










WOW-TV's Chief Engineer Bill Kotera says the 100,000 watts will extend the Channel 6 "Primary Service Area" 15 to 20 miles in all directions from Omaha, enlarging it roughly to a 75-mile circle with Omaha as a center. In addition, the new power will strengthen and improve the WOW-TV signal throughout the station's present

The boost to 100,000 watts power will complete a \$110,000 improvement and expansion program begun at WOW-TV during the latter part
