

## De Burgh on right channel

CHRIS DE Burgh's marathon Euro-pean tour, which kicks off in Corn-wall next week (11), is being spansored by ITT Digivision in a tie-up which will cast the ITT campany more than £300,000.

IT will be using the chart top-per's tour as a platform to promote

Digivision, the brand name for a collection of digital televisian sets, and is the latest company to splash out a huge sum to put its message across via music spansorship.

Andy Etherington, marketing manager for ITT Consumer Pro-ducts (UK), says the company decided to spansor the taur after looking at alternative ways of advertising: "Music sponsorship seemed apprapriate for us be-cause of the types of product we manufacture," he explains. "Our problem was finding an artist who appealed to a lot of people from all age ranges and broke across all

all age ranges and broke across all geagraphical boundaries. We believe we have found exactly the right person in Chris De Burgh." Etherington adds that De Burgh had initially to be assured that the ITT name was one he wanted to be associated with. "He is very hoppy with us," he says, "and we believe this transcription will be mutally bethis sponsorship will be mutally beneficial to both parties. By sponsoring the tour we are underwriting some of his risk, giving him the peace of mind to concentrate on the music. Our promotion will be done in a dignified way because we want to preserve De Burgh's integrity.

NEW YORK: Prospective purchasers of RCA Records are emerging far and wide with bids directed to the RCA Corparotion's new parent, General Electric, writes Brian Chin.

Music publisher Oliver Berliner, grandson of Emile Berliner, the in-

grandson of Emile Berliner, the inventor of the recorded disc and founder of the Victor Talking Machine Co, has made a \$400m offer to take over the label.

Other possible suitors, according to various reports, include Coca-Cola, the Walt Disney Co, RCAV Ariola president Elliot Galdman, and Arista Records president Clive Davis, with 20th Century Fox chairman Alan Hirschfield.

# Night owl viewers switch on to singles

ALL NIGHT video music has received the thumbs up. Record shops in the Yorkshire Television catchment area are reparting a definite increase in singles sales as a result of the 24-hour broadcast-

ing experiment.
The TV con

The TV company has been screening Music Box — the cable music video programme — between the hours of michight and 6am when screens would normally be blank. The experiment, which will last for three months, began on August 8 and figures just revealed show that for the first three days of broadcasting nearly 1m Yorkshire TV viewers tuned in at midnight to watch Music Box.
Yorkshire TV spakeswoman

Yorkshire TV spakeswoman Shanti Bhatia says: "We ore de-lighted with the response. Of course it is still early days yet, but we reach 6m viewers in the area and to get 1m tuning in for Music Box certainly bodes well for the

A further breakdown of the viewing figures shows that on average 1/2m viewers watched between midnight ond 3am with peak figures for the 3am to 6am period at 120,000 viewers.

Record shops in the area are delighted with the spin-off results for their businesses. Gary Clutterbrook, assistant manager of Syd-ney Scarborough, Hull, says: "We have had customers coming in osking for singles they saw on Music Box. I think Yorkshire TV has hit on a great idea — in most coses it is the video that sells the record, which is good news for us."

Stephen Bullock, manager of asa Disco, Barnsley, adds: "When Casa Disco, Barnsley, adds: "When the public watch these promo

videos it revives their interest in the singles. Customers are definitely Music Box — a good example is the Lionel Richie single which we have had a rush on because it is shown on TV." for records featured on

Steve Hunt, spokesman for W H Smith's branches in the Yorkshire area, says: "We have noticed an increase in sales which without doubt can be attributed to Music Box. It is not a huge increase, but it is noticeable and we would be delighted if Yorkshire TV decide to make this experiment permanent."



# Lindisfarne concert scheme RCA/Ariola seeks out the lost LP buyer

IN A bold bid to bring lost regular album buyers back into record stares, music industry consultant Barry McKoy has fied up a deal which will offer vouchers for free hotel accommodation. The deal brings together the resources of Priority Records, RCA/Ariola and Lindistame.

The scheme centres on Lindisfame's forthcoming 46-date UK Christmas tour which is expected to have a total audience capacity of 86,000. Everyone buying tickets will receive an offer inviting them ta visit any record store and pick up a Dance Your Life Away voucher. The voucher holders will then be able to exchange them on the night they attend the Lindis-farne show for a three-day free hotel accammadation visa for twa

The vouchers will also be in-The vouchers will also be included with Lindisfarne's latest product, the single Shine On, plus the album Dance Your Life Away distributed by RCA/Ariala, and the promotian will run thraugh to the end of the year. A £100,000 ILR campaign will promote the scheme, and there will also be national press advertising and a poster campaign around all 46 tour venues.

McKoy says: "Lindisfame share a similar problem to that of most UK record companies in that the market is very soft at the moment. The mid-Seventies album buyers are not visiting stores regularly, so we intend to motivate every one of Lindisfarne's live oudience to go

and visit a record store.
"I'm sure many af them will end making a purchase, and obviously hope they will also make a Lindisfame product purchase, although the offer is not conditional on a record purchase, and the distribution of vouchers is not res-tricted to Lindisfarne products."



# Get on the Dwight track

HILE THE pramaters of the Discover New Country campaign Country campaign
have certainly
achieved promising results thus far,
had they been able ta utilise the
single-mindedness of Dwight
Yookam at the start of the campaign things may have been quite different.

Rather than relying on the same-what bland/cabaret music of the Oakridge Bays and Exile, ar the rather uninteresting autput of Sawyer Brown ar Alabama, their task of persuading Britain that there is a new breed of country music would have been far mare convincing. As Yaakam maintains: "By the early Sixties, the Noshville saund had crassed the fine line which pravides integrity of farm musically, and indulged in a bastardisation of that form."

Yaakam's whale being is directed towards returning to the Rather than relying on the same-

directed towards returning to the spirit which existed before the Nashville sound became a pap/
MOR hybrid with toa little excitement and taa much gloss. The
Dwight Yoakam recipe far integrity
involves three elements:

First, the sang type, which must "Irrst, the sang type, which must be traditional country in the way it orticulates emotion, and talks about the type of peaple and the setting they're in. Country sangs are not necessarily story sangs, they're nat operos. They're possibly scenarios, and that's where cauntry music got in trouble in the Sixties.

"I'm not knacking Tam T Hall, far instance, but what he writes oren't classical country songs — listen to the Louvin Brothers and you'll hear o reol country song.

"The secand element invalved is

"The secand element invalved is arrangement, which means instrumentation — that's twin fiddles instead of orchestral string sections, and two and three-part hillbilly harmonies instead of choral groups oo-ing and ah-ing.

"The third thing is performance — Jahnny Harton stayed saunding country, Ray Price didn't. He sounded smaath and slick like Tony Bennett, which he has every right to da, but I take exception to him still calling it country music because still calling it country music because he daesn't want to lase his audi-

The 29-year-old Yoakam, who is never seen without his cawbay hat (shades of Dan Williams) is almost alarmingly articulate for one who has only released a debut album nas only released a debut album and is visiting Europe for the first time, althaugh a measure of just haw braad his appeal has already became is that MW was preceded by The Times and fallawed by Recard Mirror. When politely warned that Ricital would turn it has been as that Britain would turn its back on those who make a big impact and then follow the big bucks rather than returning here (eg Tom Petty), Yaakam avers that he wants to return here at least once a year.

Yoakam has already made a niche far himself in histary — his Guitars, Cadillacs Etc., Etc. album has been in the US LP chart far nearly five months and tapped a quarter of a million sales, which is and a paged a page a paged with the gaad going, particularly as the album was not the work of same

album was not the work of same trendy hatshot praducer, but of his lead guitarist Peter Andersan.

Weren't you quite fortunate to be able to take contral of your first record? "I was fartunate in that I stomped my feet and threw things around the raam, telling them I wouldn't do it unless I did it my way. I sincerely meant it, and I'd have done it with IRS Records or Slash Records in LA if I'd had to, which would have aliented me which would have alienated me from country radia in America, so I was thrilled when Warner/Reprise

agreed to let me da it."

# Criminal released in UK

by Barry Lazell

FIRST PRODUCT from the US label Criminal Records, recently launched in New York by the legendary dance producer Arthur Baker, is now available in the UK on Club. In archetypal Baker style, the record is a huge underground club and street hit in the Big Apple, having instantly sold 25,000 having instantly sold 25,000 copies within the metropolis before the US national chorts had even got around to spotting it!

The disc in question is Jump Bock, by Wolly Jump Junior & The Criminal Element (JABX 35 on UK 12-inch), ostensibly on answer re-cord to the recent Dhor Braxton success, but a harder and much more "garage" production which will almost certainly have still more street/club oppeal than the Brox-

ton midi-hit

The UK 12-inch features a Baker-Shep Pettibone mix of Jump Back on the A-side, olong with a "lo lo reggae rap" version. The flipside, meanwhile, is unique this country, and comprises a Jeff Young combination edit of the US chant/jazz and dub mixes, now knawn os the "name that tune jazz dub edition" because it flicks snippets of other hot records in and out of the mix too. This could well be the side which moves the recard to club buyers if DJs pick up on it as they are likely to, so dealers ought to be aware of its presence. Nu Shaoz, Colonel Abrams, Whistle and (appropriately) Dhar Braxton tontalisingly in there, amongst others.

Bigger news right now though is the eagerly onlicipated new double LP, Maze featuring Frankie Beverly's Live In Los Angeles (Capitol SWBB-12479), although it's predictable and its three new studies techniques. studio tracks are not that fantastic. Also on import LP are

Domestic UK 12-inchers include the ofarementioned Phyllis Hyman's You Know How To Love Me (Aristo ARIST 12669), o still potent (ond unremixed) glorious swinger from 1979 kicking off o new from 1979 Ricking off o new Arista Masters reissue series; Howord Heweth's I'm For Real (Elektro EKR 47T), possibly, for crossover purposes, over subtle soul swoyer by Shalamar's now solo old leader; TC Curtis's Slave Of Love (Hot Melt 12TC007), remorselessly tense lurching jitterer; LA Dream Team's Nurser Rymes (MCA Records MCAT 1074), amusingly updated nursery amusingly updated nursery rhyme rapper which deserves wider attention than it had on import; Breakwater's Say You Love Me Girl (Aristo ARIST Love Me Girl (Ansto AKIS) 12674), somewhat Earth Wind & Fire-ish revival from 1980; Sam L Dees' Survive (Move MS 11, via Chorly), MS 11, via Chortyl, almospheric swoying piano instrumental by o guy revered far his deep soul singing; Dorothy Galdez's Never Too Late (A&M AMY 339), Billie Jean-ish loper much tighter in its panting 'PG Rated' mix; Eastbound Expressway's Knock Mc Sepseless (Passing) Knock Me Senseless (Possion PASH 1261), girls-sung but otherwise blatont revival of the Gibson Brothers' old Cuba sound, possibly good for parties; MC Boob aka Steady sound, possibly good of parties; MC Boob aka Steady 'B"s Bring The Beat Back (Streetwave MKHAN 75), stark hip hop; Barbara Roy's Gotta See You Tonight (RCA PT49804), dated discorombler; The Temptations' Lady Soul (Motown ZT 40850), Ben E King-ish early 'Sixtiesstyle stately swayer.

Speaking of which era, a couple more UK LPs worth investigating are both compilations. Jazz For Absolute Beginners (RCA NL 89874), is a sensible collection of late 'Fifties/early 'Sixties jazz classics aimed at the Absalute Beginners movie-inspired Beginners movie-inspired market, and coincidentally reminds me of the first jazz album that I myself bought then, in 1961, a Downbeat Poll Winners compilation. Harlem Shuffle/Sixties Soul Classics (Charly R&B CRB 1139) also contains many quintessential gems from that time. Worth drawing to people's attention.

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
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

## The way was we

DRIGINALLY LAUNCHED by Britain's critical music press into the cult figure vacuum with his band Was Not Was, Don Was subsequently achieved hip dance-floor status via praduction credits with a surprisingly varied list af artists. Now Detroit's Don Was is back, putting recent LIS contracted. Now Detroit's Don Was is back, putting recent US contractual problems behind him, with a return to form on the release of a new single: Robot Girl in September, followed by an album and UK tour in January next year.

"Problems with our previous label Z Records who sold our contract to Geffen Records after losing their distribution deal with kland

their distribution deal with Island Records meant we couldn't put out records far eighteen months," says the now-relaxed Was. "Although our last LP came out on Geffen, it toak a long time to buy our way aut of the contract."

While lawyers argued, Was turned to producing, using mem-bers of the Was Nat Was band to record with other artists. "People thought I was being reclusive, but it was the only way to keep the whale thing tagether until we could

sign a new deal," says Don.

The much saught-after Was could quite easily have spent the rest of his career producing other artists, but he is a man with a mission — to write and record his own music in his own way. "Right from the start I knew what I wanted to do and how it should sound," says Dan, "Sa I did session work and played the US club circuit five nights a week rather than be forced to compromise my own music so early an."

Was Not Was started with Don

phoning the members of his embryonic band with a desperate plea: Help me make music or I'll be forced to rob the dry cleaners.' "I'd planned it down to the last detail," says Don. "I was so broke at the

time."
"But I knew the band and music were right and that my approach would work, then came the problems with the label."
The necessity of sitting in a producer's chair for artists such as Floy Joy, Helen Terry, P P Arnold and Carly Simon while his own work and on virtual hold has given vas put on virtual hold, has given Was music a new-found sophistica-tion both in sound and method. "Although technically, the new single and album will be the best we've ever made, I can't help feeling you produce your best work of a kind in the early days when you dan't understand the technology

involved in making a record."

Although the poverty and past-industrial Motor-City element in Don's hometown has more than helped forge the band's sound and style, Was now feels the time is right for a change of lacation and opproach. "Was Not Was is now based in Los Angeles, which doesn't mean we're obaut to retire to our carpet slippers," says Dan. "It just worked out that way."

But one thing Was misses by moving to the US's West Coast is the Detroit recording studio where all the formative Was Not Was records were made. "We used the place 24hrs a day, I even lived

there far a few manths," says Dan. "It's great having all the equipment lying around far you to just pick up when you feel inspired. Same of the best things I've done came fram fiddling an a keybaard at four in the marning."

Citing influences such as Miles Davis, Gearge Clintan (also from Detrait), the MC5 and Bab Dylan,

Detrait), the MC5 and Bab Dylan, Dan Was describes the farthcoming single and LP as "A smoothing of the seams, a re-discovery of myself and my R & B raats aided by modern technology."

The modern technology reference is pertinent, as Was Not Was records have so far fallen between the cracks in US radia formats, farcing the band in the past ta undertake extensive touring. "We still intend to ag out and tour next still intend to ga out and tour next year," says Dan, "But we hope the new records find more of a hame

on the world's radiowaves."
Now signed to the giant Phonogram Records, Don Was is in London until early September producing new EMI band Brother Beyond and ofter completing a new Was and after completing a new Was Nat Was LP in Los Angeles, plans to spend mare time in Britain over

the coming year.
"I like it here. Where I come from
in Detroit you hardly ever see a

## Dwight light **Dwight fever**

Lead guitar man Pete Anderson displayed o nifty style, as did fid-dler Brantley Kearns (ex-David Bromberg), and it was plain, both from the intensity and commitment of the performance and the delight of the packed crawd, that this was in fact a broadening of Dwight's home grawn success, where his LP has exceeded soles of a quarter million. If nathing goes wrong (and it shouldn't, as Yaakam is remarkably single-minded) this could be the stort of something big.







# Lightning – less flash, more speed

NINETEEN EIGHTY six is proving a significant year for major distributor Lightning after its recent move into new 40,000 square feet premises in Park Royal. Director Ray Laren talks about Lightning's continuing ability to expand through exploiting new areas of business as well as maintaining key existing ones, and John Tobler takes it all in.



LIGHTNING STRIKES.....

O ENTER the new head-quarters of Lightning Dis-tribution in Bashley Road, tribution in Bashley Road, Park Royal (clase to the A40 in West Landon) is to see the culmination of over 30 years of experience for Raymond Laren, the avuncular entrepreneurially gifted and eloquent managing director of a company which was launched in 1975 after Laren had worked as a jukehov engineer for worked as a jukebox engineer for his father, wha owned a cafe in which the first Bal Ami jukebox was installed. When Laren Senior saw how much money the jukebox took, "he realised he was wasting his time selling tea and started to operate jukeboxes, and he persuaded me to go on a course of Balfour Marine Engineering, where I learned on the production line how they were made and how to service them."

This led to Raymond also programming the jukeboxes, and eventually so many records were needed that it was clear it would be advantageous to buy them directly from record companies. To ochieve this, the Lorens purchased o record shop, the Woodford Music Saloon, merely to use its account focilities.

After Roymond Laren was mar-ried in 1966, his father gave him the shop as a wedding present after changing its name to Pop Inn ("it was a trendy nome then, as there was a radio show with that title"). Roymond developed a chain of record stores by the early Seventies, when his father retired. "It was then that I was able to

coptalise on an opportunity which hod struck me some time before

all the time I was buying recards far the jukebaxes, no one ever tried to sell me recards, while most jukebaxes were pragrammed according to the personal taste of someone like a telephonist. With this in mind, I used the name of my dad's original aperating company, Laren For Music, and set up a service which supplied jukebox records to other operators — this company in the Lightning group now supplies over 20,000 jukenow supplies over 20,000 juke-boxes. According to the BPI, Laren and Lightning are the biggest pur-chasers of singles in the UK. "Jukebox operators require more than just current hits, and we started to sell them the idea of started to sell them the idea of

started to sell them the idea of having sets of oldies, of easy listening, of Country & Western etc, and soon built up a very good selection of titles. Other retailers got to know of the lorge stocks we held, both in singles for jukeboxes, and because I now had five shops, with a stack of LPs and tapes, I began to supply other retailers and market traders. other retailers and market traders

with stock.
"In 1974, just after the three-day week, fuel costs were rising and record companies were imposing small order surcharges, so I placed an ad in whot was then Record Retailer, offering to supply dealers with records. When I storted in the Sixties, record shops typically had Sixies, record snops rypically had three deliveries per day, with people like TDB, Selecta and Lugtons fighting to sell you the same records, but by the mid-Seventies, dealers only got two deliveries per week os well os small order surchorges. I was inundated with re-plies, so I had to find premises to combine the jukebox operation,

which needed more space, with o cash-and-corry facility.
"The Pop Inn shop at the Angel Islington (which later became, ofter we'd left it, a Sexy Sauna) wos close to main line stations, which was what we required. We operated that way for a while, but when Courier Services began, they would come to us, so that we no longer needed to be tied to Red Star services and could be anywhere. As I had teamed up with n brother-in-low, Norman Mandell, who was olso a professional in the jukebox business, we looked for new premises, which we found in Harrow Rood, Harlesden, where

we opened Lightning in September, 1975. We were very successful there — I reckoned we could take £3,000 per week, ond thinking os a retailer, £150,000 per year would have been very good, but we took over £1m by that Christmer. Christmas!

"Feeling that we had the right idea, we developed from there by extending our ronge of products. We still stocked records and cassettes, the jukebox operation was expanding and we diversified into expanding and we diversified into distribution reggae records as we were in West London, then opened a recording studio, then did a licensing deal with WEA, with whom we had significant chort success with Althea & Donno's Up Town Top Ronking (No 1), Jonet Koy's Silly Games (No 2), Errol Dunkley's OK Fred (No 11) ond

several other hits.

"Then came the punk era, and we quickly established ourselves os the premier distributor of new wave product, which expanded the range of deolers we served. We also realised ofter a year or so that the record business wasn't for but we had identified that the oldies business was being badly served by labels who necessarily had to concentrate on their new TO PAGE 4

artists, sa we farmed a label called Old Gald, which re-released pre-viaus chart hits and affered them exclusively in Britain. It's naw a very successful label with aver 1,000 titles available an 7 inch, and a series of LPs/cassettes called

and a series of LPs/cassettes called Decades, which are compilations of hits of a particular year ar era. "We diversified outside records when in 1979, I was delivering same recards to a jukebax operator in Willesden called Cherry Leisure. I saw there the Atan Arcade machine, to which they had the rights, and they also had the Atan VCS home camputer system, the first of the camputerised games marchines. I was so impressed when machines. I was so impressed when I taak it hame and tried it that we started to distribute those machines, and later on in 1980, the Atari XL400 and XL800 computers, which was really the start of purers, which was really hie start of the hame camputer baam. In the same year, we also began distributing pre-recorded video films, which we thought would parallel the distribution of records to record dealers, although it didn't quite happen that way.

"However, we were established early and have continued to build thase sides at the business — fram the games machines, we were saan appainted exclusive distributors far Texas Instruments and then far Sinclair, BBC, Cammadare and today for Amstrad. Now we have three main trading divisians — re-cards, videa and cansumer electranics — and also a very healthy expart division dealing with these

expart division dealing with these products.

"When we started in 1975, we had four people at Harraw Raad, and we used to bang around in this big 15,000 square feet of a building, but when we left last month, we had 174 people who were larget eithing an each other's almost sitting an each ather's shaulders. We recagnised three years ago that we needed larger years ago that we needed larger premises, and it was essential that the new building was close to the ald ane, so that we didn't lase any essential staff ar inconvenience custamers wha found getting to Harraw Raad easy. In fact, cammunicatians here at Bashley Raad are even better, as we're within five minutes of the M1, M3 and M4 and 15 minutes fram London's and 15 minutes fram London's Heathraw Airpart. It's a very central location off Western Avenue in Park Royal, and with a facility we never enjayed at Harraw Road —

never enjayed at Harraw Raad — a huge car park with space far over 100 cars.

"We have 40,000 square feet, and this is the best and biggest cash-and-carry of its type in the UK, where custamers can brawse at their leisure with a full range af products — records, CDs, video, laservision, camputer hardware, software and accessories, Duracell batteries telephones basic calculations. batteries, telephanes, basic calculatars and keyboards and many ather items."

Laren has gaad reasan to be pleased with his new empire — the vast warehause allows far mare space for customers than mast, while the affice accommodation, which at Harraw Raad was spartan, to be polite, is now roomy and comfortable. There are other fairly recent innovations apart from the premises, as Laren relates: "Our turnaver has increased to the paint where last year we taak over £30m, although clearly we were frustrated in our expansion plans until we came here. Apart fram much mare space both far staff and stack, aur acquisitian recently

by the Parkfield Graup has given us access bath to mare custamers and mare diversified products. I believe we shall saan be able to believe we shall saan be able to offer our customers the whale range af fluarescent light fittings, replacement tubes, light bulbs, spatlights etc, as well as an in-creased range af botteries and other electrical applicances. Norman Mandell and I wanted to capitalise an our equity within the business, and we had planned a Exchange quatatian in September this year, but we were intraduced by aur braker ta Parkfield, who had acquired last year Foster Electrical, a lass making sub-sidiary of EMI with a head affice at Brixtan and 10 depats around the cauntry."
As Raymand Laren has mare

experience of the record industry than any UK record campany managing director, it seemed oppartune to ask his views on same of the areas which are cur-rently causing parts of the industry concern. "The prablem with a distributian business is that margins are necessarily narrow, and the recent recard campany action in withdrawing bath settlement dis-caunt and the 5 per cent returns allawance has put aur margins under attack, which cauld mean that we may cut back an the amount of catalogue we'd normally like to stack, because we can no langer affard to take a chance on material which may not sell.

stack-in-trade. We ensure that recard dealers have stack on their shelves when the companies can't deliver it, but we're not appreciated to the extent that they have maintained the discount we need to provide the service dealers acknowledge as being excellent."

Little need to explain the saurce of that prablem, but another exam-ple of the far-sightedness af Lightning and Raymond Laren cancerns the campany's major cammitment to campact disc, which has seen the greatest grawth of all the divisians of Lightning recently. "We've extended aur stackhalding since we've moved here and now baast over 3,000 titles in stack in bulk. We have nearly 400 metres af shelf space far CDs, which means 10 per cent of aur warehause space is devoted to that ane praduct. All our stack is bar-caded and duct. All our stack is bar-caded and everything is an the computer, sa that out-of-stock items can be swift-ly identified, and although the stack position isn't as we'd like it ta be, this is due to world shortage of manufacturing capacity. Because af that, I think it's impartant far dealers to establish accounts with those best able to provide product, ie whalesale distributors — when petral's rationed, only valued account custamers get mare than one gallon."

As Lightning appears to succeed at mast undertakings, why nat open a CD plant of your own? "We're always laaking at oppartu-





"I've na daubt the sale of new releases will be affected, because there'll be less inclination to take a chance on an unknown artist, which is, after all, the lifeblaad of the record industry. It has an equally detrimental effect an back cata-lague sales, because if they're nat turning over fast enough and remain an our shelves, we can ill-affard to pay bank interest on them if we have no facility for return ar far extra margin. I hape there will be an early resolution to this problem that's satisfactory to all parties, but with all recard wholesalers being detrimentally affected, the being derimentally arrected, the record companies are making it difficult for peaple to buy their products, which I consider to be a very short-sighted action on their part. Ian Timmer stated at the CD ference at which I was invited to speak last February that fram the moment you press the buttan, it takes nearly three years to estab-lish a CD factory. As all the seniar executives of Lightning have retail experience, we try to lead our customers into new product areas it may not be generally realised — it may not be generally realised that we have aur own retail autlet at Ruislip, where we try aut new products. We've been most successful in what was once a record shap exclusively in selling computer saftware, music on videa, telephorate. phones, Casia keybaards and we're about to intraduce Casio calculatars, all af which are additional lines for all record shops.

"There's nathing wanderful about selling a chart-tapping recard to a custamer who comes in for it. The clever thing is to sell that custamer samething he didn't come in for, and for that you need attractive products.

# Cohen: keying into new areas

THE ONLY woman omong the directors of Lightning is Loretta Cohen, who holds the post of director, consumer electronics. "That meons computer games, computer hardware and software, electronic keyboards from Casio, calculators, desk machines, hand held computers and telephone product."

A veritable treasure trave for the up to dote executive, but hosn't everyone soid that the small com-puter boom is over? "It's very much o growth orea, despite what others may say, and people hove moved into business computers much more. For example, the Amstrad word processor is very compoct, sits on the top of o desk nicely, and can be seen all around our offices. As for as gomes mochines go, there's a new Sincloir computer orientated for gomes playing to be released in September." Is the business for telephones buoyant? "Since British Telecom ollowed onyone to provide telephones, we've stocked telephone product, and the change from rentol only to outright purchose means that we sell o number of cosmetic the sell of the procession of the sell of t phones. It's not inconceivable that with the price of phones, people might change the colour of their phone when they redecorate o room or change a colour scheme, so now it's becoming a foshion

so now its becoming a sitem."

Whot obout block phones, which everyone used to have not that lang ago?

"They've become very popular ogain — they're very upmarket and Porsche-type people seem to like them".

Other new lines? "We hove Cosio keyboards, which more ond more computer deolers ore stocking, os they marry very well with computer equipment. Thot's o growth market, a young person's market since keyboard prices hove come down." come down."


Prior to joining Lightning three ond a half years ago, Cohen had a ond o holf years ago, Cohen had o chain of retail shaps mostly situated within other stores specialising in video games, colculators, digital wotches etc, but ofter selling her business, she occepted an invitation from Raymond Loren to head Lightning's Consumer Electronics Division. Lightning's new premises are o great improvement for her—"We've got better facilities for my team to evaluate software, it's team to evoluate softwore, it's quieter and more conducive to concentration, and we have much better showroom and storage faci-lities, so I'm very pleased."

are very professional now — the rubbish retailers and the people who got into it when it was a new business to make a quick buck have all gone now, but those stores which did it properly have survived."

Piracy has also decreased, according to Yershon, particularly in the south of England, although it can still be troublesome in the north. "Rocky IV came out only six manths ago in the cinemas, and it was on the shelves of some duties without the state of the state bious video outlets straight away, and so was Back To The Future it's hard to stamp it out completely, but the situation is better than it was. A lot of the inferior pirated stuff was originated outside the UK, sometimes with Asian sub-titles, and it'll remain a problem becouse of the time lag between theatricol and video releases, which is often nine months to a year, although some companies are now only using a six month gap or even simultaneaus release on video."

Recent video releases which Recent video releases which have been more reosonobly priced, such as Channel 5 and The Video Collection, have further decreased piracy, although brand new material is still relatively expensive: "There's talk that the £50 retail barrier will be broken by the end of the year, possibly with Rocky IV, but it'll be worth the price at the end of the day, because a lot of people will rent it at £1.50 to £2, although very few will buy it at

One line which foiled to fulfil the promise Lightning saw in it is

Loservisian, the videa system which works with records rather than tapes Despite its better quality, bath visually and saundwise, the inability to recard on these machines held them back cammercially. Yershon feels that the Laservisian market will be relative. y quiet until the introduction of the combined CD/Loservisian machine, expected in 1987. As he says: "It'll have the best sound and the best picture, and I'm sure it'll have a good chance."

# Powell — the smooth operator

LIGHTNING OPERATIONS director David Powell, who has been with the company for eight years, is actually rather more familiar with the campany's new building than most of his colleagues, as he, together with Vaughan Bendall, general manager, had the respon-sibility of both planning the layout of the Bashley Road site and overseeing the move of stock and per-sannel into it.

"We had a planned move — first the stock, then the offices, then the computer, which altogether took a month," says Powell.

efficiently, including a camputerised worning system to indicate where fresh stocks are required, and from where bulk supplies can be retrieved within the warehouse, os well as recommending locations far incaming goads and logging their position

In addition, the 25 feet high shelving, accessible anly with fork lift trucks, provides a "bonded warehouse" facility controlled with a computerised docket system, and each of these refinements adds to

a sophisticated conveyor, assists customers who are unwilling or unable to lift lorge quantities of merchandise to reach the cash points with far less effort.

Powell is also responsible for supervising and programming the juke box side of Lightning's operation. Interestingly, when asked for an example of the type of record an example of the type of record which might not be appropriate for juke baxes, Powell cites The Chick-en Song — "In a pub, once it had been played half a dozen times, it could drive everyone mad!

# Exports-20 pc of the business

NOT TOO surprisingly, compact discs form a substantial prapartian of the exparts of the Lightning Graup, although it is interesting to learn from the company's expant director, Graham Lambdan, that

expart business accounts far same 20 per cent of Lightning's business. "We expart to the Coak Islands, Fiji, places like that, although our primary markets are North America, Scandinavia and the rest af Europe, and we also sell to Japan and to communist countries. As far as the other side of the Iran Curtain goes, we sell a lat to diplamats and embassies, and we have special arrangements far them to buy videos and laservision players duty free."



# A young person's guide to musicals

PEOPLE UNDER 30 who are capable of writing credible, ariginal and contemporary stage musicals are rarer than income tax rebates. Indeed, the PRS instituted the Vivian Ellis Award in an attempt to salve the dearth of candidates in this creative area.

rents funding the Action Live Theatre Company headed by their

Theatre Company headed by their daughter, who proceeded to write a musical versian of Macbeth initially titled Rockbeth and then Nightshriek. It was premiered at Middlesbrough, fallawed by Redcor, with grants assisting its production from Middlesbrough Council and Northern Arts.

In December 1984 she was asked by the National Youth Theatre if it could stage the show in Cleveland the following April, and it played a week in Billingham under its new title Nightshriek, sponsored by ICI, Tyne Tees TV, Northern Arts and Cleveland Independent Theatre Ca. Last month saw its London debut of the Shaw Theatre, performed by the National Youth Theatre Theatre, performed by the National Youth Theatre.

## **Profitable** year for GEMA

MUNICH: West Germon callection society GEMA earned £162m in 1985, on increose of 5.1 per cent on the previous year. Mechanical rights payments accounted for £83m, and performance, broadcost, library music ond ossaciated rights for £69m. Radio Europe 1, hassed outside the country, paid based outside the country, paid £2.4m, the balance of GEMA's in-come coming from property and interest earnings.

Sound carrier sales accounted for 35.6 per cent of GEMA's income, radia and TV for 27.5 per cent, and performances for 10.4 per cent. Functional music per cent. Functional music accounted for 8.4 per cent, video cossette rentals for 1.2 per cent, movies for 1.2 per cent, and the VCR hordware levy for twa per cent. Foreign earnings ot £12m represented 7.7 per cent, but almost £43m was paid out to foreign writers and publishers.

The society's lang-running battle with the IFPI over mechanical royalties appears unlikely to be resalved this yeor. The industry has already paid £27m into a blacked account pending settlement. The Supreme Court here has fixed November 27 as the new date for

November 27 as the new date for a decision in the dispute, but both parlies are expected to fight for their percentages until a final judgement.

Mendes' keybaard work is pivotal in the overall sound and impact and his singers for the album lend a family touch to the proceedings with Gracinha Leparace (Mrs Mendes) and Lani Hall (Mrs Alpert) among them. Mendes is a known quantity, and this LP is first-class in every respect and worth stocking ond displaying.

BRUCE COCKBURN. World Of Wonders. Revolver/FM-Revolver REVLP 73. Distribution: EMI. Bruce Cockburn is a Canadian folk/rack/paet songwriter who has a cult following here, and is big news in Germany and Canada. He also makes damn good records, and this, his latest, is no exception. Evacative and provocative lyrics swarm through a haze of conch, guitars, violin, flugelhorn etc. If Pe-ter Case and Suzanne Vega can attract attention here, then Cockburn should be equally capable of making a name for himself.

With the Discover New Country campaign making hesitant prag-ress, it's ironic that same of the finest examples of the rock/country crossover of the late Sixties/early Seventies are now finding reissue on specialist lobels. This trio of neoclassic olbums all share rock and country influences in vorying de-grees — Cody's group mixed them with vaudeville, western swing and a smidgeon of bluegrass, and this compilation is good value and pleasing if perhops insufficiently varied. The Burritos, who included Gram Parsons and Chris Hillman, still sound magnificent — while not disagreeing with the recent review of Burrito DeLuxe (Edsel ED 194), which is excellent, aficionados of this great group generally feel that Gilded Palace is their finest LP, and it's also released on CD. The Dirt Band are still active, happily, as they showed at Wembley earlier this year. This campilation of early work includes several Jackson Browne songs not recorded by their creator in his solo career, plus classics like Some Of Shelley's Blues, Mr Bojongles and House At Pooh Corner. A reissue af the su-perb Uncle Charlie album might have been preferable, but maybe that's next — this shows the band's development through jug band music and bluegrass to country/rock, while the Burnitos LPs ore the blueprint for country/rock.

After ostonishing R&B fans with his fluid yet rounchy guitar playing, which includes an unparalleled mastery of feedback, during the early Seventies, ex-session player Buchanon seemed to vonish until the reappeaged last year. This followers. he reappeared last year. This fol-low up LP is a similar mixture of high octone Chicago blues, but with the added odvantage of guest vocalist Delbert McClinton on three of the best tracks, like Diddley's You Can't Judge A Baok. Buchanan himself isn't a bad singer, as in Drowning On Dry Land, but too many instrumental non-tunes detract from an overall goad effect, although a version here of Peter Gunn makes Art Of Noise sound like Barry Manilow. Good in parts — more real tunes next time.

Althaugh St Michael succeeds in predicting samething of the total revivad/reversal of Declan/Elvis in King Of America, this most crucial of epi-America, this most crucial of epi-sodes has had to be omitted. However, if your concern is what has passed, then this book is for

St Michael achieves what few biographers can: reactivating an interest in the damn records them-

selves. Through his competent appraisals he succeeds in identifying a few lost classics, helps the re-evaluation of misunderstaad works (Trust, Almast Blue) and in-furiates with a strange disregard for Imperial Bedroom, to some, Costello's most complete work, to St Michael, cluttered and ill-

conceived.



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

THE CONFERENCE season is underway in earnest this week with the first of the majars — RCA/Ariala — heading far Darset, and the strong rumaur raund the Darmy Hotel jacuzzi was that this would be acting chairman Jack Davies's farewell event in the UK ... Music far Pleasure threw itself enthusiastically into twenty first birthday celebrations at its sales conference held at Glaucester's Hotel and \*Cauntry Club. Ex-MDs Richard Baldwyn (who co-founded the label in 1965 with baok publisher Paul Hamlyn) and Ted Harris jointly cut a special birthday cake, and guests were treated to a quick-fire 11-minute visual presentation of the company's history which rivalled that old Brighton To Victoria In Five Minutes TV interlude film for pace ... Salesman of the year award went to Brian Hamilton — the first to win it twice — with Alan Tawnraw runner-up, and Derek Wall was area manager of the year, while Peter O'Cain picked up his salesman of the year award, seven years late! By the way, how many records and tapes do you think MfP has sold during its 21 years? The answer — 128m units — would have won you a prize of the conference ... A rare invitation from averseas music publishers took BPI director-general Jahn Deacan to Amsterdam to address rights arganisation STEMRA and the presence on the platfarm of PolyGram president Jan Timmer underlines haw the record industry and music publishing fratemity recagnise the impartance of unity much mare these days ...

IN THE midst of great strife the creative fire still burns. So Paul Simon demanstrated at his London press canference last week barely drawing breath during his 45 minute description of the genesis of his new LP Graceland in South Africa. But his hanest assessment of the talent and problems of the musicians there was eclipsed by the quate of the week from callaborotar Jaseph Shabalala wha declared: "Music is a thing you can't hinder. It gaes all the way from here up ta Heaven." As lang as it's not hame-taped on the way, a cynical westerner is tempted to abserve. And a shamefaced Simon had to admit that he first heard black South African music through listening to a bootleg cassette. Roberta Flack, David Stewart and Hugh Masekela are helping to organise the first African Debutantes Ball an September 21 at the Limelight to benefit the Botswana International School of Music, while this Saturday at Bridgwater, Somerset, in aid of the Kerland Faundatian Child Development Centre... If you want to hab-nab with royalty, you may want to join Dire Straits manager Ed Bicknell in buying a table at a September 19 dinner/dance to give the UK's America's Cup yacht squad a good send-off. And as TV cameras and Radio One are likely to be there, it might provide (relatively) cheap promotional exposure for artists at £2,000 per table of 10. Dire Straits, by the way, are praviding Gaing Hame as the team's theme song.

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## COMMENT

Here's a prediction for 1987 — and it's only September. I'll bet a box full of Brothers In Arms to a Black Lace Greatest Hits that digital audia tape will be the most talked about industry topic in 1987, eclipsing even hame taping, CD and trading terms. The delay in the projected autumn launch at the first Japanese machines is not expected to last until Christmas and the Electronic Industries Association of Japan is not anxious to agree a launch date for the whole industry in case it is accused of cartel action.

Apart fram its aminaus implications for CD's future, DAT technology's horrifying capacity for damestic and commercial piracy is now becoming widely understoad through features in the highbraw papers. A campaign is underway to persuade the EEC to insist that a spailer device is incorporated in DAT hardware to defeat illegal copying. The necessary legislation will take time, hawever, and interim measures urged for cansideration include a total import bon covering EEC countries or the impasition of a high tariff. Fine abjectives, but cansumer demand is also likely to play a very large role in all this ance the benefits of DAT become apparent to the average punter. Don't underestimate cansumer power either when cansidering holding back material from release via DAT.

We're all cansumers in ane way ar another and haw would car drivers among us, for instance, react if a new super fuel efficient car were kept from the market because petrol companies wouldn't release the fuel to pawer it. Nat an exact parallel I know, but it serves merely to illustrate haw consumers may not tolerate being denied a desirable advance (to



them) in audia technology.

Sorry if you're bored with the topic even before 1987 but for the music business to more or less ignore DAT's impact — just as it did the implications of the compact cassette in its early days — is just what the Japanese would like. That may sound slightly xenophobic towards the Japanese would incompact towards the Japanese — unfortunately it's very easy to lapse into suspicion and mistrust of people who do something better than you do yourself.

There's one crucial difference about DAT — and it provides a last chilling thought. Far Eastern dominance of cansumer electranics has been based on taking up and improving on good ideas and praducing them cheaper, while this new format is the first audia innavatian largely canjured up by the Japanese themselves. So don't expect them ta give it up lightly.


