




BILL ANDERSON

Hank Thompson, a tall, handsome Texan, was born in Waco, September 3, 1925. He has recorded many hits for Capitol . . . Roy Acuff is one of the living members of the Country Music Hall of Fame. He has been a star of the Grand Ole Opry for nearly 30 years and was born in Maynardsville, Tenn., September 15, 1907 . . . Johnny Cash was born in Kingsland, Ark., February 26, 1932, and records for Columbia. He is now developing as a movie and TV star . . . Lester was born in 1914 near Sparta, Tenn., and Earl was born in Flint Hill, N. C., in 1924. As he puts it, "I just grew up with a banjo." . . . Buck Owens was born in Sherman, Texas, Aug. 12, 1929. He now lives in California and is under contract to Capitol. His pet peeve: "people who try to be what they aren't." . . . \boldsymbol{Judy} Lynn records for United Artists.
