ceremony next February.

BPI chairman Maurice Oberstein said last week that the campaign was needed to counter the declining proportion of disposable income that was being spent on records and tapes. He admitted that the market had grown year-onyear but pointed out that current sales volumes were still below the levels of 1978 and '79.

Speaking at the PolyGram annual sales conference, Oberstein said: "We have been meeting in an informal way with a lot of the major retailers to try to promote communication be-

"In the US they have the Gift Of Music

campaign and here we have seen the wool mark and 'go to work on an egg'.
"We have advanced a fair distance forward

in seeing whether we could end up with an all-industry campaign which would get people to buy music product."

Publicly, the BPI is reluctant to say anything about the campaign, feeling that any details announced at present would be premature. However, people connected with the project feel that the awards ceremony, which will be televised in the UK, would be ideal for launching the campaign.

#### PolyGram is top'—

POLYGRAM, NOT CBS, should be regarded as the UK record market leader, former CBS managing director Maurice Oberstein told the PolyGram annual sales conference.

Oberstein, now chairman and chief executive of PolyGram Leisure

UK, said that having the market share split between Polydor, Phonogram and London was preventing the group being acknowledged as 'the best in Britain'

"the best in Britain".

He commented: "The fact that we maintain this separate and quite proper presence in the market place through Polydor, Phonogram and London does prevent us from standing up as a group of people and representing ourselves as the best company in Britain."

Oberstein praised the group's A&R departments and said PolyGram's UK repertoire was superior to any other in the country. He also welcomed the distribution deals that MCA and A&M had signed with PolyGram and said they would help boost Chadwell Heath's capacity. "We will have the capacity to get out our own million-selling single from our own factors and more importantly, we will have the people capable." our own factory and, more importantly, we will have the people capable of doing the job."

THE DEBENHAMS store chain is likely to be the vehicle for the expansion of the French FNAC audio retail enterprise into the UK via a "shop within a shop" operation, although the possibility of separate FNAC stores is also being studied.

At the moment, Record Merchandisers supply re-cords and tapes to selected Debenhams stores for sale through the Green's chain which has outlets within the stores and a Green's spokesman told MW: "We have the sole concession to sell records in Debenhams and know nothing of any changes in our arrangement.

FNAC, acquired earlier this year by Sir Terence Conran's Habitat Mothercare organisation in conjunction with a French insurance company (MW July 13), has 19 stores selling hi-fi and video hardware, records, tapes and video software, photographic equipment and books.

Habitat Mothercare was associated with the Bur-

ton group in its takeover of the Debenham chain, and

Sir Terence Conran confirmed that his organisation has access to 20 per cent of Debenhams floorspace throughout the UK. He was non-committal on how

this space will be shared between Habitat Mothercare retailing and FNAC operations.
"We're concentrating on the French operation at the moment," he told *MW*: "We want to improve FNAC's success there before introducing the idea here. It will take us at least six months to study the possibilities with regard to the UK, and at least a year

to set things up here."

Whether the UK FNAC chain will emulate the broad spread of stock in its French stores or not is one of the matters to be decided. Sir Terence gave the assurance that music product will play a major role

Debenhams has 67 UK stores, and Sir Terence said that about 40 will have to be "radically altered" to accommodate the Habitat Mothercare FNAC presence. Sir Terence commented that the Green's situation was something that would have to be discussed and resolved.



A QUEEN box-set and various re-issues are amongst EMI Records' autumn releases as the company continues to exploit its back catalogue.

The Queen set, entitled The Complete Works, will

feature 14 of the group's albums, all digitally remas-tered, and includes a full discography and tour itinerary. Frank Sinatra will also be featured in a box-set:
The Capitol Years will comprise the 18 digitally
remastered albums re-issued by EMI during the last
18 months, with the bonus of two other previously
unavailable albums.

Nat King Cole will have 15 of his Capitol albums re-issued — all digitally remastered. There is also to be a Christmas catalogue campaign fronted by new album titles from Slim Whitman, Kenny Rogers, Ron Goodwin, Frank Sinatra, Nat King Cole and Bing Crosby.

The Retrospect label will be issuing a Paul Robe-

son compilation including his classic Ol' Man River. A compilation, Motor City Roots featuring pre-Motown recording, will be out on the Stateside label while Liberty Records has plans for an all-women album, Liberty Belles.

Other back-catalogue releases include five albums under the banner Rock 'n' Roll Masters. Names initially scheduled are Fats Domino, Gene Vincent, Ricky Nelson, Bobby Vee and Eddie Cochran, and the series will be supported by music press advertising and point of sale material.

There is also a series of pop albums compiled by pop and film archivist Alan Warner which includes amongst its titles You Heard It Here First, In The Beginning (first recordings by many of today's su-perstars including David Bowie and Billy Joel), Put On Your Dancing Shoes and Dream Babies.

"The service is for all dealers, irrespective of their size," Ted Harris, EMI MADS managing director said this week. "We will also be including product from the previous week's Music Week charts so there is no confusion on a Tuesday as to which is the current chart. This is a positive step towards a better distribution service, and the dealer will decide what is priority product and not



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

#### Low-key MTV video awards

NEW YORK: The second annual MTV video music awards show was a surprisingly low-key event, despite the still-growing glamour of rock video. Most conspicuous by their absence: screaming girls, who would have provided a good bit of contagious excitement at the appearances of Paul Young, Sting, Corey Hart, Julian Lennon, John Taylor and Andy Taylor.

Don Henley's artful The Boys Of Summer video gathered awards for best video, and for its director, Jean-Baptiste Mondino, cinematographer Pascal Lebeque and art director Bryan Jones. Other winners included Tina Turner (best female video, What's Love Got To Do With It); Bruce Springsteen (best male video, I'm On Fire, and best stage performance, Dancing In The Dark); Til Tuesday (best new artist, Voices Carry) and Philip Bailey & Phil Collins (best overall performance in Easy Lover). Viewer's choice was We Are The World.

Vanguard awards went to directors Russell Mulcahy, David Byrne and Kevin Godley & Lol Creme. Bon mot award of the evening had to go to Bob Geldof, introduced by Joan Baez, who reminded the audience that there was time enough for the movement started by Band Aid and Live Aid to bear fruit, and that no time limit should be imposed on a limitless task. Artists and radio stations, defending their reputation as entertainers and entertainment media, are beginning to put an opposing perspective into the discussion, with very cogent statements from producer Mtume and various radio programmers outlining the real-world potential effects of what has so far been an emotional appeal by the PMRC. The Musical Majority, a group of agents, managers and artists, has been formed as a lobbying and PR organisation to do that on a more organised basis. organised basis.

Sad ironies have abounded in the situation ever since the Parents Music Resource Centre (PMRC) began its media campaign against what it claims to be a rising tide of pornography in rock music. Foremost among them: the PMRC's attack threatens not so much the free expression of recording artists threatens not so much the free expression of recording artists as the record industry's perennially pending legislation imposing a royalty on blank tapes and tape recorders. It's the latter threat that is being used as a plank to hit the industry over the head — as one of the Washington wives put it recently. And it's the fact that they can threaten the royalty legislation that's caused the record business to treat this group with such deference. It was, after all, the rock press and the fans of music who first cried out against sexist and violent abuse of women in rock videos — as well as other continuing issues such as racist radio and cable programming policies. While record labels ignored the criticism of the less-well-connected, neither were they the champions of heavy metal ugliness.

But the ins and outs of pressure tactics are just too compli-

But the ins and outs of pressure tactics are just too complicated to explain to the public — and the PMRC, promising not to seek legislation, makes that vow only so that they can continue a smear without fear of the courts ruling on the merits of the issue.

#### **Controlling outlaw product**

AS MAIN supplier of photographs to the music and affiliated trades for more than 15 years it grieves us to see that the old "licensed" as opposed to "unofficial" merchandise row has broken out again. It's strange that this only seems to occur during periods when UK acts are achieving more than their share of success in the US, the area in which the problems really lie and where, of course, the laws related to these products are totally different.

the problems really lie and where, of course, the laws related to these products are totally different.

Unfortunately, the "aggrieved" parties have not given you a precise description of what occurs. Several of the manufacturers of unofficial calendars, T-shirts, posters and other material, have made multiple applications to groups, their managements and their merchandising contractors for products' licences. The story is the same throughout; no reply to letters or telephone calls, and, when and if an official contract is submitted, it inevitably contains so many restrictions and so much legal verbosity that the fees for "checking it out" become prohibitive for the small trader.

The time taken for completion can be anything between three and six

The time taken for completion can be anything between three and six months by which time, it is possible, the product isn't worth producing and the advances and royalties demanded are sometimes so extortion-

and the advances and royalties demanded are sometimes so extortionate that "unofficial" merchandise manufacturers, having looked at the law as it affects them, decide to acquire the copyright in a picture from an agency such as ourselves and "publish and be damned". It is only when Music Week runs a merchandising supplement that the "aggrieved" managers and merchandising companies are suddenly called to arms. If they all took time to take a stroll down Carnaby Street or Oxford Walk they would see shops that are totally devoted to rock paraphernalia, none of which is licensed.

Anticipating the problem two years ago this company instituted a scheme which offered groups and managements a virtual guarantee of immunity from this type of exploitation. Approaches were made (and indeed are still being made) to various top artists but the success rate on 'signings' has been very slow. Three who did sign, however, Wham, Paul Young, and Spandau Ballet, have seen their volume of unofficial merchandise available in the street dramatically reduce since we started putting in efforts on their behalf.

our advice to anyone involved who wishes to effect this sort of reduction is, firstly, don't waste money on legal actions. It's all been done before and it ultimately doesn't work. Secondly, if anybody with a half decent product idea asks for a licence then grant it to them against a nam decent product local asks for a ficefice their graft it to their against a simple agreement (we understand from our lawyers that the necessary documentation can be contained in a single page) with a reasonable advance and agreed, moderate royalty. Thirdly, control photo-output by signing a deal with a photo-agency such as us for exclusive distribution of press shots.

By the employment of these simple rules the quality of the product on the market will be controlled and the people who do turn out rubbish will gradually be squeezed out (although it would be impossible to wipe them out completely).

Where the Cure fans come from is impossible to say. What do they do in between release days? But rest assured as soon as any product becomes available, they're there to hoist it into the charts. The Cure can fill the Arena and have top 20 hits. Expect just that from the new Fiction/Polydor single, Close To Me.

"At the moment I'm based back in the UK — I've missed home a lot during the time I've been in the US — and it would be great if my pop career took off again. On the other hand, I've never wanted to be labelled as just a model, or singer or actress. I've always enjoyed branching out and doing other things — that way you are not in danger of becoming stale."





Barry Evans of Bullet tells the

five year success story

# A shot in the dark and Bullet is born

N THE heart of the West End five years ago, Barry Evans, the marketing and sales director of Phonogram, decided it was time to start his own business. At his regional outpost in sunny Leeds, general manager of regional promotion, Stewart Coxhead, had also nurtured the prospect of starting an independent promotion company.

BARRY EVANS is chairman and joint managing director of the Bullet Group. Prior to branching out on his own with Stewart Coxhead and the rest of the Bullet team — Barry had scored considerable successes with various major record companies.

His major company director-level experience covered marketing, promotion, sales, finance, business affairs, A&R and record produc-

Barry left university with a degree in economics and law, and then qualified as a chartered accountant with an international accountancy practice, whilst playing lead guitar and providing lead vocals with several semi-pro bands.

He started his career

He started his career with the holding company of EMI, advising main board directors on commercial matters in relation to the music industry. He was invited to join EMI records initially as financial controller, but quickly moved on into general management responsibilities, becoming general manager and deputy to managing director Bob Mercer. This gave him the opportunity to gain experience in all areas of marketing, sales,

A&R and contract negotiations, with particular responsibility for the TV record marketing division.

Prior to setting up Bullet, Barry was head-hunted to Phonogram Records as marketing and sales director, where he was responsible for all marketing, press promotion and sales activity.

As well as liaising with and advising Bullet clients, Barry takes responsibility for Bullet marketing, strategic policy and all business and administrative functions. He also has responsibility for the activities of the record label arm, Priority Records, and runs the TV record marketing consultancy management

So it was that fate gelled — Barry Evans resigned and secured the necessary City financial backing. Stewart Coxhead then resigned along with the majority of the Phonogram regional promotion team and the whole independent crew sailed for the relatively uncharted waters of professional indepedent national retail and media promotion.

own business within the record industry and saw there was a gap in the marketplace for a new and professional nationwide promotion company which would both enable the independent labels to compete with the majors and also provide a service to the majors — at the time, some of the majors were very sales orientated in their on-the-road teams.

In practice, our initial business came from the independents. Our first client in 1980 was Dave Robinson of Stiff who has always had tremendous faith in Bullet, and with whom we have scored tremendous success with acts such as Madness, Jona Lewie, Tracey Ull-

came to us. Now, all of them have used us at some stage or other.

#### How do you account for your success?

We were proved right — there was a gap in the marketplace for a professionally run promotion operation, and from day 1 we had a very experienced team of people and provided them with all the tools to do the job properly. They were also a very motivated team.

a very motivated team.
With Stewart and myself, we had two very experienced record business executives devoting our time exclusively to the problems and techniques of promotion.
Part of our success has

Part of our success has been because, apart from our experience, we have the ability to react very quickly to marketplace changes. Our flexibility is one of the keys that puts us ahead of the normal corporate structure.

The majors have gradually recognised and reacted to the changing face of UK sales/ promotion and most majors and medium-sized companies now have their own strike forces. Our task is always to be in the forefront of promotion changes and techniques and we are constantly reviewing our

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strategies and organisa-

#### Do you target your activities at chart return shops?

Part of our work has to be target marketing. What we do in the record industry is no different to any other industry — that is promoting its product. Given that everybody's resources are limited to some extent, you have to promote in the most effective areas.

You go out of your way to encourage retailers to give priority to your product. Aggressive marketing and promotion presents no problem with Gallup as long as people act sensibly and don't break the rules. Obviously we don't just call on chart shops. Amongst the 600 shops on our nationwide call cycle there are a number of specialist and pace making retailers who are not part of the chart system.

When we started there were perhaps four or five strike forces calling on dealers on a weekly basis, now there are almost 20—the pressure on the retailer is incredible. With so much promotion activity, it's essential that a record is given

its best possible chance. After five years, Bullet still gives a record its best

#### shot. How many records do

you work on at a time?

On average we will be working on five or six records at any one time. We have to judge when is the right moment to give a major push on a particular single. There's little point, for example, in exerting a major retail promotional push on a record which has not yet started generating any club or radio reaction or sales base.

Part of our expertise is judging what should be done at what stage during a record's life at retail level. Dealers can make all the difference to a record at the low end of the chart with in-store plays, customer targetting and so on. It's our job to encourage the dealer to use his in-store promotional muscle on our clients records as well as to ensure the dealer is aware of, is in stock and is merchandising the records.

With our close relationships with dealers, we aim to maximise our records' chances in an incredibly competitive marketplace.





STEWART COXHEAD, joint managing director of the Bullet Group had considerable major record company experience before taking the plunge and 'going independent' with Bullet.

Stewart's background however, covers more than just the record industry. Before joining the business, Stewart had jobs in shipping and airlines — he was for a time a duty officer at Leeds Bradford Airport, during which time he played in a local band and was a club D.J.

At the end of 1968, he joined Philips Records as van sales rep for Yorkshire. He started moving into the promotion area, and eventually became general manager of regional promotion, based in sunny Leeds. He also had interests in A&R and acted as a record producer on all sorts of music from Val Doonican to Mike Harding.

But his talents didn't/don't end there. Stewart was also writer for Pop Quest, a Yorkshire TV network pop quiz, and he has also produced and presented a radio show on Pennine Radio.

Now. Stewart takes

Now, Stewart takes day-to-day responsibility for running the Bullet strike force, liaising with clients, controlling and organising all retail and media promotional activities. He also acts as manager for some Bullet Management clients

Management clients.
We asked Stewart to put the record straight:

You must have seen some changes in the promotion business during the last five years?

The reality of the situation is that since our formation, people have realised the need for a strike force, and a number of record companies have set up their own strike forces, plus more independent operations have come onto the scene. It is more competitive out there than ever.

How do you account for your continuing success in this increasingly competitive field?

Hopefully, we offer the most professional service, and we run our operation in the same way a major record company would. We treat our staff from the point of view of benefits as if they were working for a major, but of course personal relationships and motivation are a lot stronger than is possible within a major record company.

Our strength lies in the people who work for us.

# Bullet strike force is a hit

We have an excellent relationship with the people who work for us and in turn, they build longterm relationships with the retailers, radio and TV stations. Overall, we try to keep a balance between experience, youth and enthusiasm — and it seems to work.

Apart from your nationwide retail coverage you also promote to radio and television stations, don't you?

Yes, we've always prided ourselves on our regional media promotion which we feel is comparable with and often better than most majors. Our team physically calls on most of the ILR stations on a weekly basis and their activity is co-ordinated by our head of media, Jackie Donnahey, who also undertakes regional television promotion, placing acts and videos.

With radio play increasingly difficult to obtain, any television opportunities are critical to an act's chances of success.

Bullet has grown from being just a promotion company — you have a lot more to offer?

Bullet as such generates the most business. But alongside the promotion side, we have our TV marketing operation, our management and publishing companies and Priority Records.

Do you get asked to promote more records than you can — or want — to handle?

Yes, in general we get offered more than we can handle. In reality, we sometimes become a second-line A&R company. There is no point in clients spending their money on us promoting records that don't stand a chance. The fact that we have had a 70 per cent success rate speaks for itself. We do choose what

we work with, and perhaps we are fortunate in that we have chosen the right product. When it comes down to it, the best promotion company in the world can't make a hit out of a bad record.

Where we score is on marginal product which we can push really hard. But basically, we specialise in maximising the potential of hits. We have no barriers as far as musical styles are concerned. The UK market holds such wide-ranging musical tastes, anything goes—and we are happy

to work with anything as long as it has commercial potential.

You are confident of the continuing success of Bullet?

While record companies are willing to spend enormous amounts of money making records, on studios, on producers, videos and so on, at the end of the day they are going to want the best possible promotion to give their artists the best possible chance of getting a hit.

#### Does the increasing competition worry you?

Obviously we watch the situation closely. Whilst Bullet remains the backbone of the operation we have expanded the areas we operate in, the services we can offer. We have reacted to the changes in the marketplace. Through Priority, for example, we have another service we can offer... On the promotion front, there's still plenty of work out there. It's interesting to note that when we started, we

thought that the majority of our work would come from the small indie labels, but now 70 per cent of our work comes from the major record companies, who either wish to give heavy priority to a particular act or haven't got the internal promotion resources to cope with a heavy singles release schedule.

Another interesting aspect is that we have seen a dramatic increase in the number of American management and record companies asking us to work on their artists' product.



DEPECHE MODE: Five years of hits with Bullet

BULLET now has a wellestablished Television marketing operation/ consultancy which, as with other divisions within the Bullet Group was established and developed because the directors had realised there was a gap in the marketplace for a specialist service in this area.

"It arose partly because of my experience with TV marketing with major record companies," says Barry Evans. "I gained a lot of experience in this field at both Phonogram and EMI where I was closely involved with the EMTV projects such as The Beach Boys and Shadows 20 Golden Greats and Nat King Cole."



"With media time-buying, we employ independent buying shops and oversee what they do to make sure the impact is being effective-

ly maximised.
"On the physical side, we advise on stock levels, and make sure the distribution is directed to the right places at the right times, in the right depth. With our reps on the road, we are able to get accurate geographical information and are thus able together with Gallup returns to judge the effectiveness of TV marketing in different areas.

That Bullet's thorough research and practical approach to TV marketing works, can be seen in its successes to date. As well as the Felicity Kendall album, there have been further big sellers in the same field, in-cluding Angela Rippon and Arlene Phillips. Last Christ-mas, in conjunction with Telstar, Black Lace's Party album sold over half a mil-lion units. Barry Evans is currently working on a Depeche Mode compilation for Mute Records, and there will be another Black Lace TV album before Christmas.

There are different approaches to new acts, to re-working old repertoire and consolidating the crossover acts that are at mid-stages in their careers."

AT THE budget end of the market, Pickwick has several releases that should enjoy considerable pre-Christmas sales including the album The Survivors featuring Johnny Cash, Jerry Lee Lewis and Carl Perkins, and a Merle Haggard and George Jones album, A Taste Of Yesterday's Wine which has previously been difficult for fans to get.



TWO WEEKS ago I said: "The acceptance of soul in the North generally may even be inhibited by the very way its fans there take it so seriously, as something special (an attitude one cannot knock), whereas around London it's so readily available as to be part of most people's daily life". Stated like that admittedly it was intended to shock, but that is basically true, and I always intended to amplify the statement.

The main cause of suspicion, ill feeling and misunderstanding between North and South (which is not serious but does sadly seem still to exist) now probably revolves around the ease of access anyone in London and the Home Counties has to black music on the radio. So many radio stations in the South-East are playing it daily that it's no surprise that this is the area that creates all the black hits. Fans there are now younger than ever, and lazy thanks to being spoon fed a diet of the music without any effort on their part in finding it — hence the rise of London-orientated teenybopper black pop.

Note that now I'm not calling it soul. Up North, where the most that the majority of people can hope for is one weekly specialist soul show on radio (not to forget Robbie Vincent nationally on Radio One every Sunday night), the fans tend to be fanatics, who really have to expend energy, time and trouble tracking down the music they love. Whether after that the music means more to them than it does

Whether after that the music means more to them than it does to their counterparts down South is a moot point, but it seems likely it does as they are attracted more by the intrinsic quality and soul content of the music than by fashionable marketing campaigns. My heart lies up North, unfortunately my head and reality are in London! (Actually this week I and most of London are in New York at the New Music Seminar!)

Of the new releases, obviously hotter than July is Stevie Wonder's In Square Circle LP (Motown ZL72005) — by now you'll be aware that his pop hit Part-Time Lover has been much remixed for 12-inch after all, and that René & Angela's I'll Re

(MCA Records MCAT 1006).

Also likely to do well on domestic 12-inch are André Cymone's The Dance Electric (CBS TX 6435), more exciting than producer/writer Prince's own current releases; The Team's We Are The Team (EMI 12EMI 5533), sort of Brass Construction sing Hi Tension, and flipped by Rock Creek Park (the original version of which by The Blackbyrds will soon be coupled with Walking In Rhythm on Streetwavel; Roy Ayer's Slip n Slide (CBS TA 6604), solid if not maybe a classic; Tramaine's Fall Down (Spirit Of Love) (A&M AMY 281), Edwin Hawkins' sister mightily wailing some agod old fashioned "disco": Fathack's She's A Go-Getter some good old fashioned "disco"; Fatback's She's A Go-Getter (Atlantic B9506T), possibly too soulful to be huge; Mas-querade's Set It Off (Streetwave MKHAN 55), a cheekily adverised British cover version of the more subtle Harlequin Four's mport hit.

A couple of slowies worth watching are Sockit's Swinging On A Star (FM Records 12KIS 2, via Spartan), and Jesse Johnson's Revue's I Want My Girl (A&M AMY 270). On import 12-inch are The System's This Is For You (Mirage 0-96851), Morris Day's The Oak Tree (Warner Bros 0-20379), Toney Lee's Night Lights (Critique CR 8516), plus the real oddity of the moment, Bobby Jimmy & The Critters' Fresh Guys (Rapsur Records RP 10015), a hip hop rap send-up straight enough to be taken seriously by anyone not listening closely but flipped by both the hilarious Sheeps, hinting at unnatural practices, and smoochy I Wanna Have Ur Baby, worthy of Theophilus P. Wildebeeste, all from the fevered in pany, worthy of Theophilus P. Wildebeeste, all from the fevered imagination of Russ Parr (a.k.a. Bobby Jimmy) whose Hollywood label it obviously is, and who must be in line as a worthy successor to the now less funny than he used to be George Clinton.

This last one may not be widely available thanks to its apparent hip hop content, so will need tracking down and demonstrating to sell it to anyone with a warped sense of

# Funkin' for Ice

STEINAR RECORDS, best known for Icelandic jazz-funkers Mezzoforte, and also recently big on the disco/dance charts with Chris Cameron releases a notable compilation album on September 23. Funkin' Marvellous (MARV 1000) features nine tracks covering most of the Steinar dance roster — Cameron, Mezzoforte, French Impression, Street Beat, Shady and Jack Magnet. Most of the tracks are new, previously unheard offerings, making the package a sampler of things to come from the label rather than a roundup of oldies.

The album's highlight, and by far its longest track, is The Megamix Segue, a medley jointly produced by Geoff Calver, Chris Cameron and Mezzoforte, and welding together familiar dance classics like Stuff Like That, Funkin' For

Times. The track is a possibility for an eventual 12-inch release, but in the meantime the entire album which retails at mid-price - is a highly attractive customer proposition since it costs very little more than a 12-inch single itself.

A strong promotional campaign is already underway for Funkin' Marvellous, including a competition in *Blues & Soul* magazine and on

specialist radio shows based around identifying the elements of the Megamix Segue.

Prizes for this include a 'Funkin' Marvellous disco weekend in Iceland' for a total of six winners, arranged in conjunction with Iceland dair. Extensive ILR advertising is also set for the album. Distribution is through PRT.

#### **EMI** soul anthologies

MORE CLASSIC soul music is reinstated to the catalogues and to specialist dealers' shelves this month, with two new compilations from EMI, both on the reactivated Stateside label (something which in itself would persuade certain long-time buyers to purchase the albums unheard!)

The first is a newly compiled anthology from the catalogues of Liberty and its various subsidiaries, featuring some of the most popular female soul soloists of the Sixties. The title (cleverly) is Liberty Belles (EG 2604831), and featured on the 16 tracks are Tina Turner, Irma Thomas,

Timi Yuro, Baby Washington and Clydie King.

The companion album is Soul Serenade — The Best Of Lou Rawls (EG 2606681), which features the still-active soloist on the pick of his Sixties Capitol material, including well-remembered hits like Dead End Street and Love Is A Hurtin' Thing. Rawls eventually found his British success from the mid-Seventies onwards, but his vocal styling doesn't date, and present-day customers who like Jeffrey Osborne, Luther Vandross, etc. could easily be guided to this set by dance dealers.

#### Reflected glory

VETERAN MEMPHIS soul group the Mad Lads, who recently resurfaced in the US with a (World Famous) tag in front of their name, now have that same re-cord You Blew It released in the UK on the new Champion label, which is based in West London. Although the group had a string of US releases in the Sixties and 70s on the Stax subsidiary label Volt, this seems to be their first British single since their first hit Don't Have To Shop Around was issued here by Atlantic in the au-

# Berlin bands special filmed by Music Box

MUSIC BOX has just completed four pop promo clips of German bands during a special one week film shoot in Berlin. The bands are Shark Vegas, Black Carnations, Mike Vamp and Soif De La Vie. So far this year, Music Box has made more than 20 such promos for new and emerging bands all over Europe.

Comments Jane Kelly, Music Box's head of production: "Our policy has always been to cover European bands, but the shortage of available visual material has led us to turn our words into actions."

"We could have just sat back and observed, but instead we have got involved in what is basically a service to the record companies, the groups and our audiences, who would otherwise be deprived of visual back-up for some of their favourite local groups. It's simply a case of putting our money where our mouth is."

Meanwhile, Sky Channel has set up a service to

help groups make videos for minimal costs. "Many of the European bands we would like to feature on Sky Trax don't have videos," says a Sky spokesman. "So we are setting up arrangements across Europe whereby we get together with local production companies to make video clips for local artists in association with the record companies."

Sky Channel has signed a one year agreement with Tele-Monte-Carlo to provide 12.5 hours weekly of Sky's pop music programme, Sky Trax on the station. Says Sky's assistant managing director David Ciclitira: "Distribution of Sky Trax on Tele-Monte-Carlo offers important exposure of the show in Southern Europe. Sky Trax has already been acquired for broadcast by Video Music in Italy, the Singapore Broadcasting Corporation, ATV in Hong Kong and Much Music in Canada is also finalising agreements after experimental broadcasts of Sky Trax."

#### No comment required

PHIL COLLINS: No Jacket Required. Virgin Video. Dealer price: £8.50. The sales potential for this new 5-track video EP must be enormous — Collins' No Jacket Required album has sold more than 600,000 units and is still in the Top 10 more than six months after release, and his UK spring tour of the same name was a complete sell-out. There must be thousands of fans who would like a more visual record of one of the UK's real giants of rock music.

The video features five tracks from the album — Sussudio, One More Night, Who Said I Would (filmed at Collins' Royal Albert Hall appearance) and the recent Top 20 hit, Take Me Home. The latter must claim the record for being filmed in the most number of exotic locations — New York, Hollywood, San Francisco, Sydney, London and Japan are all featured. Collins was presumably filmed in the various locations during his world tour.

his world tour.

Phil Collins' appeal transcends age barriers — he's the kind of guy you wouldn't look at twice in the street but when he's onstage he becomes an electrifying performer — yet one who paradoxically retains the ordinary touch. With a big advertising campaign behind this release (including TV advertising) No Jacket Required should be one of the big video sellers between now and Christmas.

TOM ROBINSON: Back In The Old Country. PolyGram Video. Dealer price: £13.50. Robinson is an under-rated rock performer who seems to specialise in bouncing back from obscurity every now and again with a record that takes everybody by surprise (as with War Baby). This video, directed by Mike Mansfield, was filmed during his 1984 Back In The Old Country tour when he was once again enjoying a resurgence in popularity.

surgence in popularity.
Robinson is a performer that you can either love or hate, a lot of it depending upon how you view the political nature of many of his songs. What can't be denied though is that he is a pretty magnetic figure onstage, and his charisma comes through on this video.

The Back In The Old Country tour featured a set resembling a

garage forecourt two miles from the centre of Port Stanley in the Falkland Islands. The backdrop helps to give the video a strong



visual presentation, and complements Robinson's often aggressive music. Producer Mansfield has come up with some interesting visual shots which add considerably to the whole produc-

Several of Robinson's best known numbers are featured including Atmospherics (Listen To The Radio) which should have been a huge hit and wasn't, War Baby. 2-4-6-8 Motorway, Never Gonna Fall In Love Again (cowritten with Elton John) and Martin's Gone. He's backed by a great set of musicians and there's a guest appearance by The Immaculate Fools on (Don't Do Me) Any Favours.

# Strauss/Rossini

TWO WORLD premiere opera recordings come from CBS next month both from composers who went on to write important works for the

both from composers who went on to write important works for the medium: Strauss and Rossini.

The premiere recording of Richard Strauss' first opera, Guntram, comes in a two-LP/tape set (I2M 39737) featuring a largely Hungarian cast conducted by Eve Queler.

ast conducted by Eve dueler.

It will provoke wide interest among operatic circles, despite Guntram rarely being performed on stage; it contains some striking music which, like the subject matter — the "redeeming female" — is strongly Wagnerian in character. In fact, like Wagner, Strauss wrote his own libretto for the Guntram.

This CBS recording was made in Budapest two years ago with Reiner Goldberg and Ilona Tokody in the principal roles, and follows other operatic recordings made by Queler for CBS, including Massenet's Le

operatic recordings made by Queler for CBS, including Massenet's Le Cid, and Puccini's Edgar.
Marilyn Horne heads an experienced Rossini cast in the composer's serious opera based on the Crusades — Tancredi. The world premiere recording (I3M 39073 3LP/tape) was made in The Opera House, Venice,

two years ago.

The new Philips recording of Verdi's Rigoletto, with Renato Bruson in the title role, Neil Shicoff as the Duke And Edita Gruberova as Gilda, conducted by Sinopoli (412 592 LP/tape/CD) makes a total of nine currently available versions of one of the composer's most popular

It was made last year in Italy with the Accademia Nazionale di Santa Cecilia, and followed the consistent reputation developed by Sinopoli for his productions of Italian opera.

#### Maisky touch for Bach

MISCHA MAISKY, the 37-year-old Russian emigre cellist now living in the US, features on two significant Deutsche Grammophon releases next month, the first fruits of a long-term exclusive contract with the company to record the major works for the instrument.

For his first albums, he has recorded the first great works for the instrument. Bach's Six Suites for Unaccompanied Cello (415 416 LP/tape/CD) and the Three Cello Sonatas with the fiery pianist Martha Argerich (415 471 LP/tape/CD) — they have regularly played together

Among other future plans are Beethoven's Triple Concerto with Kremer and Argerich and Haydn's two Cello Concertos.



CELLIST JULIAN Lloyd Web-CELLIST JULIAN Lloyd Webber continues working his new Philips contract with a new recording of Haydn's Cello Concertos No 1 in C and No 4 in D in which he not only plays but also directs the Entertain (112) plays but also directs the English Chamber Orchestra (412 793 LP/tape/CD).

Other forthcoming issues from Lloyd Webber include a cross-over album called Pieces which will have "massive" TV backing, plus the Elgar Cello Concerto recorded with Meanths. with Menuhin.

#### boosts Walkman

AS DG's immensely successful Walkman Classics series passes its 500,000 sales in the UK alone, 10 more releases are being issued, bringing the total Walkman Classics catalogue to 66.

The October release continues a trend to broaden the series away from simply using it as a medium for popular classics. Apart from Beethoven Violin Sonatas with Kempff and Menuhin (415 6154) and Tchaikovsky's Symphony No 4 and other works (415 6174), there is Bruckner's Symphony No 4 and the Te Deum (415 6164) and Ballet Suites by Weber, Tchaikovsky, Stravinsky and Delibes (415 6184), Perhaps most unusual of all is the Best of Boston Pops (415 6204) and The Best Of Ravi Shankar (415 6214), which should indicate whether Walkman Classics can broaden its operation.

"The success we have had in selling quite esoteric material over the past few months has shown that the buyers of Walkman Classics now have the confidence to experiment and try new things," said Bill

have the confidence to experiment and try new things," said Bill

Holland, classical manager, DG.

The company originally contracted with Sony to use the Walkman name for two years with a sell-off period of a further year. But the success of the series, particularly in the UK and the US, and the ensuing royalties paid to Sony, have resulted in a year's extension that could be extended.

Holland expects that by next year, the total Walkman Classics catalogue will reach the 100 mark. With plans for the autumn TV campaign well advanced, he anticipates the best Walkman Christmas yet.

Philips' popular classsics cassette series, On Tour, which has not been able to match the Walkman success, has a second release this month, a further 10 titles, with the dealer price maintained at £1.89, in compatison with Walkman Classics' £2.10.

#### PolyGram's imitations on increase

Meanwhile, on Decca, the London Enterprise series (clone of DG's Collector's Series and Phi-lips' Sequenza Special) also introduces six new titles of specialist material at mid-price.

And there are some interesting things, including Piano Works by Gottschalk played by Ivan Davis (414 438 LP/tape), Hindemith's Violin Concerto coupled with the Symphony Metamorphoses on themes of Weber played by David Oistrakh (414 437 LP/MC) which of Strakfi (414 437 EP/MC) Which is without competition; and Honegger's Symphony Nos 3 and 4 played by the Suisse Romande Orchestra (414 435 LP/tape).

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
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
