



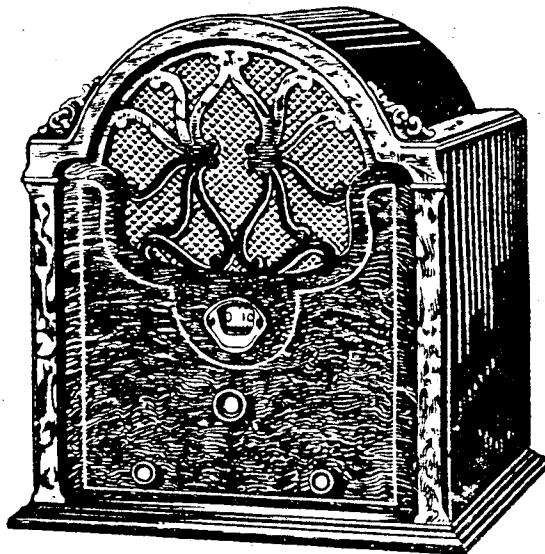

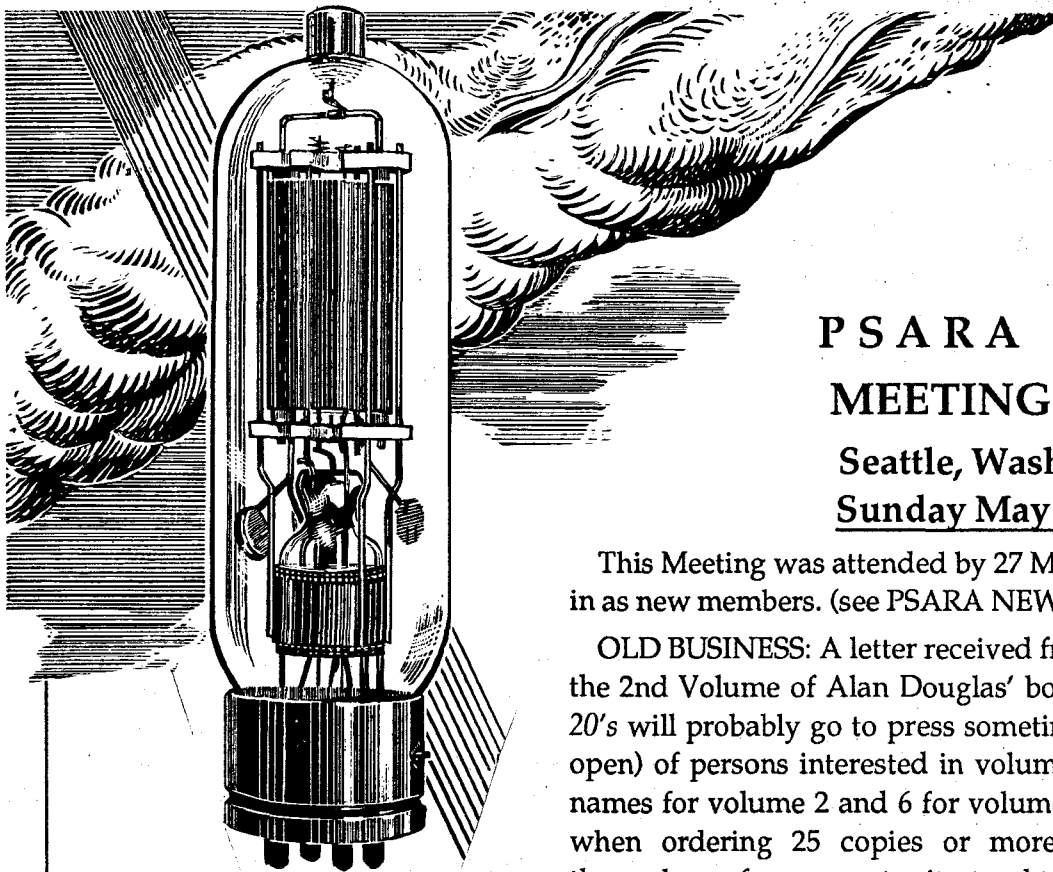

Seattle, Washington
Sunday May 21, 1989

This Meeting was attended by 27 Members, 5 of whom were voted in as new members. (see PSARA NEW MEMBERS).

OLD BUSINESS: A letter received from Vestel Press explained that the 2nd Volume of Alan Douglas' book: *Radio Manufacturers Of The 20's* will probably go to press sometime in June. The club's list (still open) of persons interested in volume 2 and volume 1, contains 20 names for volume 2 and 6 for volume 1. The discount is substantial when ordering 25 copies or more.
