Ground Gog

THE CBC's DOCUMENTARY series 20/20 will focus on food on the August 26 edition—not on food in general but on a delicacy native to the Canadian mid-west. The program is entitled *The Fish with the Golden Eye*.

A quarter of a century ago, Manitoba's central lakes produced over half a million pounds of goldeye, but last year, the province was able to harvest only 60,000 pounds of this increasingly rare commodity. This wandering breed of fish has been discovered as far north as Lake Clare in Alberta and into the east in Ontario's Severn River where they have become the object of scientific research in an effort to preserve and multiply the species. While the goldeye may be caught in Alberta, Ontario or Manitoba, the entire catch goes to Winnipeg for processing and distribution.

This program traces the now world famous smoked Lake Winnipeg Goldeye from the dinner plate back to its natural habitat, and through its processing for top restaurant consumption. Those who have relished the distinctive flavour will be particularly interested in learning why the fish is now in such scarce supply after a relatively brief history of epicurean success. The Goldeye story on the 20/20 series is produced at CBWT Winnipeg by Peter Kelly and narrated by Ron Hunka.

AN EVENING OF CANADIAN BALLET is presented on CBC-TV, Sunday evening, August 26, by the first established ballet company in Canada, the Royal Winnipeg Ballet. The three presentations from the contemporary repertoire of the Company are the creations of three Canadian choreographers—Brian McDonald, Michel Conte, and James Clouser.

In Recurrence, created by James Clouser, we are told of the lonely journey of the young through adolescence, of the many difficult experi-

ences which occur and recur. A drama of transition, the moving and sensitive study of a boy emerginto manhood. The dancing is modern, as contemporary as the movements of kids at a teen age dance. It is, however, influenced by the ritual patterns of traditional ballet. Sonja Taverner and Richard Rutherford a r e the principal dancers.

The second ballet *Un Et Un Font Deux*, created by Michel Conte uses the classical framework of the pas de deux for the technique of modern dancers. It is a charmingly flirtatious story, located in a schoolroom with two pupils. James Clouser and Lynette Fry are the dancers.

Les Whoops de Doo, choreographed by Brian McDonald, is a

dance of fun and games, of broad comedy and cheerful satire. A brawling view of the mythical West where men were mobile dancers and women-were always—women. A bold and bragging ballet where the discipline of classical dancing is allied with the abandon and energy of a good old prairie whoop-up. Principal dancers are Marilyn Young and David Shields. Orchestra under the direction of Eric Wild.

African Survival

"AFRICA STILL has the greatest and most fascinating assortment of wildlife ever assembled on one continent. Nowhere else can you see so many species of animals roaming at liberty in their natural habitat. But these wild herds, at one time seemingly inexhaustible, are now reduced to shattered remnants. What chance of survival have these great creatures that are left?"

With these words, Dr. lan McTaggart Cowan sets the mood for this week's program in the Discovery series: Survival, to be telecast Saturday, August 25 at 10:30 p.m. on CBC-TV. The film was photographed in Africa by Chiels Margach, edited by Danny Tanaka and produced at CBC Vancouver by Tom Connochie.

The importance of saving the lives of the animals that are left, and helping in every way to undo what years of unchecked slaughter have done, has now become apparent. But in order to help, man must first acquire knowledge of their behaviour, and habitat and this he has been doing for the past ten years. Before that time no research programs with the necessary depth had been undertaken to provide the information needed to increase the size of herds and to re-establish the natural balance between animal and nature, and the interdependence of the animals themselves.

"The secret of the tremendous diversity of Animals in Africa lies partly in the fact that the creatures have evolved together over a long period of time without suffering through great climactic changes, such as an ice age," states Dr. McTaggart Cowan. "Each of the creatures uses the same habitat in a different way and does it without destruction to the land.

"Poorly tended domestic cattle, on the other hand, are one of Central Africa's greatest scourges-miserable, useless, undernourished creatures that defile the water holes, denying them to wildlife. And, by intense over-use, they have done to the land in 20 years what centuries of use by wild beasts and locusts had not done. They have turned large areas of the once productive grassland into a sea of lifeless sand."

Recent studies have shown that the arid bushlands, savannahs and grass plains of Africa will produce much more meat per square mile with the natural animals of the area than would come from cattle on the same land.

During the program Dr. McTaggart Cowan shows the animals as they each use their natural habitat in their own way. The great variety of animals is also shown including a rare film of a weaver bird busily weaving its nest in a tree from reeds and twigs.

Many animals are shown being captured for transportation to national parks. A highlight is the roping of a baby elephant requiring a chase overland in a jeep and three or four men to hold it once lassooed. Another technique shown for capturing animals, is the anaesthetic needle fired from a riflea modern - day version of the blow pipe used by primitive tribes in years gone by.

The marking of hippopotami with hard-wearing paint for purposes of later identification-the equivalent of banding birds and branding cattle-creates a tense situation during the program. This is realized not only in the faces of the scientists and natives, who approach one seemingly unconscious beast with the greatest caution but, also evidenced by the fact that the cameraman became so engrossed in what he saw in the viewfinder that he forgot to change focus when he moved closer-and that for a professional cameraman like Chiels Margach is really significant.

Two Programs Highlight Australia

THIS WEEK, two separate programs on CBC radio deal, by coincidence, with the island continent of Australia. On Sunday, August 26, at 5:00 p.m., the Venture series presents a program titled Boomers and Beavers, in which folk-singers Alan Mills of Canada and Rolf Harris of Australia stage a small "hootenanny" of Canadian and Australian folk songs. Together they explain, through song, the history and background of their respective countries. The "boomer" of the title is the slang word for the kangaroo which, in the same way as the beaver in Canada, is used as a national symbol in Australia. Alan Mills will be familiar to many as one of Canada's best-known interpreters of traditional songs. He has been collecting folk material for many years, has made a number of recordings, and has appeared in his own series of programs on CBC radio networks. When not engaged in studying folk lore, he works as a straight dramatic actor, and has made many appearances in National Film Board pictures and in television dramas originating in his native Montreal. Australian Rolf Harris, sometimes referred to as "The Wizard of Aussie," is the man who made the inimitable "wobble board" famous, particularly in his recording of "Tie Me Kangaroo Down, Sport," which took the North American pop-music market by storm a few months ago.



On the *Venture* program, Harris will demonstrate his skill as an accomplished performer on the wobble board and the digeredoo, instruments that may not be immediately recognizable by musicologists but which are presumably fun to play. The wobble board is simply a piece of plywood, which, when flexed, produces a distinctive "boing, boing," it is Harris's own invention. The digeredoo, on the other hand, is an authentic aboriginal instrument, his use of which is an outcome of Harris's long study of his country's native tribes.

While Rolf Harris has been visiting this country, Canadian freelance writer and broadcaster Tony Thomas has been paying a two-month visit to Australia. He will give a two-part report on his observations in two programs of the Soundings series, on Thursdays, August 23 and 30, at 8:00 p.m. In the first broadcast, he discusses the agriculture and geography of the country, and the problems of power sources and transportation. In the second, he describes life in the cities and on the beaches, and talks about the quest for a national Australian culture. Below, Tony Thomas records some of his impressions of life "down under:"

Perth is a nice city. It's clean, modern and spacious. And the weather is the kind southern California used to have before the deluge of cars and people turned it into a smog-shrouded jungle. But visiting Perth is something like taking a trip to the moon. I remember standing at a busy cross section in down-town Perth and thinking about distances. Singapore (from where I had just flown) was two thousand miles north, with no civilization in between. Many thousands of miles south was Antartica and directly west was that eternity of space called the Indian ocean. The nearest Australian city was Adelaide, a mere 1,340 miles east. The state of Western Australia, of which Perth is the capital, is almost a million square miles.

Staggering is the word for your first impression of Australia but it doesn't take you long to feel about space and distances the way the Aussies do, namely nothing much. What does draw and hold your attention is the Aussie attitude toward life. They obviously don't believe that they were put on this earth to do nothing else but work. I remember a Saturday afternoon in Adelaide. The down-town streets were empty and all the stores were shut. This was December and the height of summer. Where were the people? The people were in the parks and they were playing. They were playing







CWNA "Special Edition"

WHILE THEY may not have the circulation of the big-city dailies. Canada's weekly newspapers occupy an important place in the Canadian publishing field. The small, local weekly gets closer to its readers, supplies news about neighborhood happenings that the bigger papers don't have space for or facilities to obtain. The editor of a weekly shares an intimacy with his readers that few other newspapermen experience; if a reader doesn't agree with the editor's views on farm subsidies, for instance, he doesn't write a cold, formal letter, he just tramps into the office and says his piece. There are many problems involved in getting out a weekly-it's often a oneman operation, with the editor serving as publisher, reporter, rewrite man, editorial writer, advertising salesman, copy boy and janitor - but there are rewards as well. Among them is the freedom to air opinions, to stand up for a cause and stick by it, to take the full responsibility for the accuracy of facts and, in short, to run one's own show. By the nature of their work, most weekly editors turn out to be profound individualists, and that in itself is something to wonder at in this age of conformity. Few owners of weeklies ever get rich; some find that a good newspaper attracts readers but not necessarily advertisers, and, as one former editor of a prairie paper once pointed out "an editor's rewards are mostly of the non-material world." But in terms of the other things that make for happiness-friendship, the respect of neighbors, the satisfaction of personal achievement, the opportunity to make a







cricket, tennis, golf and bowling. Others were in boats on lakes and rivers, when they weren't swimming. And this was not just a lucky percentage of the people, this was all of them and it was the same in Perth, in Sydney, in Brisbane, in Melbourne as it was in Adelaide.

I spent two months in Australia and it wasn't long enough. But it was enough time to get to know how Aussies felt about their position in the world and that they are not as easygoing and as casual as their reputation makes them out to be. Many Australians worry that they haven't made a better impression on the world. They worry about their meagre population—ten million in three million square miles—and like a lot of Canadians they worry about national identity, the Commonwealth, the Cold War, immigration programs and economic progress.

The Australians are, to my observation, a very pro-American people and they seem to envy Canada's proximity to the United States. But they are still a British people—they play cricket, drink tea, drive on the left side of the road and use pounds, shillings and pence. With it all, they are very conscious of being Australian and if their country has been, up to the present, a sleeping giant—then the giant is beginning to stir.

A. J. Liebling

A Profile

THIS WEEK, Four's Company, Saturday, August 25, 9:00 p.m. on radio, presents a program about the American writer, A. J. Liebling, formerly known to readers of the New Yorker as that magazine's reporter-at-large, "Wayward Pressman." Prepared by Ronald Hambleton and read by the members of the drama quartet-Ruth Springford, Diana Maddox, Mavor Moore and John Drainie-the program etches a sharp profile of the writer through Hambleton's selection of some lengthy excerpts from Liebling's work: a stinging view of The Blue Book of the John Birch Society; a thoughtful, damning study of biased newspaper coverage of a railroad strike; a vivid piece of character drawing, about Governor Earl Long of Louisiana; a gourmet's warm reminiscences of gastronomic delights; and a description of a prizefight written in a precise, fastidious style that is unusual, to say the least, in the field of sports writing. The subjects covered may indicate that Liebling is a man of seeming contradiction. He needs explaining and here is a quote from Hambleton's introduction to the Four's Company program:

"A. J. Liebling's three great interests are sports (boxing in particular), food and wine, and the newspaper business. Perhaps 'interests' is too colourless a word, because in each of these fields he is a critic, and an enthusiast, and an authority. And he can speak of any one of them in terms of the other, as when he casually remarks, in emphasizing a point, that 'a good cook, like a good jockey, must have a clock in his head.' One of his best pieces is an extended comparison between a professional boxer and a concert musician; and it is commonplace for him to paint, without strain or incongruity, a picture of a mid-west locality by detailed references to the Middle East.

"Of course, there are vintage years in journalists as there are in wines, and our selections are taken from the Liebling of the mid-fifties, roughly speaking. Since he was born just after the turn of the century, his mid-fifties more or less correspond with the 20th century's. Before the fifties began, he was on the staff of the New Yorker, and before that a practising newspaperman in Rhode Island, and before that an inquiring student in France. Now, and for the last 10 years, he has closed the circle by being once again a resident of France . . . a journalist, searching for the similarity and contrast between this society and that . . . and a student of his favourite recreations."

In his 'teens and early twenties, Liebling was an amateur boxer, devoting much of his spare time to "the sweet science." In his later articles on the sport, he employs a delicate, artistic writing style that seems in direct contradiction to the subject. A few years ago, when light-heavyweight champion Archie Moore met challenger Harold Johnson, Liebling wrote about the battle. A few excerpts from his article give an indication of the style:

"For several years -I had been hearing about Moore, a virtuoso of anachronistic perfection in an age when boxers in general are hurried along like artificially ripened tomatoes, and with similarly unsatisfactory results. Moore was an aging academician, of such celebrity that young fighters came from the very Antipodes to study at his feet, which is where they frequently landed." About the championship fight itself, Liebling wrote, in part: "Instead of flicking, moving around, Moore was reconnoitering in close, looking the challenger over as if he had never seen him before. (They had fought each other four times previously.) So the true artist takes up a work he has laid aside for years, and attempts a fresh approach. Bent forward, his bearded Oberammergau head shielded by a mobile elbow, he made sharp tangential prods at the thorax and abdomen, like a sculptor seeking the grain of a rock or a physician asking where it hurts. In round three, Moore landed one smashing right to the body, as if asking 'Is that where it hurts?', and Johnson's eyes said 'Yes.' Moore went away as quietly happy as a doctor who has made a promising diagnosis." Eventually, after 14 rounds, Moore tired of the sport, and decided to dispatch his opponent. Liebling concludes his report thus: "Watching the men fight on the side of the ring away from me, with Johnson retrograding in my direction at a speed ordinarily observed within town limits, I noted a sudden acceleration of his rearward approach. The synergetic effect of his own withdrawal and the forward propulsion imparted by Mr. Moore's right hand sent him into a spin, which failed to impair Mr. Moore's calm aim. . . . Johnson was so nearly helpless that the referee stopped the bout a few seconds later."

Surely no boxing match has ever been reported in such prose, and with such rich drawing of classical and intellectual cross-references. It is typical of Liebling, and combined with the other excerpts quoted on the program, it gives a profile of the manerudite, cynical, amused, and highly entertaining.



CBC Wednesday Night Music From Stratford

IT'S POSSIBLE that if Bach and Handel were to come to life today they might find themselves more at home playing with a jazz group than with a chamber music ensemble. Why? Because the distinctive feature of jazz is improvisation, and in the time of Bach and Handel such improvisation-on - the - spot composing of varied chords and counter-melodieswas an integral part of music. Composers used to like nothing better than to sit down at the organ or harpsichord and improvise variations on their own works or those of other composers. Indeed, the keyboard player in the ensemble of the pre-Classical period had to be able to "make it up as he went along," because he was supplied only with a sketchy outline (called a figured bass) of the harmonic structure of a composition; at the performance, he indulged in "instant composition," improvising the chords, arpeggios, runs and other ornamentation as the mood seized him. And this is exactly what happens in the free ensemble playing of a jazz group. The practice died out about 200 years ago, when composers began writing down every note exactly as they wanted it played, leaving only that vague quality called "interpretation" up to the performer.

Now an American composer-pianist, 40-year-old Lukas Foss, is trying to revive the long-dead art of improvisation and make it part of contemporary serious music.

Five years ago, he formed a small ensemble piano, clarinet, 'cello and percussion—to experiment

with his ideas in what might be called classical jam sessions. "Our improvisation is a sort of composition," says Foss, "in which the choice of notes is left up to the performer." But the choice is not entirely capricious. "We don't just play anything that comes to mind. Rather, we play anything that comes to mind within a predetermined, limited form." To achieve this, the group engages in what seems a contradiction of terms: rehearsals of improvisations. At these rehearsals, they don't read musical scores, but follow large charts that look like a cross between a floor plan, a football coach's blackboard, and a game of tic-tac-toe. The charts indicate the over-all plan of the piece, and the individual players must keep within its specific confines, but they are still allowed comparative freedom to experiment. "If we hit on something good," explains Foss, "we try to remember it; if something bad, we try to forget it." He admits that he first got the idea of "controlled improvisation" while listening to the high-brow jazz of the Modern Jazz Quartet, but insists that the techniques employed by his group are far more complex than those of jazz. "It's the difference between playing blackjack and playing bridge.'

Foss, well known as a composer of more conventional music long before he began to experiment with his new ideas, doesn't expect his system to replace the written score. In fact, the improvisational techniques are only part of his current work, and he has continued to turn out compositions written in the usual way. One of his best-known recent works combines the two approaches; it consists of four movements of fully-scored music, interspersed with improvised interludes. This is *Time Cycle*, a work for soprano soloist and instrumental ensemble,





based on poems by Auden, Housman, Kafka, and Nietzsche, all of them having to do with the flow of time, clocks or bells. It will be heard on CBC Wednesday Night, Aug. 29, in a two-hour program of music from this year's Stratford Music Festival. The program will include, in addition to the Foss work, music by Debussy, Ravel and Mozart, recorded at the week-end concerts held in Stratford during recent weeks. Taking part will be contralto Maureen Forrester, pianist Foss, violinist Oskar Shumsky, 'cellist Leonard Rose, pianist John Newmark, violist Steven Kondaks, soprano Grace-Lynne Martin and the Lukas Foss Improvisation Chamber Ensemble.

Miss Forrester will be heard, accompanied by John Newmark, in Debussy's *Trois Chansons de France*, settings dating from 1904 of poems by Charles Duc d'Orleans and Tristan L'Hermite. New-

mark will also join with Oskar Shumsky, in performing Debussy's Sonata for Violin and Piano, and with Leonard Rose, in the same composer's Sonata for 'Cello and Piano. Shumsky and Rose, who are codirectors (with Glenn Gould) of the Stratford Music Festival, will be heard in a brilliant performance of Ravel's Sonata for Violin and 'Cello. The Mozart work is his Piano Quartet in G minor, K. 478, and it will be played by Shumsky, Kondaks, Rose and Foss. The program will conclude with Time Cycle, in which soprano Grace-Lynne Martin will be soloist, accompanied by the Foss ensemble.

During its visit to Canada, the Foss group spent a day at CBC-TV studios in Toronto, videotaping a rehearsal and performance of *Time Cycle* for showing in the series *The Lively Arts* sometime this fall on the television network. On this program, Foss discusses the novel techniques with Canadian composer Harry Somers, and demonstrates the use of the graphs and other devices—including hand signals—in working out the improvisational techniques

CBC Conductor-Arranger Receives Canada Council Fellowship

THE 37-YEAR-OLD conductor-arranger for Reflections, Sundays on CBC-TV, Gordon Macpherson, has left Canada for six months' study in England, through a Canada Council Senior Arts Fellowship. He will study piano and conducting.

He began studying piano at the age of six, in his home town of Moose Jaw, Sask. He served in the RCAF during World War II as a navigator and saw active service in Burma.

With the assistance of DVA grants he continued his musical studies after the war, and received his Licentiate from the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto. While studying in Toronto from 1945 to 1953, he joined the piano department of the Royal Conservatory and received a scholarship to further his studies at the University of Toronto. During his studies for his Artists' Diploma, his chief source of income was derived from accompanying solo artists.

After graduation in the fall of 1953, Gordon came to Halifax to teach at the Maritime Academy of Music, which eventually became the Maritime Conservatory of Music. A further appointment resulted in his heading the Conservatory piano department.

He immediately became active in the musical life of the city, making appearances with the Halifax Symphony and performing solo recitals in the city and other Maritime centres. At this time, also, he acted as a piano soloist and accompanist on CBC programs.

His first association with Robert Alban, Reflections producer, began with children's radio drama series, for which he performed background music on the electronic organ. This led to other original dramatic scores for Halifax Theatre, CBC Wednesday Night and Summer Stage. He has arranged and composed for a variety of groups, from duos to full orchestra. As a conductor he first started with light variety programs on the national network, such as Invitation, Summer Date and Strings n' Things, many selections of which he also arranged.

Soon after his arrival in Halifax, he gave a recital with the well-known violinist, Francis Chaplin, which was the beginning of a long association. They have since performed on many recitals on CBC programs -Concert Hall, Wednesday Night and Distinguished Artists, and have also been featured on many regional programs.

With the advent of TV he collaborated on many regional and network programs, acting as conductor, composer and arranger. One program he especially remembers is Souvenir, a regional TV program in which he was featured along with Francis Chaplin. The 15-minute show of violin and piano artistry was very popular with CBIIT viewers. This musical format for TV, produced by Robert Alban, eventually extended into a string orchestra show with Chaplin as featured soloist and Macpherson acting as accompanist, soloist and conductor. This show was called Reflections, which has been seen on the CBC-TV network for the last two years.

Gordon has always been interested in chamber music and has experimented with many trios, quartets and quintets. The latest group, the Halifax Trio, has been heard on the national and regional networks.

Gordon is married to the former Billie Buschert, of Chicago, Ill., whom he met while studying in Toronto. They have two children, Sandra, 7 and Stephen, 3.
