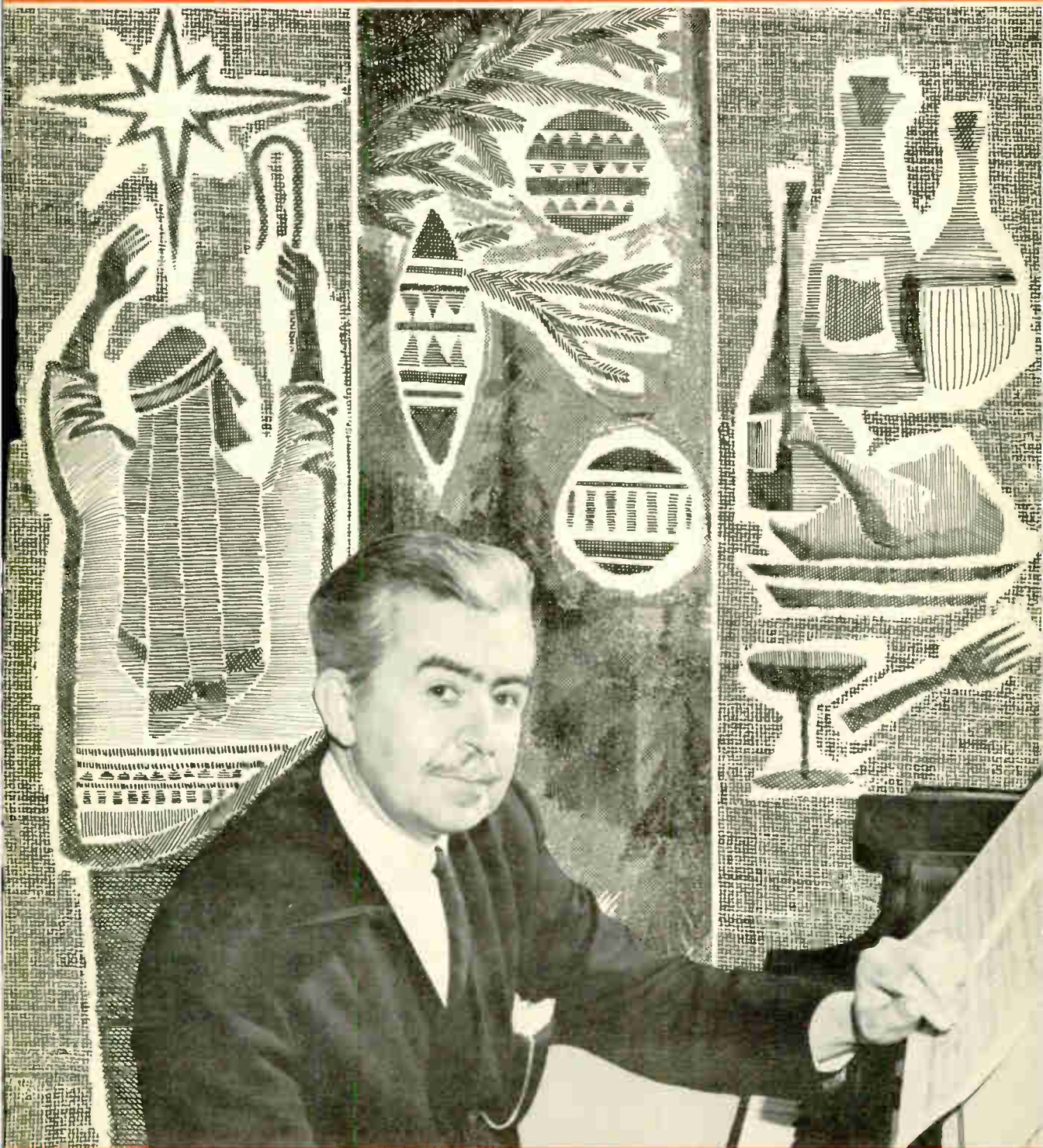

Hymn Sing—The chorus sings *Carol Sweetly Carol*, *All My Heart This Night Rejoices*, *Once in Royal David's City*, and a medley including *The First Nowell*, *Lo How a Rose E'er Blooming*, *Shepherds in the Fields Abiding*, and *Stille Nacht*. (5:30 p.m.)

MONDAY (December 20th)

Take Thirty—Special holiday features each day. Today: a visit from cast members of *Henry Green and His Mighty Machine*, a new musical by Dodi Robb and Pat Patterson, which opened at Toronto's Museum Theatre last month. (3:30 p.m.)

TUESDAY (December 21st)

Dick Van Dyke Show—Rob's boss, Alan Brady, appears as Santa Claus; Rob and Laura do a sidewalk Santa Claus song and dance; Sally and Buddy sing, and even Mel joins in a tribute to Brady. (9:30 p.m.)

The Public Eye—A review of some of the beliefs of two great Christian philosophers who died this year: Paul Tillich and Albert Schweitzer, who were much revered. (Please turn to page 9)

CBC Stage—Selections from two 14th-century dramas that form part of the medieval Mystery cycles. One is from the York cycle, *The Birth of Christ*; the other is from the Wakefield cycle, *The Play of the Shepherds*. They are accompanied by folk music of the period. (1:00 p.m.)

CBC Showcase—Part one: Impressionist Rich Little presents his version of Dickens' *A Christmas Carol*, with the "voice" of Jack Benny as Scrooge. Orchestra and chorus conducted by Jimmy Dale. The Serial / Comedy on Ice

Big-league hockey comes in for some ribbing in the next presentation of **THE SERIAL**, beginning Thursday, December 23rd.

CANADA'S HOCKEY mania supplies the colorful background for the next drama on CBC tv's *The Serial*.

McGonigle Skates Again, a six-part comedy by Leslie McFarlane, chronicles the adventures of a big-league scout in his search for young hockey hopefuls. Starring Tom Harvey as ex-NHL great (now a scout) "Skates" McGonigle, it will be seen Thursday at 10:30 p.m. starting December 23rd.

Young Tim Beckett (played by teenager Rex Hagon, well known for his appearances in *The Forest Rangers*) is the hockey-playing sensation of Snowshoe Falls, Ont. A school chum secretly tips off two major league teams about Tim's athletic prowess, triggering the arrival in town of two scouts — McGonigle and his arch-rival, "Blackjack" Snead. McGonigle's frantic efforts to keep one step ahead of the conniving Snead in his campaign to sign up the boy lead to many comic complications.

Writer Leslie McFarlane, famed for his Hardy Boys books for young people, was the adapter of Costain's *Son of a Hundred Kings*, an early *Serial* production. McFarlane has written countless scripts for CBC radio and television, including *The Great Casa Loma Purchase*, to be seen on *Show of the Week*, Monday, January 3rd.

Star Tom Harvey, born in Scotland and raised in To-

ronto, is a skilful comic as well as a serious actor. A former announcer and newscaster in private radio, Harvey turned to acting as a sideline, but eventually decided to make it a profession.

Over the past few years, he has appeared in many CBC radio and television dramas, including such shows as *Playdate*, *Quest* and *CBC Stage*. He will be seen in two forthcoming *Seaway* dramas — *The Sparrows* and *Port of Call: Paradise*.

On the stage, Harvey has been seen with comedian Tom Kneebone in the musical comedy *Evelyn* at Toronto's Crest Theatre. Last summer, he toured Canada with Wayne and Shuster.

Others featured in the large cast of *McGonigle Skates Again* include Ruth Springfield, Bill Kemp, Amelia Hall, Drew Thompson and Bill Glover. It has been produced and directed by Melwyn Breen.

A talk by Prof. W. Carey, assistant professor of Russian, University of Alberta, about the Russian novel, *One Day in the Life of Ivan Denisovich* by Solzhenitsyn. This novel first appeared in Russian two years ago and created a sensation as one of the three major post-war

novels that have come out of Russia, the others being Pasternak's *Dr. Zhivago* and Dudintsev's *Not By Bread Alone*.

8:00 p.m.—Regional Feature

Speaker is Edward Feuz, a Swiss mountain guide who was brought to Canada at the turn of the century to instruct would-be mountain climbers and guides.

9:00 p.m.—Midweek Theatre

The Police. A satiric drama from behind the Iron Curtain by Polish playwright Slavomir Mrozek, adapted by Jack Kuper. Set in a fictitious police state which has reached such perfection that the Commissioner has just one political prisoner left under his jurisdiction. When the prisoner is converted to the party line and

is set free, officialdom is thrown into confusion.

A three-part program, beginning at 8:30 p.m. Wednesday, December 22nd, presents distinguished and varied entertainment.

Festival:

FOLK SONGS, DRAMA and SHAKESPEARE

A SPECIAL 2½-hour pre-Christmas *Festival* show in three parts will be presented on Wednesday night, December 22nd. It will begin with *The Songs of Man*, an hour of folk music, starring host and folksinger Theodore Bikel; American folksinger Odetta, whose voice is described as "all organ sounds and cathedral colors"; two Canadian solo folk artists, Catherine McKinnon, featured each week on CBC tv's *Don Messer Jubilee*, and Willie Dunn, half Micmac Indian, half American, born on a Reservation near Quebec City, who is fast making a name for himself in Canada and the U.S. as singer-composer; La Famille Brassard (12 girls and a boy), and Les Cailloux (vocal quartet) from Quebec; and the Cape Breton Singers, who appeared at last year's Newport Festival. The program is written by Martin Lavut and Stan Daniels, who composed the title song, and is produced and directed by Paddy Sampson.

The Songs of Man will be followed by *Whisper Into My Good Ear*, a moving, bittersweet play splashed with humor, by American writer Willian Hanley, which, with its companion piece, *Mrs. Dally Has a Lover* (presented on *Festival* a few months ago), won for its author the coveted Vernon Rice Award. It stars Barry Morse and Budd Knapp, and is directed by Mervyn Rosenzweig. It will be followed by *Ages of Man*, a Shakespeare recital by Sir John Gielgud, produced and directed by David Susskind, and edited for *Festival* by Ron Garant. (Please turn to page 25)

Schweitzer and Tillich:

Unorthodox Views on Christianity

Theologians discuss the views of two noted
Christians Tuesday at 10:30 p.m. on CBC tv's THE PUBLIC EYE.

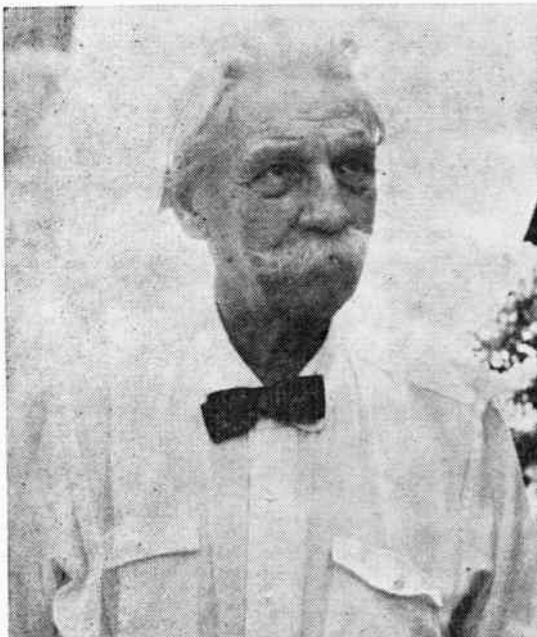
THIS YEAR was marked by the deaths of two of the greatest Christian philosophers of the century—Dr. Albert Schweitzer and Professor Paul Tillich. They died a few weeks and several thousand miles apart—Schweitzer in Lambarene, Africa, in September; Tillich in Chicago in October.

For its pre-Christmas offering this week, CBC tv's *The Public Eye* will present a discussion of the beliefs of these two men, together with film clips from programs in which they were seen earlier in the year. Both held unorthodox views on the Christian religion, since both were profoundly original thinkers who had devoted their lives to its cause.

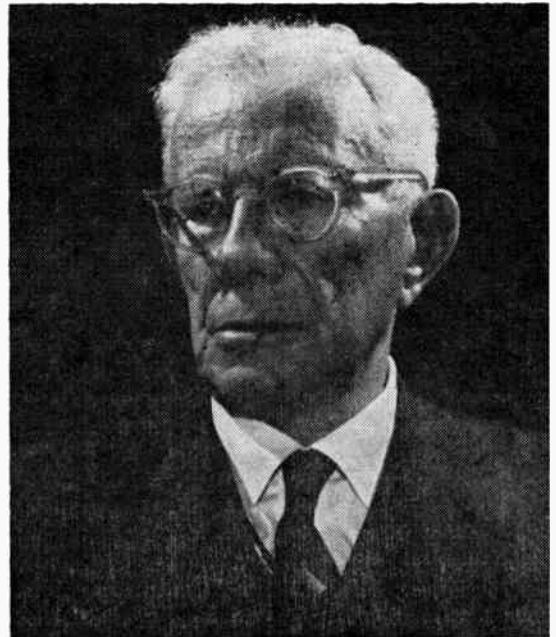
Schweitzer—doctor of music, theology, philosophy, and medicine—was appointed principal of Strasbourg Theological College before he reached the age of 30. After years of searching for “the elementary and universal conception of the ethical which I had not discovered in any philosophy,” Schweitzer found his inspiration in Africa. “There flashed upon my mind,” he wrote, “unforeseen and unsought, the phrase ‘Reverence for Life.’ The iron door had yielded; the path in the thicket had become visible. Now I knew that the world view of ethical world-and-life-affirmation, together with its ideals of civilization, is founded in thought.”

Thereafter Schweitzer spent the rest of his life, over half a century, in Lambarene, dedicated to Reverence for Life. Two years ago he was asked if he thought formal religion, and in particular, Christianity, was still a major force in the (Please turn to page 15)

CBC TUESDAY NIGHT:

For the Time Being

The true meaning of Christ's birth to modern man is expounded Tuesday, December 21st at 8:05 p.m. in a presentation of Auden's masterful work.

*If on account of the political situation
There are quite a number of homes without roofs, and men
Lying about in the countryside neither drunk nor asleep
If all sailings have been cancelled till further notice
If it's unwise now to say much in letters, and if
Under the subnormal temperatures prevailing
The two sexes are at present the weak and the strong
That is not at all unusual for this time of the year.*

This is the narrator's first speech in the Christmas oratorio *For the Time Being* by W. H. Auden. A performance of this work will be given on *CBC Tuesday Night* this week in a production from CBC Winnipeg.

"If you are looking for something that really places the Christmas story before you; if you really want to think about the event of Christ's birth and what it means to you—then *For the Time Being* is ideal," says drama producer Tony Ross, who worked on the program with music producer Tom Taylor. "Do we or do we not accept the birth of Christ—and, beyond that, do we accept its meaning in our daily lives: that is the question put forth in this work. (Please turn to page 27)

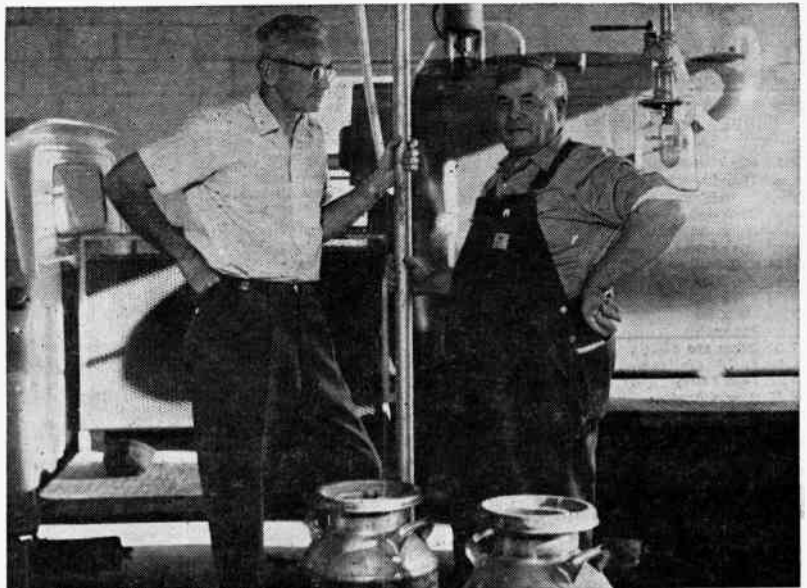

Festive Mood on 'Take 30'

ALL THE *Take 30* programs this week will have a holiday flavor, varying from jolly to serious. On Monday's show, December 20th, at 3:30 p.m., special guests will be Tom Kneebone and other cast members from *Henry Green and His Mighty Machine*, the sophisticated musical for older children and young adults which opened at Toronto's Museum Theatre last month.

Tuesday's program features a most intriguing departure from the usual *Take 30* fare. In the Wednesday program Dr. Jean Boggs, former curator of the Toronto Art Gallery, who is currently lecturing in St. Louis, Missouri, will discuss the Nativity in art, in many ages and styles. On the same program Madame Benoit will suggest festive concoctions for Christmas-time parties.

Thursday's program will be an informal holiday party with hosts Paul Soles and Adrienne Clarkson. On Friday viewers will be invited to share Christmas Eve with the Scotts — singer Joyce Sullivan, actor-announcer John Scott, their children and family pets — at their century-old farmhouse near Toronto.

world, to which he replied: "No it is not; not in a true sense . . . Christianity in the last century and at present is often untrue to itself. It has lost the essential element of willingness to love, and of reaching communion with God through that willingness."

Tilich, who at the time of his death was teaching at the University of Chicago's School of Theology, wrote more than 25 books on the relationship of religion to art, politics, sociology, philosophy, and psychology. His *magnum opus*, written over a 10-year period, was the three volume *Systematic Theology*. "These three books," he said, "would not have been written if I had not been convinced that the event in which Christianity was born has central significance for all mankind. . . . During the larger part of my life I have tried to penetrate the meaning of the Christian symbols, which have become increasingly problematic within the cultural context of our time. Since the split between a faith unacceptable to culture and a culture unacceptable to faith was not possible for me, the only alternative was to attempt to interpret the symbols of faith through expressions of our own culture."

Chairing the discussion on the beliefs of Schweitzer and Tilich will be George Grant, professor of theology at McMaster University and the author of *Lament for a Nation*.

Following *McGonigle*, *The Serial* will present a new series of Vancouver-produced dramas in the *Cariboo Country* series. Written by Paul St. Pierre and produced by Philip Keatley, these simple stories of life among the rugged people of British Columbia's Chilcotin Plateau, have an authenticity reinforced by the employment of untrained Indian actors in addition to solid professional performers.

Critical praise and mail response have been encouraging for the first two productions so far presented on *The Serial* this season, says executive producer Ronald Weyman.

Writing about Mr. Member of Parliament, the Montreal *Star's* critic, Pat Pearce, said: "It has a light touch cloaking real thought." The Ottawa *Citizen's* Frank Penn called the characters "life-sized and credible, and his hero, Quentin Durgens, the idealistic MP, is a kind of dramatic spokesman for every Canadian voter."

"It's achieved too subtly to be explained," said critic Bob Blackburn in the Toronto *Telegram*, "but *The Serial* looks Canadian."

TELESCOPE: Log Drive

THIS YEAR'S log drive down New Brunswick's Saint John River may be the last. The Mactaquac Dam and the economic factor may put an end to one of the last remaining river-drives in Eastern Canada. The drive was a fairly hard one this year. The water level, which has to be just right for a good drive, was low due to the sparse rainfall. About half a million cords of timber go down the Saint John on a 300-mile journey from the headwaters of the river to the great boom between Cromoctoc Island and the eastern shore near Naugerville. Along the way Beaver aircraft radio instructions to teams of lumbermen in boats and trucks to keep the traffic flowing smoothly.

On *Telescope* this week, viewers will meet some of the men, who have been on the log-drive most of their lives. Jim Irving is one of them. He explains how mechanization and the use of radio and spotter aircraft have changed the drive since he started: "Our drive on the

Saint John River starts anywhere from the 10th to the 25th of April and used to end up below Fredericton at Lincoln anytime after September. But during the last few years we've been successful in getting our driving time down to where we're finishing in June. Last year, I believe, it was the 28th of May. "We've mechanized our operation. Today we have a number of outboard motors, we have skidders, bulldozers, and we use aircraft for patrolling the river and spotting potential trouble."

The logs are herded by Jim Irving's men over Grand Falls, followed by back-up crews sweeping the shores and rounding up strays, and are moved to the holding boom at Beechwood Dam, the last big obstacle on the way to Fredericton. After the Beechwood Dam the river is dotted with sandbars and small islands, hazards that could quickly jam the drive. Irving describes how the "sheerboom" works to prevent this.

Messiah Broadcast Xmas Eve

CBC RADIO'S annual presentation of Handel's *Messiah* (the 18th such broadcast) comes from Massey Hall in Toronto on Christmas Eve, beginning at 7:30 p.m. Elmer Iseler conducts the Toronto Symphony Orchestra and the Toronto Mendelssohn Choir. Soloists in this per-

formance are: Elizabeth Benson Guy, soprano; Patricia Rideout, contralto; Glyn Evans, tenor; David Ward, bass; and organist George Brough.

Mid-way through the broadcast there will be an intermission period during which Derek Holman, organist and choir director of Grace Church-on-the-Hill, Toronto, will give a 15-minute talk entitled *The Great Mr. Handel*. Mr. Holman, who was formerly the Warden of the Royal School of Church Music in England, is himself a composer, teaches at Bishop Strachan School and is a lecturer at the Division of University Extension, U. of T.

In his talk he discusses Handel the man rather than dealing directly with his music. He sees Handel as a shrewd and lively person, very characteristic of the period in which he lived. Much of the force and directness of Handel's work, Holman feels, came from the composer's *rapport* with audiences of his day. He was not writing for posterity.

The producer of the *Messiah* broadcast is Richard Coulter.

Theodore Bikel has had a successful stage and film career (his latest movie is *Sands of the Kalahari*), but he says his first love is singing to a live audience. "I am as reverent as the material deserves," he says, "and as flippant as the audience allows." He knows hundreds of folk songs in 16 languages and umpteen dialects—he has a master's ear for them. Born in Vienna, he moved to Israel with his family when he was four, later became interested in acting, and helped found the Tel Aviv Chamber Theatre in 1942. Two years later he enrolled at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in London. After graduating he was appearing in Little Theatre productions when Sir Laurence Olivier noticed him and cast him as Mitch in the London production of *A Streetcar Named Desire*. Later he had a long run as a Russian colonel in Peter Ustinov's production of *The Love of Four Colonels*. Next he launched his film career as a German gunboat officer in *The African Queen*, and has since appeared in *The Blue Angel*, *I Want to Live*, *The Little Kidnappers*, *The Angry Hills*, and *A Dog of Flanders*, as well as in dozens of television productions. His stage performances have included roles in *The Lark* with Julie Harris, in *The Rope Dancers* with Art Carney, and in *The Sound of Music* with Mary Martin. And of course he has recorded several albums of folk songs.

Odetta's voice was trained originally for opera, in Los Angeles, where she had moved with her family from Montgomery, Alabama. But while in junior college she attended a party where some folk singers sang until dawn, and she was so overwhelmed by the warmth and possibilities in their music that before long she was launched as a folk singer herself, and her success has been phenomenal. What has distinguished her singing is the extreme care with which she tries to re-create the original feeling of each song in her repertoire. "In folk music," she

says, "complex emotions are spoken about with such simplicity that it's the highest form of art to me. You can unclutter things with folk songs . . . There are many difficulties between people, but there is this one likeness: we function with the same kind of emotions. Folk music can point up this human thing that we all share."

Barry Morse and Budd Knapp, who star in *Whisper Into My Good Ear*, have appeared together on several occasions, the most memorable being a year ago in *Waiting for Godot* on *Festival*, the most recent being earlier this month on radio, in a *CBC Stage* production of *A Dream Within Time*. Their stage personalities and acting styles complement one another extremely well without one overshadowing the other. In *Whisper Into My Good Ear* they again play a couple of down-and-outs, though not as poor or as oblique as Samuel Beckett's tramps. This time, Morse and Knapp are two old fellows who rendezvous in a park, perhaps for the last time, and playwright Hanley offers them a wonderful chance to build up really substantial characters, which they exploit with great artistry. Their pathetic and sometimes humorous reminiscences are punctuated by watching a pair of young lovers, and the sight is crucial to their conversation. Perhaps these two old men look humdrum, but they share a secret they can scarcely bear to mention to each other, a secret so important that if told, must be whispered into the good ear.

Ages of Man is a television version of Sir John Gielgud's one-man show which he has taken to countries around the world with tremendous success. It's an anthology of readings from Shakespeare's plays and sonnets, including excerpts from many roles Gielgud has made famous. As the greatest contemporary speaker of Shakespeare, he brings a special illumination to the poetry and philosophy of the Bard, sharing with us some of the anguished love, humor, frivolity, jealousy, sickness, and sorrow over the passage of time, in the seven ages of man.

"Auden really makes the beauty of St. Luke's story live for modern man. He captures its central challenge and expresses it in terms the modern man can understand. This challenge — of our ability to believe in something beyond man — is made real to working men and intellectuals, of this and all ages."

Auden sub-titled the poem "A Christmas Oratorio" and, for the first time on radio, it is given its full scope, with music specially composed for piano and singing voices by Chester Duncan, to supplement the spoken word. The fact that this complex work is being produced in Winnipeg is due largely to Duncan's interest and inspiration in composing the music. A specialist in modern verse on the staff of the English department at the University of Manitoba, he has set numerous other Auden poems to music, and has written a book-length critical study of the poet. Duncan is a native of Strasbourg, Saskatchewan, who has lived most of his life in Winnipeg. He is frequently heard as a pianist on CBC serious music programs, and as a critic and panelist on other broadcasts.

For the Time Being, written 20 years ago, is considered one of the most brilliant of Auden's works and a major contribution to the literature of religious drama. Sometimes compared by critics with Yeats and Eliot, Auden has been for more than 30 years one of the most important poets of our

time. In his early years, during the '30s, he was the chief left-wing poet in Britain, establishing his reputation with such works as *The Orators* and *Look, Stranger*. During the Spanish Civil War he joined the republican cause and drove an ambulance. Out of his experiences there came the bitter *Spain*, published in 1936. Following this episode in his life he emigrated to the United States and became a U.S. citizen, a break with the past that, as with Yeats and Eliot, changed his poetry. Professor Monroe K. Spears, who has written what is perhaps the definitive study of the poet, notes the shift from liberal humanist to the Christian standpoint.

Now 58, Auden lives in Vienna. Earlier this year he published a collection of poems under the title *About the House*. "He is still comparatively young," says Professor Spears, "... still capable of major surprises, and therefore not yet to be pigeon-holed."

Canadian broadcast debut of the Russian soprano Galina Vishnevskaya accompanied by her husband pianist Mstislav Rostropovich. Program includes:

The Poet's Echo ... Benjamin Britten

THE MOSCOW Bolshoi opera's leading soprano, Galina Vishnevskaya, currently visiting Canada and the United States, will be heard in her Canadian broadcast debut on *CBC Tuesday Night*, December 21st, at 10:35. Her performance, in the *CBC University Celebrity Series*, was recorded earlier this month at Hart House, University of Toronto. She is accompanied at the piano by her husband, Mstislav Rostropovich, one of the world's leading 'cellists.

Miss Vishnevskaya will give the first Canadian performance of Benjamin Britten's latest work, *The Poet's Echo*, settings of six poems by Pushkin, greatest of the Russian poets. Britten composed the music last summer, while holidaying in Armenia, U.S.S.R., with Miss Vishnevskaya and her husband, who are close friends of his. He dedicated it to both of them.

It begins with a setting of Pushkin's *Echo*, and ends with *Lines Written during a Sleepless Night*. Through all six poems the colorful imagery of the poet is delightfully complemented by the sublime lyricism of Britten's score. One of the songs, *The Nightingale and the Rose*, is considered one of the most beautiful he has ever written. When the soprano and her husband gave the work its première in October, in Moscow, the audience was so enthusiastic that it had to be repeated.

This is the first time Britten has set a Russian work to music. But it is not the first time he has composed especially for either of these two distinguished Russian performers. A couple of years ago he wrote a 'cello symphony for Rostropovich. It was inspired by their mutual admiration when they performed at the Aldeburgh Festival in 1962 — a world-renowned annual musical event organized by Britten in the tiny English fishing village where he lives.

Miss Vishnevskaya's portrayals of opera heroines in *Aida*, *Fidelio*, *Madame Butterfly*, and *Eugen Onegin* (Tchaikovsky's setting of

Pushkin's masterpiece), have won her high praise in many countries. At her Metropolitan opera debut in 1961, singing the title role in *Aida*, the audience shouted itself hoarse with enthusiasm and refused to leave until the asbestos curtain was lowered and the house lights dimmed. "It was wonderful," recalls the singer. "The audience really was insane! It was one of the best I've ever had. I will never forget it."

Born in Moscow, she began serious voice study at 16, and only a year later was invited to join the Leningrad Operetta Theatre, where her voice, beauty and acting talent soon won her leading roles. She began studying the grand operatic repertoire and a short time later was asked to join the Bolshoi, where she scored her first major success as Tatiana in *Eugen Onegin*. She has toured with the Moscow State Symphony, and has given many concerts in Europe and North America, where critics praised her superlatively. She has a big, warm, supple voice, which the *New York Times* described as having "grand line and passionate force. She seemed to be aflame, and so was the audience." Miss Vishnevskaya married Rostropovich in 1955. They have two small daughters.

Canada's Regional Theatres

THIS THURSDAY, December 23rd, at 7:30 p.m., radio's *Soundings* presents a program on the *Problems and Responsibilities of Regional Theatres*.

The U.S. government has suddenly discovered that it must subsidize the arts to keep them alive in areas outside the big centres. Here in Canada the Canada Council has been doing this successfully for some years, and regional theatres across the country are thriving and contributing much to our cultural life because of it.

Last month the Theatre Communications Group, an arm of the Ford Foundation, which endows many regional theatres in the U.S., sent a group of representatives to Winnipeg to study the methods of the Manitoba Theatre Centre, which has successfully embarked on a number of enterprises, including school tours, which no American theatre has undertaken on such a large or successful scale. Delegates to the conference were particularly interested in learning

how the Theatre finances itself. This is the second workshop the Theatre Communications Group has had, and probably the more rewarding, as far as ideas and inspiration are concerned.

Soundings will present a summary of the conference; highlights of its sessions; and a panel discussion, by some of the leading Group members attending, of the problems and responsibilities of the decentralized theatre. Among those heard from will be Malcolm Black of the Playhouse Theatre in Vancouver; Murray Davis of the Crest Theatre in Toronto, and Leon Major of the Neptune Theatre in Halifax. Panel members include John Hirsch of the Manitoba Theatre Centre; Theodore Hoffman, head of the drama department at New York University, and former editor of the *Tulane Drama Review*; Nance Mousesian of the Charles Playhouse in Boston; and Harlan Kleiman of the Long Wharf Theatre in New Haven, Connecticut.

"HANK IS not a Dick Chamberlain," says Dick Kallman, who ought to know. Dick portrays Hank in the comedy series of the same name seen Sundays at 7:00 p.m. on CBC tv.

"Hank is a typical guy of college age," explains Kallman. "He's moderately handsome, likeable and more often than not flashes a warm smile. A go-getter but not a know-it-all, Hank is sharp as a tack but is not a swinger. He's intent on getting an education even if he has to steal it . . . which is exactly what Hank does. He's sort of a school 'drop-in'."

There are marked similarities between Hank and the young man chosen to play him. Dick Kallman is an attractive, immediately likable young man whose green eyes laugh as frequently as he does. Like Hank, Dick has not had education beyond high school, but has thirsted for knowledge. He has quenched a part of his thirst by travelling throughout the world.

By his own admission, Dick is "not a swinger." He explains, "I have a great zest for living, but when given the choice between the biggest Hollywood party or a stay-at-home dinner with close friends, I'd choose the latter nine times out of ten."

And like Hank, Dick is a go-getter. "I love showbusiness," he says. "It's all I know. My aim is not just to be good but to be the best actor and singer available. I'll work as hard as I can to achieve that goal. Should I get there, I'll be ever grateful. I have no patience with actors who, once they have made it, turn their backs on interviewers and the press. If you object to the fanfare, you should be in another business. Once you're a star, it's your job to be a public personality—to be, so to speak, in the public domain."

Hank is enthusiastic about everything he does. Ditto, Dick Kallman: "Life is tremendously exciting for me now. Each day I'm on the threshold of something bigger and better. Since I could never be classified as an overnight success, I appreciate everything that is happening to me."

Dick has been in showbusiness for nearly a decade. An outstanding prize was the starring role in the national company of *How to Succeed in Business*. His first job paid him \$250 per week.

"It seemed like very little money to me," says Dick. "I was raised in an atmosphere of affluence. My father was very wealthy, but that all changed. About the time I turned 20, Dad sold all of his New York holdings and bought a huge 18-million-dollar hotel in Havana. Then came Castro, and my parents were ushered out of Cuba at gunpoint. The money was gone and so was a way of life. Only some of the family jewels were saved, as my mother sewed them into the lining of her coat."

The elder Kallman, Dick's father, never recovered from his total wipe-out in Cuba. His health progressively deteriorated until his death early in 1965. Dick became the sole support of his family. "By then," he says, "I had learned the value of the dollar. From experience, I knew what wise investments and savings can mean."

Hank, too, has had to learn the value of money. He is the sole support of himself and his baby sister. "It really is incredible how similar Hank and I are," says Dick. "At times I wonder where the play acting ends and the reality begins. It's not easy separating them."

"Where Does the Play Acting End . . .?"
