



A former Lincoln, Neb., man re-cently shared in a \$6,770 pay-off on Break the Bank.



In 1932, in addition to her duties as 4-H Club Leader, she was named Supervisor of the County Kitchen and acted as Dietary Advisor to the County Welfare Office.

She accompanied her husband to Lincoln, Nebraska, in 1939, where he was employed by the American Dairy Association. Here Miss Cook first entered the sales field in readyto-wear for a Lincoln department store.

In 1942, she was named manager of a department at Sears-Roebuck and Company. During the period the department was under her supervision, it consistently led in sales volume, and in 1945 she received a national award for her outstanding sales and managerial ability.

Miss Cook joined the Staff of Extension Service at the University of Nebraska in 1946. The following year, she was named Home Demonstration Agent of Minnehaha County, South Dakota, a position

she held until joining Meredith WOW, Inc. Her position as Home Demon-

stration Agent included the organizing and supervision of women's groups, where some 700 women took part in a program which instructed in new methods and short cuts to all phases of homemaking.

cuts to all phases of homemaking. Additionally, over 300 4-H girls studied homemaking, problems un-der Miss Cook during the last year. Daily and weekly radio programs made up a large part of her extra-curicular activities. She conducted




