Don Burkhimer US move triggers the latest top level reshuffle

# Preston quits Polydor to head

IN THE latest of a series of top level executive moves in the UK music industry during the past 12 months, RCA Records UK managing director Don Burkhimer is to return to the US and is being replaced by the present Polydor MD, John

US-born Burkhimer, who has been with RCA for 31 years, is to take up a new position on the international operations staff of the newly-formed worlwide RCA/Ariola International joint venture, reporting to international operations vice-president John Magini. He will work on the "worldwide implementation of the RCA/Ariola venture."

Implementation of the RCA/Ariola venture."
Burkhimer moved to RCA UK from managing director of RCA Benelux in July last year, filling the position vacated by David Betteridge three months earlier.
Preston is quitting Polydor just nine months after being promoted from marketing director to managing director when he replaced A J Morris who became regional director of Polygram International, and only three months after

He joined Polydor in 1983 as marketing manager and was previously general manager of Decca Records during its successful transition to London Records. Prior to that he spent three years with EMI Records in artist development

and marketing.
AS MD of RCA Records UK, Preston will report to Jack Davies, acting chairman of RCA/Ariola UK. He starts with RCA on October 7.

Preston's sudden departure from Polydor leaves yet another MD vacancy in the industry which Maurice Oberstein said last week he would be acting swiftly to fill.

These latest moves are the culmination of 12 months of hectic "musical chairs" among record industry leaders. This is the calendar so far:

# Crucial time for disc and video

NEW YORK: The fourth quarter of 1985 and the first quarter of 1986 are pivotal times in the relationship between the record and video industries. The future of that relationship will in fact be largely determined by just how well the two businesses are integrated at several levels.

First is the move among major videocassette distributors to sell direct to large volume accounts. One of the major beneficiaries of this new policy, exemplified by CBS/Fox, RCA/Columbia, Paramount, and MGM/UA, and previously practised by WEA and MCA, are record stores and their video chain offshoots. In order to encourage these outlets to participate in video to a greater degree, the studios are, in some instances, offering them similar return allowances to those they are accustomed to with records and tapes. Paramount is, in fact, rumoured to be allowing accounts 100 per cent returns on unsold merchandise of selected titles (non music), though the studio will not comment on the specifics of its sales terms.

Second is the way a number of record companies with no direct video partnerships are pursuing video software for distribution. Capitol is a prime example among the majors, Jem Records among the independents. Capitol is handling very narrowly conceived product lines, which it believes will be compatible with existing record store stock: Sony's music video, RKO's Broadway series, a comic book character-based line from Prism, etc. Jem specialises in music video — both its own, from the Passport Video label, and, acting as a distributor that acquired from other independents.

Third is an outgrowth of the previous two: with widespread availability of video in record stores, store owners will find out whether their customers are, in fact, video consumers. What is particularly in question as the fourth quarter approaches, is whether the music store customer, who has shown little more interest in music video for purchase than is true of video stores generally, will go to a record shop to get non-music video fare. Record dealers are cle

Having sworn never to repeat the mistakes of the record and tape industry concerning returns policies, the Hollywood stu-dios are reversing themselves in order to attempt to open new channels of distribution — in the hope that those new channels will concentrate on selling video cassettes rather than renting them, thereby forcing video speciality dealers to do the same. The shipping figures for the fourth quarter are going to be astronomical. Hopefully, the returns won't be.

WORLDWIDE RECEIPTS for ASCAP exceeded \$160m for the first eight months of 1985, an increase of 20 per cent over last year. More than half of the gain was attributed to payment of licensing fees held in escrow since the beginning of the Buffalo Broadcasting case concerning blanket licensing. Revenues from outside the US declined in dollar value to \$12.7m from \$16m in 1984 — though ASCAP president Hal David adds that the value of foreign revenues would have increased measured in local currencies. # **Gramophone controversy as** majors miss out on awards

FOR THE first time in the eight year history of the prestigious *Gramophone* Record Awards — the premier UK classical awards — four of the six major companies are without prizes — and a mid-price release has been selected as Record Of The Year.

Last year's award ceremony was touched with controversy when the Record Of The Year went not to a record but a compact disc, and this year's presentations, made by Peter Pears at the Savoy Hotel on Tuesday (October 2), were even more

Deutsche Grammophon, Philips, RCA and CBS all Deutsche Grammophon, Philips, RCA and CBS all went without awards as the 14 categories were shared out among EMI (five), Decca (three) Conifer (two) and a host of smaller companies, including Hyperion, Chandos and Danachord. It was the recording of Elgar's Violin Concerto played by Nigel Kennedy with the LPO under Vernon Handley that scooped the Record Of The Year title, as the Concerto seating again though it was

well as the Concerto section, even though it was made for CfP's mid-price label, EMI Eminence. It received rave reviews when it was first released last year, yet even so its selection came as a great surprise to the classical record industry.

And it has resulted in the decision to bring the recording out on CD — it is scheduled for release later this month — but at full price despite its mid-price LP origin.

The HMV section of EMI won three other awards including the chamber section with Beethoven's Late

String Quartets played by the Alban Berg String Quartet, and the Opera section with Mozart's Don Giovanni featuring the British baritone Thomas Allen and the LPO under Haitink

and the LPO under Hattink.

Conifer Records is particularly gratified at winning the choral section with the original version of Faure's Requiem, conducted by John Rutter, for it was the title that launched the label itself.

# Royalties victory for **Badfinger**

AN 11-YEAR battle over royalties between Badfinger, the Seventies band, and Apple Corps, the record company formed by The Beatles, was finally resolved in the High Court last week.

The two surviving members of the group, Mike Gibbins and Joey Melland, and manager Bill Col-lins, are to receive initial pay-ments of £20,000 each out of an undisclosed six-figure sum.
Similar sums have been paid to

the estates of Peter Ham and Tommy Evans, the other two Badfinger members, for the ben-fit of their children. Ham and Evans, who wrote Nilsson's 1972 hit Without You, died in 1975 and 1983 respectively.

community radio licences was hotting up as the deadline for registering applications passed this Monday (30). A dramatic number of pirate stations have now abandoned illegal broadcasting in order to strengthen their bids to gain official recognition.

Many of the leading pirate sta-tions such as Horizon, Solar and Jackie have left the air in the hope of being among the 21 experimental community stations that are scheduled to be operating around the country by the

end of the year.
There are five stations planned for the London area, which will be broken down into one major station on either side of the River Thames, each with a 10-km broadcasting radius, and three smaller stations with unspecified locations which will have five-km broadcast radii.

Many community radio groups specifically set up to apply for the licences are likely to provide strong competition for the pirates. Many of the groups Music Week contacted believed that they will have distinct advantages over the pirates because they had never broadcast illegally and, in general, offered a widerranging service. ranging service.

Several pirates currently off the air pending their applications said they would return to illegal broadcasting were they not successful in obtaining licences.

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

A CRISIS could be too strong a word for it, but several negative events are coinciding that will certainly have some adverse effect on the exposure of black music especially in the London area. Channel Four's 6.20 Soul Train ends its present series this week, just after the influential pirate radio stations Solar and Horizon voluntarily closed down (the better to pursue legality and a community radio licence).

6.20 Soul Train has been far from perfect, yet its power as a showcase is immediately felt in record shops, even when, as

6.20 Soul Train has been far from pertect, yet its power as a showcase is immediately felt in record shops, even when, as is often the case, it finally gets around to featuring a song long after it has supposedly reached its sales peak.

The recent upsurge in black record sales began of course before the series started, thanks to all the radio that was then available: however, the visual stimulus allied with repeated radio exposure has really broken down the resistance to new unfamiliar music which seems characteristic of the generally slow to be swayed West Indian community. (One could make a well-rewarded career out of playing the same six records to a well-rewarded career out of playing the same six records to certain black London crowds — and, come to think of it, disc jockey Steve Walsh has!).

The emphasis now will shift more than ever on to the local radio soul shows, where hopefully the DJs will stick with all the strongest material instead of just playing that week's newest records. Although the likes of Greg Edwards on Capital and Jeff Young on Radio London are influential, they and most other local radio DJs only broadcast once or twice a week.

twice a week.

Luckily in London there's a chap who whether one likes it or not is in legal soul radio's most influential position: Tony Blackburn, with his three-hour weekday morning show on Radio London, in which he does indeed keep plugging all the current black hits. In fact he more than anyone must be responsible for the rise of the new homegrown

than anyone must be responsible for the rise of the new homegrown black pop.

Radio London in general features a majority of black music right through the day, and it's interesting to note from all the many phone-in contacts how racially mixed its listeners seem to be.

Black music is identified with by ethnic minorities of wide origin—for instance, before bodypopping became a craze, electro funk was actually biggest with Indian and Pakistani kids! More of this another

time.

Of the current releases (everything's on 12-inch this week), with a huge buzz already built are Wally Badarou's Chief Inspector (Vine Street) (Fourth & Broadway 12BRW 37), Donald Banks' Status-Quo (Fourth & Broadway 12BRW 36), Total Contrast's Hit And Run (London LONX 76); and The System's This Is For You (Boiling Point POSPX 768), all of which should do very well.

More in the pop line are Paul Burnett's funny Rambo take-off, Pee Bee Squad's Rugged And Mean, Butch And On Screen (Project Records PRO 3), the Georgie Fame-reviving Matt Bianco's Yeh Yeh (WEA YZ46T), and the Kerry Delius covering Hazell Dean's They Say It's Gonna Rain (Parlophone 12R 6107).

Other UK releases include Tony Blackburn's Radio London secretary, Rosanne's This Is The Night (Remix) (ACA 001, via Jet Star), the tomy mind disappointing extended version of Jeff Lorber's Every Woman Needs It (Club JABX 23); and the electro-scratch Hardrock's Do It Anyway You Wanna (Jam, Jam, Jam) (Elite DAZZ 43).

Imports include, soon-to-be-released here on 10 Records, the Marvin Gaye soundalike Frankie Kelly's Ain't That The Truth (Trans World International TW-12110), Ralph MacDonald featuring Yogi Lee's Laying In His Arms (Polydor 883 322-1); Jeff Tyzik featuring Maurice Starr's Sweet Surrender (Polydor 883 360-1), Chuck Brown & The Soul Searchers' Sho Yuh Right (TTED Records TDE 3007), and Michael Wycoff's I Wanna Be Loved By You (Valley Vue W1273). 

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
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# Synth wizard returns to **UK** for tour

THE JAZZ/FUNK synth and guitar wizard, Jeff Lorber, whose Step By Step album on Club was a big seller recently, and whose Soul Train TV appearance made a strong impression early in the summer, returns to the UK at the end of October for his firstever live dates in this country.

Lorber and band will play Not-tingham's Rock City on October 27, the Hammersmith Odeon in London on the 28, and Luton's Pink Elephant on the 29, while at

Pink Elephant on the 29, while at least one further gig is still to be confirmed for October 26.

To precede the visit, Phonogram releases a new Jeff Lorber 12-inch on October 12. Every Woman Needs It (JABX 23) is a new extended mix of one of the most popular club tracks from Step By Step, with lead vocals from James 'Crab' Robinson. The flipside features an instrumental flipside features an instrumental variation of the same track, plus a British remix of the previous 12-inch Best Part Of The Night, which again has Robinson's vocals. This was done at the time of the band's early summer promotional visit, and although made available to club DJs shortly afterwards, has not been commercially available until now



# Mirage

WITH MADONNA fever in the UK currently at its height, it was on the cards that an enterprising UK act or producer would find a way to spin off some of the action. The first to actually succeed in this direction is Debut label supremo Nigel Wright, whose studio aggregation Mirage have already tasted chart success in the soundalike stakes with their Give Me The Night medley of George Benson material a little while back.

The new Mirage offering is titled Into The Grove (Medley) (Debut DEBT 129), already attracting much interest since its rush-release last week. The record segues together covers of erstwhile Madonna hits Lucky Star, Holiday, Like A Virgin, Material Girl and the title track in typical Wright can't-hear-thejoins fashion.

Featured vocalist taking the all-important Madonna role and pitching it to perfection is Tracey Ackerman (above), 'on loan' from her Polydor contract. Ackerman too has charted previously with a soundalike medley — she took the lead on the Platinum Pop segue of Blondie hits, under the name of This Year's Blonde. That record, on Creole, hit No 46 in the pop charts during 1981. The sheer topicality of the material and featured artist on the current medley must give it a strong chance of topping that former success in both the dance and pop fields. Certainly, Debut's parent company SMP reports tremendous response at dealer and DJ level to upfront copies of the disc. Distribution is through PRT.

# Liverpool indie label launche

ANOTHER NEW independent label planning to specialise in dance music makes its debut in October. Infrastructure Records is a little out of the ordinary, being based in Liverpool, and is the brainchild of North-Western DJ Greg Wilson, formerly of major venues like Manchester's Hacienda and Legend clubs.

Wilson has spent the last 18 months concentrating on recording and studio work, and as well as putting together dance track mixes for ILR Piccadilly Radio and Channel 4's The Tube, he also produced and co-composed six of the tracks featured on the

produced and co-composed six of the tracks featured on the Street Sounds UK Electro album.


Studio sessions for Infrastructure's first product release (slated for mid-October) are well advanced, but the label has not yet announced details of acts or titles, or a distribution deal. However, a DJ/promotional mailing list is currently being put together, and eligible readers who feel they should be on it are invited to send in written applications. London has taken the unusual step of promoting the record upfront to club DJs in a two-single package to accilitate easy turntable mixing (a form of promotion being used very effectively on dance produce in the US), and this should have the effect of heightening the club audience awareness of the track prior to release. No subsequent remix is planned, says London.

Total Contrast's debut album, simply titled Total Contrast (LONLP 15), has been scheduled for follow-up release during November.


### Indies

Apparently a contract filler for the now defunct Hearts, but sceptics desist, this is as vital or vibrant as anything the band have ever recorded. Entirely instrumental, perhaps one occasionally yearns for Christy Moore's voice to come floating in, but it is the work of Davy Spillane's uillean pipes that really shine here, almost taking the vocal line themselves. An essential album for all those who loved Moving Hearts and for all those who love Irish music.

400 BLOWS: The Good Clean English Fist. Dojo LP 14 (licensed from Illuminated Records). Good clean English electro funk from this finally-fashionable outfit. Features the now familiar scratched-in interview and movie clip format, but the varied pace in this compilation stops the clubby dance tracks sounding formula. Sure-fire indie chart topper, probably destined for the national chart too.

JON WAYNE: Texas Funeral. Hybrid. TEX 1. THE SPIKES: Six Sharp Cuts. Hybrid. BiB 2. Distribution: Pinnacle. Texas Funeral comprises 13 mercifully short examples of alternately grinding, frenetic and shambling country-punk, forever on the verge of collapse, and characterised by a delivery from Wayne that suggests he sung the whole LP through a megaphone. File next to Shockabilly. Australia's Spikes indulge in good ole dirty r'n'r with copious mind-expanding drug references and loud psychedelic guitars. 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

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

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

# Uchida — bringing a new understanding to Mozart

I AM beginning to lose count of the numbers of pianists who have recently finished recording,

have recently finished recording, are currently in the process of recording, or are about to record Mozart's Piano Concertos. In fact, one would have thought that with Murray Perahia having just completed his cycle with the ECO for CBS, and Deutsche Grammophon's 'authentic' cycle with US pianist Malcolm Bilson and John Eliot Gardiner conducting the English Baroque Soloists, any record company would have any record company would have been wary of undertaking the project without a breathing space

And this alone, she explains, should indicate that, as far as she is concerned, the two projects are completely separate.

"The concerto series was plan-ned a year ago, and the record-ings came later, and I am delight-ed to do it with Jeffrey Tate," she

"When one directs and plays a Mozart piano concerto with a good chamber orchestra, the en-tire performance has a unity that makes it sound so much more like chamber music — often, even the orchestra starts producing the kind of sounds which is near to my sound and begins to match

every phrase.

"But working with a great conductor like Jeffrey, who is firm, but flexible, something extra is added. And, of course, having a conductor takes a certain strain off my shoulders — the responsi-

bility for all orchestral details which is so important when making a recording."
Uchida is now in her mid-30s, and currently bases herself in London. She has had a successful career on the competition circuit
— she came first in the 1969 Beethoven Piano Competition at the age of 20, and second in the the age of 20, and second in the Chopin Competition in Warsaw and the Leeds International Plano Competition in 1975.

But she really shot to fame in the UK with her Mozart Sonata cycle at the Wigmore Hall in 1982.

Uchida is a compact, but in-tense figure. Born in Tokyo, she has no plans to settle in Japan, though she returns at regular intervals to play — she hopes to take the ECO there during the 1986/7 season to repeat the

Mozart concerto cycle.

She is also a musician of clear and strong opinions — a vital factor in being able to impress her personality upon an orches-tra like the ECO: "I refuse to do more than 60 concerts a year, or more than two or three recordings a year," she said, making it clear that she is going to take her time over both the Mozart Sonata cycle - the next one of which is due in December, containing Sonatas K279, 457, 576 and K475

She has laid the ground for the cycle at the Queen Elizabeth Hall by "trying to understand a little about Mozart himself, as well as just playing the music. I have tried to identify Mozart himself by listening to his operas and read-ing the biographies." And she has even taken her



# Rodgers reactivated

A GLARING gap in the discography of the late top American song composer Richard Rodgers has at last been filled, thanks to John Yap whose Covent Garden based record label That's Entertainment specialises in cast recordings and original film sound

Rodgers, whose collaborations with both Lorenz Hart and Oscar Hammerstein need little recalling, died in 1979, the year his fortieth Broadway musical I Remember Mama was running in New York. Surpringly though it was never recorded for a cast album, the only Rodgers musical not to be caught for posterity.

Now Yap has rectified the omission by gathering

together some of the top names from both the Broadway and West End theatre — including two members of the original cast — to record the music. Veteran British producer Norman Newell produced the sessions both here and in New York, and the digitally recorded album has just been released by That's Entertainment in the UK while PolyGram has picked up the rights for the US

Yap saw I Remember Mama during its relatively brief run (108 performances) and admits he was surprised that it was never recorded for LP release. "it was the first Richard Rodgers score not to be put on record, there was a marked lack of interest in the show's music by the record companies," he says. "After TER recorded the Broadway show On Your Toes which was a great success I had talks with the Rodgers and Hammerstein office which licensed shows by the songwriting team. They were keen to have the show's music recorded so I got together a cast that includes George Hearn and George S Irving

cast that includes George Hearn and George S Irving (both in the original show), Sally Ann Howes, Sian Phillips, Patricia Routledge, Elizabeth Seal, Ann Mor-

rison and Gay Soper."

Most of the I Remember Mama score, including the orchestral background, was recorded in London last May, while the rest of the recording — including Hearn and Irving's contributions — was finished in New York in June. Now the album has just been issued by TER in both album and compact disc format, distribution through PRT.



WRATHCHILD: War Machine: Hendring HEN 691. Dealer price £13.91. Immensely disappointing offering from the self-styled "top shock rock band in the UK".

The sound quality is poor, the show — recorded at The Camden Palace in London lacks atmosphere and spirit and the band are, to be kind, an acquired taste.

Audience reaction on the night of the filming was good but this is not reflected in this video which comes over as flat and uninteresting.

The band, though, have to be complimented on their level of effort. They try hard throughout and, now and again, a glimmer of greater things shines through. There is still divergence of opinion over the question of LP sales dropping in favour of CD: Harold Moores, whose London shop is supported by a flourishing mail order trade, states unequivocally that his customers rarely buy new LPs once they have invested in CD players. He said: "They want to be able to throw away the crackling record era and many are reluctant to go back to their LP collections — which are beginning to gather dust."

record era and many are reluctant to go back to their LP collections — which are beginning to gather dust."

This is helped, he said, by the increasing number of old classic recordings coming on to CD on EMI and other labels.

"The success of Decca's recording of Ferrier's Song Of The Earth and Callas' Tosca on EMI are typical examples" he said, and added that many of his customers show greater interest in these back catalogue items than the mainly new recordings on PolyGram.

But if there was one area where CD does conspicuously well in the classical sector, it was in opera.

He said: "People feel there is a great gain on CD for opera, both in the sound and the convenience of the medium."

Moores feels the high street shops will be the first to drop LPs and expects to see that happening within a relatively short period of time. "In five years' time, LPs will be served by a specialist market," he said. Peter Battershill, general manager of Chandos, supports Harold Moores drop in LP sales at the expense of CDs but remarks that companies such as Chandos still find it worthwhile to supply all three companies such as Chandos still find it worthwhile to supply all three

"Countries such as France are a year and more behind Britain in terms of CD development, and you can still get good volume LP sales there," he explained

he explained.

Battershill remains immensely optimistic about the growth of CD:
He said: "If the price maintains its level and no one tries to do serious discounting, then everyone can make a good margin with CD if it is merchandised properly.

"And there is definitely no need to start a price war — we are now in a buyer's market. The stuff is coming in to Chandos warehouse and in 24 hours going straight out again. If only we could lay our hands on enough product, we would be selling them as if there was no tomorrow."

Simon Lawman, artistic director of CRD Records, is less convinced that there is a demonstrable reduction in LPs due to the CD revolution. But he is limited in CD expansion by production rather than demand as

But there are obstacles — at least for the specialist independent manufacturers. Most of the independents as well as the majors now make records with a view to potential overseas sales, yet some English product, for example, has such a specialist repertoire that recordings can only be justified on the relatively cheap LP and tape medium on the

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
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# High standards and hi-tech join forces

HERE ARE two good stories about Nimbus Records. It is a company dedicated to capturing the best performances imaginable on disc in the most natural way. It is also a tale of impressive success in terms of technical innovation

or the CD pressing front.
Nimbus is a unique combination of record company and manufacturing plant, is based on a picturesque 48-acre estate and mansion, Wyastone Leys, on the bor-ders of Wales and Herefordshire. The company is the only UK-based manufacturer of Compact Discs.

All aspects of the production process — from recording and digital editing facilities to CD and vinyl mastering and pressing - are at Wyastone Leys, either in the Georgian country house which dominates the site, or in the low-profile plant housing the CD pressing facil-

Nimbus was conceived in the early Fifties, as the result of a chance conversation on a railway train between Numa Libin — a Franco-Russian opera singer — and Michael Reynolds, then an electrical engineer working for GEC in Birmingham. Today, they are chairman and managing director of the company respec-

Michael's brother Michael's brother Gerald joined the company as technical director in the Sixties. The company then immediately set to work on top-quality recording and disc-cutting. But there seemed to be nowhere that matched their exacting demands for pressing quality so they defor pressing quality, so they de-cided to set up a pressing plant, and make it the best.

and make it the best.

It took three years to convert
Wyastone Leys into a record
making facility. But once it was
done Nimbus began to gain an
impressive reputation for quality
and reliability, both for their own
releases and with the rapidlygrowing number of record labels
who came to Nimbus for their
cutting and pressing needs.

cutting and pressing needs.
The company had been joined by commercial director Mike Lee and artistic director Adrian Far-mer by 1980.

In the search for ever-better levels of quality, the company began to investigate the possibili-ties of digital recording. They found several problems with the techniques of the time, but they were convinced that digital was the way to go. They managed to recruit Dr Jonathan Halliday from the IBA, and he was able to sort out the shortcomings of the sys-

Having taken that step, they then decided to take a far greater

In 1982 Nimbus signed a CD manufacturing licence with Philips, and began to plan their own compact disc pressing plant. It was a daunting task, with limited resources at their command. To an outsider it would have appeared impossible. But they

There is no such thing as an "off the shelf" CD plant. The tech-

nology is all new, and even the apparently easy parts of the pro-cess — for example the injection-moulding machines used to press the discs — break many of the rules of mass-production. The first problem was laser master

ing.

The combination of processes which go into etching the microscopic pattern of "pits" on a CD which stores the digital audio information must be extremely pre-cise — and so expensive — and it wasn't practical for Nimbus to wasn't practical for Nimbus to buy a laser mastering system off the shelf. As a result, resident genius Dr Halliday designed a mastering system for CD from first principles — basic optics, physics and mechanics.

he result was a system at least as good as the vastly more expensive set-ups that can be found in other CD pressing plants. So successful has the prototype been, that when Nimbus came to examine it to see if modifications were needed when they wanted to add two more laser mastering systems to the plant, few alterations were necessary.

Then came the injection moulding machines needed to press the discs from "Lexan" polycarbonate — a substance developed by General Electric Plastics for making items such as compact discs.

The injection moulding machines must be housed in a moulding sterile clean room — and in addition, the demands of CD making differ extremely from those needed to make, say, a plastic washing-up bowl. Where normal injection moulding uses fast cy-cle times a compact disc must be moulded very carefully to avoid stress in the disc, which can adversely affect the focusing sys-tems on some players. In addition, the machines are highly automated.

It took some time, as expected, to get it right. But they did get it

ing plant went on-line officially on July 3 last year. By the end of the first year, the plant could produce over 3 million discs a year — and it was not enough.

Nimbus have been impressed by the number of clients who by the number of cleristwino have come to Wyastone Leys to have their CDs made. These range from major record companies such as EMI and Virgin panies such as Elvii airu Virgii — who regularly use the plant — to smaller companies such as the now-defunct Lamborghini Records. The plant, in November 1984, produced the first CD re-1984, produced the first CD re-leased by a recorded music library — EMI-owned KPM Music, a long-term client on the vinyl pressing side.

Meanwhile, Nimbus had already been releasing their own product on CD as well as vinyl, pressing at PolyGram in Hanover until their own plant came on-

It was expected, with Nimbus' It was expected, with Nimbus' own releases appealing to an audience interested in quality, that CD sales would become an appreciable portion of the total. What they didn't expect was that CD sales would soon outstrip sales of vinyl product by a factor of four to one. of four to one.

Gerald Reynolds says: "We

Gerald Reynolds says: "We found that, some dealers would order, say, a couple of dozen copies of a compact disc. When we asked them if they wanted any vinyl copies, they often said 'no'!"

It turned out that some dealers were taking a copy of the vinyl version simply to put it on display to draw attention to the CD. The result was predictable. In the face of greatly increased demand for CD product — a major increase in overall sales, but a sudden and massive drop in demand for vinyl copies - the company decided in

copies — the company decided in August to issue new releases on compact disc only.

But Reynolds emphasises, this only applies to Nimbus' ownlabel product. Now work is still going on to increase CD pressing capacity at the new plant. At the time of writing, new presses are coming on-line. But there is more in the pipeline. Capacity will be running at six million discs a year by the end of the month, but even that won't be enough to satisfy an overwhelming demand.

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# Get into the CD production groove

technology is introduced into any industry it always takes some time before it's introduced into workaday life. So it is with compact disc laser techniques.

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### How do I release my product on compact disc?

Releasing a compact disc can be broken down into a number of stages. Generally they constitute the recording process (including editing, transfer to the right format and so on) and the manufacturing processes (laser mastering, artwork and label preparation and pressing).

Many people have bought compact discs for convenience, but many more have quality in mind and have a right to expect it. This means using the highest quality tapes available.'

Later on in this article we'll be looking at the manufactur-ing processes and how to find - the factors affecting the booking of capacity at the factory, how large a mini-mum order is likely to be, what the usual time for manufacture is, and so on. But first, you have to get your product into a form that can be handled by the factory. In other

words, the right master tape.

### What product should I consider for CD release?

Although compact disc is doing well, it is still a developing mar-ket, and a comparatively expen-sive one to enter. But it's not exceptionally expensive and it's possible for the smaller record company to enter the field with a great deal of success. The first consideration will be the choice of product, and the choices are straightforward.

Compact disc can be characte-

rised by two things — very high quality and comparatively high

The other aspect of CD is quali-ty. Many people have bought compact disc for the conveni-ence, but many more have quali-ty in mind and have a right to expect it. This means using the highest quality tapes available. Existing material by your chosen artists may well be on traditional. analogue master tapes. These analogue master tapes. These can be considered for release if they are of high quality or are such classics that quality de-gradation becomes slightly more New recordings should at least be mixed digitally.

## How should I choose tapes for the release of back-catalogue on

The standard format for CD master tapes is the Sony 1610 digital format, using standard U-Matic video cassettes. Traditional ana-logue masters on conventional tape will have to be transferred to tape will have to be transferred to 1610, either by a studio with a digital audio post-production (DAPP) room, or by a specialist DAPP facility. There are a growing number of such facilities. When collecting together the tapes for transfer, ensure that you use the original masters—even if they take some time and

even if they take some time and trouble to locate. Do not, unless there is no alternative, use pro-duction or cutting, masters. duction or cutting, masters These are often several genera tions away from the master tapes, and will show noticeable quality degradations which will stand out like a sore thumb on CD to purchasers and reviewers alike

so directly hitting your sales. Don't take chances. Ensure that your release schedule allows plenty of time to collect together and transfer the tapes.

### What about special CD compila-

what about special CD compila-tion albums?
A DAPP facility will be happy to assemble compilation albums for CD release, but here again, take special care in getting the right tapes. Differences in studio prac-tices in the past may mean that the transfer engineer has to realign his replay machine for each tape. As a result, ensure that each reel is clearly labelled, and that there are tones supplied for each track

If you select a track for inclusion that is, say, on reel two of the original vinyl album master, and the tones are on reel one, supply both reels. Also be careful to include a list of exactly what tracks are needed and in which

Make sure that you have plan-ned a compilation album carefully. It should not run for more than about an hour including pauses between tracks. Indicate on your between tracks. Indicate on your sheet how long each track is, and the total running time. In short, supply as much information as possible.

If the CD project involves any transfer from old analogue masses the total program has sure that some.

ter tapes make sure that someter tapes make sure that some-one at your office is detailed to take charge of this stage of the project, and is available to liaise with the DAPP facility in case of any queries or problems. You can dramatically reduce the costs of transfer if you give the transfer engineers as much help and back-up as possible. It reduces the time taken for the master preparation, and time is money in

### How do I get the best results for when recording new mate-

rial?
The vast majority of top-class modern studios have digital recording systems of one sort or another. Digital equipment comes in four sizes — cheap digital stereo systems such as the Sony F1 and 701, expensive digital stereo systems such as the Sony 1610 and 1630, digital multitrack machines such as the Mitsubishi X-800 and the Sony 3324 and digital consoles such as the Neve DSP.

The recording chain is divided into three parts — the console, the multitrack machine, and the the multitrack machine, and the stereo mastering machine. The more parts of the process that are digital, the better the end result, and the more expensive the re-

and the more expensive the re-cording process will become.

The mixing process makes the most obvious difference and mix-ing to digital is one of the cheapest parts of the process. Your CD master will have to be in a digital stereo form in the end, anyway. So it makes good sense to start by mixing to a digital

Digital multitrack systems make a difference, too. There are several of them available, and any studio can hire both stereo and multitrack digital gear if needed. Check the prices and see how they match your budget. Only one studio in the UK has a CTC. digital recording console — CTS in Wembley. Your producer on the project will have ideas on the subject of what facilities he wants, and how much those facilities. lities will cost.

If you are contemplating re cording classical material for CD release (or for vinyl release) it is definitely worth considering re-cording straight to digital stereo, preferably using a 1610 or similar system. The fewer stages in the process the better. Don't use multitrack unless you have to. It can be much cheaper that way, too.

### Should I indicate to the consum-

Should I indicate to the consumer how the CD was recorded? Whatever combination of analogue and digital processes you use in the recording studio, it is worth considering passing on this information to the consumer by indicating it on the CD label or the inlay card. There is an international standard code for this, which is already used by several national standard code for this, which is already used by several record companies including EMI, Virgin and PolyGram. Simply, it breaks down the studio process into three stages: recording, mixing and mastering, and labels each stage A for analogue or D for digital.

each stage A for analogue or D for digital.

For a CD, the last letter will always be D (you can use the code on vinyl albums as well. So a CD recorded analogue multitrack and mixed digitally will be coded ADD. A classical CD recorded direct to digital stereo will be DDD (the recording and mixing are considered to be the same process in this case). process in this case)

Which digital processes should I use on a smaller budget? If your budget is limited as it quite likely will be, at least ensure that the album is mixed digitally. For preference, specify the Sony 1610 system. Failing that, use a Sony F1 or 701. Some pressing plants will accept tapes in this format, notably Nimbus. Others format, notably Nimbus. Small classical labels battle against product shortage

# Supply problems hamper indies

HORTAGE OF produc-tion capacity is still the biggest factor in limit-ing the expansion of CD in the independent classical companies, though each month brings a new label into the market, writes Nicolas

October, for instance, sees the first Saydisc and Amon-Ra issues appearing on CD for the first time, in Nimbus pressings.

Amon-Ra is the "authentic instruments" arm of Saydisc Records, and offers one of its top selling back-catalogue ti-tles — Mozart's Clarinet Quin-tets played by Alan Hacker and the Salomon Quartet (CD SAR 17) — and one of its new releases, Weber's Flute Trio and Sonatas, again played on authentic instruments with Stephen Preston, flute, Jen-nifer Ward Clarke, cello and Richard Burnett fortepiano (CD SAR 21).

The third CD is of special Christmas interest — Enchanted Carols, a collection of favourite carols played unusually on handbells, musical boxes, barrel organs, and brass band (CD SDL 327).

Two further Amon-Ra CD titles appear in November — Beethoven Songs performed by lan Partridge and Richard Burnett (CD-SAR 15) and Guitar Collection — historic guitars played by Nigel North (CD SAR 18), and it is hoped that regular releases over the first few months of next year will bring the whole Amon-Ra

the first few months of next year will bring the whole Amon-Ra catalogue out on CD.

The CDs — distributed by PRT, Taylor, Gamut and Essex — have a dealer price of £6.70.

Difficulties in supply have also hampered the smooth flow of the Supraphon releases, although they have proved popular since Counterpoint first began import-Counterpoint first began import-ing about 30 titles in June. Some Supraphon recordings had already appeared in the country through special import dealers and, by the time they surfaced in the shops, they bore some spectacular prices.

For instance, Dvorak's opera

Rusalka, recently performed at the English National Opera, was

the English National Opera, was being sold in at least one shop for more than £43, although now, in the official Counterpoint Supraphon CD, it bears a dealer price of £18.75.

Two of the popular recent sellers on Supraphon have proved to be Janacek's Glagolitic Mass with the Czech Philharmonic Orchestra conducted by Charles Mackerras and Dvorak's Slavonic Mackerras and Dvorak's Slavonic Dances. But Tony Williams of

Counterpoint also anticipates good demand for the four new releases of the autumn.

These include one opera — Smetana's Libuse on 3 CDs — Trios by Beethoven played by the Suk Trio; and Suk's Symphonic Poem Praga played by the Czech Philharmonic under Pesek. The dealer price for Supranhon CDs is dealer price for Supraphon CDs is

An important historical record-ing comes from Eurodisc this month with Target's import of Richter's performance of Bach's Well Tempered Clavier on four Well Tempered Clavier on four CDs. Also worth noting on Eurodisc is the only CD recording of Donizetti's opera L'Elisir d'Amore with Popp, Dvorsky and Nesterenko (610 097 3CDs) and Beethoven's Fidelio with Altemeyer, Jerusalem and Adam conducted by Kurt Masur (610 093 3CDs). he cheaper Sound/Ensayo CDs, which have a dealer price of £5.90, are still attractive, especially with the playing time in excess of 50 minutes — including Boccherini's Three Quintets for Strings played by the Quinteto Boccherini (3403) by the (3403).

ASV's first CDs to be pressed in France are released this month and, with the five from September, will bring the total ASV CD

catalogue to 16. The two new ones are the Lindsay Quartet playing Beethoven's Op 59 No 1 (CDDCA 553) and Batiz conducting the RPO in Stravinsky's Petrushka, the Circus Polka and other works (CD DCA 542).

A further 10 CDs are expected to arrive in late November, but certainly before Christmas. ASV CDs have a dealer price of £6.71.

As with many labels, Hyperion has had to shop around to expand its CD lists from its current total of four. Seven more titles are expected this month and inare expected this month and include both back catalogue and new recordings. Britten's Choral Music (CDA 66126) and Brahms' Cello Sonatas played by Stephen Isserlis (CDA 66159) both came out on LP last month.

Among the other CDs, not surprisingly, is the recording that won this year's Gramophone Award for the best medieval and

renaissance record, Victoria's
Missa O Quam Gloriosum sung
by the Westminster Cathedral

Conifer's Dave Barnard told MW that there will be other CD releases before Christmas but the

# azzers not so avant

HE SERIOUS collector of recorded jazz re-mains an extremely cautious creature over any kind of change — sudden or gradual — in the basic methods of reproduction, writes Stan Britt.

For the elder statesmen among collectors, the appearance of microgroove recordings during the early Fifties was often greeted with extreme suspicion, amounting at times to hostility. The various transitions from wax-based 78rpm discs to the 45/33½rpm shellac alternatives did not impress the purist element. It was the same with the additional hazards of pre-recorded tapes reel-to-reel, cassettes and cartridaes.

This could partly explain why jazz now represents such a small portion of the compact disc market (between two-three per cent, some pundits believe). This, and the anonymous design and size of CD in comparison with the LP.

Of course, jazz lovers' attitudes have become considerably more flexible during the past 20 years or so. But the fact remains that or so. But the fact remains that the CD market at present remains largely untapped where jazz is concerned. This situation is not improved by the fact that for many the price of investing in CD hardware puts off even those receptive to change.

Jazz specialist retailers too have not been enthusiastic about jazz on CD, even though many

agree that the interest in this field is likely to increase, but more slowly than other music forms available in the format.

Eric Rose's long-established Music Inn in Nottingham is one Music Inn in Nottingham is one jazz emporium that, up to now, has not involved itself with CD. Admitting that the Music Inn had been "extremely cautious" with regard to jazz-on-CD, proprietor Rose admits this is a market his shop has plans to enter.

He says: "We intend to start building up a stock of CDs. A big factor in the past which has held us back is the price of software. Now, the cost of ordinary LPs and CDs seem to be meeting."

CDs seem to be meeting."
Ray Purslow, like Rose, has yet to order his first CD jazz recording for display at his Record Centre in

for display at his Record Centre in Birmingham.

He says: "We are now considering the CD market. We are trying to encourage people in this direction — but because we're getting little response, we are merely making the material available to order only."

able to order only."

The situation at Mole Jazz's Kings Cross, London, premises is

Kings Cross, London, premises is infinitely more promising.
Graham Griffiths enthuses:
"Today we are selling CD all the time. As opposed to last year, when, if we were lucky, we sold between 100 to 200, now it is between 500 to 1,000. We aim to increase this, as and when more CDs become available. And when more become available more more become available, more people will buy CD."

Available material in the UK. says Mike Autton of HMV, Oxford

Street, is small: "But elsewhere there is quite a bit. We import much of this material into our shops. These tick over quite well shops. These tick over quite well, Certainly, though, this is a growing area. Any new title that becomes available from our suppliers — especially priced at between £8 to £10 — usually sells reasonably well.

"Personally, I believe it will probably grow just slightly quicker than some other markets. Re-grettably, though, the blues sec-tion is more or less non-existent."

One company which has achieved more than any other in promoting interest in CD-jazz is IMS, importing wing of Poly-Gram.



General manager Eddie Wilkinson, revealing that by the end of September, his company will have issued 120 jazz-CDs, says: "Compact discs will prove to be a bigger and more important part of our business. I hope that more jazz labels — like ECM, Black Saint, Soul Note, Pablo, Concord, GRP — all of which we import — will offer more support to jazz on CD than non-jazz outlets do. CD than non-jazz outlets do.

"It's ironic that most CD/jazz is being sold in non-jazz — often classical — outlets."

You can only hope, too, that many more of the major record companies in the UK demonstrate a more positive interest in what might well prove to be not only a growing, but also a steady and, ultimately, a lucrative section of the CD market.

One or two plants will accept top-quality analogue masters as well, but the vast majority will not. Analogue mastering is not recommended and should be considered only as a last resort. Mixing to analogue formats such as 30 ips on 1/2" tape can be more expensive than digital stereo and will not give as good results — honest!

### How necessary is digital postproduction?

A minimal amount of DAPP work is bound to be needed, even if it is no more than assembling the tracks in the right order, with the right spaces between them, on to 1610 format. A reference track (or timecode) is also laid down during the assembly process, to which all track timings are re-

Ensure that a list is generated of the exact start and stop times of the tracks during the assembly process, including the length of each track and each pause, and the total elapsed time including pauses. This timing must be highly accurate, and each figure should be expressed in minutes, seconds and frames.

These relate to the timecode on the U-Matic master tape and are simply read off the digital editing system as the assembly is done. When this is completed, you have the "master tape" needed to make a CD.

What needs to be done after the master tape has been assembled?

There is one more stage between

the creation of the master tape and the laser mastering process at the factory. The addition of P and  $\Omega$  subcode information. This is encoded on to the disc and tells the CD player where each track starts and ends.

starts and ends.

The pressing plant, if necessary, will generally do this for you, for a price. They will base their PQ editing on the list of timings you generated during assembly, and this is why those timecode values must be so accurate. A few frames out and listeners could hear the end of a preceding track when they select one, or lose the first note.

Some DAPP facilities will hand-

Some DAPP facilities will handle PQ encoding for you. Only three locations in the UK now offer this service.

These are Abbey Road Studios, Tape One and the Townhouse. In all cases, the PQ Editor is installed in a digital editing suite, enabling the editing, assembly and PQ encoding to be performed as a single process. This can make economic sense. Most of the above facilities will be pleased to quote for a complete edit. assembly and PQ package.

# Should I use the same masters for vinyl as for CD mastering?

Most new releases for the time being will appear in both CD and vinyl formats. It should be remembered that although modern cutting systems — particularly Direct Metal Mastering (DMM) — offer far better results on vinyl than was possible even a few years ago. The CD, if care has been taken in the preparation of the tapes, will be much closer to

the master tape than any vinyl pressing.

Compromises still have to be

Compromises still have to be made when cutting for vinyl, and you can get much more dynamics on CD. So the CD master has, and needs to have, more recorded information on it than the master for vinyl cutting, so if you know that a CD is to be released, you should make that the first priority, even if the CD will be released later than the vinyl album.

# What if I have to rush-release the vinyl, and can't put the CD preparation first?

If pressures of time or lack of CD pressing capacity force you to hold back CD release, and the vinyl release has to take priority, consult the producer when you are ready to proceed with CD mastering, unless he has supplied a specific, separate, master from which the CD is to be made.

Certain parts of the process are critical, and it should never be left simply to grabbing the nearest tapes with the right name on them and sending them off to the CD plant — this is asking for trouble, and for an unsuccessful release

The consumer is aware of CD quality, and if you produce a poor-quality disc, the CD-buyer will be likely to assume that all your CDs will be as bad. So it is worth spending extra time, money and effort to get it right. A reputation for quality in CD master preparation is the key to good reviews and continuing better sales. Take more care, make more money. In the final analysis,

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# **Ambitious Christmas** schedule at Chandos

THOUGH ENJOYING the fruits of the company's second Gramophone Award with Prokofiev's Sixth Symphony played by Neeme Jarvi and the Scottish National Orchestra, Chandos has prepared its most ambitious CD programme yet for the run up to the Christmas market.

Slightly hampered by the constraints of CD production, Brian Couzen's company is hoping to bring more than 35 CD titles on to the market, a combination of new issues and back catalogue appearing on the medium for the first time.

And it is spearheading its releases with specific attention on two of its particularly successful series, the Prokofiev Symphonies and the Tchaikovsky Symphonies played by the Oslo Philharmonic Orchestra under Mariss Jansons that has received so much praise for Nos 4 and 5.

Chandos has secured the November cover of *Gramophone* for Tchaikovsky's Symphony No 1 with Jansons (Chan 8402) which should mean good sales, particularly when backed up by a nationwide in store display campaign to be mounted in the same month.

"We want to showcase the Prokofiev and Tchaikovsky cycles by muscling in on the wall-space of shops that always seem to be dominated by the majors," said Peter Battershill, Chandos general manager. "But in addition, our editorial and advertising campaign will be heavier than ever before."

Tow new Prokofiev records were released on CD this month, Sympho-Tow new Prokotiev records were released on CD this month, Symphonies Nos 1 and 4 (revised 1947 version) (Chan 8500) and (original 1929 version) (Chan 8401) played by the SND and Jarvi. Also in the release expected early this month is the first recording for many years of Britten's Symphony For Cello And Orchestra by Raphael Wallfisch and the ECO, coupled with the Death In Venice Suite (Chan 8363), Mendelssohn's Piano Trios Nos 1 and 2 played by The Borodin Trio (Chan 8404).

The second group of Chandos releases comes from CTA in Japan and are expected to arrive in the UK towards the end of this month or early

These include Jansons' Tchaikovsky Symphony No 1 (Chan 8402), a second Respighi album with Belkis and Metamorphosen conducted by Geoffrey Simon (Chan 8405) and Dvorak's Slavonic Dances with the SNO under Jarvi (Chan 8406) among the new releases.

Among the back catalogue CDs are Bridge: Music For String Quartet played by the Delme String Quartet (Chan 8426) and Elgar's Pomp and Circumstance Marches with the SNO under Gibson (Chan 8429). The company is also to test the Christmas Carol CD market for the first time with its Festival Of Christmas, a collection of popular carols with the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra and Choir under Edmund Walters (Chan 8436)

For every Two CDs sold the buyer receives a voucher for three nights free accommodation at any one of 300 hotels owned by a major group. Dave Wilson of HMV Newcastle says "We did have a promotion on CDs a month or two ago where we knocked £1 off the price, but it had

Dave Wilson of Hilly NewCastle says. We did nave a prointion of CDs a month or two ago where we knocked £1 off the price, but it had nothing like the impact this promotion has."

Promotion or not Wilson says that sales in the Newcastle area are increasing steadily, particularly in the AOR market. "Traditionally this has always been a good area for hard rock and we have what I call a stereotype CD buyer. We've had heavy sales on all Dire Straits, Phil Collins and Bryan Ferry and I expect the Kate Bush to go well, but Wham! on CD was a flop for us."

On prices, Wilson would like to see reductions on back catalogue and for companies to have an allied prices policy. "At the moment some of them are becoming greedy and there is a big disparity among some labels. Strangely many people come in and ask when prices will fall, but I see no signs from the companies of any 'reduction."

But he does favour simultaneous releases: "It definitely works and if a certain item isn't on CD when a customer wants it, they'll invariably buy it on cassette. Orders are coming through but some of the companies are still taking too long. Madonna is a case in point and it can only mean the companies losing out when the demand is there but the product isn't."

But if sales of the LP do drop drastically, so that its market is very small, the record companies would have to consider whether a recording of, let's say, an obscure orchestral piece by Bridge, would recoup its costs on CD.

"I do feel a certain amount of concern about this." Ted Perry, who owns Hyperion Records said: "The Finzi double album of songs on vinyl, for example, is an expensive set with a limited potential in Greece, Finland or Thailand. But I am sure that my investment will

oreece, Finland or Thalland. But I am sure that my investment will be returned by the English sales.

"But I am not so sure whether there are enough buyers in England prepared to pay about £20 for two CDs for a collection of Finzi songs, and I can only conclude that we may find we will lose a lot of repertoire over the next few years."

Hyperion is now concentrating on putting its back catalogue on CD so difficult decisions have not had to be taken.

"But I have decided that we will go ahead with a record of Quilter songs, so I suppose we will just have to live dangerously for the moment," he added.
