It scored 124 points from the regional juries, and the runners-up were Dancing In The Night sung by Kerri Wells, written by Graham Sacher and Paul Curtis, published by Leonie Music and released by Magnet Records (101 points), and The Clock On The Wall, Alvin Stardust, Peter Vale & Mike Leeson, C&D/Arlon Music/Chappell, Chrysalis (90 points).

150 jobs to go at PolyGram distribution

"The Japanese public have for a long time had a particularly dark image of the British music scene, especially after the emergence of punk and the outrageous fashion that came with it some years are "says Aki Taylas Enjo(Sopy) interpretional relaago," says Aki Tanaka, Epic/Sony international relations manager. "The intention of this campaign,

under the heading UK Now, is to sweep away such image from peoples' minds and convey to the Japanese people that there is a healthy variety of high quality music and artists available in the UK today."
CBS UK's international marketing director, Andy

Stephens, who will be flying to Japan on April 13 to take part in the presentations, says one aim of the campaign is to try to short-circuit the "US route" to the Japanese market.

"Traditionally Japan has looked to the US as its primary source of rock and pop," he says. "Many, although by no means all, UK artists have found that their Japanese fortunes only kick into overdrive after US chart success.

"We are totally committed to supporting Epic/ Sony in every way we can in bringing UK music, not just CBS music, to the forefront once more in Japan. With the exception of Culture Club, Duran Duran and Wham!, the UK's recent share of the international market place in Japan has been relatively small. This is a determined effort to redress the balance.

"I would be very interested to hear from any other international directors whose Japanese counterparts may be interested in participating in the campaign."



Inland Revenue Clark appeal fails

Judge dismisses

THE TAX advantages of living abroad for a certain period of time have again been emphasised by the High Court dismissal of an appeal by the Inland Revenue in a case concerning Dave Clark, former leader of The

Dave Clark Five.

Mr Justice Nicholls rejected the appeal, stating that "Residence abroad for a carefully chosen limited period is no less residence abroad because a major reason for it was the avoidance of tax'

The judge ruled that Clark was not liable for tax on £275,700 which he earned between 1978 and 1979 because he was out of Britain for the whole of that period, living and working in Los Angeles. His aim was to avoid income tax on \$500,000 paid to him by a record company for some master tapes. By receiving the money in a lump sum in Britain just before leaving for the US, Clark also succeeded in not paying tax on it in

America.

The Inland Revenue claimed that Clark's stay in the US should be regarded as a temporary visit, and during that period he was still legally a resident in the UK and liable to pay income tax.

However, the judge said there had been a "distinct break" in the path of Clark's life for just over a year. In that time, he had made Los Angeles his headquarters and had not returned to the UK.

The Dave Clark Five, disbanded in 1970, scored a string of record hits, the biseaset being Clard All Over and Bits And Pieces.

BPI/Amstrad court case set for June

THE LEGAL battle between the BPI and UK hi-fi manufacturer Amstrad over tape-to-tape copying machines for the consumer market is set to reach the High Court on June 10 and will be watched with considerable interest by the hi-fi industry around the world.

Amstrad is applying for a dec-Amstrad is applying for a declaration from the court that their marketing and selling of tape-to-tape machines is lawful. Last month Amstrad failed in its attempt to strike out a parallel action, brought by the BPI and Mechanical Right Society, in which Amstrad are the defendants. That action has been staved pending the outcome of stayed pending the outcome of the June 10 hearing. Last week the court ordered

Amstrad to disclose a number of documents relevant to the issues, including guarantee cards re-turned by its customers. The video hardware industry is







CD: PolyGram to triple output?

HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA: PolyGram will triple its previously anticipated compact disc production in 1985 to 25m units announced PolyGram's Emile Petrone at the NARM convention here.

But it will be 18 months before there is sufficient manufacturing capacity to meet the demand for simultaneous release of recordings in LP, cassette and CD formats, added PolyGram's CD director Hans Gout.

LP, cassette and CD formats, added PolyGram's CD director Hans Gout. NARM delegates heard various views on the demise of the LP and the rise of the CD. RCA Records president Robert Summer declared: "We all have a stake in the winding down of the standard LP disc. If digital audio tape came along prematurely you'd have to all but run from the LP. Barring that, I think it will be an orderly withdrawal." PolyGram's Guenter Hensler thought it would be five years before CDs equal LPs in unit sales, and A&M's Gil Friesen cautioned against prematurely "putting the LP to pasture". However, Jack Ugster, of the 400-store Musicland chain, said that only 36 per cent of his business in March was in LPs and he predicted that the LP would drop to 10 per cent of unit sales within five years. He warned

LP would drop to 10 per cent of unit sales within five years. He warned manufacturers "not to push LPs on retailers".

Fraud: PRS member fined

A PRS composer member was fined a total of £600 following a plea of guilty to three charges of falsification of accounts at Clerkenwell Magistrates Court. Tony Evans, who is also a director of publisher member Mark Tyme Music, asked for 12 similar offences to be taken into

The charges related to attempts by Evans to obtain royalties to which he was not entitled by claiming that only his musical works were performed on a number of occasions when in fact most of the performance was of other works. The PRS had made no payments to Evans in respect of these claims.

A PRS statement said that the society's detailed investigations of programme returns submitted for live public performance of music revealed that Evans was one of a very small minority of members attempting to influence the distribution of royalties for their personal advantage by the supply of programme returns containing false in-

formation about performance of their musical works.

Since December 1983, there has been a total of seven criminal prosecutions of PRS members for attempted fraud and/or falsification of accounts, all of which have resulted in convictions, including the present

Soviet music piracy: stricter controls

MOSCOW: Piracy of music from the West has caused Soviet cultural officials to devise stricter controls over a chain of recording studios authorised to make tape recordings for private customers, according to the Soviet culture publication Sovietskaya Kultura.

These studios came into being because of the limited range of catalogue offered by the state-owned Melodiya record com-pany, but complaints from the public and in the press allege that untrained staff at the studios are taping Western music and also performances at "fringe" concerts and offering the unauthorised recordings for sale at high prices on the black market.

Stocking dilemma

NEW YORK: Every time a new home entertainment technology comes along, record retailers have to decide whether or not to jump on the latest bandwagon. Sometimes there is little question — as with new music-only formats, even when some of these formats (quad, 8-track cartridges) turn out to be losers. There is, understandably enough, considerably more debate when the new technologies involve other than audio-only music. In the US, video games proved for the most part of an ill-fit for record and tape stores looking to become home

music. In the US, video games proved for the most part of an ill-fit for record and tape stores looking to become home entertainment boutiques.

Even at the height of the video game craze, most stores simply didn't have or want to acquire the hardware and expertise required to serve the computer software buyer. As it turned out, that was probably a wise decision in terms of long-range direction.

Home video has proven a more sticky problem. Two and three years ago many record retailers entered the field, believing that music video would be a magnet for new customers and ing that music video would be a magnet for new customers and a good way to expand the amount of business their existing client base did in the store. But a rental market developed which, while a potentially valuable traffic builder, required a different type of inventory investment and a high degree of service. Many early participants got burned, cut their losses, and left the business. Some of these dealers are now returning to video, and more are expected as record companies become

to video, and more are expected as record companies become directly involved in video distribution.

The message offered by some of the more successful record-cum-video dealers at the recent NARM convention is music video doesn't warrant a record store entering the home video field, video generally — and the big box office hits, specifically — does. Music-orientated titles do better as a percentage of the business at record outlets than at video speciality stores, they seemed to feel, but the titles cited again and again as today's traffic builders were general interest box office hits, not concert

traffic builders were general interest box office hits, not concert tapes or clip compilations. In recent years, many of those general interest hits just happened to be music orientated. Also, as at video speciality stores, music tapes (and 8-inch laser discs) sell better (as a percentage of overall transactions) than hit movie titles — but not sufficiently to be a business unto itself.

NARM has been encouraging its members to enter the home video market for some time, though the investment may be more than many could handle — \$300,000 for an initial rental library, another \$100,000 if they want product to sell, according to the heads of the Wharehouse and Sound Warehouse record chains.

Video, however, wasn't the only new technology being touted to the record dealer at NARM. WCI's Stan Cornyn urged

touted to the record dealer at NARM. WCI's Stan Cornyn urged retailers to embrace CD technology, regardless of the program content that may one day adorn the software.

Record stores are ready to embrace computer-interactive CDs, for example, with all the explanations and demonstrations they might call for. But then the current and next generation of record store employee will probably have more of an understanding for the product (and not be as intimidated by it) as the salespeople asked to handle computer games a few years ago. The same is likely to go for home video. The key question for retailers, though, remains the same: which new technologies to support and sell?

"But with an eye to the future, and with the intention of continuing to release regular packages of top quality, well-balanced family entertainment, we are now prepared to discuss the acquisition of video rights from UK operations.

"We don't intend to restrict our backing solely to mainstream productions and established companies. We'd like to hear from independent production companies, up-and-coming film-makers, and simply people

production companies, up-and-coming film-makers, and simply people with exciting new ideas. Our discussions will be in the strictest confidence and we're fast decision makers."

ZURICH: LOCAL record company members of the IFPI have stopped supplying video clips to Swiss TV until the station agrees to pay for their

use.

The ban has been prompted by similar action last year in Germany and Austria which resulted in payment agreements with the TV authorities in those countries, although most German and Austrian record companies regard the tariff as "inadequate."

Swiss TV (SRG) claims that video clips are marketing tools of the record industry which should pay for the promotion of its own product. The IFPI, which is demanding \$35 per time for the use of clips, retorts that their use does not necessarily boost record sales and points to the current stagnant state of Swiss disc sales. Record retailers disagree with this theory, and major Swiss chains are offered video programmes by the big distributors as a regular in-store marketing service.

Video production is just getting underway in Switzerland, and is still on a low-scale budget. Producer Peter Grau comments: "Most local bands have small financial resources, so many video studios are prepared to produce clips for less than \$3,000."

CONCERN ABOUT the soaring cost of music promotion videos has been expressed by David Simone, managing director of Ariola/Arista Records. He highlighted a dilemma confronting most record company chiefs these days in as much as Arista "is committed to signing visually exciting acts able to be equally exciting when performing live", and an accompanying video is now virtually de rigueur for each release. "The cost of videos is frightening," said Simone. "Rock videos were almost a British invention, but what is worrying is that we're selling only marginally more records now that we did five years ago, and the cost of videos comes out of budgets based largely on a pre-video situation. Video costs are escalating out of all proportion."

Sky Channel reaches 3m homes in European countries, including 135,000 in the UK. It currently transmits 10 hours of programming each weekday and 11½ hours on Saturdays and Sundays. The channel forecasts reaching 7 120,000 homes by

Sundays. The channel forecasts reaching 7,120,000 homes by the end of this year and just under 10m by 1987.

In the UK, cable now passes by just under 1m homes, not all of them hooked up. The growth of new systems — high-tech, 16 to 32 channel cable networks — has been hampered by licensing problems and difficulties in raising finance. However, cable franchises have been awarded in 11 areas and five more are due to be advertised this month.

difficulties in raising finance. However, cable franchises have been awarded in 11 areas and five more are due to be advertised this month. In addition, it's expected the Government will soon allow the transmission of satellite channels on SMATV (Satellite Master Antenna Television, otherwise known as mini-cable), which would serve blocks of flats. Despite the problems facing cable system operators, many observers—among them, presumably, the British Government—feel that the growth of the new media is inexorable. Already there are six cable channels in the UK, with at least three more set to launch this year. Additionally, there is nothing to stop British cable transmitting foreign satellite channels: the first of these—TV-5 from France—began transmitting to bemused cable viewers in Swindon only last month. The new UK channels currently operating probably typify the shape of television to come. There are two film programmes, Premiere and TEN—The Movie Channel, which are available to cable subscribers for an additional monthly charge. There is programming for kids on The Childrens' Channel and for armchair sports fanatics on Screensport. There is Sky, now controlled by Rupert Murdoch, which is a general entertainment channel with a heavy emphasis on music programming. And there is Music Box, the European answer to America's MTV, which broadcasts as much as 50 minutes of video clips in every hour. Sky and Music Box exemplify the importance of music in the new scheme of things. Music videos are a relatively cheap form of programming, notwithstanding the fact that both Sky and Music Box pay for transmission rights. They appeal to a young audience, which, for advertiser-supported channels, is of major importance. They're international, in that language is secondary to the music. And, most important of all, they're popular.

of all, they're popular.

ky's programming strategy is an adaptation of an American television practice known as "stripping" which — in simple terms — reserves the same time slots each night for specific types of programming. Behind this notion is a schedule planned around the probable audience; hence, kids' programming starts in the afternoon when the children get back from school. That leads into a series designed to be viewed by mum and the kids in the early evening, which itself loads into many male extentions are recommended.

noon when the children get back from school. That leads into a series designed to be viewed by mum and the kids in the early evening, which itself leads into more male-orientated programming when dad's back from work. In theory, you need never change the channel.

Sky's chosen medium for reaching kids is music. It broadcasts two and a half hours of music videos and music-orientated magazine programmes, under the collective name of "Sky Trax", every afternoon from 3.00 to 5.30. The programme begins each day with a 45 minute segment made up of pop videos, quizzes and guest stars from the music world. The next two segments vary, but are generally targeted at the older children and teenagers and include a live weekly soul show, AOR slots, heavy metal segments, the US Hot 100 and the UK Top 50. This latter is transmitted on Tuesdays, two days before Top Of The Pops.


Sky has purposely avoided the MTV Top-40 style, opting for a mix of personality shows and magazine programmes. Music Box broadcasts music all day from seven in the morning to 1am, with concerts and specials at weekends. In its advertising it calls itself "video radio" and, like radio, can be received in stereo in some areas.


Music Box was, originally, broadcast in the music slot on Sky. It became a channel in its own right last year when it began transmitting via ECS-1 to the UK and the Continent. In six months it had achieved a penetration of 1m homes in Europe (most in Holland) and is now targeted to reach 4m by the end of the year. Recently it began broadcasting to the 95,000 home cable system in Helsinki, and is reportedly considering offers to transmit its signal to Hungary, Yugoslavia and Iceland, among other countries. At some point this year it will begin broadcasting 24 hours a day, becoming Europe's first round-the-clock TV service.

The audience impact of the new media is as yet hard to gauge. Some research has been carried out but, given the nature of pan-European

The audience impact of the new media is as yet hard to gauge. Some research has been carried out but, given the nature of pan-European broadcasting, is difficult to put in perspective. In November last year, Sky released figures that ranked it as the third most viewed channel in those homes in Holland and the UK able to receive it. In Britain, that put it ahead of both BBC and Channel 4. Music Box has released its own figures, carried out by an independent research organisation, that rank it the most popular satellite TV channel in the UK, Holland and Germany. Demand is the basis for any change. The tentative step that began three years ago with the launch of Satellite Television may yet revolutionise European TV, bringing more diversity, more channels and, incidentally, more music videos, into homes throughout the Continent.





Box: TV's 'radio' channel

ecutive officer of Music Box, the UK's only all-music cable/ station gives straightforward satellite TV answers to straightforward questions about a complex and ever-changing subject.

How would you describe Music

Box? Music Box is a music television Music Box is a music television channel. It doesn't really matter how it gets to people, whether it's broadcast television, cable television, or satellite television, it is a television channel. It's a European TV channel, with an audience throughout Europe from Helsinki to Madrid. We don't aim Helsinki to Madrid. We don't aim to do anything other than to transmit music. Our programmes are aimed at a 15-25 age group which is the primary audience, but it has also got important secondary audiences down to seven and eight year olds, and up

to 40/45-years-old.

It's essentially pop music and essentially pop videos. But while in a sense it is modelled on MTV, it's also modelled on radio One. However, we are developing our own format of programming. It's not just videos one after the other. There are programmes with distinct formats-specials on individual artists, concert hours, chart hours

How long has it been transmit-

We've been transmitting as our own channel since July 12 1984.

We started first of all by doing hour-long programmes on Sky Channel back in February last

Who owns Music Box?

Who owns music Box?
It's actually a separate company

that's owned by Thorn EMI

Have you learned a lot from MTV

That's a very successful operation, and we have learned a lot from them, but we've also learned much ourselves. We have to make our programming much more cheaply, because our potential audience is much smaller than theirs, we have to spend less on marketing for the same less on marketing for the same reasons; and we have to address a very different audience — the European audience is a very different one to the American one. Musically it's quite different. You'll find more hard rock on MTV than on Music Box. We play more black music, more reggae, and we obviously play European acts that are not getting played in the US. Our programming is specifically directed at the European audience.

Can you estimate the current tot-

al audience for Music Box? In January we were in just about

1m homes, which means the potential viewing audience was about 2.5m. That's made up of around 500,000 in Holland, 100,000 in Norway and the same in Finland (which came on stream in February), another 100,000 in

many.
There is some confusion about cable and satallite — how does Jo Public go about getting Music

What are transmitting What we are transmitting through is what is called a communications satellite, that's principally intended for cable distribution, so that the cable owner would pick up the signal, which we transmit from London. It goes up to the satellite, and comes down to the dish which is usually about three or four foot across, which the cable operator has at what's called his head-end, and he then transmits the signal through his cable to his various subscribers. The main intention is to distribute the -programme that way. But it's perfectly possible to pick up if you have a satellite dish yourself in the garden you can pick it up direct and have it straight into your own home. There aren't that many of those dishes around at present because they cost so much. But it will be possible in say another two or these years time that a large numthree years time that a large num-ber of our viewers will be either single homes or blocks of flats with their own dishes on the roof rather than being connected to cable systems.

There has been a lot of bad

press about cable. But we are not linked exclusively to the cable market, certainly not in the UK. There is a lot of cable already in the ground all over Europe.

Do you see the audience in this country developing as individual subscribers rather than through

mass cabling?
Cable and satellite are two complimentary things. They are really just different methods of distribution, and the popular press has got terribly confused about the issues of cable and satellite. Cable is just one method of getcable is just one method of get-ting things to you in your home, its particular advantage is in fact its ability to get very high quality reproduction and its ability to talk back — you can have a computer or whatever at your home, so you can send messages back to the cable head-end — but that's not really an area that Music Box is involved in. But it will be cheaper to get Music Box by cable rather than to put a dish in your garden.

I think what will happen is that cable will develop in most urban areas, and satellite dish reception areas, and satellite dish reception will be the method of receiving in rural areas. In small villages you'll probably get in effect a small cable system. There's no reason why you can't have just a dozen houses in a village with one satellite dish linked up by cable. I think that kind of system will come in more and more as will come in more and more as people realise the wide variety of programming that's available to them. At the moment you can get two film channels, a sports channel, Sky Channel which is general entertainment, ourselves and a childrens channel. That's all in

normal broadcast addition to normal broadcast television. It's a surprisingly wide


television. It's a surprisingly wide variety of entertainment. Do you believe there is room for 18 hours a day — and in the future 24 hours a day — of music

It's like radio. Music is the essential lasting factor. The visual images may not have as strong a lasting quality. There is the danger of burn-out. There needs to be more discussion about saturation and where the videos are being put out. I remember endless discussions at the BPI about the saturation of radio plays. It was something the record industry needed to pay attention to, possibly not so much now because the number of outlets for the music has increased. But with It's like radio. Music is the essenthe music has increased. But with video we have to be careful careful not to play things too often. The record companies have to be careful about where they place their videos, what kind

they place their videos, what kind of restrictions they put on them. I would argue strongly in favour of them actually seeing us as their champion in a sense. We only exist by virture of our relationship with the record companies, the music publishers and the artists. We see ourselves as being in partnership with the music industry — and that's different from any other channel, and that's why I don't name Sky that's why I don't name Sky Channel as being in competition with us. They are only competition in the sense of being an addi-tional television channel. They are not in competition with us as a music channel, because their music is only really 2.5 hours a day of their total output, they are using music programming in a perfectly justifiable way as a part of an overall general entertain-ment package whereas we are wholly music, and therefore need to work closely with the music

We have to balance our profitability and their income against the appropriate exposure for their product.

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

PUBLISHING

"STARTING music publishing today can suicide unless you can keep copyrights well beyond three years. If you don't, you cannot succeed or establish a worthwhile Too company. people many coming into the business do not realise this until it is too late."

This frank assessment comes from Cyril Simons, a veteran music publisher who steps back (but not out) from the scene on April 16 after 35 years at the helm of MCA Music, formerly Leeds Music (MW March 30). He's always been known to call a spade a shovel, and he has some fortha shovel, and he has some forth-right and unfavourable views on publishing as it largely is today, but he obviously still loves every minute of it, and he has no inten-

tion of retiring.
Simons began his career as office boy at Peter Maurice Music under the invaluable tutelage of the late Jimmy Phillips. He progressed to the orchestral depart-ment before serving six wartime years in the RAF, and then spent

three years at Southern Music under Dave Toff before joining Leeds Music in 1950.

He freely admits he's had his He freely admits he's had his share of luck, and an early example was a No.1 hit during his first week at Leeds in the shape of Beloved Be Faithful by Pearl Carr & Teddy Johnson, closely followed by Teasin' by The Beverley Sisters

Simons' long tenure at MCA Music has witnessed some of the most spectacular publishing successes of this century — and it can't all be ascribed to luck. But perhaps getting the B side of Vera Lynn's million-selling Auf Lynn's million-selling Auf Wiederseh'n (a number called

The Parting Song) was lucky — or, as Simons puts it: "I do like to be beside the A side".

Certainly there was a hint of it

in being a lifelong friend of David

Land came to Simons saying he had found two brilliant young writers who had penned a rock opera called Jesus Christ Superopera called Jesus Christ Super-star. He thought Simons was the right man to publish and exploit the work. Simons arranged for Land to discuss the project with Brian Brolly, then head of MCA Records UK, and the rest of the multi-million pound JCS story, and that of Evita, is now history. But it wasn't luck that caused

But it wasn't luck that caused the Welbeck Music success story. Pye chief Louis Benjamin approached Simons, saying the company wanted to set up a publishing arm, and Simons did just that, starting from scratch and building a formidable catalogue, including the waste of Tony.

including the works of Tony
Macaulay and Tony Hatch.
The latter came up with huge
successes for Petula Clark including the classic Downtown, Don't ing the classic Downtown, Don't Sleep In The Subway, I Couldn't Live Without Your Love and The Other Man's Grass Is Always Greener, to say nothing of the Crossroads theme. The Welbeck Music catalogue formed the foundation of ATV Music, and Simons shrewdly secured the overseas rights for MCA Music.

Simons has an understandable soft spot for songwriter and man soft spot for songwriter and man about music Jack Fishman as well as trusting his judgement. Fishman rang him from the Cannes Film Festival one year and urged him to get the rights to the soundtrack of a movie which Jack was tipping to take first prize. Simons did acquire the rights of the score by Francis Lai for MCA Music, and the title tune became one of the most performed and recorded numbers throughout the world — A Man And A

He has a keen wit and a toler-ance that enables him to disclose the descriptive phrase coined for him by Bill Cotton — "The sore with the bare head". His three with the bare head". His three guiding mottos throughout his music publishing career are realistic as well as funny: Copyrights don't talk back; You can't run over a copyright, and Where there's a hit, there's a writ.

While Simons does admit that maybe he doesn't undestrand all.

maybe he doesn't understand all

contemporary music, he did understand Bob Dylan and Leonard Cohen and their mes-sages which he published.

Too much of the business side "Too much of the business side of music publishing today concentrates on money and percentages and songs come third, when it should be the other way around." None of this will deter him from future involvement in

him from future involvement in publishing, however. Simons is taking a well-earned holiday after April 16, and then will consider some projects which have already been dangled before him. He's not even hazarding a guess at this stage about which direction he will choose, but one gets the impression that, but one gets the impression that, while he remains keen to exercise his proven skills in the modern scene and admires the talent of many of the new breed of young writers, he also sees a future for the rejuvenation of great stan-

the rejuvenation of great standard catalogues.

"There's so much untapped wealth in those standard catalogues. A lot of people think they're new songs."

Meanwhile, his vast knowledge and experience of music pub-

Meanwhile, his vast knowledge and experience of music publishing will not be lost to the industry. His departure from MCA Music means also his departure from the PRS council, but the society intends to appoint him a consultant director, so that he can continue to give valuable input to its deliberations by voice if not by yote

not by vote.

Simons has received many awards over the years as the publisher of the hits concerned. But his own personal award for outns own personal award for our standing contributions to British music presented at this year's BASCA/PRS Ivor Novello cere-mony touched him in that area which publishers are supposed to lack — the heart.

VIRGIN DANCE: Against The Tide. Spartan SPMP 102. Yet more Merseyside music, similar in feel to the likes of neighbours The Lotus Eaters and China Crisis. Virgin Dance are very much what we've come to expect from Liverpool people, earnest drama, impenetrable lyrics and soft melody. Consequently this album, although of high quality, lacks identity and tends to grate on repeated listenings. Fine for a debut, but really should demonstrate more originality. Retails at the attractive price of £3.99.

HELEN & THE HORNS: Helen And The Horns. Rockin' Ray Records RRR1. (Distribution: Backs and The Cartel). First album from the outfit whose Freight Train was such a big turntable hit. The other tracks all have a similar western theme — Northbound Train, Pioneer Town, Southern Belle etc — and have a delightful whimsical charm to them.

TURKEY BONES AND THE WILD-DOGS: No Way Before The Weekend. Big Beat. NED 13. A more limited Capt Beefheart, gutteral vocal technique, and a dishevelled, old fashioned rock-'n'roll guitar sound, are the hallmarks of the debut mini-album from this popular London pub act. That it includes a cover of Don Fardon's Indian Reservation is fair indication of the kind of 999-meets-Birthday-Party territory it inhabits.

Gulda for promo push

FRIEDRICH GULDA is a cult figure in Germany and Austria, although he is mainly known in the UK for his classic recordings, made in the Sixties, of Mozart and Beethoven.

But this month, Philips is to rectify this in releasing three new Gulda titles in an attempt to convey some of the many facets of this extraordinary musician, who is as comfortable seated at a piano with the jazz pianist Chick Corea as he is at the composer's desk, or in front of a Beethoven score.

The three titles show different elements of his musicianship. The first The three titles show different elements of his musicianship. The first finds him accompanying his wife, the soprano Ursula Anders in Schumann's Liederkreis and playing the Fantasiestucke (412 113 LP/tape/CD). The second casts him in the role of solo pianist, as he plays Beethoven's Sonata Op 111 as well as one of his own compositions, Wintermeditation (412 114, LP/tape/CD).

The last release is a recital of Gulda's jazz compositions, and some selections from his friend, Chick Corea (412 115 LP/tape/CD).

ECHO BASE: Puppet At The GoGo (DEP International/Virgin DEP 19(12), EMI. Bright vocals and dynamic brass section contriand dynamic brass section contri-bute to a lively track combined with a driving rhythm to give a slightly soulful, even jazz-tinged feel to this promising number.



LATIN QUARTET: Radio Africa (Rockin' Horse RH(T) 102, CBS). Insistent reggae reflecting the present troubles in South Africa, re-issued due to the acclaim and subsequent chart placing of their previous single Toulouse. Pro-duced by Nigel Gray, the fine voc-al harmonies should gain the band many fans, although unen-terprising radio stations probably won't play it.

STEWART COPELAND AND RAY LEMA: Koteja (A&M 242, CBS). LEMA: Koteja (A&M 242, CBS),
This reworking of a traditional
Zairean folk is taken from Cope-land's film The Rhythmatist and shows another aspect of African music to that of Malcolm McLaren's South African period and Fela Kuti. 

The song eventually arrived in the hands of Jackson's producer Quincy Jones who recorded it himself, and had a hit both sides

Lobos themselves are above the cant that surrounds them, they just get on and play their own mix of R&B, rock'n'roll, Mexican, zydeco, and all those other forms of US roots music,

other forms of US roots music, that are little more than words in the UK journalist's vocabulary.

The five big lads from East LA are the real McCoy, they've been playing and drinking beer together for 10 years now, and entertaining an invited industry audience at Ronnie Scott's, it showed. There was but one overt show of extreme professionalshowed. There was but one overt show of extreme professional-ism, when Cesar Rosas played his guitar with the mike stand, and it sounded beautiful, but for the most part they channelled their skill into accordion/guitardriven boogie tunes, that must have made the Boothill Foottappers embarrassed to be sitting so near the stage.

The records played before they came on give as much indication as anything of what they're about — Promised Land, Bo Diddley, Green Onions, heralding the wolves' own exciting modern American folk music.

Both David Hidalgo and Rosas are excellent vocalists, Hidalgo particularly possessing a highly-individual voice as distinctive (and in some ways similar to) Steve Miller's, while Rosas has a fine West Coast rock voice.

Almost needless to say, they

can handle slowies - Matter Of Time — with as much aplomb as the rockers, but quite why they should be chosen as the prodigal sons, while their "personal friends" The Fabulous Thunderbirds were largely ignored a few years back, is difficult to fathom. That said, any signs of unsullied enthusiasm in the US rock scene must be a welcome develop-ment, and thank you London Re-cords for all the Slash roster.

Hard Corps

OF ALL the latest wave of "hard" electronic bands, Hard Corps tower above the competition with a simple, elegant grace.

And they showed the likes of Gina X and UBahn X just how it should be done with a set of terse songs which eschewed the usual SM cliches of the genre at Islington Town Hall.

There wasn't a note or gesture wasted in a set which managed to make full use of the barest surroundings. Pride is a word that often sprung to mind watching singer Regine and her three men in black. To resort to the obvious pouting and posturing would have been beneath their dignity, and while the men (in the most tasteful of make-up) con-structed the percussive, stark sound, Regine (bare face and gamine chic) paced around the stage with a cat-like grace.

That they could play with such hauteur and confidence in front of a couple of hundred people in a Victorian town hall seems to suggest that there will be no stopping them with a bit of publicity under their belts and a good

producer to guide them.

At their best on the pacier dance tracks, Hard Corps really did sound brave and new. It's early days yet, this was only their third live performance and a lot lies in the hands of their new record company, Polydor. But there's no mistaking the fact that Hard Corps have got what it takes to be very big.

Mezzoforte back on European scene

ICELANDIC JAZZ-funk band Mez zoforte, best known in this coun try for their major pop hit Garden Party in 1983, recently returned to this country for recording. Soon they go on a European tour which opens in West Germany on April 13, and moves on through Austria and Holland.

The band's new single Taking Off (Steinar STE 1260, through Pinnacle) is a radical departure in Pinnacle) is a radical departure in that it features a vocal (the original instrumental mix Take Off is on the flip of the 12 inch in a 5.48 version). Indeed vocals will also for the first time be a feature of the upcoming live dates. The voice is that of Weston Foster, better known as the lead vocalist and drummer with Second Image. He will be performing on-

stage with Mezzoforte, playing percussion throughout, and tak-ing the lead on three or four vocal highlights including Taking Off and This Is The Night, another cut recently recorded for possible single release at the end of May.

Apart from Foster, the band still retains its original line-up of Eythor Gunnarson, Johann Asmundsson, Fredrik Karlsson and Gunnlauger Briem. After seven years together, this makes them the longest-lived Icelandic band with a consistent line-up, as well as by far the most interna-tionally successful. The combina-tion with a British vocalist could prove very interesting both for their future development and commercial prospects here.

Hollywood debutante

A NEW label on the UK dance A NEW label on the UK dance scene is Debut, marketed by Skratch/SMP through PRT. Its first single (DEBT 12 1) is Hollywood Nights (not the Bob Seger song) by Marcel King, whom those with long memories will recall as lead singer of hitmaking recall as lead singer of hitmaking Seventies band Sweet Sensation. The accompanying release fea-tures Mirage, produced by Nigel Wright, with a medley entitled Get Down On It (DEBT 12 2) which, as the title suggests, is made up of Kool & The Gang hits eight in all, including Ladies Night, Steppin' Out, Take It To The Top and most of Kool's other UK biggies.

It has been a while since a re-cord of this kind was successful — Mirage's own medley of George Benson hits was prob-ably the most recent — but the strength of the Kool originals and the skill with which they have been interpreted and blended here should give this single huge dance floor appeal.

Shack attack

RECORD SHACK is counting on another major success well out-side its consistently fruitful Hiside its consistently fruitful Hi-NRG field with Barbara Ponning-ton's Fan The Flame (SOHOT 37 on 12-inch), which is a mid-tempo funky soul burner that— as the label actually claims— blends perfectly on dancefloors with the current biggies by such as Loose Ends, Krystol and Jenny Burton. To assist with promotion, Shack has Burton in the country for an extensive series of PAs, which will include Radio London's Soul Night Out.

The SMP/Inferno Northern Soul compilation Livin' The Nightlife, announced in this column a few weeks ago, will hit the street imminently, and offers contents to spread its appeal far beyond the environs of Stoke and Wigan, R&B dance classics like Jackie Wilson's Higher And Higher, the Platters' Sweet Sweet Lovin', Bar-Platters' Sweet Sweet Lovin', Barbara Acklin's Am I The Same Girl and Chuck Jackson's I Keep Forgettin' share the four sides with 28 other tracks by names like the Toys, Billy Butler, the Shirelles and Gene Chandler.
