and a Louis Armstrong boxed set with seven previously unreleased tracks. The label is also reissuing its first record, *Livery Stable Blues* by the Original Dixieland Jazzband as a 10° promo vinyl in March.

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Off the record

Following the news that Berlin techno label Low Spirit has changed its distribution partners from Motor to BMG Ariola Hamburg (Music & Media, February 1), OTR hears that Low Spirit star Mark'Oh of Tears Don't Lie

fame has decided to sign directly with Motor.

Slots for concerts at the London Music Week trade fair/seminar are filling up fast. OTR hears that Creation, EMI, Avex and WEA have already booked label showcases. And Parlophone has apparently taken options on all five evenings of the April 28-May 2 event.

It seems that IPSOS still wants to produce diary based radio ratings as an alternative to the established Médiamétrie survey. IPSOS president Didier Truchot said at a recent meeting held by Vive La Radio that the plan is still alive; the idea is to broaden the scope of the survey from a Paris-based panel to include the whole of France. A first trial survey—financed by Europe 1—was undertaken last September in Paris, but no other data has been released since. Truchot says that continuation of the surveys is simply a question of getting clients to finance the ratings. It seems, nevertheless, that Europe 1 is unwilling to commit itself to such an investment.

OTR understands that the tentative merger plans for two of Warner Classics labels, German-based Teldec and French-based Erato, will now not be carried to fruition. A source suggests that the merger might have been called off because, "Each label has a very strong identity and a specific artistic policy."

It looks as if French indie label **Tréma** no longer has a general manager; founders **Jacques Revaux** and **Régis Talar**, have let incumbent **Bernard Carbonez** go, two years after he was hired. Modest results and disagreements over company strategy are apparently behind the move. It seems Carbonez will not be replaced, but will continue to have some relationship with Tréma, through his own label **Carpe Diem**. Previously, Carbonez was president of **BMG France**.

Leading U.S. ratings firm **Arbitron** (story, page 6) will be pitching its tent in the U.K. in a few weeks. The company is scheduling a series of presentations for broadcasters in the run-up to the bidding for the radio research contract which goes out to tender next year, according to a U.S. source.

France Inter music programmer Marc Garcia is expected to be appointed soon as head of music programming for all the stations of public broadcasting company Radio France. Garcia is also closely involved in the set-up of a new, youth-oriented station, which is likely to take firm shape in the first half of this year.



The potential audience for country music in the U.K. is looking increasingly healthy, if provisional viewing figures for the six-and-a-half hour TV extravaganza, Country Night, aired by the BBC2 network on January 25 are anything to go by. It's estimated that the programming was watched by a total of 3.5 million U.K. viewers.

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
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
