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Gaff: £12m spend on Marquee emp

MUSIC ENTREPRENEUR Billy Gaff and the Fraser investment bank are to spend £12m next year on transforming the legendary pop/rock venue of the Marquee Club in London's Soho and on launching a new record label and a weekly magazine for young people.

They will also finance an extension in the activities and re-sources of the Marquee Studios, and herald a link with a Marquee Club in Melbourne, Australia, and possible additions to the club chain in the UK provincial centres and New York.

Gaff has acquired the Marquee location (90 Wardour Street) plus adjoining premises at numbers 92 and 94 and alterations and refurbishment will begin next January. Gaff hopes to open the new Marquee Club in conjunction with Marquee veteran Harold Pendleton about June 1986, but in the meantime will find temporature premises to extract the second process. ary premises to continue present-

ing live music.

He is aiming for a simultaneous opening with the Marquee Club in Melbourne, linked by TV satellite. His partner in the projected Acceptation operation will prob-

ably be concert and TV impresario Paul Dainty.
"The Marquee's London capacity will rise from 300 now to about 1,500," says Gaff. "Like McDonald's hamburgers, we'll be cheap but good — the McDo-nald's of rock 'n' roll. There will be air-conditioning, pleasant de-cor, clean toilets and better facilities for the bands appearing. We'll be playing to the same kids and not going upmarket, but we'll

pay the bands more."
Subject to planning permission, Gaff hopes to add fast food facilities at a later date, with lunchtime opening for bar and food

Marquee Studios will definitely be going upmarket in the record-ing range it will offer, and an initial step is the purchase of a Harrison control console for Harrison £150,000.

Gaff is also considering the possibilities of launching out-of-town Marquee Clubs in Liverpool and Manchester, and is having talks with US clubman and promoter Ron Delsener about opening a Marquee operation in New York on existing club premises. He will launch a Marquee Re-cords label from the Wardour

Street base, which will also

accommodate his Riva Records and music publishing enter-prises, at present located in the

New Kings Road.
"The Marquee label will be en-"The Marquee label will be entirely independent of Riva, apart from administration functions," says Gaff. "I'll find the right A&R person for it, and let him get on with it. He will be in a prime position to see what acts are coming through the club."

Gaff envisages TV shows from the new club, but emphasised that the opening night will not centre on big names or blasts from the past.

"It will feature the new bands

"It will feature the new bands of the moment causing a stir and a buzz, and that's the way we intend to go on. The London Mar-quee has been the best showcase in the world for young bands, and will continue to be. It will also fulfil the same function in Mel-bourne and wherever else we open up.

Gaff is planning a weekly publication, tentatively called Marquee Weekly, which, he hopes, will fill a gap he perceives by being a "complete youth pap-er" with a much wider scope than existing titles. It is likely to be launched in conjunction with Mir-ror Group Newspapers.



Managing editor of Livewire is Chartcall system manager and former Virgin Records press officer Gerald O'Connell who comments: "What we are doing is really a very new thing. It's a magazine by telephone, with the individual services correspond-

ing to individual pages. And it's also a form of cable radio, introducing listener choice and user interac-

Livewire's promotional push will encompass Capital Radio, cinema and music press advertising, as well as a poster campaign around London. Reciprocal sponsorship deals are also being discussed with the HMV chain and alternative fashion/music magazine I-D. No advertising will be taken during the initial months of Livewire's operation.

It is hoped that the service will be available in "half-a-dozen major population centres" in the course of the next year, says O'Connell.

People ringing Livewire — on 0066 0066 — will initially be connected to the programme of their choice by an operator, but will then be given a direct access number for future use. The service will operators ate for 24-hours a day

O-Connell estimates Livewire will create between 20 and 30 new jobs in the industry.

Pirate country station 'blocked'

FREQUENT VISITS from the police are claimed to be hampering efforts to set up Tennessee Sound, the pirate country music radio station scheduled to begin broadcast from its North Sea-based vessel in June. According to a spokeswoman, police attention has been concentrated on the National Sound Broadcasting Agency, a Leatherhead-based promotion company run by Terry Mundy, editor of UK country magazine North Country, which has been serving as a pick up point for Andrew McIntire, the man behind Tennessee Sound.

The agency claimed that the attention of the authorities had meant they had not seen or heard from McIntire for over two months, but that the equipping of the ship, The General Lee, was going ahead as planned.

The expected winter of weather is likely to prevent adequate securing of the vessel in its position 15 miles off the Suffolk/Essex coast before the end of the year.

Cassettes overtake LP albums

NEW YORK: Pre-recorded audio cassettes are now making up two-thirds of the music market, with records on one-third. This is according to CBS Records consumer research. New shipments of cassette recorders versus record players were even more lopsided, running at a seven-to-one ratio.

The research, presented to a National Association of Recording Merchandisers (NARM) gathering, also indicated that buyers under 18 and over 35 favour cassettes most (the younger group buying 75 per cent tapes and 25 per cent disc), while those in between are split evenly between formats. Except for jazz, cassettes outsell vinyl in all music categories.

A large majority (85 per cent) of cassette owners agree that pre-recorded tape quality is up. But LP—only customers still believe that cassettes represent poorer sound and less durability and overall value. Meanwhile, CD players have achieved one per cent penetration, according to the survey, with consumer awareness of the format reaching one-half of the population over age 11.

THE BACKERS of an audio home-taping hardware and blank tape royalty introduced this year's version of the proposed legislation early this month in the US Senate. A hearing on the bill may take place as soon as November. The bill's counterpart in the House of Representatives was introduced in July. Both versions specify a one-cent-per-minute levy on blank tape, charged to manufacturers. The Senate bill calls for a royalty of five per cent on hardware wholesale price, however, which is half that proposed in the House version. Fees would be divided between record companies, artists, songwriters, music publishers, and industry unions, among others, though no formal method about how to divide the monies has been proposed. proposed.

Other currently pending legislation would direct mechanical royalties to composers and their successors rather than to music publishers when songwriters have recovered copyrights from publishers.

REPORTS FROM Terre Haute, Indiana, compact disc plant jointly owned by CBS Inc and Sony say that the latter company is on the verge of buying CBS out of the operation. Details were not forthcoming from either company, but the expected buyout could be one of the repercussions of the expensive manoeuvres CBS recently undertook to prevent Ted Turner from taking over CBS.

Other observers indicate that the partnership between CBS and Sony has been strained by the facility's inability to raise its saleable yield and boost overall output in its first year of operation. Earlier this year, the different joint venture partners had issued widely divergent reports on the status of the plant. Sony maintaining it was up to scratch and CBS saying the vields were not.

The production problems delayed non-CBS orders and even-tually resulted in the restriction of production to CBS product. CBS would reportedly continue to receive favoured status as a customer after a buy-out until production availability meets

RM identifies over-24 mar

THE GROWING importance of the over-24-year-old market, as the UK's

IHE GROWING importance of the over-24-year-old market, as the UK's teenage-population declines, was highlighted at the Record Merchandisers annual conference last week.

"We have to recognise that the over-24-year-olds will become a vital target market for the music industry if the business is to capitalise on the opportunity they represent," said RM deputy managing director David Hammond.

And he was echoed by director of buying Kingsley Grimble who said:
"The challenge now is to invest in acts that appeal to the over

And he was echoed by director of buying Kingsley Grimble who said: "The challenge now is to invest in acts that appeal to the over 24-year-old age group in order to sustain or increase music's share of the leisure pound, and this would also hopefully produce a new generation of acts that last for five, seven or, who knows, even 10 albums rather than burn out after just two."

The demographic change to an older but more prosperous population was one of the factors likely to affect retailing in the future pinpointed by a conference presentation by the Henley School of Forecasting. They also warned of the need to be aware of regional social and economic variations in the country becoming more sharply defined, and increasing competition between high street and out-of-town shopping areas.

Picking up these points, Hammond urged for "local sensitivity to maximise sales and profit opportunities", and warned of a "battle for survival" in retailing with at least another 100 hypermarkets opening in

Stulver in retailing with at least another 100 hypermarkets opening in the next few years.
 Other RM conference points:
 Retailers' margins on compact discs must be at a level where the stock investment fully supports the stocking of a credible CD range, said Hammond, adding that the CD must not be undersold to the consumer

Hammond, adding that the CD must not be undersold to the consumer—"Here is an opportunity for everyone to make a reasonable profit margin for a high quality product whose forefathers (the LP and cassette) have been undersold to the consumer since the days of the Price Commission and the advent of discounting."

The Twelve-inch singles are now more expensive and worse value for money, said Grimble. "Fewer tracks and shorter playing times will limit 12-inch singles sales exclusively to the dedicated fans rather than a wider market and the industry cannot expect retailers to sacrifice margins and hold prices down simply to avoid breaking what some preceive to be important price points."

The industry is dragging its feet on bar-coding, said Grimble, warning that "if record companies want their products to remain in view in the nation's leading retailers, then product must be coded—it should not be regarded as a necessary evil".

The RM conference also called on the industry to mount a generic advertising campaign to boost sales.

RENEWED INTEREST in Midem among major record companies is being reported by Midem's UK representative Peter Rhodes who this week announced that the new RCA/Ariola International company is the latest to book a stand, joining CBS, Chrysalis and WEA.

Satellite and cable music programme operators Sky Channel and Music Box have also confirmed their presence at the 20th Anniversary Midem which takes place in Cannes from January 27 to 31, 1986.

Video music is expected to feature strongly with more than 100 directors of record company video music departments being invited.

tenants.

Manorlike Ltd, the company which owns the lease to the shopping "village" off London's Oxford Street, went to court seek-Oxford Street, went to court seeking possession of the site (MW October 12). In a hearing in chambers, the judge decided that 11 tenants must leave but that the cases of a further six would not be considered for another five weeks. The defeated tenants have given notice that they will appeal.

In a separate action as Music Week went to press, Manorlike asked the High Court to grant eviction orders on seven other shopkeepers who run premises in Oxford Walk under licences.

NELSON RIDDLE died in Los Angeles last week at the age of 64 following a short illness. He had become closely identified with the recording success of such too names as Frank Sinatra, Nat King Cole, Judy Garland and Peggy

Lee. He started his career more than four decades ago, playing trom-bone in many of the leading dance bands of the day including that of Tommy Dorsey's, before becoming music director for Capitol Records in the early Fif-Capitol Records in the early Fif-ties. His musical arrangements helped Frank Sinatra emerge from several years of near-obscurity thanks to hits like Only The Lonely, All The Way and Learnin' The Blues, and the clas-sic Songs For Swinging Lovers album. He also arranged Nat King Cole's Mona Lisa. Nelson's success as an arran-

Nelson's success as an arran-er and conductor extended to the Eighties — he was responsi-ble for Linda Ronstadt's What's New? album, and had completed an album Blue Skies with opera singer Kiri te Kanawa.

A Taking Care of Business special for retailers, by lawyer PAUL HILDEN

Keep the books clea

IF YOURS is a limited company, you would do well to take note of questions recently asked in Parliament about the failure of businesses to make the accounting returns required by law to the Registrar of Companies.

It was stated that many limited companies had failed to make their returns and that action

was being taken to tighten matters up.

An amount of information taken from your annual accounts must, by law, be returned to the Registrar and failure to do so can result in a fine. You should ask the accountant who audits your books to prepare this return and send it in to the appropriate address.

On the subject of accountants, you may or

may not be aware that you are obliged by law to have your accounts audited annually be a qualified accountant and that if you wish to change your auditor you must do so in an approved way.

Strictly speaking the auditor should be appointed at the first general meeting before the accounts are presented and he then carries on until the next annual meeting.

If you wish to remove your auditor and appoint another you must give advance notice of your intention and give him the opportunity of addressing the meeting and submitting a written statement if he wishes.

When an auditor has fallen out with you and wants to resign he can give notice to you and provide details of the reason for resignation. A copy of such a statement must be sent to the

Registrar of Companies.

You should also know that in carrying out his duties an auditor has to be given access to all the books and vouchers of the company and can demand from you and any fellow directors any information that might affect his job as

auditor.

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Making sure your business is legal

IT IS a fact that more and more retail businesses are being hemmed in by laws that seem to flow out in a never-ending stream. Some retailers have reached the stage where they just plough on regardless in an attempt to make their operations a success and just hope that they are keeping to all the laws that have been laid down.

Sometimes they are lucky - sometimes not. But, there are Sometimes they are lucky — sometimes not. But, there are some formalities which the law requires them to follow and since these can be adhered to without too much effort, it is worth drawing attention to them so that the risk of fines or penalty payments are cut down as much as possible.

First, if you are trading under a name other than your own or if you run your business as a limited company yet actually trade under another name, then you must display on your premises a set if it is the playing the name of

under another name, then you must display on your premises a certificate showing the name of the business and the name or names of the true owners. Since a homemade certificate will do, there is no excuse for not putting up such a notice on your premises. It will at least satisfy any inspector who might call on you and save you from the possibility of a fine.

There is another law involving the display of certificates. If you have any employees at all, you are obliged to insure against any claims that may be made on you by that employee for any negligence on your part that has caused injury to him. As a matter of prudence, you will no doubt have already done this as

matter of prudence, you will no doubt have already done this as part of your business insurance. However, the law requires you to display a certificate to this effect on your premises where an employee can see it. It is worth checking to see that this is the case as far as your business is concerned. If not, get in touch with your insurers since normally they can supply you with such

a certificate in the requisite form.

There is one other formality which you should follow if you have employees. Under employment legislation, you should ensure that when you hand over a wage packet or a salary cheque at the end of the week or month, as the case may be, take care that at the same time you give to the employee concerned the fullest details of any deductions you have made. This is so whether the deductions made are required of you by law (eg national insurance or income tax) or whether the deductions are those that have been authorised by the em-

A failure to do this can result in a claim from the employee for a lump sum equivalent to the deductions that have not been shown to him or her at the time of payment.

Insurance contributions and the self employed

THE SELF-employed are often baffled by their national insurance con-

THE SELF-employed are often baffled by their national insurance contribution position. Matters have not been made easier by considerable changes made in the March 1985 Budget.

It is, therefore, worthwhile setting out the position as it now stands with an indication of the changes being made.

There are two types of contribution that you may be required to pay. If your profits exceed the figures of £1,925 per annum estimated by you for the year 1985/6 then you have to pay what is known as a Class 2 contribution. contribution.

This is at present £4.75 per week. However as from October 6 this rate was reduced to £3.50 per week.

You pay this either by purchasing stamps from the Post Office or you can make arrangements to pay the Department of Health and Social

Security directly.

In addition to the Class 2 contribution, you will, if your profits exceed £4,150 for the current tax year, have to pay in addition what is known as a Class 4 contribution. You will pay 6.3 per cent of profits between the lower limit of £4,150 and an upper limit of £13,780. These limits remain in force except that as a new concession from April 6 1985 tax relief will be given of half of the Class 4 contributions, this being treated in the way of a business expense

The Class 4 contribution which you owe less the tax relief will be collected from you by the Inland Revenue when you pay your Schedule

THE LIMIT for registration for VAT is now £19,500 per annum instead of the previous £18,700. Traders whose turnover is above the limit must

the previous £18,700. Traders whose turnover is above the limit must register for VAT.

If a trader is already registered for VAT the registration can be cancelled if on their estimate, turnover is likely to fall below £18,500. You can also apply for cancellation if you have been registered for two years and your turnover has not exceeded £19,500 per annum and you do not expect turnover to exceed this sum in the year beginning on June 1.

June 1.

In addition there is going to be considerable tightening up on late payments with interest being charged and also the imposition of penalties on those in default of payment.

There will be increased assessments made on taxpayers who persistently fail to furnish VAT returns. It will be thus seen that delaying VAT payments to assist cash flow will be a counter-productive proposition once this year's Finance Bill has passed through Parliament.

IN TERMS of public prestige, Jaki Graham may have a little way to go yet before she reaches her goal as the UK's new Lady Soul. But on the strength of her pure vocal power and polish, and the waves she made at her London concert debut, she's already arrived and she's lapping most of the opposition.

With the ability to reproduce effortlessly her vinyl successes onstage, Jaki Graham was always going to win over a Dominion Theatre crowd that initially needed more persuading than their Croydon Fairfield Halls counterparts earlier on the tour. But add her irresistibly warm and natural stage manner and you immediately have an audience roaring her home.

David Grant's stylish guest appearance for the Could It Be I'm Falling In Love duet came at just the right time to boost the early buzz of songs such as What's The Name Of Your Game and another duet, with her producer/writer Derek Bramble on Loving You, which suggested that Bramble has a hit career of his own if he ever gets around to it.

Jaki Graham sung just about everything she's committed to record, plus something she hasn't: a fine, subtle version of Bill Withers' Use Me. Her voice is capable of real greatness and it's imperative that EMI let her begin to stretch herself vocally soon. 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

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



Voluntary codes for library mu

THE VOLUNTARY Code of Practice agreed between the Mechanical Copyright Protection Society (MCPS) and the Audio Visual Association (AVA) is being seen as "a positive step forward towards more coperation and understanding within the audio visual industry", accord-

operation and understanding within the audio visual industry, according to an MCPS statement.

The agreement is designed to benefit AVA members (producers, facility houses, music libraries and so forth) by establishing "a very workable set of ground rules regarding application for library music copyright licences". It will not encompass the use of commercial music,

copyright licences". It will not encompass the use of commercial music, which will still require prior authorisation.

The pact covers the use of library music in non-broadcast audio visual and audio productions, but excludes productions made for sale or rental to the general public. One of its major objectives is to eliminate the unprofessional and illegal habit of copyright infringement. It is, in fact, an extension of the original document signed by the two organisations in 1982. MCPS managing director Bob Montgomery commented: "We would like to see other associations come forward to make similar agreements to help notices our members' recording."

commented: "We would like to see other associations come forward to make similar agreements to help protect our members' recording copyrights. The AVA has agreed upon a settlement which will benefit both its current and future members when it comes to clearing the copyright of library publishers."







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SINGLES

ECHO & THE BUNNYMEN: Bring On The Dancing Horses (Korova KOW 43 (T), WEA). The mighty Bunnymen return after a lengthy absence with a truly epic number which wraps a dramatic Laurie Latham production around lan MacCulloch's evocative vocal to give an electrifying number that could take them right to the top of the charts.

ARCADIA: Election Day (Parlophone (12) NSR 1, EMI). Remaining three members of Duran Duran come up with their answer to The Power Station and issue this strong, moody number as a prelude to their upcoming album So Red The Rose. A memorable number, with a contribution by Grace Jones, It can't fail to do very well.

REM: Wendell Gee (I.R.S. MCA IRM 105 (IRT 105), Poly-Gram). The first and foremost of the American wave band's issues, this excellent number from their latest album Fables Of The Reconstruction. With Michael Stipes' sensitive vocals and the inclusion of a limited edition free single, this deserves to reach a wider audience than their previous singles.

THE ARMOURY SHOW: Castles In Spain (Parlophone (12)R 6109, EMI). A re-recorded version of their first single and one of the more commercial tracks off their magnificent debut album, Waiting For The Flood. Their big anthemic sound is kept at an effective pace beneath Richard Jobson's stirring versils.

THE ICICLE WORKS: When It All Comes Down (Beggars Banquet 151 (T), WEA). Yet another rousing single that deserves to bring this acclaimed Liverpool band a good chart position — and it doesn't even feature on their new album, The Small Price Of A Bicycle. Meshes chiming psychedelic guitars with an unforgettable swaying vocal harmony.

LATIN QUARTER: No Rope As Long As Time (Rockin' Horse/ Arista RH (T) 105, PolyGram). Highly-acclaimed and sociallyaware band have taken this track from their debut album Modern Times, and it's backed with a previous single, Radio Africa, with both tracks commenting astutely on the problems of South Africa. Not one of their most immediately likeable singles, but it deserves attention.

ROBERT PALMER: Discipline Of Love (Island (12)IS 242, EMI). Powerful dance track that continues Palmer's previous work with The Power Station and is also produced by Bernard Edwards. Remains to be seen if it can do as well though.

THEN JERICO: Fault (London LON(X) 63, PolyGram). Second single from this hotly-tipped new band after their limited edition debut with the rousing The Big Sweep, a new mix of

THE SNAKES OF SHAKE: Southern Cross (TBC/Stiff GOBS (12)1, EMI). Fresh, lively slice of raucous pop from this

promising Glaswegian band. Excellent, dramatic vocal is well-backed by sharp, trebly guitars over a driving beat and with the added bonus of a mesmerising accordion break.

LISA LISA & CULT JAM WITH FULL FORCE: Can You Feel The Beat (CBS (T)A 6635, CBS). Lively beat box-based dance number that seems sure to repeat the club success of Wonder If I Take You Home as it features the same formula of melodic vocal within sparsely arranged synth effects.

JULIE ROBERTS: Ain't You Had Enough Love? (Bluebird/10 BR (T) 19, EMI). Working Week's dynamic vocalist teams up with Loose Ends to produce this slow, soulful single as her debut solo release. Given enough exposure this atmospheric number could cross over to the main charts.

EVELYN THOMAS: Reflections (Record Shack SOHO(T) 53 PRT). An unimaginative version of the Holland/Dozier/Holland classic made famous by The Supremes, it stays so close to the original as to be redundant, despite Evelyn Thomas' strong vocal and the beat heavy mix.

FRANKIE PAUL: Fools Fighting (Greensleeves (GRED 189) Jetstar/Spartan). Hard, bubbling rhythm supports yet another smooth melodic and memorable vocal from the much-praised Frankie Paul and gives a superb track that deserves to be heard outside the confines of the reggae circuit.

FRICTION GROOVE: Family Affair (Atlantic A 9489(T), WEA). Band featuring Ali McMordie, the former bass player with Stiff Little Fingers, issues this hard punchy version of the Sly & The Family Stone classic, taken from their debut album The Black Box.

THEREZA BAZAAR: Too Much In Love (MCA MCA(T) 998, PolyGram). This polished piece of pop is the second solo single from this singer, formerly one half of Dollar. Arif Mardin's lush production gives a memorable mid-tempo number that should gain plenty of airplay.

ANNABELLA: Don't Dance With Strangers (RCA PB 40377 (PT 40378), RCA). Former singer with Bow Wow Wow strikes out on her own with this her first solo single. This rather weak song does feature some positive aspects within The Systems production but is otherwise disappointing.

JIH: Big Blue Ocean (Breadth Of Vision JIH 1(12), Jungle/Cartel). A strong, moody indie record that is reminiscent of the Associates with its dramatic vocal, atmospheric violin line and driving dance beat, all within the effective David Ball production.

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



With the added attraction of starring roles by Placido Domingo and Julia Migenes Johnson (above), a value-formoney 149 minutes running time, and critics' quotes like "The sexiest Carmen of them all" on the packaging, this video version has everything going for it as a sure-fire stock item.

IAN DURY: Hold On To Your Structure. PMI. Dealer price: £9.75. With Picture Music In ternational's new pricing poli-cy, this excellent recording of the Hammersmith Odeon the Hammersmith Odeon concert which took place earlier this year should achieve reasonable sales.

Dury (above) is no longer a regular visitor to the single charts these days, although his recently released single, Profoundly In Love With Pandora — the theme from the current TV series The Secret Diary Of Adrian Mole —

Diary Of Adrian Mole — might alter this situation.

That said, Dury is a hardened campaigner, and the selection on this video programme sees him and his hand. ramme sees him and his band — the re-formed Blockheads including Chas Jankel and Wilko Johnson — cover the highlights of his chequered — and sometimes illustrious career. It should sell on the strength of Hit Me With Your Rhythm Stick, What A Waste and Reasons To Be Cheerful alone. A good, visually entertaining performance.

VENOM: Video Nightmare. PolyGram Video. Dealer price: £8. With a running time of 20 minutes, this is a short, sharp shock of a video and impossible to ignore whether you like Venom or not.

Subtlety has never been very high on this band's list of priorities and there's no semblance of restraint in their attack on the four tracks. Backed by lasers, smoke and assorted pyrotechnics, this is as close to pure head down, no-nonsense heavy metal as anybody is likely to get.

The sound quality, though, remains excellent. For anybody who actually wants to hear the noise that Venom make, it's all there — and that's the quality that lists this product above the usual

thrash and thunder.

The video is highly professional throughout which is why it may appeal to people other than just fans of the band. Sampling Venom live is a fairly taxing experience but Video Nightmare gives a chance to do it in the safety, comfort and sanity of your living room.

RCA/COLUMBIA'S five October releases offer a very broad selection of musical styles — all backed with substantial retail level merchandising support.

In the £9.95 dealer price bracket are two potentially big-sellers and a third that could prove surprisingly popular. Pat Benatar's (below left) Hit Videos should appeal to the heavy rock market, an area proving a happy hunting ground for music video producers/distributors. In just over half an hour, Hit Videos squeezes in Anxiety (Get Nervous), Lipstick Lies, Shadows Of The Night and Love Is A Battlefield. There is also some slightly pretentious behind-the-shoot footage which, thankfully, does

not detract from the whole.

Jermaine Jackson's Dynamite Videos (also £9.95 dealer price) goes — as one would expect — slightly over the top, but it's all entertaining stuff. Jackson's duet with Pia Zadora on When The Rain Begins To Fall is something else . . . Ronnie Milsap's Golden Video Hits is a bit of a don't-know in the sales stakes. He has crossed over before on record, and this mixture of promos and live shots might do likewise, but to do anymore than average sales, the artist really needs more media exposure.





Laura Branigan's (above right) eponymous hour-long programme features 10 songs including Gloria, Self Control, The Lucky One, How Am I Supposed To Live Without You and Ti Amo, all filmed in concert. She's done well on vinyl, and her increasing popularity should be reflected in video sales. Randy Newman has had limited success record-wise on this side of the Atlantic, and it's doubtful whether this video, Live At

The Odeon, will enhance his standing, strong on atmosphere and performance though it is.

GENESIS: The Mama Tour. Virgin. Dealer price: £13.99. Running for over 100 minutes, this is certainly a marathon among music videos. Filmed at the Birmingham NEC earlier this year, few frills or special effects are used — except for the occasional close-ups of a tapping foot and seasoned hands tinkling the ivories. This straight down the line approach gives the viewer more of a feeling of actually being at the concert. It is strong on atmosphere throughout. The sound quality is good, but the picture quality does vary, but much of this must be down to the Phil Collins' (whose excellent No Jacket Required video is

among the current best sellers) has developed into a remarkably competent front man, though his between-numbers chatter

Genesis still maintain a massive and faithful following which augurs well for this video's sales prospects. And there is such a spread of their extensive repertoire included that even the most demanding fans should not be disappointed.

EDDIE AND THE CRUISERS. EV/Media Releasing. Dealer price: £34.95. Michael Pare (Streets Of Fire etc) stars in this feature film which has scored considerable video success in the US. VISAGE: Visage. PolyGram. Dealer price: £13.50. Excellent hi-fi sound quality and award-winning visual imagery produced by Midge Ure, Godley & Creme an Tim Pope combine to provide a well-constructed documentary of the Blitz club era. Additional Egyptian footage by Jean-Claude Luyat develops this work into more of a musical travelogue, but without detracting from this representation of the new image of the early Eighties.





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

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

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

A notable newie on EMI's reactivated Stateside logo comes from Ike and Tina Turner, and is a reissue of their long-unavailable 1970 Capitol album Her Man . . . His Woman (EG 2607331). This was originally a one-off offering by the duo around the days of their major US pop hits on Liberty (already reissued by EMI), and was a pack-age of hard blues/soul/rock, including several lke Turner compositions and one by Billy Preston.

Over on Edsel, Billy Butler & The Enchanters' The Right Track (ED 147) features material licensed from CBS which originally appeared on the revered Okeh label during the Sixties, and is classic Chicago brassy, punchy soul of the period. Butler is remembered chiefly by aficionados, his success at the time never extending internationally. He is, however, the brother of the much better-known Jerry Butler, and Jerry's influence plus that of his own mentor Curtis Mayfield, are clear to hear. This can be sold without fear to anyone fond of Mayfield, or to buyers of the reissued Impressions material.

Edsel's sister label HDH also has a new package, in the form of the Chairmen Of The Board's AGM (LP 006), a neat round-up of early Seventies material by the General

Johnson-led group. The same label The same label group's deal with Hi Records of Memphis also offers a new compilation shortly in the form of soulster Ann Peebles' I'm Gonna Tear Your Playhouse Down (HIUKLP 422). The title track is, of course, the number which Paul Young revived as a hit single not too long

Finally, Kent keeps its soul reissue road wide open with two new albums. The Soul Of Bobby Bland (KENT 044) is classic Sixties Duke label material licensed from MCA, and features this remarkably

stream soul idiom, including some of his all-time biggest hits like Call On Me, Ain't Doing Too Bad, and Ain't Nothin' You Can Do. The other Kent album is an

interesting compilation of alltime soul tear-jerkers, and is appropriately titled The Tears In My Eyes (KENT 045): Tracks include the title cut from the Fascinations, plus items from the likes of the Impressions, OV Wright, Arthur Adams, Bobby Bland and the Mirettes (who were lke & Tina's lkettes in a later guise). A highlight is BB King's all-time biggest hit. The Thrill Is Gone.

CANUTE EDWARDS, known on record simply by his (real!) first name, returns with a second EMI 12-inch release on October 21. Canute reached the disco/dance charts two years back with a one-off MCA outing, Turn It Up, and prior to that had played guitar in the studio and on the first UK tour with Linx, the successful partnership of David Grant and Sketch.

Phil Harding, plus songwriter/vocalist Roy Hamilton, earlier this year, at which time he was signed to EMI as part of the major's new commitment to recording and promoting dance music. Hamilton's song Amazing Mind

Dancing

ORIGINALLY SCHEDULED for a mid-September launch, the dance-orientated youth consumer weekly *The Street Scene*, published by Morgan Khan's Streetwave Group, is now due to make its debut on October 29 (MW October 12).

Edited by Ralph Tee, one of black music's best-known journalists, The Street Scene intends to target itself much more tightly than the existing pop mags aimed at the same age range (Smash Hits, No.1 et al) at the young dance music audience, and its musical reporting and extensive charts coverage will be angled sharply in this direction, "from disco/funk to reggae, electro, jazz, alternative dance, soca, African music, real and Hi-NRG", to quote the Street Group's own publicity.

With the demise of dance-orientated pirate radio in metropoli-

tan areas, the new magazine could well prove to be a newly vital area of upfront exposure and promotion for many dance-orientated acts and record labels, reaching the same committed listening, buying and vitally aware youth market. The Street Scene's 'National Dance Chart' is already the subject of positive negotiations with ILR radio stations for broadcasting.

As for the editorial tone of the magazine, it is being made clear that it will have much more in common in terms of style and approach with *Smash Hits* (apart from musical direction) than with the existing black music-orientated magazines like *Black Echoes* and *Blues & Soul*, whose approach is more adult-orientated in the MM/NME mould. Again, the publisher's own advance promo message spells it out clearly:

"A typical 14-year-old girl who buys Five Star records wants to read about their clothes their dance routines and their

to read about their clothes, their dance routines and their make-up — not about the authentic gospel roots of their maternal grandmother."

The magazine will feature specialist musical editorial input from familiar names like David Nathan, lan Levine, David Rodigan and Richard Searling. The position it comes to hold with regard to the crossover promotion of dance/black records and acts will indeed be one to watch closely.

SOUL FANS in the UK may assume that paradise is the other side of the Atlantic when in fact they don't realise how lucky they are. America is a huge scattered Union of States with relatively poor lines of communication between individual areas, something not apparent here where imports arrive as if from one centralised point on a map. This actually may be true, as most of the exporters seem to be out on Long Island near the airport! However, a soul fan in for instance New York, or Los Angeles, or Houston, or Cincinnati, is only going to be able to buy whatever records have reached the stores there, and many factors dictate what those will be. Local tastes, radio play in that area, distribution and the location of the issuing label all come to bear on what will be available.

Even knowing this, the UK disco contingent in New York City for the recent New Music Seminar were amazed to find, after for the recent New Music Seminar were amazed to find, after phoning home to establish what imports had arrived that week in London's shops (before Hurricane Gloria closed down transatlantic flights), many of those titles were unheard of at all the leading specialist DJ-serving stores in the centre of Manhattan. The only benefit in shopping there was the number of oldies to be unearthed (often at a price). The exporters may be out on Long Island, but they obviously have tapped straight into the main supply source of all the black music labels wherever in the US they may be — this despite often heard accusations that because the exporters are based in New York they only send over the disco stuff originating in the North-Eastern cities.

The shopper in the UK's black music import stockists is better and faster served than his counterpart in the nation where the music comes from! What's more, in those places here where soul is to be heard on the radio (which is not to forget Robbie

soul is to be heard on the radio (which is not to forget Robbie Vincent's Sunday evening show, a beacon shining without compromise on Radio One), the music is likely to be a lot more interesting and varied than on the US's black urban contempor-

ary stations.

Currently, or at least at the time of writing last week, new noise-makers on import 12-inch were **The Winans'** Let My People Go (Qwest 0-20388), a gospel record selling for its remixed instrumental flip; **Facade's** The Groove (Techno Hop Records THR-4), another strong instrumental; Danté's Freak In Me (Panoramic PRI-1210), confusingly not the UK group; Caprice's 100% (NIA NI-1249), Five Star-ish; EU's Sho Nuff Bump'n (TTED TDE-3010), live go go incorporating Maze's Back In Stride; Slu...go's Crazy (TTED TDE-3008), more go go; Evelyn 'Champagne' King's Your Personal Touch (RCA PW-14202), in box old style: Poster Europeansia and D. L. Cash Money's her old style; Doctor Funnkenstein and D. J. Cash Money's Scratchin' To. The Funk (Sound Makers Records TTED-3014), wild and woolly DJ scratching.

On domestic 12-inch, following continued strong sales of his LP, it'll be interesting to see whether EMI can do for Freddie Jackson's You Are My Lady (Capitol 12CL 379) what CBS's sales force so singularly failed to do for the similarly popular Alexander O'Neal; 52nd Street's Tell Me (How It Feels) (10 Records TEN 74-12) is an instantly familiar Nick Martinelli production, LW5's Kill Or Be Killed (Virgin VS80912) has had mixed reaction due to some rock guitar.

Ready For The World's Oh Sheila (MCA Records MCAT 1005) despite US chart-topping success and Tony Blackburn's championing will need pop support as it's too fast for the soul crowd.
