And they are warning that the Government's suggested levy of Government's suggested levy of 10 per cent on audio tape and five per cent on video tape would in fact be up to 20 per cent "in real terms" after mark-ups and Vat. "On an average 90-minute audio cassette costing £1 that represents a major price increase which would bit the public averal

which would hit the public as well as the retail and manufacturing industries," Christopher Hobbs, chairman of the TMG, told a press conference last week.

 A levy on records and tapes. The TMG has also released figures from its own survey of home-taping habits which sug-gests that less than 22 per cent of the population buy blank tape for any purpose. They contrast this with the BPI's figure of 44 per cent of the public home-taping. And they claim that almost 70 per cent of record taping is of tapers' own records and that over 25 per cent is to preserve records in good condition. It concludes that home-taping

is much less widespread than the Government believes, and is by

no means always carried out to avoid buying records. The TMG also points out that while record and pre-recorded tape sales have increased, blank

tape sales have increased, blank audio tape sales have remained "relatively static" recently. The BPI and other music in-dustry bodies are finalising their own submissions on the Green Paper proposals which will be announced shortly.

New PolyGram merger talks

NEW YORK: PolyGram is in-volved in merger talks again — this time with Alan Hirschfield, who negotiated the purchase of Atlantic Records for Warner in the Sixties and who later helped found Arista Records while at Columbia Pictures. He is heading a group of investors seeking to purchase a majority share in PolyGram Records.

The deal would give the Hirschfield group 80 per cent of the company's US record opera-tions and 50 per cent of its over-seas division. As in the past, Hirschfield would be expected to bring in a management team to take over the day-to-day running of the company.
Meanwhile, Warner Com-

Meanwhile, Warner Com-munications, a former PolyGram

suitor, is the subject of reports that chairman Steve Ross is investigating the possibility of a leverage buy-out that would take the company private.

Wall Street analysts say that if Ross can sell off some of the company's unprofitable divisions in order to pay off existing debts, such a buy-out would be possible.

A PolyGram spokesperson commented that the company has been talking to several potenhas been taking to sectors in pro-tial merger partners and this process will continue while "ther are further candidates available" It was added that there was no point, at this stage, in announc-ing the name of any potential partner.



AFTER 20 years with CBS Re-cords, the UK music industry's best-known and most-respected figure, Maurice Oberstein, has announced his "retirement". Oberstein, known to everyone in the business as Obie, will quit his position as chairman of CBS Records UK at the end of June, when his two-year term as chairwhen his two-year term as chair-man of the BPI also comes to an end. He will then take a six-month break, but promises that he intends to return to the music in-

dustry in some capacity. As he puts it: "After 20 years with CBS it is time to re-group. CBS made all the right approaches to induce me to stay on, but I think it is time to move on

on." The 56-year-old American will remain in London, his home since moving here in 1965 to help set up CBS as an independent company. "I'm staying in this country for ever, and that's offi-cial," he told MW. Industry spe-culation has suggested that CBS had earmarked a new position for him in the US parent company

him in the US parent company. Obie's retirement from CBS has been rumoured for some weeks and was confirmed at CBS International's annual convention in Hawaii. Obie announced his decision to UK staff last week. Born in New York, he is the son

of the late Eli Oberstein, one-time head of A&R at RCA Records who worked with Perry Como and The

Dorseys, pioneered the recording of rhythm and blues, and was elected a member of the Country Music Hall of Fame in Nashville. Obie is a graduate chemical en-gineer from Clarkson Tech and a LL.B from New York University. He joined CBS Records in the US in 1965 after a spell runing his own budget label, Rondo Re-cords cords.

cords. He came to the UK as director of operations, setting up the Aylesbury plant and Barlby Road distribution centre. He was also a director of marketing and sales and was appointed managing director and later chairman. It is acknowledged that his canny business acumen and man-management techniques contri-buted greatly to establishing CBS buted greatly to establishing CBS as the UK's most successful record company.



THE DECISION by the European Commission of Human Rights to examine the validity of Anton Pil-ler orders (*MW*, Mar 23) — the court "search and seize" warrants widely used in anti-piracy operations — should not affect their usefulness to the music in-

Patrick Isherwood, the BPI's legal adviser, last week examined a statement from the commission which outlined why it gave its support to a submission from Somerset video dealer Anthony Chappell that there were insuffi-cient safeguards on Anton Piller orders. "The BPI understands that the case before the commis-

sion is restricted to the special sion is restricted to the special facts in the Chappell case relating to the execution of an Anton Pil-ler order — in this case in com-bination with a police search war-

"The general principle of an Anton Piller order is unaffected and the BPI intends to use it in all appropriate cases."

The commission is now ex-amining whether the orders are contrary to European agreements on human rights. The UK Government has a history, though, of ignoring commission findings against it and a finding that Anton Piller orders do break the rules is likely to have little effect.

EMI plans for Soviet star


By NICOLAS SOAMES EMI'S CLASSICAL division is planning a busy year of recording sessions following the news that the Soviet planist Andrei Gavrilov and his wife Natasha have been granted a year's UK residency by the British and Soviet authorities

Soviet authorities. The company has wanted to record the pianist extensively for over seven years, particularly since his first EMI recording, of Ravel's Piano Concerto to the Left Hand and Prokofiev's Piano Concerto No 1 with the LSO under Rattle won the *Gramophone* Best Concerto Award in 1978. This followed international recognition achieved when he won the prestigious International Tchaikovsky Piano Competition in 1974.

The news of Gazvilov's extended stay in this country comes just after EMI signed an exclusive contract with him, which however, has certain flexibility because the company can rely on only 12 months of recording sessions. For after a year's UK residency, Gavrilov may choose to return to the USSR to the USSR

to the USSR. But work has already begun on Gavrilov issues. His award-winning recordings come back into the catalogue this month in EMI's new mid-price Master series — each concerto coupled with solo material; and a recording of Chopin, including the Ballades — and Bach's French Suites, recorded in Moscow by EMI will come out later this year. This month also sees the arrival of the first Gavrilov CD, a volume of music by Skryabin, recorded in Prague because of the restrictions placed upon the planst

placed upon the pianist.





Jackson king of music vid

From IRA MAYER NEW YORK: Latest estimates indicate that the seven all-time best music video sellers have moved a total of 1.085m units with a wholesale value of approximately \$20m. Retail list prices range from 9.95 for Band Aid's Do They Know It's Christmas? to \$59.95 for MGM/UA's The Compleat Beatles. Most long-form music video titles, however, are being issued at \$29.95, with the notable exception of RCA/Columbia's seven song Go-Gos set, which sells for \$14.95. The same studio has used the latter price for a four-song Lionel Richie tape — which, buoyed by the artist's best selling album and high visibility in commercials astonishing 110,000 copies since release last month.

astonishing 110,000 copies since release last month. But while the unit volume on the Richie programme makes it

astonishing 110,000 copies since release last moment. But while the unit volume on the Richie programme makes it the third all-time music best seller, topped only by Vestron's Making of Michael Jackson's Thriller (600,000 units) and Video Rewind by the Rolling Stones (120,000), it comes No. 6 when ranked by dollar volume — the non-profit Do They Know It's Christmas? being the only lower grossing title on the list. The best sellers, as estimated by *Video Marketing* based on cumulative sales are: Making of Michael Jackson's Thriller (Ves-tron: 600,000 units; S10.8m); Video Rewinds (Vestron: 120,000 units; \$2.2m); Lionel Richie (RCA/Columbia: 110,000 units; \$987,000); Compleat Beatles (MGM/UA: 80,000 units; \$2.9m); Do They Know Its' Christmas? (Vestron: 75,000 units; \$2.9m); Do They Know Its' Christmas? (Vestron: 75,000 units; 713,000); Neil Diamond (Vestron: 55,000 units; \$1.3m). The Duran Duran programme, incidentally, was originally re-leased at \$59.95 list and later repriced at \$29.95. The tape is believed to have sold 25,000 units at the original price (and at the

believed to have sold 25,000 units at the original price (and at the height of the band's popularity), and an additional 20,000 units

at the lower price. Of related note: Disney's DTV series, consisting of classic rock, pop and R&B songs as originally recorded but coupled with animation from the Disney library, has done extremely well. Three titles in the series, Golden Oldies, Pop & Rock, and Rock,

Three titles in the series, Golden Oldies, Pop & Rock, and Rock, Rhythm & Blues, have each been certified platinum by the RIAA. Only seven music tapes had been certified gold and three platinum by the RIAA between 1981 and 1984, though under new rules governing certification of non-theatrical video releases which went into effect on January 1, platinum now indicates sales of 40,000 units; previous platinum awards in the category were based on the same scale as theatrical releases: 75,000 units.

were based on the same scale as theatrical releases: 75,000 units. Among video speciality dealers, music video accounts for less than three per cent of all rental transactions — or about 100 rentals per month. Interestingly, extrapolating video 45s from other types of music video, the video 45s account for about one-quarter of music video rentals. This proportion is reversed when sales are examined, with two-thirds of music video sales being of Sony's short-form releases.

TAMPA: The compact disc in its current state of development is merely the first link in a string of connoisseur-quality audio components and the foundation upon which the next generation of digital sound and CDbased products will be built.

That is the recurring theme from the 15th annual meeting of the International Tape/Disc Association (ITA) in Tampa. While speakers and International Tape/Disc Association (ITA) in Tampa. While speakers and panellists may have disagreed over whether, for example, CD-ROM is a product of the here-and-now (Sony's John Hartigan and 3M's Frank Price) or a fantasy for the future (Almon Clegg, Matsushita), all concur-red that the potential for improved sound quality is enormous. Robert Barone of Electro Sound defined the challenges for the industry as developing new tapes and high-speed duplication equip-ment to accommodate both digital-to-digital sound and digital-to-

analog sound.


A certain scepticism was to be expected from the unusually pragmatic "provocative") of one seminar: "What Price Quality? Audio Cassettes Can Be Made Better, But Who Will Pay The Price?" yet there was mounting evidence that a premium can be exacted for certain pre-recorded material. recorded material

CBS's Seymour Gartenberg suggested that purveyors of pre-recorded cassettes are competing with the quality of tapes consumers make themselves — but added that so far CBS is duplicating only classical and

themselves — but added that so far CBS is duplicating only classical and selected hit pop titles on high grade chromium dioxide tape. The dividing line on the pop selections: those with a wholesale price equivalent to a \$9.98 list (CBS has no formal list prices). The extent to which the public is willing to pay a premium for audiophile cassettes was seen as limited — but changing. The high interest in CD players, for example, leads some tape manufacturers to believe that there will be growing demand for high-end blank tape and high-end pre-precorded cassettes. high-end pre-recorded cassettes. CD, goes this line of reasoning, will also lead to demand for the next

generation of audio products, including digital audiotape recording and playback for the home. Once consumers get accustomed to superior audio, they find it hard to go back to LPs or standard audio cassettes. Matsushita's T Kogure offered an extensive technical description of digital audio tape configurations that are now being considered for

digital audio tape configurations that are now being considered for standardization. While these specifications were beyond the under-standing of most attendees, CBS's Gartenberg offered statistics demon-strating the high interest CD player owners have in replacing their libraries. And where will all these developments lead? A growing integration of audio and visual media, including still-frame video with sound, interactivity, and ever-improved technologies for delivering all manner of software into the home.



SENIOR vice-president CBS Seymour Gartenberg hinted that the final demise of the LP may be secured by the end of the decade, a victim of the surge in popularity of cassettes and compact discs.

Though he warned an ITA seminar that it was premature to announce the LP dead, he said: "We expect the format to remain a major part of our product mix probably through to the end of this decade and perhaps beyond."

That scenario effectively puts the demise of the LP — a stanthe demise of the LP — a stan-dard for 30 years — as happening over approximately a seven year period. According to CBS Re-cords' market research division, cassettes accounted for 61 per-cent of shipments last year — including non-retail distribution - and one percent CDs. The re-maining 38 percent were LPs.

The growth in the cassette for-mat, due to improved quality of stationary systems and the ad-vent of portable units, has been clearly documented. However, the current excitement over CD stems as much from retailer de-mand, per se, as from the discov-ery that player owners buy more discs than was ownered and as discs than was expected, and are more eager to replace LPs with CDs than could have been anticipated

Gartenberg said: "There has been a near-explosion in CD sales that has been much greater than anything our market research people predicted."

THE CONTRACTUAL battle between heavy metal band Saxon and record company Carrere has moved back to the French courts where the band is claiming breach of contract and Carrere is seeking damages for what it sees as Saxon walking out on a valid recording deal. The dispute first came to court in Paris a year ago when Saxon


claimed their contract to be terminated because they had received no advance for a compilation album released in Germany. Carrere argued that no advance was due on the mid-price album which was not released in any other country. The company claimed that meant the contract was intact.

contract was intact. The case follows on from last week's refusal by a High Court judge in London (*MW* March 30) to grant Carrere an injunction banning Saxon from recording for EMI, the company which signed the band in January. Saxon claimed in court that they were free to negotiate a new deal but Carrere said they were still on its books. The judge made no comment as to the merits of the arguments but refused the injunction because he felt it would not be fair to stop Saxon comments and the the premeres result finally to decide the once



When the action is heard in France - and French courts are notorious When the action is heard in France — and French courts are notorious-ly slow — Carrere will be asking for damages from both the band and EMI. EMI's lawyers in England claim, though, that their company is not involved in the action in France and that it will take another writ from Carrere for a damages claim against EMI to be heard.









New indies advice service

A NEW music business advisory service intended to "plug a hole in the A NEW music business advisory service intended to "plug a hole in the independent sector" has been formed by John Bassett, an original founder member of the recently demised Independent Labels Associa-tion. The Independent Labels Advisory Service (ILAS) will not however be restricted to use by just indie labels and, unlike the ILA which was a non-profit making organisation, will be run on commercial lines. Bassett, who is also involved with Music Industry Services, which recently went into record distribution, has started ILAS in partnership with another music industry veteran, Mike Kitson. The company will act as a consultancy, supplying information and advice on all aspects of the

as a consultancy, supplying information and advice on all aspects of the

as a consultancy, supplying information and advice on all aspects of the music industry. Kitson said: "The ILAS has been created to assist independent music and record companies with the standard day to day problems and business affairs of the current industry environment. The recent demise of the ILA has left a hole which we intend to plug. Unlike the newly-formed Independent Phonographic Industry organisation however, we will be an information service as opposed to a political body." Kitson added: "The ILAS will also be completely autonomous from MIS, and clients will not be obligated in any way to use the services available from the latter."



But on Thursday (29) Oberstein told Music Week that he would be But on Thursday (29) Oberstein fold *Music Week* that he would be using his influence as head of CBS and chairman of the BPI to persuade the chains to stock it. On Friday, a Woolworths spokesman declared: "In the light of further discussions with our suppliers, Woolworths will be stocking USA For Africa." A Smiths spokesman confirmed his com-pany's co-operation and added: "We are now satisfied with the new arrangements for handling this record. We will not be making any profit." profit

Virgin agreed to stock We Are The World from the first and HMV confirmed last week that it would also be doing so. Boots re-stated it would not be carrying the record because of its committment to famine relief through its own initiatives. Our Price has made no statement on the issue but is understood not to be stocking the record which was

the issue but is understood not to be stocking the record which was officially released on Monday (1). Oberstein commented: "I hope people are not going to look upon this record as any less credible, valuable or beneficial because it's American and not British. Anything that is done for Ethiopia is all part of the same effort." He added: "I would never allow this thing to be in any way an advantage to CBS."

He said he could not give a breakdown of where the money would be He said he could not give a breakdown of where the money would be going because of the complexities of the US licensing deal but he gave an assurance that the maximum possible would be sent to Ethiopia. Another US single being sold in aid of Ethiopia — titled Ethiopia by The Band AKA — is being exported to the UK through Win Records in New York, and negotiations for UK release are underway with several labels. All net proceeds are going to the Ethiopia Famine Relief Fund, administered through World Vision Ethiopia Relief.



HOMESPUN RECORDS has taken the unusual step of releasing Barn-brack's Belfast as a cassette-single. This single has already been a hit for the Northern Ireland indie.

the Northern Ireland indie. The Belfast-based folk group's single has been a steady seller for several weeks and spent the last three weeks in the lower region of the national chart. Billy McBurney of the Outlet Recording Company in Belfast said: "The cassette seems to have made an impression on the dealer and the record buyer — it isn't exactly a new idea but you could say it is our gesture against home-taping." Homespun is also re-issuing the Ann Breen single Pal Of My Cradle Days which was first released in 1981 and has spent more than 60 weeks in the top 200 without ever becoming a top 50 hit. The record was featured on a recent Granada TV Mother's Day special and after the TV station received "stacks of mail" Homespun has decided to re-promote it in a new picture sleeve.

The set will include eight pre-viously unissued recordings and five tracks that were previously only available as part of a box-set, as well as Cochran hits like Summertime Blues, Weekend, Something Else and C'Mon Ev-ervbody.

 EMI is also re-issuing two singles — The Beatles' Ticket To Ride, available as a picture disc and in a picture bag, and Kenny Rogers' The Gambler which coincides with a three-part TV western adventure mini-series





Is the MU the key needletime 10

REPRESENTING A member company of PPL, I read with interest the letter published in *Music Week* (March 23) from PPL general manager, John Love. We expected he would give a gentle restatement of details in response to issues arising from the Radio Academy Conference — but the general statement, often repeated by Mr Love, deserves comment.

He claims that PPL represents its 500 members as an "honest broker" between the BBC, ILB and the MU. The balance of 475 members may well believe that PPL policy on needletime and royalty levels represents the interests of only the 25 'A' members who, estimating from PPL royalty payments, control 90 per cent of the needletime. If justified, the belief has far-reaching implications.

needletime. If justified, the belief has far-reaching implications. Currently PPL helps to maintain a system geared towards the creation of a very few wealthy superstars at the expense of other musicians. Superstars are created by a handful of record companies, and the vast costs involved prevent competition from hundreds of less well financed companies. Robin Valk, music manager of BRMB, speaking at the Radio Academy confer-ence, supported this claim by stating: "The record companies have an obsession with a quick return on high investment, and music takes a back seat." And the position is highlighted by the judgement in the Ray Jackson/EMI action. Robin Valk also described how broadcatters help to maintain the superstar.

position is highlighted by the judgement in the Ray Jackson/EMI action. Robin Valk also described how broadcasters help to maintain the superstar system. He explained to the conference that he spent 30 minutes turing his radio to various local and national radio stations and was led to conclude: "It was a tedious and repetitious half-hour. We all sounded like we had the same 10 records sent out by the same major record companies. There is a lemming-like inclination to rush to the security of the Top 30. We lack courage, and are afraid to back our own judgement in prime time." As "honest broker," PL should help the radio stations to back their own judgement by encouraging a fairer distribution of needletime amongst the 500 PPL members, and by considering accommodations in policy relating to needletime and royalty levels.

And royally levels Regrettably, PPL is unlikely to want this kind of change because its board of directors consists entirely of representatives from the 25 companies who control 90 per cent of the needletime. (They have agreed in principle to appoint *one* other, presumably well chosen, member to the board.) Perhaps the key does lie with the MU, as stated by Derek Chinnery in his speech to the Radio Academy conference on the day before he retired as controller of Radio One. A fairer distribution of needletime would create job opportunities for a much greater number of musicians than the superstar system, and even opportu-nities for playing live would increase — as any band without a reasonably successful single will know. But the MU is unlikely to act unless its members start to create some noise, at local meetings for example, and this is a long-winded process which could be overtaken by the PPL negotiations with the BBC due now These columns are not the place for discussion of specific suggestions or

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

EMI revamps re-issues with HMV Master series

EMI'S REISSUE programme, which for some time has been in need of a major revamp, assumes a new character this month with the introduction of an upper and mid price series to go with the two lower-mid-price series, Greensleeves and Treasury.

ASSICA

It is called HMV Master Series and it is clearly designed to compete with Philips' Sequenza, Deutsche Grammophon's Signature, and De-cca's Jubilee, bearing, as it does, a £2.44 dealer price tag.

It will contain important recordings which are no longer available on full price, by leading EMI artists such as Pollini, Muti, Gavrilov, Karajan, Previn, Richter, Ormandy, Tuckwell and Galway. All the recordings in the series will be digitally re-mastered and be presented in DMM pressings with XDR cassettes and Dolby HX.

The first 26 releases are scheduled to arrive in the shops by mid-April, and contain a num-In the shops by mid-April, and contain a num-ber of recordings specially re-coupled to give extra value, including Tchaikovsky's Piano Concerto No 1 with three fill-ups, the Theme and Variations Op 19 No 6, by Tchaikovsky; Balakirev's Islamey, and Liszt's Paganini Etude No 3, La Campanella (EG 2903271 and on tape) with the artists being Andre Gavrilov and the Philharmonia under Muti. Gavirolov features in other reissues, includ-

ing Ravel's Piano Concerto for the left hand, coupled with the Pavane and Gaspard de la Nuit, with the LSO under Rattle (EG 2903251 and on tape).

From the start, the range of HMV Master Series is wide, with not only popular orchestral works (which also includes Brahms' Violin Concerto played by Gidon Kremer, on EG 2902931 and on tape, conducted by Karajan), but also chamber music, including Schubert's String Quartet No 15, played by the Alban Berg Quartet (EG 2902941 and on tape). There is choral music too, Mozart's C minor

Mass with Kiri Te Kanawa, conducted by Raymond Leppard (2902771 and tape), and even more unusually Charpentier's Te Deum And Magnificat with the Choir of King's College, Cambridge, the Academy of St Martin-inthe-Fields, conducted by Philip Ledger (EG 2903011 and on tape).

But most of it is popular material: Rodrigo's Guitar Concerto, Stravinsky's Rite of Spring, and Dvorak's New Workd Symphony.

More Bach celebrations

THE CELEBRATION of Bach's tercentenary continues unabated with two important choral releases this month. These include St Matthew Pas-

important choral releases this month. These include St Matthew Pas-sion, and two new instrumental recordings. Despite the St Matthew Passion being one of the greatest of choral works, it does not exist as a wholly satisfying recording, and this new set, with the tenor Peter Schreier conducting the Staatskapelle Dresden, and also singing the Evangelist, will be awaited with keen interest. Schreier's last major choral release on which he appeared as conduc-tor was Mozart's Requiem, which won the Best Choral Record of 1984 in the *Gramophone* Awards — which augurs well for this new Bach set. He has chosen Theo Adam, Lucia Popp, and Marjana Lipovsek as the soloists, and it is released by Philips on all three mediums (412 527). With the work contained on three CDs, the dealer price is £17.25, against the £15.20 for the LP and tape versions, making the new medium a very attractive proposition. attractive proposition. The second choral release which also comes from Philips, but moves

The second choral release which also comes from Philips, but moves from the modern instruments of the Staatskapelle to the Baroque instruments of the English Baroque Soloists, and the period-style direction of John Eliot Gardiner. The work is Bach's Magnificat, coupled with the Cantata No 51, Gott In Allen Landen, and it features Nancy Argenta, Emma Kirkby, Patrizia Kwella, Charles Brett, Anthony Rolfe Johnson and David Thomas as the soloists (411 485 LP/tape/CD).

The Magnificat already exists in an "authentic" version on Decca, under Hogwood's direction, but it is in a slightly different edition. Bach's Sonatas and Partitas for unaccompanied violin is one of the pinnacles for any violinist, and although already well-recorded, Mintz's performance will create interest. It was recorded in the prayer room of the Nikolaus Monastery, in Juchen, Germany (413 810, LP/tape/CD).

Karajan's Requiem triumph

HERBERT VON Karajan's perfor-mance of Verdi's Requiem in the Salzburg Festival last year was regarded a triumph, and his re-cording of the works, made some weeks before in Vienna with the same forces on that triumphant performance, has been much performance, has been much awaited

was made with Tomowa-It was made with Tomowa-Sintow, Baltsa, Carreras and Van Dam, with the Vienna Philhar-monic Orchestra (415 091 LP/ tape/CD), soloists who have all long links with the conductor.

Other Karajan issues to coin-cide with his late April visit to London include Beethoven's Symphonies Nos 4 and 7 (414 121 LP/tape/CD), and Bizet's L'Arlesienne Suites and the Carmen Suite with the Berlin Phil-harmonic Orchestra (415 106 Lp/ tape/CD). tape/CD)

Elgar's historic releases benefiting from DMM

TWO RARE historic recordings of music by Edward Elgar are benefiting from the DMM process and come back into the catalogue this month. They are Elgar's Symphony No 2 in the 1944 recording made by the BBC Symphony Orchestra under Sir Adrian Boult; and Elgar's arrangement of Chopin's Funeral March from the B flat minor Sonata, a recording which was produced by the legendary Fred Gaisberg in 1932 with the composer in the studio — again with a performance by the BBC Symphony Orchestra under Boult. Neither recordings have been issued on album or tape before (ED 2903551 and on tape).

been issued on album or tape before (ED 2903551 and on tape). Another interesting historic release is due for issue this month, this time by Decca. The amazing success of Kathleen Ferrier's Das Lied von der Erde on CD has demonstrated the enduring popularity of the contralto, and Decca has acquired rights to some private recordings appearing on a commercial record for the first time. The works are Chausson's Poeme de L'Amour et de La Mer, and two scarce songs by Bach, Vergiss Mein Nicht and Ach, Dass Nicht Die Letze Stunde, made by Ferrier in 1951 and 1949 respectively. Deca has coupled them with her 1949 recording of Brahms' Four Serious Songs, made with the BBC SO under Sir Malcolm Sargent, and has issued it on LP and tape (414 095). It also puts Bruckner's Symphony No 7 on one LP (64 minutes), available on ED 2900041 and on tape, making the third issue, Haydn's Symphonies Nos 100 and 104 appear modest a 57 minutes (ED 2903571). All perform-ances are with the Philharmonia Orchestra.

Berg's centenary marked by DG/EMI packages

THE CENTENARY of the birth of Alban Berg is in danger of being smothered by the Bach, Handel and Scarlatti tercentenaries, but both Deutsche Grammophon and EMI have produced genuinely interesting packages to commemo-

rate the date. From DG comes, predictably, the big package — a collection of two double albums and six single discs, called Alban Berg — The Published Works (413 797) which is handsomely presented with sleeve paintings by Egon Schrele, a contemporary of the composer.

The performances, taken from DG's back catalogues, are by Karjan, Barenboim, Boulez, Zukerman, Bohm, Margaret Price as well as many others, and traces Berg's music from the early songs to the last completed work, the violin concerto. It carries a dealer price of £22.

Among the featured artists is Dietrich Fischer-Dieskau who stars in an important new EMI album: Alban Berg: Unpublished album: Alban Berg: Unpublished Songs. Some 22 songs are given world premiere recordings by the great German baritone, with Aribert Reimann accompanying, in a gatefold sleeve presentation (EL 2701951) which contains a cover picture of Berg painted by Arnold Scheenberg Arnold Schoenberg

Galway heads RCA's important new releases

TWO NEW James Galway albums — one of them featuring the flautist as conductor — and a new Rubinstein series head RCA's first important releases on the UK market for two years.

James Galway, who continues to search for new flute material, plays six Concertos for flute, string orchestra and continuo by Vivaldi with the New Irish Chamber Orchestra directed from the flute by the virtuoso on RL 85316, and on tape/CD.

But signs of a new career are shown in his performance of Handel's Music For The Royal Fireworks and the Suite No 1 from the Water Music. Although he makes no pretence of "direct-ing from the flute" he picks up a baton to conduct the Chamber Orchestra of Europe (RL 85364 and on tape/CD).

Other new releases from RCA include Prokofiev's Symphony No 5 played by the Saint Louis Symphony conducted by Louis Slatkin, which tours Europe in April and May, coming to the UK next month (RL 85035 and on tape/CD), and Chopin's Piano Concertos Nos 1 and 2 played by Emanuel Ax and the Philadelphia Orchestra under Eugene Orman-Orchestra under Eugene Orman-dy, a recording which is given its first CD release (RD 85317). The Rubinstein re-issues come

in the form of The Chopin Collec-tion, with the Nocturnes, the Waltzes and the Mazurkas out on 2CD sets (RD 89563, Nocturnes), (RD 89564 Waltzes) and (RD 85171 Mazurkas). The Nocturnes and Waltzes are also contained on 3 LPs (RL 85018) and three tapes (RK 85018), with the Mazur-kas also on 3 LPs/tapes (RL/RK 85171).

YALE UNIVERSITY Press is publishing a facsimile edition of 33 previous-ly unknown organ chorale preludes by J S Bach, discovered at the University last year. This is to coincide with the first European performance of the works, writes Nicolas Soames. The performance will be in June at the Queen Elizabeth Hall as part of

The performance will be in June at the Queen Elizabeth Hall as part of the Celebrating 1685 organ series, with the works in the hands of three leading English organists — Nicholas Danby, Gillian Weir and John Scott — on June 5, 6 and 7. The discovery, made in December by Professor Christoph J Wolff, a leading world authority on Bach, came as he studied in detail all the manuscripts in the Yale collection, which originally belonged to a second-generation pupil of J S Bach, J C H Rinck. Although the 33 chorale preludes are ascribed to J S Bach in the volume, the source material apparently escaped the notice of scholars because it was inconspicuously labelled "Chorales without Text", and no references to the composers or repertoire were given in the library catalogue. catalogue.

catalogue. Wolff describes the discovery, as "one of the most significant addi-tions to the Bach Canon since the Bach Gesellschaft edition (the standard reference) was completed in 1899". He adds: "Bach research and source studies are extremely sophisti-cated today, and to my mind there is absolutely no doubt that the chorales are by J S Bach."



TORONTO: A new Canadian society to administer the reproduction rights of all Canadian composers, authors and music publishers will

rights of all Canadian composers, authors and music publishers will start operating next month. The Society for Reproduction Rights of Canadian Composers, Authors & Publishers (SODRAC) will function in Canada and abroad (through reciprocal agreements) in all areas of musical reproduction rights, including recordings, magnetic tapes, video cassettes and synchronisa-tion for the purpose of films, TV and radio broadcasting. The three existing societies behind the foundation of the new orga-nisation are the Societe Professionnelle des Auteurs et Compositeurs du Quebec (SPACQ), the Performing Rights Organisation of Canada (PRO Canada), and the Societe des Auteurs, Compositeurs, Editeurs de Musique (SACEM), the French performing rights organisation. SODRAC will be non-profit making, and will receive any necessary assistance from PRO Canada and SACEM.

Hurrah shout to the top By JOHN BEST

CRIMINALLY LOST in the middle CRIMINALLY LOST in the middle ground of being too pop for Peel and not state-of-the-(ch)art enough for daytime radio, New-castle's Hurrah! are out on their own writing songs with timeless melodies and plain-speaking lyrics for a privileged and grow-ing legion of fans. Too self-effacing to blow their own trumpet, the guitar-based

own trumpet, the guitar-based four piece are probably the most refreshing "unknown" pop band in the UK. If reference points are needed, they can loosely be deemed Sixties-influenced, with songs soaring on powerful tunes and heartfelt harmonies. But and heartfelt harmonies. But attempts to specifically pin-down Hurrahl's sound — Big Country, Joan Armatrading, Stiff Little Fin-gers — have been as hoplessly

awry as their variety suggests. A brief history runs that Hur-rahl's two guitarist/vocalist/ songwriters, Paul Handyside and Taffy Hughes, met at technical college and started a punk band with the distinctly un-punky name of Best Friends. They re-cruited Dave Porthouse, an old school mate of Handyside's on bass, and became The Green-Eyed Children. Around two-anda-half years ago they became Hurrah! and after recording their superb debut single, The Sun Shines Here, acquired drummer Damian Mahoney from Manches-ter doom-band The Passage, while he was in Newcastle visit-

while he was in Newcastle visit-ing his brother. They have now released three singles — The Sun ..., Hip Hip and Who'd Have Thought? — in-dependently on Kitchenware, but are holding back their fourth, Gloria, until a major licensing deal is secured, in the style of those already gained by label col-leagues The Kane Gang, The Daintees (both through London) and Prefab Sprout (CBS). "It's pointless putting the sing-

"It's pointless putting the sing-le out as an indie really, because it's a good song. The same with the last three, while the record-ings weren't really what we wanted, all three were really good songs that deserved a bigger audience," says Handyside. Hurrah! inspire dedication from their fans, and receive far more letters than their more well-known label mates. Especially from Europe, where they have

plans to release an album of sing-les and B-sides.

But their main ambition for 1985 is to release a UK album. "Maybe we should've had an album out earlier, because it serves the purpose of getting a deal, but now is the right time to record it, because we've de-veloped a lot and got a better idea of what we want in the studio and how we want things to sound," says Handyside. The group is also gaining more

on-stage confidence: "We're just starting to perform well, and it isn't putting on a show, it's felt on stage," says Hughes. Still besotted with the wonder-

ment of actually being in a group and playing gigs, the nearest Hur-rah! get to a manifesto is to up-hold the old punk adage that "anyone can do it". "There doesn't seem to be that

many people going for that any-more," says Handyside. "I'm sick of groups who claim to be the new messiahs. You don't have to proclaim yourselves as great songwriters

"Competing with The Kane Gang in the Top 40 doesn't frus-Gang in the 1op 40 doesn't trus-trate us at all. Not being able to put out records and getting off the dole and making a living, that frustrates us. But we're not artistically frustrated."

tically trustrated." Both Huges and Handyside are prolific songwriters, with a vast backlog of material written, re-hearsed and played live, only to be dropped as they tire of them. Each writes on his own, some-times singing the others' songs, but they are quick to emphasise that Hurrah¹ is very much a guartet, with a lot of creative input coming from Mahoney and Porthouse.

They remain quiety confident about their chances in 1985, as they should

ALTHOUGH THIS benefit for the min-ALTHOUGH THIS benefit for the min-ers was held at the University of Lon-don's Logan Hall which, as a seated lecture theatre, must be one of the most unsuitable venues in the city, the occasion still seemed to bring out ex-cellent performances from all con-cerned. And despite all the venue's shortcomings the audience's fervent reception to the acts bordered on the relations. religious

reception to the acts bordered on the religious. As soon as the standing ovation accorded to the South Wales Miners' Choir had died away on strode lone minstrel Billy Bragg who launched straight into a venomous assault featuring some of his best bitter-sweet songs from It Says Here to New Eng-land, the song that gave Kirsty Mac-Coll a Top 10 hit. It was also appropriate that Bragg covered two songs from past eras, the Kentucky miners' song Which Side Are You On and Leon Rosselson's World Turned Upside Down, which as themes of oppression are just as re-levant today. But it was with his own songs that Bragg really excelled, as seen in his delivery of a new song. Days Like These, which showed his true accuracy as a social commenta-tor.

true accuracy as a social commenta-tor. This was also the first time in four months that Elvis Costello had played live with The Attractions and they obviously relished the opportunity, producing one of their most powerful sets for a long time. Costello stalked the stage, pumping away on his guitar as the group stormed through a set that leaved heavily on some of their oldest mate-rial from the classic Alison and Less Than Zero to the less well known No Action and Waiting For The End Of The World. The band were in excellent form

Than Zero to the less well known NO Action and Waiting For The End Of The World. The band were in excellent form with Steve Nieve's exquisite touches of piano and organ adding colour as the solid rhythm section powered through a selection of their greatest hits.

A healthy amount of new material revealed Costello at his most pointed-especially on the aptly-titled Brilliant Mistake — and countrified with the engagingly-titled Why Must You Throw Dirt In My Face, dedicated to Mr MacGregor, and Merle Haggard's No Reason To Quit. There seemed to be no stopping them as they covered The Beat's Stand Down Margaret and Oliver's Army, fitting a vast amount of songs into the little time that was available as they came back for encore after encore. They even returned again after the



MORE THAN 30 international country stars including Brenda Lee, Jerry Lee Lewis, Rita Coolidge, Loretta Lynn, Con-way Twitty, The Osmond Brothers, Moe Bandy and Boxcar Willie will be seen by an estimated 30,000 people at the threeday annual Silk Cut Festival held at Wembley Arena over Easter.

Promoter Mervyn Conn is anticipating more TV and radio exposure than ever before: BBC TV will be there and, as in the past, will broadcast edited highlights of the festival in the BBC-2 Sing Country series. And for the first time BBC's Whistle Test will also be at the festival — featuring presenter Andy Kershaw being guided through the event by the UK's very own country performer Hank Wangford.

More than 150 country musicians will be taking part in the festival, underlining the growth of the 16-year-old event. Osmonds return

THE CONTROVERSIAL decision to feature the Osmond Brothers at the Silk Cut Festival last year was more than justified by their excellent stage performance and rapport with fans, press and radio personnel.

For the group who had so many pop hits in the Seventies, it was a return to their roots when they set out singing gospel, coun-try and barbershop. "We've try and barbershop. "We've wanted to get back to singing country for a long time, but it is really hard once you are estab-lished in a certain field to convince people that you can do other things," says Wayne Osmond.

The latest batch of country releases on the various Pickwick labels covers a wide range of styles, while together, the artists represented make up almost a complete Who's Who of country and western. And at Pickwick's prices, all represent excellent value for money.

The Pride album features a number of classics including Me and Bobby McGee and Tom Paxton's The Last Thing On My Mind. The Country Giants albums, as their titles suggest, feature big names such as Jim Reeves, Dolly Parton, Waylon Jennings, Don Gibson, Dottie West and Chet Atkins. Both are excellent samplers and would make a good introduction to the music for those new to it.

Of equal quality are the two Country Superstars volumes and The Wonderful World Of Country. The Opry collection includes some less familiar names such as Charlie Louvin and Merle Kilgore, but the 12 tracks are representative of the breadth of styles catered for by the US's longest running continuous radio show. Duets have proved a happy hit hunting ground for country singers over the last few years, and among the double acts on the new Spot release are Johnny Cash and June Carter, Johnny & Jonie Mosby, Tammy Wynette and George Jones and Carl & Pearl Butler. The cream of these compilations is the four-record box set 75 Country Classics, which at £7.99 is excellent value for money. Featured artists include Skeeter Davis, Sandy Posey, Lynn Anderson, Marty Robbins and Tammy Wynette.

CRYSTAL GAYLE: The Woman In Me, Hallmark,

Crystal Gayle takes a lazy stroll through repertoire such as Bill Withers' Lean On Me and Ain't No Sunshine, and other standards such as Ain't No Love In The Heart Of The City and Crying In The Rain, in a disappointingly dispassionate manner. An album that adds nothing to her appeal, but as a cheapie by a famous person, it is guaranteed sales.



GEORGE JONES. Ladies' Choice. Epic EPC 26233. Producer: Billy Sherrill. Jones duets with a starspangled succession of female country artists, including Loretta Lynn, Emmylou Harris, Barbara Mandrell, Janie Fricke and the ever-ebullient Brenda Lee. A formidable line-up which should attract healthy sales.

MASTERS OF COUNTRY: 16 Great Tracks. Music for Pleasure MFP 41 5690 1. A first-rate compilation Ferlin Husky featuring (Tumbling Tumbleweeds), Merle Travis (Sixteen Tennessee Ernie Tons) Ford (Mule Train) and Tex Ritter (The Wayward Wind) among others, and some typical country humour from Red Ingle (Cigareets, Whusky & Wild Wild Women) and Tex Williams (Life Gits Tee-Jus Don't lt). Firmly rooted in the older brand of country, but a package with excellent sales potential.





be found among this motley crew.



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
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
