

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

Gallup normally combines such sales automatically but, because two separate lobels are involved, both companies had to give their consent before this could go ahead. In the week before the sales were added together, Jive's re-recorded version was at 41 and London's original at 51. The com-bining meant that the single went into the Top 20. However, that has left broadcas-ters to decide which version to play and Gallup reports that there has been some confusion omong whalesalers.

in October. MMG managing director Nigel Molden says: "We've released some half dozen CD tilles on the various labels, and the time is now right to go into CD in a big way The market is much more orderly now, and has matured a lot. I believe The CD Label will fill an

important gap." Molden will be using Nimbus for pressings, and is currently negatiating with several major companies for product. His third CD release will be Hawkwind's Space Ritual Vol. 2. All titles retail of full-price. Also, MMG will be increasing its general release schedule from five

to 10 albums a month. The com-pony has signed a licensing deal with the US independent Biograph Records which gives it access to a vast catalogue of original country,

blues and nastalgia material. The Magnum Music Group has also introduced a completely re-designed set of logos for its Mog-num Force, Sundown, Blue Moon, Thunderbalt and Meteor lobels. NEW YORK: CBS is getting back into the Compact Disc manufacturing business by dedicating its Pitman, New Jersey factory to CDs exclu-sively. Production will begin in 1988, with annual production expected to reach 20m CDs by 1990.

CBS production of vinyl re-cords will be consolidated in tis Carrollton, Georgia plant. About 300 employees will be eliminated by the refitting of the New Jersey location.

LOS ANGELES: Hits Magazine is being launched the week of August 4 as a music industry trade weekly by publisher Dennis Lavinthal.

The publication will make point of dispensing with arts individualised by charts individualised by music format, listing instead the top 50 singles and albums each week in a consolidated chart. Lenny Beer is Hits editor-in-chief and David Adelson is managing editor.

NEW YORK: Convenience chain retailer Wal-Mart's coup-de-grace to its recent abandonment of numerous music publications was selective weeding of music itself.

Among the artists affected were UK metal acts Judas Priest, Ozzy Osbourne, and Black Sabbath. Comedy albums by Eddie Murphy and Richard Pryor were also re-moved from the shelves. The company declined comment but is reportedly judging both lyric content and album art (including inner sleeves).

NEW YORK: Warner Communications Inc's music/ music publishing division had record sales and profits in the first half of 1986, boosted in the second quarter by earnings of \$34.75m, up 43 per cent on the same period of 1985.

In Los Angeles MCA Inc's music division registered a slight revenue decline in the second quorter, at \$70.17m compared to \$70.27m in 1985.





reached agreement on new re-cording session fees. The general recording rate for a three-hour session rises by 3.7 per cent to £55 and listed symphony, opera and ballet orchestra rates are in-creased by three per cent.

JUNGLE RECORDS and the Cartel have merged their wholesale divisions, now both working from Rough Trade's head-quarters in Collier Street, London N1.

New moves from an old hand

by John Tobler

T IS difficult to conceive of a more relaxed individual than Dan Williams, the Texan singer/guitarist wha recently taured here to immense acclaim in support of his new Capital LP, New Maves.

Williams is part of the Discover New Country campaign, although he is somewhat ambivalent about his qualifications for inclusion, perhaps correctly feeling that the word 'new' is inappropriate in his case. "The one thing I don't want to be part of," soys Don, wearing his trademark hat even for an interview, "is a fad. I don't like to be associated with efforts to promote anything that even smacks of faddism, which is why I distanced myself from the Outlaw Country thing too. In many ways, I totally relate to Waylon (Jennings) and Willie (Nelsan), as we're from the some part of the some things, but I just don't like fads — you may grow with a fad, but you'll decline with it too".

The reason for his inclusion in the New Country campaign seems to have rather more to do with his capture by Capitol than any similarity between himself and soy Exile — in Britain, nearly all his previous LPs were released via MCA or the company MCA obsorbed, ABC, and Williams sees the move as positive in terms of his career because the EMI organisation has more clout in those territories where he has enjoyed most success than had previous labels.

than had previous labels. "Per capita, my success olmost from the very start has been far greater everywhere else than the States, although in some respects the States is catching up. It's bizarre that it should be so, and I don't really understand it, but I don't care particularly — it's kind of ironic".

Don Vrilliams is very definitely a substantial artist, about whom the term 'country' should not evoke images of stetsons and six guns worn by chartered accountants (although they're welcome too). His band includes such notables as veteran sax/flute player Jim Horn of Duane Eddy fome, mercurial guitarist/harmonica player Danny Flowers, whose composition, 'Tulsa Time', was a big hit for Eric Clapton, himself a devaut Williams admirer, and others less famaus, but equally musically erudite.

Amang the crowd leaving Hammersmith Odean with smiles an their faces were several hardline rock fans, who perhaps see Dan as a accurate view in songs like That's The Thing About Love, while the more mature were captivated by older classics like I Recall A Gypsy Waman and You're My Best Friend. It seems that finally prejudices are being rejected as inaccurate — Don Williams is an entertainer with rock roots as well as a country flavour, and before long, his audience won't be all wimas!

Willioms seems to be made of sterner stuff than many of his compatriots — he didn't sense the risk from either terrorists or Chernobyl, but defends those who cancelled tours by noting "people here find it difficult to understand, but in America, terrorism is a new concept, apart fram assassinations, which aren't directed at the general public like terrorism is. The media has also played it up too much and if's frightened a lot of people". Don even brought his wife of

Don even brought his wife of many years to Britain, so he's not freaked out, just as he wasn't on previous visit which included an emotional and unforgettable concert in Belfast.

Although it's a major part of his life, music isn't everything for Dan — he also works on improving the aerodynamics of go-karts and is about to embark on learning how to fly a helicopter, as well as being a devoted family man. However, he did not take part in any of the 'Aid' concerts last year. "It's difficult to explain how I feel about those things — they sound attractive to the general public, but I prefer to have some control over what happens to the money tho's raised. The only way I'm prepared to get involved is to make a stotement that the organisers are honest ond will do everything they say they'll do, but I have o hard time doing that. So many of these things seem like another reason for TV exposure — have people stopped dying because of We Are The World? If they were talking about financing a huge reservoir or an educational programme, I think I could get more into something like that". Unlike so many in the public eye, Don Williams thinks before he acts

Unlike so many in the public eye, Don Williams thinks before he acts — the same applies to his recorded output, which therefore hos a far longer life than that of olmost anyone else.



Granted, not the first rock gig in the beautiful city beside The Donube, but by far the biggest with tickets for the vast stadium (last Western performer Louis Armstrong in '64) oversubscribed by 250,000 and people travelling from as for afield as Poland.

Negotiations for the concert began last year when local promoter Laszlo Hegedus of The Multimedia Organisation opproached Queen's manager Jim Beach. After groundbreoking tours in Central and South America, Beach had previously had his eye on ploying China, but had pulled out after permission had been granted when Wham! pipped him to the post.

him to the post. Now, though, his and Queen's — and probably many others' — sights are on the Eastern Bloc. Naturally music-loving, the people of the socialist countries are nearer than ever to having their thirst for Western pop ossuaged when the various state record companies are de-nationalised as seems likely any day now. And the definitely-capitalist promoters are eager to negotiate.

At present, most major Western releases are available in Hungary either pressed under license to Hungarotan or as imports. At 300 forints a time (less for classical) they're not cheap (the average wage is 5,000 or around £75 a month), but records — classical jazz, folk, pop, sell. ture is often a dirty word records sell right across the board, with young and old apparently united in their interest. A quick survey of the audience for Queen showed everyone from teenagers, to middle-aged intellectuals, families — the lot. With tickets selling out in 24

With tickets selling out in 24 hours and black market prices rocketing as the big day approached (it was hord to get a sensible estimate of prices the legitimate volue being 150-240 forints, around £2.30-£3.60), Beach was naturally disoppointed at not being able to get another date at the stadium.

The fact was that at the tail end of a 28-date tour, he had little room to manoeuvre and the stadium had been booked for a motorcycle rally the day before for some months. The important thing is that Queen played well, impressed, and conquered. But while this was a big state event attended by the president himself, plus the British Chargé D'Affaires David Colvin, who threw a party at the Embassy in the group's honour on their first evening in the country, the authorities did harbour worries about the effect of the music on their people who undoubtedly suffer curtailment of civil liberties with travel severely restricted, homosexuality illegal and sexism and racism as prevalent as onywhere.

As one embassy official noted, "The Government had some doubts because of the group's position as symbols of freedom. This sort of thing is the only place kids can let go here, so the concert has been very eagerly awaited in Budapest. Radicals can go so far here, but they have to be very careful."

And while Queen ploying It's A Kind Of Magic would hardly be seen as radical at home, in Budapest, where the group's records are stacked side by side with Herman's Hermits, Led Zepplin and even the Sex Pistols' Never Mind The Bollocks — though with the offending word carefully obscured — things are different.

There are plans, however, to get the show to those who didn't make it to the stadium and it has been filmed to be released theatrically round the Eastern Bloc and possibly even the West before Christmas.

As with the tour itself (which used 60 road crew, 15 trucks and 6,000 square foot carpeted stage), the logistics of the film, directed by Jano Zsombolyai and produced by George Mihaly, are impressive. Mihaly: "This is a great challenge to us. The organisers nearly went mad when we asked for 160 stage passes though." The team — which spanned three generations of the noteworthy Hungarian film industry, ages ranging from 23 to 71 — used 17 35mm cameras. As Mihaly notes, if it hadn't been a weekend, and most film makers had not been using their equipment, some might well have found their cameras being "requisitioned" for the event.

Hot air balloons were to have joined helicopters in stodium for aeriol shots, but, in the event, wind prevented their use. Still, Beach and Miholy were delighted with both sets of results from musicions ond photographers. "We should get a whole new

"We should get a whole new perspective from the Hungarian cinema — of which I'm a great fan — and it should be unusual too. There was one team just filming things like shadows," says Beach.

And what he should get is a well-made cheap film of an ex-

traordinary spectacle which is likely to step up the opening up of the East to Western music.

of the East to Western music. Alongside music, the video industry, likewise, is also slowly beginning to gather pace. According to Mihaly, the Hungarian Government is only just starting to pick up on the cultural importance of video and recently reduced the import tax on VHS recarders. As things now stand, videos can be made on a shoestring in Hungary. "Promo vids which are mode here oren't of the same richness of Western ones, nor is the market os big, but there are about 100,000 tape machines out of a population of around 10m people," says Mihaly.

Diplomats on either side for once seem to be prepared to let political differences at least appear to take o back seat. As one UK Embassy officiol noted — and onyone wolking down the main shopping streets in Budopest past streams of buskers, more and more record stores and even the odd splash of Clash grafitti cannot fail to register either — is thot music and music video are among our major ombassadorial assets behind the Iron Curtain.

Gabriel plans **UK** video tour

PETER GABRIEL is one of the UK's PELEK GABRIEL is one of the UK's consistently inventive and most un-likely stars. Currently riding the charts with the Sledgehammer single, Gabriel has now set up a company to develop long-form videos and plans a ground-breaking nationwide video tour part wate next year.

"I'm working with a number of visual artists to produce a series of 20-90minute videos, hoping to ex-periment and stretch the medium a bit", he says. "Video is still tied to advertising and promoting records, but it could do a great deal more then that" than that."

For the video tour Gabriel plans to use a combination of big-screens and banks of smaller video feducing many of the video and film techniques he is currently working on. "The possibilities are working on. "The possibilities are enormous, but so are the costs, I'm currently trying to persuade a ma-jor video manufacturer to sponsar the tour as what I want to do is very

expensive." Gabriel's next Virgin single, Don't Give Up, highlights the same approach as Sledgehammer: "Instead of finishing the music and then going to the video people, you collaborate with visual artists from the word go," says Gabriel. "Giving yau the opportunity to view your music from a different perspective.

Unlike the high-pressure, grab-it-while-yau-can vinyl outpourings of some of the country's chart stars, there's a refreshing timespan between Gabriel records which is re-flected in the quality of his work:

'You can't get ideas and inspiration from being part of the rock 'n' roll machinery'

"The album/taur, album/taur circus hallaws yau out," he says. "I prefer to travel and experience things befare trying to record anything and it's travelling through places like Brazil and Senegal that develaped my interest in nan-Western music."

However, at the finols it was unexpectedly announced that these initial heats were to be re-run, ostensibly to use (without any fonfore stift) sponsered by Numark) QUITE BLATANT political ostensibly to use (without any fonfore os still sponsored by Numark) Technics decks, but also to

ostill sponsored by Numark) Technics decks, but also to accommodate aspiring scratcher **Tary G.** This threw the previous heaf's winners, who were unprepared for o rematch, and Chod Jackson fell to Jazzy Jeff. So, os it transpired, did everyone — and not without reason. On a distinguished panel of stor judges (Grandmaster Flash, Mantronik, etc), Philodephia DJ/ rapper Lady B actually admitted she manages Jazzy Jeff. All the rest of the judges seemed unwilling to upset anyone and gove most campetitors the same marks, leaving the way for Lady B to award a full 10 every time to her bay and considerably less to whoever he was up against. Unsurpringly, Jazzy Jeff wan, the fort that he probably deserved to being clouded by the way in which he did so. Further politicising was only too evident during the ropping contest, when, amid heartfelt booing from the audience, the judges decided against the brilliant extemponised raps of newcomer Robsert 5 in forvaur of their dull peer **T LA Rock**, who was then beaten by Grandmaster Kaz. A bad taste was left after all this, and the results of future Seminar competitions will never be given the respect they ought to deserve. Myway, on to the new releases in what little room that's left. On import LP ore **Gwen Guthrie's** Good To Go Lover (Playdor 829-532-17-1), eagerly awaited with several more club hits likely; Kenny G's Duotones





Ovation attracts mid-price market

OVATION, THE new mid-price reissue series of digital or digitally-remastered recordings which is being launched by Decca this month, is being regarded by the compony as the most important re-release series since the introduc-tion of Jubilee nearly 10 years

considerable lifespan at the mid-price level, though we do expect to sell more cossettes than LPs to the ratio of about 55 per cent to 45 per cent," said Andrew Dolton, Decca's classical marketing manager.

In a sense, the series follows in the footsteps of Deutsche Gram-mophon's Galleria releose, both in The corporate design making each Ovation cover extremely distinc-tive, and in a cheap "taster" for the

whole series. The 25 titles in the first release The 25 titles in the first release comprise popular works ranging from Tchaikovsky's Piano Concer-tos Nos 1 And 2 played by Ashke-nazy (417 265) and Rodrigo's Guitar Concerto coupled with two other works played by Bonell and the Montreal Symphony Orchestra (417 272) to Tchaikovsky's 1812 and other works played by the Detroit Symphony Orchestra con-ducted by Doroti (417 277). Many of the recordings are by Decca's top exclusive ortists, in-

cluding Solti and Pavarotti. The corporate design features a

"pixilation" theme: each of the col-our pictures of the performer, in-strument, or imaginative design, has been reset in coloured compu-

ter squares — pixels — familior to computer graphics. Playing time has been regarded as a prime attraction, as well as some unusual couplings. Of the 25 some unusual couplings. Of the 25 recordings, 11 are considerably longer than one haur, with the longest running aver 71 minutes. This is Halst's The Planets, con-ducted by Solti, which has been coupled, strikingly, with Jahn Wil-liams's Star Wars Suite (417 268), conducted by Mehta. Other long records include Stro-vinsty's Le Socre Du Printemas and

Viner lang records include Stro-vinsky's Le Socre Du Printemps and Petruskha conducted by Daroti (417 281), and Tchaikovsky's Bal-let Suites, Swon Lake, Nutcracker and Sleeping Beauty (417 274) conducted by Karajan.

Ovotion was not, said Mr Dalton, seen as a preparation for a mid-price CD series, but it was benefiting from digital technology. All the recordings were either digital or late analogue recordings which or tote anoiague recordings which had been through Decco's ADRM process, providing a mid-price series with better saund quality than ever on conventional formots — incidentally, the tape used is chrome dioxide.

The series has a dealer price of £2.44, but has a special dealer price of £2.12 for the opening months of the Ovation lounch. What's more, the last of the 25 titles has a special dealer price of 20a, but will actual the dealer. 99p, which will enable the dealers, if they wont, to use it in specific Ovotion promotions — or simply

Instead, it is o releose in its own right, a com-pilation of shorter classical pieces such as the Overture from Strouss' Der Fledermaus, Offenbach's Der Fledermaus, Offenbach's Bocarolle, Greensleeves, Thois' Meditotion and The Rituol Fire Dance (417 455). It will, eventual-ly, revert to normal Ovation dealer price

The launch is being supported with a double-page spread in The Gromophone, national press advertising, including The Guardian.

Dealers will have the opportunity of special counter bins for records and tapes, full colour leaflets, posters and showcards

Tate chooses remarkable repertoire

JEFFREY TATE, the principal con-ductor of the English Chamber Orchestro, has chosen unusual reperfore for his latest recording with EMI — the little-known arrangment for string orchestra Mahler made of Schubert's Death and the Maiden Quartet.

The release opens with the song Death And The Maiden which Schubert used in the first movement of the Quartet, sung by the English soprano Ann Murray accompo-nied by Jeffrey Tate on the piono, and then continues with the Mahler

It will undoubtedly provoke widespreod interest, and has been made the Record of the Month by EMI. It is hoped that o CD will be released later this year. The orrongement was made by

Mohler who believed that Schubert's D minor Quartet "offered an unfulled sonority that Mohler could only be ochieved by orrong-ing the works for orchestra." The most unexpected ospect of the arrongement was that Mohler added a double bass line to the work.


THE BANKRUPTCY of Axel Mehr-le, the founder of the West Ger-man classical record company Orfeo, has not offected the supply ond distribution of the existing Orfeo cotalogue, said Scott Butler, general manager of Harmonia Mundi UK Ltd.

Although no more recordings ore currently being made, the 100 titles mode over the past five years are still available, and the stock of

Orfeo CDs is cantinuing to be re-plenished, he added. Like all lobels, Orfeo hos suf-fered from o shortage of CD sup-plies, but stocks are now ovailable of its leading sellers, including the Weber Symphonies with Sawal-lisch (CO 91841), Brohms' Clarinet Sonatas played by Korl Leister (CO 88842) and Bruckner's Symphony No 6, conducted by Sowallisch (CO 24821).

August sees the release of four new vocal recitals on CD, featuring Anna Tomowa-Sintow, Brigitte Fossbaender, Lucia Alberti and Grace Bumbry. In oddition, Har-monia Mundi is re-stocking the five-LP set of the Salzburg Festival recordings of Dietrich Fischer-Dieskau and Gerald Moore which received a good review on Rodio 3 in July, ond hos hos been the subject of much interest since.

Some 100 recordings remain "in the con" awoiting release, so there is still a future in the record label while the compony is re-establishing itself, since it was taken over by four independent direc-fors. While there is still some uncertointy concerning past and current commitments, Butler soid he re-mained optimistic for the label, and, at the moment, it was business as usual.

"We believe that the LP still has a considerable lifespan at the mid-price level, though we do expect to sell more cassettes than LPs to the ratia of about 55 per cent to 45 per cent," said Andrew Dalton, De-

cco's classical marketing manager. In a sense, the series follows in the footsteps of Deutsche Grammophon's Galleria release, both in the corporate design making each Ovation cover extremely distinc-tive, and in a cheap "taster" for the whole series.

The 25 titles in the first release comprise popular works ranging from Tchaikovsky's Piano Concer-los Nos 1 And 2 played by Ashke nazy (417 265) and Rodrigo's Guilar Concerto caupled with wo Guitar Concerto coupled with two other works played by Bonell and the Montreol Symphony Orchestra (417 272) to Tchaikovsky's 1812 and other works played by the Detroil Symphony Orchestra con-ducted by Doroti (417 277).

Many of the recordings are by Decco's top exclusive artists, in-



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Other Tang records include Stra-vinsky's Le Sacre Du Printemps and Petruskho conducted by Doroti (417 281), and Tchaikavsky's Bal-let Suites, Swan Lake, Nutcracker and Sleeping Beauty (417 274) conducted by Karajan. Ovation was not, soid Mr Dal-ton usen as a prenartificing for a

Ovation was not, sold Mr Dai-ton, seen as a preparation for a mid-price CD series, but it was be-nefiting from digital technology. All the recordings were either digital or late analogue recordings which had been through Decca's ADRM paraeter acouding a mid-price process, providing a mid-price series with better sound quality than ever on conventional formats

than ever on canventional formats — incidentally, the tape used is chrome dioxide. The series has a dealer price of £2.44, but has a special dealer price of £2.12 for the opening months of the Ovation launch. What's more, the last of the 25 titles has a special dealer price of 99p, which will enable the dealers if they want to use it in specific if they want, to use it in specific Ovation promotions - or simply

sell it very cheaply. This is not, as in the Galleria launch when a similar marketing device was used, strictly a sampler of the Ovations series. Instead, it is a release in its own right, a compilotion of shorter classical pieces such as the Overture from Strauss' Der Fledermaus, Offenbach's Bacarolle, Greensleeves, Thais' Meditation and The Ritual Fire Dance (417 455). It will, eventual-ly, revert to normal Ovation dealer price

The launch is being supported with a double-page spread in The Gramophone, national press advertising, including The Guardian.

Dealers will have the appar-tunity of special counter bins for records and tapes, full colour leaf-lets, pasters and showcards.

Tate chooses remarkable repertoire



FACED WITH the problem of promoting The Smiths in the US when the group are violently opposed to promotional videos, Rough Trade has hit upon a scheme which appears to be keep ing everyone happy. Knowing that Marrissey & Co are admirers of Derek Jarman's work (Jarman made Jubilee and so forth), the label approached Jarman with the suggestion that he prepare a 15

minute conceptual video featuring three songs — The Queen Is Dead, There Is A Light That Never Goes Out (a Smiths single released in the US) and Panic.

The Smiths gave their approval to this approach, but do not appear in the video, which is to be shown as a supporting feature to the somewhat controversial Sid And Nancy movie when the latter goes on general release soon.

HILE MANY music video majors still struggle to make it to fourfigure sales, up in Nottingham the savagely independent Doublevision can do it five times over with bands who record-wise seldom see the outside of the indie chart.

The most successful of these have been Cabaret Valtaire, an apprapriate circumstance really, since they — Stephen Mallinder since they — Stephen Mallinder and Richard H Kırk — actually run Daublevisian along with Paul Badden-Smith.

But haw daes a small campany with na marketing, pramation and scarcely any staff manage ta shift more than 5,000 copies of its very first release, Doublevision Presents Cabaret Voltaire, while the might a Virgin can anly do around 2,000 af the band's (technically superior) fallow up, Gasaline In Your Eye?

Badden-Smith: "I think this is where independent video can be far mare valuable than indepen-dent records. We are far better equipped to sell this kind of stuff than the majors, because they miss the grassroats level by such a margin.

"With Daublevision people can ring up and actually buy the videas from sameone in the company, and I think that's important in this kind of area. With the exception of world dominatars like Dire Straits, mast videas sell anly a couple of must videas sell anly a couple of thousand, and if you can do that independently then you're making a far greater impression an the market."

market." Sa the credibility factor laoms large here, but efficiency's still an impartant cansideration. And with Bodden-Smith spending a lat af time on the recard side of Doublevisian, a link with the like-minds at Manchester's Ikan videa label has made a lot af sense.

The two companies have been warking together for about three or faur manths naw, sharing dis-tributian and manufacturing and using their cambined strength to present a mare fully-rounded and attractive package to dealers. The immediate result has been an im-provement in sales. And links with other indie video autlets are not naw aut of the question.

Far Badden-Smith being young and picking up a Super-8 in prefer-ence to a guitar is in 1986 a far more punk thing ta do. "All you need is two machines and you're in business. You can put things out



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

WE HAVE read that new Codes of Practice recommend that businesses should monitor the sex and ethnic profile of their employees. Surely this would not require a small record shop like ours to make records of the sex or race of our handful of staff?

The respective Codes of the Commission for Racial Equality and of the Equal Opportunities Commission do indeed recommend that businesses should carefully exomine the ethnic ond sex moke-up of their warkforce. The purpose: to get an indication as to whether or not people really are being given equal opportunities, irrespective of ethnic origin, sex or marital status. But both Cades emphasise that the nature, type and extent of monitoring must depend upon the business itself.

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


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


HAVING RECEIVED a verbal clip round the ear from PPL chairman John Brooks (Dooley August 2) about his New Music Seminar prediction that video clip TV rates will rise, Phonogram managing director David Simone responds to the effect that he campletely understands the situation, and was in fact one of the prime movers in the campaign to ensure that both the record companies' and the artists' rights are fully protected to the extent that use of their product in the media is properly renumerated. He was the only BPI council member on the seminor panel in question, and indie labels soid they were insufficiently informed of BPI plans before the video ban. Simone adds that he made it clear that if "our music or videas are used in any form of transmission, we must be paid for it. If the sums of more yeem small naw, in the long term they may end up amounting to a major portion of our earned income".... Britain's anti-litter supremo Richard Branson is also entering the porridge business, it seems. He's signed Inside Out, a heavy metal band which is comprised of three guests of Her Majesty and three of their custodians at Wormwood Scrubs. They're doing their recording inside with the aid of a mobile studio, and, as one of the warder musicians comments, won't be able to appear on Top Of The Paps because only half the band could turn up. The three captive members are all convicted murderers.

AS THE Irish punt is devalued again, there seems to be a race on to be first to open a record store in the Irish Republic between HMV and Virgin. The latter company announced its Emerald Isle plans twa months aga, but HMV's Ian Duffell insists that "We'll be open first"... Twa distinguished refugees from major recard companies, Peter Jamieson and Clive Swan, met by coincidence in the MW offices last week. Both said to the other: "Dan't tell anybody you saw me here." Swan's right on course for someane who said six months ago that he would love to be considered as a serious rival to Record Merchandisers. Beating RM to the Baots contract (story on P1) must qualify as serious rivalry. Jamieson has future plans well in hand, we suspect, but is still at the "No comment' stage... Reg Hagg is retiring after 48 years of rack 'n' rall — 33 at EMI and 15 at Palydor... Empire Music managing director Bab Grace and concert promoter Andrew Miller held a joint 40th birthday celebration at Fulham Tawn Hall... Now TVS has bought the Midem organiation, will it be patriatic and transfer the annual extravaganza from Cannes to Southampton? The Martinez bar and its elastic opening hours would have to be transferred too, of course... Warner Bros Music MD Peter Reichardt celebrates 10 years with the company ... Radio Two's Bill Bebb to be the new head of radio for the British Forces Broadcasting Service.

Gordon Mills

GORDON MILLS who helped guide Tom Jones, Engelbert Humperdinck and Gilbert O'Sullivan to international success died in Los Angeles last week aged 51, after a short illness.

South Wales-born Mills was a bus conductor before joining The Viscounts who achieved moderate chart success. He turned his attention to songwriting, penning ['II Never Get Over You for Johnny Kidd and The Pirates, and then in 1964 discovered Tommy Scott who he moulded into Tom Jones. Mills co-penned Jones' first number one hit, If's Not Unusual.

Similarly he helped transform Gerry Dorsey into Engelbert Humperdinck, and was later responsible for launching Gilbert O'Sulivan on the road ta success.

Mills, who founded the MAM empire, had lived in California for the last 10 years but returned to the UK for Tom Jones' last tour two years ago.

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COMMENT

Happily and fortunately during the "summer of 86" I find myself with the time (ample) and the broad abjectivity (hopefully) to fill in for David Dalton who is taking a well earned break for the first time since assuming the editor's chair and intraducing this often excellent personal weekly commentary. In the competitive market place we have had little more than the fairly predictable pot-pauri of corporate reshuffles, smaller label crises and chart orguments, although the confrontations in the retail sector between some majors and multiples have yet to be resalved and could make bigger headlines yet. No, in an industry traditionally

No, in an industry traditionally dominated by rampant self interest, surprisingly and pleasingly the significant headlines in the summer of '86 are being made in the cammon interest areas.

MCPS has emerged in a self generated spotlight as if ta illustrate the definitive awakening af a 'sleeping giant' (points are no langer given for recognising Bob Montgomery at industry functions). PPL, that much misunderstood

PPL, that much misunderstood and maligned protector of recorded music copyrights has acquired a new Chairman, John Braoks, who hit the front page and Dooley in consecutive weeks. More significantly he appears to have established common graund in some of the video clip stalemates with broadcasters.



chairman has made all the right pronouncements. His speech at the USA New Music Seminar carrectly lambasted the absurb distinctians between independents and corporations where music mokers large and small are ill served by unnecessary categorisations. However, his simple plea for unity on the broadest possible industry front was the best headline and absolutely the right message for the summer af '86.

It is a good moment for rights owners to acquire a new unity af purpase. Technological improvement continues to outpace copyright and other protective legislation, and the growing quality and proliferation of media opportunity can ensure ropid saturation of musical warks before the public sometimes even have time to reach for the pennies in their packet

their pocket. Whilst the main thrust of every activity must be to create innovative music backed by skilful marketing, it becomes increasingly difficult to adequately reward those achievements. The industry should heed and unite behind Rab, John, Bob and other heads of associations who give af their time to ensure a better future for us all.




