Pirate tape distributor netted

THE BPI has scored a further success in its fight against piracy with a £67,000 judgment plus £5,000 costs against a distributor of counterfeit cassettes.

Gary Sorrell, of Great Dunmow, Essex, was brought to court by the BPI who acted in co-operation with the police in investigating his activities as a distributor for various counterfeit rings. Sorrell admitted selling 20,000 cassettes.

"Investigations continue against a number of counterfeiting rings who continue to produce full-blown counterfeit cassettes for sale in market and street locations," says BPI legal adviser Patrick Isherwood.

BPI PR role for Anderson

MUSIC WEEK features editor, Terri Anderson, is to join the BPI secretariat as press officer and will take up her new appointment on July 23. Anderson, a long-term MW staffer, is also responsible for retailing and studio editorial.

BPI director general John Deacon said: "During the past year the BPI's activities have substantially increased, and Terri's depth of experience in journalism will, I'm sure, prove invaluable, both in communicating those activities to the media and our council's decisions to the BPI membership."

New generation CD hardware unveiled

NEW DEVELOPMENTS in compact disc technology were announced at a series of press conferences for the European media at PolyGram's CD plant at Hanover last week. Coincidentally, Nimbus Records successfully pressed the first Britishmade CD at its new Monmouth factory, while PolyGram is preparing to celebrate the 10 millionth CD disc pressed in 20 months.

Philips' international product manager Peer Custers unveiled new generation CD hardware, which included:

- A CD combination music centre with tuner/amp and cassette player;
 A CD changer machine which
- A CD changer machine which allows random access to any track on any record in a 10-disc stack;
- A CD rack system integrating a
 CD player with a full-function hi-fi
 system:
- A CD professional machine for use in recording studios, broadcast studios and discos, complete with console, monitor and control system:
- CD graphics text or graphics such as lyrics, artist biography or photos, will be stored on the discs

for display on a TV screen

 And the CD car player, although still not yet fully developed, is being predicted for late 1985 or early 1986.

Philips admits that problems of miniaturisation, vibration, variable temperature and dust are still hampering the development of the in-car player and they are "completely re-engineering" the system to meet the demands of in-car conditions. But agreement on a single standard machine is expected "in the near future".

The CD professional system was being demonstrated at the London Cetex exhibition this week, and Philips expects it to be in production by the end of the year. All the other variations are under the heading "coming innovations", along with the CD portable, or Walkman-style, machine, and the use of the CD in ROM (read only memory) applications for storage of information such as encyclopaedias.

Philips UK product manager Simon Turner said that market research among hi-fi owners indicated that in January, 1984, 80 per cent were aware of CD compared to 20 per cent a year ago, and 50 per cent said they would buy a machine compared with only 15 per cent in January, 1983.

CDs and cassettes shine in quarterly survey

THE COMPACT disc — just over one year old in the UK market — is making an impressive impact, says the British Phonographic Industry's first quarterly survey this year.

first quarterly survey this year.

CD deliveries to the trade are running at 30-40,000 a month, and a total of 750,000 CD sales is forecast for 1984. CD sales have taken over about five per cent of the classical album trade, and to that extent, says the survey, are replacing an existing established market.

Cassettes are continuing their upward surge, and now account for well over 40 per cent of the album market. In the first three months of this year, 7.2m units were delivered compared with 6.2m for the same period last year, an increase of 16.5 per cent.

per cent.

Their value only increased by 15 per cent to £16.2m, and the average trade price of tapes fell slightly. The BPI opines that this contributes to the attractiveness of the product, so long as it is passed on to the consumer.

LP disc deliveries were well maintained, and were three per cent up on last year's 9.4m at 10.2m upton in the street of the stre

Singles continued "to decline gently". Unit deliveries were five per cent down in the first quarter at just under 18m units, but their value rose by nine per cent at £17.5m.

The BPI identifies two main contributory factors: the price of seven-inch singles has risen over the past year, and the percentage of the market taken by 12-inch singles now stands at about 28 per cent.

was tands at about 28 per cent.
"It is possible," says the BPI,
"that retail price increases have met
some consumer resistance".

Record industry sales for January-March 1984 rose by 9.5 per cent over 1983, and the value was £59.6m compared with £54.5m last year. The percentage increase is well ahead of the inflation rate which stood at 5.2 per cent.

"The most encouraging aspect of this performance lies in the number of album units delivered to the trade," says the survey.

"The total of LPs, cassettes and CDs sold was nearly 17.5m units — 8.6 per cent up on last year — and value was up 10 per cent at £42.2m, leaving the prevailing level of turnover at £291m per annum."

Album of last papal castrato on Pavi

THE FIRST complete collection on
LP of the only known recordings of
the world's last papal castrato has been issued by independent English label Pavilion Records.

It is an extraordinary historical record of singing which, during its heyday (from 1650 to 1750) resulted in Beatle-like hysteria in opera houses on the Continent, particularly Italy. After virtuoso performances of the leading castrati, fans would cry out "Eviva il coltello" - long live the knife.

By the beginning of this century there were few castrati still singing, but in 1902 Fred and Will Gaisberg, the first recording managers of the London branch of the Gramophone Company (forerunners of EMI) managed to persuade conductor of the Sistine Chapel Choir, Alessandro

Moreschi, to make some records.
Two years later their US associate
Sinkler Darby made further
recordings at the Vatican, both of
Moreschi singing solos and with a

chorus. Altogether 17 recordings were made.

Although he was past his prime as a singer, the unique quality of a castrati voice is unmistakable, even when compared to the natural counter-tenor or the falsettist (the natural base trained to sing falsetto). With the purity of a boy's voice but with the power of an adult, the

with the power of an adult, the sound is unique.

There is some doubt whether Moreschi followed the path of the true castrati — having his testicles removed at the age of 10 and then removed at the age of 10 and their being subjected to severe vocal training — or whether he was a congenital eunuch. The effect, however, was the same. His recordings were issued in the

first two decades of this century, and since then have appeared only as isolated examples in expensive collections. The only recent LP example was in EMI's 1977 issue The Art Of Singing, a 6-LP set which contained one Moreschi item.

Pavilion Records, best known for

its Pearl label, has managed to track down all the Moreschi recordings (largely by scouring US collections)

and has issued it in its specialist series Opal.

John Waite, MD of Pavilion Records, said: "We felt that with the interest being shown in the countertheor voice and the falsettist, there should be a proper collection of Moreschi's work, as he is the only castrato known to have been recorded."

recorded."

Titles in the Opal series, while not strictly limited editions, are pressed initially in very small numbers — even for classical records. Waite said that within a week of its release the initial 1,000 press order has already been exhausted.

Among the works Moreschi sings on the disc — not yet available on cassette or CD — are the Ave Maria cassette or CD — are the AVE Maria in the Bach/Gounod arrangement, and two versions of the Crucifixus from Rossini's Petite Messe Solenelle, which illustrate Moreschi's extremely emotive style.

'Sixties appeal' takes off

NEW YORK: Be forewarned — the late Fifties/early Sixties will be here before you know it. First, there's the movie The Big Chill, with its soundtrack (actually two separate records listed on the Billboard Top LPs and Tape chart). Then there's the interest in the show Leader Of The Pack, featuring the songs of and a performance by Ellie Greenwich. The show moves from the Bottom Line, where it's had an extended showcase, to Broadway. An original cast recording is to follow.

Then there's the use of Sixties music by advertising agencies — always a sure sign that a given style is in the mainstream anew. Consider that at the upcoming Consumer Electronics Show in Chicago, RCA/Columbia is sponsoring a Big Chill theme party, while Mindset, a computer software company, sent out an EP (in full foldout cover) as an invitation to a reception at which Bobby Vee, The Diamonds, The Drifters and The Angels will perform.

The EP, on flexidisc, features Vée's The Night Has A Thousand Eyes, The Diamonds' The Stroll and The Drifters' This Magic Moment. The company's theme: "Mindscape and rock 'n' roll are here to store." are here to stay.

SPEAKING OF computers and music, a firm named CompuSonic is promising an attachment for IBM personal computers which would permit the digital recording of music on floppy diskettes and for editing via the terminal's standard keyboard.

The add-on device is reported to cost \$1,000 (£725) and the method of delivery of the digitised information into the home would be standard telephone lines. You may recall that a similar scheme for home taping of music delivered on the FM frequency of a cable channel had to be abandoned, when the company setting up the system couldn't obtain licences for material from record companies.

ASCAP HAS lost another battle in its efforts to avoid quoting a per-programme licensing fee to ABC TV. ASCAP has argued that, because ABC has a blanket licence with BMI, it (ASCAP) would be in a negative bargaining position were it to offer a per-

programme alternative fee structure.

The US District Court in New York upheld previous rulings ordering ASCAP to provide ABC with a per-programme licensing schedule. ASCAP can appeal the ruling; similar cases are also still outstanding.

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Dealers: an ill wind blows for the CD?

Indie CD specialists raise some points for the record companies to ponder

STRAWS IN the wind seem to be blowing in the direction of discounting on CD by some non-record specialist shops. The prospect of margins being cut in another painful (and totally unnecessary) price war on this precious new product is already worrying some dealers. "This bodes ill for CD altogether," warns Steve Walters of Earthshaker

Records in Twickenham. A keen CD dealer, he went in on the PolyGram launch scheme from day one and has built his CD business up into a significant portion of his turnover, without dropping from the full £9.99 basic retail price.

His anxiety has been sparked by seeing a Dire Straits Alchemy double CD on sale in a local NSS double CD on sale in a local NSS branch at a discount of over £5.
"Any shop discounting like this is not making enough out of selling CD to carry a proper range of stock—and that means that the market development of CD is being badly effected."

affected."
While accepting that such apparently lunatic discounting on CD is still rare, Mark Clark of Mark One Records in Wokingham shares this concern. One of a number of dealers around the country who are putting considerable capital and retail expertise into stocking and selling the fullest possible range of CD, he views the prospect of a new dis-count battle with the multiples and non-music chains with alarm.

Full range

Walters says: "When CD goes into any of the big stores at a discount, the prospect of turning the vinyl-buying public on to CD will go out of the window.

"The public cannot be taught to appreciate CD by Woolworth, Boots or WH Smith. We indie specialists are the only ones who are prepared to carry the full range, to invest in playing equipment for the shop to demonstrate the sound, and explain about CD and introduce it to poten-

tial new buyers."
Clark adds: "We have given small introductory discounts — such as when we told hi-fi dealers locally that we would give discounts on a certain level of purchases to people

they introduced to us.
"In my shop I've made up a mailing list of all new customers, filed them, and keep them informed of all new releases. It comes down to money. The multiples must be made to realise they can make just as much money as we do without discounting; but they have the discount mentality ingrained from all the years of cut pricing vinyl.

If there is no discounting we can all make come more."

all make some money."

Both dealers feel that there must be something that the CD suppliers can do to influence this situation before it becomes an established pattern. Walters reluctantly accepts that PolyGram's tight control on CD dealerships had to end, enphasising that "PolyGram was absolutely right to start as they did — and there is still no point in having three or four shops in one small area selling CD; it's still too early for that. In fact everything was going well until RCA • indies' desire for CDs from new artists, especially in minority interest

areas
• the need to select what goes on CD with greater regard for the realities of the market — "some bigselling artists just do not have the kinds of fans who want, or can afford, CD players and discs."
• the need for better information about CD — "it's hard to get

precise, accurate information about CD releases"

 the need to organise the almost haphazard way in which titles become available on CD through different territories — "there are UK artists available on CD in Europe and



STEVE WALTERS (above) of Earthshaker Records says that he and many other CD dealers around the country with whom he is in regular contact, are worried about the prospect of CD being sold in non-record specialist outlets at discounted prices. They would be happy to see multiples selling CD "if they approached it like indies" but this, the indies suspect, they would be both unwilling and unable to do.

decided to drop the CD dealer price and let everyone who wanted them order them.

But he insisted that all the major distributors who are also copyright owners "must have some way of controlling their distribution and insisting that retailers stock and promote their product properly." Earthshaker and Mark One each

carry about 800 CD titles including imports — taking at least one of everything released in the UK.

They feel that while the question

of record shops acting as vinyl libraries is open to discussion there can be no sense in any retailer lending but CDs, because the market for sale is so strong. Points that Clark and Walters would like to put to the record

Constantly telling customers that the titles they want are out of stock is bad for the image of the product. People think that if a vinyl album is out of stock its fock it's because it's not out of stock it's because it's not popular, whereas the reverse is true

the need to seize the opportunity to make CD something special and even more prestigious by using the

even more prestigious by using the full potential of the sound quality, putting tracks on CD which could not be cut on vinyl, or by using the playing time available to put remixed longer versions of songs on.

Both dealers, dedicated to the stocking and selling of CD, stress: "We are not knocking CD by bringing all these points up. We want things to go on being good and not backslide into the way they are with vinyl albums, Perhaps if the CD specialists got together the record companies would listen more companies would listen more carefully.







many of which have never been pre-viously released before.

The rock and roll specialist label
Magnum Force Records has just re-leased a new compilation of Fury leased a new compilation of Put tracks, Loving You, compiled by Lisa Rosen, the singer's long-standing girl-friend, and there are plans to follow it up with another

plans to follow it up with another volume later in the year.
"Reaction to the LP has been very good," says Adrian Owlett of the Magnum Music Group. "Most of Billy Fury's hits were for Decca Records between 1959 and 1966, but there was a period after that when he was signed to EMI's Parlohops label and recorded some 75 phone label and recorded some 75 tracks, most of which never saw the light of day.

'The two albums that we releasing on the Magnum Force label are filling an important gap in the Fury discography, bridging the early Decca hits with the comeback tracks he did for Polydor in the two

years before his death."
Compiling the albums in conjunction with MMG has naturally been a labour of love for Rosen, who nursed Fury through his various ill-

nesses. "Parlophone did release several singles by Billy, but generally most of the recordings that he made, both at Abbey Road and the Pye Studios, just never got re-leased," she says.
"Because of Billy's heart com-

plaint, he was unable to work for a long time and there was a long period when he gave up the music business completely to concentrate on his farm and bird sanctuary in

"The tragedy of his death was that it came at a time when he was poised to make a major comeback. He had had two minor hits on Poly-dor and was confident that everything was going to start happening again for him." Since Fury's death in February

last year, Rosen has been involved with the Billy Fury Memorial Fund, which was established to buy medical equipment for research into heart disease and has donated to hospitals and research laboratories Response to the fund, from fans and Response to the fund, from fans and colleagues alike, has been "over-whelming," she says, and various items of important equipment have been given to various London

hospitals.



As an indie dealer serviced by Golds and Terry Blood, our only contact with what's available is through our *Music Master* and *Music Week*—and this leaves great the service of the servi holes in our knowledge of what to

We are especially referring to the new DG Walkman cassettes range — we have no idea what titles are available. Also, we read in *Music Week* that WEA is "dusting down" its midprice range under the slogan of "prime cuts". But what's available? I noticed the Doors LA Woman sleeve in the photograph accompanying the story; if that's now on midprice I had no idea.

Surely we independents dealing through wholesalers supplement the majors' sales and we would do a lot more if we had information. If we can't receive visits from reps. or receive publicity material, at least we could be mailed stock information, or have them passed on through the

Radio pirates will pay copyrights

I TOTALLY agree with Mike Berry's letter (MW April 28).

It's quite true that pirate radio stations such as the one I ran (Radio Sovereign) have tried to make payments to the various copyright bodies — we wrote on three occasions demanding to pay fees for the music we played, and no society

ever bothered to reply.

We talked with various musicians, and the general opinion was that they would rather have their product receive air play without a royalty, than receive no air play. Radio Sovereign now broadcasts from Northern Italy to the South of France, using very high power on FM. We applied to the copyright bodies over here to pay royalties and they welcomed us with open arms. I should perhaps point out that we are licensed by the Italian Government.

The recent clamp down by the British Government on pirate radio stations has been instigated by the IBA, who quite obviously are frightened of losing more and more listeners to the pirates. This means just one thing, they can't stand the competition. If this is so, they are in the wrong business, as someone once commented, competition healthy, and the radio situation in the US is a prime example!

It took the pirate radio stations of the Sixties to show the way for radio development in England, perhaps it will take the pirates of the Eighties to show the way for future radio development — especially

Academy celebrates a prolific 25 years

its 25th anniversary over the next two months. It is a significant date for the classical record industry, as no English orchestra has been more prolific in the classical studio over that period.

It has had only two directors throughout its quarter century: Neville Marriner, who founded and led the orchestra from the violin before broadening his career into symphonic (and now operatic) conducting; and lona Brown, who has proved an able leader as well as a fine soloist in the major concerto repertoire.

The main events centre around a week of concerts in June at the orchestra's first home, St Martin-in-the-Fields in Trafalgar Square, but both EMI and Philips are spreading a series of releases over both June and July each with one major popular title guaranteed to be best-sellers.

Ironically, the most popular from Philips is the one involving the Philharmonia rather than the Academy, but with Marriner conducting. It is a concert of lighter pieces from the piano repertoire, including Gershwin's Rhapsody In Blue, played by the young US pianist Misha Dichter. It is coupled with Richard Addinsell's evergreen Warsaw Concerto, a much-whistled tune since its use as the theme in the war-time film Dangerous Moonlight.

Misha Dichter also plays three other works, Litolff's Concerto Symphonique, Chopin's Fantasy on Polish Airs, and Liszt's Polonaise Brilliante (411 123 LP/MC/CD)

is a new recording of very popular classical pieces. It includes Jesu Joy Of Man's Desiring and Sheep May Safely Graze in arrangements by Marriner; Gluck's Dance Of The Blessed Spirits; the Nocturne from Borodin's String Quartet No 2, and Handel's The Arrival Of The Queen Of Sheba (ASD 1436421 and cassette).

Marriner also conducts his Minnesota Orchestra in well known works by Copland, Appalachian Spring, El Salon Mexico, and Four Dance Episodes from Rodeo (ASD 1436501 and cassette).

This month also sees the start of a complete new series of all Mozart's Serenades and Divertiment by the Academy using a chamber ensemble in the smaller works, and the larger orchestra in the Serenades. The first issue is the March in D and Divertimento in D K334 (411 102 LP/MC)

Mozart's Sinfonia Concertante in E Flat is interestingly played in a new reconstruction by Robert Levin on Philips recording coupled with the second recording, for Heinz Hollinger, of Mozart's Oboe Concerto (411 134 LP/MC). Aurele Nicolet, flute, Hermann Baumann, horn, and Klaus Thunemann, bassoon, are the other soloists, and the Academy is conducted by Marriner,

The final release in June is a collection of Double Concertos by Vivaldi playd by the Academy and Marriner

Festivities to publicise Glyndebourne Don Giovanni

GLYNDEBOURNE Opera's 50th anniversary cele-brations will ensure particularly good for its new recording Mozart's Don Giovanni, released by EMI this month.

Although it comes into a com-petitive field, it has the advantage of being contained on three discs, rather than the four used by the leading versions by Giulini (EMI) and Solti (Decca).

The Glyndebourne version is

based on the Peter Hall production with the reliable cast from 1982 performances with Thomas Allen in the title role and the London Philharmonic Orchestra conducted by Bernard Haitink (SLS 1436653 3-186/175). /2TCs).

EMI is also re-releasing the respected version of Mozart's Marriage Of Figaro made by the Glyndebourne Festival under Vittorio Gui in 1955, with Bruscantini in the title role, Sena Jurinac as the Countess, Calbrese as the Count, Countess, Calbrese as the Count, and Ian Wallace as Bartolo. This, however, will mainly interest collectors and Glyndebourne enthusiasts (EX 2900173 3-LPs/2MCs).

'Flapbox' for DG re-issues

A NEW series of double LP/cassette titles taken from back catalogue and issued at mid-price is being intro-duced by Deutsche Grammophon this month.

Although priced at the same level as Signature (£4.80 dealer price), the series will be distinguished only by a new sleeving concept. Instead of being contained in a double wallet or box, they come in a "flapbox", best described as being midway between the wallet/box systems.

It is space saving compared to the box, and cheaper for the manufacturers.

There are six titles in the first Collection ranging across the concert repertoire. There is Verdi's Requiem, in the performance conducted by Karajan (413 2151 GX2), and a generous coupling of Beethoven's Symphonies Nos 3 and 9, with the Vienna Philhormonic Orchestra conducted by Karl Bohm (413 2211 GX2).

There are two attractive piano

concerto compilations, Brahms' Piano Concertos played by Gilels and conducted by Jochum (413 2291 GX2) and Chopin's Piano Con-certos, plus the Piano Sonatas Nos 2 and 3, played by the fiery Martha Argerich conducted by Abbado and Rostropovich (413 2351 GX2). Chamber music is also included in the shape of Brahms' Piano Quartets played by Tamas Vasary and members of the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra (413 1941 GX2).

This is a surprising issue to be included as the recording was first published last year as part of the Brahms Edition, and there is no direct competition.

McCormack centenary

The first set is John McCormack Sings Popular Songs and Irish Ballads, a 2-LP/cassette set with everything from Silent Night to Bless This House and Down By The Sally Gardens (Ex 2900073). The second is The Art Of John McCormack, which covers the classical side of his work — songs and arias by Handel, Bach, Mozart, Schubert, Wagner, Brahms, Strauss, Tchaikovsky, Elgar, Quilter and many others. This is also a 2-LP/MC set, (Ex 2900563). Together the sets represent a very substantial part of McCormack's recordings

Companies battle over Bach

WITH COMPANIES building up for Bach's 300th anniversary next year, competition for sales of the organ works should be very strong.

Last month, Deutsche Grammophon issued the first of its "complete" series

with Ton Koopman playing a Baroque instrument — two collections of Toccatas and Fugues, and Passacaglias and Pastorales — but Decca have already established Peter Hurford's fine series using modern organs, on Argo.

Now Decca is releasing more individual LPs from the box sets — though not by pressing more single records or cassettes. One of the major selling points of the Hurford sets was that it was organised not chronologically or according to genre, but in the form of varied and entertaining programmes.

The company is now taking up a second option of following a "genre" pattern, as it does with this month's release: Toccata (411 824 and cassette) which includes the famous Toccata and Fugue in D minor, the Toccata, Adagio and Fugue in C major and the Passacaglia and Fugue in C minor.

Philip Jones: burgeoning brass

THE PHILIP Jones Brass Ensemble has expanded to include woodwind and percussion for its latest release a collection of the most popular works by Sousa.

Called Sousa: Marches, it in-cludes many of the most popular numbers such as Stars and Stripes Forever, Semper Fidelis, On Parade, The Directorate and The Liberty Bell (otherwise known as the Monty Python tune). It is conducted by Elgar Howarth, who directed one of the Ensemble's greatest successes
— the transcription of Pictures From An Exhibition.

Sousa is released on 410 290 LP and chrome cassette, but it is one of and chrome cassette, but it is one of two Philip Jones releases this month on Decca — for the group plays on a compilation of extrovert music for choir, brass, percussion and organ. Titled I Was Glad, it features the

Parry work and other grand English music with the Canterbury Cathedral Choir, conducted by Alan Wicks.

Authentic Nachtmusik

MOZART'S EINE Kleine Nachtmusik, perhaps his single most well-known composition, receives its first proper recording using authentic instruments on a new release on Decca's L'Oiseau Lyre label.

It is played by the Academy of Ancient Music, directed by Christopher Hogwood, and is coupled with the Serenata Notturna and Notturno (411 720 LP/MC), and was recorded after last year's Mostly Mozart Festival at the Barbican.

Interestingly, the Eine Kleine Nachtmusik Serenade includes an extra minuet and trio which appears to have been omitted early in the work's history.

Petri power from Philips

MICHALA PETRI, the young Danish recorder virtuoso, aims to confirm her popularity in this country by setting off on another tour of the UK with her family Petri Trio, supported by an article in the Sunday Telegraph colour magazine, and a new

graph colour magazine, and a new concerto sold on Philips.
She plays Concerti da Camera by Vivaldi (2-LP/MC 411 356) on which she is joined by other Philips' virtuosos, including Heinz Holliger, oboe, Feliz Ayo, violin, and Klaus Thunemann, bassoon.

Philips buys Kondrashin series

KIRILL KONDRASHIN, the Russian conductor who settled in Holland in 1975 after 19 years as permanent director of the Bolshoi, is the subject of a IO-LP series issued by Philips this year

Kondrashin, widely respected by Western orchestras, died unexpectedly in 1980 with extensive recording plans uncompleted. But Philips has acquired a series of live recordings he made with the Concertgebouw Orchestra taped by Dutch Radio, and the company is convinced that his reputation will provide a

The first five single LPs and cassettes are being issued this month, with the second five in the autumn. Many contain major repertory works and (although recorded on analogue), have been digitally remastered.



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

PSYCHEDELIC FURS: Ghost In You (CBS (T)A 4470. CBS). Not as immediate as the success Heaven but is still a very good atmospheric track with a great vocal from Butler and some nice harmonies. It is taken from their fantastic latest album Mirror Moves and features a new track Another Edge and a live version of President Gas.

MADONNA: Borderline (Sire W9260(T), WEA), A fantastic mid-tempo number taken from her debut album and remixed by John Jellybean Benitez. A throbbing bass synth and melodic strings make this a great dance number and it should continue her success from the hit

MARC ALMOND: The Boy Who Came Back (Some Bizzare/Phonogram BZS 23(12), PolyGram). A fast backbeat with a strong sleazy vocal that's underpinned by melodic piano and full, warm sounding trumpets. It is more along the lines of some of the Mambas material than Soft Cell but should bring him solo chart success.

DAVID SYLVIAN: Red Guitar (Virgin VS 633-(12), EMI). Subtle drum rhythms combine with a smooth bass line and Sylvian's soft drawl to produce an interesting and compelling single. Also features a new version of classic hit Forbidden Colours.

PETER GABRIEL: Walk Through The Fire (Virgin VS 689, EMI). A complex rhythm track of drum synths and congas gives a modern but ethnic feel, with Gabriel's characteristic vocals over heavy but melodic synths. Should get a lot of exposure as it is taken from the film Against All Odds.

After a long, mainly vocal intro this moves into a punchy, high energy dance beat with a heavy synth backing and a warbling vocal line. Overall has a certain sleazy feel and with the high amount of press this band has had it should do well.

DEE.C.LEE: Yippee-Yi-Yay (CBS (T)A 4377, CBS), A bright breezy up-tempo number from the girl who is better known from her previous work with Wham and The Style Council. This should bring her own success with its bluesy sax and memorable chanted chorus.

J.B.'S ALLSTARS: Sign On The Dotted Line (RCA Victor RCA(T) 408, RCA). High energy Sixties' style soul with a powerful vocal by Dee Sharp. Features a strong horn section and some nice vocal harmonies, which should see it reach the charts.

FICTION FACTORY: All Or Nothing (CBS (T)A 4453. CBS). This has a commercial sound, with its funky bass and very Martin Fry type vocals punctuated by an intricate keyboard arrangement. Slick pop that has been well produced by Alan Rankine.

BRILLIANT: Soul Murder (Food FOOD (SNAK 1), Cartel/Rough Trade). A powerful, heavy dance beat with a pounding bass and a short clipped guitar figure that combines with a soulful, catchy vocal. Also features some interesting effects and it should take them out of the indie market and into the main charts

CAMEO: Hangin' Downtown (Club/Phonogram JAB(X) 4, PolyGram). A pleasant cool soul ballad with a

fine production and some full rich vocal harmonies. Sure to pick up plenty of radio play and should do as well if not better than their last hit She's Strange.

KLEEER: Next Time It's For Real (Atlantic A 9699(T) WEA). A smooth, soulful dance track with some funky sliding bass and a bright bubbling synth line. With its deep, clear vocals and melodic harmonies this should be a

THE EARONS: Land Of Hunger (Island (12)IS 167, EMI). A hot club number with an intricate combination of rhythms and a reggae style vocal. A great mix with lots of percussion that should put it in the dance charts and create interest for the forthcoming LP Hear On Earth.

PAUL BLAKE AND THE BLOOD FIRE POSSEE: Rub-A-Dub Soldier (Revue/Creole REV 7008 (12"-008) PRT). An exciting slice of reggae with some heavy dub bass rhythms and a vibrant melodic vocal. A great summer record that, now it's been picked up, should crossover and do very well.

FRANKIE PAUL: Pass The TV-Sheng-Peng (Greensleeves GRED 147, Jet Star). A mellow number with backing by the Roots Radios, that features a heavy bubbling bass and some bright horns mixed in with a soft vocal about the pleasures of Tu-Sheng-Peng.

BLUE RONDO: Masked Moods (Virgin VS 676 (-12) EMI). Gives a lively jazz feel with its plodding double bass and warm bluesy guitar that combines with a rough nasal vocal. The B-side features a Latin style beat with plenty of percussion but it does get a bit repetitive.

WORKING WEEK: Venceremos (We Will Win) (Virgin VS 684 (-12), EMI). There are two versions of this Latin, VS 684 (-12), EMI). There are two versions of this Latin, jazz style number. One is slower and more atmospheric whilst the other is an up-tempo dance version. Both feature beautiful haunting vocals by Tracey Thorn and Robert Wyatt and some fine instrumental solos.

THE SID PRESLEY EXPERIENCE: Hup Two Three Four (ID.EYE (T)4, IDS). A great enthusiastic wall of sound for this no nonsense rock 'n' roll single. It's fast and noisy with blistering guitars and raw vocals. The flip side Public Enemy Number One, is more of the same with staccato drumming and raunchy machine gun guitaring.

PORTION CONTROL: Go-Talk (Illuminated ILL 4312, Rough Trade/Cartel/Jungle). A heavy alternative dancefloor cut with a crashing, beat and rough vocals over spluttering synths and effects. They have done well in the US dance charts but are confined to the indie market over

ANNABEL LAMB: So Lucky (A&M AM (X) 194, CBS). A commercial single of diluted reggae rhythms with melodic keyboards and her charismatic deep vocals. Could bring her chart success and so re-activate sales of the album The Flame from which it is taken.

RAISE THE DRAGON: The Blue Hour (LRS.IRS(X) 106, CBS). An interesting and stylish single with a languid slow beat and a prominent rich guitar sound that complements the melodic tuneful vocal. With enough exposure could do well as they are definitely a group to watch out for in the future

FURNITURE: Dancing The Hard Bargain (Survival SUR (12) 023, Pinnacle). An alternative jazz sound of complex drum rhythms and a bouncy organ plus a steamy, shrieking sax solo. This coupled with the rather flat vocal delivery and some scat backing vocals gives an original single that should appeal to the indie market

RESCUE: Tell Me Now (A&M AM (X) 191, CBS). A pleasant if ordinary tune with moody synths and echoed droning guitars that sound similar to early Cure. It has a chugging rhythm guitar and a vocal that, interestingly, strays off key.

HUSKER DU: Eight Miles High (SST SST 025, Pinnacle). A wild version of the Byrds classic, with over-driven distorting guitars and a strangled vocal manages to dispense with the melody of the original for a manic

BON JOVI: She Don't Know Me (Vertigo/Phonogram VER(X) 11, PolyGram). Melodic American rock with a straight beat and a completely unoriginal guitar style. Taken from their successful debut album of the same name but does not distinguish itself from anything else of this type.

Women take top three

FEMALE DOMINATION of the top three disco singles chart places continues, as the Pointer Sisters hold off strong challenges from Deniece Williams and Terri Wells. Women also account for half of Love Wars at number 6, while former chart-topper Jocelyn Brown is also still in the reckoning in eighth

position.

Of all these, the most likely to be the next chart-topper is Deniece Williams' Let's Hear It For The Boy, which has just carved itself into something of a legend in the US charts by achieving the incredibly rare triple number one status atop the pop, R&B and dance listings. It could also add top slots on both the UK disco/dance and pop singles charts to that tally, which would probably make it unique. probably make it unique.

Deniece has had a UK hit before; her debut ballad hit Free topped the pop chart in May 1977, in the days before the disco/dance charts began.

Most of the new entries into this week's Top 50 have a distinctly nostalgic feel about them. Most notable is McFadden & Whitehead's 1984 variation of their Ain't No Stoppin' smash, which also kicked up some dust a few weeks ago on import. Now on UK Buddah release (via PRT), it seems set to give both the duo and the label a taste of chart glory they've been missing for a while.

Much the same could be said for Billy Ocean with European Queen (No More Love On The Run), his first release for Jive which debuts at a strong 27. Ocean has been missing from the recording scene for some time due to contractual hassles, but in the late Seventies he scored a series of smash hits with GTO, including a pair of pop number twos with Love Really Hurts Without You and Red Light Spells Danger. 

Defiantly bouncy, glossy and superficial, the Go Go's are the essence of the sort of "all-girl" group that doesn't do their sister musicians any favours in the credibility stakes. High-quality airplay material, but too meaningless to sit and listen to. NONA HENDRIX: The Art Of Defence. RCA PL 84999. Another fine album from a lady who is consistently good, both as a songwriter and a performer, and whose day must surely come as a top-selling singles and albums artist.

JOHNNY WINTER: Guitar Slinger. Sonet SNTF 914. The bluesman's 14th album — and his first since leaving CBS in 1981 sees him surrounded by top players and producing a range of blues styles from the sensitive and moving to the loud and screaming. Worth the wait.

Chrysalis keeps faith with them, but interest which began to stir a while back is unlikely to be boosted by this release. However, the name must be familiar to record buyers, and the overall Roxy-cum-Spandavox sound is pleasant enough.

STANLEY CLARKE: Time Exposure. CBS EPC 25486. Could this man have been influenced by Herbie Hancock of late? With tracks like Are You Ready For The Future and Future Shock (although the latter bears little resemblance to Hancock's other than in title) this album sees Clarke being more progressive. With the unmistakeable Clarke bass, this album sees the addition of more synth and strong

soul vocals throughout giving an overall funk bias. Contains excellent version of Heaven Sent You.

AUSTRALIAN CRAWL: Semantics. Geffen GEF 25934. Producer: Mark Opitz. Very likeable, fairly cheerful (mostly) AOR, with unabrasive but quite clear transatlantic (rather than Pacific) flavour. Not their first UK appearance, but they are likely to have as much work to do as if it were.

LAURA BRANIGAN: Self Control. Atlantic K780147-1. Producers: Robbie Buchanan & Jack White. Third LP for this label from the singer who has had to live off her Gloria hit for an awfully long time. Good production, and she is certainly showing more self control than on the last two, which had a lot more energy than direction. This demonstrates that she has more emotional range (as opposed to mere overblown emotion) than hitherto expected, although the nasal quality of her vocals and the sub-Faithfull crack slightly get on the nerves after a while. Only another big single hit will get this one off the ground in the UK.

BRANFORD MARSALIS: Branford Marsalis. CBS 25952. Producer: Thomas Mowrey, A beautifully solid first LP with a satisfying range of mood and texture from Wynton's horn-playing brother Branford. There isn't an ounce of fat on any of the tracks as he demonstrates a fierce technique together with great sensitivity. Rich tenor and soprano work give a nod to jazz tradition, notably Coltrane and Mingus. Mingus.

CHANGE: Change Of Heart. WEA WX5. The group's fifth album but their first for WEA. Originally available on import, and attracting a lot of radio and club attention, Change Of Heart has all the musical hallmarks to be a big seller. The fortunes of the title track single look good too.

Karaoke machines to bear MPA OK for trial period

THE MUSIC Publishers Association council has recommended THE MUSIC Publishers Association council has recommended that, for the initial one-year trial period, the lyric sheets provided with the Karaoke singalong machines (MW April 7) should bear stickers to the effect that permission to reproduce the lyrics has been granted through the Mechanical Copyright Protection Society acting as agents for the UK copyright owners.

The MPA says this is a necessary measure in view of the dif-

ficulties involved in the complete reprinting of the lyric sheets. But if more than 1,000 copies of any one song are used, reprinting must be done with the correct UK copyright notice.

US approves UK action



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
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Zuma backs Kenny
