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CBS strengthens market position

CBS MAINTAINED and strengthened its dominant position in the UK record market during 1984, taking all four top market share awards at the Music Week Awards luncheon at the Dorchester Hotel in London this week.

With 16 per cent of the singles market and 17.2 pe cent of the albums market, CBS was lengths ahead of its competitors in the top company section, while Epic was a clear first as top label with 9.3 per cent, and CBS was top albums label with 7.7 per cent, followed by Epic with 7 per cent. WEA had its best singles market share figure since

WEA had its best singles market share figure since 1980 with 11.1 per cent, to take second place in the company section, followed by EMI, which slipped to equal third place with 9.1, alongside RCA, which maintained its position in singles and albums. EMI improved its albums market share in the company section compared to the last couple of years with 12.9 per cent, and WEA took third place with 9.8 — its best figure since 1981

with 9.8 — its best figure since 1981. Most other companies were relatively unchanged

ported by the offer of a 30-minute sampler cassette with the £1.99 price tag redeemable on purch-ase of one of the 12 titles. The dealer support will come

in the shape of display units --free with all orders of the full in the

posters, substantial range advertising back-up in quality journals and magazines and the free sampler cassette.

The 12 titles — including Pucci-ni's La Boheme and Manon Lescaut with Domingo, and Herold's ballet La Fille Mal Gardee — are to be promoted through 50 90-second spots on ITV. "We believe that these videos

are being increasingly regarded as 'collectables' rather than rent-ables," says NVC MD Philip Nugus.

"We don't know what Caruso and Melba sounded like when they sang in La Boheme in 1902, but future generations will know what Placido Domingo and Kiri Te Kanawa were like at their peak because we have recorded them.







RCA's classical renaissance

THE CLASSICAL wing of RCA is to emerge as a force in the market place from April a couple years "of comparative inactivity", Ralph Mace, newly appointed Divisional Director, Classical Music, RCA Europe, declared this week, writes Nicholas Soames.

declared this week, writes Nicholas Soames. With 80 new re-issue titles planned for release between April and December this year, the company "intends to attain our former presti-gious position in the classical business," added Mace. "We are re-forming our classical operation on a European basis with central release planning and manufacturing and we will, as from April, be commencing a series of regular releases including new recording from contract artists such as James Galway, Julian Bream, James Levine, Eduardo Mata and the Dallas Symphony, Leonard Slatkin and the St Louis Symphony Emmanuel Ax and the Guarneri Quartet. "In addition, we will be releasing many of the legendary recordings

"In addition, we will be releasing many of the legendary recordings from back catalogue." These will include items such as the Vaughan Williams Symphonies

conducted by Previn which has been much in demand — the first of these will be among the first monthly releases, and, like much of the re-issue material, they will come digitally re-mastered with DMM press-ings — made in Germany. Mace also said that he is looking to "expand the artist roster. We are

Mace also said that he is looking to "expand the artist roster. We are not looking for a large roster, but artists which whom we believe we can have a long-standing and profitable relationship." However, RCA will not be primarily looking for cross-over artists as it has done so strongly in the past. "Cross-over potential in classical music is something that emerges with time — and applies to all the really great musicians like Rachmaninov, Heifetz or Caruso," he remarked. While RCA's classical operation in the UK has been silent, it has remained active in the US and for the new releases, Mace will draw upon some of the recordings awaiting for first release over here. In any case, many of the 80 releases planned will be on CD for the first time. "We regard CD as the most important event in recording for 20 years," he said unequivocally. "The demands of the medium highlight the need for quality which is in any case what the customer now demands — the days when it was possible to make money for a second-rate recording are over."

MCPS highlights functions

THE MECHANICAL Copyright Protection Society (MCPS) is making an effort to increase awareness of its functions with an information pack explaining its activities in some detail.

As well as examining the principles of mechanical copyright in the general scheme of copyright law, the folder has brochures titled Mechanical Copyright and The Manufacture of Discs & Tapes, Independent Producers, Videograms, Non-Theatrical Audio Visual Presentations, Education, and Copyright Owners.

There is also a schedule of minimum rates for the licensing of MCPS members' mood music library works and recordings in films, TV, radio and video productions. Specimen music log/cue sheets are attached, plus a videogram rate card and the statutory notice for making records. The MCPS also draws attention to the fact that it is a society which collects and distributes mechanical royalties, and that registration of a work with the society does not establish copyright or accomplish anothing updage mechanical logeling as the properties of the there will be the provided of the status of t

Bullish Our Price plans growth more

THE Our Price retailing chain is aiming to continue expansion fol-

aiming to continue expansion foi-lowing the publication of a heal-thy interim report which showed pre-tax profits climbing from £445,000 to £592,000. Our Price chairman Garry Nes-bitt stressed the "broad scope and depth of repertoire" stocked throughout the chain as a key factor in its success and popular-ity as a retailer. And he told *Music Week* that OP stock ranged from indie singles to the classics, and that stocking extent was only limited by space considerations, particulary in the smaller premises taken over when Our Price acquired the Harlequin chain.

"We're now seeking new pre-mises to add to our operation with an area of 1,500 to 2,000 square feet minimum so that we can stock a wide selection," he said

Our Price shops are at present confined to a 100-mile radius from London (its Northampton branch is the furthest flung), and the chain claims 22 per cent of the retail market within 100 miles

of the metropolis and eight per cent of the national market. Nesbit forecast that there will be 100 OP outlets employing 750 by May, with the objective of 200 shops within the next two years. The expansion of the chain is governed partly by the availabil-ity of suitable premises in new locations, but mostly by the availability of suitable staff. The chain operates an exclusive poli-cy of promotion from within, appointing managers of new branches from staff who have risen from counter sales people. The chain is continuing with its

The chain is continuing with its records, cassettes and compact discs pattern of retailing, and is unconvinced so far about the viability of branching into com-Viability of branching into com-puter software on an appreciable scale. Nesbitt is also restrained in his appraisal of the compact disc. "It accounts for about three to four per cent of our turnover at present," he said. NEW YORK: The battle between CBS Records Group and the Digital Audio Disc Corporation, the CBS/Sony CD manufactur-ing plant in Terre Haute, Indiana, continues to rage. CBS maintains that plant yields are 50 per cent below the anticipated capacity — or less than 150,000 CDs per month. DADC has modified its initial response to CBS' refusal to accept further custom CD pression coders form a claim that the plant is further custom CD pressing orders from a claim that the plant is running at capacity to maintaining that five of six presses are operational. The sixth, according to DADC, is expected to be up

soon. DADC, however, will not comment on what percentage of DADC, however, will not comment on what percentage of production is actually usable. Plant officials also say they hope to double pressing capacity by early summer, and to be press-ing 1m discs monthly by the autumn. Given the difficulties that are apparent in getting the high-tech presses running, outsiders are sceptical that such goals can be reached that quickly. The situation is reminiscent of CBS' experience with CED video disc pressing at a Carrollton, Georgia, plant. CED was even closer to the process used for duplicating LPs, yet execu-tives candidly admitted early on that the switchover to a new process was far more complex than could have been antici-pated.

Long-term, at least, a pay-off appears likely with CDs, where-as CBS was forced to abandon CED duplicating just as the machinery was getting up to gear.

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Copyright abuse worry for White

CONCERN OVER the widespread abuse and misuse of copyright works with no payment was the main theme of Ron White's address at the annual meet of the International Federation of Popular Music Publishers

annual meet of the International Federation of Popular Music Publishers during Midem (MW February 9). White, managing director of EMI Music Publishing and president of the IFPMP was also worried by the apparent lack of comprehension in the world at large that copyright owners are not charitable institutions and deserve recompense for the fruits of their labours. "We've got to get to grips with new users," he told MW. "The satellite, computer music and cable people, and make sure they pay a fair rate." White is also hoping for some stability in the pound sterling and interest rates. Dollar advances demanded for deals are affecting all music nublishers

interest rates. Dollar auvalues demonded the music publishers. "Apart from one or two crazy people, we can't afford them" he said. "It's not being mean. Current sales and earnings don't justify it." Wearing both his MPA and EMI hats, White believes that the develop-ing situation affecting Chappell, Intersong and Carlin Music is a move in the right direction.

the right direction. "I'm encouraged by what I've seen so far regarding the merger. Uncertainty has inhibited Chappell over the last year, taking it out of the market. The new line-up offers powerful competition and I welcome it." Surveying the publishing scene as a whole, White concluded it's basically an arena for the big boys.

Dasically an arena for the big boys. "You can't live today on small acts. You need the megastars or a large catalogue behind you to survive and cover the horrendous overhead costs. Nonetheless, a small publisher can always shake the big ones hard. It's like having a ferret at your tail."



TONY HALL'S Brampton Music has extended its administration agreement with Mtume Music, which publishes the hits by the eponymous band, for a further three years. Among the tiles is Juicy Fruit, Mtume's million-selling hit for 1983.

The resolu-tion, drafted by the PRO and the Brian Mulroney, reminding him that last autumn's election which brought him to power has delayed a White Paper on copyright

revision and also that the "Throne Speech" of the Cana-dian Government in December dian 1983 had stated the intention of proceeding with copyright revision

The resolution ended by stating that "the General Assembly of CISAC requests that the Cana-dian Government proceed immediately to introduce new copyright legislation to protect authors' rights, particularly in light of rapid technological change."



Remote Luxury found in Australian Church

By John Best

THE CHURCH have just released their fourth album of melodic and mody pop/rock, Remote Luxury, on Carrere, with the signs that it will top the sales of last year's Seance. The latter release spent two-and-a-half months in the in-die chart, while the new LP could see them into the UK national charts for the first time. The Church can be considered

charts for the first time. The Church can be considered Australian, although singer, bass, keyboard player and chief song-writer, Steve Kilbey spent the first four years of his life in Welwyn Garden City, prior to his parents emigration to a township just outside Sydney for the grand sum of £10 as part of an Australian population drive.

lian population drive. "Remote Luxury was originally released as two EPs in Australia, the first in March 1984 and the second in August. And it came out as an LP in the US in August, and went really well on the indie and college radio scene, but it

didn't exactly have Prince looking over his shoulder," explains Kil-bey.

In Australia The Church have in Australia The Church have been a household name since early 1981, when their second single The Unguarded Moment went Top 20. By the middle of 1982 they had two gold LPs in their homeland. 1982 also saw The Church play

1982 also saw The Church play their first UK gigs, both as head-liners and support to Duran

"We pulled out of the 30-date Duran Duran tour after only seven dates. Not because the auseven dates. Not because the au-dience didn't like us, but because you could've put Jesus Christ on stage and they wouldn't have been interested," says Kilbey. The Church have long been compared to The Byrds, and now that REM have arrived to acclaim and cimilar comparisons the four

and similar comparisons, the four Australians are having to put up with suggestions that they are part of a bandwagon of post-REM groups, which would hardly

seem fair in view of their four year history. Fairness aside, melodic guitar

renaissance has got to be good news for The Church. As has the current high level of interest in all current nigh level of interest in all things Australian (although no suggestion of any Antipodean scene is being made). In fact any-thing that promotes music to sit down and listen to, rather than consume and forget like fast food, has to be seen as a good

thing. Kilbey's only worry is that now Carrere has foresaken its inde-pendent status for a distribution deal with PRT, the band will lose the exposure of the indie chart and risk getting lost in no-man's land between it and the national chart. But with features lined up in Sounds, NME and Kerrang! as well as radio interviews, and a forthcoming tour and single Kilbey's "ambient sketches" Kilbey's songs could soon be reaching an audience of more realistic proportions.

The Last Poets

THE LAST Poets are generally acknowledged by people who know about these things as one of the single greatest influences on contemporary black music, yet they have remained relatively unknown throughout their 15 years of rallying against worldly injustice.

In their tightly disciplined, rhythmic rants at London's Shaw Theatre lay the roots of rap. And the similarities with Gil Scottthe similarities with Gill Scott-Heron's anti-oppression mono-logues are too close to be coin-cidental. But if The Last Poets have been influential, then — as with The New York Dolls' role in spawning punk — they have been outstripped by what has fol-lowed lowed.

To a minimal backing of bass and bongos, the two rapping Poets overlaid voices that could have come straight from Top Cat, in circling and repetitious struc-tures, for which the meter was

tures, for which the meter was everything. While the spartan presentation meant that no-one could mis-understand the message, it also meant that they sounded like no-one so much as UK dread poet Benjamin Zephaniah — not the stuff locands are made of nation. stuff legends are made of particularly.

larly. Lyrically, The Poets are really too clever for their own good. Although the poems occasionally matched their mighty reputation, the lengthy between-song interludes became annoying, espe-cially when the more pompous of the two rappers went on in a patronising way about good and evil and right and wrong inters-persed with unabashed plugs for the LPs and thinly disguised bit-terness at their continued lack of recognition recognition.

But mass recognition for The Last Poets is not around the cor-Last poets is not around the cor-ner, because worthy though their hatred of oppression is, their apparent desire to be intellectual will never allow them to write

anything as simply incisive as, say, Nelson Mandela. They have a new LP, Oh My People, out on Celluloid soon, which will continue their which will continue their preaching to the hip intelligensia converted, but might at least spur someone else on, in the way they have in the past. JOHN BEST

THERE AREN'T many bands who can look back and say that their first gig together was in a BBC studio for the benefit of several million radio listeners. But that's the boast that Go West will be able to make when they reflect on the days of 1985.

used throughout the advertising campaign. C-More-Tone has been responsible for all Dire Straits sleeves since Twisting By The Pool, when the band decided they wanted something a shade more interesting and up-to-date than previous covers. Other recent C-More-Tone clients have

Judges comments on the winning single sleeve, Scritti Politti's Absolute, included "distinctive design that transfers well to ads/posters", "excellent graphic" and "unique visual". In the classical section, the Scriabin sleeve was a clear winner, with judges' comments including "The only sleeve to show any creative input", "a truly creative cover", "adventur-ous" and "effective".







THE TRANSITION from one half of Yazoo to a fully-fledged solo star has been successful to say the least for Alison "Alf" Moyet with three big hit singles and a number one album. Indeed so successful has been Moyet's solo launch that it doesn't seem possible that it is less than eight months ago since her first single Love Resurrection was released. CBS Records' efforts in establishing Moyet as a solo artist are rewarded by the fact that the company takes the top marketing award for

company takes the top marketing award for records, and also the top point-of-sale award. "What we needed to do was get the name of Alison Moyet across to all those people who had known her as Alf with Yazoo, while at the same time bringing her to an entirely new audience as a solo artist," says Kit Buckler, CBS Records senior product manager.

"We knew that the transition had to be car-ried out as naturally and as sympathetically as possible — during her period with Mute Re-cords, Alison had built up a lot of credibility and goodwill and we were aware that CBS could be open to criticism if we tried to re-shape her image too drastically " shape her image too drastically.

Moyet's first solo single Love Resurrection



was released in a picture bag but *without* a photograph of her; it just featured a graphic. "The success of that single gave us the confidence to use pictures of Alison looking as natural as possible on the follow-up, All Cried Out, and it was at this time that we also started the fly-posting campaign," Buckler adds. The Alf album was released on November 5, and CBS was faced with the task of recapturing the 300,000-plus fans who had bought the Upstairs At Eric's album by Yazoo, as well as attracting new fans. "We had between then and Christmas to sell as many albums as possible. The All Cried Out single gave Alison the chance to do TV work, including programmes like the Wogan show which was seen by 21 million viewers. There were also quite a few music paper interviews at this also quite a few music paper interviews at this time, but we did avoid the worst excesses of Fleet Street. "British Rail and London Underground was

utilised quite a lot for the campaign. With posters you reach a much wider age spectrum not just the kids but the mums and dads as well," Buckler explains. "In addition we did quite a lot of music press advertising to reach the younger end of the market." Even the promo videos for Moyet's singles were kept as simple as possible: "They were

made on a relatively small budget but again with someone like Alison Moyet, you don't need to have spectacular visual effects. The talent sells itself.









sales of Wings' Mull Of Kintyre, the previous all-time top-selling single) and shipped more than seven million units worldwide.

The record has been number one in Austria, Switzerland, Holland, Belgium, Italy and Ireland, and a top 10 hit in the US, Canada, West Germany and Australia. Its US sale of 2.5 million was the highest in that country since Chic's Le Freak topped four million in 1978.

The history of Band Aid real-ly needs no repeating, so successful has been the pro-

ject. Do They Know It's Christmas? was written by the Boomtown Rats' Bob Geldof and Midge Ure, who also organised the recording session, carried out under hush-hush conditions in a London recording studio early one Sunday

Ing studio early one Sunday morning. The list of artists involved was a "who's who" of British pop music: Wham!, Ultravox, U2, Paul Young, Status Quo, Culture Club, Bananarama, Duran Duran, Heaven 17, Phil Collice Spandau, Ballot and Collins, Spandau Ballet and Sting were just some of the names who appeared on the session.

Everyone involved in making, marketing, promoting and distributing the single gave their services free including sleeve designer Peter Blake, Sarm West Studios, Phono-gram and PolyGram distribution. And a lot of credit must go to Bob Geldof who personally got the project off the ground and who has now in-spired top US pop names to do their own similar project.

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

JUDGES FOR the Leslie Perrin PR Award are always briefed by *Music* Week editor Rodney Burbeck to look for those outstanding qualities of flair and originality, combined with good old fashioned slog and attention to details, that stamped the work of Perrin himself — the doyen of music PR men in the Sixties. In 1984 one PR campaign stood out on all those fronts — the ZTT/Island campaign for Frankie Goes To Hollywood. In the nomination presentation made by the Island press office, they made it clear that this was a collaboration between ZTT's Paul Morley and Island's Rob Partridge and Regine Moylett. Morley was responsible for the presentation (press releases, photo sessions etc), while Island ensured the smooth running of the mechanics of the campaign.

campaign. The judges took into account the self-generating nature of the publicity which surrounded FGTH in 1984 but agreed that behind it was a very well orchestrated campaign showing great originality and breaking most of the ground rules. "It dosn't always follow that the biggest hit record of the year has the best PR campaign behind it, as previous Leslie Perrin PR awards have shown," said Burbeck. "But this year we were unanimous in voting ZTT and Island as clear winners." Lee Leschasin of the Polydor press office took second place for her work on establishing Lloyd Cole & The Commotions, which the judges thought was the best campaign for a relatively unknown artist; and Capitol Records' Debbie Bennett's campaign to help re-establish Tina Turner came third.



CARMEN: Conifer is confident of major success for chartable soundtrack

£90,000 pop-style campaign for "action-packed" opera film with new approach

Conifer's Carmen 'extravaganza'

CONIFER IS expecting a dramatic sales boost next month when the atmospheric film of the most popular of all operas, Bizet's Car-men, opens in London backed by

men, opens in London backed by a £90,000 marketing campaign. Francesco Rosi's film stars Julia Migenes Johnson, now featuring in a peak-time Sunday Channel Four programme, and Placido Domingo, and uses a soundtrack available on the Erato

soundtrack available on the Erato label, imported by Conifer. The marketing campaign is to be organised jointly by distribu-tor Virgin and Conifer: "We are selling it as a piece of entertain-ing cinema rather than as an opera for the opera buffs only," says Dominique Green, film dis-tribution manager at Virgin Films. "We are aiming to go two or three steps beyond the art-house circuit, because we are convinced

circuit, because we are convinced that Carmen will be seen as an exciting, commercial movie, if the people are informed that it is action-packed spectacular, which it is

"I think that Carmen will benefit from the recent release of La Tra-viata, because that showed that you don't have to be an experi-enced opera goer to enjoy an opera on film, and in any case, everybody knows the main tunes from Carmen," she adds.

Carmen opens at the Lumiere Cinema, London, on March 14 for a minimum run of eight weeks. During that time, there will be Screenings in Edinburgh, Bristol, Cambridge and other cities; and by the end of April it will be screened on the Rank circuit with between 35-40 playdates.

between 35-40 playdates. The major poster campaign will be handled by Virgin, but Conifer is organising the market-ing of the single LP/tape/CD soundtrack album (NUM/MCE 75120-ECD 88041) and the com-plete opera, (NUM/MCE 751133 3LP/tape -ECD 980373 3CDs) con-ducted by Lorin Maazel. The soundtrack album has already sold 500,000 units and the complete opera 750.000 units

the complete opera 750,000 units

abroad, and since the release of the complete opera in the UK last March, it has sold "thousands of units, well above normal opera figures," according to Conifer's John Kehoe.

In fact, Cohifer is so convinced that it has a major sales success on its hands, that it is engaging the services of a plugger, some the services of a plugger, some-thing that rarely happens to clas-sical records. "We believe that the soundtrack album is definite-ly chartable," says Kehoe. Conifer is organising extensive point of sale material and nation-wide shop and cinema displays, timed to coincide with local

timed to coincide with local showings of the film. It starts with a number of prestigious London sites, including Virgin's Megas-tore in Oxford Street.

With the film being shown throughout the country well into September and the autumn, it is felt that Carmen-awareness will be very high indeed, backed, as it will be, by extensive newspaper and magazine advertising.

Two weeks ago a Music Week consumer reader challenged the BPI's case for a blank tape levy. In this article the BPI re-states its position ...

THE BPI's argument for a royalty on blank tape and recording hardware rests simply in the wish of record producers to be farly paid for use of their copyright material. The industry is not seeking a subsidy or a grant, or to be bailed out in difficult financial times. It is not even incumbent upon the industry to show that it has suffered loss through home-taping, but the fact that it has suffered massive reductions in its potential market simply spurs the determination to put right a very considerable wrong. The nousand million pounds, but it is inportant to get the fact straight because they are often misunderstood or frequently deliberately misquoted. Research evidence has provided time and time again undeniable and incontrovertible evidence that record companies suffer loss as a result of home taping.  Many myths have pervaded the debate on the home-taping issue. Amongst the his the impression put about that the record industry gazes wisfully back at the halcyon days of the mid-Stites. Much more music is sold now than it was shattering by burgeoning blank tape sales and rapidly increasing genetration of tape recorders.
 Real growth between 1965 and 1975 has been described as only 135%! This was a wonderful achievement; but since 1975 the real value of recorded music sales has fallen by 27% and that is during a period when record prices have become comparatively much lower and record and tape players have become more widely available.
 Further real growth during 1975/85 should have been at least another 135% — but we have seen a fall. The wholesale value of sales last year was £329m, but to match the 1975 level the figure should have been £450m. To have continued the patient of pre-recorded records and tapes can't be blamed. They are phenomenally good value. In real terms they are at about two-thrids of the level of 10 years ago, and to an extent prices have been forced down by unfair competition from blank tapes.
 Bahk tape is not a rival to the pre-recorded tape or disc — it is a parasite. It is only cheap because a massive market has grown up around illegal use. People who copy music have create

DARYL HALL and John Oates' success in the UK is long-overdue — for several years they were always on the periphery of big chart success but only in the last two years have they finally attained the status of superstardom that so long evaded them. A timely book publication Dangerous Dances is an official documenta-tion of their long rise to success and fortune. It features early family photographs along with photos from their very early years as a duo in Philadelphia, their home town.

Philadelphia, their home town. Hall and Oates themselves have contributed to the text, and there are well over 100 black and white photographs, as well as 16 pages of colour, and drawings by Daryl Hall. Many of the pictures are from the duo's own personal collections and are published for the first time. Daryl Hall and John Oates have sold 40 million records to date which makes them the most successful pop duo in the history of contemporary music. If only a very small fraction of their fans buy this book, then it should still do very well indeed. The complete violin

THE VIOLIN is a universal instrument found in one form or another in most cultures, but nowhere has it been brought to such a pinnacle of achievement as in its western form. Dominic Gill's *The Book Of The Violin* is a celebration of this fact. A handsome and beautifully presented volume, which combines the appearance of that much-maligned coffee table book with learned, eclectic and searching content, follows the pattern of his much acclaimed The Book Of The Piano. It contains a series of essays written by musicians active as writers, critics, thinkers, makers and performers and therefore the words carry the fruit of experience rather than academic regurgitation. For instance, the violin maker David Rubio discusses The Anatomy Of The Violin, and Nicholas Kenyon, early music critic for *The Times* and *Gramophone* writes two separate chapters on the Baroque and Classical Violin. Hans Keller contributes a typically challenging consideration of Violin Technique: Its Modern Development And Musical Decline, while the compass of the book, and the lack of prejudice of its editor, has brought forth an equally interesting essay from Wilfred Mellers on the folk fiddle and the jazz violin, leading to Dave Swarbrick and Stephane Grappelli.

Grappelli. Everywhere, the illustrations add depth and often humour to the text, as the playing styles and the music is shown evolving side by side through the centuries: even small touches, such as a photo of Enescu containing a dedication to his youthful pupil Menuhin "To my old, young friend Yehudi," helps to bring the music and musicians alive. And musicians play an important part, for throughout the ages it was the virtuosity of players from Locatelli to Paganini to Huberman and Szigeti that helped shaped the music. There is even a discography — a highly personalised one, admits Gill, but one that surveys the vast range of repertoire. Altogether, this book is a feast.
