REDUCING THE FARMER'S RISK

THIS BUSINESS OF FARMING returns with five daily 60-minute programs about better methods for agriculture, January 10th to 14th.

FARMERS will always be subject to the vagaries of the weather, with good years and bad years coming more or less by chance. But there are methods of reducing the risk, keeping farm income on a more steady level. These methods are outlined on the fifth annual *This Business of Farming* short course, seen on CBC tv stations in the prairie provinces Monday through Friday, January 10th to 14th.

A one-hour program each morning at 10:30 a.m. will be introduced by Lionel Moore, supervisor of farm broadcasts for the CBC Prairie Region. Agricultural experts will give well-illustrated lectures showing practical ways of improving the profits of farms

large and small, through better planning and methods.

The series is presented by the CBC in co-operation with the federal and provincial agriculture departments and the provincial universities. Program organizers are Vern McNair of the Manitoba Department of Agriculture, John McConnell of the Saskatchewan Department of Agriculture, and Warren Wismer of the Alberta Department of Agriculture. Gren Bates of CBC Winnipeg is the producer.

Farmstead Planning and Beautification. Farm specialists deal with the purpose of farmstead planning, which is to provide a well-organized arrangement of buildings and equipment, and to reduce labor costs but still provide an attractive area for the family. *Participants:* P. 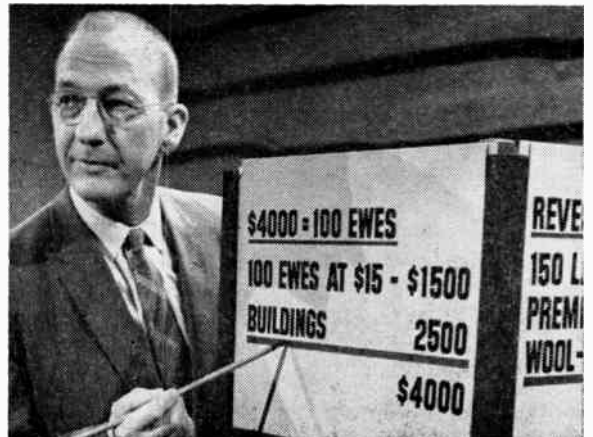
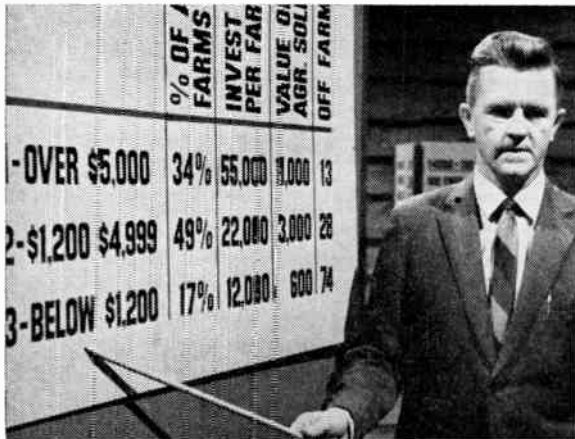

Non-singing Spy Role for Robert Goulet

SINGING STAR Robert Goulet enters a new phase



of his career this season as he takes the lead in a dramatic series — with no singing involved. Goulet stars as double agent David March in *Blue Light*, a Second World War spy series beginning on tv Wednesday night, January 12th. *Blue Light* is the code name for an Allied plan to infiltrate the German High Command. March is a noted foreign correspondent who, before war broke out, had volunteered for a dangerous Allied mission from which he was sure he would never return, renounced his citizenship, and gone to Germany as a Nazi agent.

His job is to work his way into the confidence of the German leaders and steal their secrets, sabotage their plans, and generally undermine the Reich's hopes for world power. As the series begins, the other 17 specially trained members of March's maximum security unit have been discovered and executed by the Germans. Alone but undefeated, March is hated by his own countrymen who are unaware of his mission, hunted by partisans, and frequently under suspicion by the Gestapo. Much of the series is being filmed in Germany.

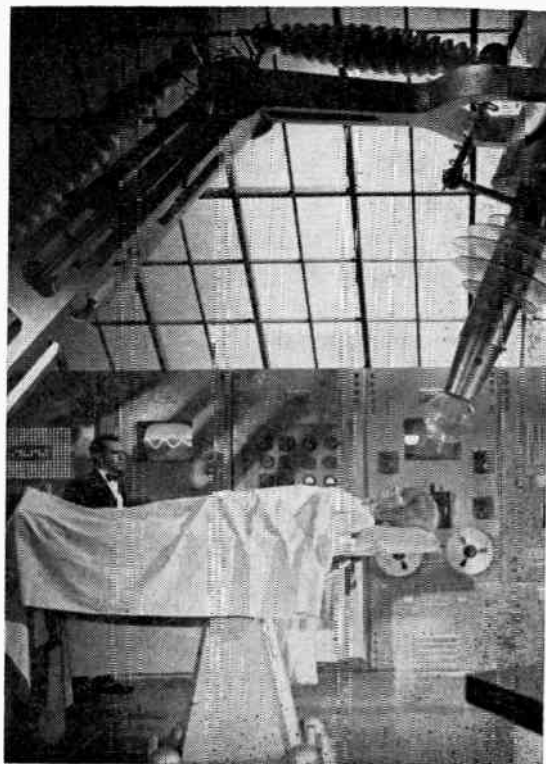

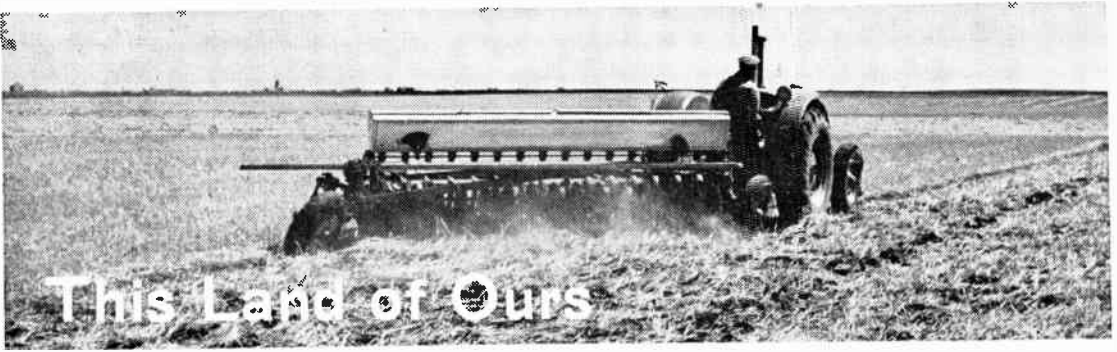

Blood-chillers of the past are recalled on SHOW OF THE WEEK.

On *Show of the Week* Monday, (January 10th, at 9:00 p.m.) the boys fondly survey the history of horror films, from the early German expressionist films, *The Cabinet of Dr. Caligari* and *Nosferatu*, to some of the weirder movies and tv shows of today. Along the way, we may encounter Count Dracula, Wolf Man, King Kong, Frankenstein's monster, The Mummy, Godzilla, The Blob, The Creature from the Black Lagoon, and many other lovable little horrors. Norman Campbell produced this edition of the show.





The immense renewable resources of Canada are explored in a new television series beginning Saturday.

THIS LAND OF OURS, a new weekly half-hour television series, makes its debut on the CBC tv network, Saturday, January 8th, at 6:00 p.m. "The purpose of the 13-week series," says R. G. Knowles, supervisor of CBC's farms and fisheries department, "is to explore the areas of Canada's rural renewable resources with a view to bringing an understanding of the particular re-

source to the general viewing audience."

These resources include agriculture, fishing, forestry, water and soil conservation, and wildlife. "The series is also designed to show experiences and attitudes of people in rural areas, particularly those earning their livelihood off the land and from the sea," says Knowles.

Host for the new series will be John Foster.

Each program will concen-

trate on a particular resource, and frequently special guests will appear to discuss wild and domestic animals and to present demonstrations of various kinds.

The first program will be on the Albion Hills Conservation School, as seen through the eyes of students from two Scarborough junior high schools who lived there for a week. The program shows how the school teaches conservation practices.

The January 15th program illustrates how dependent the Northern Indian is on the goose as a source of food. It is the story of Andrew Salt and his wife, two of some 500 Indians brought to Ontario this year to help in the fruit harvest. They are seen picking fruit during the summer months on the Niagara peninsula, and hunting geese in their home area of Ruperts House, an Indian village in Moosonee.

Other programs in the series will include studies of the lobster (January 22nd); bird population and control (January 29th); and a two-part story (February 5th and 12th) on two Quebec farming families, one of which continues with traditional farming practices, while the other is regarded as one of the most progressive in the area.



Bing Crosby's Love Affair With Canada

The famous showbusiness personality recalls his many visits to this country
on TELESCOPE, Thursday at 9:30 p.m. on CBC tv

BING CROSBY has been visiting Canada ever since he was a boy, and over the years he has collected a good many friends here — quite apart from his large number of Canadian fans. Crosby's most recent trip to Canada was made last October, when he spent a long week-end with his old friend Charlie Conacher, the former Maple Leaf hockey star. Their friendship goes back a long way, to the late '20s, and Conacher has often been a guest of Crosby's on hunting trips in Mexico and Baja California.

While he was staying with Conacher, Bing went out in the Ontario countryside for some pheasant shooting and later attended Woodbine race-track for the Canadian Championship, where he caught up with another old friend, jockey Johnny Longden (riding the Canadian-bred George Royal). In the course of a casual conversation with Fletcher Markle for *Telescope*, Bing had a lot of things to say about his association with Canada. High up among all the sports activities Bing enjoys is horse-racing, which is also a part of his close relationship with Canada. Along with Max Bell, the Calgary publisher, and Frank McMahan, the Vancouver oilman, he is part-owner of the Irish Derby winner, Meadow Court.

On *Telescope* this week Bing talks to Fletcher Markle about his trips to Canada and his favorite songs from the various periods of his career in clubs, radio, and films. "We lived in the State of Washington, in Spokane," says Bing, "and my father used to take me fishing up in Trail, British Columbia, and Penticton and that's when I first got to know Canada and Canadians. Then I got into show business and I was on tour a lot and played Vancouver, Toronto, Montreal. I never played Quebec, but in later years through my interest in hunting and fishing I was able to visit and spend some time in Quebec salmon fishing. I visited Montreal many times to play golf, exhibition matches at a club in the Laurentians. I've played golf in Vancouver and baseball in Medicine Hat, that's going back to when I was in college. Then I went to Jasper Park to make the film *Emperor Waltz*, spent two delightful months up there, and participated in the Jasper Park Totem Pole Tournament a couple of times — won it once and came second once."

Bing's visit to Canada is illustrated on *Telescope* with stills from some of his earlier trips and film clips of the crooner with his old friend Bob Hope, playing a golf match. Peter Kelly, producer of *Telescope*, directed this edition. Thom Benson is the executive producer of the series.

The Wonderful World of Golf

THE WONDERFUL World of Golf (telecast Sundays at 4:00 p.m.) returns to CBC tv January 9th with a new 11-week series of matches between some of the world's top golfers, competing on many of the greatest courses in the world.

This year's round-the-world trip begins at Panama City, where Mike Souchak and Chi-Chi Rodriguez tee off at the Club de Golf de Panama. Following this match the series visits the Oslo Golf Klubb, Oslo, Norway; The Country Club, Brookline, Mass.; the Royal Selangor Golf Club, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia; the Royal Ottawa Golf Club, Ottawa; the Club de Campo, Madrid, Spain; the Eisenhower Golf Course, Colorado Springs, U.S.A.; the Turnberry Golf Course, Ayr-

shire, Scotland; the Valley Golf Course, Manila, Philippines; the Glyfada Golf Club, Athens, Greece; and the Ibaraki Country Club, Osaka, Japan.

Host and commentator for the series is Gene Sarazen, twice the National Open Champion, three times the PGA title-holder, and a frequent winner of many of the major tournaments throughout the world, including the Masters and the British Open. With Sarazen as co-commentator is George Rogers, himself a low-handicap golfer, who has been with the series since its inception in 1960.

Following each match the players offer tips on technique, demonstrating their points in slow-motion photography.

'Danger Man' Back on CBC tv

LARGELY THROUGH the international success of the series *Danger Man*, in which he plays an imperturbable and resourceful secret agent, Patrick McGoohan is now Britain's highest-paid television actor. He has also been named, by the Clothing Manufacturers' Federation, one of the top three best-dressed men there.

But I don't believe that sex should be introduced into plays — whether for television, the theatre, or the cinema — just for its own sake."

Jordan: Surrounded by Bad Neighbors

SURROUNDED ON all sides by enemies — Syria in the north, Iraq in the east, Saudi Arabia in the south, and Israel in the west — King Hussein of Jordan has had a sometimes perilous 12-year reign. The lone survivor among the British-backed Hashemite kings, Hussein ibn Talal has had formidable problems to face for such a young ruler (he was only 18 when he came to power after his father, King Talal, was deposed by Parliament). The chief anomaly in his position is that for their own various reasons each of the countries encircling Jordan prefers Hussein, for the time being at any rate, to "interested" powers like the United States, the Soviet Union, Great Britain, and Nasser's United Arab Republic.

Hussein is a constitutional monarch who was educated in Alexandria (Victoria College) and in Britain (Harrow and the Royal Military Academy at Sandhurst) and is married to an English girl.

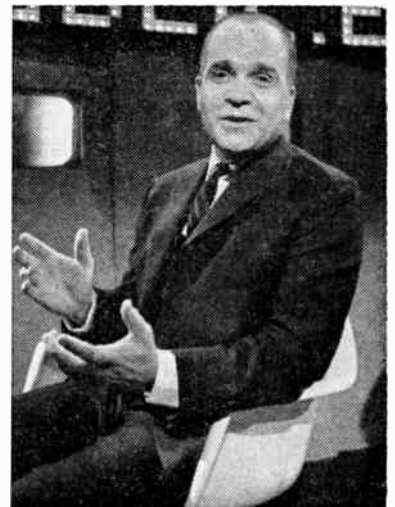

Seaway script writers, Lindsay Galloway, wandered into the studios. To his bewilderment he was grabbed and ushered without ceremony into Miss Samuels' office and asked for his opinion on the script possibilities of some on-the-scene film. He felt that they were excellent. Within seven minutes of his arrival he and Miss Samuels were in a car dashing to the fire 10 miles away, and a water taxi had been ordered to meet them at Pier 11. Luckily the car had a radio, because a message was relayed to them enroute that Pier 11 had been closed to traffic and that the disaster ship was being towed out of the harbor. They picked up the cameraman who had shot footage in the harbor, commandeered a water taxi at

another pier, and were able to film the burning ship being towed away, getting a total of 2,000 feet of dramatic film.

Galloway, author of most of the *Forest Ranger* films on tv, lost no time in working out the plot line for a *Seaway* script, and was commissioned to write *Trial by Fire*, which will be seen on CBC tv's *Seaway* this Thursday, January 13th. It's about a ship from Alexandria with a cargo of cotton which bursts into flame in Toronto harbor. Investigation reveals that the crew is extremely hostile to the new captain, who had been appointed at sea after the former captain's death. Stephen Young appears as Nick King and Austin Willis as Admiral Fox, with special guest star Jeremy Slate, well-known American film, tv and stage performer, as Captain Kerr.

ACT 1. The Polka, a miner's saloon and dance-hall. Nick the bartender is telling the miners that Minnie is partial to him. The miners join in a song of home with Jake Wallace, and Larkens, completely overcome, begins to sob. Ashby enters boasting that he will soon catch Ramerrez. The miners then drink a toast to Minnie. Sonora insults Rance and there is a scuffle. Minnie enters and the miners leave and she is left alone with Rance who attempts to make love to her. A stranger enters who calls himself Dick Johnson from Sacramento. It is obvious that Minnie has known him from a previous encounter. Jealously, Rance demands to know Johnson's business when Castro is brought in about to be hung and offers to show the men Ramerrez's hiding place. He manages to get a word with Johnson about a certain signal and all the miners join in the hunt. Minnie, left alone with Johnson, confides that in him she finds something which helps and makes her happy. He explains this feeling as love, and proclaims that he has the same emotions. Minnie invites him to come to see her later at her cabin.

ACT II. Minnie's cabin one hour later. During a heavy snow storm Johnson arrives at the cabin. Wowkle the squaw is present with her papoose. Johnson declares passionately that he will never leave Minnie. She is thoroughly convinced, and gives him her bed, and lying down before the fire, prays. Rance enters with the miners to tell her that they have tracked Ramerrez to her cabin. She hides Johnson behind the bed curtains and tells Rance that he is not there and they depart. She is contemptuous of Johnson and orders him to leave. He has betrayed her trust and robbed her of her first kiss. As he leaves there is a pistol shot and the sound of a fall. Johnson re-enters and Minnie helps him up a ladder and into the loft. Rance returns to arrest Johnson as Ramerrez. Again she denies that he is there and he seizes her in his arms but she attacks him with a bottle. From the loft, drops of blood reveal the hiding place of Johnson, who descends and faints. A poker game is played between Minnie and Rance, the stakes of which are to be hers and Johnson's freedom against her marriage with Rance, and Johnson's surrender. They begin to play with feverish haste, deciding upon the best two hands out of three. Minnie wheedles Rance, and pretends that she is faint. While he is looking for whisky to revive her, she stacks the cards from her stocking and thus wins the game. Rance in a rage, gets up and goes out. Minnie laughing wildly throws her arms around her lover.

Project '66:

Interview with William L. Shirer

LAST WEEK radio's *Project '66* presented a program by Tony Thomas which recalled the period in Europe from the First World War up to the end of the Second. The program this week is also by Tony Thomas and deals with one of the great reporters of the European scene and specifically Germany prior to the Second World War and during the early years of the war — William L. Shirer.

Based on his experiences as a correspondent in Berlin from 1934 to 1940 (both for newspapers and the Columbia Broadcasting System), he wrote *Berlin Diary*, which rapidly became a best-seller when it was issued in 1941. Today he is probably best-known for the massive *Rise and Fall of the Third Reich*, also a best-seller a few years ago.

After he graduated from college in the United States, Shirer worked his way to Europe aboard a cattleboat out of Montreal. In Paris he joined the staff of the overseas edition of the *Chicago Tribune* and later went to Afghanistan and India, where he had a long associa-

tion with Gandhi. He was living in Spain when the Spanish Civil War broke out and a year later, 1937, when CBS was looking around for a Berlin correspondent, he was recommended as one of the shrewdest observers on the continent.

Thereafter he witnessed at close quarters some of the momentous events in recent history — the storming by Fascists of the Chamber of Deputies in the Place de la Concorde, Paris; the occupation of the Rhineland by German troops; the invasion of Austria; the crisis at Munich; the fall of Poland, Norway, Denmark, Holland and Belgium. And at Compiègne he broadcast the signing of the 1940 truce when France fell.

Shirer was interviewed for *Project '66* at his home near Torrington, Connecticut, by Tony Thomas. Included on the program will be excerpts from some of Shirer's wartime broadcasts, and a personal tribute to him by a distinguished colleague, news commentator Howard K. Smith.

spond by giving back this notion in spades. But we have found them extremely reliable when you show you have confidence in them. They've incredibly well informed, and quite idealistic — so much so that on the program we have to parallel their ideas with some down-to-earth, practical guests who know how to balance idealism with objectivity."

Director of music and variety for the series is Neil Andrews, and Herb Roland is drama director. Joan Soloviov is script editor, and the title song is written and sung by Jim Pirie. Co-hosts for the series are Janet McQuillin, who graduated from the University of Toronto last spring with a B.A. in sociology, and Paul Saltzman, who is part way through a course in engineering physics at the U. of T., both of whom have many interests and a great zest for enjoying life.

In the first show, jazz drummer and teacher Ed Thigpen (a former member of the Oscar Peterson Trio) talks about his theory of

'disciplined freedom' in music, and illustrates it with percussion accompaniment to a Mack Sennett comedy film, and with a drum interpretation of the Beatles' hit, *A Hard Day's Night*. Aaron Charloff, a young Winnipeg composer, conducts the Toronto Chamber Orchestra in a performance of four of his own compositions, to one of which, *Dance Suite*, Brian Foley and Dawn Covier improvise a dance. The Mark IIs, a new folk-song group led by singer-composer Mark Stone, sing *A Land of Good and Plenty*, *Wall of Iron*, and *I Dream* (which Stone wrote especially for this show).

achieved, I believe, to remove many of the barriers that exist between the king and the people. I live with them. I spend most of my time with them, as one of them," he said in an interview. "I move freely about in the country, I spend quite a portion of my time studying their conditions, learning of their needs. A normal day in my life would begin around eight, by either going to my office or some section or part of the government to see how work is being done, without being announced. In my work at the office I meet anyone who likes to come and see me, no matter what walk of life he's in, to see what I can do to help him. If I have free time in the afternoon I either go flying with other pilots in the Royal Jordanian Air Force or go to visit some units. I spend in Jordan quite a bit of time in schools, with students that are a great hope for us for a better future."

Stravinsky Work Premiered Sunday

ON RADIO'S *Concerts from Two Worlds* on Sunday, January 9th, at 3:00 p.m. CST/9:00 p.m. MST, the Toronto Symphony Orchestra will present the première of the latest work by Igor Stravinsky, one of the dominant figures in 20th-century music. Only two minutes long, a crystallization of this brilliant man's 83-year-old talent, it is titled *Canon on An Old Russian Folk Song*, and was written just a few weeks ago. It will be conducted by Stravinsky's musical associate, Robert Craft, a distinguished American conductor, lecturer, essayist and author, and one of the foremost interpreters of the music of Schoenberg, Berg, Webern and their successors. He has been associated with Stravinsky since 1948, taking over many arduous duties to free the composer for other work, and conducting important Stravinsky concerts in the way the composer intended his works to be interpreted.

The January 9th concert will include two Canadian broadcast premières of other Stravinsky works: the early *Symphony in E Flat*, and the *Variations for Orchestra*; and it also includes the *Altenberg Lieder*, five songs for voice and orchestra (1910) by Alban Berg. These are based on picture-postcard texts by Peter Altenberg, a Viennese poet who used to dash off pithy remarks to his friends on postcards from time to time. They will be sung by soprano Elizabeth Benson Guy.

Spoerly's latest original drama, *The Elusive Angel*, will be presented on *CBC Tuesday Night*, January 11th, at 8.05, in a production by Peter Donkin in the Halifax studios. The question it asks — whether to die a hero or live as a coward — concerns several people who meet in a cell: Paul, a political prisoner due for execution next day; Red, a practical sailor; a brutish turnkey; a mysterious professor who is seeking after truth; and Maria, representing love. As they talk, they begin to question their motives and ideals. On the surface these appear straightforward, but on closer scrutiny they turn out to be quite different. Explains Spoerly: "We all exist on two levels of reality, established by what we say and think we think, and by what we really are." The cast includes Bill Fulton as the turnkey and as Red; David Renton as Paul; Gavin Douglas as the professor; and Joan Gregson as Maria.

On Sunday, January 9th, *CBC Stage* will present a repeat performance of *I Am Talking To My Friends*, a series of conversations between Michéal Mac Liammoir and John Hobday in London, England, which were first heard on *CBC Tuesday Night*, October 3rd.

Mac Liammoir, who was born in Cork in 1899, describes his world-famous voice as "very rich, rather mannered Christmas pudding made audible." The public first heard it when his stage career was launched in 1911, after a friend of his father's had peeked through a crack in the Mac Liammoir kitchen door, had seen young Michéal dressing up, and had remarked "Oh there's money in that boy." Noël Coward made his debut in the same production, *Goldfish*. Mac Liammoir recalls him as "a very pugnacious child, and I was a cry-baby, so you can imagine the result." After considerable success as a child actor Mac Liammoir left the stage to study painting at the Slade School, then returned to acting at 18. After an appearance in London he went back to Ireland to paint and design for the Irish Theatre and the Dublin Drama League for three years. Then for six years he studied

painting abroad, returning to Ireland in 1927 to act with the Anew McMaster Company. The following year he opened the Galway Gaelic Theatre, where he produced 20 plays, and established the Dublin Gate Theatre with Hilton Edwards. He has produced, acted in or designed hundreds of productions for this famous theatre. He has also continued to perform in London and on Broadway, sometimes in his own plays.

A few years ago he toured Britain and North America in a one-man production called *The Importance of Being Oscar*, a series of readings from Wilde's work, which was tremendously successful.

On Wednesday night, January 12th, *Midweek Theatre* presents J. B. Priestley's *An Inspector Calls*, adapted by Otto Lowy and directed in the Vancouver studios by Gerald Newman. A mystery drama set in England in the mid-1930s, it deals with the members of an upper middle class family who are celebrating the daughter's engagement to the son of a business rival. During dinner they are visited by a police inspector who has called to question them about the violent death of a young girl. On the surface the incident seems to have nothing to do with any of them, but as the plot unfolds it becomes apparent that each member of the family is involved. — *June Graham*

familiar music. His first album *I Love Paris*, became one of the all-time best-sellers — he said he arranged it to prove that hit records don't have to contain "musical garbage." Since then he has put his imaginative, exhilarating stamp on a wide variety of music, from the classics through pop music to jazz, frequently annoying traditionalists with his impish debunking of musical stuffiness.

Introducing Michel Legrand will be followed, at 10:30 by *Heritage*, a half-hour poetic study of the big-city Negro based on writings by American lyric poet Countee Cullen, who died in 1946 at the age of 42, and who wrote with sensitivity and understanding of the Negro's loneliness in the asphalt jungle, and of his thoughts about his African heritage. His poetry will be presented with music by Moe Koffman and dances created by Charlotte de Neve. Mel Scott plays the man, and his thoughts are spoken by Percy Rodriguez. The dancers are Beth Harry, Al Harris, and Ola and Marianne Skanks. Sets are by Murray Laufer. Production and the adaptation of Cullen's work by Leon Orenstein.

Cullen wrote in conventional, precisely metred style, but, as fellow poet James Weldon Johnson observed, "The old forms come from his hands filled with fresh beauty." Born in New York City, the son of a clergyman, he won a national poetry contest while still in his teens, with his *I Have a Rendezvous With Life*. A graduate of New York University, he received his master's degree in English literature from Harvard, edited a Negro magazine for two years, studied abroad for two years on a Guggenheim fellowship, then returned to the U.S. to teach. At intervals collections of his poetry were published, and he wrote a novel about Harlem life, *One Way to Heaven*, and a play, *St. Louis Woman*. "Most things I write I do for the sheer love of the music in them," he once said. "Somehow I find my poetry of itself treating of the Negro, of his joys and sorrows — mostly of the latter — and of the heights and depths of emotion I feel as a Negro."

John Drainie:

Man of Many Voices — and Faces

WILL THE real John Drainie please stand up? Sometimes he does—for instance, when he is a commentator for a Toronto Symphony Orchestra performance, as he was recently. Or when he serves as narrator for a National Film Board production or a CBC documentary, as he does frequently. But most often this versatile Canadian actor cloaks himself in such a bewildering array of disguises, so successfully, that the real John Drainie is nowhere in evidence.

Drainie's virtuoso versatility is currently being demonstrated on CBC radio in the series, *Stories with John Drainie*, heard at 1:45 p.m. Monday through Friday. This series of stories by Canadian writers, now in its seventh year, allows Drainie, as story-teller, to use a variety of dialects he has perfected over 27 years as a CBC performer.

During those seven years, about 1,400 stories have been broadcast "The supply from writers all over Canada seems to be endless," says Drainie. "Our 1,400 stories were selected from 7,600 submissions. One of the main reasons for the show's existence is to encourage new writers in Canada. It is very gratifying to see raw beginners develop—under the wise and helpful guidance of our script editor, Dorothy Needles—into professional writers who are capable of branching out into other writing fields after one or two years with this series."

John Drainie was born in Vancouver in 1916 and studied acting and playwriting in Vancouver and Hollywood. He began his stage and radio career in the mid-thirties. In 1943 he moved to Toronto and became a leading actor in the famous radio *Stage* series. Radio listeners still remember his *Jake and the Kid* programs, which were a Canadian institution for six years.

The tall, compactly built actor sports a reddish moustache, has hazel eyes and brown hair. He

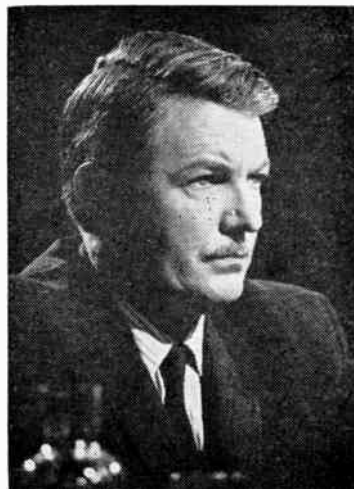
lists his hobbies as chess, golf, sculpture and, inevitably, Stephen Leacock.

His interest in Leacock began 20 years ago when he started his adaptations of Leacock's works and was appalled to find the Canadian author was almost unknown in his own country, although Leacock's works were familiar to millions throughout the rest of the world.

Drainie first appeared as Leacock in the 1950s in a tv series based on *Sunshine Sketches of a Little Town*. Leacock, courtesy of John Drainie, is currently touring Ontario high schools and colleges delivering a series of lectures and thereby ensuring that the Canadian humorist's legend lives on.

Though "getting in a rut" should be the least of his worries, Drainie is always ready to try something new. This willingness to experiment resulted in Canadian viewers hearing him sing for the first time in a 1956, 90-minute tv musical production of *Anne of Green Gables*. He also gave a standout solo performance in Dostoevsky's *Dream of a Ridiculous Man*, on *Camera Three* in the U.S.

And *Stories with John Drainie* continues to add many new voices to John Drainie's still-expanding repertoire.
