ENJOY OPRYLAND U. S. A.

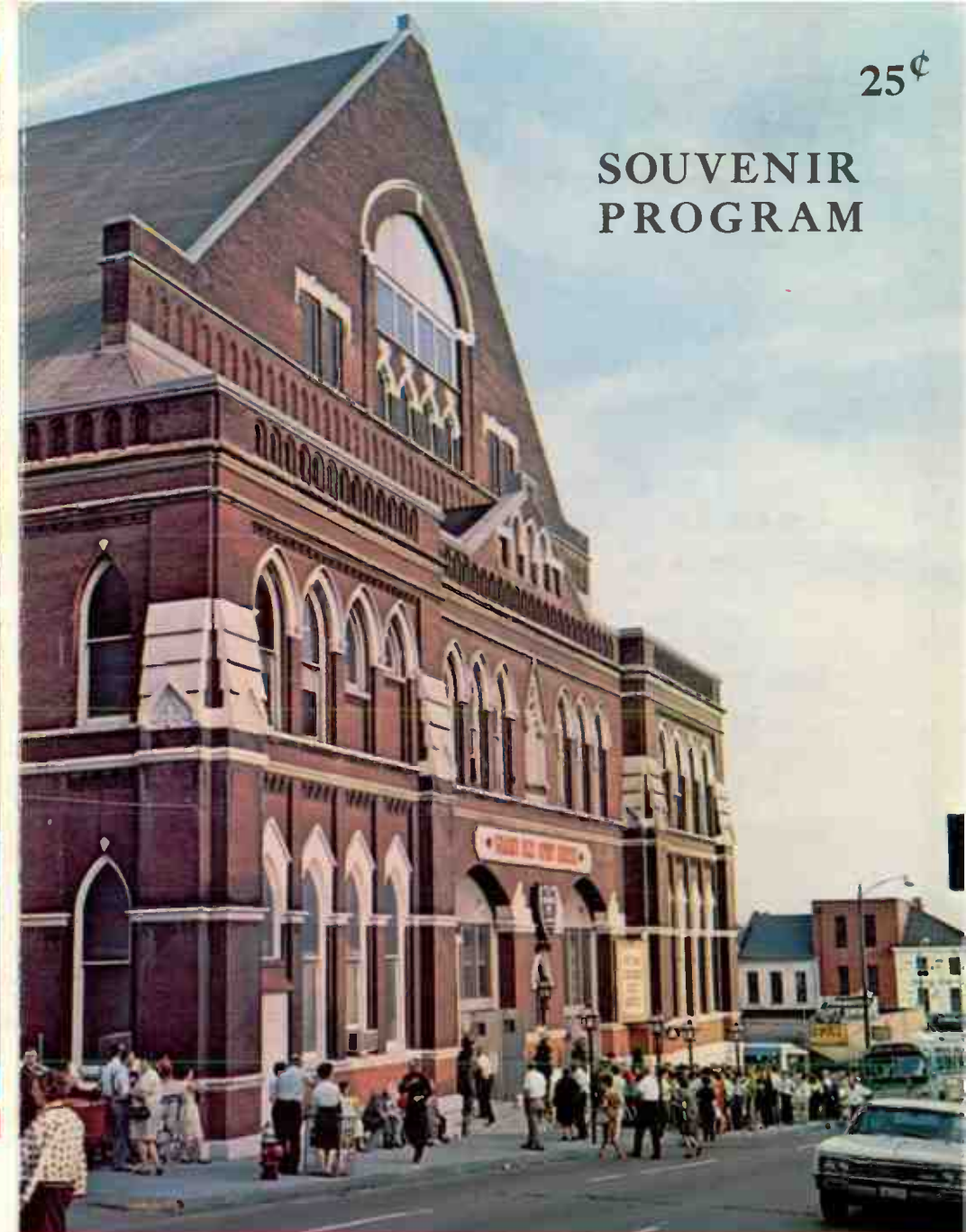
