History proves that direct official condemnation by Popes has often

aggravated rather than helped in the plight of victims of despotic rulers. One example of this was the enforcement of the penal laws in England, Ireland and Scotland.

Truth and justice should be the hallmark of historical presentations for public viewing.

YOU, TOO can be a television performer — if you live in one of 13 Manitoba towns to be visited soon by CBC singing star Reg Gibson, announcer Ken Dunstan and a CBC video-tape production crew.

Vacation Time, the summertime network show for young people seen daily on CBC-TV beginning July 4th and coming from various centres across Canada, will have the subtitle *Summer Singalong* when it originates from Manitoba Mondays and Thursdays. The programs will be taped in 13 Manitoba towns, beginning June 12th. Reg Gibson, as a modern version of the touring (by jeep) troubadour, will entertain personally on the main street of each community, meeting the townsfolk and, with Ken Dunstan, touring the points of interest. They will report something of the town's past and describe what's happening in the present. An original song will be sung about each town visited.

Here are the places to be visited, and the dates: Beause-

jour, June 12th; Stonewall, June 17th; Selkirk, June 18th; Lorette, June 25th; Minnedosa, July 5th; Neepawa, July 6th; Carberry, July 7th; Starbuck, July 16th; Headingly, July 22nd; Gilbert Plains, July 26th; Dauphin, July 27th; Ste. Rose du Lac, July 28th; and the City of St. Boniface, August 2nd.

The above dates indicate only the time at which the visits will be taped. Telecast dates will be announced later. Rudy Gijzen is the producer of *Vacation Time: Summer Singalong*.

The Hectic World of Max Ferguson

A look at how CBC radio's master of satire puts together his daily program is presented Wednesday, June 15th at 10:30 p.m. on CBC-TV.

MONDAY to Friday, the day begins at 5:00 a.m. for Max Ferguson. That's when he leaves home and drives to work at the downtown Toronto studios of CBC. On the way down he picks up his breakfast—a carton of coffee—and his script, the morning paper. This is the only script anyone connected with his morning radio show will ever see. Somewhere in the daily paper is something that over the next two hours will be transformed into a very funny radio program — the

Max Ferguson Show.

How does he do it? To find out, a camera crew followed him around one morning for this week's *NFB Presents* program, *Max In the Morning*. This is the fourth year that Max has been doing this kind of morning show, and he will soon be celebrating his 20th anniversary on CBC radio. For most of his career on the air, about 15 years, he was best-known as "Rawhide," the crusty character with a Western drawl. Although Rawhide became one

of the most popular characters on CBC radio, Max eventually decided to let him just fade away before everyone got tired of him.

Rawhide was born the year that Max Ferguson first started on CBC radio, in 1947. That year, just after Max had graduated with an arts degree from the University of Western Ontario, he joined CBC Halifax as an announcer and disc-jockey. One of his assignments was a program of Western music and, instead

IT'S A SQUARE WORLD

MICHAEL BENTINE is a Peruvian-Englishman, Old Etonian, founder-member of the Goons, and perpetrator of a television series, new to Canadian audiences called *It's A Square World* (Thursdays at 7:30 p.m., CBC-TV). In this series Bentine goes after the stories that somehow seem to escape the attention of most of the world's press — the great British Nannies' pram race, for instance; Sherwood Forest taken over by impoverished businessmen; a new search for the Great White Whale; and interviews with Britons who are doing their bit to help the export drive,

such as the Englishman selling cricket gear in vampire-ridden Transylvania. *It's A Square World* also reports on what's happening in the world of sports — from the old English games like nurdling and boggiting to the Japanese art of Digitsu, or finger defence.

Bentine is famous in Britain for his Common Market lecture ("widely recognized as having done more than anything else to confuse the issue") and films showing the defence of Britain's coasts against marauding tourists and the dive-bombing of the infamous Kamikaze beetle which attacks miniature gardens. He is also the author of the West End revue *Don't Shoot — We're English*.

In the weeks ahead *It's A Square World* will illuminate those areas of life which have remained a mystery to most people — how, for example, does a noise exterminator go about his work? What happens if you take a piggy-bank into a real bank? What does an ornithologist do on finding a monster egg on a mountain top? Who is the master unsuccessful criminal known as The Brain?

The remarkable life-story of the man responsible for CBC's drama production has all the ups, downs and twists to make a good drama itself.

PEOPLE ARE usually stunned the first time they see Esse Ljungh at work in a studio. His honest enthusiasm, backed by an excellent education and complete mastery of all the theatrical graces, is like an electric current that turns everyone on. The whole show is reflected on his mobile, well-lived-in face, every nuance of idea or emotion in the script. He actually lives each joy, terror, frustration or broken temper his cast experiences, and in doing so, draws from them better performances than they could otherwise give. His rehearsals are lessons in the fine art of dramatic expression that would do justice to the world's leading theatre schools.

For some, with more vanity than talent, perhaps, the strain is too much, but one at

least of them admits that Ljungh "has a wonderful gift for setting a character for you with a word or gesture. You know at once exactly how he wants you to do it." His faculty for pantomime is highly developed. He paces about the studio, grimaces, roars with laughter, wrings his hands, reacts to everything, but always in the correct mood, never excessively serious or funny, and always with the utmost courtesy. No matter how well he and his cast know one another, they are all addressed as Mr. or Miss. Tommy Tweed pointed this out to us. He has known and worked with Ljungh since 1934, and considers him "something of a genius, tops in his line, who makes all his background work for him. I've seen him show a young operator how to do the technically impossible."

"You play up to Esse's standards or you don't play at all," says an actress who has performed in many of his dramas. "He will never compromise with perfection." He has even fried sausages during a show to tantalize his players into giving the exactly right effect in a kitchen or cafe scene.

"I say to them don't make your lines ring,"

Ljungh tells us. "We're not putting on a display or pageant—speak them as you would in your own home. Look around you. How do people move, react, how do their faces work, what do they think about when they're in a situation? Give me your heart on a platter, cry with me, live with me, bleed with me. Act from the heart, not from the head. But I can't take the credit for a good performance. I only help to bring out what's there." Many performers tell us that "a word of praise or gratitude from him after the show is better than a dozen curtain-calls."

From time to time, such as this spring in the Central Ontario Drama Festival, he is asked to adjudicate, and his wit and practical, well-thought-out advice, always much more than is required from him, makes the evening a memorable one. But many, such as Toronto critic Nathan Cohen, feel that the Canadian legitimate theatre is missing an invaluable thing by not making greater use of his directorial talents, his great knowledge of theatrical literature, and his uncanny knack for polishing fine performances into brilliant ones.

SEAWAY: Gunpowder and Paint

A two-part episode of TV's adventure series posed interesting challenges to production crews that filmed it.

TORONTO ARTIST Jack McAdam, who has been art director for the last 13 shows in the *Seaway* series, says he had the most fun to date in designing for *Seaway's* second two-part drama, *Gunpowder and Paint*, to be seen on June 16th and 23rd. "It was shot in 35 mm color," he tells us, "and that immediately brought in extra values. Color co-ordination on a two-hour show has to be stimulating, but you have to be aware of contrasts, too. We went out on a limb in many sets and tried a very abstract approach. For an ordinary bar scene we designed a revolving carousel with walls painted in a sky effect and lots of helium-filled balloons around. For a morgue scene we changed to grey tones and built a set filled with seemingly endless corridors, giving a creepy feeling of being underground. An apartment belonging to an artist character in the play became vault-like, all arches and no windows, in stunning colors.

The pop art scenes were part of an exhibition we shot in a house in Toronto's Rosedale district. It was a challenge to have to do collages that were supposed to be the work of another artist — the one in the play. I examined her role in the script and then decided what kind of pop art this kind of woman would go in for."

McAdam is co-partner (with John Holmes) of a new firm which provides completely finished, propped, set-up and lit sets for theatre, ballet, opera, films and commercials. Before opening his own production house, in an old stable, McAdam worked at the CBC for 10 years, beginning as a scenic artist and eventually becoming a full designer.

The woman artist in *Gunpowder and Paint* is played by Ulla Moreland, one of Toronto's best-known models, who came to Canada from Sweden six years ago, speaking no English. She had trained at the Swedish Royal Dramatic Academy and had played a variety of stage and film roles in Sweden, but had to give up her career in this country until she learned the language. In the meantime she turned to modelling.

Gunpowder and Paint begins on a dock in Cleveland, where a nun, a familiar figure who collects donations from ships' crews, is accidentally killed by a loading truck. Quantities of heroin are found in her purse, the first clue to a big drug ring operating between the U.S. and Canada. Grainger of Central American Intelligence, played by Gordon Pinsent, is sent to Canada to help break the ring, with the aid of Admiral Fox of the Seaway Authority (played by Austin Willis), and Shippers' Agent Nick King (played by Stephen Young). Other guest-starring roles are played by Harold J. Stone, well-known American actor, and Toronto actress Anne Collings.

ANNE BANCROFT spent a good many years in Hollywood being wasted in minor roles (usually as a gangster's moll) before her potential as a dramatic actress of considerable talent was recognized. Even then, in the mid-50s, it was a television producer, Fred Coe, a television director, Arthur Penn, and a hitherto un-produced playwright, William Gibson, who first saw in her the qualities that Hollywood later acknowledged with the award of an Oscar. Coe, Penn, and Gibson were looking for someone very special to portray Gittel Mosca, the kooky heroine of the two-character Broadway play *Two for the Seesaw*. The moment Anne Bancroft walked into Coe's office and opened her mouth (like Gittel, Miss Bancroft is from the Bronx) they knew she was "Gittel on the hoof." The success of that play started a whole new career for Anne Bancroft, but when Hollywood adapted it for the screen, someone else (Shirley MacLaine) got the part of Gittel. It was therefore, somewhat ironic that a few years later Anne Bancroft received the Best Actress Award for her work in this week's selection on *Great Movies* (Saturday, June 11th at 8:30 p.m.), *The Miracle Worker*. Starring with Miss Bancroft in this true story of the young Helen Keller are Patty Duke, Victor Jory, and Inga Swenson. Patty Duke plays the blind and deaf Helen Keller, Anne Bancroft is Annie Sullivan, the nurse whose dedication helped Helen Keller overcome her disabilities. The film is based on William Gibson's television and Broadway play of the same title.

The story of how blind deaf-mute Helen Keller was taught to overcome her handicap is told on GREAT MOVIES.

of doing it straight, Max slipped into the drawl that was to become so famous in Canada. Literally thousands of letters were received after that broadcast, requesting more appearances by Old Rawhide. For the next two years the character was a regular feature of CBC Halifax, then Max transferred to Toronto and Rawhide became a national figure.

From time to time Max returned to the Maritimes, once to host a nightly television program (*Gazette*) and on another occasion to take part in a performance of *Peter and the Wolf*, in a concert given by the Halifax Symphony Orchestra. Aside from his radio work, he has frequently appeared on television in variety programs and was co-host with Gwen Grant of the afternoon series *Open House*.

The *Max Ferguson Show*, which is broadcast live to the Maritimes at 7:35 a.m. Toronto time and recorded for broadcast at 8:35 a.m. to other parts of the country, is unique on CBC radio. Completely spontaneous,

it goes on the air without any rehearsal and without a line of Max's skits written down and committed to memory. Often he doesn't know how a skit will end or even how many characters will be involved. Between 5:30 a.m. and the time the show goes on the air he sits alone in an office poring over the newspaper, trying out in his mind what news items of the day will lend themselves to a comedy sketch, what kind of sound effects will be needed, how many different voices he will have to assume. Much of the success of the show depends on the sound-effects men, who often have to anticipate Max. He gives them a rough idea of what's needed before the show, but once it's underway it becomes a kind of catch-as-catch-can.

Max In the Morning (to be telecast this Wednesday, June 15th at 10:30 p.m.) was produced and directed by David Bairstow and photographed by Roger Racine.

Says Young Playwright:

'There's No Shortage of Playwrights'

WHEN PATRICK McDougall isn't turning out plays, he's a CBC announcer. When he isn't announcing he's airing devil-take-the-hindmost opinions about the 'fantastically frustrating business' of being a dramatist.

As a brash 18-year-old, Pat McDougall got into radio because of his propensity for expressing strong views. "I had no radio background at the time," he recalls. "I was doing a weekly record column for a Winnipeg newspaper. One night, listening to a CBC jazz program from Winnipeg, I thought it so bad that I wrote a stinging letter of criticism to the station. As a result, I got called in and was introduced to the program director. You've said some very damaging things about this program," he told me, "Could you do better?" I screwed up my courage and said, 'Sure I could.' Next thing, I found myself doing a jazz program on CBC radio."

The talented young announcer-playwright's new drama, *The Powder Blue Overcoat*, will be heard on CBC radio's *Midweek Theatre* on Wednesday, June 15th, at 9:00 p.m. With production by Rupert Caplan, the three-star cast is composed of Budd Knapp, John Codner and Eileen Clifford. In this fast-paced comedy about an elderly couple whose marriage has broken up, when the wife advertises her husband's blue overcoat for sale, it turns out to be the key to understanding what held them together for 31 explosive years of marriage.

A native of St. Boniface, Patrick McDougall got his first encouragement in the playwriting field through winning a one-act play competition in Alberta in 1964. The current *Midweek Theatre* production marks his CBC radio debut as a playwright, but earlier this season, a McDougall drama was produced in Mont-

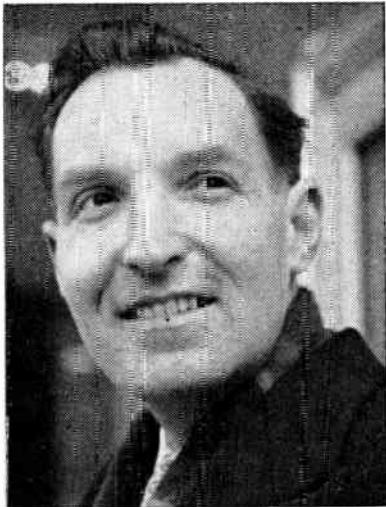

real in the CBC-TV *Shoestring Theatre* series. As a playwright, his record would seem good to the average person. Is he patting himself on the back?

“I suppose I should keep saying to myself, God has been good to me! But what I've had produced doesn't seem like much when I look back on ten years of writing drama and a good-sized cardboard box filled with rejected TV plays.”

Asked if it helped to be a CBC employee, his answer is an emphatic “No help at all.” As he points out, he probably has less to do with producers than freelance writers. “After all, the TV producers don't even work

in the same building as me. And since I've not been in Montreal long, I haven't had much chance to know the radio producers on the professional level.

“Sitting out on the Prairies where I wrote most of my plays, people like Rupert Caplan, Budd Knapp and Neil Chotem weren't real, they were *names*. I never dreamed I'd be working with them some day.” The young Westerner grins. “When I met Budd Knapp, I told him he was one of my folk heroes.”

In McDougall's opinion, a dramatist is always shooting in the dark. “The wildest darn things happen,” he sighs. He vividly recalls one TV play which he wrote about a young Ontario lawyer who decides to run for parliament. It was sent to a Toronto producer, and the worst possible happened: it was lost!

“Although I had a carbon copy, I was so discouraged that I didn't write again for three years,” he says. “When I got going again last Spring, I sent that same play to Toronto and a most encouraging letter came back. My play was in the hands of Ron Weyman and I was urged to ‘keep my fingers crossed.’ Then came another letter. Sorry too much like something being done for *The Serial*.” McDougall shrugs philosophically. “When I saw *Mr. Member of Parliament* last winter, I knew what they meant.

“It's a discouraging business,” he says with a quizzical grin. “It's hard not to get neurotic at times, and feel you're being victimized.”

His biggest beef is about producers who sound off about the scarcity of Canadian playwrights who can do a professional job. “I wish these producers would do me a special favor. I don't mind them demolishing my plays; that may be their function. But I wish they'd stop telling the press that there's a terrific shortage of good Canadian playwrights. I happen to know that's not true.”

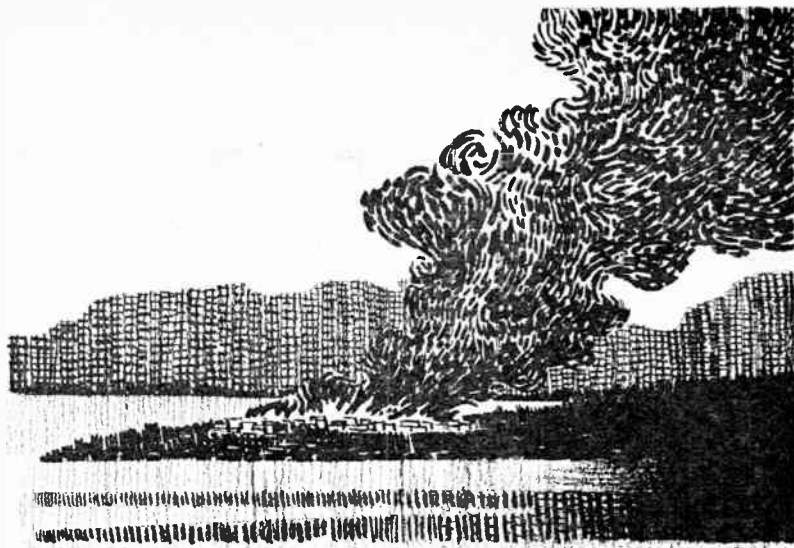

The Big Vancouver Fire

SUNDAY, June 13th, 1886 dawned soft and warm in the small town of Vancouver. By mid-morning, it was clear this was to be another hot and sultry day like the others since May 26th, the last time rain had fallen.

The city's population of between two and three thousand people went about their usual Sunday routines. Some went to church, others stayed late-a-bed, a few wandered around the town.

Just to the west of the built-up area, in what is now the heart of downtown Vancouver, crews were at work clearing the timberlands on a 6,000-acre townsite owned by the CPR. The

men sawed row after row of closely packed trees half way through and felled other forest giants against them. Scores of trees were smashed down in this bowling pin method of clearing and left one massive conglomeration of splintered tree trunks, branches, snagged-tooth stumps and undergrowth. Other crews were building roads to the site of the first Hotel Vancouver.

Just after lunchtime, at about 1:45 p.m., a gale wind sprang up and whipped across the area being cleared, fanning into roaring fires the slash being burned. Sparks showered down on the townsite and ignited the tinder-dry logs and stumps and branches.

Within 30 to 45 minutes, the flames engulfed the city, destroyed anywhere from 500 to 750 business blocks and homes and, as accurately as can be determined in the absence of any official records, killed seven people.

The story of "The Great Fire" or "The Big Fire" as it was called, will be told in a special documentary *Black Sunday in Gastown*, broadcast over CBC's national radio network on the 80th anniversary of the event, Monday, June 13th at 8:03 p.m.

"Newcomers are usually terrified the first time they do a show with Esse," Tweed says. "But he always gives them special, thoughtful care — he's punctilious about this — and praise when they deserve it." Even long-experienced performers find that Ljungh can make them take a fresh look at themselves when they're beginning to go stale. "When an actor is in the slumps I try to rebuild his sense of confidence," Ljungh explained when we asked him about this. "I remind him of the debt he owes his profession. He must not betray his faith in himself, or the public's or rob his audience of the full fruits of his talent. Talent is a gift of God, I tell them. You must use it, and use it well. That's what the Old Boy would want. Radio drama isn't play acting. It's re-living people."

And he has met a great variety of those people. He was born in Malmo, Sweden, the son of an attorney-general of the province, who was determined that his son should become a lawyer, too; he would have made a magnificently persuasive one, for he can charm the birds off the trees. But, as early as age nine, he had other ideas. When a touring company brought *Hamlet* to town, he was so smitten by the theatre that he wrote a play and had it produced. When he was 16 he poked around a 17th-century church library and found a drama called *The Prodigal Son*, based on the Bible story, hand-written on parchment by an archbishop in 1616. He copied it out, bringing some ancient words up to date, directed a production by teenagers, and played five parts himself. "I often wonder how I had the nerve to do it," he recalls. "But the play was taken on a tour of the province and was tremendously well received."

His grandmother was all in

favor of Esse's going into the theatre, but his parents were dead set against it, so to please them he studied philosophy and economics for four years at Upsala University as a prelude to a law degree, but he also enrolled at Sweden's Royal Dramatic Theatre, was one of the most enthusiastic founders of the university drama society, sang in the Upsala Orpheus Choir, in which Jussi Bjoerling was a soloist, played the violin and piano for his own pleasure, and was a ringleader in the undergraduate pranks which the university town endured with Scandinavian stoicism. During the holidays he toured in summer stock. By the time he graduated, the law had lost him to the theatre. He joined a professional company as actor and director—even jazzed the classics by having Hamlet die of a toothache!

In 1927, when he was 23, a bit fed up with his family's low opinion of his chosen profession, and restless to see the world, an old school friend offered him a job as correspondent and translator with a German publishing firm in Chile. (He speaks seven languages.) He accepted, but just as he and his wife were sailing, a cable informed them that a revolution in Chile was nationalizing private industries, and he was advised to go to Canada and await instructions. Two months later the firm closed down operations in South America. Meanwhile, he had to eat, so he volunteered as immigrant labor, and was hired by a Saskatchewan farmer for \$40 a month.

Eventually Ljungh bought a farm of his own, near Radville, Sask., but after a couple of years the Depression forced him off the land into town. He never lost his love of the prairies, though, or his appreciation of

the importance of simplicity, which is the essence of his success. Of course no one is quite the same after he has heard a meadowlark's high song of praise in a sky that goes on forever, walked through acres of furry, mauve crocuses, or seen a wide-screen sunset wrap its opalescent arms around a cluster of elevators and false-fronted shops in a dust bowl and make them beautiful—least of all someone as poetic and empathetic as Ljungh. So he took his deep understanding of the pleasures and perils of the farming life, and the people who choose it, to the place where he could make it pay—Winnipeg, where he edited a Swedish-language newspaper circulated among the farming communities. His princely salary was \$6.50 a week plus groceries. Being Ljungh he

not only wrote and edited, but type-set and made his own linoleum cuts. The paper won several prizes in Sweden.

In 1934 he was sent on a six-week walking trip to Vancouver as a publicity stunt for the Hudson Bay Company, and he did it with a flourish. "I walked nearly all of those 2,000 miles," he says. "Drivers wouldn't pick me up for fear of being robbed and beaten. I slept on the ground and in the rain. For days I never had my clothes off. I paid my way by cutting wood and loading cargo."

One day, back at the newspaper, John Craig, director of the Winnipeg Little Theatre, walked in to place an ad for a production of Ibsen's *A Doll's House*, and they got into a long discussion of Ibsen, which so impressed Craig that he asked Ljungh to give a talk to his theatre group. Before long Ljungh was actively involved with the company. His performance in the title role of Ibsen's *Peer Gynt* is still remembered as one of the most moving portraits the city has ever seen. He taught languages and drama, and was so much in demand that at one time he was simultaneously editing his paper, producing an opera in French, a play in German, and performing in another in English. "For a foreigner like me, still stumbling around in English, to teach Canadians how to speak their own language, seemed to me the height of impertinence," he laughs. "But fortunately the language of the theatre transplants fairly easily." Nowadays his command of English is complete. He's one of the most entertaining conversationalists we have met, has an enormous curiosity about people and things, and is stocked with all sorts of unusual facts and opinions, which sound all the more piquant in his Swedish accent.

In the late 1930s, Winnipeg radio drew most of its performers from the Little Theatre, so it was inevitable that Ljungh should be invited to take part in a play produced by the CBC,

and then another and another—for \$1.50 each. He was so successful a villain or tragedian, so funny a clown, wrote so imaginatively and was so handy with sound effects — he insists that even a door closing can be poetic—that he was soon a radio regular, and eventually directed a series of radio dramas for \$40 each. Such giddy affluence hardly affected him at all. When he had money to spare, he gave it away to someone less fortunate. His youthful nattiness was forgotten, and sometimes he was too busy to shave. Today he's always extremely spruce, but he still favors informal attire — dark plaid shirt, slacks, tweed jacket, but no one can look more elegant in dress clothes. Eventually, the CBC fired him.

Fired or not, he had no intention of leaving radio, so he went over to CKRC, took the only job going, as an operator, and became a first-rate technician. Two years later, when he had become supervisor of production, the CBC realized its loss and hired him back as staff producer. That was in 1942, and he's been winning production awards and honors for the Corporation ever since. He moved to the Toronto studios in 1946, where one of the pleasures was meeting his present charming wife, actress Beth Lockertie. Over the years he has lent his extensive theatrical know-how to the *Stage* series, *CBC Tuesday Night*, school broadcasts, farm dramas, opera, and many special occasions, refusing to take the credit, shying away from publicity like a frisky colt at saddling time. He hardly ever allows it to be mentioned that he has translated or adapted some great play for radio, honing and weeding and making the result a proud tribute to the original author, then bringing it to life in the studio with his own special mastery that warms and inspires or leaves his listeners purged and shaken. He's an extraordinary person, modest and idealistic and broadminded, in the great artistic tradition. —June Graham

Death in the Barren Ground



IN THE summer of 1928 a party of geologists, *en route* from Great Slave Lake to Hudson's Bay by way of the Thelon River, came upon a log cabin about 35 miles below the junction of the Hanbury and Thelon Rivers. No voice answered their greetings, no smoke issued from the chimney, no creature stirred in the underbrush. When the party reached the cabin they saw that the windows were covered with sacking and the glass blown in. Two rifles stood by the door, and on the ground just in front of the door lay two large bundles — the bodies of two men sewn in blankets. Inside was a third body which, in the dark, was accidentally dislodged from the bunk on which it lay and fell to the floor.

The geologists left everything as they found it and reported to the RCMP when they reached Chesterfield Inlet. It was then too late in the year for a search party to go that far north, and further investigation had to wait until spring. Almost a year later Inspector Trundle of the Great Slave Lake Sub-Division of the RCMP, with Corporal Williams and Constables Kirk and Bobblets, entered the cabin.

By then only the skeletons remained, and on top of the stove

a barely legible note that read: "Whoever comes here look in the stove." Buried in the ashes at the bottom of the stove were all the papers, letters, and diaries necessary to identify the remains and tell the tale. They were three Englishmen; the two found outside the cabin were John Hornby, aged about 46, and Harold Adlard, about 28.

The body inside the cabin was the youngest member, Edgar Christian, who was a few days short of his 19th birthday when he died.

All three had died slowly and painfully of privation after spending a year in what explorer Samuel Hearne called "The Barren Ground," the half-million square miles of tundra in North-Western Canada which the Indians call "de-chin-u-le (place of no trees)." Hornby, the leader of the group, had spent most of his life in the Canadian North, the others were making the trip for the first time. Hornby was not an explorer in the strict sense of the word: "... it's living in that country that I'm interested in — not getting to certain places or drawing maps or making scientific observations. . . . My life has been finding out how to eat when there's nothing to eat, finding game where there isn't any. . . ."

The story of John Hornby's last journey has been adapted for radio from the diary of Edgar Christian and will be broadcast Friday on the series *The Human Condition*.

To Interview Mr. 'Average Joe'

If your name has never appeared in the headlines,
Bill McNeil might want to talk with you on his cross-country jaunt.

THIS SUMMER, broadcaster Bill McNeil will spend two months on a 10,000-mile 'cross-country expedition interviewing people who *don't* make the headlines.

McNeil, host of the weekday CBC radio interview series *Assignment*, will hitch a 17-foot trailer to his car on June 29th and begin a trip that will take him from Toronto to Vancouver Island and back — with numerous detours along the way. Accompanying the broadcaster will be his wife Eileen, son Breton, 7, and daughter Dawn Marie, 4.

Purpose of the trip is to tape interviews with "average" Canadians and obtain their views about Canada as the Centennial of Confederation approaches. "After years of interviewing celebrities," says McNeil, "I want to find the people who *don't* make the headlines: the ones who make Canada tick.

"For instance, the West is full of small rodeos where you can talk to real cowboys; wheat farmers who'll tell you what the price of wheat should be and where it should be sold; and old-timers who sit in the sun and love to reminisce."

McNeil says he will visit Indians to get their opinions on bilingualism and biculturalism. He also hopes to tape interviews

with senior citizens about the changes they have seen in Canada over the years.

During the journey McNeil will stop at CBC regional offices to relay taped material to Toronto for broadcast on *Assign-*

ment. This way, listeners will be able to follow the McNeils' progress through the West.

McNeil anticipates two major headaches on the trip: how to back up the trailer; and what to do with the kids when it rains.
