Gorman Sues WNCXFor \$5.6 Million

Former WNCX/Cleveland PD John Gorman filed a \$5.6 million breach of contract suit Monday (10/19) against WNCX owner Metropolis Broadcasting. He seeks \$600,000 in compensatory damages and \$5 million in punitive damages.

Charles Delbaum, Gorman's attorney, said, "John was PD at WMMS/Cleveland for 13 years. He ran one of the most successful stations in America, and was lured away by Metropolis to take on VP/Programming duties at its newly acquired Cleveland property. John

was offered a two-year contract, including equity in future acquisitions, which they chose not to honor. He was only given five months; they told him they didn't like the direction the station was going in, and changed format from CHR to Classic Hits."

"By getting fired this way John's reputation in the business was severely damaged. A grave injustice was done to him."

WNCX GM Steve Joos and Metropolis owner Harvey Deutch could not be reached for comment.

A battle royal has erupted in a Washington courtroom between Chapman Associates President William Cate and three men who until recently were close associates — and the firm's top billing brokers.



Seven-and-a-half-year station vet Jerry Minshall will host the morning show, joined by new newsman Dan Osborne, who's been out of the business the last three years.



Last Friday (10-16) at 11:30pm, Metro Mass Media's hard-rock "Z-Rock"'-formatted WZRC/Des Plaines, IL (Chicago market) changed calls to WTWV and switched affiliations to SMN's "The Wave." The only localization within the satellite feed of Metropolitan's pop/rock/jazz/new age format comes in AM drive, when local news and traffic conditions are aired.

According to OM Kevin Jay, "Advertiser reaction has been positive; we've had some holdovers from the old format. On the other hand, we had some people show up with pickets over the weekend to protest our switch."

A TV and billboard campaign was launched in conjunction with the format change. "Our first TV spots ran during the World Series.

Allen New PD At KXKL

David Allen has been named PD at Shamrock's KXKL-AM & FM (Kool 105)/Denver. Allen replaces Steve Nicholls, who was with the simulcast combo for nine weeks during its transition from Country to Gold.

Allen was most recently PD of Transtar's Specials Division, responsible for the programs "Romancin' The Oldies" and "Saturday Night Supergold." Before that he was PD at "Classic Hits" KLSC/Denver (now KYBG) and OM at KVMT/Vail.

KXKL GM Marty Loughman told R&R, "My intention had been to find a PD with experience in the format and the market. I was fortunate enough to have Dave Allen, who meets both those criteria. He'd voiced a desire to come back to Denver and the combination of things worked out."

"When I came on board, this station was in very good condition and very well-organized," Allen said. "It's an exciting radio station because the energy level is really high."

KXKL adopted a mainstream Gold posture in July after spending most of this decade as Country KBRQ-AM & FM. In the summer Arbitron, the combo was up 2.2-2.9, making KXKL the leader in a three-way Gold race.

We're targetting upwardly mobile people, both in Chicago and in the suburbs. Our strong suit is the highly-populated North Shore area"

Asked about differences between WTWV and Chicago's WNUA, Jay said, "Anyone who checks it out closely will find we're not that similar. Our music formula is about one-third light Jazz, one-third New Age, and one-third Soft Rock. They tend to have more of a Jazz flavor and are going after the Urban audience. Granted, this might be a West Coast hybrid format, but we firmly believe there's a market for it here."

Jay and GM Craig Wilbraham remain with the station, but some staff changes in sales and on-air personnel have been made. "We're making some substantial technical improvements," Jay added.

Results from Chicago's summer Arbitron placed WZRC in a tie for 24th 12+ with a 1.1.

Masia Sells Katz Its Rep Contracts

Masla Radio has sold the majority of its representation contracts to the Katz Radio Group. The former Masla stations will be repped by the following Katz companies: Banner Radio, Republic Radio, Christal Radio, Katz Radio, and Katz Hispanic Radio Sales.

Mosesman To WB Nat'l Country Post

Longtime Country programmer and WBAP & KSCS/Dallas OM Bill Mayne is leaving the Cap Cities/ABC Country outlets after four years to become Southwest Regional Marketing Manager for Warner Bros./Nashville. His last day will be October 30, but he won't start with WB until January 1, 1988. Mayne replaces Denny Mosesman, who is relocating to Nashville to become National Field Promotion Manager with WB, also effective January 1.

WB/Nashville VP/Promotion Nick Hunter told R&R, "Denny's been with WB since 1983 and was with Elektra for four years before that. He's earned the right to come up here and get a national slot."

Hunter's only comment about Mayne's joining WB was, "Now he'll have to listen to our records."

Mayne commented, "Being part of the legend that is WBAP, and taking part in KSCS's growth as we've restructured the station the

last few months, has been wonderful. But I'm 36, and after 17 years of getting up and going to a radio station every morning I just decided I'd like to do something different."

Mayne's early career was spent in CHR. He was a KRLY/Houston personality, and later programmed KNOW/Austin and KCNR & KPAM/Portland.

He moved into Country programming in 1981 when he joined KVET & KASE/Austin. From there it was to Los Angeles to program KZLA and later KLAC when it was purchased by Cap Cities. In 1985, as Cap Cities prepared to spin off KLAC & KZLA following its acquisition of ABC, Mayne was named PD at its WBAP.

Last December Mayne was promoted to OM for WBAP and sister KSCS. After several years of declining ratings, KSCS climbed from a winter '87 12+ 3.2 in Arbitron to a spring 4.5. It moved to 5.8 in the summer ARB.

Fields PD At WJYL

Tony Fields has been promoted to PD at Inter-Urban's WJYL/Louisville, which he joined several weeks ago for mornings after an evening stint at crosstown CHR WDJX. He is now sitting out an onair non-compete clause from WDJX, and will join his former WLOU partner Gary Rogers in mornings on WJYL around mid-November. Previous PD Maurice Harrod is now OM, responsible for personnel functions.

GM Paul Bather told R&R, "Our ratings have increased 25% since the first of the year. We think with Tony's arrival in morning drive, which has been our weakest daypart, we can move into Louisville's top three."

Until Fields goes on-air at WJYL the station is running a "where is Tony Fields" contest, with \$101 prizes to winners who spot him in any public place.

"I've been in this market for seven or eight years," said Fields. "I have a pretty good grasp of what people want — an uptempo Urban station — and I'm going to give it to them. Right now the music is divided almost evenly between fast and slow; we'll try to change that to 70/30."

Fields began his career at longtime Black giant WLOU as a parttimer. He spent five years there, working his way up to MD.

WJYL became a market factor in early 1984 when it posted a 7.0 by becoming the market's only CHR at the time. Inter-Urban switched WJYL to UC when it took over that summer. With a format monopoly on FM, WJYL has beat WLOU consistently for 15 months. It cracked a six share for the first time in the summer book.

New owners Louisville Radio Partnership are expected to take over in January.

McGovern GSM At WCCO

Don McGovern, GSM at KMPC/ Los Angeles for 14 years, has been named GSM at News/Talk WCCO/ Minneapolis.

"This has got to be the most complete radio station in existence," he commented. "I also landed a windfall, because I got here just as the Minnesota Twins [carried by WCCO] walked into the World Series."



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

FCC Stalls On Smut NEW/S BRIEFS

Okays Limited Call Sign Rule Changes

The FCC has temporarily postponed action on plans to "clarify" its new policy on indecent broadcasts, but says it will rule on the matter November 24.

The Commission was scheduled to announce its plans during its regular monthly meeting on Tuesday (10/20), but shelved the item at the last minute at the direction of Chairman Dennis Patrick.

FCC General Counsel Diane Killory said the Commissioners need more time to resolve problems involved with the conflict between First Amendment rights and the interest in protecting children from smutty material.

Call Sign Rules Changed

In another controversial matter, the FCC says it will streamline present call sign rules involving station ownership changes but nixed a proposed rule that broadcasters feared would cause pandemonium in the industry.

Last February the Commission proposed to wipe out rules governing the use of "K" and "W" call signs, and to allow many stations to use identical calls. The proposal provoked widespread opposition from broadcasters who claimed it would confuse the public.

The Commission has now found there is no shortage of available call signs, and the benefits of maintaining the geographic restrictions outweighed any inconvenience to broadcasters. Stations west of the

Mississippi River will continue to be assigned calls with "K" prefixes; those east of the river will continue to receive "W" handles.

Stations in different broadcast services, such as a TV station and an FM station, will be allowed to use identical call signs even if the stations are not commonly owned. The FCC says any station wishing to use such a call sign must first get the written permission of the existing call sign holder.

The Commission also will amend its rules to waive its first-comefirst-served policy when licensees switch frequencies in their market area. Existing rules require stations in such cases to give up their call sign first, then ask the Commission for permission to use it again.

"It seems to be a sensible, rational response to a chaotic proposal," said Commissioner Jim Quello. "I'm glad to see that common sense prevailed.'

'I don't think this docket requires intensive comment from me," said Chairman Patrick to laughter, "except to say, for those who believe that this Commission is disposed to deregulate for the sake of deregulation, I would have them note this item.

More Daytimers Get Nighttime Hours

The extinction of daytime-only broadcast stations drew closer recently as the FCC gave the go-ahead for more daytimers to operate at night on 14 foreign clear channels. Previously, US stations within 650 miles of Canada and Mexico were prohibited from operating at night on these channels, as stipulated by the North American Regional Broadcasting Agreement (NARBA). But the Commission reported that recent international talks determined those protection levels "far exceeded" requirements needed to avoid interference, so more US stations can operate on them.

Because the NARBA rules still apply to Bahamian clear channels, only partial nighttime operation on 1540 KHz was granted to US daytimers within 650 miles of the Bahamas. However, the FCC says the Bahamian government "intends to denounce NARBA" and stick only to another international agreement with no such restrictive

Twenty-one of the 41 daytimers on the 1540 KHz frequency are now authorized for nighttime broadcasting, although the Commission noted that some stations even outside of the 650-mile boundary will continue to

have operations restricted until NARBA rules are scrapped.

Tennessee Upholds Reporters' Shield Law

The right of news reporters to keep sources' identities confidential has been unanimously upheld by Tennessee's Supreme Court. The court decided that WDOD/Chattanooga, TN reporter Mark Curriden could lawfully refuse to identify a source who confessed to murder in a news series on unsolved crimes in the Chattanooga region. State law enforcement officials claimed that Curriden was exempt from the shield laws because he had exclusive access to the unidentified source. However, the Supreme Court upheld an earlier court of appeals ruling that said the state hadn't tried hard enough on its own to find the self-proclaimed murderer.

Gutin New CPB Chairman

Texas public TV broadcaster Howard Gutin was elected new Chairman of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting's board of directors at their recent annual meeting. The board also elected former CPB Board Chairman and New York corporate entrepreneur William Hanley Jr. as Vice Chairman. In other action, CPB VP/Telecommunications David Brugger was promoted to Sr. VP.

NAB Launches AIDS **Education Campaign**

A 15-segment radio PSA series on the myths and facts about AIDS is being produced by NAB in conjunction with the US Department of Health and Human Services, "AIDS, Let's Give America The Facts" features one- to two-minute messages from medical authorities at the Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta. Stations are encouraged to use the segments as part of public affairs or news programming, and NAB is supplementing the tapes with lists of the most frequently asked questions about AIDS and additional information sources. NAB Radio Board Chairman Jerry Lyman said the project "approaches the AIDS issue from both a national and, more importantly, a local perspective. It will give stations the tools to develop on-air material geared to the specific needs of individual communities." The materials will be available by calling NAB at (202) 429-5420.

Swift Introduces **Renewal Reform Bill**

Flying in the face of criticism from the broadcast industry, Rep. Al Swift (D-WA) introduced his version of two-step license renewal reform legislation on Capitol Hill last week (10/15). The bill (HR 3493) leaves the door open for public interest provisions originally drafted last June, and requires that broadcasters be judged by a standard of "meritorious" service.

"I believe the public interest standard as we have always known it is in serious jeopardy of disappearing altogether," Swift said. "This bill clearly reasserts that vital standard."

Swift said broadcast industry representatives such as the NAB have failed to make what he called necessary compromises to get reforms they need. "It hurts to see an industry put itself in such danger willingly, eagerly," Swift commented. The NAB recently said it would support a license renewal bill covering radio only, but the Congressman said he wasn't interested in that proposal.

NAB President Eddie Fritts responded with thanks for Swift's effort but objected to the possible tradeoffs the bill allows. "We are concerned that many more provisions negative to broadcasters, such as reimposition of the threeyear rule, could be inserted as the bill winds its way through the legis-

lative process," he said.

The bill proposes that an incumbent licensee first be evaluated by the Commission as to how "meritoriously" it has served the public interest. This would require stations to keep records of public serv-



In return for nixing financial settlements paid by incumbent licensees to challengers, the bill provides for "one other thing" unspecified tradeoff such as reinstatement of the three-year ownership rule or commercial limits on children's television programming to pacify public interest advocates in Congress.

"We just don't see the bill as being desirable for the industry, and we are looking for some kind of ra-dio-only approach," NAB lobbyist Steve Jacobs told R&R. "We're not sure we would gain very much from a meritorious service stand-

In his statement, Fritts said NAB would continue to support the bill (HR 1140) introduced last February by Rep. Tom Tauke (R-IA), which requires a less stringent "substantial" public service standard broadcasters feel would better protect their programming free-

House Commerce Committee hearings on both the Swift and Tauke bills are expected to be held in early 1988.



Congress Rejects Ad Tax Revenue Proposals

Advertising tax deductions were spared the Congressional hatchet last week in tax revenue bills passed by House and Senate committees. Broadcast and advertising industry lobbyists had testified at Congressional hearings last summer against proposals such as cutting ad tax deductibility by 20%. Also abandoned were proposals to kill tax deductibility on advertising of so-called "sin" products such as alcohol and tobacco.

Lobbyists at the American Advertising Federation and NAB were jubilant. "The strong efforts of our local radio and television broadcasters in raising this issue with senators and representatives was crucial to our success," said NAB President Eddie Fritts.
"While we are pleased that this

"While we are pleased that this battle turned out in our favor, we know that the question of advertising deductibility will continue to come up as the Congress wrestles with the budget deficits. We remain opposed to this proposal due to its discriminatory nature and the fact that it is bad tax policy," Fritts added.

Florida Ad Tax Persists

In Florida, however, broadcasters' hopes were dashed last week as the legislature ended three weeks of special sessions without repealing the state's controversial five percent advertising tax.

According to Susan Traylor, Press Secretary for Governor Bob Martinez, state House and Senate leaders plan to resume meetings about the tax in December and will hold public hearings around the state in the interim.

state in the interim.

"We're a little skeptical about these public hearings, frankly, because all the efforts the (House and Senate) leadership made were to save the tax," Traylor told R&R. "We believe the rank-and-file members wanted repeal on the day the leadership decided to adjourn and go home. The winner usually doesn't get up and walk away from the table first. It really appears to us that the leadership lost control

of the members."

Until the December hearings, Traylor said the governor will make speeches around the state to campaign against the tax.

Florida Association of Broad-casters President-Elect and tax committee Chairman George Hyde, VP/GM of WQBA/Miami, said, "I think the focus of the FAB can be summarized as 'stay the course.' When we started fighting this thing, we really had no expectation that we would be able to make any sort of progress before the next session in April. But in four months we've been able to convince both the House and the Senate to pass a bill which excluded advertising from further taxation. Conceptually, the governor is also on the side of exempting advertising from taxation."

Hyde said the FAB decided at a board meeting last week it will continue anti-tax activities, but in a diplomatic way. He believes it is unwise for broadcasters to take a heavily negative stance at this point.

"I would not want all that we have gained to be lost by a sudden, ill-advised outcry just because we're upset," Hyde said. "If the broadcasters in Florida now start a campaign of retribution, the legislators will find some way of getting back at us, whether it's another tax or something else."

Traylor said since the tax went into effect July 1, the governor's office has received about 27,000 letters protesting it. Even though Martinez at first vowed to fight for the tax, he subsequently bowed to pressure from fellow Republicans and called for its repeal. During the legislature meetings, the state attorney general announced that repeal of the tax without its replacement would be unconstitutional. Subsequent proposals included revising the tax or replacing it with a sales tax increase.


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Unlocking Mall Dollars

By Chris Beck

uestion: I've been trying to develop business from several shopping centers in my market to no avail. I know there is money there, yet I haven't been able to tap it. I've tried getting budgets from the mall advertising directors as well as the individual merchants without success. Any ideas or suggestions?

nswer: One probable reason you're not getting the response you'd like is because the individual merchants are already contributing a significant percentage from rent and sales overrides alike to the mall's management, which coordinates the advertising. While some malls do have corporate advertising dollars, the majority comes from this percentage of rent from merchants, which makes up the mall's co-op budget.

This contribution usually comes in addition to agreements that require the individual merchants to participate in a predetermined number of other advertising vehicles per year. Each retailer has a certain number of MPRs (Mall Participation Requirements). Generally, these MPRs take the form of an ad in a direct mail piece.

Armed with this knowledge, use these MPRs to unlock mall dollars. Whatever your promotional idea might be, first present it to the mall office, and ask them if they will credit those merchants who participate in your campaign with fulfilling a Mall Participation Requirement.

Furthermore, try to get the mall association to underwrite 50% of each participating merchant's schedule. The 50% co-op qualifies the mall management for 50% of the spot. (Normally, you should recommend a 60-second spot, broken into a 15-30-15, with the first and last 15 seconds devoted to general mall advertising and the middle 30 seconds reserved for the individual participating merchant.)

Once you've presented your ideas and won approval from the mall's management, ask if they'll let you have a few minutes at an upcoming merchants association meeting to present your campaign. If that isn't

possible, start canvassing the mall merchants with your package, stressing that their participation will count towards their MPRs and that the mall is picking up half the cost out of its coop budget.

If you are unable to secure the cooperation of the mall's management, try to form your own mall co-op by selling a "mall shopper concept." This involves selling 60-second spots in which two or three participants underwrite the cost of each spot, which can then be pro-rated on the basis of each participant's share of the total spot length.

Finally, when selling any concept to a mall, allow

yourself ample time to contact the national or regional advertising people for each franchise in order to get their approval. They are frequently willing to participate, if given enough time. However, don't count on the major mall anchors for much support; chances are they are already contibuting additional monies though their own advertis-

he average chief executive officer is 46 years of age, has been with his present employer for 12 of those years (68% of the time, he founded the company), and earns a base salary of \$74,379.

However, according to a recent survey conducted by *Inc.* magazine, the addition of bonuses, benefits, and other perks push the average CEO's total compensation to an annual \$96,811. The latter figure, incidentally, represents a 23% increase in the average CEO's total compensation over 1985-86.

At least 48% of these CEOs report receiving bonuses, with the average bonus equal to 25% of their base salary.

How Bonuses Are Determined

While 83% of the companies pay bonuses directly to the individuals, at 72% of the firms this money is placed in a bonus pool to be divided among worthy individuals. (The total here is greater than 100% because a number of companies use a combination of the two methods.) Among companies that pay bonuses directly, 58% of the time these bonuses are completely discretionary. Another 30% of the time the bonus is related to achievement of

any companies provide their chief executive officer, their chief operating officer, their chief financial officer, and their chief managing officer with benefits and perks above and beyond those which are available on a company-wide basis. profit goals, 28% of the time the bonus is determined by a percentage of the company's profits, and 24% of the time the bonus is tied to achievement of sales goals. Only 8% of individual bonus plans are linked to a percentage of sales or a return on equity, assets, and sales.

As for companies that compute bonuses from a bonus pool, 65% of the time these monies are distributed on a discretionary basis. Another 20% of the time a fixed formula is used, and 19% of the time these companies determine CEOs' bonuses from a formula that is established annually. (Again, the number of multiple responses to the categories in the previous two paragraphs are due to firms that use more than one method to determine CEO bonuses.)

The typical company that contributed to the *Inc.* survey had \$6.1 million in total revenues, 105 em-



Flexible Medical Plans Benefit Employees And Employers

ompanies that allow their employees to choose their own packages of health and medical benefits not only keep their workers happy, but also reap significant financial rewards.

Those companies that provide their employees with a so-called "flexible" health plan help reduce the rate of increased medical costs over a period of time, according to a recent survey conducted by the Lincolnshire, IL-based Hewitt Associates firm.

Data for the survey was compiled from 20 companies that implemented a flexible benefits program by 1982 or earlier. Statistics show that for these firms the rate

of medical cost increases dropped 18.5 percentage points, from an average of 14.5% above inflation in the year prior to implementation to 4% below inflation by the third year of the program.

The features most commonly adopted under flexible medical programs include increasing deductibles (found in 43% of the plans), replacing first dollar medical plans with one or more comprehensive plans (32%), requiring higher contributions for either dependents (26%) or employees (16%), and allowing employees to take an outside medical package that is not offered by the company (18%).

VCRs CAUSE SHIFT IN TV VIEWING: When do busy Americans have time to play back all those VCR-taped programs? According to data compiled by Nielsen Media Research, it's a case of Saturday Night (Not)

Saturday night is the most popular time to replay videotaped TV programs, with 20% of all playback viewing occurring that evening. Sunday evening is the next most-popular playback time (18%), followed by Friday evening (16%), a tie between Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday nights (12%), and Thursday evening (10%). (Maybe it's mere coincidence, but television's number one program, "The Cosby Show," also airs on Thursday nights.)

According to the study, day-time television — not prime time TV — is most affected by delayed viewing. Research shows that many evening VCR watchers are soap opera junkies, but apparently they are not screening their favorite soaps during prime time. In fact, only one-quarter of all playback occurs





during prime time. (Last season's overall prime-time viewing was decreased by 2%.)

Specials, plays, and miniseries are the types of shows most likely to be taped by viewers, followed by feature films and regular television series. Nielsen concluded that the average VCR household has its cassette recorder in a "play" mode an average of five hours per week, and in "record" about 3.5 hours per week.

hristmas and Hanukkah are still several weeks away, but now is the time for parents to start purchasing the gifts that will make their tiny tots' eyes all aglow come holiday time. Made in Italy, the bellissimo exterior design is matched by some impressive under-the-hood engineering. Sporting a 12-volt battery and an electric ig-

nition, the gas-powered car features an automatic transmission, an 11-horsepower 3600 rpm engine, front and rear suspension, and hydraulic disc brakes. The car measures 9' 4" long by 4'5" wide by 2'8½" high. Price: \$14,500.

Up to 17 weeks may be needed to complete the baby mogul's production, which is presented at a private screening. Price: \$180,000 (all expenses included).

• African Safari: The catalog promises all the sites and sounds associated with a traditional African safari. Land Rovers will transport you to an exclusive campsite, complete with a tent as luxurious as the best hotel. Lounge around the campfire eating gourmet meals and taking in the sights while preparing for a private expedition in search of rhinos, zebras, and wildebeests. The \$50,000 price is based on first-class accommodations, transportation, meals, taxes, and fees for 14 days for two adults and two children.

Swimming Pools Found In Two Million US Homes

here are 2.69 million inground swimming pools currently in use in the US, and 84% of these are residential inground pools.

According to a recent study conducted by the Alexandria, VA-based National Spa & Pool Institute, 61% of these backyard resorts were constructed out of concrete, 35% were made out of vinyl, and 4% were fabricated from fiberglass.

While medium-size pools — measuring either 15' by 30' or 20' by 40' — are the most popular, for most Americans their little piece of surf on turf isn't complete without an automatic skimmer (found on 91% of all residential inground pools), a set of underwater lights (81%), an automatic-cleaning system (56%), and a diving board (53%). Gas heaters are seen as a must among 39% of residential inground poolowners as well.

Less-popular options include remote multifunction controls (found on 12% of all residential inground pools), waterslides (11%), active solar water heaters (3%), and electric heaters (1%).

Mood Swimsuits

rom our Build-A-Better-Mousetrap Department comes the news that Union City, NJ-based inventor Donald Spector has designed a bathing suit that changes color according to the body temperature of the person wearing it.

Here's how the "mood suits" work: The garment is made of a thermally-sensitive material that contains liquid cholesterol crystals. When the wearer's body temperature changes, the cholesterol molecules rotate, causing light to reflect in different patterns, and thereby altering the color of the suit.

While Spector's NYC-based company, Scentronic Industries, can make the basic suit in any color, the part of the suit affected by the change in temperature — we'll leave that to your imaginations — runs the predictable gamut of colors, going from brown to green to deep blue.

Spector plans to have the "mood suits" available in department stores by the summer of '88, at a retail price of less than \$100.

Circular Bar Codes Upcoming

ar codes, those rectangular patches of thick and thin lines, are used to identify everything from common grocery items to military equipment. However, not every product can be barcoded easily.

For example, items passing through an optical scanner in a jumbled fashion frequently cross over the sensor from all directions, and the resulting mix of vertical and horizontal lines makes it difficult for the scanner to read them.

To solve this problem, a San Diego-based firm, Tarbox Developments Inc., has developed circular bar codes that look the same from every angle. Owing to their shape, the circular bar codes are ideal for identifying cylinders and reels as well

PAPERLESS OFFICES IN FUTURE?

Optical Disc Market Set To Explode

espite the millions of personal computers currently in use, at least 95% of the nation's information is still stored on paper.

According to a recent survey by the Coopers & Lybrand accounting firm, only 4% of America's information is presently stored on optical discs, and only 1% of this info is stored on magnetic discs. Clearly, any dreams of a paperless office are just that.

Nevertheless, the growing need to store and extract information in

a form that will increase productivity is expected to force businesses to create electronic duplicates of these paper documents for easy retrieval

As a result, the survey predicts that the amount of information stored on microfilm and optical or magnetic discs should double by the mid-1990s. Optical disc systems are likely to be the biggest gainers, with sales estimated to soar from \$100 million in 1986 to \$2.4 billion in 1996.

Concurrently, overall sales of data and image-storage equipment are expected to increase from a today's annual figure of \$2.5 billion to an annual figure of \$6.5 billion before the end of the next decade.

Rather than using coins, this new system requires consumers to purchase a small card that comes in \$2, \$5, or \$10 denominations. The user simply slips the card into the phone, which deducts the cost of the call, then displays the amount of credit left on the card. When you're out of credit, the machine "eats" the card.

To prevent users from being cut off in mid-sentence, a tone sounds 20 seconds before the card's value expires, allowing you to either insert another card or end the call.

The company is presently monitoring the coinless pay phones at 47 locations on the University of Michigan campus, in a test that is scheduled to run throughout the school year. The site was chosen because of the potential for parents to give the cash cards as gifts, thereby ensuring that their sons and daughters will phone home at a price less than what it costs to call



Walter Grins And Bears It

CBS RECORDS honcho WALTER
YETNIKOFF, the man who's been globetrotting to raise the dough to buy CBS
Records out from under its corporate umbrella,
has reportedly been squirreling away his own
dough in the form of Treasury Bills — which
were one of the few bright spots this wild
week on Wall Street. If the market keeps
going to the Bears, Walter may be the only
one who can afford to buy CBS Records.

Big changes at WOR/NY, as Gotham's News/Talk giant not only severs its relationship with TALKNET, but also drops SHERRYE HENRY's and Dr. KAREN BLAKER's shows, causing the following reshuffling of the on-air lineup: BERNARD MELTZER moving into the 10am-1pm slot, JOAN HAMBURG's consumer show going to 1-3pm, former KGO/SF weekender JIM JORGENSON taking over the 7-10pm shift, and Dr. ROBERT ATKINSON switching to the 10-11pm timeframe. Neither LARRY KING nor morning perennial JOHN GAMBLING will be affected by the moves. Also, WOR News Director BERNARD GERSHON has announced that he will segue crosstown to the Associate News & PD post at All-News WCBS, starting 11/9.

While One Hand Giveth...

Songwriters can take some comfort from news out of Washington. House and Senate committees have passed amendments to last year's Tax Reform Act that will reinstate critical tax benefits for composers, as well as freelance writers and photographers. Under the '86 law, they would have been able to deduct research and other expenses only by estimating the long-term worth of their work — a near-impossible task with something like a song.

The SONGWRITERS' GUILD, the NATIONAL ACADEMY OF SONGWRITERS, and BMI were among groups lobbying for the changes, which should become law when the full Congress votes on an omnibus tax correction bill in the next few weeks.

Meanwhile . . . they've been handing out the pink slips at **CHAPPELL MUSIC**, now that **WCI** has completed its \$200-million purchase of the music publishing house. In Nashville, VP/GM **HENRY HURT** (16 years with the

company) and VP PAT ROLFE (a 12-year veteran) were among those let go. Similar actions are expected elsewhere, owing to duplicate job functions at Chappell and WARNER BROS. MUSIC.

BMI President **FRANCES PRESTON** is the first woman to be inducted into the Nashville Rotary Club.

Who's "Still" In Charge

Rumors continue to fly in the Motor City as GREAT AMERICAN awaits FCC approval of its WRIF/DETROIT purchase from SILVER STAR. The hottest is that PAT STILL (half of the popular PAT & WAGS morning team) will replace MICHAEL MAYER as PD. Exiting GM ABE THOMPSON previously denied the possible change, and Mayer, while confirming he's heard "all the rumors," had no comment.

More changes at KBEQ/KC, as present GM DON PETERSON resigns, making way for the new crew from NOBLE, who are set for an early November takeover. Look for KISS/SAN ANTONIO VP/GM DAVID SMALL to be officially announced as Peterson's replacement, and a new PD to follow next week

PARKER COMMUNICATIONS Prez LOU BURON called the ST rumor control tower to deny any market rumbles about 194/HONOLULU changing course away from its CHR direction. Look for the three-way battle between 194, KQMQ, and newcomer KXPW to rage on and on and on.



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

Asher Beats His PolyGram 'Secret' Goal By A Year

wo years ago, Dick Asher was appointed President/CEO of PolyGram Records, Inc. Two weeks ago, PolyGram's European parent, N.V. Philips, announced plans to make a public stock offering of 20% of its shares in the worldwide record company.

The events are not unconnected. Before Asher arrived, such a flotation would have appeared absurd, since PolyGram's US operations lost more than \$200 million between 1979 and 1984. Now the company is very much in the black, and sales for the current year are expected to be at least 25% ahead of last year's \$225 million.

Before PolyGram, Asher was bestknown for his 22 years at CBS, where his titles included President of CBS Records International from 1975-79 and Deputy President/COO of the CBS/Records Group from 1979-83. He spent a year as Sr. VP of Warner Communications immediately prior to joining PolyGram.

In the following interview, Asher discusses the last 24 months at the company, and some of the changes for which he and his executive team have been responsible.

R&R: What do you feel you've been accomplishing at PolyGram?

DA: We're trying to make sure we have a company which does things efficiently and professionally — and I think we've achieved a decent degree of that.

There are no huge secrets. We stick to fundamentals pretty well. If you're an effective company and sensitive and sympathetic to artists and creative people in general, you should attract your share of good artists.

A good record company is one that does everything well, because all kinds of little things can screw you up. It's the classic "Richard III" situation: "For the want of a nail, the shoe was lost," etc.

R&R: You once said, "After you've finished being smart in the record business, you also have to be lucky." True in this case?

DA: We've certainly had some luck. At any given time we can't be much better than the music we have. It's humbling to think of it that way, but very true. The public won't be sold things — certainly not on a profitable basis — that they don't want to buy.

What's also humbling is that we can screw up something the public might want, or do a less than adequate job. So we're really working hard on all our records.

Bon Jovi was a good album, we knew that when it came in. Was it eight million good? You bet. But we would have been happy if it had been two million good, which would have been an immense improvement over what had happened before.

Yes, we had Bon Jovi targeted as fine artists, with a lot of potential. We had our guns lined up and firing, and before the album came out we did the things you're supposed to do. But we didn't write the songs—we just went into it as hard as we could and the public did the rest. So there's always an element of chance.

R&R: People say PolyGram is more artist-oriented than before. By design?

DA: Yes, we work very hard at that. It's tough being an artist. Being creative requires almost exposing your guts. You work very hard on things and expose your innermost thoughts, and then you have to go out in front of a lot of people and do it.

Whether or not something is commercial is happenstance, but it usually represents difficult and sincere efforts by these people. So we owe them an obligation to do the best possible job with what they present to us. I feel that very strongly.

They should also feel we're their friends. Not in the sense of going out and having a drink with them — although sometimes they like that, too — but in the sense that we're on their side, that we're trying hard to make it happen for them. We're in it together.

R&R: How far can you extend that obligation?

DA: It's hard to generalize. I can't sit here with an open checkbook and pay for anything anybody dreams of. But it is a lot easier to get money from me for marketing or A&R or for artist-oriented pur-

poses than it is for adding an extra accountant or lawyer or mailboy. The guts of a company are the artists and the product. If we don't have that, the rest of us might as well go home.

R&R: How much have you had to change PolyGram's overall organization?

DA: When I first came here, I was amazed at the lack of organization. It just didn't function like any record company I had ever known. There were a large number of people who, I began to realize, were pretty good but very unprofessional

A lot of the more competent ones were running around trying to do everything. There were A&R people spending 90% of their time trying to "sell" the company or promote records, rather than signing good artists and making good records.

As simple as it sounds, a lot of people really didn't know the definition of their jobs. They just needed some role models, a little bit of direction, and maybe a little bit of reorganization.

R&R: Does criticism about the number of CBS people you brought in bother you?


DA: A little. I went after the best possible people. Sometimes when you want to get things done it's quicker to ask the people you know.

Some of that was accidental. I must have interviewed 40 people for the A&R job. I chose (Sr. VP/A&R) Dick Wingate, who was somebody I knew from CBS, because I was looking for a very professional attitude. So maybe the fact that he had been at CBS meant something, because I knew they had a pretty professional outlook there.

In other cases, I wanted to grab (Exec. VP/Marketing & Sales) Bob Jamieson as soon as I got here. The only question was whether I could get him or not, and I thought CBS was crazy to let him go.

R&R: Do you have enough resources for your current level of business?

DA: We've added some people. They say I'm fairly easy on the marketing and A&R side, and tough on extra MIS or financial people. But even there, we've had to loosen up. There is some strain, because the level of business is considerably above what the company's ever done before.



again.

One way not to have to do it again is by not overloading and leaving yourself vulnerable. I'd rather treat this current success as a peak rather than a plateau that's going to stay forever. If it turns out to be a plateau or the valley for the next peak, so much the better — but I don't want to anticipate it to the point where I have to go through those cutbacks again.

R&R: Are you considering separate promotion teams for Polydor and Mercury?

DA: Definitely. We're trying to prepare for it in an intelligent way that doesn't involve going around the street with hundred-dollar bills coming out of our pockets, trying to buy people. We're trying to train an awful lot of them here, because very often your best people are those you develop yourselves.

One reason you see us trying to get ourselves in a position where we have the option of a second promotion force is obviously because there's a bottleneck. You can only handle so many records at a time.

There's no sense in giving promotion more records; that isn't going to solve the problem. They've done a great job handling as many as we've had at times, but we have to expand the machine.

DA: I would guess we would be

DA: I would guess we would be up between 25% and 50% over that, maybe even a little more. It depends on what happens in the last quarter.

If the chart activity and things like that are any indication, we've been running number three behind CBS and Warners all year in terms of owned repertoire. A decent amount behind, but for us it's quite an improvement.

R&R: Was that a specific goal when you joined the company?

DA: We had a sort of secret goal among ourselves of "three in three" — but now it's actually in two years. But we didn't broadcast that goal publicly; it would have sounded pretty brash and conceited.

We're just trying to build every day the best we can with what we have, and if we do that, we're confident the rest will take care of itself.


R&R: Do you think about your own image in comparison with the industry's other chief executives?

DA: For one thing, I consider myself a moth among butterflies. I'm just not like the other company presidents in a lot of ways, but everybody has to do what works for

Most of the others are very individualistic. I really believe in teamwork a lot. I get my kicks that way, and I don't know any other way to do it. Nor can I convince people I have all the answers, because I don't. There's no giant "S" on my chest under my sweater.

I hope the company has a bluecollar image. We don't have a lot of executive stars here, or heads of finance who wear gold chains. We're different that way. I think our image is that we're effective, and that we pay attention to business.

I've heard people say we have a high degree of integrity in our dealings with artists, inasmuch as you get what you pay for: no hooks, no tricks. Nobody feels they got screwed. If the things I hear are true, I love that kind of image.

top brokerage firms.

'I see no change whatsoever in the firm or the direction that we're headed or the goals that we have," he said.

Frustration Fed Defection

Giddens has repeatedly refused to discuss the lawsuit, on the advice of his attorney. But affidavits filed by the former Chapman brokers indicates the split was triggered in part when Cate and coowner Ray Stanfield repeatedly rejected their offers to buy into the company, and refused to give them a voice in the running of the firm.

"Associates of Chapman receive no meaningful territorial exclusivi-Giddens's affidavit states. "Chapman has always reserved the right to place associates wherever it sees fit. The associates, whose votes are not binding, urged Chapman management to institute a review process for future associates that would require an associate vote or some requirement status: the idea was rejected. There is little control over the number of associates placed anywhere and there is no control over what their qualifications may or may not be.'

In their response, the brokers say they gave Cate their resignations - effective October 10 - on Friday (9/11) at the NAB Radio Convention in Anaheim. Upon returning to Washington on Sunday (9/13), they discovered that their offices had been "illegally

entered" and personal property removed. The brokers also say Chapman officials have not returned all of the property. Cate claims the contents of the offices were disrupted because of the company's recent relocation of its headquarters to Washington.

In his lawsuit, Cate alleges the three accounted for "close to half of Chapman's business." An affidavit he filed also provides a rare behind-the-scenes glimpse of the financial rewards of high-powered radio brokering:

"In 1986, Mr. Evers was paid \$865,104.83 in commissions. Mr. Jeffery was paid \$622,278.84, and Mr. Giddens received \$395,101.28. Mr. Evers was Chapman's leader in commissions that year, while Mr. Jeffery and Mr. Giddens received the second and fourth highest amounts of commissions, respectively. The commissions paid in 1986 to these three men were approximately one-half of the amounts paid by Chapman to all Associates that year.'

How will the loss of top billers affect Chapman? In his lawsuit, Cate suggests dire financial consequences, but in a discussion with R&R, he was more philosophical.

"Very little, other than it will take some time to replace their productivity. Chapman's been around for 33 years, and brokers come and brokers go, but the company continues ahead.

"I think it'll be a couple of weeks before we really see the ripple hit local radio. I see no effect today nationally," he said.

Record Repercussions

In the record industry, the week's events focused attention on CBS Records and the proposed PolyGram stock offering.

Any disposition of the CBS/Records Group — whether to Sony for its \$2 billion bid, or as a spinoff to avoid the tax consequences of such an outright sale — is now considered unlikely, at least in the short term. CBS stock declined more than 40 points Monday.

Financial analyst Harold Vogel of Merrill Lynch said Tuesday, "The disaster is so bad that no deals are being done at all right now. There is nothing new to say on anything, and to ask about Poly-Gram or CBS is academic."

Dutch-based Philips announced two weeks ago that it would make a public offering in November of approximately 20% of its shares in PolyGram's international record operations.

A Philips spokesman in Holland told R&R Tuesday, "As of today, we have no plans to delay the flotation of PolyGram." It would proceed as scheduled next month, he said. Philips shares were among those that dipped in European markets at the beginning of the week.

In the US, WCI and MCA were among music-related companies whose stock suffered on Wall Street. WCI has just completed the acquisition of Chappell Music for \$100 million in stock, and the assumption of \$100 million in Chappell debt.

Publishing Stock Offer Confusion

The combined Chappell and Warner Bros. Music catalogs make WCI's music publishing interests (with 650,000 songs) the largest in the world, and a partial public stock offering had been anticipated. Its status is now unclear.

This past spring, MCA toyed with the idea of selling a minority interest in its Music Entertainment Group to the public, but shelved the idea shortly afterward for reasons not made public.

Tightening Up

Other broadcasters watched the value of their companies melt away during the Wall Street panic, such as JACOR Communications President Frank Wood. Jacor stock went from 7% to 6, for a ball-park paper loss of about 16% of the company's value.

"It sucks . . . we took it in the shorts like everybody else," Wood said

Wood said the asset value of his company is strong, and said JACOR is considering buying up its own stock while the price is so low.

He believes overall financing for radio deals will be tougher to get industrywide. "I think it's going to make everyone's buttocks tighten up. People will be walking crowfooted for a while," he said.

Infinity Buying

Another broadcaster who took a large paper loss was Infinity President Mel Karmazin, who watched the value of his personal portfolio drop by about \$6 million as his company's stock plunged to about \$14 Monday, down from a high of nearly \$27 two months ago.

"From our point of view it doesn't impact us at all, because we wouldn't use the stock to make an acquisition," he said. "It certainly doesn't impair our operations, doesn't affect our cash flow or our ability to borrow money."

Karmazin's strategy is to buy. "I think there are some terrific values out there, all of the broadcasting companies," Karmazin said. "This morning (10/20) I bought CBS and Cap Cities. Gannett's down to about half of what it was, and it's a fabulous buy. I don't think there is any question about the fact that the companies are still very solid."

Karmazin said Infinity "absolutely" intends to buy back some of its shares while the market is down.

Broadcasters Better Off Than Most?

Paul Kagan & Associates analyst Bishop Cheen says media stocks have not fallen as much as the rest of the market. He believes the broadcasting business will remain healthy because it's a highly domestic industry and doesn't have to worry about competition from foreign suppliers.

While he expects the availability of capital to tighten in the aftermath of the crash, Cheen says broadcast deals — especially in the form of limited partnerships — may be very favorably viewed by investors looking for high yields.

"In a flat market, good venture yields become very attractive to investors. While there may be less capital because people took a big hit, for those deals that make sense, they'll become even more attractive for investors.

"Advertising expenditures are the first thing to go when the retail economy takes a hit. Broadcasting is so retail-dependent, it's going to hurt if there is a recession.

"Human nature being what it is, people don't go out and spend money when they're told things are bad. There is a ripple effect. When people lose net worth, there's a trickledown effect so it's got to hurt

Capital Gets Tougher To Find

George Nadel Rivin, a broadcast accountant with Miller, Kaplan, Arase, believes the broadcast industry will generally fare well in the aftermath of the crash. But he feels that highly-leveraged entrepreneurs may face some immediate discomfort as financing sources temporarily dry up.

"It certainly isn't good news. The banks are in a standstill position. I'll be very surprised if any financing commitments will be granted between now and the middle of November." he said.

Florida broadcast broker Stan Raymond disagrees with Rivin. He is optimistic about deals being funded, and he believes the value of broadcast investments is now greater than ever before.

"I don't think it's going to have much impact. The broadcast business is too strong. The people who want to buy stations will have the money. I think if you have sense, you'll be buying broadcast stocks. Just put 90% of the broadcast stocks up on a dartboard and hit 20 and you'll have all winners."

He's putting his money where his mouth is. Shortly before R&R interviewed him Tuesday afternoon, Raymond placed buy orders with his broker for LIN, Osborn, and Gannett stocks.

Other Factors In Play

Broadcast financial experts say the future availability of venture capital for the radio industry will hinge on many factors, with the underlying value of station assets taking on increased significance. Chapman Associates investment banker Bob Maccini is worried about the impact of the market crash, but he sees other problems on the horizon.

"I think the more serious effect could be the specter of rising interest rates," Maccini said.

Morgan Stanley & Co. VP Peter Currie says it's too early to know for certain if equity values have taken a dive. But he believes more rough financial weather is ahead because of actions by Congressional Democrats.

"The House Ways and Means Committee would deny the deductibility of interest on debt used to finance acquisitions," says Currie. "The banks and the mezzanine lenders, if they perceive a risk, however remote — and I don't think anybody believes this tax law's going to be passed — they won't lend as much."

Wertheim Schroder investment banker Gary Stevens says perception of risk will become a major factor in the post-crash days, as lenders and investors more critically examine their net worth.

"I don't think it's going to have any immediate impact on capital. I think it will, however, have an impact on the willingness of people who spend that capital. They may

view their net worth as being much different than it was a week ago," Stevens said.

"I don't want to sound like President Reagan, but I think 'stay the course' makes a lot of sense," said Broadcast Investment Analysts President Tom Buono. "I think the industry's still solid, the assets are solid. What happened with some of these companies just doesn't make sense."

Bankers Expressing Confidence

Rochelle King, VP/Investment Banking for Merrill Lynch Capital Markets in New York, told R&R, "The values inherent in radio and television stations were never speculative and were traded on real cash flow, so I think you've got solid investments that are not going to go down. We feel very confident"

One market lender observed, "We have some clients who are postponing public offerings until the market stabilizes. It's almost certain that if they go through with trying to raise any equity at this point they will be taking some discounts." The market slide could deflate many investors' hopes that 1988 would be a boom trading year for the broadcast industry, she added.


However, Communications Equity Associates Managing Director/Group VP Don Russell thinks that while lower station prices are likely, there is hope that interest rates will decline.

"People have a tremendous confidence level in the radio, television, and cable industries," Russell says. "The question is how acquisition financing may change regarding venture capital, the junk bond market, and zero coupon bonds."

Russell says he is seeing a lot of publicly-owned media company stock buybacks, although he has not heard of any bank loans being recalled. "Each deal is going to stand on its own merits," he says.

Providence, RI-based Fleet National Bank VP Daniel Williams says, "If anything, people will be scarred with the knowledge that the world can turn upside down in a matter of hours or days, and the psychology of it may impact everybody for some time to come."

Teens: The Quest For Concert 'Cool'

Two weeks ago (R&R, 10/9), I shared insights from a focus group conducted with concertgoers over 18. They discussed their fears regarding safety at concerts, their reticence to attend shows without reserved seating, and the reality of budgets.

Later that same day a focus group was conducted with concert-goers 17 and younger. As with the older group, all participants were recruited from telephone numbers they had given when intercepted at various concerts.

Eager For Challenge

The recurring theme in this afternoon session was "challenge." For example, if the teens could get tickets to a hot show and come away with a T-shirt or sweatshirt and wear it to school the next day, that was cool. The smaller the venue, the greater the challenge. If there's a good show being held in a 3500-seater, then the value to getting any seat is enhanced. Just the fact that you're inside and someone else is outside makes it that much more valuable. Everyone being inside diminishes the event's "hipness."

Interestingly, the teens said promoters should charge more money. Make it harder for everyone to go — thereby more exclusive. In turn, the T-shirts or sweatshirts given away or sold become more valuable or hipper. The same

premise worked for WMCA/New York in the '60s. Listeners could only get hold of the station's golden yellow Good Guys sweatshirts through an on-air promotion. And 'MCA further ensured the garments' hipness by not giving them away in droves.

When a local promoter calls the radio station and offers ticket giveaways to bolster sales for a show that isn't selling well, the message isn't understood clearly by teens. They confuse a radio station's message of exclusivity — i.e., "We're the only place you can get these" — with the message of "plenty of good seats available." Some even said a radio promo for a ticket giveaway meant the show was sold out. It would be very important in a station's relationship with the concert promoter to offer a clear message to listeners.

Down In Front

The challenge issue popped up again when the group was asked which they preferred: reserved or "festival" seating. Unreserved won out — a 180-degree turnaround from the older group's reply. Although some peer pressure was definitely at work, the same answer kept coming back.

Our first thought was that they liked having the same opportunity as anyone else to sit in the front row: no ticket scalpers, no waiting in line overnight, no ordering. Instead it was "the challenge to get to the front" that they sought — "to push, shove, kick, and claw our way to the front of the stage."

Teens get into the music of their older brothers' lives

Once there, do they fend off other challengers who wish to occupy the same space? "Nah," they yawned.

"(Getting) tickets to a hot show . . . and wearing the T-shirt to school the next day (is) cool."

"After a few minutes up there it gets boring." So what do they do? They kick, punch, and physically jostle their way to the back of the arena. And from there what happens? Score a beer? Hang out? "We shove our way back to the front."

Not every mother's son or daughter exhibits this same behavior. But as I looked around the table, no one seemed overly shocked by what had been said. Clearly, the challenge mentality is a big part of adolescent behavior.



There was very little clarity in call letter identification. As with the older concertgoers, the teens were most likely to identify stations by digital frequency. There was also very little disc jockey name recall.

Among the females, station preference closely paralleled artist preference. If the young woman had first been questioned at a Whitney Houston concert, she favored a CHR station. If sampled at a Ratt/Poison performance, she favored AOR. Male station preferences weren't as easily discernible.

One phenomenon that's brewing among these adolescents is the discovery of the Woodstock generation's music. They reacted positively to Crosby, Stills and Nash, and said they're taping the music from each other or sharing an older brother or sister's copy of such LPs as Led Zeppelin "I & II." Most of them also said they'll tape the product they buy to protect the master's quality.

When it comes to purchase power, everyone in this sample had a way to earn cash. Many told us they visited shopping malls at least once a week. Clearly, they have money — and they spend it on being cool.




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

Chapman was up nicely, as were all KVIL DPs except nights, calming speculation on whether the AC legend was merely mortal now. KMEZ reversed its spring 6.3-4.2 drop. KSCS has climbed from a 3.2 since winter to come suddenly within earshot of Country leader KPLX. Without moving much, KHYI is now within striking distance of KEGL. WINZ moved 5.0-6.3-5.0; Neil Rogers was second in middays with a 7.5 in his final AM book. All three players in the tight AOR race were up. The big surprise was WAXY, which shot from 12th place to sixth. The oldies-edged AC was one of at least nine Broward or Palm Beach County stations that increased (So was motivational WWNN. which showed in Miami for the first time with an 0.4.) In a largely contrasting Birch, WPOW's incredible growth continues. WEDR, not traditionally a Birch power, added a share for second place. WHYI and WHQT fought the CHR battle in third and fourth place.

In Arbitron, it was a big deal for WZAK just to be back in the 7-8 share range as it had been over the past six months. Now Lynn Tolliver and the 93FM crew are higher 12+ and closer to perennial leader WMMS than ever before: as has been the case for a few books, WZAK wins nights. Another station benefiting from a virtual format monopoly is WQAL, which hasn't hit a nine since winter '84. WLTF, which billed itself as the "free money station" and ran one of the few heavy summer giveaways, picked up some ground on AC leader WMJI. (In Birch, the race is even tighter with WMJI on top 8.4 to 8.1.) WNCX, which hasn't advertised since switching to AOR/ Gold, had its best book under those

WBSB lost a few tenths but led both Arbitron and Birch. The surprise here was WXYV, which has had a few anxious moments in Arbitron recently. V103 was very street-oriented in the summer; its only outside advertising was a handful of subway cards. WXYV, WEBB and WWIN all got an Arbitron boost from WWIN-FM becoming dance outlet WGHT. V103 declared itself "the station that won't change on you." WWIN (AM), meanwhile, moved away from its Gold approach back towards Urban center to beat its FM. (DC's WHUR, which is next to WWIN/WGHT, also had a good Birch.) An increasingly modern WPOC opened its Country lead in both books as competitor WCAO's direct mail drew to a close. ACs WWMX and WYST, which both used outdoor during the summer, rebounded in Arbitron. WBAL, which has wobbled at the start of baseball season for two years now, strengthened its third place ARB showing.

KOSI was the Arbitron leader as always, but KRXY was suddenly right behind; in Birch, it's already the third #1 station in as many books. Y108 had nearly 38% of ARB's teens: KQKS, which seaued to CHR, had only 3%, indicating that the new format hadn't kicked in yet. The #2 teen station was Urban KDKO, which had its best showing in a long time, beating its sister FM immediately before switching to "Heart & Soul." Another upset went to KLZ, almost always found around a two share instad of in the Country lead. (The sudden change in the KLZ vs. KYGO battle can be seen in Birch too, although not as dramatically.) Apparently the passing of the baton from KBRQ brought KLZ back to public notice. KBRQ's successor, KXKL, didn't do badly for itself the first time out either.

DISCLEXIA PT. V

Freak Out In The Darkness & Other Greatest Garbled Hits

When I began preparing my "comeback" column, I thought a simple garbled lyrics column would be the simplest transition back into the swing of things. I never envisioned that one column would become a three-part megaepic. Next thing you know it will turn into a novel, probably a Book-of-the-Month Club alternate selection, with film rights going to the highest bidder (three no trump is the highest bid to come in so far). This installment, however, will be the last for the present time . . . at least until the home video and interactive CD versions come out.

A couple of request line title tripups from WCIL/Carbondale PD Tony Waitekus: "I Eat Cannonballs" ("I Eat Cannibals," Total Coelo) and "Lobster In The Sun" ("Lost Her In The Sun," John Stewart).

WHMP/Northampton, MA PD Maria Zippay believed the Honey Cone's "Want Ads" contained the lines: "Experienced in love preferred/But will accept a young Chinese." The group was actually an equal opportunity employer, looking for a young "trainee" regardless of race, creed, or color.

Former R&R editor Gene Schulatti, already cited in an earlier installment for royally screwing up lines from "La Isla Bonita," proves his peculiar knack is not a short-term affair with this example from the early '60s. "Dear Lady Twist" by Gary US Bonds had a couplet that went, "Doctors agree and now I know/Do the twist and you'll never get old." Instead of the first two words, Gene thought Gary was saying, "I talk to the trees . . ."

While I'm dredging up transgressions of past R&R staffers, I should mention a couple from a present R&R contributor, Mr. "Air Personalities" himself, Dan O'Day. Listening to "Me & Bobby McGee," Dan heard Janis Joplin singing "One night in a mausole-um/Lord, I let him slip away" and thought to himself, "No wonder he

dumped her!" Deriving "in a mausoleum" from "near Salinas" qualifies Dan for the 32nd degree of the secret brotherhood of lyric-mangling masters.

Dan also was puzzled by Sam Cooke's "Wonderful World." When Cooke sang "Don't know much about the French I took," Dan thought it was "those French ice hooks" and couldn't wait to get to high school and find out about 'em.

And R&R's Jim Dawson and Sean Ross both used to think Jimi Hendrix was saying "Scuse me while I kiss this guy" in "Purple Haze." (Ironically, in Soft Cell's cover of the song, singer Marc Almond, in keeping with a rather flamboyant sexual persona, actually sang the garbled lines.) On The Records contributor Phil Columns says that when Mel & Kim sang "Like us, hate us" during "Respectable," he thought it was "Lie, castrate us."

Freaking Out In The Darkness

"Solid Gold" 's David Leaf and his brother Bobby believed Friend & Lover's "Reach Out In The Darkness" was "Freak Out In The Garden." (I don't know about the garden bit, but I'll still swear they're singing "freak out" instead of "reach out" at least half the song.)

Independent promoter Richard Pachter cites Missing Persons' classic "Walking In A Lake" ("L.A."). WLUW/Chicago's Stephen Hill thought Jermaine Jackson's "Let Me Tickle Your Fancy" was "Let me take off your pants." (Both interpretations probably convey the intent of the song, but Jermaine's is just a tad subtler.)

Ed Clay of WGEM/Quincy, IL got behind the concept of the Go-Go's "Our Lips Are Sealed" as "Alex I See You." And one of his listeners at another station called up to hear Kenny Loggins's "I'm Alright" by the title "Ham On Rye." Jim Martin of WOAY/Beckley, WV, perhaps influenced by local industry, reports hearing the Pointer Sisters' "Goldmine" rendered as "My baby's got a coal mine."

Another Sean Ross-ism is fairly ingenious. Ashford & Simpson sing "On any street corner" during the course of "Street Corner," but he misinterpreted it as "An industry called love" — totally different idea but quite similar-sounding syllables.

Joe Reed at WKIK & WGRQ/Leonardtown, MD had an active imagination as a kid. The 1964 J. Frank Wilson car crash hit "Last Kiss" contains the chorus line "She's gone to heaven and I've got to be good." Joe interpreted it to match some of his own concerns: "She's rounding second and I'm heading for third." As he says, "It could only make sense to a six-year-old who learned how to read from the sports pages of the New York Daily News!"

Continuing, Joe recalls, "As a teenager, I remember Rod Stewart telling Maggie May, 'My love, you didn't need the cokes.' My sister informed me that this was not the real thing." The actual line, far from being an early anti-drug (or anti-soft-drink) message, was "My love, you didn't need to coax."

Finally, Joe has the ultimate twist on lyric garbling. "My sister

was a big Beatles fanatic. So I thought I would annoy her by purposely messing up the words to 'Lucy In The Sky With Diamonds.' I paraded around the house singing, 'Picture yourself in a boat on a river with plasticine porters and looking glass ties!' Imagine my chagrin when I found out those were the actual lyrics." Some days it doesn't pay to garble.

A number of disclexic incidents stem from listeners localizing lyrics to fit their own geographies. Here's a bizarre example from KLON/Long Beach's Steve Propes. Freddy Cannon's "Tallahassee Lassie" includes the line, "She's my Tallahassee Lassie from F-L-A," a hip sort of reference to the great state of Florida. But an L.A. jock who played the song at the time said on the air he was getting complaint calls from East Los Angeles listeners peeved about him playing a song that said "She's my Tallahassee Lassie from West L.A."

England Dan's Millennial Mystery

This next one's got me perplexed. I received two letters about the opening line of the chorus of "I'd Really Love To See You Tonight" by England Dan & John Ford Coley. Neither mentioned the correct version, so I figured that, even though I couldn't remember it myself, I could just ask somebody around the office when it came time to write this column.

Well, that worked like a charm. Instead of discovering the right line, I ended up with *three more* interpretations, plus a repeat of one of the original garblings.

To recap, NBC Radio Networks' Mike Greenzeig thought it went "I'm not talkin' 'bout the linen." Another correspondent, known to me only as Slim (probably because I lost the envelope that went with the letter), figured it was "I'm not talkin' 'bout millennium' (maybe this mystery writer was Don Ienner...).

Here at R&R, Hurricane Heeran held out for "I'm not talkin' 'bout leavin'," while Filmhouse's Jeff Green insists it's "I'm not talkin' 'bout believin'." Sean Ross goes along with Slim on the millennium thing, while Jim Dawson, Jim Nelson, and ex-R&R editor Reed Bunzel, who at least have the most logical idea, contend it's "I'm not talkin' 'bout movin' in." I'll throw my hat in their ring.

Slim, by the way (and I do apologize for not being able to provide a more accurate ID), has a few other jewels. A friend believed Chaka Khan's "I'm Every Woman" was "Climb Every Mountain." And then, in Slim's words, "Prince's 'Raspberry Beret' has been cleverly retitled 'Bad Varicose Veins.' But my alltime favorite hatchet job happened while I was in Chicago. A woman called my request line to ask for 'Mama Save My Mocca-This became an allconsuming challenge as I tried to decode it, as the broadcast went all to hell. After 15 minutes, I hit paydirt when I asked her to sing a few bars. I then recognized the song as Michael Jackson's 'Wanna Be Startin' Something." The caller had derived her title from the African words Michael sings during the course of the song.

Disclexia Foils Columnist

To conclude, let me relate how I got screwed up by a case of disclexia. I commented in a consumer music publication about how strange some lyrics from Dead Or Alive's "Brand New Lover" seemed to me: "What I really need to do is find myself a brand new lover/ Somebody who'll lie with me who doesn't notice all the others." I pictured a big bedroom full of friends of Dead Or Alive crouched under the bed, hanging from the ceiling, or hiding in the closets, unnoticed by the oblivious lover. Talk about weird group sex, I thought . . . then a reader wrote to say the correct line was "Somebody with eyes for me who doesn't notice all the others." Definitely a first-class Emily Litella syndrome . . . never mind.

These horizon acts will normally receive 3-4 plays a day while in the Buzz Bin category, and will then generally move up to Heavy or to more medium exposure levels.

Criteria For Upbeat Pop Hits

In another policy move, MTV has formally announced a set of criteria for adding pop and dance hits outside the overall rock spectrum of the channel. When uptempo hits not being aired by MTV reach the Top 20 (R&R and Billboard), they will be added if they research well with MTV's audience and if the clips are visually compatible and up to MTV's standards.

not already on MTV hit the Top 20 each week, this policy will not revolutionize the content of the channel. It will give MTV exposure to some artists previously not featured (like Lisa Lisa and Expose, the first two clips added under the new criteria, both in lesser rotations below the heavy levels showcased on R&R's weekly MTV list). It also serves to add potentially more pop/dance material augmenting the Madonna/Whitney Houston/Janet & Michael Jackson-type super stars already aired regularly.

etallica's "Garage Days Revisited" is almost metal. Gold, that is. Elektra VP/National AOR Promotion Brad Hunt reports the five-cut EP is only about 40,000 short of the 500,000 unit sales necessary to collect an RIAA gold certification.

No surprise, then, that the label is planning a similar release for another of its hard rocking acts, Metal Church. "Live In Dallas, Texas" is due in November, with concert versions of five songs from the band's repertoire, including "Watch The Children Play."

It originates from a show Metal

Church did earlier this year for Z-Rock. Says Hunt, "The quality of the tape came out extremely well, so we decided to go with an EP. It keeps the band's profile up between studio albums, and makes a lot of sense from a promotional and marketing standpoint."

The release will figure in the label's roster-wide "Merry Metal Christmas" sales campaign. The last Metal Church album sold 180,000 units — 80,000 ahead of the one before. "We're establishing a real nice base for the band," concludes Hunt.

o make sure AOR programmers have all the up-to-the-minute info on the new album by MSG (the McAuley Schenker Group), Capitol has sent out this all-purpose stopwatch, personalized with the band's logo and album title.

If the name sounds familiar, you might remember the first formation of the MSG band (the Michael Schenker Group), which released two albums on Chrysalis. New lead vocalist Robin McAuley has hooked up with Schenker for their Capitol debut.

The band will be opening on the fall leg of the Rush tour.

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

Pint By The Gallon

English is alive and well and living in disguise all over the nation. With my radio on scan/seek in the South, I was momentarily baffled when I heard a jock announce a big pint sale.

Following the split second during which my brain challenged the possibility of one pint being bigger than another, the right connection was made when the announcer gave the location of the big sale: the Sherwin-Williams Pint Store. Hot dang, Billy Bob, it only took me a second to figger out he meant paint!

Regional accents are kind of fun to hear on the radio. Deep in Confederate country (you'll know you're there when you hear "South" pronounced with two syllables) some people sit on chayahs and eat gree-uts. Up in the Nor'east, "lodge" is a size. A

burlap bag in the West is a gunny sack in the Northwest and a tote bag or a jute down South.

For my money, the theory that national radio and TV are smoothing out the regional quirks of the American language is just loose talk, for a passel of differences ah still theyuh.

The broadcasting business used to prefer that announcers work toward attaining a "neutral Midwest accent," but there's not much talk of that anymore. In fact, we may have gone in the opposite direction, preferring an announcer to retain and even emphasize his own distinctive regional speaking

style

Accents are interesting and almost certainly harmless, except in extremely rare instances where confusion caused by regional pronunciations has the potential to be dangerous. Air traffic controllers and pilots are instructed to always say niner instead of nine to avoid mistaking nines for fives when talking about assigned altitudes, speeds, and compass headings.

Our regional accents, rich and varied, add the equivalent of texture and color to the American language, giving us interesting variations that are preferable to a cookie-cutter, Barbie doll sameness.

So if those Georgia folks want to put pint on their houses, I say more par to 'em!

Winning Mini-Market Music Monsters

WAAL, KLYV, KBIU, KKMG, And WIFC Profiled

Contrary to popular belief, some of America's best radio airs in the smaller markets. They may borrow an idea or two from the big cities. But most often their own creativity is fuel enough to build a winning fire.

Below are thumbnail sketches of five such winning stations.

WAAL'in In Binghamton

WAAL/Binghamton, NY made the AOR-to-CHR transition in December 1984 and hasn't looked back since. Don Morgan became PD 18 months ago and has propelled the evolution of "99 WAAL, The Hot FM" into a mainstream market leader with a 23.1 rating.

WAAL's main rival is AC WMRV, with a 14.0 share. The only other CHR is WQXT/Owego, NY nearly 20 miles away, showing a 3.0. WAAL boasts a staggering 93.5 share in teens plus a market-leading 33 share 18-34, and is a close number two to WMRV in 25-49.

Morgan believes the station's community orientation is the key reason for its success. "If it happens, we're there, and charity work is our favorite way of getting involved. While we don't do remotes for sales, we will for charity."

WAAL is consulted by WEBN/Cincinnati's Tom Owens, who devised the current format. "His input, along with his research from Jacor, makes us state of the art when it comes to programming techniques. Adding our own local input, plus some guts and good aim

at the dartboard, gives us a winning sound for the market."

The station programs about 35 currents and is 20% non-current in profile. "Musically, we cater to women and find we also do well with men and teens. They like their music so we're music-intensive, with 30-minute sweeps each hour except mornings.

"Having only one Arbitron a year, we've tended to lump our promotional budget toward the spring. But we're beginning to spread it out. Promotionally we outdo everyone with cash, bill-boards, and TV spots."

K-Live Lights Up Dubuque

Jeff Davis has been programming KLYV/Dubuque for the past two years since moving from crosstown KATF. "All Hits K-Live" is the city's only CHR. This past spring, without an AOR in the market, it was able to mix some Urban crossovers with traditional pop songs and pop/rockers.

"When I first came here, KLYV was almost a jukebox in terms of presentation," said Davis. "Now it's the most visible of the eight stations in town. I do a morning zootype show with Michael K. which sets a listener-involved posture."

Asked where he looks for new ideas, he replied, "There are a lot of other markets within easy driv-

ing distance, and I try to listen to as many out-of-town airchecks as possible. I also talk with Gary King, who programs 2WD/Norfolk, and I get a lot of input from our consultant Tim Moore, who's VP/Programming for Midwest Family Broadcasting.

"K-Live has a major market way of doing things. Our promotions are large-scale (car, boat, trip, and cash giveaways) — we're a part of, or the sponsor of, every big event which could draw a crowd. Sales and management have been putting major promotions with sales advantages on-air without making them sound like sales promotions. We've doubled or tripled in sales what we spent on promotions in the spring."

Stability is a hallmark of KLYV. "I haven't had one fulltime opening in five years," Davis said proudly. "I'm the shorttimer on staff. My morning partner has been here for six years, as has midday personality Patty Frost. Afternoon driver Tim Jansen has ten years with us and night guy John Reilly has been here for five. In fact, the entire airstaff — with me as the exception — is from Dubuque."

Despite K-Live's dominance, Davis said, "We don't do any outside marketing because KATF, (MOR) KDTH, and (Country) KXKX dominate the billboards and TV. Instead we're on the street three or more times a week with our personalities. When I hear major market PDs say they can't find any talent, I say they haven't looked hard enough."

Rocky Mountain Magic

KKMG (Magic FM 98.9)/Pueblo PD Max Miller joined the station as afternoon driver four years ago. He became PD six months later and shifted to middays.

"This is a very conservative market," he said. "It's 40% Hispanic, but they're very Americanized. Still, for a market of 125,000, there are too many signals. Every Colorado Springs FM gets in here, but we don't reach that far very well — at least not yet. We're hoping for a tower change soon and want to become a true dual-market station. I'm fighting KIKX and KATM on the CHR front, while KILO knocks 'em out in AOR."

The market's conservative stance doesn't extend to KKMG's music. "With a strong CHR like KIKX and a big AOR like KILO in the Springs, we can play a (wide) variety," said Miller. "Music sweeps of at least 30 minutes an hour, and 98-minute sweeps at least

twice a day, help focus the audience on the new product we air.

"We're number one in Pueblo because of the quality of our staff. We've lost a few good ones this past year, but with major market veterans Rob Sherwood & Al Malmberg in mornings, plus solid people in every other daypart, we could move this staff to just about any market and compete."

Armed with less than \$8000 in cash, KKMG gave away trips, VCRs, and other prizes in a well-orchestrated contest. "We had cards printed with numbered keys on them. Using newspaper and TV, we encouraged listeners to pick up the cards for free to win trips to the Caribbean.

"We put out 100 of the cards each day at different locations, giving clues as to the whereabouts of the distribution points. It got the whole town talking and looking. We also do a lot of charity work. In our 'Walk For Mankind' we broke a first-walk attendance record, with 1200 people raising \$10,000."

Down In The Bayou

KBIU (Bayou-104) owns the Lake Charles, LA market. "Not only do we beat everyone two to one, but we average near a 60 share in teens around the clock," said PD Bruce Gilbert. He and OM Don Rivers work in tandem on the programming; Gilbert also tackles the day-to-day action as morning man.

"Our biggest challenger is AC KHLA (LA99)," continued Gilbert. "They hit the gold pretty good,

which allows us to play a bit as well. Without an AOR in town, we have great musical flexibility to wait and see which songs really come through.

"This market has an oil-based economy that's fighting its way back. It's a pretty hip area with lots of nightclubs, which means lots of dancing. The market is 38% black, with over 8000 college students at McNeese State University. The median age here is 23, so urban music really gets over.

"We hire pros who like to work hard because we have to be everywhere to do the job. For example, in April we are on remote for almost two solid weeks at an annual local event called Contraband Days. It's almost as wild as Mardi Gras."

Active with promotions ("We're always giving something away targeted to the 18-34 female"), Bayou 104 handed out \$10,000 so far in '87, as well as a year's lease on an apartment, an Olds Callais, and a '57 Lincoln. The station is currently promoting its Fall Flyaway, which will award 100 trips to Houston and a weeklong trip to London. "And we're not even in a book," Gilbert noted

Wausau's CHR Monster

"When you cover half the state, it's a bit difficult to take everyone's tastes into account," said WIFC (FM-95)/Wausau, WI PD Duff Damos. "And it's getting more competitive all the time."

Although FM-95 is a 100kw outlet, Damos said the staff can't afford to "sit on our laurels. We never want to be on the defensive, we want to be on the offensive. We don't worry about what the others do; we concern ourselves first with our product."

Damos's winning attitude carries over into his morning show. "We have a fun presentation and like to do crazy things. The show sets the tone for the rest of the day. Since we treat people well, and the audience senses that, we have little staff turnover and our audience seems to keep expanding.

"We-re owned by the Journal, which also owns WKTI in Milwau-kee. A tremendous amount of great ideas is shared from that end. I've learned a lot about the value of using urban music in the right amounts so we stay mainstream yet uptempo. We mix this in with the rockers to keep a fresh, cutting-edge sound."

WIFC tells listeners "We've Got Your Music" and doesn't rely on much gold for variety. "Maybe one an hour," said Damos. "Since there's no AOR here, we're involv-

ed in a wide spectrum musically. That's why we recently did the 'Pink Floyd Concert Caravan' to Milwaukee. We filled five buses with 200 listeners. Our last contest, 'Say It And Win,' asked people what station they listen to and gave them \$100. It's building that kind of top-of-mind awareness that keeps any station number one."

Underdog WDJY Wins In DC

Two years ago, WDJY's decision to bring in PD Brute Bailey unleashed plenty of market speculation. What chance did a third Urban outlet have in Washington against heavy hitters WKYS (KISS-FM) and WHUR?

The summer '87 Arbitron underscored the wisdom of that decision: WDJY now holds the Urban lead, having gained 5.1-5.7. While WHUR held steady at 5.3, the biggest surprise was WKYS's 7.2-5.1 drop. In the meantime, Jerry Clifton's CHR-leaning Urban WPGC benefited from the infusion of black music: it rose 1.9-4.3.

Teaching By Example

Washington residents are used to hearing winning Black radio, and Bailey does double-duty to ensure 'DJY's contribution. "Personality radio is one of the most important reasons we've been picking up small shares each ratings book," said the DC native. "I didn't come here and fire everyone. Part of the job we had to do was teach.

"I went on the air after only three weeks here and never raised the issue about hiring a morning person or team because I knew the company really couldn't afford it at the time. I also knew if I was on the air my announcers would have the opportunity to learn how to become personalities with time. We've gotten to know each person, what he can and cannot do.


"We also began an educational program, showing people what we wanted and expected from them. I hope the day will come that I can

get off the air and just do the administrative things that are a must in keeping a radio station in the winners' circle."


Music The Vital Ingredient

As important as personalities are, Bailey said the music is the vital element in WDJY's success. "First, we're a Black/Urban station, a mix of black music in its purest form. That's not to say that we don't play music by white artists because we do when it's appropriate. When you tune in, you



they don't like certain types of rap because of the lyrics. So we make it our business to air only rap songs with a positive message."

"We try and make everything we do blend in with our music — the commercials, personalities, promotions, news. We never feel our listeners are listening to us for anything but our music and our human approach. It becomes a personal challenge for me to use all the other elements to flavor the sound and end up with a nice, highly relatable personality operation."



On the other hand, WDJY hasn't fallen in line with other Urbans that have dropped news entirely. Its four-person news staff offers what they call "News You Can Use." Bailey explained, "News stations can take care of the hard news. Our news is relative and to the point, like a business letter. We cover pure and simple things of interest, delivered by nice people. The news lasts three minutes once an hour during the morning show and two minutes an hour in the

afternoons. Our news is so cleverly written and presented it's like USA Today or the front page of the Wall Street Journal."

Turning to the subject of promotion, Bailey said, "We're looking for a sense of kinship with our listeners. Our involvement with the Black Family Reunion (R&R, 5/1) is a good example. Anything black in this city that's positive, we want to be a part of."


However, he added that his best promotion doesn't require major dollars. "Everyone would love to have hundreds of thousands of dollars for advertising. While we do have some bus cards, currently our best form of advertising is word of mouth.

"People talk about us because we are part of them, we're reflecting what they tell us they want. When a listener tells a relative or a good friend that he likes the station, you can't get any better endorsement than that."



Bailey has always had a "take no prisoners" attitude. After surviving three tours of duty in Vietnam and beating cancer, he takes his responsibilities seriously. And he strongly believes that Urban and Black radio programmers should fortify their survival instincts, especially since CHRs are frequently playing the same urban music.

"Our positioning, timing, and consistency are all a part of being



prepared to execute — at all times and under any conditions. We talk and think war here because when you're up against WHUR, WKYS, and others, you are in a war.

"It's all about people. For any station to be a winner you need the total support of your corporate leaders. If you have their blessings, then all you need is a well-thought-out plan, players, and the intestinal fortitude to hang tough for as long as it takes. Believing you can accomplish something is more than half the battle.

"With grace and humility we thank God and our listeners for sticking with us. None of this happened because I'm a genius or we were lucky. It happened because we continue to work at it every day. And we'll continue working hard for good results in the fall book."

Going For The Gold

Spotlight On Small Market Successes

Small market PDs often perform duties without receiving the same attention as their larger market counterparts. To give some of these programmers and stations their due, the AC section is launching an ongoing series of small market salutes beginning with two Gold Intensive success stories: one AM, one FM.

WFSY/Panama City, FL

On January 1, 1987, Beautiful Music WGNE/Panama City, FL became Gold Intensive WFSY. The FM Beautiful Music format and calls were shifted to AM sister WDLP. As a result of this fancy footwork by new owner Ken Woodfin, WFSY (Sunny 98.5) turned its #3 showing 12+ (spring '86 Arbitron) into a first place, with a hefty 25.4. The AM notched a respectable

Joining Woodfin's new management team was PD Jim Dooley, who left the market's '86 12+ leader, Country WPAP. Dooley found no problems in adapting to AC. "The basics are the same. I had the attitude I wanted to win and found other folks with the same attitude."

To help boost the new format WFSY utilized a ten-week direct mail campaign, starting the day after the spring sweep began. Approximately \$35,000 in cash and prizes were awarded, with one winner carting off nearly \$25,000 in merchandise.

Other factors also accounted for the station's success. "The AC format with a strong emphasis on classic hits is the main reason for our success," said Dooley. "Direct mail, TV, and billboards were all ploys to get people tuned in. Once we got them to listen for 10-15 minutes, they were hooked. The product was and is that good. Many people switched from 'PAP because they like Sunny 98.5 better."

Fellow AC WLVV was affected the most by WFSY's emergence: it plunged 14.3-2.9, and lost nearly 15 shares in its 25-54 target demo. Noted Dooley, "They're not too happy with us right now."

Dictating To Competition

In morning drive the station airs two- to three-minute local newscasts (at six, seven, eight, and nine); 20-second news teases (6:40,

Dooley refused to reveal the size of the station's oldies library, saying it "would probably fool a lot of people. It's growing in some respects and shrinking in others. It's a heck of a library." All music is carted,and CDs don't play a vital

One recent 'FSY promotion netted \$5000 for muscular dystrophy. Originally, MD/PM driver Dave Nolin was slated to sit atop the roof of an area restaurant for five days and nights. Instead of pitching a tent on the eatery's roof, the station built the frame of a house. Nolin did his show from there, calling in live reports throughout the day. Dooley said, "We probably spent \$3-\$4000 building the house before we put him there." The specially built shell was removed by crane and is situated next to the station. Nolin said it'll be ready for next year's event.

There are no immediate plans to alter Sunny 98.5's programming. "I suspect we woke up a lot of people," said Dooley. "The only thing we'll do is improve. We won't drop to #3 or #4; I won't let that happen. We're dictating to the competition what they need to do. They're going to have to scramble - and I


PD/9am-noon announcer Rip Avina, a 15-year station veteran. The Gold Intensive AM station has more than tripled its 12+ audience in the last two books.

"Three or four years ago, we were like KIMN/Denver, a legendary Top 40 station trying to play the hits. It wasn't working. We decided to switch to AC with a heavy gold emphasis. Oldies are coming back - you're hearing them on national commercials. The heavy Hispanic audience here really responds to

Avina credited Surrey Broadcasting with much of the station's improvement; it purchased the station in 1984. "They brought us from the Dark Age into the '80s. We always knew we had the talent and ability. We didn't have the tools like computers and promotion budgets, and that's what Surrey gave us. They researched and discovered there was nothing wrong with KDZA - at times our audience just didn't know where we were coming from musically."

Passing On Some National Hits

KDZA uses the tag line "The Greatest Hits Of All Time" and blends current music into its mix.



Rip Avina

"We do callout research to several outlets. We look at R&R and other trades to see what's going on nationally. We're late on a lot of records, but there are many songs on the Back Page that don't fit what we're doing. We also go inside R&R to see what's happening with Full-Service and Gold Intensive stations. We cover all types of AC and attempt to pick songs that will work for us.

In the selection process, some

national hits won't get KDZA airplay. Avina explained, "I know REO Speedwagon is doing well on the Music Intensive chart, but it certainly doesn't fit on KDZA. We don't let names of groups get in the way. If a song is good, we'll play it." Avina mentioned Crowded House as an example of one group that gets played even though the name is less-than-familiar to AC audiences.

GORDON LIGHTFOOT/Sundown

Unlike Sunny 98.5, KDZA utilizes special programming. "Our noon special is 'Lunchtime Oldies.' There are no currents in that hour. Music ranges from 1957-73. At 6pm we carry '60s At 6,' with 'The Forgotten 45.'" Clues are given about a featured "mystery" song and listeners are encouraged to guess the title. The song airs in the final quarter-hour. "It could be any top ten song that you just don't hear on radio anymore.'

Saturdays and Sundays are "Solid Gold Weekends," and currents aren't played. Dick Bartley's 'Solid Gold Saturday Night" and Dick Clark's "Rock, Roll, And Remember" are weekend staples. KDZA also carries Denver Broncos

Working with a 1200-song library, Avina is constantly shuffling titles and rotations. "We'll play the original version of a song like 'I Think We're Alone Now' (Tommy James & The Shondells) in a higher rotation if someone has done a remake of it (Tiffany)."

Painting The Town

The Gold Intensive station enjoys a positive community image by participating in many goodwill projects. "Our jocks are going to take part in Operation Paintbrush. They'll paint houses in a section of town that desperately needs help. It's that kind of involvement that's kept us in people's minds."

During the NFL players' strike, many large market stations staged clever events to help make a positive out of a negative circumstance. Among those quick-thinking stations was KDZA - it recreated the most recent Super Bowl game. In the re-creation, the Broncos pulled off a dramatic upset of the Giants on a last-second 60-yard field goal by placekicker Rich Karlis. (The Giants bested the Broncos in Super Bowl 21.) Appropriately, the game was called 'Super Bowl 21 And A Half.'

Such promotions underscore Avina's promise to his listeners: "Our approach is snappy, adultoriented, and never boring.

Country Music Week Wrap-Up

Observations from illegible notes scribbled on a TV show program:

Applause, Applause — Congrats to CMA Awards Show Exec. Producer Irving Waugh and everyone else connected with the TV show. All week the buzz was that this was one of the best - if not the best show in a long time.

The open was great, featuring pictures of the nominees and superstars set to appear on the show. The audience is making up its mind whether to watch the show in the first five minutes, and flexing the starpower muscle was a great way to do it.

Radio Revival - Though the radio turnout was nowhere near what it was in the "good ol' days," the fact is there were more radio folks here this week than at any time in the last several years. That was due in large part to the "Live From Nashville" broadcasts from the Union Station hotel. Nine radio stations took part in the project organized and created by John McGhan. Bill Robinson of Musicworks acted as associate producer and talent coordinator. More than 70 artists visited the broadcast site in the five days.

Everyone I talked with - artists, publicists, and radio people - loved the idea. Those on the talent side liked the fact that it was concentrated in one area, and that the acts could cover nine stations with just one stop. Stations participating were KTFX/Tulsa; WKSJ/Mobile; WQYK/Tampa; WQIK/Jacksonville; KKCS/Colorado Springs; WDAF/Kansas City: WBOS/Boston; WUBE/Cincinnati; and WIL/St. Louis.

WQYK GM Charlie Ochs told me, "This was the most exciting thing we've had on the radio station in a long time. Audience reaction has been tremendous."

WUBE PD Mike Chapman threw a promotional twist into the event by having a different pair of contest winnners at the broadcast table each day, meeting the stars.

A number of PDs said they had sold the event, with dollar figures ranging from \$20,000 to \$100,000.

Best of all, though, was having radio people back in town for the

More TV Show - There were some new twists which broke up the standard shots of artists standing on stage singing. The opening song, with Randy Travis going through the audience shaking hands with people, was a nice piece of business. It was perfectly topped off when he gave Minnie Pearl a kiss before ascending the stairs to the stage, beautifully illustrating the bridge connecting the different generations of artists.

The videotaped footage of a George Strait concert at the University of Texas which segued into Strait singing the last half of the song live was also very effective. The message which came screaming from the screen was that young people can love Country, too.

Another neat touch was having four harmonica players scattered among the audience during the Judds' "Turn It Loose." "Breaking the proscenium" by having parts of

the show done from the audience gave the show a nice feel.

Numbers, Please - The overnight ratings for the show, reflecting viewing in major markets, were good. It tied the NBC movie for first place, both well ahead of football on ABC.

The awards show share was 28 and the rating was 17.3. In comparison to last year, the share was the same but the rating was down. This reflects the overall lower audience levels watching network TV. (In other words, the share of sets in use was the same as last year but there were fewer sets in use, so the rating was down.)

For the fourth straight year, NBC put a movie directly opposite the awards show which targeted the same demographic. The CMA awards show skews decidedly female, and NBC went after those same ladies with its Raquel Welch movie "Right To Die."

On Cue — This might be just coincidence and an off-the-wall observation, but I thought the scripted remarks by the presenters and host Kenny Rogers went very smoothly. Could this have been because a big-screen TV was used as a teleprompter instead of the usual cue-card system?

Best Line — The "Line of the Night" award is a three-way tie among Randy Travis, who said, "This is a good night for me" after receiving his third award; Don Schlitz, who uttered, "We're the first to win and lose at the same time" after he and Paul Overstreet won the Song of the Year award for "Forever and Ever, Amen," while simultaneously losing it for their "On The Other Hand;" and Hank Williams Jr., who, upon receipt of his second consecutive Video of the Year award, said, "Maybe I ought to quit singin' and start makin'

movies." His line while accepting the Entertainer of the Year award ranks up there, too: "This is the one ol' Bocephus was lookin' for!"

Speaking of Rockin' Randall, you didn't have to hear him say how much he wanted to win Entertainer of the Year. All you had to do was see him leap four feet out of his seat when they read his name to know he wanted it bad.

Most Touching Moment — If you weren't moved by the reaction of Ricky Skaggs and wife Sharon White to winning the Duo of the Year, then you'd better have your pulse checked 'cause you might be dead. What a nice moment from two of the most genuine people around.

Biggest Surprise — Ricky and Sharon winning the Duo was a bit of a surprise, Holly Dunn's winning the Horizon award was the biggest surprise of the night. Not because she didn't have a great year - winning a Grammy, after all - but because the field was so crowded with artists who had great years.

Surprised or not, Holly's comment in which she acknowledged and paid respect to the female performers who had paved the way and "walked through the fires" to make things easier for today's female artists set the tone for the acceptance speeches of a couple oth-

Credit Where It's Due — About the only one who wasn't surprised was Tennessean columnist Robert K. Oermann, who wrote in the October 11 edition, "This is one of the toughest races to call. Restless Heart had the big crossover hit. T. Graham Brown was nominated last year and remains enormously popular within the industry. The Sweethearts of the Rodeo have the looks and a hot live show. The O'Kanes got the press.

"Because those contenders are all so strong, I think they'll cancel each other out in the voting and 'dark horse' Holly Dunn will gallop home the winner."

Wanna go to Vegas, Bob?

Reba — Not only did Reba McEntire win an unprecedented fourth consecutive Female Vocalist of the Year award, her performance demonstrated how poised, talented, and polished she has become. The production was great and looked super on TV, but it was the grace with which she moved that provided one of the most captivating moments of the show.

Young Country - Not since Kenny and Dolly knocked us out with "Islands In The Stream" a few years ago has a production number set the crowd to buzzing like this one did. WB/Nashville chief Jim Ed Norman mentioned this song, which is on Hank Jr.'s "Born To Boogie" album, to Producer Irving Waugh a few months ago.

Hank was joined onstage by Vince Gill, Ricky Van Shelton, k.d. lang, K.T. Oslin, Nanci Griffith, Lyle Lovett, Highway 101, Foster and Lloyd, Michael Johnson, and the New Grass Revival. The final tableau was a sight to behold, and evidence that the future's so bright we all may have to join Hank and T. Graham Brown in wearing

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
