New shops, new style HMV

THIS IS the new look at HMV, the style that will eventually take over from the "fax 'n' frottage" format that was introduced at the begin-

ning of 1985. The company is spending £5m in the next 12 months on converting its existing stores and plans to open a further six, 6,000 square feet shops around the UK during that time. Says HAV managing director Ian Duffell: "Ultimately, we will move away from wallpapering our shops but that could take some time. We cannot convert our 40 shops to the new style overnight so fax 'n' frottage will be around in some places for a while but will eventually be replaced." HMV opened the first of its new

stores — its 42nd in total Peterborough on Saturday. Desig-ner Richie Irvine comments: "We want to demonstrate HMV's under-standing of the product and the customer. This is achieved by using a flexible approach to promotional material incorporating stage, stu-dio and theatrical effects, creating an environment which is representative of music studios and per-formance areas."

HANDS OFF Radios One and Two. That is the clear message which the BBC is unable to deliver as it awaits official details of the Peacock Committee's report into the financing of the BBC.

And because the BBC finds itself hamstrung and unable to comment until it has sight of the report, now in the hands of Home Secretary Douglas Hurd, *Music Week* is this week launching a campaign to save the music networks, writes David Dalton.

It is in the interests of the whole music industry to get behind the campaign. Imagine these dire con-sequences if Radio One, for inst-

 Nine minutes less music per hour to accommodate ads; • A safer, more bland format concentrating on the upper reaches of the chart;

• Fewer opportunities for new artists and fresh music;

 More pressure on existing ILR stations and their music content as they compete for ads with a

national network. And Radio Two, while its light music format does not sell records, complements Radio One's output

in a way which would be impossi-ble in a privatised form. Certainly no commercial organisation would make such a commitment to live music and the employment of musicians, and the service would slip into a latter-day "housewives" into a latter-choice" format.

IRS resigns from BPI over video clip ban

MILES COPELAND's IRS is to resign from the BPI in protest over the organisation's handling of the video clips dispute and is declaring that its own promos are available

to anybody who wants them. However, Phonographic Per-formance Ltd believes that IRS would also have to withdraw from that organisation before its videos could legally be used on independent television.

The BPI is in dispute with the ITV companies and Channel Four over

whether a payment should be whener a payment should be made for showing video clips. Our Price managing director Garry Nesbilt says: "We are hav-ing a dispute with CBS and I cannot deny it. It's no secret that CBS and Our Price do not see eye-to-eye on a number of issues and this is one of those issues."

Asked when the dispute is likely to be resolved, he replied: "I've no idea. It's up to CBS."

Nesbitt explains the decision to restrict Our Price's stock of singles with: "Sales of singles have not been inspiring and we have now decided to cut down our stocks. We run our business on the basis that there are not going to be any over-stocks. We will take the new releases that we believe will chart.

"Eighteen months ago, we went from stocking the top 75 to the top 50 and we have now reduced that to the top 40." CBS declines to comment on the

issue but it is understood that the company is making a stand be-cause it feels it will be harder for all companies to get product into the chart under the new conditions.



tory at Swindon. About 2,000 units of Nigel Ken-nedy's award winning recording of Elgar's Violin Concerto, currently number two in the classical CD chart, became available for dis-tibution to work the start of the Start tribution last week shortly after EMI had issued a second notice to deal-

nao issued a second notice to deal-ers listing nearly 100 CD titles — including Kennedy — which were "temporarily suspended". Classical marketing manager Stefan Bown comments: "Those

damages and could lead to injunc-tions being imposed. IRS's Andy McNaughton says: "If the PPL are saying that we are not allowed to make our videos available to ITV, that's the first I've heard of it. We're not trying to make a fast buck."

In its statement announcing its resignation from the BPI, IRS says: "Miles Copeland feels that the BPI's position is against the interests of IRS and its artists as it will tend to discourage broadcasters from programming adventurous and un-proven artists of the kind signed to IRS in favour of established artists."

BPI director general John Deacon says he cannot comment on IRS's decision because he has not been officially informed of it. But the organisation says of those companies who allowed their videos to be shown on C4's The Chart Show on Friday: "The BPI notes with regret that

"The BPI is not in any position to coerce a member to follow the council's guidelines but the council will now have to consider whether the actions taken by some mem-bers are compatible with continued membership." membership.

New image boost for Woolworths

HIGH STREET record retailing is receiving a new boost with the introduction of the new-look Woolworth store image, with grea-ter emphasis on in-home entertain-ment and family leisure, and which has been previewed in the West End with the re-opening of the multiple's Edgware Road branch.

The new image includes re-vamped record departments, with a broader depth of catalogue, in-cluding compact discs and videos, and related merchandise. So far 22 outlets have been refurbished, and another 30 are planned within

and another 30 are planned within the next six weeks. Woolworth Group chief execu-tive Geoff Mulcahy says that a total of £43m is being spent this year on the store development programme called Operation Focus with another £100m over the next two upper else inext sets. the next two years also invested. Marketing manager Peter Curtis

adds: "We want to build up customer loyalty and get customers who pre-viously may have only made the occasional visit coming back to our in-home entertainment departments."



NEW YORK: Latin superstar Miguel Bose has been signed by WEA International to a long-term worldwide exclusive recording contract. The Spanish-born artist's first album under the deal will be Salamandra produced by Celso Valli and recorded in Italy.

Bose's last 10 albums released during a similar num-ber of years have all topped the Spanish chart, and his last release, Bandido, sold over 200,000 in Mexico.

LOS ANGELES: Apple Corps, the Beatles management company, has been awarded over £6m in damages against Beatlemania, the company which produced a stage show and film of the same name.

A judge ruled that the show and its creator Steven Leber misappropriated the characters and did not have their consent. The show featured the music of the Beatles with actors playing their roles. Beatlemania Inc and Leber were ordered to pay Apple nearly £4m plus interest, and the film company and pro-ducer Ely Landau were ordered to pay £1.3m plus interest.

ATHENS: Freelance disc jockeys losif Avramoglou and Michalis Tsaousopoulos have been dropped by Greece's state-run ERT-1 radio and TV network after they and two other broad-casters currently under inves-tigation sent an extraordin-ary letter to 26 executives throughout the world music industry accusing PolyGram industry accusing PolyGram Greece international reper-toire manager Vasos Tsimi-dopoulos of a "negative atti-tude" and suggesting he should be dismissed.



PolyGram Greece MD Vico Antypas re-veals that Avramoglou and the others are being sued for libed libel.

Do you use music in public?

You are breaking the law if you use copyright music in public without a PRS licence! Whether in a shop, club, pub, restaurant, hotel or factory — in fact, anywhere outside the domestic circle — it's unlawful to use someone else's copyright music without permission. This applies not just to "live" performances but also if you use a radio or TV set, a record or tape player, juke box, video or any other device.

Some 200,000 premises in the UK currently comply with the law by holding a licence from PRS, which represents virtually all composers, songwriters and music publishers — British and foreign.

From July 1st, music users who ask for a licence before they are visited by a PRS inspector will still be offered a licence at the standard tariff rate. Otherwise the first-year charge will be 50% higher.

Commissions lost as TV video ban hits producers

WHILE THE row over payment for promos rages on, those caught in the middle, the video production companies, are beginning to get seriously worried about the longterm effects of the television ban.



Already production companies are reporting lost commissions as videos are cancelled, and many say that record release dates are now being deferred until a solution is found.

"There are a few people here who are seriously worried about it," says Miles Clennell of Directors International which recently had a video for Brilliant put on hold. "It's still early days but if it dragged on I'd say it would have a serious effect on some of the companies who do nothing else but promos. Some could even disappear." Richard Bell of Vivid agrees: "I've lost one in a week, which he do rastic he drastic huit it is serious



Even the most established production companies are feeling the pinch, with GLO head Gordon Lewis reporting that if it was not for a recent rash of work from the US he would be very concerned by





JOHNNY BEERLING's cogitations provoked many thoughts and memories. Let me try and challenge the current Radio One controller's assessment on radio recruits required.

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Johnny's bottom line on what makes a star DJ was more or less on target. It was how the DJ ascended to this high plateau of radiophonic efficiency and com-munication which provoked my dissent

Johnny Beerling is the co-author of my only publication (*The Rosko* DJ Book), so fundamentally we concur on the basic principles of communication. I quote: "The best broadcasting DJs are the natural communicators who have a built-in rebellious streak. They are dedi-cated to their craft, and above all they are original"

I don't believe that there is a 100 per cent original DJ today. This is not a put-down. Most personalities not a put-down. Most personalities get their material from publications written expressly for this purpose (where would Tony Blackburn have been without his 101 Joke-book etc?). Professional writers who supply material, as well as listening to one's peers, are the standard methods of obtaining us-oble data able data

Even outright thievery is "state of the art" acceptable, providing the jock can successfully disguise the original "source". The latter prob-ably nicked it from someone who nicked it from etc etc. There is really very little totally original material around, so it's how you

change it that makes it work. JB mentions Wolfman Jack as my guiding light — and that, to a degree, is correct. Homage must

also be paid to such greats as Socko and Jocko and Bill Mercer and the late Bobby Mitchell and Tommy Donahue. To learn how to sell sincerely.

there is only one. The chap that helped me the most is Casey Kasem who I call the world's greatest communicator of vapidity and father of America's Top 40. If I had to pick a fave voice heard in the UK, Jack Jackson for the Fifties was as close to original as one gets.

Johnny salvoed a mouthful at the club DJs, and once again I have to take issue. You say they have nothing in common with radio DJs but most radio jocks I know had prior time in clubs or playing records at parties etc. So I say to you, JB, yes — nothing in common with radio DJs — until the select few break out and become stars.

RADIO ONE's Johnny Beerling was spot-on. What happens in dance halls and the nation's airdance halls and the nation's air-waves are two distinctly different things. I have no complaint with these trip the light fantastic turnt-able fanatics — at every public appearance I've made I have re-lined as their tarbiest skills with lied on their technical skills with turntables and mixing abilities. Being on the radio, however, is a lot more than soul music and mix-ing. It is communicating, entertaining, and serving the listeners who depend on the personality as a constant in their lives.


Johnny Beerling best summed up the qualities of a good radio pre-senter: "... those who know their stuff and who are so passionate that they cannot wait to share their enthusiasm ... entertaining ... making the patter entertainment in itself." Let me add to this a sincere love for the listener (above all), as well as the music, the station and — - the advertisers. Radio is in ILR not playing your favourite funk tune (or pop tune); but it's playing the audience's favourite tune. And radio is definitely not listening to ourselves in the headphones or ego-tripping to our Bill Mitchell name checks. Like the turntable these are all ancillary items that go into our presentation. But, stripping these gimmicks aside, you separate the wheat from the chaff.

We should thank God every day for the great industry we are in, and we should protect this industry by magnifying the talents He's given us. Let's all strive to dedicate ourselves to our craft, to be ourselves, and to communicate from the heart.

do appreciate Johnny's remarks about pirate radio. Being cloistered like a monk was one of cloistered like a monk was one of the greatest creative exercises of my life. That kind of environment is a great boost, being with dedi-cated radio people ... almost like a mission. But this can be created on land too. Steve Wright and Mike Read are great examples of this going from Radio 210 to the heights of Radio One. The BBC and ILR can nurture the Kenny Everetts and Tony Black-burns of the Eightes. but only with

CHAKK: Big Hot Blues (MCA FON(T) 3, PolyGram). A live favourile, this tense and dynamic slice of hard industrial funk stutters and sways over bubbling rhythms and with its sharp sax and strong emotive vocals it could be the one to give them the inevitable chart breakthrough.

The long awaited new material from Torch Song proves to be pulsating and totally captivating, with a broad cinematic pro-duction and Laurie Mayers' soft seductive vocals pinned down by an unforgettable hook. Should re-ceive wide-scale exposure.

THE TRIFFIDS: Wide Open Road (Hot! HOT 1230, Rough Trade/ Cartel). Acclaimed Antipodeans deliver another typically arid, country-tinged number that conjures up pictures of the wide open plains with gravelly vocals and re-verberating drums. Taken from an eagerly awaited album, Born San-dy Devotional, it certainly deserves attention

THRASHING DOVES: Match-stick Flotilla (A&M AM(Y) 325, PolyGram). This new band have been very impressive live, but they seem to have lost some of their edge with the transfer to vinyl for their debut single. Still with a tinctive vocal and a driving rhythm, they remain a band with promise and one worth watching out for.

RUEFREX: In The Traps (Kasper/ Stiff (12)KAS 3, EMI). Passionate Belfast band issue this number from their inspiring album, Flowers For All Occasions. Contains the usual committed vocals and intense backing, but it doesn't quite hit as hard as some of the better songs on the album.

CARMEL: Sally (London LON(X) 90, PolyGram). A bright swinging arrangement of a bluesy, funeral song. Engaging and memorable with breezy brass and organ fills adding to the loose feel of what amounts to their best single for some time

FAT BOYS: Sex Machine (Sutra/ WEA U 8674(T), WEA). New York's heaviest rapping trio turn this classic James Brown number into a dramatic rap number with style. With the humorous angle, is sure to crossover to the main charts.

BEGGAR AND CO.: Life (Total Control (12)TOCO 9, EMI). Well known session band reform to produce a bright and breezy club track. The sparse arrangement of punchy horn section and moody synth sound should fill the dancefloors and could go even further.

PAUL HARDCASTLE: Foolin' PAUL HARDCASILE: Foolin' Yourself (Chrysalis PAUL(X) 2, PolyGram). Very much the same formula that gave him a hit with Don't Waste My Time with the same dance beat and similar synth sound, but without the strong Carol Kenyon vocal that distinguished that number it is in no way as memorable.

BONNIE TYLER: Band Of Gold (CBS (T)A 7223, CBS). Jim Stein-man puls one of his typically mas-sive productions around Tyler's raunchy vocal for this version of the Freda Payne classic. Lacks the soul and subtlety of the original but with its American style sound is well suited for mass radio play.

THE TURNPIKE CRUISERS: Extra Flesh (Jettisoundz JZ 6, Pinna-cle). Highly charged rock 'n' roll delivered in a suitably energetic and menacing style with stuttering machine gun guitars and squawk-ing horns. Despite a murky mix the dynamic power of this great track is not subdued.



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

In two nights at Hammersmith Odeon, Sabbath found that with Tony Iommi (pictured below) now being the only familiar face on stage — the fans just weren't prepared to accept newer mate-rial. They bayed for the tunes of 15 years ago, even though many of the audience must have still been in nappies when they were first recorded.

When Sabbath obliged with N.I.B., War Pigs, Black Sabbath and Paranoid, the old madness took over. Each of those works was given a new coating of menace by the technology that wasn't even a concept when they were first writ-ten and that electronic devilment was used to its fullest when Sab-

was used to its fullest when Sab-bath called a conclusion with Heaven And Hell. Iommi's power backed by a rag-ing synthesizer and led by Ray Gillen's rampaging vocals is guaranteed to lift any metal fan several inches off the floor. Phonogram must be asking why he doesn't write stuff like that any more.

for Grimethorpe), only two works are currently available on record. His opera Punch and Judy, re-corded by Decca for the late and lamented Headline series, and his AGM recorded by Boulas for For AGM, recorded by Boulez for Erato, are all that can be currently obtained — and both only on con-ventional formats. All you need is love

TAKE IT with a pinch of salt when Stephen Duffy says he wants to be the new Donovan, writes Danny

Duffy, former Duran man, more lately a minor idol with the success of Kiss Me and Unkiss That Kiss, is of Kiss Me and Unkiss That Kiss, is at that difficult second album stage. At least, difficult for everyone else: he reckons he's wildly commercial, but with the last two singles, I Love You and Something Special failing to hit home, he's very much caught between two stools — too intellec-tual for the teenies and too wilfully poppy for those who reckon they know better. What the subdued wit and postel

What the subdued wit and pastel pop of the Because We Love You album on 10 Records will achieve, he thinks, is to take him back to the stage where people will listen to the music and words and take them at face value. There's no mistaking that Duffy thinks he's had a bad deal so far: "I think I did things the wrong way round really. I went straight into the backlash without straight into the backlash Windou having the honeymoon period. I was straight into the top four like that," snaps fingers, "so press peo-ple took an instant dislike to me. I've had to take this time to turn things round, so that people aren't achamad to have my records at the ashamed to have my records at the front of the rack.

"I think people are going to be surprised at the sales of the album, because the last one — coming after the hit singles — did relatively

after the hit singles — did relatively badly. But as we're not following up a Top 5 single now, I think dealers will take less and sell out and regain goad faith." From the opening complaint "I'll never be hip in the magazines" onwards, Duffy wraps some droll humour up in the tender, hopeful and sometimes sad vigneties of Be-curse. We Love You, which takes cause We Love You, which takes up the story from where the first left off, with the songs written from a slightly older, experienced but still naive lover's point of view. So is this a Life Of Duffy cycle, to be

continued with regular updates? "Well, all my songs are true — I was there at the time! The next album is going to be more explicit about things like lust without being in coy situations. I can express it better because I'm older... and

wiser. "But I write about topical things — I'm very politically sound, Icing On The Cake was a really strong protest about unemployment and it was record of the week on

Radio Two!" If Duffy's searching for the reason why people often miss the point it could well be down to the fact that he doesn't personally deliver the songs to the fans.

Apart from a live appearance on the Tube, Duffy doesn't tour: "Because I'm a solo artist it's very expensive to pay for a band so I've never been able to afford it really. Every time I've put together a band Every time I've put together a band and said 'hey let's do the show' the amount of support I'd've needed has been ridiculous so I've always done another record instead. Any-way, these days it's all 'what's going to happen if the tape breaks' and 'does it really matter if they've already bought the 1-shirts?' "It's all merchandising not a lat

"It's all merchandising, not a lot

He's equally scathing about the charts ("I can't see the talent, only the money"), but then someone who freely professes his love of pop has to go along with the pop process, don't they?

process, don't they? His "very loyal following" will be delighted to know that he may be breaking the silence later in the summer, though, warming up for Dr Calculus (the Pigbag horn sec-tion whose record Dufty produced latt area? last year) on a few live dates.

"At career interviews I always said I wanted to be a pop star. So what led someone who's unsuited to the 'big-grins-let's-party' pop world we have now, what made me carry on, I suppose, was that I believed in the songs. Writing love songs is the best job in the world."

Just a peek at one of the videos or publicity pix or a snatch of the strings-trimmed songs on Because We Love You is enough to confirm that Duffy is yet another Sixties nostalgic — "Everything's cyclical; The Smiths are The Beatles, The Mary Chain are The Stones and I'm Donovan —", though luckily it's not too soured by a "things-will-never-be-as-good" mentality.

"I can't understand why people say music's in a state really. The equipment's so good now that if you're any good you can just sit down and it happens. But between A&R men and the bands there's no

spark — that's where the problem

Until the new album, Duffy's busying himself on the other side of the studio, producing artists like the studio, producing artists like Carroll Thompson, former-lovers' rock queen, the voice behind Floy Joy's exquisite first LP, and backing singer on several Duffy tracks. "Things are looking up. With this new LP and CD I think the new CD I think the new

Donovan will break into the Dire Straits category. Icing On The Cake and Kiss Me will just be seen as hiccoughs which made me known and things will steady out from now on: platinum albums, I'll get really boring and forget my convictions, I can't wait. Open the champagne!"



WHO WROTE The Book Of WHO WROLE the Book Of Love? Every New York art band from The Velvet Under-ground down. But read on, for this is no weighty introspective tome. No, The Book Of Love is more light romantic fiction, or, as they would have it a first as they would have it, a fairy

story. The Book Of Love (above) has four central characters — Jade Lee, Theodore Ottariano, Susan Ottaviano (unbelievably no relation), Lauren Roselli — a charismatic bunch of adopted New Yorkers drawn to the art schools of the Big Apple by its reputation as a melting pot of ideas and people.

Their roots lie in the English electropop of The Human League, Depeche Mode and League, Depeche Mode and their compatriots, who in the early Eighties shipped their bright, shiny new wares to the Lower East and Bronx and be-gat hip hop. The band's self-titled first album has just been released over here on Sire, and the best track from it, I Touch Roses, should by now be winning tender hearts with the dizzy tune-fulness of the tragic side of ro-mance (just like all the best fairy stories

British black band to top the US R&B chart with Hanging On A String last year, have a new single, Stay A Little While, Child, out and an album called Zagora due on July 14 with Brampton Music copyrights. Ian Foster's debut single on MCA, Tell Me It's True, is also on Brampton, with more to come with the August release of his album recorded in the US.

Hall's producer protege Nick Martinelli is working with Phyllis Hyman for the new Gamble-Huff label through EMI America, and she has covered a Brampton copyright written by Loose Ends entitled Ain't You Had Enough Love, Baby. Martinelli is also producing Gladys Knight, Legacy and Sheena Easton.

Other Brampton songs can be heard on Anita Baker's Elektra LP, Mtume's Breathless single and Theatre Of The Mind album on Epic, three Reggie Lucas songs on a Randy Crawford LP, Together We Are Beautiful by Fern Kinney on the Bring On The Girls compilation, Kleer's Greatest Hits on Atlantic, and Lew Kirton's Don't Wanna Wait on MCA later this month. Openchoice Music has Children Of The Ghetto written by Chris and Eddy Amoo of The Real Thing on a Philip Bailey LP pro-duced by Phil Collins.

Last but not least, Sahara, which comprises Matt Bianco singer Jen-nifer Evans and former Light Of The World keyboardist Peter Hinds, are nearing a new record deal with the help of Hall's Manna Management. They were on the MW disco chart for 32 weeks last year with Love So Fine. And Paul Buckmaster, whom Hall has man-aged for 16 years, has written the incidental music for three TV documentaries including the award-winning Nature Watch.

Commercial breaks

TOKYO: Nichion, the top music publisher for Top 100 single char-ters last year again, is developing a lucrative market for its copyrights used as the music for TV commercials. It is placing both well-known material which it controls and hitherto unrecorded songs by its house writers.

Standards placed for commercials so far include Rhapsody In

Blue (Nissan Bluebird), It's A Sin To Tell A Lie (Mr Donut) and I'm Popeye The Sailor Man (Nippon Telegraph & Telephone Corporation)

An unrecorded Nichion convr-An unrecorded Nichion copyr-ight, The Push Is On, was selected by yoghut maker Yakult for a commercial, and the same com-pany has picked two further uncovered items, All That Heaven Allows and Love Is On The Line, for use in two more TV commercials, one running now for 26 weeks and another due to start for a similar period in October.

Nichion president Mamoru Murakami says that potential clients are now contacting the clients are now contacting the company seeking appropriate songs to promote their product on TV. Synchronisation fees range from \$8,333 to \$27,778 per song, and with 60 songs already placed, the activity is proving profitable.

Nichion has assigned a produc-er and an assistant to handle this work full-time in view of the interest. Murakami adds that the company can clear rights and set fees within one week.

Printed music sales rise


GENESIS: Invisible Touch. Charisma/Virgin. GEN LP2. Even more commercial than their last LP, Invisible Touch is disappointing synthetic pap with horrendous electronic drums peppering the sound. It's standard Phil Collins material which will doubtless sell in droves, but seems really to be the droves, but seems really to be the final insult to their original fans who put them in this, privileged position. Appeal-to-the-masses music which is sadly short of massive appeal.

VARIOUS: Never Before Released Masters From Motown's Brightest Stars — The 1960s. Tamla WL 72425. Having recycled its catalogue year in year

out, Motown has shown initiative in out, Motown has shown initiative in releasing this "new" album featur-ing well-known label names like Mary Wells, The Marvelettes, Ste-vie Wonder, and Diana Ross and The Supremes performing pre-viously unissued material. The tracks are maybe not up to the standard of many of the Sixties Motown classics but they are all still worthy of release, and this album work, Notward and State and State and Collectors appeal. Cashing in an the re-discovery of Sam Cooke's work, Motown has also re-issued The Supremes' 1965 album We Remember Sam Cooke which was originally released as a tribute album, and will find new fans the second time around. Looking Back At Yesterday, a compilation of ear-ly unissued tracks by Michael Jackson, and Lionel Richie — The Com-poser, featuring his hits by The Commodores and the Endless Love duet with Diana Ross, also have enormous sales potential.

WOLFGANG PRESS: Standing Up Straight. 4AD. CAD606. Producers: Artists/John Fryer. Subtle and strong at the same time, Stand-ing Up Straight is multi-layered with unusual drum patterns and oddly captivating noises not nor-mally found in pop, all integrated perfectly with Mark Cox's peculiarly aching voice to form an album that will consume you if listened to rather than be consumed. The work of intelligent people for those who take their listening pleasure seriously

SMITHS: The Queen Is Dead. Rough Trade. ROUGH 96. Pro-ducers: Morrissey/Marr. In which aucers: Morrissey/Marr. In Which The Smiths pick another controver-sial catchline and steer perilously close to disappointing self-parody, only to gaily acquit themselves with Morrissey's withest words to date (one gets the feeling he actually every in self parody) and the usual revels in self-parody) and the usual sterling backing from Marr and men. As with Meat Is Murder, not immediately sparkling but another grower one suspects, and probably another chart-topper too.



FLUX: The Uncast Block. Of Pink Indians. INDIAN 1. Distribution: Nine Mile. Well this is unexpected, Brian. Flux wave bye bye to threequarters of their name and the old commune-punk row, and substitute it with the most impressive percussive barrage, strong/icily tuneful voices and sometimes even songs. A record of two halves, half pro-duced by the great Adrian Sher-wood and half by the group them-selves — and one to take them to their biggest audience yet

FELT: Let The Snakes Crinkle Their Heads To Death. Creation. CRELP009. Distribution: Rough Trade. Not so much an album as a series of engaging snippets. Ten instrumentals, all well under three minutes long, and each too much an unelaborated thumbnail sketch to be fully satisfying. Charming all the same, and fine indie seller.

ACK IN the Seventies it was ACK IN the Seventies it was a description of the music by names as Ken Dodd, Des O'Connor, Mrs Mills and Lena Martell but in the Eighties it is also likely to embrace the latest albums by Barbra Streisand, 'Neil Di-amond, Billy Joel and even Dire Straits and Alison Moyet. Middle-of-the-road-music — a description which has connotations of bland-ness and yet is responsible for the which has conhotations of blatte-ness, and yet is responsible for the sales of millions of albums and cassettes every year. There is no doubt the easy listen

There is no doubt the easy listen-ing music scene has changed enor-mously in just a few years. Origi-nally it was a term for light orches-tral music, ballads crooned by cabaret-type artists, or film or theatre music. Today it is almost any form of music outside of the boundaries of contemporary pop and today's chart hits are and rock, and today's chart hits are likely to be the MOR music of future years.

The search for a more appropri-ate description of such "catalogue" and easy listening music continues. Adult-orientated rock has strong American overtones, and the term has never really caught on this side of the Atlantic. Coffee table music is one of the newer euphemisms, and that's a description which has been applied to the albums of Dire

Straits, Paul Young, Sade and

easy money

Straits, Paul Young, Sade and Whitney Houston. Label it what you like though, it's music that is guaranteed a long shelf life, appeals to a wide range of record buyers, and is never out of fashion. And although it fre-quently gets knocked, MOR is re-sponsible for the sales of millions of record/cassettes units every year, not just at Christmas but throughout all the seasons. Back in the Seventies, EMI Re-

cords was one of the major record companies most predominant in the MOR market, to the extent that it had its own MOR division which it had its own MOR division which became a lucrative money-spinner for the company, exploiting both back-catalogue (Shirley Bassey, Ken Dodd, Vince Hill, Manuel and His Music of the Mountains etc) along with "current" MOR acts (The Wurzels, Don Estelle and Windsor Davis, Simon Park Orchestra etc).

Orchestra etc). Vic Lanza, who headed the divi-sion, and is now general manager A&R strategic marketing, admits: "MOR has changed, it embraces so much more music now — it's a dreadful description for the music but it is appropriate in that its appeal straddles both side of the road, and reaches the broadest audience. has become an important medium for the success of MOR music, parfor the success of MOR music, par-ticularly with ballad material. "There are a lot of records which if put out 'cold' would probably just disappear from view but with TV promotion, and I'm not just talking about television advertising, they've got a strong chance of success. TV gets straight to the MOR audience — look at the suc-cess of Nana Mouskund's recent cess of Nana Mouskouri's recent single Only Love, which was the theme from the TV mini-series The Mistral. It has completely re-established her as a recording artist and brought her to a new public." public

MOR/easy listening music lends itself to particular popularity in the cassette configuration. Although it is only comparatively recently that tapes sales have reached parity with their vinyl equivalent, EMI Rewith their vinyl equivalent, EMI Re-cords was experiencing 50:50 sales some eight or nine years ago with series like Motorway Music and Miles Of Music. "It was the first musical area in which tape really took off," Lanza says." Motorists in particular were responsible for this because it was the kind of music that they wanted to listen to in their cars — good, easy listenina backcars — good, easy listening back-ground music which didn't make


too many demands on them." This trend was recently rein-forced with EMI budget record subsidiary Music for Pleasure's launch of the MOR tape-only

series, Hour Of Pleasure. There, repertoire marketing manager Ro-ger Woodhead says: "We released several three-cassette packs in the Trio range, which largely covered middle-of-the-road music, covered middle-of-the-road music, and had tremendous success with them — similarly on many of our MfP titles tape sales outstripped the LP equivalent, so we decided to introduce Hour of Pleasure as new concept in tape marketing."

The perennial popularity of middle-of-the-road music has proved to be particularly lucrative for record shops specialising in it. Dress Circle in London's Covent Garden, and nearby Monmouth Street, specialises in records, cas-settes and compact discs of stage and film musicals, nostalgia and personality recordings, as well as soundtracks. Owner Patrick Martyn feels that apart from the appeal of the music itself, it is important for record shops to reflect their potential customers' style. "The personal touch is a vital part of our image — it's important that whoever is behind the counter knows their subject and is enthusiastic about it. It doesn't matter if someone is looking for an ancient re-issue or the latest Johnny Mathis album, they want that personal touch because makes them feel more at home in

Nostalgia and back-catalogue is an important area of the MOR Market, and the former in particu-lar seems to have been "rediscovered" by record companies dur-ing the Eighties. "I believe that we've helped contribute towards this revival of interest in the music

of yesteryear," Martyn adds. "When we started the original shop, the record companies didn't shop, the record compones dath means to know about us but gra-dually, through the feedback we got from our customers, they started to sit up and take notice. Some of the companies actually come to us now and ask for advice on what they should release in the MOR/back-catalogue areas."

Paul Bott, record buyer at Terry Blood Distribution in the Midlands, echoes this view: "A lot of dealers do seem reluctant to stock MOR which is rather strange because it can have a long shell life whereas some of today's pop sensations can be forgotten in a couple of years. On the other hond MOR years. On the other hand MOR also now encompasses music which only two or three years ago wouldn't have been considered to fall into that area. Billy Joel is a good example — he has mass acceptance, not just amongst the constant rack huvers but amongst pop and rock buyers, but amongst the older record buyers as well." Bott adds. "Unlike many other

a single out as well. Barbara Dick-son and Elaine Paige have both become huge album-selling artists without the benefit of hit singles. Dealer Alan Challoner owns Cavern Records in Lewisham, South London, which specialises primarily in middle-of-the-road music and he reports that business is "as usual, very buoyant". Chal-loner says: "It can be a very profit-loner says: "It can be a very profit-able business because there is a able business because there is a better mark-up to be made — it's not like a lot of the chart stuff which has to be discounted. We do particularly good business because a lot of the MOR product we keep in stock can't be found in a lot of the

bigger stores and multiples. "For instance, PRT have an artist called Bobby Cole whose got

something like 15 albums in cata-logue. A lot of people have never heard of him yet we can guarantee to sell at least a dozen of his albums every week. Rose Marie is also a tremendous seller — she might not make the top 30 but she sells lots of albums."

In-store play is an important sell-ing factor, Challoner points out, "If you play an album in the shop you you play an aloum in the sinap you don't just sell one copy, but prob-ably three or four. Some of the music played might be quite awful but it does help sales! If you don't play the albums then some of them could well be left on the shelves for

quite a long time." "We specialise in different areas of music, including disco and pop, but middle-of-the-road music always does good business, prob-ably because there are a lot of people in their forties or fifties who don't particularly like the contem-porary stuff but still want to listen to easy listening music. You have to push it underneath their noses though, and ensure that the product is in the right place at the right time.

CBS and EMI expand ICE tape range

TWO COMPANIES expand their long-play tape series in June, with EMI adding 10 new titles to its Miles of Music and CBS adding seven titles to its Classical C90s.

Miles of Music was the first of the tape-only series to exploit the incar market, using long-play tapes as the major selling point. The June list includes Tchaikovsky Showpieces (TC2MOM 2908879), Beethoven by Moonlight (TC2MOM 2908879), and Hallelujah Handel (TC2MOM 2908939). CBS' Classical C900

CBS' Classical C90s also follow a one-composer programme in their seven additions, with Bach's Violin Concertos played by Pinchas Zukerman as well as other concertos containing violin (MGT 397898); Mazart's Violin Concertos Nos 3-5 also played by Zukerman (MGT 39700) and Tchaikovsky, with Bernstein conducting Romeo and Juliet, Marche Slave and other popular works (MGT 39803).

Candide from US in big Conifer deal

LEONARD Bernstein's musicalturned-opera, Candide, heads a list of six titles which introduce the American label New World to the UK for the first time following the completion of an important distribution deal signed with Conifer, writes Nicolas Saames. The New World label had an

The New World label had an unusual genesis in that it was formed to record 200 titles which would mark the American bicentennial by encapsulating American music.

It covered a wide range of styles, including jazz, blues, bluegrass and gospel as well as classical, and was originally intended to be placed free of charge in all major American educational establishments.

But the success of the series assured its continuing future on a more commercial basis, and its introduction to the UK comes in the wake of the successful Bernstein Festival in London. Candide started off life as a musical comedy, but was reworked into a full opera by the composer in 1982. This recording, conducted by Bernstein, was based on the 1984 Metropolitan Opera House production, and comes on all three mediums in double albums sets (NW 340-1).

(NW 340-1). But Conifer classical manager John Kehoe warned that CD stocks were originally ordered by New World only for US consumption, and that the British allocation was fairly small. "I am afraid it is a question of first-come first-served," he said.

Pavarotti sell out

TICKETS FOR the Wembley concert on August 6 of supertenor Luciano Pavarotti are almost sold out — an indication of his popularity that augurs well for his latest release on Decca.

Ity that dugits were to the terms release on Decca. Called Luciano Pavarotti — Anniversary, it marks the 25th year since the singer's operatic debut as Rudolfo in Puccini's La Boheme in Italy. And, appropriately, the release (417 362 LP/tape/CD) contains

And, appropriately, the release (417 362 LP/tape/CD) contains the most famous aria from the opera, Che Gelida Manina, along with a selection of other arias. Songs from liquid days, Philip M Glass. Philip Glass Ensemble. Michael Riesman, Conductor. CBS FM 39564.

This first venture by cult composer Philip Glass into songwriting contains six songs written in collaboration with figures such as Paul Simon, David Byrne and Suzanne Vega, Each song bears the hallmarks of Glass's distinctive style, with a repetitive patina gradually changing. Glass clearly wanted to contribute something lasting to songwriting, but the end result is, I fear, a little too self-conscious to be of great significance.

Theatre of Memory/Proenca, John Buller. BBC Symphony Orchestra, Mark Elder. Unicorn Kanchana DKP (C) 9045.

Now approaching his 60th year, Buller is an English composer who made his impact on English music relatively later in life — principally, in fact, with his extraordinary work Proenca, which tells the terrible story of the Albigensian Crusade. It is a tour de force which has rarely been matched in English music over the past 10 years, particularly in the persuasive hands of mezzosoprano Sarah Walker. The strong theatrical flavour also exists in the complex work Theatre of Memory recorded for the first time here, though it was written for the BBC Symphony Orchestra for its golden jubilee five years ago. Proenca was originally issued separately on LP and cassette, and the Theatre of Memory is also available on LP on its own. But Unicorn-Kanchana has generously taken advantage of the flexible tape length to put the two together, with extra financial help from the Arts Council which assisted with the recording. An important new music release.

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Breakthrough — Eddie Daniels, clarinet, with the London Philharmonic Orchestra. GRP 91024 Distribution IMS.

This is an odd release. The first side contains arrangements of classical pieces such as CPE Bach's Solfiegetto which begins as a straight arrangement for clarinet and orchestra, and then swoops into jazz with a sudden change of gear. Even though Daniels is clearly a fine clarinettist, I can only imagine that rather than appeal to both classical and jazz buffs, he will probably just irritate both.

Symphony No 1/Karelia Suite, Sibelius. Philharmonia Orchestra. Vladimir Ashkenazy, conductor. Decca 414 534-2.

Once again, coupling is allimportant. Other versions of both works exist, but putting together two of the most popular of Sibelius's orchestral scores will have its desired effect on sales. Musically, Ashkenazy marks his performance of both with an intensity and an urgency, rather than a grandiose reading. Expect a regular stock turnover.


Dealers win Bartok 'at home'

COMMENT

THERE ARE several key elements necessary in the marketing of a top 40 single — even taking it for granted that the track itself is good enough. A word of mouth buzz can get interest going, favourable press reaction helps, radio play is all important and TV exposure can be a make or break factor. Yet there is one further ingredient in the marketing mix that is vital for o record to make the right progress — the stores must have it in stock for the punters to buy it.

for the punters to buy it. This makes the latest policy decision by Our Price — to stock only singles in the top 40 — all the more frustrating for those trying to keep the top end of the chart fresh, interesting, challenging, innovative, exciting and all those other adjectives that apply to the best in British music. In fact, all the reasons why music from the UK has reached the pinnacle of respect throughout the world.

throughout the world. Persuading a retailer to stock any particular record must be difficult enough. But if that retailer's immediate respone is "Sorry, I can't take it unless if's already in the top 40", it will make a rep's job a totally thankless task. And anyone handling an unknown artist faces the great Catch 22 of the record industry — to sell in great numbers you have to make the chart, and to make the chart you have to sell in great numbers. This makes chart manipulation all the more tempting. Our Price chief Garry Nesbitt

Our Price chief Garry Nesbitt explains that he is keen not to carry excess stock and will take new releases "we believe will chart". That could place Our Price dangerously close to exercising an A&R function. Now we all like to



think we could do a better A&R job than those paid to do it just as we may feel we could pick a better England football team than Bobby Robson. However, would it be a healthy position where retailers become so powerful, they would be consulted even before a band is signed? It could happen. Garry Nesbitt could readily supply 46m reasons to suggest he

Garry Nesbitt could readily supply 46m reasons to suggest he knows how to run a successful business and the record industry needs a strong retail sector. Yet the retail sector also benefits from a strong record industry and it's difficult to see how more restrictive buying policies will promote that. It's worth remembering that

It's worth remembering that while everyone might want the new George Michael, Eurythmics or Tears For Fears records now, a few years ago they were just new names knocking on the door.
