

Music replaces chat as R1 changes tune

MORE MUSIC and less chat. That is the fresh image for Radio One to coincide with the new spring schedule from this week. And at the same time the network is reverting to a playlist system to give more opportunities to new records trying to break into the top 40.

break into the top 40.

Hired for his chirpy personality but under the tightest reign of all following the new "less chat" edict is Mike Smith, leading the new schedule as breakfast show replacement for Mike Read who has moved

to a Sunday slot.

Another key reason behind the "cut the chat" directive is the intention to reduce the emphasis on the DJ's personality — some would say ego — and concentrate on promoting the station identity, and Beerling is believed to have put this message across in recent meetings with the presenters.

The playlist consists of 10 "chartbusters" and about 40 A list titles which can be virtually guaranteed up to a dozen plays on daytime programmes. The singles are chosen each week by a panel of daytime producers and presenters chaired by Paul Williams. There is also a secondary list but Radio One is not highlighting that.

ing that.

"The playlist is designed to make Radio One less reflective of the top 40 and more selective about what we play," says network controller Johnny Beerling who wants more new music to be played in the mainstream programming.

To cope with extra pressure the "more music" policy and an earlier 5.30am start put on Radio One's needletime allocation, the station has lined up more concert broadcasts and live sessions for Saturday

evenings and in the Janice Long and John Peel slots. Janice Long is also hosting a new Friday evening singles review programme — Singled Out.

Rak gets chart code caution from the BPI

THE BPI was due to issue a reminder of the chart code of conduct to Rak Records this week after being informed of a freelance promotion man buying a single in chart shops.

Evidence was presented to the BPI that the man had bought You And Me by Johnny Hates Jazz in several shops in the Luton and Watford areas. The organisation apparently does not regard the incident as particularly serious and a letter to Rak will probably be the full extent of action taken.

BELGIUM WAS the runaway victor in the 1986 Eurovision Song Contest last Saturday in Bergen with the song J'Aime La Vie (I Love Life) sung by 15-year-old schoolgirl Sandra Kim. Second and third were Switzerland and Luxembourg, and the UK's Runner In The Night performed by Ryder finished seventh. There was no whitewash this year, but Israel came bottom of the 20 competing countries with just one point. Carrere has UK rights to the winning song.

Three sacked over VAT 'irregularities'

THREE PEOPLE have been dismissed by PolyGram over what is understood to be VAT irregularities.

The matter apparently came to light during a routine VAT inspection of a record distributor and the case is currently being investigated by police and customs and excise officers. The matter is said to centre around the illicit recovery of VAT on returned records.

PolyGram personnel director Tony Preedy declines to give details of the case, saying: "I'm never prepared to comment on why people have left the company."





Fifty members for black indie group

A MEMBERSHIP of around 50 is being claimed by the Black Independent Record Labels Association (Birla) three months after its launch.

Director Jack Hamilton says four or five new members are being attracted each week and adds:
"There has been a need for an
association like this for a long time. Black music companies have never had a voice before."

Birla and the newly-formed

general indie labels association, Umbrella, have met to exchange ideas but Hamilton says there is a difference between the two organisations in that Birla is more actively involved in promotion and studio facilities and personnel.

Birla charges members a £25 annual fee and has set up offices at Ventura House, 176-188 Acre Lane, Brixton, London SW2 5UL (01-733 7012).

International edge for music seminar

NEW YORK: WEA International's Rob Dickins will deliver the keynote address at the opening session of the 1986 New Music Seminar, sig-nifying the increased emphasis to be placed on the international scene at this year's conference, writes Brian Chin. Joining Dickins will be a yet-to-be-announced US radio representative to explore the

radio representative to explore the increasingly complex relationship of radio and the music industry. The seventh annual Seminar, expected to draw over 5,000 delegates, will feature panels on international media, talent and booking, club DJs, independent labels, and focus also on the worthwide interaction of smaller labels. dwide interaction of smaller labels.

Live events, incorporating some 90 acts, will include showcases of

UK/Euro music, US rock'n'roll and black music on successive nights at the 4,500-seat Felt Forum, fol-lowed by more rock at the Ritz, disco at the Saint, and UK bands at

the World. NMS has established offices to cover Germany, Benelux, Scandi-navia and Australia, and is book-ing a charter flight from the UK. Independent regional and international labels are encouraged to "co-op" booth space, splitting costs. Unsigned performers can submit

demos for inclusion on a compilation tape to be distributed to all NMS delegates. NMS will choose 14 tracks and charge \$350 for associated costs. Deadline is 30 May. (NMS New York phone, 212-722-2115.)

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Unique Gant sponsorship

FORMER WEA marketing mana-ger Carl Gant has established The Unique Group Ltd, a company specialising in organising music sponsorship.

Gant, who ran successful joint promotions with Adidas, Pioneer, British Caledonian and Schlitz while with WEA, says he already has two companies willing to sponsor tours.

SINGAPORE: A copyright bill before the Singapore Parlia-ment proposes fines of up to \$40,000 and five years in jail \$40,000 and five years in jail for the piracy of records, casette tapes, video tapes and computer programs. This is 10 times the existing penalty, which does not carry a prison sentence as well.

The bill also advocates fines up to \$60,000 or three years in jail or both for anyone found guilty of distributing pirated product. It recommends that a copyright tribunal should be set

copyright tribunal should be set up to settle disputes over per-forming and broadcasting

NEW YORK: An out-of-court settlement has been agreed in settlement has been agreed in the recent action against Tower Records and Caroline Records by CBS, Chrysalis, RCA/Ariola, Sire and WEA. No fines are involved, but all parallel import stock had to be cleared within three days of the settlement day, April 23.

Tower and Caroline also

Tower and Caroline also assented to a permanent injunction against importation of copyright product without written authorisation.

AMSTERDAM: The compact disc has played a major role in an 11.3 per cent climb in Dutch record sales in 1985 compared with the previous year. CDs improved by 160 per cent, and accounted for 12 per cent of the total turnover (1.4m sales).

Musicassettes also registered a 20 per cent increase, but singles and albums maintained virtually the same levels as in 1984, although the decline in LP trade which started in 1978 has been started.

has been stemmed.

The Italian record and cassette market has also reversed 1984's downward trend with a 6.1 per cent improvement last year, according to a Milan report. CDs registered a 52.8 per cent gain with 1.02m unit sales, and cassettes climbed by 11.4 per cent.

LOS ANGELES: Although now under the distributing banner of Warner Bros, Quincy Jones' Qwest operation is diversifying into new films, TV and home video.

Qwest Home Video will re-lease Portrait Of An Album, documenting the recording of Frank Sinatra's LA Is My Lady LP, and a similar programme based on Jones' own forthcoming album.

Qwest Films is following its chief's composing involvement with The Colour Purple movie with a musical production and a short series based on Langston Hughes' writings.



Radio's single obsession

was highlighted at the second UK Music Radio Conference, organised by the Radio Academy in asso-ciaton with Thorn EMI Ferguson, during the debate entitled Hooked

EMI Records UK MD Peter Jamieson drew attention to radio's apparent obsession with single re-cords, and asked whether broadcasters lack the courage or skills to select material which has not already been approved by others

arready been approved by others for single release.

"The increasing airplay of oldies is frustraining to those of us trying to break new acts and music," declared Dickins. "I admit we're whores, and issue records to meet

demand."
"We want people today to relate to the music of their own time," commented Jamieson. "We need more albums which aren't just collections of singles, and more air-time for them to be played. We are too hooked on 45s and fads."

Dickins remarked that too many

singles are released, and Jamieson questioned whether compilation olbums should be in the chart at all. He also referred to the continuing contentions of the broadcasting industry about why should it pay PPL for the right to play records and that it is not radio's job to sell records for the disc companies.

Invicta Radio programme mana-ger Roger Day cast doubt on the claim of LPs for airtime by saying "the dross is left on albums offer the best tracks are released as singles". DevonAir Radio MD Dave Cousins commented that "the sooner ILR can separate their wavelengths, the sooner there will be more airtime. The record companies must grant more needle-

Radio One controller Johnny Beerling supported a point made by Dickins that record promotion men should be knowledgeable ab-out the contents of albums and suggest suitable tracks to producers and presenters.
Radio Two chief assistant Dave

Treadway said it was up to broadcasters to prevent radio being bland in a computerised age. His

colleague Phil Hughes criticised colleague rnii riugnes criticised promo people for not knowing what's on albums, and BBC Radio York programme organiser Tony Fish pointed out that research indicates that the public wants to hear oldies and chart music.

The need for knowledgeable promotion personnel was stressed again during the session on record promotion entitled I'm Gonna Knock On Your Door. Phonogram's Julian Spear remarked that there were too many promo peo-ple in the Seventies, including some

of doubtful qualifications.
"A more businesslike atmosphere now prevails," he said. "One has to be more precise, concise and knowledgeable."

and knowledgeable."
Spear mentioned the presence of breakfast TV and the forthcoming daytime TV as factors which will make inroads on radio listen-

ing.
Managing director of Piccadilly
Marketing Simon Cole drew attention to the "brown envelopes"
which are the extent of attention which some ILR stations receive from the record industry in terms of promotion and personal touch. Some of the major record companies now have no permanent promotion staff in the regions. "We'd like to see record com-

pany promotion people knocking on our doors," he said. "Even if we have to give them a map to find the

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

EMI/Kennedy deal to move into jazz/pop

NIGEL KENNEDY, the leading young British violinist, has signed an extensive new recording contract with EMI, which ties him to the company exclusively for not only classical music, but also for his recordings in the jazz and pop fields.

cordings in the jazz and pop fields.
Kennedy made an indelible impact in the classical world by winning the prestigious *Gramophone*Award for his recording of Elgar's
Violin Concerto on the mid-price
series EMI Eminence, a recording
which was then issued on full price

Further awards, including the British Record Industry's classical award, boosted sales of the Elgar Concerto, and, last week, Kennedy was presented with a silver disc for its LIK sales

But the cross-over potential of Kennedy, underlined by an entertaining appearance on Desert Island Discs, has clearly prompted EMI to gain control of this multitalented musician, who is as comfortable in the jazz and pop fields as he is in classical.

Under the terms of his new contract, he is to record a broad range of classical music, including concertos by Bruch, Walton, Mendelssohn, Sibelius, Shostakovich and Britten, as well as solo works by Bach, Bartok and Brahms.

This indicates clearly that EMI is to build Kennedy into a major artist for the label over the next decade, investing the same amount of financial and artistic commitment as was given to Simon Rattle when he first began to impress.

nnancial and artistic commitment as was given to Simon Rattle when he first began to impress.

It is not surprising, therefore, that Rattle will be among the conductors accompanying Kennedy on the concerto projects, though other leading EMI artists such as Jeffrey Tate, and international figures including Andre Previn will also be involved.

However, EMI also intends to present Kennedy as a thoughtful violinist as can be seen by the plan to record him in some of the greatest repertoire for solo violin.

But, there are great hopes for commercial success from Kennedy's other interests. Characteristically, Kennedy has suggested that Bartok's Solo Sonata should be coupled with music by the composer's contemporary Duke Ellington — on the premise that if Kennedy can record them back to back then the audience must exist to want to hear them in a similar fashion.

Solti tops 1m CD sales

SIR GEORG SOLTI has become the first classical recording artists to top sales of 1m on compact disc.

And at a special reception organised for the conductor to mark the event, as well as celebrating Solii's record 25th Grammy Award, Rheinhard Klaassen, president of Decca International, revealed that between organising the reception and the actual event, the sales had reached 1.5m.

In presenting Solti with a CD mounted in a gold and walnut case, Klaassen remarked that the sales figures had been achieved through a total of 53 CD titles on the market worldwide.

Despite this, the regularity with which he has scooped Grammy Awards is still surprising. The 25th Award came for recording of one of the most difficult operas in the repertoire, Schoenberg's Moses und Aaron which, for years, Sollihad been reluctant to undertake.

He won his first Grammy in 1962 with another opera, Verdi's Aida, although his single greatest achievement was without doubt Wagner's Ring Cycle for which he was awarded a special Grammy jointly with the producer John Culshaw, in 1967.

In fact, sales of the Ring — the most popular on CD — have obviously contributed greatly to the 1.5m discs sold, although the most popular of all his CD recordings is Dvorak's New World Symphony which has also sold nearly 90,000 copies.

It is worth noting that after Solti, the pianist Vladimir Horowitz comes second in the Grammy lists with 18, Boulez third with 11 and Bernstein fourth with nine.

Marking the Grammy success, Solfi was presented with a 1909 horn gramophone, and three 12 inch 78 discs containing the 1949 historic recording of Britten's Serenade for Tenor, Horn and Strings.

Next year will be Solti's 75th birthday, and the CD list of his recordings will be expanded with both new titles and reissues on CD.

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Pump it up

by Duncan Holland

TAKE THE buzz from the Buzz-cocks, add an overtone of The Undertones — as in pure pop — mix it with a dash of the defiant Derryman and you've got That Petrol Emotion.

The spectre of everybody's best-loved, but most missed band, The Undertones, must lurk behind the Petrol Boys, but to see them as Teenage Kicks mark two is one serious mistake. Sure, the band features Sean (ne John) O'Neill on guitar and principal pen, plus the eleventh hour entry of brother Damian on boss, together with a song structure that owes an odd glance at the Tones greatest non-hits ... but this is not a rise from the ashes, post Feargal phoenix job.

but this is not a rise from the ashes, post Feargal phoenix job.
A gaggle of so-so, "OK we're interested singles," boosted by some hot live gigs and the story reaches the new single, It's A Good Thing and the recently released debut Demon LP, Manic Pop Thrill.
A good point to ask the band about the inevitable comparisons. Drummer Ciaran McLaughlin speaks:

"To start with it wasn't obvious that Damian would join, so this isn't The Undertones reforming. There is the hallmark of The Undertones in that Sean writes a lot of our songs, but that hallmark is good pop songs."

Good pop songs soon leads on to discussion of the first single and LP bought by the two represented Petrol pumps, McLaughlin and guitarist Raymond Gorman. Hello Hello; Gary Glitter, Bowie's Ziggy Stardust, The Jean Genie, Space Oddity — and all those other peculiar early Seventies records people bought because there was little else.

Further investigation reveals influences such as Television, Test Department and in earlier times bands such as Love and nowadays, favourites like fellow indie chums Stump and The Wolfhounds (but not really The Wolfetones)

(but not really The Wolfetones).
Currently, the band are London
based, which must have been
something of an upheaval for the
four Derry boys, but was clearly a

necessity for American singer Steve Mack. Was the decision to move easily taken? Says Gorman: "There was no-

Says Gorman: "There was nowhere to play and only a small minority of people were interested, it's all showbands. It's a catch 22 situation, wanting to stay and write about your surroundings, but to get the exposure you have to move to London. After a year on the dole we had to do it."

Manic Pop Thrill is clearly a political album, as one would expect, but Gorman and McLaughlin are at pains to point out that there are other concerns at work within their songs: "It's down to entertainment first. We do the tunes, then the lyrics come. We just hope that our songs give people the opportunity to think. We're trying to combat the ignorance that surrounds so many subjects, not just Northern Ireland."

The LP justifies the live perform-

The LP justifies the live performances and the dictum of "short songs/good tunes" is satisfied. By all means remember The Undertones, but experience a new pop thrill with That Petrol Emotion.

Y's moves

THE LATE Seventies: the timely question, "Why records?" finds form with Dick O'Dell as Y Records, and a groundbreaking outlet for such new breeds as The Pop Group, Slits and Shriekback is established. O'Dell plays on all sides of the fence — manager, producer (Disc O'Dell), artist (Disconnection) — and gives the world Papa's Got A Brand New Pigbag, before temporarily losing his zeal and allowing Y to pass quietly into rocklore sometime a couple of years back.

years back.

Now, after a brief artistic reprise last year with ham Huns U-BahnX, O'Dell and Y are back, zeal rejuvenated, the label rechristened YII (say Y2) and O'Dell happy to be a string puller rather than dangler agree again.

ler once again.

The release policy of YII will be minimal and flexible, says O'Dell, and kicks off this Friday (9) with White Night, the first single in absolutely ages from severely under-rated Anglo-American popsters Torch Song. Before the month is out it will be followed by an album from the duo entilled Ecstasy, a very special record characterised by the Bush-meets-Grogan breathy educated purr of Laurie Mayer, and the almost filmic softly pulsing electronic atmospherics of William Orbit.

"Torch Song have got a hard-

core following of people who are absolutely in love with the group," says O'Dell. "I see them very much in parallel with The Cocleau Twins and New Orders of the world. And just as labels like Factory and 4AD have distinct identities, so YII will develop distinct identity."

develop distinct identity."

Like those labels, Yll intends to remain staunchly independent, with O'Dell only releasing a record if he and distributor Rough Trade are 100 per cent up for it, which may seem like an obvious thing to say, but it's surprising how rarely it crops up as a working principle.

crops up as a working principle.

As well as releasing Torch Song records, O'Dell also manages William Orbit and shares premises with his successful West London recording studio Guerilla. The filmic feel of Orbit's music for Ecstasy has its direct roots in the Hollywood soundtracks he's recently completed for such bratpack movies as Youngblood and Hotshot, the former of which has already grossed \$25m in the US.

olready grossed \$25m in the US.
Orbit has also recently finished producing Belinda, the first solo album from former Go-Go's singer Belinda Carlisle, and remixing two singles, Camouflage and Salesman, for ex-Wall Of Voodoo frontman Stanard Ridgeway. All of which, along with the two sound-tracks, are eventually destined to emerge on IRS, to which Orbit is signed as a solo artist.

Book with Yll, itself not to be

signed as a solo artist.

Back with Yll itself, not to be outdone by Orbit Laurie Mayer also has a solo project, a single entitled Dust In The Wind, scheduled to emerge in the near future.

While the London-based Last Few

Days are likely to be among the first to fit O'Dell's exacting A&R policy. Finally — at least — the man himself is likely to re-adopt his Disconnection guise for a Eurodisco update of The Temptations classic Law Of The Land, featuring all sorts of guest musicians and a still savagely relevant lyric.

Rea: happy as a sand boy

"THE MORE happy I am the more laid back my music becomes," says Chris Rea, so it comes as no surprise to find that On The Beach, his new Magnet LP, is possibly his most mellow record yet, inspired by his currently contented state of mind, writes Gareth Thompson.

By way of contrast then was last year's remarkable Shamrock Diaries album as Rea knows only too well: "Shamrock was very retrock was very retrock was very and memotional watershed, and I've had a lot of happier times since then."

a ior or nappier times since timen. Which leads us back to On The Beach, which the cynics will no doubt say has been streamlined for the American market. "Everyone keeps saying I'm tailor-made for the American market, but for some reason I haven't even got a deal out there. This has been the case for the last four albums now and I've had to learn to live with it. "It's stranger still when you con-

"It's stranger still when you consider that America was where I first took off with Fool If You Think It's Over. It seems to be one of those periods in America where you have to fit into a certain bag, be it West Coast, heavy metal, pop or whatever, and I don't feel that I fall easily into any category."

And nowhere is this better illustrated than On The Beach (jazzy here, rocky there) which has also earned high praise for Rea's keyboardist Max Middleton with whom he has just finished work on the score for a German movie, Auf Immer Und Ewig (a section of which appears on the new I of the property of the new I of the property of the new I of the property of the new I of the new

the score for a German movie, Automare Und Ewig (a section of which appears on the new LP). Rea is scheduled to play at the Self-Aid festival along with Elvis Costello and U2 in Dublin on May 17 to help youth employment. It seems appropriate that Rea should be part of a charity gig in the country which he feels resurrected his career, when the Irish record company personnel really got behind him. The Dublin event is part of a European tour which should consolidate the success of last year's Shamrock Diaries outing. "I have to tour because I don't

"I have to tour because I don't have much commercial success with singles, although I'd be lying if I said I didn't want big hits. They make life so much easier for all concerned. Having said that, touring has become very enjoyable and I'm really pleased with the band I've got. The tours have built up the solid, consistent following that I now have."

More Carmel

GOOD NEWS for Absolute Beginners who loved the film, but were less happy with the soundtrack. Carmel, the singer, the band, supply the missing link with Goodbye Sally, an atmospheric, smouldering new single very much in the vein of More More More. The song is built round a basic line which Carmel McCourt herself wraps her tonsils

round with gusto. Out on May 9 (London), another Lindsay Anderson video is also on the cards. It's great to dance to, great for summer and it sounds like a hit.





Brady bunch in big break bid

WITH A new LP; Back To The Centre, Paul Brady, an Irish singer/songwriter most notable recently for the artists who have covered his songs (Dave Edmunds, Santana and particularly Steel Claw, which is featured on Tina Turner's megaselling Private Dancer album) is trying to make the frequently predicted breakthrough he so richly deserved, writes John Tobler.

Does he regard himself as primarily a peformer or (praise be to Goffin and King!) a songwriter? "It's definitely a combination of both, because I only write songs for my own use, either to play live or record or both, and it's a fortunate by-product that other people want to record them. I'd find it very hard to write for someone else, because I've never done that," he

There is much more active promotion for this record than for its predecessors with a press reception, showcase gigs and very positive Phonogram muscle strongly in evidence. Signs are, to say the least, encouraging.

Giving 'peace chance

NEVER HAS doing good been such fun: Echo & The Bunnymen, Such tun: Ecno & The Bunnymen, Love & Money, John Martyn and China Crisis all on one bill at Greenpeace's charity do at the Royal Albert Hall.

First on, Love & Money's intention was as clear as their name suggests, but thankfully mainman James Grant has his priorities right. So while the chart ambitions of Their strongest songs, the new Phonogram single Candybar Express, the infinitely superior smoothie River Of People and You're Beautiful were obvious, it wasn't to the sacrifice of style: Grant is adopting the mantle of swaggering frontman with surpris-ing ease after making a career out of being coy with Friends Again. A worldclass singer he may not be, but Love & Money have all the feel of a band on the very brink of something big.

Next onstage were the wellmeaning China Crisis, who went down well but veered wildly from supreme grace to mundane rock-ism and a particularly ill-conceived cover of Exodus was baffling. But with the sound sparkling, it was a slick if inconsistent set.

Always preceded by his reputation and credibility, John Martyn's set — the shortest of the evening was as well-judged and flexible as you'd expect, despite the misgiv-ings about his guitar. With just a percussionist (and drum machine) for company, Martyn was entranc-ing — even to the uninitiated, of which there must have been many among the Bunnymen's supporters who, nevertheless, gave him the loudest reception of the evening so

Finally, thank God for The Bunnymen, whose continued bril-liance stands out like a beacon among the market's so many lesser among the market's so many lesses bands. After a shaky start with Mac's vocals all over the place, they recovered to play a blinder, Blair Cunningham doing a sterling job as stand-in drummer after the departure of Pete De Freitas and Will Sargeant positively inspir-ational on guitar.

The best news of all though is

that the new material was stunning. Never Stop, please.

And Vega spoke for herself too, telling us anecdotes and explana-tions around each song in turn, adding to the intimacy as she did so. And when she sang she had a purity of voice that could hold you in its guile while disguising the fact that often her insights are not that acute. She writes personal vignet-tes that impress with their tenderness while seldom getting to the very crux of any particular trauma

or grand emotion.

De Wolfe tones

"THE LARGEST and most comprehensive catalogue in existence", the De Wolfe Music Library also claims to be the first to utilise compact disc. Founded in 1909, it now has its own offices in six countries and agents in a further 30.

Its Soho HQ couldn't be more

appropriate in view of the fact that many of its clients are in the cinema and TV film world. De Wolfe has 18 composers under exclusive contract, and produces about 40 albums of recorded music every year in its own studios.

The latter are the Angel Record-

ing Studios in Islington, North London, and the smaller Red Light Recording Studio in the headquarters building, whose name is piquantly appropriate with regard to other activities practised in Soho. The Angel complex, housed in a

former church, has been operating for over two years and can accommodate 120 musicians in its main studio. It is equipped with the latest refinements in recording technology, and, in the words of company chief James de Wolfe, is "a multi-million investment".

We offer a comprehensive service for the film, audio-visual and TV industries," he says. "Our library distributed everywhere, and

there are over 25,000 sound effects available on tape and disc." De Wolfe points out that TV companies particularly are in con-stant need of music for their programmes, and his company presents them with music of all kinds "of a very high standard". One de Wolfe theme, Eye Level, was chosen by Thames TV as the signature tune for Van der Valk, its series about a Dutch detective. The tune caught on with the public, and at the last count had sold 31/4m records around the world.

"Such themes can have a life of 20 years through our library rather than being limited to a particular TV series of seven episodes."

TV companies have become

aware of the additional earning power afforded by starting librar-ies of their own. De Wolfe looks askance at this competition, but draws consolation by ensuring that his company's library is so much better in terms of variety and quali-ty. Even those TV firms running their own libraries often come to de Wolfe still with needs they cannot meet themselves.

The de Wolfe payroll is 50 strong and very loyal, according to strong and very loyal, according to the boss. "We're a private com-pany, able to take quick decisions and find our own finance when necessary. A good 50 to 60 per cent of our income is earned over-seas. We're constantly watching technical developments with regard to our studios, and we're always looking for good compos-ers," says de Wolfe. "Looking ahead, I believe that in four or five years' time everything will be CD."



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

FLOY JOY: Weak In The Presence Of Beauty. Virgin V2368. Producer: Don Was. A lot more going on here than immediately meets the ears. Most obviously, the loss of Carroll Thompson's languid vocals, which lent such class to FJ's debut two years ago, is a major blow, but while 86's material Is more down-to-earth, more everyday, it could be just this which provides them with the airplay to see them into the charts. The title track didn't make it as a single, the inferior but easier on the ear Friday Night could do the trick. In any event, a quality contender in a flabby soul market: stock it and play in-store.



DAINTEES: Recommend

BILL NELSON: Getting The Holy Ghost Across. Portrait PRT 26602. Producer: artist. After all those compilations, new materiai c.\(^1\) last and an album that occasionally matches Nelson's Acceleration single of a few years back for elegant commerciality. Fastidiously presented and shot through with graceful melodies, this is the spiritual first cousin of Bowie minus the obvious marketing angle.



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MARTIN STEPHENSON & THE DAINTEES: Boat To Bolivia, Kitchenware Records KWLP 5 (via London). Producer: Gil Norton. A long time coming ... but boy was it worth the wait. Live, these boys are shambolic but brilliant, with Stephenson's wit the most obvious focus of attention. On vinyl, the songs take over. Ideas dart in all directions leading us from the mellow Paul Simon-style veneer to the wicked send-ups and smart observations underneath. Full of surprises and tender treasures, The Dainties should get their act together and promote it. Recommend.

ICEHOUSE: Measure For Measure. Chrysalis CHR 1527. More anadyne pleasantries, casting an eye over Roxy Avalon and Bowie Heroes. In some circles the careful constructions and undemanding poppy feel would be considered damning, but Icehouse carry it all off with elegance and poise and are only found wanting on ill-conceived, up-tempo numbers. Potential, but not a banker.

BONNIE TYLER: Secret Dreams And Forbidden Fire. CBS (40-) 86319. Something odd here — it's been three years since Faster Than The Speed Of Night deservedly topped the world's charts, yet here we have an eight-track LP again produced by master of overkill Jim Steinman with only six new songs, as both Holding Out For A Hero (from Footloose) and Loving You's A Dirty Job will already be owned by many. Steinman's muse seems to have deserted him — only two new songs by him (although both Ravishing and Rebel Without A Clue are excellent) plus covers of Band Of Gold, a Bryan Adams song and two by Desmond Child. It's good, but it took too long. Stock it hut be careful

SCREAMING BLUE MESSIAHS: Gun-Shy. WEA. WX 41. Produced: Vic Maile/Howard Gray. Like cousins in musical attitude The Three Johns (see below), The Screaming Blue Messiahs are less driven more measured these days, but that doesn't mean that Gun-Shy isn't still one very exciting LP. The single, Smash The Market Place, particularly (and ironically) is possessed of more commercial clout than the trio have shown be-

fore, and they seem to have a lot of fans in the right places, despite their marked lack of '86 glamour — so who knows?



THE VELVET UNDERGROUND: The Velvet Underground. Polydor. VUBOX 1. The kind of thing people kill for. And that's despite the fact that The Velvet Underground, White Light/White Heat and The Velvet Underground & Nico are available at mid-price, and that the classic 1969 album is notable by its absence. Making up the balance are the fourth album, VU, unreleased until last year, and the carrot, Another View, unreleased stuff from between December 1967-September 1969. Twenty-four-page booklet included, and interest at a premium after the recent South Bank Show on the band.

DANCE

VARIOUS: Dance i-D. WEA WX48. First of a series of compilations by WEA and the style magazine, and even if there's no particular theme or inspiration in the track selection, there's some unquestionably major dancefloor action here: the recent giants by Rochelle, the Winans, Jocelyn Brown, Shirley Murdoch and Zapp, plus the current Patti Austin. Still, the series would benefit from a more individual table of contents: more import cuts à la Streetsounds next time perhaps?

SISTER SLEDGE: The Greatest Hits. Atlantic. WX26. GAP BAND: The Best Of The Gap Band. Club/Phonogram. JABH 15. Both these albums are only 50 per cent of what they claim to be, but in the unsentimental world of dancefloor allegiance five smasheroonies a piece is by no means to be sneered at. Especially when they're of the legendary stature of Sledge's We Are Family, Lost In Music (both remixed with Si Le Bon and Andy Taylor on backing vocals) and He's The Greatest Dancer, or the Gap Band's Burn Rubber On Me, Outstanding and Oops Upside Your Head. Cheap and effective ways of filling in holes in the collection or replacing worn out platters, likely to be rewarded with Top 30/50 showings respectively.

THREE JOHNS: World By Storm.
Abstract. ABTO12. Producers:
Steve Forward/Artists. As evidenced by the two mighty singles included here — Sold Down The River and Death Of The European — an even better Johns' LP than 1984's classic mini Atom Drum Bop. Still ragged as torn corrugated iron around the edges, these Johns are a slightly less urgent concern than before, but better produced and more melody conscious to make up. Biggest yet despite finely-honed uncompromising lyrics, with great indie chart potential and then some.

STOCKIT

THE WOODENTOPS: Good Thing (Rough Trade RT(T) 177, Rough Trade/Cartel. Each Woodentop single sees them a step nearer the charts and this engaging Rolo McGinty number is performed with their characteristic verve with its stuttering beat and frantic acoustic guitar set in their smoothest production yet.

ROSE OF AVALANCHE: Too Many Castles In The Sky (Fire BLAZE 9 (5), Nine Mile/Cartel). Hard and powerful third single from this promising indie band. Crunching guitars and chiming chorus delivered in a swaggering style should make a suitable impact on the indie charts.

THE SHAMEN: They May Be Right ... But They're Certainly Wrong EP (One Big Guitar OBG 003 (T), Pinnacle/Making Waves). This young Aberdeen band have produced an inspired three track EP of memorable and inventive songs. The strong pure vocal combines well with the crisp, shimmering sound to give a psychedelic touch that is in no way detrimental to the fresh and vibrant feel.

A great slice of rocking fun, it will please their not inconsiderable legion of fans.

HIS LATEST FLAME: Somebody's Gonna Get Hurt (Go! Discs/chrysalis GOD(X) 10, Poly-Gram). Much-talked-about Glasgow band release their debut single and it proves to be an effective piece of sparkling pop no doubt enhanced by the production talents of the legendary Nick Lowe. With its powerful vocal and strong harmonies they look sure to go far. FRANK TOVEY: Luddite Joe (Mute 7 MUTE 44 (12 MUTE 44) Rough Trade/Cartel/Spartan. 





Band (Club JABH 15 — a UK compilation of full length 12-inch tracks different from the US equivalent), **Various's** Streetsounds Eurobeat (StreetSounds EBEAT 1 sequed pay bits)

(StreetSounds EBEAT 1 — segued gay hits).

Carrying on with 12-inch UK releases, there will obviously be decent business if not panting excitement generated by The Real Thing's Can't Get By Without You (Remix) (PRT 12P 352), the obvious though rather lethargic follow-up (as it was in 1976); Atlantic Starr's If Your Heart Isn't In It (A&M AMY 319), fragmented crawling big ballod for radio; Guinn's Open Your Door (Motown GUININT 1), classy soul jogger (their consistently good eponymous LP is also out here, Motown ZL 72418); Beastie Boys' Hold It, Now Hit It (Def Jam/CBS TA 7055), powerful scratch 'n rap proving quite widely popular; Booker Newberry's Take A Piece Of Me (Omni Records 120MN 1, via Pinnacle), satisfying enough soul swayer; Gerry Trew's Heartache (BILLYBoy 12 BILLY 1, via PRT), bouncily skipping lurcher; Justlee's Put That Record Back On (StreetSounds Electro LP use, this being an eight-track 331/srpm LP in all but Morgan Khan's mind, with the B-side featuring 12:41's Success Is The Word in all its versions.

Giving peace

APTURING THE moods and concerns of the time, an ambitious choral work in celebration of the peace movement has been recorded. The Gates Of Greenham features The London Philharmonic Orchestra and an array of top UK soloists, plus narration by Sheila Hancock and Barry Wilsher and was recorded largely thanks to donations and a loan amounting to £20,000. The work, described as a peace

passion for today by the composer and teacher Tony Biggin, lasts 100 minutes and it has proved a major minutes and it has proved a major success at its two performances so far — in the Royal Festival Hall at Easter 1985, and in a repeat performance in Sheffield on Easter Sunday this year.

"The first performance was listened to with rapt attention," recalls the conductor John Hywel.

"At the end there was total silence."

"At the end there was total silence for some eight seconds which, when finally broken, was suc-ceeded by a standing ovation of eight minutes."

And even the hardened professionals of the LPO were affected during the five recording sessions. "They quickly became totally involved in the music — even though the work was being recorded in 28 non-chronological sections. Members of the orchestra from all sections were constantly sections. Members of the orchestra from all sections were constantly showing interest in the work, saying in particular how they wished they could play it or hear it from start to finish."

The work, commissioned by the Leaveners' arts youth group — part of the Quaker movement was inspired, Tony Biggin explains, by the first three years of the women's peace Greenham Common. camp

Biggin, who is best known as a composer of youth musicals, in-cluding a skateboard rock opera, was first asked to write a work on the subject of peace for the International Year Of Youth in 1984.

national Year Of Youth in 1984.

He considered numerous subjects, from historical ideas to fiction.

"But I kept coming back to what was happening at Greenham Common — it seemed that here was an action promoting peace that was both very concrete and very concrete and

very courageous."

He decided to base the work on the activity during those early years of Greenham, using the un-precedented developments as a universal expression of a deep-

rooted human desire for peace. However, it was a severe chalnowever, it was a severe chainlenge for Biggin, for he had decided to compile his own libretto both from writings and stories of the women at Greenham, and other sources, ranging from Martin Luther King to the Bible.

He spent months preparing the words, visiting Greenham on numerous occasions, and gradually evolving musical ideas that were very different to the youth works he had written before.

he had written before.
"I considered myself basically a tunesmith, and I had never written an extended through-composed classical work before, but I also believed that there was no reason why people have to listen to music pre-1900 to hear something classical but tuneful."

sical but tuneful."

The result even surprised him, yet at the time of the first performance last year, there was little thought of recording the work — for the costs of putting the 90 minutes of music

involving a large choir, orchestra and soloists was considered prohibitive.

And even when the recording was seen to be possible, it was only planned to sell it through the peace movement.

But as donations for the project passed all expectations, it became clear that a wider marketing push could be developed — one that would do justice to the strong response The Gates Of Greenham itself evoked.

The Welsh record company Sain The Weish record company Sain — best-known for its records of Aled Jones — agreed to release the work on a 2LP/two chrome tape set, with the LP in a gatefold sleeve format (SAIN 1352R), with a dealer price of £6.50, and Pinnacle/D Sharp as the distributor



Library CDs spell profit not

I AM responsible for a group of libraries in Cumbria and started lending CDs nearly two years ago. I count among my friends in the area three record and hardware area three record and hardware dealers who supply us with CDs and co-operate with us in promoting the medium generally. I therefore feel qualified to refute some of the hysteria I detected in the article in Music Week of March 22 enti-tled "CD rental danger". Private rental clubs are not my concern but I consider it odd that shops can make a profit, but not "clubs" in the industry's view.

Demand for CDs at present far outstrips supply so I pose the question "what is the problem" and who are public libraries "danger-ous" to? Public libraries loan media of all kinds such as vinyl discs, tapes, videos, slides, maps, computer software, talking books and the traditional printed book. There has never been an outcry over us lending discs in the past 30 years. Our collections are usually of single copies (anyone wishing to listen to Dire Straits would wait months) and very small in number and range. Commercial video libraries are an established thing now, of course. Does the industry worry about them? Have you seen your about them's Have you seen your local bookseller close because of the local library? Quite the reverse I think you will find.
Public libraries are non-profit making. How could we run commercial businesses? I cannot understand under-

mercial businessess? I cannot under-stand why the article implies that we are changing our "limited lend-ing policy" or what "indications" there are. Budgets that do exist still have to cater for vinyl disc and cassette users so expenditure on CD cannot be used. In case, the

CD cannot be very large.

The quality and durability of CDs is better for public library stocks but not infallible. We have careless users and often not enough staff to obeck discs properly. Some discs are already "sticking" or unplay-able — so they do wear out and will never be permanent assets as implied. Tastes in music change over a period anyway.

over a period anyway.

Taping is really a red herring in my opinion. My library publicity stresses that home taping is illegal and we actively discourage it whenever possible and encourage people to buy CD for its quality. Home taping will never be stopped however — friends will only form syndicates and lend material to each other. If they really like the syndicates and tend material to each other. If they really like the work, they will want a CD or vinyl version for the better quality.

Who can afford to buy a pig in a poke these days anyway? People

who borrow from us are always reporting that they had never

heard some artists or works before and like them so much that they rush out and order the CD. My suppliers confirm this and admit they have neither the time nor the facilities to demonstrate titles to the public. Whatever happened to listening booths in record departments and shops? The more that people are exposed to music of all types (apart from the top 40 albums), the more they will want to buy and own, not just borrow. A CD-only shop in my area actually wants me to put a collection in the library near him because he knows how many sales he has made after people have borrowed items from another branch. Even then we have to consider that probably only five to 10 per cent of CD owners in this area visit our libraries and use the small collections

Public Lending Right is probably a source of valued income for the less successful or minority writer. But are we seriously to believe that artists like the Rolling Stones or André Previn are being ruined by public libraries. Or is this an attempt to rake in more money by the record companies?

the record companies?

If more CD plants were constructed and output increased, costs contained and CD prices were under £10, the industry would benefit. At the moment it seems to be looking for scapegoats before any problems exist.

I also maintain that we are sup-portive of local hardware shops and record shops. First of all we buy our CD *locally* and this boosts sales for the local businessman. We have recently held a Compact Disc Week at our Group HQ with recit-als, demonstrations, lectures and other activities from 9am to 10pm onlier activities from yam to Topmene ach day. Our local dealers sold hardware after setting up exhibitions of about 50 pieces of equipment and also sold large numbers of discs. They were extremely encouraged by the results and want page expenditions with the properties. more promotions with us in the future. Go down and see your local librarian if they stock CDs and

offer to help plan similar events.

The public sector and private industry can work together in many ways. We are merely promoting this new medium as we are with any means of communicating "information". Public libraries want the local record shop and industry to go from strength to strength as we do the book shop and publishing field. I hope my comments help to reassure the industry, but I fail to understand how the public library is such a danger.

Record producer Ben Findon has issued libel writs against Billy Ocean's manager Laurie Jay, the London Standard and its Ad Lib column editor Peter Holl over the contents of a story about the Billy Ocean In Motion album on Trax ... U2, Van Morrison, Bob Geldof, Clannad and Elvis Costello among the leprechaun stars lining up for Self-Aid, a 12-hour rock marathon set for May 17 in Dublin, with radio and TV coverage by RTE, to assist Ireland's unemployed ... Prepare to sweat in greater comfort than ever — The Marquee has obtained approval for its plans to develop the site at 90 Wardour Street, boosting capacity to 1,200 and providing facilities that, in the words of Goff Marquee Ltd, "bands and their customers now expect for an evening's entertainment". Well said, and if it means the toilets will be clean, the beer drinkable and our feet won't stick to the floor, we'll be happy.

THE RACE (a steady trot, so far) to appoint a new BPI chairman is becoming more a case of who is being allowed to stand, it seems, rother than a straightforward set of nominations... Fancy a Sony Walkman with no botteries? A solar powered version is on the way... Congrats to the Grange Hill cast and producers on coming to the notice of 32 MPs who signed what's called an "early day motion" in appreciation of their efforts against drug abuse with Don't Say No... That great character PR Max "Waxie Maxie" Needham, who died suddenly last month, will be remembered with a rock'n'roll tribute at The Fridge on May 29 to benefit his widow Ursula who has been left in financial straits. Already lined up are Big Town Playboys, Wild Angels and The Wild Wax Roadshow... Let's hope the ridiculous "stickering" mentality which is branding risque records in the States doesn't catch on here. The latest ridiculous example is Serge Gainsbourg's Love On The Beat, stickered by PolyGram for its "explicit French lyrics" — clearly a threat to young teens just learning French at school ... Unsettled Spandau Ballet to sign to Phonogram ... Muff Winwood seemed to re-emerge as a hot tip for the MCA job until he signed a handsome contract tying him to CBS. Roger Ames seems another good bet.

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COMMENT

MORE MUSIC and less chat is an admirable ambition for Radio One. A radio station's image can be influenced by the personality of its presenters. But even more importantly a station sound is moulded by the music it plays and since the end of the playlist system five years ago the only tangible yardstick for justifying repeated plays has been the chart. The chart is not a bad guide to popularity for the only national pop music station but when the chart becomes clogged up with "oldies" and TV influenced hits, it becomes very difficult for Radio One to focus on fresh talent deserving wider exposure. Hence the playlist system, allowing the station to make a positive decision about what it wants to play.

Now, Johnny Beerling doesn't have a short memory. He remembers very well the iniquities that caused the playlist to be dropped in the first place. The beall and end-all of a single's potential was a place on that list and if a cut didn't make it, it was often ignored by the record company from then on. The playlist virtually guarantees a significant number of plays and is the best stepping stone to a high place in the chart and a Top Of The Pops slot. That concentration was unhealthy and will undoubtedly place intense pressure on Paul Williams and his panel to make responsible decisions. But, like Beerling, Williams has seen it all before — he was chairm of the playlist panel last time around and can be relied upon to act responsibly.

What is less certain is that the record industry can be relied upon to play the game properly. If



undue emphasis is placed on the playlist by promotion departments and in marketing plans, record companies will not be using the playlist system to its best advantage. By making that listing the be-all and end-all once more, they could stifle Beerling's attempt to get more new material into

doytime programming.

One completely different threat being posed to Radio One's ability to showcase music is the suggestion — gaining ground apparently — that advertisements should be introduced into Radios One and Two to offset operating costs. The Peccock Committee is considering ways of cutting the corporation's costs and with almost half the total radio audience between them the two premier national music networks are seen as prime targets for commercialisation. Whatever the benefits of that exercise might be, one result is certin — more chat and less music. Fight it.


