FCC Approval is Asked

The widely and favorably known Meredith Publishing interests ("Better Homes & Gardens" and "Successful Farming") have contracted to buy (subject to FCC approval) the Radio Station WOW, Inc., stations, WOW, and WOW-TV, for a cash consideration of \$2,525,000.

Announcement of the contemplated sale was made jointly Au-gust 8 by Francis P. Matthews, president of WOW. Inc., and E. T. Meredith, Jr., president of the Meredith Engineering Co. of Des Moines, and vice president of the parent publishing company.

Under the terms of the contract to buy, all the stock of Radio Sta-tion WOW, Inc., is to be purchased by the Meredith Engineering Co., which also owns and operates Station WHEN (TV), at Syra-cuse, N. Y.

The announcement by Mr. Matthews who retired recently as Sec-retary of the Navy to become U. S. Ambassador to Ireland, said a pri-mary factor in acceptance of the





For Consistently **Good Music**

The National Broadcasting Company was selected as the network that has "most consistently fostered the cause of good music" for the fifth successive year in the poll of music and radio editors conducted annually by Musical America Magazine.

The announcement of the magazine's eighth annual poll also indi-cated that Arturo Toscanini was again chosen as leading conductor, which he has won every year of the poll. Toscanini's performance of Verdi's "Requiem" (carried by WOW last winter) was voted the leading musical event of the year.
