Owners, brokers express relief at expanded ownership limits; medium market flurry expected, but crunch may curtail spending

Leaders of the radio community expressed grudging satisfaction with the FCC's revised ownership rules, which they cautiously hope will bring some relief to the sagging industry.

"I think the industry is relieved that there's a final decision here, especially one that helps the bulk of the industry," said Blackburn & Co. President Dick Blackburn. "I can live with this, and the industry can operate with it. This is an acceptable compromise and one that will help radio broadcasters."

New Rules In Detail

he modified ownership plan approved by the FCC last Wednesday (8/5) will eventually allow a single licensee to own up to 40 radio stations nationwide, and as many as four outlets in a single market.

The new rules are expected to take effect sometime early next month, following publication in the Federal Register.

While many key details won't be clarified until the full text of the rules is released, these are the central features:

· An 18-AM/18-FM national limit (up from the current 12/12) that will increase to 20/20 in 1994. While the new levels represent a significant increase over the current 12/12, they are well short of the 30/30 proposed by the Commission in March.

The original proposal was vehemently opposed by a small group of powerful lawmakers led by Rep. John Dingeli (D-Mi) who pressured the agency into scaling back the limits.

 Licensees will be permitted to own up to 49% of three additional stations per band, as long as those properties are controlled by either a small business or minority entrepreneur. The def-inition of "small business" has not yet been resolved.

Under the new rules, minority group owners will no longer be allowed to exceed the national limit unless they partner with a minority or small business entity. The current rules allow minority groups to own 14 AMs and 14 FMs.

In conjunction with approval of the new rules, the FCC also announced its intention to explore the creation of a plan that would allow licensees to ex-

Arbitron Council Changes Formats

The Arbitron Advisory Council has voted to reconfigure its representation of formats. An earlier proposal to add a seat representing radio programmers was scuttled, but the council did agree to add an at-large seat which could accommodate a programmer.

At its semi-annual meetings, the council voted to reduce the number of seats representing Easy Listening and MOR/Personality stations from two to one, and it added a Gold/Oldies seat (that format was formerly represented by AC). Spanish and AOR formats will continue to be represented with one seat each; and AC, CHR, and Country will still have two.

The Council also decided to change the market designation for the two-seat formats. They had been assigned by market rank 1-50 ADVISORY COUNCIL/See Page 16

Seasonal Sales Swings Widen

January radio billings in big slump; local more stable

If you've sensed an increasing seasonality factor in radio revenues, you're right. Combined local and national January sales now add up to only 65% of a typical month in the July-December period. That's down from 74% in 1987. These findings are based on reports gathered from 1400 radio stations by Miller, Kaplan, Arase & Co. for the five years ending in June 1992.

The seasonal dropoff continues to be more severe for national ad revenues. Only 4.89% of annual national business took place in January in the last five years, down from an average 5.77% during the previous five-year period. January national revenues are just 55% of an average July-December month, down from 68% five years earlier.

Local revenues did not slide to the same degree as national, but the same seasonality gap is present. Local January revenues are

Robinson Named PD At AOR KTCZ

WHPT/Tampa PD Jim Robinson has been named PD at AOR KTCZ (The Cities' 97)/Minneapolis. Robinson replaces interim PD Jane Fredericksen, who also served as APD/MD. Fredericksen will remain with the American Media station in a "meaningful management capacity," according to GM Doug Brown.

"This is not an easy format to find a PD for, and Jim's diverse background will help us maximize the potential of the format," Brown told R&R.

"It's a privilege to join KTCZ because it's such a classy operation," Robinson remarked. "It's done well despite some extreme hardship, and that speaks loudly to the strength of the staff."

Rumors of a format adjustment have been swirling around KTCZ since American Media's recent acquisition of the station, but Robinson stressed the unique Cities' 97 approach will not undergo any significant changes. Robinson has programmed several formats during his lengthy career, including AOR (KZOK/Seattle, KGON/Portland), AC (KMMX/San Antonio), NAC (WHVE/Tampa), and Rock AC (WHPT, formerly WHVE,

Ownership Rules Expected To Dominate NAB Radio Confab

Approximately 7000 broadcasters are expected to attend the NAB Radio Show next month, according to association officials. The convention is scheduled for September 9-12 at the New Orleans Convention Center.

"The mood in the radio industry is better in 1992 than it was in 1991," said NAB Exec. VP John Abel. At a news conference in Washington Tuesday (8/11), he cited favorable industry reaction to the FCC's new ownership rules, a reduction in new FM sign-ons, a better economy, and debt restructurings that have eased pressures on station owners.

Abel said NAB officials had experienced difficulty in recent weeks contacting many major broadcasting execs about trade group projects. "We think they're looking for deals," he said.

The increase in station ownership limits is expected to dominate discussion at this year's confab. While no FCC commissioners are expected to attend, Abel said key staffers such as Mass Media Bureau Chief Roy Stewart will be there to explain the new rules.

Other panels are scheduled to discuss the station financing environment and the mechanics of structuring LMAs.

Abel added that the convention planning committee, headed by Unistar executive Bill Hogan, "has focused on a hands-on operational conference."

What To Expect

NAB Radio Sr. VP John David said registration is running at about the same pace as last year's convention. He added that 157 exhibitors will demonstrate their wares over 33,500 square feet of auditorium.

Among key convention highlights:

• Denon Electronics plans to debut the long-awaited NAB "Supertuner" radio, which features enhanced AM and FM reception. A. limited number of receivers will be available for purchase at \$499. • Eight "technology management" sessions will focus on new technologies, such as the Radio Data Broadcast System and special engineering techniques to enhance LMAs and duopoly situations.

• All 11 Digital Audio Broadcasting proponents have been invited to attend, and USA Digital Radio is expected to announce this week that it will test an in-band DAB system at the show. AT&T also has agreed to appear, and Canadian broadcasters will make a detailed report on DAB activity north of the border.

• Mutual talkmaster Larry King will emcee the "Political Powerhouse Face-Off" between Republican Party Chairman Rich Bond and his Democratic counterpart, Ron Brown, on Friday (9/11).

• A special tribute to legendary programmer **Rick Sklar** is planned during the convention's starstudded Marconi Awards program. The National Radio Award will be presented to **Beck-Ross Communi**cations CEO Marty Beck.

Swaggart Ministry Denies Financial Crunch

The scandal-ravaged Jimmy Swaggart Ministries (JSM) is rich in physical assets but has comparatively little cash on hand. These latter-day revelations are found in documents filed with the FCC in a dispute over JSM's CP for a new educational FM at the radio and TV preacher's home base of Baton Rouge.

Poor Little Rich Church

However, financial statements filed by JSM show that while its balance sheet is asset-rich, the ministry is cash-poor.

Plant, property, and equipment are valued at \$134 million, and JSM's existing radio stations (WLUX/Baton Rouge and WJYM/ Bowling Green-Toledo) are listed at \$364,000. (JSM sold WHYM/Pensacola, FL earlier this year for \$83,500.) The asset list shows cash of \$680,000, accounts receivable of \$559,000, and over \$2 million in notes receivable. In all, JSM lists assets of \$141 million.

By comparison, JSM shows total liabilities of only \$21 million, resulting in a net worth of \$120 million. However, the liabilities list includes accounts payable of \$5.9 million, notes payable to banks of \$1.4 million, and accrued payroll and expenses of \$740,000. These bills greatly exceed JSM's liquid assets, although there's no indication how much of that total is currently due.



S. officials began work Tuesday (8/11) on efforts to answer many of the questions that remained earlier this year after the World Administrative Radio Conference (WARC) in Spain allocated worldwide DAB frequencies.

Although the WARC designated L-band frequencies for DAB in most countries and two groups of S-band frequencies in others (including the U.S.), details of how to implement DAB and coordinate cross-border interference were left to another international gathering that's scheduled for 1998. That meeting will determine how satellite DAB coverage areas will be coordinated, and it may lead to an international standard for DAB.

L-Band Not An Option

FCC official John Reiser sought to head off speculation that the U.S. might succumb to Canada's and Mexico's entreaties to join them in using L-band for DAB. He noted such a change would have to be approved at another WARC, and added, "it's not an option for the U.S. — period."

U.S. officials have already had to scramble to block language in a preliminary document for the '98 conference that calls Eureka-147 the world standard for DAB. But NASA scientist Wayne White noted at Tuesday's meeting, "We can't just go on saying the U.S. is doing something — pretty scon we have to get something on the table."

Flight Phone Corp. to create a \$4.7 million nationwide 12-channel digital radio network for air travelers. Harris promises it will be "the world's first stereo airborne broadcast network."

The web, which would compete with **Gannett**'s mono **USA Today Sky Radio** service, is scheduled to test this fall with nine channels, signing on during the first quarter of next year.

"Thanks to the FCC, passengers will soon enjoy 12 channels of their favorite radio programming, including live world and business newscasts, sporting events, entertainment, music, children's shows, and more," said IFPC CEO John Goeken. He said his company eventually plans to provide inflight live TV.

Goeken, who created the **Airfone** telephone service, sald Harris will help design and manufacture the system. It will operate in the 900 MHz frequency band under an experimental license recently authorized by the FCC.

In addition to free programs, passengers will be offered premium special event shows that may be purchased by credit card through IFPC's digital FlightLink telephone and information system.

Wall Street Says'Good Buy'To Clear Channel

wall Street analysts are eyeing radio stocks again. **Clear Channel Communications** is getting a hearty show of support from two pros who expect its stock to be a hot play.

"The company is not as leveraged as many in the industry are," said **A.G. Edwards** VP/Media Analyst **Michael Kupinski**. He flashed a buy signal to clients after noting that Clear Channel's new \$150 million credit line will allow it to make "opportunistic aquisitions" under the new rules.

"It's not really an earnings play; its attraction is cash flow. The stock is currently trading at less than nine times its after-tax cash flow for next year," Kupinski said. He estimates per share free cash flow will be \$1.60 for 1992, rising to \$1.95 in 1993.

Another analyst who likes the company is Alan Gottesman of Paine-Webber. "Lack of liquidity is the only sensible reason not to own this stock. Fewer than 100,000 of the 9.5 million outstanding shares trade in a typical month," he sald.

Gottesman, who rates Clear Channel as "compellingly attractive," added, "The company's tight-fisted operating style has fostered a persistently growing flow of cash, which has created the opportunity to make sound acquisitions, which accelerates cash flow generation, etc."

NASDAQ Dumps Jacor

ASDAQ Stock Market officials have stopped listing Jacor Communications because the company has failed to meet financial qualifications.

Jacor traded for months under a temporary exemption from NASDAQ's \$1 million net capital and surplus requirements as it struggled with heavy debt and anemic revenues, but NASDAQ officials pulled the plug last week.


"Essentially, the only impact is that the bid and ask won't be published in local newspapers. Shareholders will have to call their brokers to get current quotes." said Jacor Sr. VP/Treasurer **Jon Berry**.

While Berry downplays the impact of the delisting, its consequences are far more serious. Jacor securities are now relegated to the status of penny stocks. They will be traded only in the "pink sheet" over-the-counter market or on the **National Association of Securities Dealers** OTC Bulletin Board system. Quotes from those markets aren't easily accessible to the general public, and major institutional investors generally shy away from investing in such low-rent stocks.

Shareholders may now find it difficult to get rid of Jacor stock because many stockbrokers refuse to trade pink sheet stocks.

Chicago vulture capitalist **Sam Zell** recently invested \$1 million in Jacor. According to Berry, the **Zell-Chillmark Fund** is still trying to restructure debt, and Jacor would seek a relisting on NASDAQ if successful.

"Much of the debt matures this month. We are talking with the banks and sub-debt holders in hopes of getting it extended. If the debt restructuring succeeds, Zell would make a significant equity investment, which would dilute current shareholders and likely result in a change of voting control," Berry said.



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
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



More Americans Visit Psychiatrists

wo years ago, only 10% of Americans had ever gone to see a psychiatrist. According to the latest survey by the NYC-based Roper Organization, that figure now has climbed to 15% of U.S. citizens. Most of the increase has come from middle-class Americans. The percentage of people in middle-income households (defined as those earning between \$30-50,000 per year) who have sought psychiatric treatment soard from 10% in 1990 to today's 20%.

Households earning less than \$30,000 per year have seen a similar, albeit smaller (5%) increase in psychiatric care, with 14% of the people falling into this income bracket having visited psychiatrists.

Among households earning more than \$50,000 per year, the number of people who've seen psychiatrists currently stands at 17%, up only 1% in the past two years.

Executives and professionals (21%) and white-collar workers (20%) — the same groups most likely to report feeling stress on a weekly basis — are also the most likely to seek psychiatric help. In contrast, only 11% of blue-collar workers have visited psychiatrists.

Commuters Spending More Time On The Road

W ondering where your listeners are every morning and afternoon? Chances are they're still in their cars. It's taking most Americans longer to get to and from work these days. According to the U.S. Census Bureau's 1990 commuter survey, the average American's one-way travel time now stands at 22.4 minutes, up from 21.7 minutes in 1980. New Varleys ground the most

onsumers ordered more than \$2 billion worth of prerecorded CDs, audiocassettes, LPs, and videotapes through catalogs, TV offers, and other direct response methods last year.

According to a recent survey by Brooklyn-based *Entertainment Marketing Letter*, direct sales of music climbed to \$1.4 billion in 1991 – a 13% increase from 1990. The industry-wide gain for the corresponding period was 3.9%.

Meanwhile, direct sales of video increased to \$600 million last year, up 37% from 1990. The overall video sell-through (defined as tapes sold to consumers) market rose only 15% from '90 to '91.

The survey also found that consumers buy approximately 18% of all pretaped music and 20% of all prerecorded videocassettes direct.

Sweetest Sales For Sour Gums

chewing gum industry salivating over the prospect of a breakthrough product, supersour gum has come on strong. Cry Baby's manufacturer projects industrywide sales of \$70 million in its first year on the market.

Confectioners are trying to cash in on the trend by marketing dozens of sour gums and candies, and the rule of thumb seems to be "the grosser, the better." For instance, keep an eye out for Spicy Meatball Gum, a gumball shaped like a meatball – and loaded with hot chili pepper.



Interactive Music Databases Arrive In Record Outlets

S everal major record store chains recently have installed "MUZE," an interactive computer (pictured above) that can provide consumers with information on most pop, rock, jazz, and classical recordings,

Created by **Digital Radio Network**'s **Paul Zullo** and **Trev Huxley**, the computer's database contains detailed artist, song, album, and label info — most of which can be accessed using just one word from a song's title.

The system also can display catalog numbers, condensed liner notes, LP cover art, and positive album reviews culled from various publications. Furthermore, users can get a print-out of this information at any time during their search.

Cars & Drivers

Among the five cities with the longest commute times, usage of car pools and public transportation varies widely. In New York City, 53.3% of commuters drive alone, 10.3% car pool, and 25.6% use public transporation.

In second-place Washington, 62.9% drive alone, 15.8% car pool, and 13.7% use public transit. Among Chicago commuters, 67.4% drive alone, 12% car pool, and 13.7% use public transit.

In fourth-slowest Los Angeles, 72.3% drive alone, 15.5% car pool, and 4.6% use public transit. (While L.A.'s population soared 27% between 1980 and 1990, one-way commute times inched up an additional 2.5 minutes.)

Meanwhile, in Houston, 76.1% drive alone, 14.6% car pool, and 3.8% use public transit.

Appetite For Pasta Growing

hether it's spaghetti, linguini, macaroni, or fettucini, Americans are eating more pasta than ever. And along with consuming more pasta, people now think it's better to eat more of it.

A recent NYC-based Roper Organization survey found that 32% of Americans claimed to eat "a lot" of pasta, up from 20% in 1983. A similar number (30%) said it was "ideal" to include "a lot" of pasta in their diet (up a whopping 18 points from nine years ago), while another 54% advocate eating a moderate amount.

Incidentally, the people who are eating the most pasta are adults aged 18-29. Roughly four in 10 (41%) say they eat "a lot" of pasta.

Continued from Page 1 Not surprisingly, several industry figures who deal almost exclusively in major market and group deals expressed disappointment with the Commission's decision to scale back its original ownership proposal, which would have permitted a single licensee to own 60 stations, and up to six outlets in a single market.

"[The new rules] are clearly designed to constrain mega-merg-ers," said broker Gary Stevens. "I think it's unfortunate that it's not higher."

Infinity Broadcasting President/CEO Mel Karmazin echoed that sentiment and questioned the logic of limiting radio's ability to consolidate in local markets, "[Cable magnate] Ted Turner is able to have five channels in every home in the world and we're limited to two FMs [per market]."

Karmazin nevertheless plans to take full advantage of the new rules, which allow his company to add seven FMs. "We'd like those seven to be in the Top 10 markets exclusively

Granum Communications President Herb McCord also hinted that he'll move quickly to take advantage of the expanded limits. "I would hope that we would have pairings-up in a couple of our markets by the end of the year," he said.

LMA Daze

According to several observers, LMAs may play a somewhat lesser role under the relaxed local ownership rules.

"I think there will still be LMAs because of the need for consolidation, but there may be fewer of them," said Blackburn. "They will still be necessary in some cases, for instance where there's an inability to finance an acquisition, or a reluctance to sell outright for whatever reasons."

Continued from Page 1 ceed the national limit by some defined number of stations, if they implement a broadcast ownership "incubator" program to provide financial, training, or technical support to small businesses. Details of the plan, which was devised by Chairman Al Sikes, remain sketchy.

. In markets with 15 or more radio stations, a single licensee may own two AM and two FM properties. In markets with fewer than 15 stations, a licensee will be allowed three stations, no more than two of which may be in a single band. Additionally, a licensee cannot control more than half the stations in the market.

The March proposal included tiered local limits that would have permitted a licensee to own up to six stations (three AM/three FM) in the largest markets

. The number of stations in a market will be determined by signal contour overlap. Noncommercial stations will not be counted. The agency originally planned to base the number of stations on Arbitron's station listinas


In markets with 15 or more stations, applicants seeking to assemble a multi-station combination will face a market con-

centration test. If the proposed combination totals more than 25% of the 12+ AQH audience, the FCC will presume the deal is not in the public interest. To get such a sale approved, the applicant will have to present a documented case that the combo will not wield excessive market power.

It is not vet clear whether new stand-alone AM-FM combos will be subject to the 25% test, or if it will apply only in cases where a licensee wants to add a third or fourth station.

Where Arbitron or other ratings data is "readily available." applicants will have to submit that information with their license transfer application. If ratings data is not available. without incurring "undue expense," the applicant must provide other information "clearly establishing a lack of concentration."

Despite industry complaints about fluctuations in ratings data, the FCC has tentatively decided it will look at only the most current survey when calculating a proposed combo's combined 12+ share. However, Mass Media Chief Roy Stewart said that policy could change before the rules take effect. Stewart had previously hinted that the agency would use a multi-book average to determine whether a proposed combo exceeds the 25% line of demarcation.



"The council felt the position of general manager represented all facets of the radio operation," said Council Chairman and WAPI/ Birmingham GM Bernie Barker of the decision not to allocate a seat for a programmer. "Breaking things down to one particular department was not seen in our best interests '

Barker said the new at-large position was created with the future in mind: "With LMAs and the new ownership rules in place, we might see the composition of the council take on different forms in the future. The addition of an at-large seat allows the council, and future councils, the opportunity to be flexible. And, it's entirely possible that we will appoint a programmer to the at-large seat.'

The council is now composed of 13 elected broadcasters, two research appointees from rep firms, and the new at-large position.

FCC Combs Greasy Kid Stuff

he FCC recently notified WWDC-FM (DC101)/Washington that it's investigating two allegedly indecent

broadcasts by morning man Doug "The Greaseman" Tracht.

One of the November 1991 bits at issue features Tracht suggesting what to do about a neighbor who "wails away" (masturbates) whenever the caller and his wife have sex with their window open: "If I were you, the next time I'd yell out the window, 'Could you try and time your Shangri-la [orgasm] with our Shangri-la?' So that way you'll all be smoking Camels at the same time."

Later in the bit another caller complains to Tracht that his wife's boss "wails away" in the supply closet next to her desk. Tracht's response: "He's just making his own White-Out."

In the second bit a female butcher tells Tracht, "I'll bet you'd like to stick six inches of meat into my sausage grinder." To which he replies, "No way, baby, I don't do anything halfway."

DC101 officials did not return ST's calls regarding their eminence Grease. The suburban homemaker who filed the complaint told ST she feels Tracht's smutty humor has "no redeeming social value" and should be restricted to late-night hours when no kids are listening.


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

Texas Vandal Scandal II

Former KKYS/Bryan-College Station, TX morning man Rex DeShannon, who turned himself in to police last Wednesday (8/5) to answer charges that he sabotaged crosstown WTAW & KTSR, is free on a personal recognizance bond and awaiting further legal action.

"We cooperated and Rex turned himself in," lawyer Lane Thibodeaux told ST, disputing last week's report that a fugitive warrant had been issued. "As of today (8/11) he hasn't been formally charged with a felony or misdemeanor of any kind."

However, Bryan Police Sgt. **Choya Walling** told ST DeShannon *had* been charged with third-degree felony criminal mischief, which carries a jail term of 2-10 years and a fine of up to \$10,000. Walling added that it may take up to two months before the case is presented to a grand jury.

Meanwhile, DeShannon's wife, **WTDR**/ **Charlotte** night personality **Kim Diamond**, told ST that *at least three* other KKYS employees participated in the incidents against WTAW & KTSR — including PD **Ron Elliott**, who she claims was involved in making and/or had knowledge of the harassing phone calls.

No callbacks or comments from Elliott or KKYS Station Mgr. **Mike Connor,** but ST has learned that one KKYS employee has been terminated and another one is on probation because of participation in the events.

Recapturing The Magic . . . CHR's Forgotten Art

In the new Spring '92 Arbitron survey, CHR continues to show a mixed report card, despite less direct competition. As a result, many GMs and PDs are blaming lower ratings on a dearth of good new music, too much repetition, and teen music, among other things.

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Perhaps this is true, but maybe we should remind ourselves that great radio is more than just music.

Radio has been a victim of progress. CHR is a victim of a lack of creativity. You can't stop progress, but you can develop creativity. Markets will continue to fragment, with more signals, entertainment options, and consumer choices than ever before. Everyone predicted radio would be finished when TV debuted in the '50s. Music radio was supposed to have been at a competitive disadvantage when MTV bowed 30 years later. Yet 96% of Americans still listen to radio each week.

While new technology continues to invade our space, radio has done little to ensure consumer loyalty. What have we done to sell the consumer not only on radio, but on our specific stations? Should we really blame the 28-year-old female when focus groups show she can't name our new slogan?

Have we done everything possible to make stations dynamic? Are stations cutting through the clutter? Are we serving consumers a memorable product they'll want to return to and, more importantly, prefer over the competition? While it would be nice to be able to buy 500 GRPs per week of prime-time TV to get a unique message across, that kind of financial commitment is beyond most stations' budgets. So naturally, we must begin with our own cume base to create a demand for our product.

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Clutter-Cutters Attack

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Somewhere – not too many years ago – someone came up with the idea that to reduce clutter, we all needed to hire big-voiced guys to shout our call letters and positioning statements over a bevy of laser effects.

Research told us we needed to position ourselves as the station

with the most music. We responded with liners echoing the praises of 10 in a row and more variety. We were the radio station that did it all. And if consumers didn't parrot back our praises in focus groups, they were mindless idiots who missed the obvious. How could they not know we were their favorite radio station? After all, we played those damn liners every 15 minutes!

Back To The Future

In an effort to move forward, we must look back. In the early years of Top 40 radio, stations like WLS/Chicago, WABC/New York, KCBQ/San Diego, and KFRC/San Francisco all had something in common. Besides the fact they were legendary AM stations, they shared a common bond beyond their music. These stations, and many like them throughout the country, had images that were larger than life.

While the argument can accurately be made that these stations didn't face the kind of competition we face today, they still went out of their way to create a strong, powerful image. A large part of that image was creativity. The focus of that creativity was promotions and the way they were presented over the air. These stations didn't just give away tickets to a movie screening. It became an event -a *major* event. It totally consumed the radio station and became the pulse of the city.

Promotions – and the on-air promos that touted them – grew to mammoth proportions. It didn't always have to be big-budget material, either. It was easy to get excited about a car giveaway, but Top 40 went out of its way to get excited about movie tickets, T-shirts, and even old 45 giveaways.

Top 40 made it a point to sell its contests, its winners, and itself. It was fun and captured the listeners' imaginations. While TV chose a matter-of-fact approach, radio leaned toward self-generated excitement. If there was a spectacu-

lar promotion, it was on the radio. Top 40 was on the edge, totally committed to entertainment.

Sizzle, Sizzle, Sizzle

Today's average CHR is stuck in the 10-in-a-row mentality. The great stations of the past were more concerned about production value, sizzle, and contesting elements than they were about "stopless music." Music was important to successful Top 40 stations in the '70s, but these stations were more than just jukeboxes. For example, every promotion on WLS was larger than life. Each one was topical and relevant to what was happening in Chicago.

Recorded promos really sold the promotion, painting crystal-clear pictures that made the station's contests stand out beyond any other feature. Contest promos became an art – an item of intense pride, like a priceless painting. The station's promo voice would slave away for hours, looking for just the right music change or sound effect. Promos were updated daily ... sometimes hourly.

Each station's production value was an unbreakable commandment. Promos cut through the clutter and helped the radio station develop a personality and depth beyond the music. Promos were

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entertaining for contest players and non-players alike. Make no mistake: Music was the foundation, but many stations turned promotions into a spectacular aspect of their programming. They were the station's signature and gave Top 40 its identity as the fun format. Who can forget the "Last Contest?" KCBQ's on-air promos for it were so powerful that they're still part of better aircheck collections everywhere.

Learn From The Past

With only a few exceptions, today you have to watch MTV to see great production and crisp, clear, larger-than-life promos, or contests that are topical and fun. MTV promos capture your interest, pump your imagination, and force you to react. The prize is secondary. The channel is just as effective promoting T-shirts as it is promoting dinner with Michael Jackson.

Promos With Punch

What makes a good promo? Here's a checklist:

- Is the copy well-written? Get the point across using an economy of words.
- Is it simple? Remember ..., K.I.S.S.
- Does it accurately spell out what the station is trying to accomplish?
- Does it create larger-than-life excitement?
- Does it effectively use theatre of the mind to full advantage?
- Are the copy and concept updated weekly? Daily? Hourly?

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Larger-than-life excitement is easy to obtain if you're giving away a house. But what about that little value-added promotion the GSM just dropped on your desk?

The point is that radio again needs to step back and learn from its past. Playing long sets of music is an attribute we all want to be credited with. But what about something beyond that? When an artist like Mariah Carey has a multiformat hit, it can be heard on dozens of radio stations in any one market. What steps have you taken to separate your station from the competition?

It's time CHR stood up and reclaimed the creative sizzle that was a key element of its distinguished heritage just a few short years ago. In an effort to remove negatives from the format, we've removed one of the positives CHR can deliver like no other format.

CHR needs to recapture the creative excitement that ruled Top 40 15-20 years ago. We need to teach up-and-coming PDs that the way to improve ratings goes beyond the continuous music sweep. Anyone can play a 30-minute music marathon, and *every* station has to play commercials. CHR can flourish once more when we again commit to putting an exciting reason to listen back on the dial.

Promo Pointers

Don't mistake this excitement for the hype CHR's been accused of by listeners over the years. This is not a proclamation to return to Boss Radio, with big-voiced jocks talking out of both sides of their mouths. Radio needs to return to the era of creative production elements for its on-air contests.

Larger-than-life excitement is easy to obtain if you're giving away a house. But what about that little value-added promotion the GSM just dropped on your desk? There's no reason to lose your creative outlook, no matter what the promotion is. I recently heard WAPW (Power 99)/Atlanta PD Rick Stacy play a station composite that effectively demonstrated creativity at its best. The promotional concept: With the new year, the station was changing for the better. One promo even claimed WAPW built a new freeway (one was already under construction) so it would be easier for listeners to get to the station and pick up their prizes.

CHR will always be a viable format. But if we're to grow and create an identity beyond the music, we must look at our own

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promotional position within the market and focus on how we can turn it to our advantage. The great Top 40 stations made radio a fun and exciting medium to listen to. It's important that CHR reintroduce one of the crucial elements that made it great in its formative years, because sizzle = ratings.



Roger Waters 'Amused To Death'

Roger Waters's "Amused To Death" is the former Pink Floyd frontman's first album since 1987's "Radio KAOS." He produced the 14-track set with Patrick Leonard, who also plays keyboards. Don Henley contributes background vocals, and guitar hero Jeff Beck is heard on several tracks.

Other noteworthies on the disc include guitarists Andy Fairweather-Low and Steve Lukather, bassist Randy Jackson, and sportscaster Marv Albert, who provides color commentary on "Perfect Sense, Part II." Among the other songs are "Ballad Of Bill Hubbard," "The Bravery Of Being Out Of Range," "Too Much Rope," and "What God Wants, Part I." This last cut goes to radio this week. Columbia will have the set in stores September 1.

'Bone Machine' Waits

Tom Waits co-produced his forthcoming "Bone Machine" album with his wife, Kathleen Brennan, who also co-wrote eight of the songs. Waits composed another seven tracks by himself and one ("That Feel") with Rolling Stones fretmaster Keith Richards, who sings and plays on the track as well.

Los Lobos frontman David Hidalgo contributes violin and accordion to "Whistle Down The Wind," and Primus bassist Les Claypool can be heard on "Earth Died Screaming." "Goin' Out West" goes to radio August 19. Island/PLG will have the set in stores September 8.

10,000 Maniacs Return

10,000 Maniacs' forthcoming "Our Time In Eden" album was produced by Paul Fox (of Sugarcubes and XTC fame). Singer Natalie Merchant plays piano on nine tracks, and former James Brown sidemen Maceo Parker and Fred Wesley lend their horny horns to the tune "Few And Far Between." Other selections include "I'm Not The Man," "Stockton Gala Days," and the lead track ("These Are Days"), which goes to radio on September 7. The Elektra disc will be in stores September 29.



Cray On Deck

"I Was Warned" will be Robert Cray's fourth Mercury LP (his seventh total). Among the set's songs are "On The Road Down" (co-written with veteran soulster Steve Cropper) and "A Picture Of A Broken Heart" (co-written by album producer Dennis Walker and Boz Scaggs). The track "Just A Loser" goes to radio August 31. The full CD will be in stores September

Alice In Chains 'Dirt'

Alice In Chains' forthcoming Columbia album, "Dirt," was produced by Dave Jerden (whose credits include Jane's Addiction and Social Distortion). Among the cheerful titles: "Down In A Hole," "Junkhead," "Godsmack," and "Hate To Feel." The song "Would" is also featured on the "Singles" soundtrack. "Them Bones" goes to radio the first week in September. "Dirt" hits the streets September 29.

Chuckii Iis 'Wiild'

Chuckii Booker wrote or cowrote all 14 cuts on his sophomore Atlantic set, "Niice 'N' Wiild." Janet Jackson, for whom Booker served as 1990 tour musical director, makes a guest vocal appearance, as does labelmate Gerald Albright. Among the provocatiive song titles: "You Don't Know," "Love Is Medicine," and "I Giit Around." The track "Games" goes to radio August 31. The LP arrives the next day.

Double Live AC/DC

"AC/DC Live" — the band's first live record in 14 years — will be available as a single 70-minutesplus CD/cassette and as a special double CD/cassette. The latter features two hours and 12 minutes of music and a pullout poster. Bruce Fairbairn produced the Atco/East-West projects. The lead track ("Highway To Hell") goes to radio October 5. The CDs hit stores October 27.

Williams's World

Lucinda Williams co-produced her "Sweet Old World" with Dusty Wakeman and her longtime guitarist, Gurf Morlix. Guitarist Jim Lauderdale and keyboardist Benmont Tench (of Heartbreakers fame) appear on the disc, as does a cover of Nick Drake's "Which Will."

Originals include "Something About What Happens When We Talk," "He Never Got Enough Love," and "Prove My Love." "Six Blocks Away" goes to radio this week. The full **Chameleon**/Elektra set hits stores August 25.

Mahal & Cooder's Rising Sons LP On Horizon

Yardbirds 'Little Games Sessions' LP Coming

Fans of the **Jimmy Page**-era **Yardbirds** will be interested in "Little Games Sessions & More," a 32track double CD that **EMI** intends to have in stores September 8. Several songs are presented in original and alternate versions. Among them are the title cut (a minor U.S. hit), the non-LP single "Goodnight Sweet Josephine," and "White Summer," Page's instrumental guitar showpiece that later developed into the Led Zeppelin tunes "Black Mountain Side" and "Over The Hills And Far Away."

Along with all the songs found on the original "Little Games" LP, the package spotlights the non-album single B-side "Think About It" guitar licks from which wound their way into Led Zeppelin's "Dazed And Confused" — as well as the band's classic 1966 "Great Shakes/U.S. Commercial Spot."

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

Hotlanta's Rising Star 94

Station takes format lead with a 4.2-4.9 increase

WSTR (Star 94)/Atlanta has risen like a phoenix from the ashes of the old WQXI-FM (94Q). The station has taken the market's CHR lead (and seventh place overall) with a 4.2-4.9 showing in the Spring '92 Arbitron.

This is a significant accomplishment for several reasons. It's the first time in years another CHR has seriously challenged – let alone beaten – crosstown CHR WAPW (Power 99), which was off 6.3-4.6. Star 94 also achieved significant gains among 25-34 females with a current-intensive, personality-oriented presentation.

Star Story

When OM Tony Novia arrived at Star 94 two years ago from Miami – where he'd spent nine years as OM at WHYI (Y100)/Miami and been GM at NAC WXDJ – he took over a troubled radio station mired in constant format changes and block programming. Here's the history.

The Star 94 image – introduced 18 months earlier under then-PD Jan Jeffries – was designed to return the poorly rated AC to a CHR format and better numbers. But with the sales department still calling the shots in programming, the station's sound remained inconsistent. Soon, Star 94 returned to AC and block programming with its highly rated nightly "Jazz Flavours" show.

Novia recalls his first days on the job. "This was one very screwedup station. For many years, it had been resting on its laurels, its market heritage, and [legendary former] morning man Gary Mc-Kee. The on-air product was just fair, and it was driven by sales and the whims of morning drive. We

have now totally separated sales and programming.

"Our GM is Clarke Brown, who is also President of Jefferson-Pilot's radio division. He was instrumental in helping me get the station focused, fixing the product, and hiring good people. You can rest assured that there is 100% involvement in the programming of Star 94 from the programming department. We pride ourselves on listening to the staff and taking input from everyone, but the tail ain't wagging the dog here anymore."

This past January, Star 94 sent shock waves through the market by hiring Power 99 MD Lee Chesnut for a similar position. Chesnut, who was recently elevated to PD, had spent two years at Power 99, preceded by MD slots at WAPI (195)/Birmingham and WABB/ Mobile. He says, "Even today as PD, my focus is the music, which is why I was brought in. Tony wanted someone who was obsessed with the music, had a good ear, and could schedule it to create the right sound.

"After being in the market for so long, it was obvious to me that a lot of listeners weren't being serviced properly at Power 99. It was fun working there, but I had some different ideas on how to win and had formulated plans on how to put it together. When Tony approached me, it was obvious we were coming from the same direction."

Current-Based Adult CHR Novia's approach to adult CHR is unique. He hasn't increased the ballads and gold, because he feels "Star 94's success has a lot to do



with breaking a lot of music out of this station. We launched Jon Secada, K.D. Lang, the Indigo Girls, and a lot of other titles. Some have gone on to become national hits,

but all have been major successes in Atlanta.

"Star 94 just proves that you can still be musically aggressive and have strong adult appeal at the same time. Our philosophy is that

Star 94 uses the new **Premiere Radio** jingle package in combination with **Bobby Ocean**-voiced sweepers, and afternoon driver **Boomer** voices promos. Speaking of Boomer, here's what his music sounds like at 5pm:

whenever listeners tune in, they sure as hell had better hear their favorite — or soon-to-be-favorite song. Lee is the consummate PD/ MD, because he's a Picasso at the music computer. When he sits down at it, magic happens with the music.''

Chesnut adds, "Star 94 is about 60% current. I don't know who decided that once you turn 25 you no longer care about hearing new music. The subtle difference is that you can't slam six or seven new titles at the audience every week. A lot of it has to do with the packaging or flow.

"We can play Toad The Wet Sprocket, as long as there's something familiar – like a Michael Bolton or Amy Grant – surrounding it. Basically, when you turn on Star 94, you get today's current hit music for adults. Rap has changed the face of things, and Star 94 has proven you can do CHR for adults. We never play two ballads in a row – Star 94 is basically bright

- Star 94 is basically bright, uptempo, and has a good flow.



Adults want something enjoyable; they don't want to be put to sleep.'

Novia recalls one of the most important musical adjustments leading up to Star 94's recovery: "One of the biggest battles I had to fight was to get the 'Jazz Flavours' show dropped, because it had such great 25-54 numbers. My theory is that a successful Italian restaurant serves the same food all day long and doesn't switch to Chinese at night. We decided we had to risk losing those night numbers and build up again. That's what's happening now.'

"We're not doing anything special at night," remarks Chesnut. "We're presenting the same musical focus around the clock, with very little dayparting.

"We're not in a teen battle with Power 99, because we don't play any rap product - just mass appeal hit music. Hard rock is also a tough one for us, but rockers like EMF's 'Unbelievable' and several Black Crowes cuts have worked well, because they have adult appeal.

The Entertainers

While Star 94 makes the music a major priority, Novia explains, "The personalities are key to our success, and they're tops in the market in perceptual studies. We go for strong personalities in all dayparts. They're entertainers who pitch the music and the station.

Here's the staff: "From 5:30-10am, it's Steve McCoy & Vikki Locke (both from Power 99), along with news guy Rob Stadler and producer Rusty Humphries. On Friday mornings, Atlanta Braves right-fielder Dave Justice is a regular on the show. Midday per-sonality Stephanie, Paige joined two months ago from WMJJ/Birmingham. Afternoon driver Boomer came from Power 99 about a year ago. Our night personality, Tom Sullivan, has been here forever, and in overnights we have Dave Gibson.

Star 94 has focused its primary marketing efforts on improving the cume. An extensive TV schedule was bought to bring in those new listeners. "This is an exciting sta-- and a topical station," tion Novia says. "Recently, the body of a seven-month-old baby was found after a three-week search. We urged Atlantans to drive with their headlights on in memory of the child's death.

We try to capture and reflect the essence of what people are feeling. And because concert tickets are such a big-ticket item now, we offer them from 9-5 on Thursdays and Fridays. Recently, we blitzed the audience with Michael Bolton tickets, and then offered backstage passes and front row tickets as part of our 'Front Row Friday' promotion

"With the Atlanta Braves in first place, there's a lot of interest in free tickets, and we've got them. We're also involved with the opening of the Georgia Dome, where the Atlanta Falcons are going to play. The '96 Olympics are coming to Atlanta, and with the current Summer Olympics taking place, the city has the fever. We just wrapped up a large promotion involving the summer games by sending four listeners to Barcelona with tickets for all the events. The best part is that they're living aboard a cruise ship in Barcelona Harbor during their stay."

Well-Rounded

Novia details how the promotions, music, and personalities have come together to achieve the well-rounded success Star 94 is enjoying this book. "When we went 4.2-4.9 12+ and looked at all the demos, I was very proud.

"Our focus is 25-34 females, and we're No. 2 now to Urban WVEE in that demo and in 18-34 women. We're fourth in 18-34 adults (tied with Power 99), and fifth in teens behind AOR WKLS. Our research concentrates on females, but unlike many other stations, we still sample males for callouts and perceptual studies.'

He turned to the subject of Power 99's sharp ratings dip. 'They're a lot more focused on the young end than we are, so their problems aren't ours. When I first looked at coming here, Power 99 was on a pedestal no one could take away. It was no different than [WRBQ/Tampa] Q105's not having any competition. In fact, both Power 99 and AC WSB-FM had no competition, and we've gotten in the middle of both of them without being a niche format. We sound like 1984 CHR, playing Bruce Springsteen, Michael Jackson, Madonna, and whoever else is big and mass appeal today.

"Star 94's goal is to spend the money necessary to bring us back into the sixes, sevens, and eights again. We're not looking to change our focus, and we'll continue to be what we are.

"But all of that aside, the most important element at Star 94 is the people. We've got the best staff, and everyone likes each other, which makes life a lot easier. It's seldom - in this or any other business - that people can say they truly love to come to work every day. But that's the case here - we all work hard as a team to keep the environment creative and positive.'



The Stories Behind The 12+

Okay, you've seen the 12+ scores. But what's really going on? Here's a sample of the most intriguing results from the Spring '92 Arbitron books we've received to date.

Tampa: WXTB **Throttles WYNF**

The most shocking spring survey story comes out of Tampa, where WXTB jumped 5.6-6.9 and opened up a three-point lead on rival WYNF, which tumbled 5.2-3.9. That's 'YNF's lowest 12+ since it switched to AOR in 1981.

Looking beyond 'YNF's 12+, it's tough to find a silver lining among the numbers. The only dayparts that were up: Saturday 3-7pm and Sunday 10am-3pm.

WYNF took a big hit in AM drive, where Ron & Ron sank 9.0-6.9. That's a share loss of 23%. and it might lead you to believe the overall ratings slide can be traced to mornings. However, 'YNF actually suffered greater share losses in afternoons (35%) and nights (37%), 'XTB now has an almost inconceivable 4-1 advantage 7pmmidnight.

Perhaps the most noteworthy thing about this book is 'XTB beat 'YNF in persons 25-54, despite 'YNF's still-commanding 25+ advantage in morning drive

Sacramento: KSEG **Beats KRXQ**

Tampa wasn't the only market to produce some startling spring numbers. In Sacramento, KRXQ fell 7.3-5.3 - its lowest 12+ in nearly five years – and was beaten by Classic Rock KSEG, which improved 5.6-6.0.

KSEG climbed to within 0.1 of its AOR rival in persons 18-34, as KRXQ shed nearly four points in

that demo. More important, KSEG increased in 25-54s for the fourth straight book and widened its lead over KRXQ in that demo by a substantial margin.

One year ago, when Sacramento heritage rocker KZAP was still in business, KRXQ was the market's No. 3 station 25-54 it's now eighth. In contrast, KSEG has jumped from ninth to second. Those who said KSEG had the most to gain from KZAP's demise appear to be correct - at least for the short term.

Portland: Reversals Of Fortune

Results like the ones from Portland, OR make me seriously question the sanity of being a PD in an Arbitron-dominated world.

KGON, whose recent 3.4-4.0-5.9 rebound was heralded in this column, stumbled to 3.3. Concurrently, rival KUFO leaped 4.5-6.7. Talk about ver wild fluctuations!

The numbers point out the utter silliness of using monthly and quarterly data to make decisions of any kind. You have to look at several books to determine what's really happening:

KGON: 4.2 3.4 4.0 5.9 3.3 KUFO: 7.0 7.4 5.7 4.5 6.7

The five-book trend indicates the winter book was probably an aberration. This battle may be closer than the spring results demon-strate, but KUFO clearly remains the leader

Houston: KLOL Soars

KLOL capped its first full year under PD Ted Edwards with one of its best books ever. The station has risen 5.1-5.4-5.8-6.8 since Terrible Ted arrived in the Lone Star state from KGB/San Diego.


The one-point gain placed KLOL third 12+ behind perennial Country leaders KILT and KIKK, KLOL also moved up to third in persons 25-54. It leads the market by healthy margins in all pertinent male demos.

Meanwhile, Classic Rock KZFX dipped 3 3=3 2

Phoenix: KUPD Rebounds

KUPD/Phoenix ended a threebook slide, jumping 5.4-6.9. Morning mainstay Dave Pratt whose 12+ took an inexplicable two-point tumble in the winter book - gained nearly all of his audience back. Was he really that much better in spring?

KUPD, which targets 18-34, has to be particularly pleased with its significant 25-54 improvement (eighth to fifth in adults, seventh to

third in men). It's No. 1 18-34 by a wide margin.

Adult-oriented KDKB also improved, moving 3.5-4.1. It tied KUPD for the top spot in 25-34 men, and would have posted even better overall numbers save for a significant slide in older women (?)

The demo breakouts clearly illustrate the differences between these two stations. KUPD, which has always rocked hard and played plenty of new music, earned nearly a 30 share of 18-24 men – four times that of KDKB, which is decidedly softer and more classic

San Antonio: KISS, **KSAQ** Gain

KISS, which returned from the dead in Winter '92 to post an impressive 5.3, increased another half-point to 5.8. Interestingly, the improvement was in 18-24s; the station's 25-34 and 25-54 numbers slid a bit from its debut book

Rival KSAQ, which fell 4.9-3.0 in the winter survey, rebounded to Its 18-34 numbers were up 4.5. significantly, spurred by huge growth in women. For example, the station didn't even manage a 1.0 among 25-34 women in the winter book One book later its

noted WAZU/Dayton's 5.5-3.8 tumble and wondered whether the station might reconsider its decision to eliminate the PD position. Well, the station rebounded nicely in the spring book (3.8-5.9), and I'm happy to report APD/MD Brad Hardin has just been upped to PD (see Page 10.)

The big move extended WAZU's roller coaster-like trend over the past couple of years: 5.8-5.0-6.0-4.6-5.8-4.1-5.5-3.8-5.9. That works out to an "average" book of 5.2.

Rival WTUE's ratings also have jumped around quite a bit during the same period, ranging from a high of 97 to a low of 60 (The average works out to 7.8.) The spring book showed the heritage rocker posting its second straight gain (8.1-8.8). Meanwhile, the station's No. 1 in men 18-34 and 25-54.

As you'd expect, 'TUE's demographic profile is considerably older than WAZU's. The stations are tied in 18-24 men, and WAZU holds its own 25-34. But 'TUE blows away WAZU's 35-44 which gives a commanding 25-54 lead

Seattle: KZOK Takes Crown, KISW Climbs

It was a good book all around for rock 'n' roll in Seattle – as well it should be, I guess, considering the city's recent musical notoriety First, the 12+ results:

KZOK (CR)	3.7-4.3
KXRX (AOR)	4.4-4.2
KISW (AOR)	3.4-3.9
KNDD (NR)	2.4 - 3.3

Delve into KZOK's book and you'll find two primary sources for the Classic Rocker's 12+ increase. First, the station zoomed 2.7-4.2 in morning drive – a spectacular gain. Apparently, KZOK's decision last November to hire 18-year market vet Gary Lockwood – whose arrival was supported by TV and billboards – is paying big dividends.

Second. the station exploded 35-44, more than doubling from the winter book. Its 35-44 morning numbers nearly *tripled*. And its 35-44 increase in middays was even larger than that!

In contrast, KISW's boost was largely due to a huge increase in 18-24 men. While the station's 25-34 gain was more modest, a concurrent 25-34 slip by KXRX made KISW No. 1 in the market in that key demo.

In fact, KISW now *leads* KXRX in men 18+- KXRX owes its slim 0.3 12+ edge to superior female demos. KISW's two-book rebound has silenced those who predicted the station was just a stone's throw away from Country.

New Rock KNDD shrugged off its sophomore slump and pulled right back into the thick of things. although it should be noted that its demographic profile is much different than the other three, owing to its appeal among younger women. In fact, it has more younger women listeners than men.

Scoreboard Looms

We've received about 75% of the spring books so far. The rest are scheduled to arrive shortly. Assuming I don't go blind from number-crunching, the quarterly AOR Scoreboard — featuring 12+ trends and key demo rankings for every rated AOR (and Classic Rocker) in the country — should be on your desk in two weeks. Party!

Incidentally, I'm often asked how I decide what stations and markets to write about. It mainly comes down to checking out the latest ratings, trends, and issues, and selecting which stations/markets/ personalities merit attention. If you've got a story to tell, please don't hesitate to let me know.

Making Mornings Mean Something

How two stations challenge conventional wisdom — and the competition

For a number of years, UC/Black radio has conceded mornings to other formats - no one thought our format's music could win the daypart. That philosophy is changing.

This week, KKBT (The Beat)/ Los Angeles "House Party" ringleader John London and WQMG/ Greensboro's Bee J. Murphy & Jasmine James talk about their successful high-profile UC morning shows.

Great Expectations

Twenty-year industry vet London joined the Beat in March 1991 from CHR KMEL/San Francisco. "Even though KMEL was not known as an Urban station, it certainly targeted the urban areas, so I had a real sense of what this kind of radio is all about. It was foreign to me at first, but it's become the most enjoyable format I've ever worked in.

66

This is something the Urban audience demands . . . If the morning show's going to be successful, you better be a part of their lives. — John London

"To be honest, it's still a learning experience. This is a very active format. The people who listen to it expect more out of you and your station than a traditional CHR experiences with its listeners. I find the people who listen want to know what kind of a person you really are. I feel comfortable with that. "It was just a matter of whether they were going to respond to

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someone coming out of CHR. I had to move a little bit, and I've asked [the listeners] to move a little bit. 'If you look at the Urban ratings

in this town, people listen to the Beat - period. That's the exciting aspect of it. And if the census hadn't taken such a huge hit out of the black population, there's no telling where the Beat would be right now. We were set back more than a year by that, and that's what we're overcoming right now

Solid Bond

London says successful Urban morning shows are based on real personalities. "It's walking that [fine] line between being outrageous - on this side of tasteful and being yourself at the same time. Certainly, all of us exag-



gerate aspects of our personalities on the air. But you've got to deliver a real person to listeners – and not at the expense of being an entertainer. You can't put on an act for four and a half hours each day and expect them to buy it.

"If you look at the top people around the country, they sound real. They're funny and entertaining, but listeners really have a sense of who they are. That's the most important thing. A lot of people coming up in the industry are so [focused] on being entertaining that they lose sight of being real. One morning, a listener called London on the air, asking him to break format because she wanted to hear "one of those good oldies." He good-naturedly summoned PD Mike Stradford into the studio, took

him to task regarding the listener's suggestion, and promptly satisfied her craving. London sees that as part of maintaining the intimate connection between Urban radio and its audience.

"Urban audiences love their radio stations - they're very loyal. Like when they pick up the phone, call you, and say, 'John,' right off the bat. It's the way they say your name. They've never even met me. But it's like they've known me for years.

Encouraging Talent

"When people talk to you like you're their next door neighbor, you pick up on that. Over a period of time, you realize they're looking at this as something very intimate, as opposed to trying to call an unapproachable [CHR] jock who they probably wouldn't get to talk tc. You get the confidence that you can go ahead and [respond to their requests].

"This is something the Urban audience demands of their station and morning show. If the morning show's going to be successful, you better be a part of their lives."

London believes young Urban talent should be given the opportunity to grow if the trend toward more high-profile morning shows is to continue. "When people call me from smaller markets, one thing that comes across is that - for some reason - Urban PDs at certain levels are very restrictive.

That's a mistake. They need to let those shows grow and fly . . . let them be creative.

"Urban radio hasn't been known for successful morning shows in the past, with the exception of [WGCI/Chicago's] Doug Banks and a few others. I think it's because we're stifling some talent from the very beginning. CHR personalities get a lot more freedom, and that's something we should see more of in Urban radio. It's so hard to put together a good morning show - it takes years for your own ears to hear the show properly."

Early Birds

Meanwhile, on the other side of the country, WQMG's morning duo of Murphy & James hits the Greensboro airwayes each morning at 5am. "Our main competition starts at 5:30, and we want to be on the air a half-hour before all the other morning shows get started," Murphy explains. "We're not afraid of work - that's why we do a five-hour airshift. This is a factory town and a lot of people have to be at work starting at 6am. This



way, we beat everybody to the punch."

James says the team's appeal lies in its natural rapport with each other and the audience. "I think it's the fact that we're ourselves on the air, and the audience is able to relate to us as human beings. We never let egos get in the way; we try to be as personable as possible. We always tie our audience in with what we're doing on the air. We know we're here for them and, for it to work, they have to take part in what we're doing.'

Murphy adds, "Most morning shows showcase the male announcer, with the female always the so called sidekick. Instead of the status quo, we're into a 50/50 thing. We both get the same amount of play on the air, and our listeners like it that way.

James continues, "There are times when the females take my

side when I'm discussing something with Bee J. and the males fall in behind him. But there are other times when the men are with me and the ladies are with him. It gets to be a bit topsy-turvy occasionally."

Work Chemistry

The pair have been working as a team at WQMG since February 1990. "I used to listen to Bee J. on WQOK (K97.5)/Raleigh, when he used the name 'Dan Williams,'" James recalls. "I thought he was excellent . . . little did I know we'd be working together someday. Our former PD, Sam Weaver, put us together in mornings.

'It's interesting – I'm from Mount Olive, NC and Bee J.'s from Goldsboro, which is like the same hometown. Both of our parents teach school in the area and know one another, but we didn't know each other until we met here and began talking about our backgrounds."

But will this young (James is 22, Murphy 27) on-air couple pursue a career together? It's a split decision. Murphy says, "Our chemistry's good together. When you find somebody you can play off of and make things happen smoothly, you want to keep it going as long as you can. I'd like to have the opportunity to work with Jasmine in a larger market someday, because we work good together.'


James, however, has other goals. "I'd like to stay in radio, and Bee J. and I have excellent chemistry. But I'm in the business to one day move into the music industry as an artist. I want to sing. I perform in small clubs back home, and I debut next month here in Greensboro. People know me from [hearing me] on the radio – [maybe] someday it'll also be because they like hearing my record on the radio."

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



WRMF Still Wears Format **Crown In West Palm Beach**

The two stations in this week's spotlight have reasons to be pleased with their spring Arbitron results. One continues to dominate its market, while the other appears to be on the upswing after a down period following the arrival of a formidable format rival.

Double-Digit 25-54

"We spend about three hours a day checking music logs for rotations and balance," remarks WRMF/West Palm Beach OM/PD Russ Morley. "We're not Hot AC or Bright AC – there's no other station quite like us. Our gold/current ratio is about 55/45."

WRMF repeated the feat of being the only station in the West Palm Beach-Boca Raton book to post double-digit 25-54 shares (among 37 rated signals). Showing enormous demographic appeal, WRMF ranked first 12+, 18-34, 25-54, and 35-64. It failed to post double digits in only one of those demos (12+/9.9)

In addition to music flow monitoring, another factor in 'RMF's success is the airstaff's consistency and longevity. "Our afternoon and midday people have been with the station the last 11 years, our traffic reporter has been with us eight years, and the morning [team's] been in place for seven years, Morley notes. "They make my job much easier."

Boasting that his station always aims for unique contests, Morley points out, "For the summer book, we're taking 30 winners on a treasure hunt to the Bahamas - one will win a \$100,000 home. Promotions and innovations keep us freshsounding; we don't take the standard approach to anything.

Made In The USA

WRMF's "Great American Dream" catalog mailer promotion in the spring "was based on the fact that everyone was rah rah for America. We wanted to do everything we could to help stimulate the bad economy.'

The logistics to the promotion were simple. "There were 'Great American Dream' tickets in the mailer. People had to listen for their number and call in to win. The [catalog] cover was done in a Norman Rockwell fashion. It was a fine piece of art that stood out in the mailbox.

According to Morley, the station altered its prior methods of catalog distribution. "Instead of mailing directly to households, we worked with Advo [distribution systems] and there were fewer people complaining of not receiving catalogs. The response was the best we'd ever had, and we had much higher ratios of winners.

"The catalog included prizes worth about \$1 million, and we

awarded about \$125,000 worth. All the prizes were American-related: vacations to the US Virgin Islands, Hawaii, and the US territory of Puerto Rico."

Perhaps as a sign of the times, the prize chosen most often was \$75 worth of groceries each week for a vear

Eyeing The Competition

WRMF's market rule can't be attributed to format exclusivity. Crosstown WNGS had been AC for years, until recently bowing out in favor of Jazz. Also, just before the spring sweep began, longtime B/EZ WEAT segued to Lite AC, utilizing the "Sunny 104.3" banner. Among 25-54s this spring, WEAT posted a fourth-place finish. "[WEAT's change] affected us in

terms of women during middays.

Sounding confident that WRMF

won't be further affected by Sunny's emergence, Morley predicts, "Unless they launch a high promotion image, I don't look for them to do much better than they did this spring. In fact, they may erode.

Santa Barbara's 'Magic' Adds New Programming Tricks

from us.

KMGQ/Santa Barbara, CA PD/midday personality Joni Caryl has imparted a dynamic new attitude to a station that hit the skids when faced with format competition. Prior to Caryl's arrival last year, KMGQ had slipped from mid-teen 25-54 shares to mid-five levels.

Overreaction = Confusion

"It was clear to me that KMGQ [also known as Magic 106] had ignored its competition [KSBL – K-Lite]," she recalls. "When the station noticed how quickly K-Lite was gaining, Magic made kneejerk reactions - a mistake many other stations in that situation make. Magic got scared and started messing with its basic 'pure AC' format.

Working "magic" is nothing new to Caryl, who was Robert W. Morgan's sidekick several years ago at Emmis Hot AC KMGG (Magic 106)/Los Angeles (now KPWR).

"KMGQ did many things it shouldn't have, including adding a ton of oldies and yanking its very successful jazz show. Listeners got confused and didn't know what station they were listening to anymore. I came in and cleaned things up so people knew they were going to hear familiar, contemporary adult songs.

More Current-Based

One of Caryl's first cleanup projects was reworking the format clocks. "I fixed our current-tooldies ratio so we became more current. Scheduling music is one of the most important jobs I have here. Having Selector is great, but I spend about two hours a day reviewing the music by hand."

Pointing out that KMGQ is more current-based than K-Lite, Caryl

notes, "Our music is now '70s, '80s, '90s-based. We play three and currents and two recurrents each hour

Coming Together

In addition to eliminating '60s music and reinstituting the station's nightly 9pm-midnight jazz program, Caryl also became a cheerleader for her fellow air talent. "They needed someone who was enthusiastic and who would tell them they could win. Someone who could bring everyone together. When a station starts losing, people start protecting themselves, rather than working as part of a team."

Next on the agenda was strengthening Magic 106's community profile. Caryl explains, "K-Lite did a great job of being at walkathons and hosting theater events, while Magic did nothing. This year - for the first time in three years – we were at the fair.

'[The Santa Barbara] Fiesta is the city's biggest celebration. My goal [for KMGQ] was to be the center of attention this year as well as the major sponsor. The city basically shuts down and parties for four days.

A Bahamas trip and concert ticket giveaways notwithstanding, KMGQ's principal spring promotional lure was "Thousand Dollar Thursdays." Caryl notes, "K-Lite gave away \$101 [frequency-related] to businesses if their offices had K-Lite on when they came to visit. [To counter that], we decided we'd give away \$1000.

"We made it clear that if people listened to another station at work, they could win one-tenth of what we'd give away each week. The phone company complained that our contest threw its circuits out of whack, and it couldn't get emergency phone calls through.

Fall Confidence

Caryl doesn't hide her respect for the competition. "K-Lite's a good station. It runs contests well and is a real class act. It follows KOST/Los Angeles's playlist and has a nightly 'Love Songs' show. The station's doing a wonderful job and doesn't seem to make any mistakes

"We're just trying to be hipper, slicker, and not as sleepy. I can't wait for the fall book. We had three record-breaking sales months this spring. Advertisers [are] excited about what we are doing - and that's when you play your best game."

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

Sexual Harassment: One Woman's Perspective

Propositions preclude fulfilling on-air career

Sexual harassment has been a hot topic in many industries this year, and ours has been no exception. Most discussions of the problem concern preventive measures employers can take. Here's another perspective: a female air personality who's had to deal with it personally.

I'll call her Jane Doe. She does exist. She's quite talented, and she dearly loves radio. As other women in radio can attest, her experiences are all too common. Here's her story.

JD: I moved from California to do mornings at a station in Colorado Springs. After I was there about a week, the program director started calling me at home and asking me to go to out with him. I always like to keep the business part of my life strictly business, so I said, I'm sorry, but . . .

One day, he called me into his office and told me that either I would have to get with the game plan or I'd be moved to the midnight-6am shift.

DO: And by get with the game plan he meant . . . ?

JD: He meant I had to date him.

DO: How could you be sure? Perhaps if he were here, he'd say, "Oh, no. I just meant she should be a team player, stick to the format," etc

JD: When you're a woman, you learn to recognize when someone is coming on to you. He was really putting pressure on me.

DO: So what did you say to him?

JD: I said "I'm sorry, but I can't. I've been in radio for six years now and I've never had to go to bed with someone to keep my job ... and I'm not going to start now." He said, 'Fine. We'll see about that.'

Two weeks later, I found myself working midnight-6am. I went to the station management, gave them two weeks notice, and requested a meeting with the program director, the general manager, and the vice-president of the

company. The PD didn't show up for the meeting. I told them I was leaving due to sexual harassment. They felt very uncomfortable about the whole situation.

DO: They both were men?

JD: Yes, and they just didn't know how to deal with it. They said they were sorry. I told them they really should look into it, because it hadn't happened just to me; it had happened to another woman who had worked there and who left for the same reason.

DO: Do you think management might have done something about the situation if, instead of resigning, you had stayed and filed a complaint against the PD?

JD: I don't know. I think if I had filed a complaint . . . I'm so concerned about my career ... I don't know.

DO: Is that the only time you've experienced sexual harassment?

JD: No, there was one other instance, in Louisiana. I did a team show with a male partner. The station hired us separately and put us together. The first night I was in town, my new partner made a pass at me. I said, "Listen, I'm here to do a job and I don't get involved with the people I work with. I also **66**

don't get involved with married men.

After that, everything was fine . . for about six weeks. [Then] we were in the studio and he pinned me up against the wall and kissed me on the lips. I said, "Wait a minute! I can't deal with this!"

He backed off, but he got very angry and upset. After that, it was impossible to work with him. He screamed at me constantly. On the air we sounded fine, but off the air it was the worst nightmare of my life. So I decided to go to management.

DO: Did you try to talk it out with this guy first?

JD: Yes, several times. Finally, I went to both the program director and the general manager and told them what was going on. They didn't even want to hear about it; they ignored me.

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DO: What did they say?

JD: "Well, those things happen. When people work together, they often get close."

DO: And again, both the PD and the GM were men?

JD: Yes. For some reason men get embarrassed when they hear about things like this. I don't think they really condone it, but they prefer to pretend it doesn't happen.

Comedy Compilation Show: Bad Career Move

My last column, entitled "Passion = Personality Power," generated an exceptionally large number of responses from readers ... including two who were critical.

One complained he didn't understand what I was trying to say. On the other hand, WSSL/Greenville, SC PD Mark Elliot understood my point - but he disagreed.

You say "Avoid Recycling," And the comments that follow disparage a morning show approach that I strongly feel is one of the new hot ideas out there — compilation morning shows. The biggest complaint working people have today is, "I don't have enough time to do it all." I'm sure that includes watching TV and reading magazines.

A jock who might not have great humor skills but does have a sense for what's "hot" could put together an adult morning show that's a daily keep-in-touch guide. Letterman's Top Ten, jokes from Leno's and Hall's monologues, the top entertainment news - [they could all be] packaged for easy aural digestion between songs and service.

This is a great approach for a station that targets the busy atwork listener. And the resources are available (the new CBS service, make a deal with the TV station, etc.). For a visual example, watch the TV show Talk Soup on the E! cable channel

One of the points of that last column is that the makeup of the radio personality pool will increasingly follow a distressing societal trend in our country: the Upper Class (jocks making huge amounts of money) will grow, the Lower Class (jocks with no career security making meager wages) will grow, and the Middle Class (jocks making a decent living) will shrink.

Stay A Player

The maxim to which you object ("Avoid Recycling") is offered as one thing an air personality can do to position himself as a player in the '90s, in the hopes of reaching the Upper Class - or at least of hanging onto the Middle Class.

The kind of show you describe is unlikely to help anyone's career. It

might or might not perform adequately in the ratings, but it doesn't require a specialized skill or talent upon which one can build a career. for the following reasons.

It's something many people can do. The descriptive term you use says it all: "Compilation Morning Show." Relatively few people can create; almost everyone can compile. Creative people are harder to find and harder to replace than compilers.

Any ratings success for such a show is bound to be short-lived; it's hard to imagine a compilation radio show that can sustain a loyal audience over a long period of time.

Hold The 'Talk Soup'

I haven't seen "Talk Soup," but from what I understand, it offers fast-paced highlights of the week's various TV talk shows. Such a show is highly targeted and mediaspecific: Most people don't sub-scribe to E!, and those who do are likely to be much more interested in television than the average American is, hence more receptive to "Talk Soup" than a less active TV viewer would be. So the question is: Is that very active TV viewer representative of your target?

A more appropriate comparison might be made to a disastrous NBC-TV failure last year - a weekly show that promised to show highlights from the previous week's network TV shows. Never heard of it? Well, you're proving my point.


I'm sure "Talk Soup" gets permission to broadcast clips. A radio station that records Letterman's Top 10 List or Leno's or Hall's monologues and then replays them without permission is setting itself up for charges of copyright infringement. (Making a deal with the local network affiliate is pointless; you have to receive permission from the copyright holder.)

Power Of Personality

Finally, look again at the people whose work you cite as examples of material that is good to compile on a morning show: Letterman, Leno, and Hall. What has made them successful? Personality.

Now look at the morning shows that dominate their markets, and you'll discover that each of those also reflects a distinct personality. (That's why I'm likely either to love or to hate a dominant radio program; they're programs that evoke strong reactions - both positive and negative.)

A person compiling and delivering a show like the one you describe will have a job, not a career. I'd like to see more radio people with careers.
