CAMP FISH CREEK, N.W.T., April 30—  
A scout from Prince Albert who has just ar-  
rived reports all well. He heard that the  
rebel has been very busy, and that the  
Indians deserted the Rebels early in the  
night. He says that the Rebels have been  
seen near the camp, but they were  
seen or thirty men in the night, and that  
he and his fellows were further back wait-  
ing to draw us into an ambush. What-  
ever number of Rebels there may have been  
in the night at the outset, the number of  
horses in the ravine gives some idea of the  
number of men who must have been engaged  
in the fight with us, and especially speak-  
ing such words as this. This scout says  
that

**EH Dumont**  
a brother of General's was killed. He is  
probably the man that by Captain Forrest,  
as the description is. The scout confirms  
the report that Albert's man is with Kiel  
and thinks the stores at Ratoc were burned  
on Thursday. A large number of Rebels have  
been made by the police at Prince Albert; all  
parties suspected of being disaffected and in  
sympathy with the rebels, have, as a precau-  
tionary measure, been placed under arrest.  
Amongst the number in House, brother of  
our interpreter, and Mountain, uncle of Al-  
bert.

**Our Wounded**  
passed a fairly good night. David Hestlop  
is improving. J. E. Latsbridge, was seriously  
wounded in the chest and hip, slightly be-  
tween, and C. H. Kemp is much better. These  
are the most serious cases in the others,  
the injuries are trifling, and the sufferers have  
almost entirely recovered. Many are walk-  
ing around. It is intended, I am now told,  
to send the wounded to Saskatoon to-morrow  
where they will be accommodated and cared  
for in a special house, and will have more  
conveniences than they can obtain at the  
Crosby.

Gordie Howe

"THE BEST hockey player the world has ever seen," says N.H.L. president Clarence Campbell of Gordie Howe. After 20 years as a professional, Gordie holds the league scoring record—624 goals. In 1963 he was named Canada's athlete of the year. Throughout this country and the United States, he is respected, even revered, by millions of fans. And his position at the pinnacle of success in the world of sport has brought him wealth—his income is estimated at \$100,000 a year.

Yet, by most of the rules, Gordie Howe's chances for greatness should have been pretty small. He had a boyhood of poverty in the small town of Floral, Saskatchewan, and later in Saskatoon, where his father was a laborer. He saw little formal schooling. But, like the hero of a Horatio Alger story, Gordie overcame the odds to win fame and adulation to such a degree that the city of Saskatoon this summer held a day in his honor, naming a city park after him.

On *Between Ourselves*, Wednesday, August 17th at 8:03 p.m., CBC radio visits Gordie Howe Day in Saskatoon, then looks at the athlete's past and present through interviews with family and friends, drawing a portrait

of Gordie Howe, the man and the public figure. *Howe and Why* is the program's title. Script and production are by Craig Oliver; *Between Ourselves* is coordinated for the Prairies by Anthony Ross.

THE WEEKLY press is not often called upon to report earth-shaking news. The comings and goings, the community affairs of the small centres they serve make interesting and important news for the readers at whom they are directed, but seldom would rate the attention of an outsider.

But the Moosomin (Saskatchewan) *Courier* of May 7th, 1885, was different. For in that issue, residents of the then three-year-old settlement learned of the outbreak of the Riel Rebellion.

In remarkable, flowing prose, the opening hostilities were described in great detail. Perceptive portraits of Middleton, Dumont, Riel and Archbishop Taché were intermingled with moving eyewitness accounts of bravery and savage fighting.

Detailed though the reports were, there was still space in the paper for the weekly column, Wapella Whisperings, and for quaintly worded advertisements reporting the going price for good hay. Plus the regular installment of a romantic serial.

A copy of this fascinating issue of the *Courier* recently was given to CBC Winnipeg drama producer Anthony Ross by the publisher of the present Moosomin newspaper, the *World-Spectator*. So engrossed was Ross with the contents that he decided to present a reading of the greater part of the newspaper on *Midweek Theatre*, Wednesday, August 17th at 9:00 p.m.

In the cast are George Waight, Marian Waldman, Meredith Robinson, Russ Waller, Vic

Cowie and Margaret Brown. A special score is composed and conducted by Neil Harris. Script is by Lyal Brown.

A FILM STORY on jockey Johnny Longden and British Columbia-bred race-horse George Royal will be presented in Diary of Johnny and George on CBC-TV's 20/20 series, Sunday, August 14th, at 5:30 p.m.

Highlight of the film, narrated by Terry Garner, will be film of the Canadian horse winning the San Juan Capistrano Handicap in 1965 and 1966 at Santa Anita, California.

Johnny Longden, now 60 years old, rode George Royal in both races. But the 1966 San Juan Handicap was historic because it was Longden's last race before he retired.

The program also shows George Royal at his home on Emerald Acres, a farm in the Fraser Valley about 50 miles from Vancouver.

It includes interviews with George Royal's owner, Robert Hall, a young man who emigrated from County Sligo in Ireland 12 years ago, Ernest Hammond, a retired furniture dealer from Vancouver, and with trainer Donnie Richardson.

Terry Garner talks with Johnny Longden and with his friends and relatives in his home town of Taber, Alberta.

# When Haydn was the Toast of London

A musical documentary on CBC TUESDAY NIGHT  
recalls Joseph Haydn's years of triumph in England.

*DR. HAYDN IN LONDON*, an account of the composer's visit to London between the years of 1791 to 1795, will be presented on *CBC Tuesday Night* this week (August 16th). The 90-minute musical documentary was prepared by the noted American Haydn scholar H. C. Robbins Landon, who also introduces the feature. Otto Lowy will be heard as Joseph Haydn. Others taking part are Patricia Williams, Peter Ajello and Roy Brinson. Narrator is David Hughes. The major musical illustrations are recordings by the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, conducted by the late Sir Thomas Beecham. The program was produced in the Vancouver studios of the CBC by Robert Chesterman.

The *CBC Tuesday Night* program (on AM radio) will serve as an introduction to a new series entitled *Haydn in London*, to be presented on CBW-FM (Winnipeg) Thursday evenings at 7:30. This seven-week series, prepared in Vancouver by Norman Newton, will include recordings of the bulk of Haydn's symphonies, string quartets and other works composed in or for England, as well as a com-

plete performance of the opera *Orfeo et Euridice*.

When Joseph Haydn arrived in London on New Year's Day 1791, he was greeted by an overwhelmingly enthusiastic public and press. His arrival was the talk of the town. The newspapers were full of it and the famous Austrian composer was in great demand at social gatherings and for guest appearances. He was 58 years old and his career was at its zenith. For years, several people had attempted to persuade Haydn to come to England, but he had been under contract to Prince Nicolaus Esterhazy for nearly 30 years and could or would not leave his Austria — which was then Hungary — where the Prince was major-domo of a fairy-tale castle, complete with opera house and marionette theatre. In the early autumn of 1790, Prince Nicolaus died. His successor, Paul Anton, cared little for music. He dismissed the singers and most of the orchestra, retaining Haydn as chapel master on a nominal basis.

Johann Peter Salomon, London's foremost impresario and an excellent violinist, was in

Cologne on his way from Italy, where he had been to engage singers for the Italian opera, when he heard of Esterhazy's death and rushed to Haydn in Vienna. Salomon and Haydn had corresponded for a long time but, like the others, Salomon had been unsuccessful in bringing the composer to England. Now he realized his opportunity and was insistent on Haydn coming to London for a visit. Haydn did not offer too much resistance, for he had lived long enough in what he called the wilderness.

Shortly before his departure for England, Haydn had a farewell lunch with his best musical friend Mozart, who was moved to tears at Haydn's departure and said "We won't ever meet again, you'll see." Mozart died on December 5th, 1791. Mozart also expressed fears that Haydn would feel uncomfortable in England because he didn't know the language, but Haydn answered "Ah, my language is understood all over the world."

In London, the atmosphere was one of great expectation at what the musical genius of Haydn would give to the city. His own words describe the feeling in London: "My arrival caused a great sensation throughout the whole city, and I went the round of all the newspapers for three successive days. Everyone wants to know me. I had to dine out six times up to now, and if I wanted, I could dine out every day, but first I must consider my health and secondly, my work. At 4 o'clock, I dine at home with Monsieur Salomon. I have nice and comfortable, but expensive lodgings. My landlord is Italian, and also a cook, and serves me four very respectable meals, but everything is frightfully expensive here. I wish I could fly for a time to Vienna to have more quiet in which to work, for the noise that the common people make as they sell their wares in the street is intolerable. I shall have to rent a room far from the centre of town."

Haydn took lodgings in Lisson Grove, then a suburb of London, and there he wrote most of his new opera *L'anima del filosofo* with the sub-title *Orfeo et Euridice*. For that first season Salomon announced that there would be 12 subscription concerts and that Haydn would compose a new piece of music for each night. The first concert took place at the famous Hanover Square rooms on March 11th, 1791. It was a full program and included, at the beginning of the second part, Haydn's new symphony (No. 96 in D).

Haydn's musical genius surpassed London audiences' expectations. *The Morning Chronicle* of Saturday, March 12th, had the following report on the premiere concert: "Salomon's Concert. The first concert under the



auspices of Haydn was last night, and never, perhaps, was there a richer musical treat. Is it not wonderful that to souls capable of being touched by music, Haydn should be an object of homage, and even of idolatry, for like our own Shakespeare, he moves and governs the passions at will. His new Grand Overture (which in 18th-century England meant a symphony) was pronounced by every scientific ear to be a most wonderful composition; but the first movement in particular rises in grandeur of subject, and in the rich variety of air and passion, beyond any even of his own productions." *The Diary* (Woodfall's Register) of the same date said: "The audience was so enraptured that by unanimous desire, the second movement was encored, and the third was vehemently demanded a second time also, but the modesty of the composer prevailed too strongly to admit a repetition."

For the 1791 season, Haydn wrote two new symphonies, No. 96 and No. 95 in C minor. All the other "new" pieces were actually works written in 1789 and 1790 but not yet known in England, such as the String Quartets, Opus 64, and Symphonies Nos. 90 and 92. Meanwhile, Salomon's concerts continued with ever-increasing success. Not only Haydn's genius but his modesty too touched English hearts. *The Oracle* stated "Haydn's manuscript overture was highly relished. The approbation of the (Please turn to page 31)



# Anglers are Made, Not Born

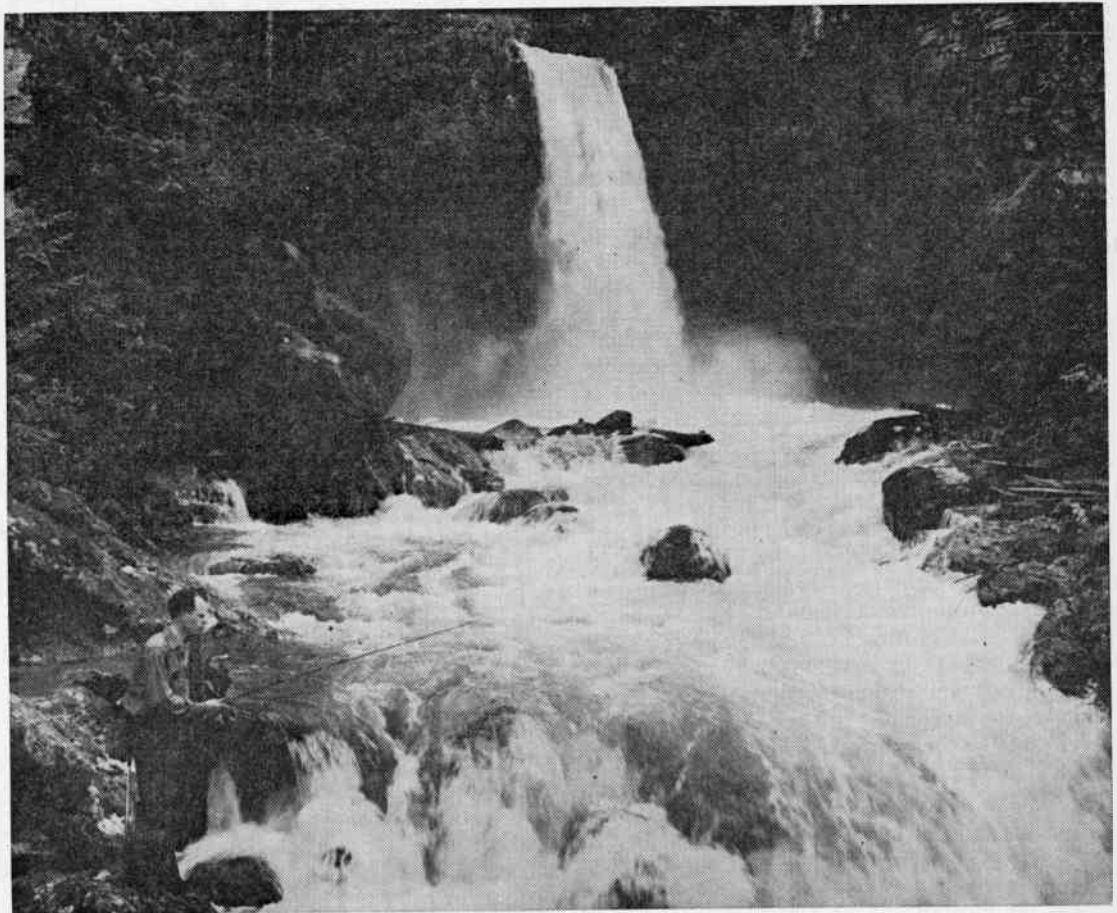
THE NATURE OF THINGS explodes  
some myths about fishing,  
Monday at 7:30 p.m. on CBC-TV.

SIR HENRY WOTTON, quoted by Sir Izaak Walton in his *Compleat Angler*, said of the art of fishing that, "it was an employment for his idle time, which was then not idly spent . . . a rest to his mind, a cheerer of his spirits, a diverter of sadness, a calmer of unquiet thoughts, a moderator of passions, a procurer of contentedness; and that it beget habits of peace and patience in those that professed and practiced it." Walton himself described it as "an art worthy the knowledge and practice of a wise man," but observed that "as no man is

born an artist, so no man is born an angler."

Nowadays, fishing is not only an art but a science, and both aspects of the sport will be investigated in this week's edition of *The Nature of Things* (Monday, August 15th, 7:30 p.m.), which deals with fish, fishermen, and scientists. Are fishing lures designed for the fish or for the fishermen? Do solar and lunar cycles affect fish? Is it really better to fish in the evening? Science provides interesting data on these and other topics from the traditional lore of angling.

And science is developing new and better game fish — for instance, the splake, the product of the crossbreeding of the lake and speckled trout. (It takes seven years for the large lake trout to mature, whereas the smaller, stream-haunting speckled variety takes only three.) At Maple, Ont., biologists of the department of lands and forests developed the splake for seeding in Lake Ontario and Lake Huron. The program shows how they did it, and how they hope to beat the vicious lamprey eel, which preys on the ordinary lake trout.

# KOREA

---

FIFTEEN YEARS ago the United Nations mounted its first "police action," the defence of South Korea against invasion by forces of the North. The date was June 25th, 1950, when more than 60,000 North Korean troops, spear-headed by some 100 Russian-built tanks, poured over the 38th Parallel and, four days later, occupied Seoul, capital of the South. The UN Security Council met in special session, at the request of the United States, on the second day of action and passed a resolution demanding immediate cessation of hostilities, and the withdrawal of the forces of the North to the 38th Parallel, and calling for member-countries to "render every assistance in the execution of this resolution."

The war was to last three years, with the negotiations for a peaceful settlement lasting fully two-thirds of that time. At the end of it there were well over 2,000,000 battle casualties. Canada's contribution to the UN action was, according to the official account by the Historical Section of the General Staff, Ottawa, "larger . . . in proportion to her population than most of the nations which provided troops for the international force. It is worth remembering that on this basis a brigade group from Canada was almost equivalent to four of the divisions sent to Korea by the United States, which in 1950 had 11 times Canada's population." The cost to Canada was 1,557 battle casualties, 312 of them fatal.

After U.S. and associated troops had checked the drive south by the North Koreans, they then went on to capture Pyongyang, capital of the North, and reached the Manchurian border late in November. The second phase of the war was a counter- (Please turn to page 11)

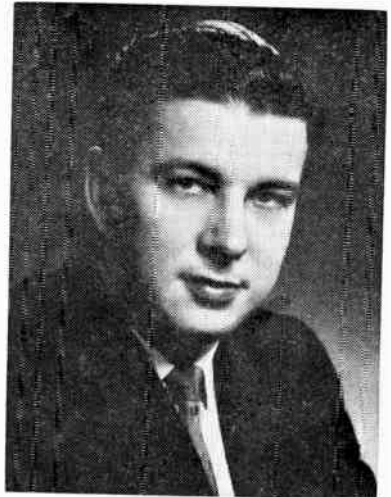

attack by 200,000 Chinese "volunteers" across the Yalu River, forcing the evacuation of UN troops at Hungnam, and smashing 70 miles deep into South Korea. By April 3rd, 1951, UN troops had pushed the Chinese back across the 38th Parallel and later that month stopped an offensive by 600,000 Chinese. The third phase of the Korean War began with the removal of General MacArthur as head of the U.S. and UN forces on April 11th, 1951, by President Truman. MacArthur wanted to pursue the Chinese across the Yalu to Manchuria and had threatened China with air and naval attack. Following MacArthur's removal, negotiations for a truce along the 38th Parallel began on July 10th, 1951, and an Armistice was signed on July 27th, 1953.

This Sunday (August 14th at 3:00 p.m.) CBC-TV presents a documentary program on the Korean War narrated by actor Richard Basehart and produced by David Wolper.

perimental films and television documentaries.

"Home Movies will cover the Canadian film from 1897 up to the present, with a glimpse into the future as we see excerpts from a new kind of cinematic experience that visitors to Expo '67 will undergo. This is a film called *Labyrinth*, by Jean-Claude Labrecque, which is not quite like any other film I've ever seen."

"This will be not only a most interesting series," says Ross McLean, "but also a lot of good fun, certainly not too solemn. I hope we'll attract many viewers

other than those in the business of film-making."

"We're very glad to see someone doing this sort of program, showing the development of the film in Canada," says Peter Morris. "There are a lot of fascinating stories in the history of Canadian film-making which I'm sure will interest many people."

"For me," says Wendy Michener, "it was like discovering a secret civilization. Researching this series was an education. There was so much material. I thought I'd seen and heard about a lot of Canadian films, but the CFI and NFB have millions of feet of film I'd never heard about before. Rosalind and I spent dozens of hours in Montreal and Ottawa screening all manner of films. What is the Canadian

image that emerges? It's difficult to put your finger on it, but there's definitely something that one recognizes—and it's definitely not the stereotyped image of Canada that the U.S. film makers have been putting out for years. Although we are partly to blame for that image. For instance, on the program we see some of the early newsreels (some of them faked when there wasn't much news), which were primarily for the American market, showing Eskimos wrestling in the snow. But there were also a lot of stories that we in Canada should have done but neglected to do, like *Anne of Green Gables*. So we have included parts of the feature film that was made in

## The Music of Mendelssohn

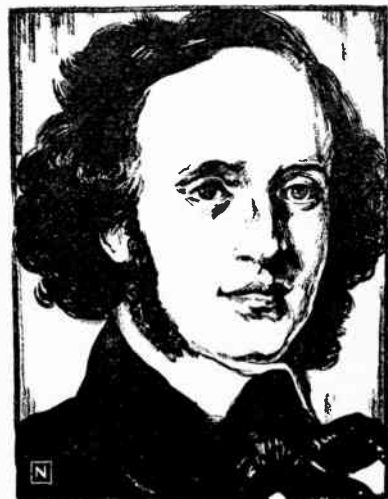
*Music critic Ken Winters, formerly of Winnipeg and now of Toronto, is host of a series illuminating the works of Felix Mendelssohn.*

A NEW PROGRAM series on the music of Mendelssohn begins this week on CBW-FM, Winnipeg. With Kenneth Winters as host and Oleg Telizvn as producer, the series will be heard Tuesday nights at 11:00 p.m., beginning August 16th.

Writing of the series, Mr. Winters says, "Felix Mendelssohn (1809-1847) fell from favor, as particularly successful great men always do, not long after his death. When the big figure is not on hand to keep his reputation bright, the little figures are quick to take advantage. And in Mendelssohn's case, with overestimation the order of the day during his life, underestimation was particularly eager to grab the spotlight after his death.

"Unfortunately, underestimation was concurrent with the age of the textbook; Mendelssohn was listed as a back number in the textbooks of that post-Victorian time, and until recently those textbooks have not been subjected to any kind of question. They've just been read, and believed.

"Several generations of Canadians cut their teeth on H. C. Colles's *The Growth of Music*, which came out in 1912. When, after six reprintings, this venerable tome came up for re-editing (1939), the author was able to begin his preface with the statement: 'Alterations in the text of this edition are few.' Certainly the passages on Mendelssohn, rational but patronizing, have an unaltered look and represent a very fixed and narrow slant on Mendelssohn's music."



Mr. Winters, whose admiration of Mendelssohn he attributes to getting acquainted with the bulk of the music and steering clear of the bulk of the printed word on it, will take a fresh look at the man and his works in the new series, making use of available recordings and pertinent contemporary documents, such as Mendelssohn's own enchanting letters. The first program will include the Piano Sonata in G Minor, written by the 12-year-old Mendelssohn in 1821, and published posthumously as Opus 105; and the Violin Concerto in D Minor, composed at age 13.

Kenneth Winters was music critic for the *Winnipeg Free Press* for 10 years (1956-66). One of those years (1959-60) was spent in Paris, where he studied harmony and composition with Nadia Boulanger and reviewed the French music scene for *Winnipeg* readers. In February of this year he moved to Toronto as music critic for *The Telegram*.

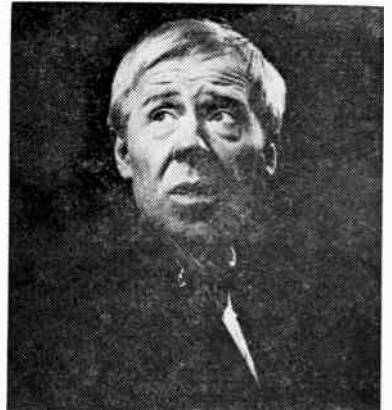

Canada in 1934 by RKO, starring Anne Shirley in the title role.”

*Home Movies* is broken down into four categories: the first program, on August 17th, deals with documentary filming-making; the second, on August 24th, deals with feature films; the third, on August 31st, will be animation; and the final program, on September 7th, will be a survey of the whole industry — *70 Years in 60 Minutes*.

“Originally, just as a convenient division, we thought of doing this series by regions, but this proved unsatisfactory,” says Miss Michener. “Production in

some regions has dwindled over the years, so we developed the idea of dividing by program content — feature films, animation, and so forth. But, most of all, what we wanted to do was to spotlight what is being done now, so we have included interviews with many contemporary Canadian film-makers. I feel very strongly that Canadian film-makers ought not to be allowed to remain anonymous, as they too often have been in the past.”

On the first program there will be a panel discussion between Miss Michener and film-makers Donald Brittain of the NFB and freelancers Beryl Fox and Richard Ballentine, with selections from several of their films. These include Ballentine's *The Most*, a film about *Playboy* publisher Hugh Hefner; Brittain's *Ladies and Gentlemen: Mr. Leonard Cohen* and Beryl Fox's *Single Woman and the Double Standard*, used to illustrate a discussion on filmed portraits and the whole question of image-making in films and the ethics of the documentary director. Program one also shows the travelogue type of film that for years was such a well-tryed formula in Canadian film-making. “It's striking how long it took Canadian film-makers to get around to talking about people,” says Miss Michener. “For years it was all landscape — trees, more trees, snow, and prairies.”

The second program will have excerpts from such feature films as *Nobody Waved Goodbye* by Don Owen, *A Tout Prendre* by Claude Jutra, *Caressed* by Laurence Kent, *Winter Kept Us Warm* by David Sector, *La Vie Heureuse de Leopold Z* by Gilles Carle, *The Mask*, a horror film originally made in 3-D process by Julian Roffman, and *The Luck of Ginger Coffey* by Crawley Films. Some of the directors who will be heard on this program discussing their work are: Don Owen, Michel Brault, Claude Jutra, Jean-Pierre Lefebvre, and Fletcher Markle.

In the field of animation most of the work has been done by

the National Film Board, but the CBC, too, has made a great contribution. On program three we see selections from both the NFB and the CBC, with films like *My Financial Career*, *Christmas Crackers*, *A Is for Architecture*, and satires by artists Michael Snow, Louis de Niverville, and Carlos Marchiori. This program brings us up to date on animation from the early '40s, and some of the various influences on animation by artists at home and abroad.

Finally, there is the historical survey, beginning with newsreels from 1897, through documentaries and shorts at the turn of the century and in the '20s, and selections from some of the first feature films, including what is thought to be the first sound on film production in Canada *The Viking* (1931); and the most expensive feature film, Bruce Bairnsfather's \$500,000 production *Carry On Sergeant*.

Other early feature films shown include: *Crossing the Border*, an Edison one-reeler of 1904, and *The Man From Glen-garry* (1923), one of a cycle of films adapted from Ralph Connor's books. Interviewed on this program about the compiling and preserving of early Canadian films are Guy Coté, Peter Morris, and veteran Canadian film-maker Gordon Sparling.

A discussion of the propaganda film and excerpts from some of Canada's wartime documentaries also forms part of this program. “Aside from John Grierson's *The War For Men's Minds*, McLaren's *V For Victory*, and a very effective short called *Train-Busters*, a marvellously dramatic piece of editing, we also have a Film Board production of the early '40s called *The Proudest Girl in the World*,” says Wendy Michener. “This is a recruiting film for the Canadian Women's Army Corps, based on a song by Wayne and Shuster of the same title. It's a fun piece done in the style of a Busby Berkeley musical of the '30s, with long lines of chorus girls in CWAC uniforms.”

## in the Summer

*Programs on radio this week visit musical happenings across Canada.*

ONE OF THE most apparent changes in Canada's musical life in recent years has been the amount of musical activity during the summer months. At music camps and festivals across the country people of all ages—and at all stages of musical accomplishment—are engaged in making music or listening to it. CBC radio this week reflects some of this activity in a number of programs:

**Stratford Festival** — Each summer, the musicians who assemble from many parts of Canada to make up the National Festival Orchestra, also take part in workshop study sessions. One result of these workshops is the series of Saturday morning chamber concerts presented in the Festival Theatre. This week's *Chamber Music* program (Thursday, 8:03 p.m.) was recorded at one of these concerts.

**Jeunesses Musicales** — At Mont Orford, in Quebec's Eastern Townships, the annual summer music camp of Les Jeunesses Musicales du Canada presents, in addition to its classes and workshops, a number of recitals by well-known artists. CBW-FM's *Encore* program (Sunday, August 14th, 8:00 p.m.) will include a recital by the internationally famous 'cellist, Paul Tortelier, who is in his third season as head of the 'cello class at Mont Orford. He will be accompanied by the Swiss pianist, Karl Engel, in works by Bach and Brahms. Also from Mont Orford will

**Music on Campus** — For the fifth season, the CBC is cooperating with the University of Manitoba in presenting a series of concerts in Winnipeg. Eleven concerts, in all, make up the series, including recitals by folk-singer Ian Tyson and contralto Maureen Forrester. The *CBC Winnipeg Pops Concert*, *Chamber Music*, and other radio series, will be presenting broadcasts from these concerts in coming weeks.

documentary. It is simply a thing in itself, the creation of a certain day in the life of Moosomin. That day was Thursday, May 7th, 1885, the day the *Courier* reported the outbreak of the Riel Rebellion and events at Fish Creek.

## When Haydn was the Toast of London

audience was received with the utmost modesty by that gentleman." And *The Morning Herald* wrote: "A fine manuscript overture of Haydn was highly admired, and it was gratifying to observe with what zeal the audience endeavored to show their sense of this composer's exquisite genius, and the modesty with which Haydn received their eager eulogiums."

It had been a sensational season. Nothing like it had occurred in London since Handel's death more than 30 years before. At the beginning of July, a great honor was conferred on Haydn. The ancient and famous University of Oxford bestowed on him a Doctorate of Music. Salomon and the distinguished musicologist Charles Burney accompanied Haydn to Oxford, where, the day before the ceremony, Haydn conducted the "Oxford" Symphony No. 92, a work written for Paris in 1789, but as yet unknown in England. The concert was held in Wren's Sheldonian Theatre, and Haydn conducted from the organ.

The first season of the Haydn-Salomon concerts was such a success that Haydn was easily persuaded to remain for the season of 1792. All during the 1791 season *The Times*, conservative and careful, watched Haydn's dizzy rise to British fame but did not review any of his music except for a small note about Haydn's benefit concert. But for Salomon's first concert of 1792, held February 17th, *The Times* entered the Fleet Street chorus of praise: "The first Subscription Concert took place last Friday, at Hanover Square. The established musical judges present all agreed that it went off with surprising effect and rigid exactness. No orchestra in the world can do better. A new overture

from the pen of the incomparable Haydn formed one considerable branch of this stupendous musical tree. Such a combination of excellence was contained in every movement, and inspired all the performers as well as the audience with enthusiastic ardor. Novelty of idea, agreeable caprice, and whim combined with all Haydn's sublime grandeur, gave additional consequence to the soul and feeling of every individual present. The critic's eye brightened with additional lustre — then was the moment that the great painter might have caught — that, which cannot be thrown on the human frame but on such rare and great occasions."

And the end of June, 1792, Haydn left London for Vienna. On the way back, he stopped at Bonn and was shown a cantata by a promising young composer, Ludwig von Beethoven. Haydn took Beethoven on as a pupil, and during the late fall of 1792 and the year 1793, Haydn taught him counterpoint and the tricks of the trade.

In January 1794, Haydn again left for London, even though Europe was threatened by war. This time, he was well prepared for a new concert season. He had already completed six new string quartets — the first quartets ever written for the concert hall rather than the chamber; and he had also finished Symphony No. 99 and part of "The Clock." At the eighth concert, on March 21st, 1794, Haydn achieved the wildest success of his career with *The Military Symphony*. People stood up and shouted and the hall was absolute pandemonium. The Salomon concerts finished in May.

London seemed to be the epitome for both Salomon and

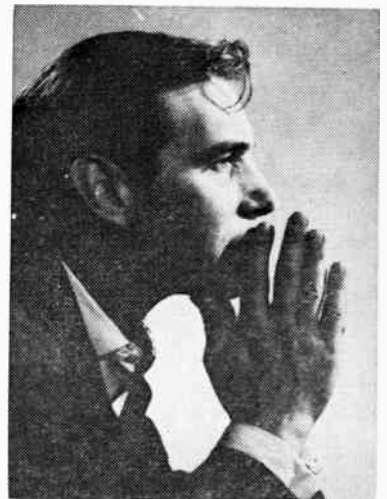

## HAYDN

Haydn, for there they both achieved the most brilliant successes of their respective careers. The overwhelming response of the English for the Haydn-Salomon concerts inspired them to a high pitch of creativity. It was at Salomon's suggestion that Haydn undertook to write *The Creation* and his last Quartets were composed especially to suit Salomon's style of playing.

In the summer of 1794, Haydn was working on his new symphonies for the coming season, Nos. 102, 103 and 104. He also travelled throughout England. He visited Portsmouth, where he saw the French warships captured by Lord Howe, and Bath, which he described as one of the most beautiful cities in Europe. At one point in his tour, he accompanied Lord Abingdon on a visit to Preston, where they stayed with the Baron of Aston and his wife. Haydn brought with him to Preston as a gift for his hostess some trios for two flutes and cello, the flute parts of which were played by Lord Abingdon and Sir Willoughby Aston, baronet. In Preston, a

magnificent country house, these *London Trios*, as they are now called, were first played.

In January of 1795, Salomon announced with regret that due to the existing situation of affairs on the Continent, he was unable to procure from abroad any vocal performers of first talent. Thus the Haydn-Salomon concerts were at an end. Haydn stayed in London, however, and was engaged by Salomon together with three other composers, Martini, Bianchi and Clementi, for the so-called Opera Concerts which were held in King's Theatre, Haymarket. There were also the usual benefit concerts, at which Haydn often conducted one of his new symphonies.

The last concert at which he assisted took place at the beginning of June, 1795. Haydn had decided to return home to Austria . . . to his people . . . his religion. He loved England and had made dozens of friends. He drank to the full of England and her traditions before he left. About his time in England, Haydn said: "I consider the days I spent in England the happiest of my life. I was everywhere appreciated there, it opened a new

world to me, and with all my rich earnings, I could at last escape the restricted circumstances in which I had grown grey. It was England that made me famous at home." During his years in England, Haydn wrote more than 3,000 pages of music. Also, it was in London where he composed his famous "Salomon" Symphonies (Nos. 92-104), which are the best-known of his symphonic output.

children, and their response to Quebec nationalism. The result is a program as much about marriage as about larger questions.

*Confederation of Two* was directed by Dennis Miller, with Marion André Czerniecki as story editor. Executive producer of the series is Paul Wright.

Czerniecki says he interviewed nearly a dozen couples before it was decided which three would be seen in the film. It would be difficult, he said, to draw any conclusions, because he didn't carry out sociological research in depth for facts or statistics, but rather just wanted to show what marriage is like for these particular couples. However, he did notice a few trends amongst those interviewed: In all cases, the woman was French and the man English; the French Canadian women who married Jewish men seemed to get along better because they had more in common; in most cases, the children wind up speaking French predominantly, because they spend more time with their mothers. "A lot of people said one of their biggest problems was the simple fact that it's a terrible strain to speak another language when they are tired, and this often led to minor arguments," said Czerniecki. But, he said, it appeared that any and all marriage difficulties couldn't be blamed on language difficulties; actually, he said, difficulties stem in bilingual marriages from the same sources as they do in other marriages—personality problems.

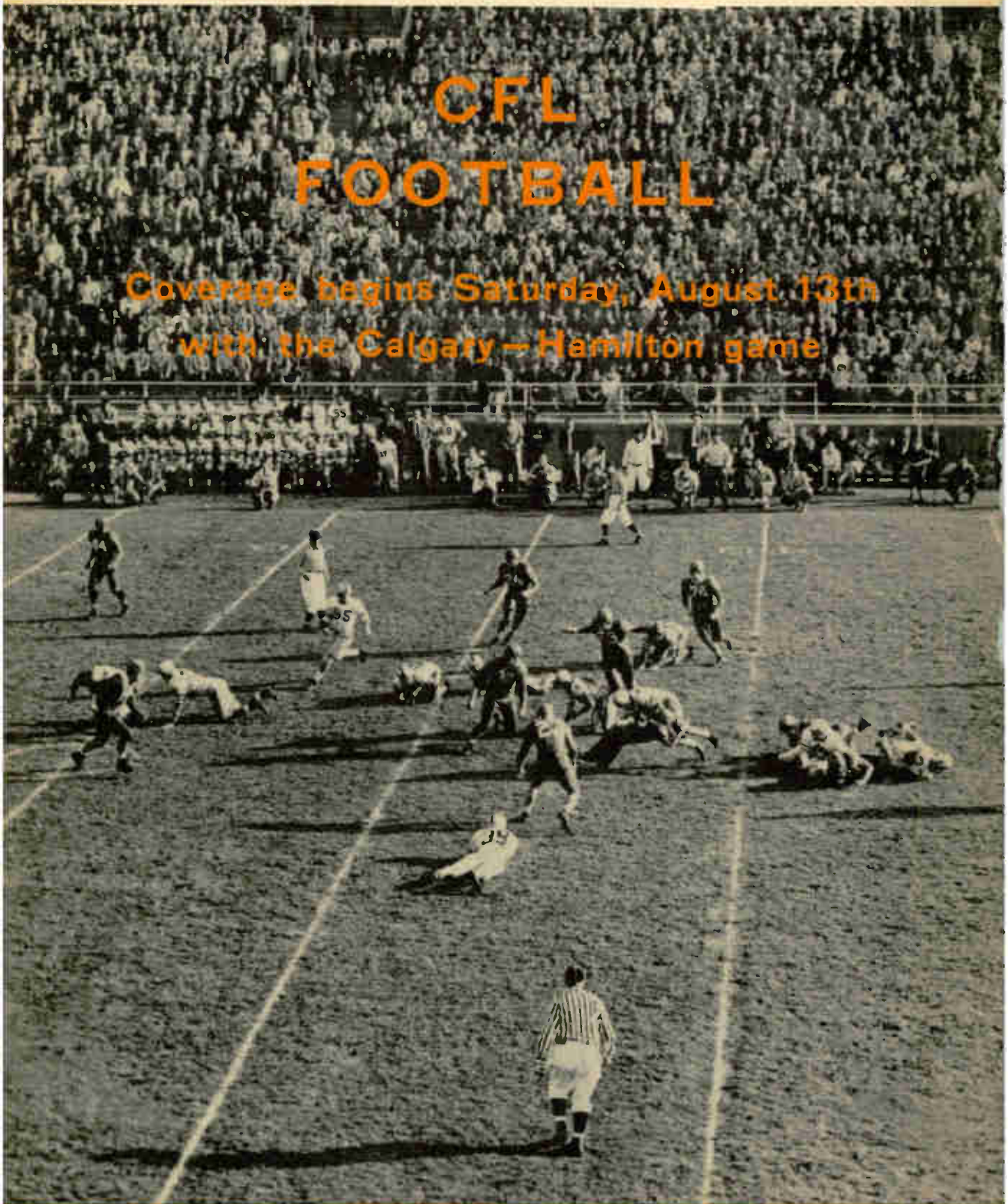
