JOSEPH G. ANTELO, CHARLES J. ROTHERS TO NEW POSITIONS AT WGN CONTINENTAL BROADCASTING COMPANIES

DANIEL T. PECARO, president and chief executive officer of WGN Continental Broadcasting Company, announced two appointments during the company's annual sales seminar.

JOSEPH G. ANTELO, vice president and general sales manager for WGN Television and a vice president of the company's sales subsidiary, was named Vice President and Director of Sales, WGN Continental Broadcasting Company, and President, WGN Continental Sales Company.

CHARLES J. ROTHERS, president and treasurer, WGN Electronic Systems Company, was named Director of Engineering and Development, WGN Continental Stations. He retains his offices with the CATV subsidiary.

In making this dual announcement, Pecaro said, "These two appointments are consistent with the continued growth of our company as we look to increased emphasis on development, not only in Programming, but in Sales and in future technology as well."

Antelo joined WGN Continental Sales Company's New York office as account executive in 1964 after previously holding the same position for Katz Television and Stone Radio Representatives. He was named Eastern Division sales manager for television in 1974 and was elected a vice president of the Sales Company in May, 1975. In June, 1975, Antelo was brought to Chicago headquarters and was named General Sales Manager, WGN Television. In 1976, he assumed additional responsibilities as Director of Television Sales for the Sales subsidiary. In May of 1977, he was elected a vice president of WGN Continental Broadcasting Company.

In his new position, Antelo will have responsibility for sales at WGN Continental Broadcasting Company.

Antelo graduated from the City College of New York in 1951 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Business Administration. He received his master's degree in Public Administration the following year from the same school. He served 4 years in the Navy.

Rothers, a veteran WGN employee, joined the Engineering Department of WGN Continental Broadcasting Company in 1948 as a Field Supervisor. In 1962, he left WGN briefly to become vice president of operations for Industrial Television Services, Inc. He rejoined WGN in 1964 as an administrative engineer and in May, 1967, was appointed administrative engineer - Special Projects. In 1968, Rothers was named to the Board of Directors of WGN Electronic Systems Company. The following year, he was named Executive Vice President and Treasurer of the CATV subsidiary. In July, 1975, he was elected President and Treasurer of WGN Electronic Systems Company.

In addition to his duties with WGN Electronic Systems, he will undertake the responsibilities for the direction and future development of the Engineering phases of the WGN Continental Stations.

Rothers attended Grove City College in Pennsylvania, where he majored in electrical engineering. He served four years during World War II in Naval Aviation in advanced electronics, most of his duty was in the South Pacific.

JOHN KUCERA - 15 years -- June 24, 1978




WELCOME TO FLYING OFFICER RUSSELL HOGANSEN

INTERNSHIP PROGRAM


The Internship Program was first granted on April 1, 1963 and is in memory of PIERRE NDRE who was a well known announcer at WGN.



NBC's 'Days,' ABC top Emmys

NEW YORK [AP]—NBC's "Days of Our Lives" won an Emmy as the best daytime dramatic series and the stars of NBC's "The Doctors" and "Another World" won acting awards in nationally televised ceremonies here Wednesday.

James Pritchett, who plays Dr. Matt Powers in "The Doctors," was chosen outstanding actor in a daytime dramatic series for the period between March 14, 1977, and March 28, 1978, and Laurie Heineman was named best actress for her role as Charlene Frame Matthews in "Another World."

An ABC soap opera, "Ryan's Hope," won an Emmy for writing, and Richard Dunlap of CBS' "The Young and the Restless" picked up one for directing.

ABC WAS THE BIG WINNER overall with seven daytime Emmys, including four for children's programming. NBC won five, with CBS and the Public Broadcasting Service each receiving two. ABC had 28 nominations; NBC, 18; CBS, 13; and PBS, 8.

Talk show host Phil Donahue was a double winner, receiving Emmys for being the outstanding host in a talk, service, or variety series, and for his syndicated "Donahue" show.

"CAPTAIN KANGAROO," which made its debut on CBS in 1955, was named the outstanding children's series.

WGN-ILLINOIS OPERA GUILD AUDITIONS OF THE AIR

ENDY WHITE, a twenty-five-year-old mezzo from Harvey, Illinois, got off to a running start this year. Last March she won first prize in the WGN-Illinois Opera Guild Auditions of the Air, and went on almost immediately to share first place, with Winifred Brown, in the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions in New York. It is, to say the least, a promising pair of prizes.

For two decades, rather quietly, the WGN-Illinois Opera Guild project has been giving a solid annual boost to young singers. Its Auditions of the Air—the country's only national operatic vocal competition presented by a major broadcasting company—bestows a handsome \$4,000 on the winner in addition to a solo appearance at the Grant Park summer concerts. Second and third prizes are \$3,000 and \$2,000—won this year by sopranos Susan Brummell of Chicago and

Maryanne Telese of Houston. All three winners are heard on WGN's "Grand Awards Presentation" program.

The Auditions are organized on a grand scale. This year nineteen final-

ists, chosen from 535 singers heard at auditions in New York, Los Angeles, and Chicago, converged on the Chicago Civic Opera House to compete before a panel of three somewhat formidable judges: Nicola Rescigno, conductor and artistic director of the Dallas Civic Opera; Lili Chookasian, contralto of the Metropolitan Opera; and Sherrill Milnes, leading baritone of the Metropolitan and himself a winner of these Auditions in 1960. Interestingly enough, first honorable mention this year was given to Winifred Brown, who went on to the first-place tie at the Met.

The WGN-Illinois Opera Guild Auditions, which operate under the direction of Richard D. Jones, program manager of WGN-Radio, has proved over the past twenty years that its collective ear is a good one. Past winners include Dominic Cossa, Kathleen Battle, Jeannine Altmeyer, Vinson Cole, and Brent Ellis—all familiar names on opera house rosters both here and abroad.
