THE RECORD industry has largely survived on gut feeling about haw to market recards. Naw Gallup aims to turn those instincts into concrete statistics. Far instance, did you know that almost half the adult papulation buys an album at least once a year but men are more likely to buy one than wamen,

while The Beatles fans of the late Sixties still spend heavily on LPs, with three quarters of men and two thirds of women aged between 25 and 34 making such purchases. These and other findings are revealed in The Artist Profile, a new report which is being campiled by Gallup for the record industry ev-

Gallup's chars department has joined farces with its established Omnibus survey which interviews a crass-section of 2,000 adults every week about a wide range of subjects. The Artist Prafile will give detailed pictures of wha and where the buyers of the UK's lead-

ing recording artists are.

Over a faur-week periad 8,000 inter-viewees will be asked the frequency of their album purchases and whether they have bought albums by any of the 20 selected artists during the past year. The Omnibus survey will caver only adults aged 16 and aver, and singles will initially be excluded. These results will then be combined with analysis af the past three manths album sales far each selected artist, taken fram the chart panel data.



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COMPACT CISAC urges US to toe copyright line

MADRID: The Berne Convention on capyright is 100 years ald this year, and the 35th congress of the International Canfederation of Auinternollonic Confederation of Au-thors & Composers Societies (CISAC) held here recently colled upon all countries to join the con-vention, described os "the Mogno Corto of the internotional copyright community".

There are currently 76 countries which are signatories to the convention, but there are also notable obsentees, including the US. Two American composer/songwriters, William Schumon and Norman Gimbel, drew attention to this foct. Gimbel, drew attention to this toci. They said that joining Berne is "the lost step necessary for the US to become a fully fledged world copyright leader" in view of it

being a major producer and distributar of intelluctual property.

Denis de Freitas, representing the PRS, MCPS and the British Capyright Council (of which he is choirmon) reminded delegates of choirmon) reminded delegates of the extent of the hame-taping hoemorrhage, and urged CISAC to demond that all gavernments that recognise the value of the copyright system to introduce hame-taping royalties.

He quoted surveys reveoling that six times as much music is being toped in the UK annually than is being baught on record and pre-recorded tope. In 1983 466m hours of music were toped while the recard industry sold only 70m hours of music, and the praportion was similar for video tope.

Secondary sources of income ore now vital to the record industry ond the lotest tribunal decision in this marathon dispute effectively preserves Phonographic Performance Ltd incame from Independent Rodio ot close to £3m o yeor. It follows a High Court judgment ear-lier this year in which Mr Justice Hormon held that the tribunal had erred in low on certain points when reaching its original decision in 1980.

Hormon judged the tribunol was wrong to toke into occount the 32½ per cent paid by PPL to performers when fixing the level of rayolties, and wrong also to ignore of formula which AIRC had proposed for comporing Independent Rodio's poyments to those of the BBC. This formulo would have led to a mossive reduction in Indepen-

dent Rodio's fees.

However, olthough reconsidering its decision in the light of the Hormon judgment, the Performing Right Tribunol hos not significantly changed the amount that the com-

mercial stations poy overall.

Under the new formulo each station must poy four per cent of the first £650,000 of its net advertising revenue (equivolent to £1.2m of 1986 prices) and seven per cent obove that. New stations still have start up rates of two and three per start up rates of two and three per cent. This means that the largest station — Capital — will benefit by a substantial £2,300,000 while other stations will find themselves poying much the same, or more than before.

PPL general monoger John Love is pleased that the tribunal oppears to have endorsed most of the orguments put forward by the record industry and says: "After eight years and £2m of litigation it's like o gigantic tape loop — with every-one back where they were, What we really wont now is to get back

we really want now is to get back to hoving a proper commercial relationship with the ILR stations."

AIRC's West, who feels the tribunal has "ducked the issues" in its lotest decision, says: "We've gone backwords 13 years to the original terms that we didn't agree in the first place, when the IBA negotiated the agreement."

ated the agreement."
West says that the rodio companies are still "reeling" from this setback in their crusade to have needletime fees reduced to a nominal rate but is already "investigating" on appeal to the European Commission on the subject. However, the next stage in the battle is likely to be o brand new reference to the Performing Right Tribunal

"The world has revolved a few times since 1980 and the decision may well be to make a fresh start," says West. Meanwhile, both sides in the dis-

meanwhile, poin sides in the dis-pute are considering the horrifying prospect of hoving to bockdate the tribunal's decision. Copital would benefit consider-

ably from backdating but Love warns: "If Capital claimed money back, then other stations would have to pay us."

UK to capitalise on his shared success with Farley "Jackmaster" Funk as co-creator of the Tap 10 hit Love Can't Turn Around, publicly expressed surprise at the club scene that he found here. As a leading "house" DJ in Chicago, he detually plays many European dance records, and, in common with many Americans in the disco business, had the impression that the clubs here would be much more rack or pap arientated. He hadn't realised they would be as "R&B", as he put it, so black.

There can be few UK discos, no mother what their music policy, that don't play some black must (if anly the current crossover hist) during the cause of an evening. As this column keeps pointing out, disco music for at least two decades in this country has been by and large synanymous with "soul music", and thanks to the structure of aur charts it has traditionally been the discos rather than radio which have started the regular quota of black hits on their crossover path.

In the US, an exuberant black

In the US, an exuberant black dance record like Lave Can't Tum Around will never be a crossover pap hit while the charts are dictated and segregated according to types of sagiegated accraing to types or radio playlist. Here, once a record cracks it, it can go all the way, in a national chart influenced anly by soles. Billboard's Hat 100, the premier US chart, is controlled by white-aimed radio stations most of whose playlists will only countenance a black record that has had to compromise to fit their format. Back in the Sixties, though,

formal. Back in the Sixties, though, and maybe surprisingly, US radio stations were sa much mare openminded (especially in the wake of the Beatles-led first "British Invosion"). That Morbown's slagan was truthfully able to be "The Sound Of Young America", as that black record campany become the most consistently successful source of indigenous US hits.

Nawadays there's an even bigger British Invosion overtaking the US Hat 100 — many of the records involved not getting airspace here, because British radio is playing in their place the madem US black music that could, if given the chance, be fighting back just as hard on its harm turf. American radio programmers should maybe look less to this side of the pond for their material, and peek instead into their own beat were?

Greyhound back in the running

GREYHOUND RECORDS, the label side of the Greyhound distribution and importing set-up, has been absent from the scene far some time naw, after some dance chart successes in the early Eighties. Greyhound returns, however, in November in completely re-vamped form with new release policies to boot.

Phonogram's Club label released Facts Of Love an single and 12-inch on November 7, this being a new recording extracted from the forthcoming Lorber album Private Passian, which is scheduled for the end of the mouth end of the month.

als by 19-year-old Karyn White, and was produced by Evan Ra-gers, Carl Sturken and Lorber himself. 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


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

Brits in the US more awards

TWENTY TWO awards went to PRS writers far the most performed works in the US during 1985 presented by ASCAP at its recent Clar-idge's Hotel annual dinner, the sixth in the series. These were in addition to those received by the three writers topping the list re-ported in last week's MW — Phil Collins, Billy Ocean and Julian Len-

The awards were presented by ASCAP president Morton Gauld, managing director Gloria Messinger and European regianal director James Fisher. The awards (with only the names of the PRS members in interest listed) went to the following.

Elements of Hitchcock

THE DAY before his latest American sojourn — to his strongholds in the North East and South West, to MTV appearances and o Rolling Stane interview, Robyn Hitchcack, that most English of artistes in the tradition, he says, of Viv Stanshall, is mulling over his latest release, The Elements Of Light LP an his own Glass Fish label.

Pag with the wrong wards is

Pop with the wrong wards is how he describes it: the jumbled but very funny imagery set to bright and Beatley tunes. "Writing as I do to The Beatles rules may make me conservative, but they wrote such great songs that I'm happy to follow them for the rest of my life. I always thought that arding ary pap lyrics were so confined,"

he says.

Elements Of Light was recorded in Hitchcock's favourite studio, Alaska in Waterlao, which in his inimitable way, he admires for its cheapness, friendliness and "un-usual smell", the source of which he has yet to pinpoint. "The new songs are probably less exotic but mare

human."
With the words such an obvious starting point far the uninitiated,
Hitchcock is surprisingly dismissive:
"They're just the right words ta sing
— just sounds yau make ta comfort
yaurself or unsettle someone else. A lang time aga I wanted to inject a different way of speaking into rack," he says, while also observing that "uncommercial pop is the kiss of death — that's why it hasn't

kiss of death — that's why it nosit's sold in its millions?.

Who does buy Hitchcock olbums beyond the Whistle Test team? "People always describe our audiences as mixed. They're certainly not hairstyle-arientated. certainly not natistyle-tentaleur.
The people at our gigs used to have shifty eyes and beards—
God knows if that's what we look like," says Hitchcock, a firm believer in the tribalism of rack and that

audiences like to look like their heroes — or is it vice versa? "Any-way, it's a lot less exclusive than it

used to be." Do the resources of the majors hold much allure? "People talk to us, but I knaw how things ple talk to us, but I know how things wark. There's a terrific demand for fast results and there's probably no point taking a band like us . . . I ought to find out who signed Van Morrisan and Richard Thompson

"I'm not a teenybapper. People still buy records that I made 10 years ago — when Graham Greene puts aut a baok that's not it people are.still buying Brightan Rock. I'm not built to explait and

destroy.
"I don't know what I'm invoking. but I'rn trying to get it straight from my subconscious without using market forces."

The dilemma, he feels, is that while industry doesn't want to take risks, it does want new things: "They all want what other A&R men want."

men want."

While claiming he daesn't care about a major deal here, Hitchcack would love to sign to Warners in the US. So what's the difference? 

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

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

As if to underline the fact that the mid-price series does not have to be factory line stuff, the Brodsky play Schubert's A minor too. Gane is the normal impassioned opening reading of the opening theme. In-stead, there is a restroined statement, more akin to outhentic performance olthough the Brodsky players use modern instruments, and can be very forthright at times An arresting, thoughtful occount of both works

Concertas far Vialin and Orchestra, Bruch/Mendelssahn. Concertos Jaime Laredo, violin, Scottish Chamber Orchestra. IMP Red Label, PCD 829.

This should prove one of the biggest sellers for Pickwick. Throughout its various recordings biggest Introghout its various recordings of mainstream violin concerto work for IMP Red Lobel, Laredo and SCO have developed a deserved reputation for reliability — a bit like the qualities of the Volkswagen Beetle in its heyday.

I think the recording of Bruch's

Concerto in particular goes a bit further than that, for Loredo seems to revel in the headier emotional overtones. But the combination of popular repertoire and £7.99 rrp will definitely ensure healthy definitely ensure healthy sales.

Howard Shelley is one of the handful of English pianists to have carved o respectable niche for himself in his own country's musical network. His wide musical interests have seen him avoid being cast os grand virtuoso or chomber music ployer, though he does both well; and here his worm and expressive playing is seen at its best.

It is strong Mozart, with the left hand always well occented, but the music never loses its vigour. It augurs well for further collaborations between Shelley and the City of London Sinfonia.

Brandenburg Concertos Nos 1, 2, 3, Bach. English Chamber Orchestra, directed by Philip Ledger. IMP Red Label PCD 830.

With the introduction of the English Chamber Orchestra to the IMP Red Lobel, musical adviser John Boyden is corefully upgrad-ing the public image of Pickwick's classical CD series.

In the experienced hands of Phi-lip Ledger, the ECO gives the kind of performances of Bach's Brandenburgs that they have been doing over the past decade: bright, respectable, palatoble but perhaps a little routine. The idea was better than the execution

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

"I don't bather too much with catalogue and stock, mainly the big-sellers. The current EMI package, though, which has backcatalogue videos by Duran Duran, Kate Bush and Iron Maiden amangst athers, should do particularly well. The fact that retail prices have come dawn should considerably boast business."

Wayne Allen of the wellestablished Ainley's record shap in Leicester adds: "Music videos are becoming mare of an essential

leicester adds: "Music videos ore becoming mare of an essential product line. It's a steady market thraughaut the year and then from October onwards sales increase considerably. I believe the price reductions will also help make music videos much mare attractive to the customers".

Alan Bellward of Lewes Record
Centre stocks around 100 music
video titles at any one time, with particular emphasis on new re-leases. "The price reductions will help sales considerably — £20 was rother a lot for people to fork out for a new video, and £10 or £15 is a much more realistic price. Now people can afford to buy

mucic videas as stacking fillers whereas befare they had to be samething that they particularly wanted for themselves."

wanted for themselves."

Bellward adds: "Obviously I stock mast af the big-name releases but there are same where business is a lat better than with others. Queen are always a big-seller an videa — and their catalogue cantinues to sell well — and business is always goad for heavy metal videa releases, and ones rebusiness is always goad for heavy metal videa releases, and ones released by cult bands such as New Order. The EMI/Virgin Now series has always dane very well tao, and the Five Stor video hos done good business.

"When it comes to stocking music videos, i usually go by whot's in the video chart and anything also that there seems to be a de-

else that there seems to be a demond for — even if a pop concert hos been shown on TV it doesn't mean that the video sales are immediately killed, most customers still wont the real thing. Children's music videas like Paul McCartney's Frag Chorus and The Snowman have also done particularly good business."

Bellward points aut that in-store promotion is important. "We're showing videos all the time in the shop, it's a necessary part of selling them, you con't just put them on display and expect the videas to aspiray and expect the videos to sell themselves. Generally, thaugh, I'm laoking forward to a good pre-Christmas selling period, some of the titles which have been re-leased in recent manths have been rather suspect but there are alsa some very strong music video re-leases around."

Paul Webb, manager of Sydney Scorborough in Hull, says: "We always keep music videos in stack, and try to keep up to dote with all the big Top 30 titles, although we've found that there are certain we've found that there are certain musical areas like jazz, soul and reggoe which don't lend themselves to big sales on video, at least so far as this area is concerned. "Generally sales of pop videos ore consistent throughout the year,

but about this time, in the run-up to Christmas, sales suddenly boom. This year business must be even better because of the cheaper prices of pre-recarded videas which means that they will become mare af a Christmas present buy then in previous years.

"In-stare pramatian is abviausly very important and we have screens in the shop so that the customers can see new videos. Quite often we get them coming in looking for an album but walking out with a video instead. Music videos are on important part of our retailing as much attention as any other ting as much attention as ony other product line so far as we're con-

Stuart Wilkinson, owner of Citicento in South London points out though that the costs of installout mough ind the costs of installing videos in shops for promotional purposes con be quite exhorbitant. "I must admit that we don't promote videos as much as we should in-store, simply because of the high investment that is involved. Citicenta's video sales include cotalague as well as current hit titles. "The 25 Years Of Molown video has done very well, and names like McCortney and Queen are always goad video sellers. Spandau Ballet — The Singles, Tino Turner and Five Star have also been attracting a lot of consumer been attracting a lot of consumer ottention," Wilkinson says. "I wouldn't say though that music videos are an essential product line for us though, if we gave up selling them tomorrow it wouldn't make all that difference to business. We'll

probably do more business with them between now and Christmas than we have done throughout the

rest of the year."

One set-back to the imminent growth of the music video market could be the increase in mortgage rates which will leave mony houserotes which will leave mony house-holders with less disposable in-come. "The recent mortgage rise will have an effect — people will feel the financial pinch more but it always takes time for this kind of thing to filter through," adds Wil-kinsan. "I don't think the pre-Christmas business with music videas will be affected, it will be in the New Year that people have to start lightening their belts."



John Tobler picks through the new releases, autumn schedules and items particularly relevant to the traditional money spinning season.

Madness rules at Virgin

AS RECENTLY mentioned in these pages, Virgin Vision has no immediate intention of lowering its prices to break the £10 barrier, claiming that the videos it releases are chasen with care and discrimination and are technically superb. The company's six major music titles for this autumn feature two potentially profitable acts — Madness follow the mega-selling Complete Madness with the inventively titled Complete Madness 2, which does not overlap with its predecessor, and includes the videos used for the group's final singles on Stiff and their more recent Virgin 45s, and Big Cauntry's The Seer — Live features the group



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

JOE SMITH and his amazing talking book

Throwing the book at pop music



SMITH INTERVIEWEES: Frank Sinatra, Mick Jagger, Bab Dylan and Paul McCartney

You can't accuse Joe Smith of doing things by half. Having spent 30 years in the world of international music, he's now embarked on the potentially impossible task of writing the
"definitive" history of popular music. But unlike many other authors, Smith has decided to allow the musicians themselves to do the talking. Chris White met up with Smith on a recent London trip. years' experience of the international president of Warner Bros Records and loter choirmon of Elektro/ Asylum, Joe Smith hos come into contoct with many of the top names in popular music, post and present. He's now putting his knowledge, contacts and experience to good use by writing whot is being described os "the definitive" history of popular music since the Thirties, and was in London recently to research the UK end of the tame.

After leaving Elektro/Asylum in 1983 Smith spent two years as president of Home Sports Enterioriment, a division of Worner/AMEX Coble, spending six months a year in New York and the other six months on the West Coost. He odmits though: "The future was becoming predictable and I decided I

must do something else — for the first time in 30 years I found myself free to do whot I wonted, and it wosn't long before people started urging me to write a book obout the business."

However he wanted to ovoid writing o tome olong the lines of "Joe Smith remembers" ond so decided to odopt the opproach of on orol history whereby the ortists, musicions and record company executives told the story themselves.

ecutives told the story themselves. "I decided to do a book about popular music, but presenting it from the point of view of all those who have been involved with it. There have been lots of very good books which have dealt with a certain period or style of music but they have always been dane from the perspective of the author. I wanted to do an oral history and get people like Dylan talking about his croft — something that has never been done before."

Smith's eminence within the US record industry helped open many doors, and he feels the fact that he isn't a journalist has helped considerably too. "I've been telling people that I'm not looking for scandal, and I'm not trying to preempt ony plans they might have far writing their own story. The book — which hos a working title, We're Tolking Music — is not so much a history of music as a series of conversations with the people who have created the history."

With the names that Smith has already spoken to, the book should live up to its promise. Amongst the big bond names interviewed hove

With the names that Smith has already spoken to, the book should live up to its promise. Amongst the big bond names interviewed hove been Artie Show, Woody Herman and Lionel Hompton while solo artists have included Fronk Sinatro (notorious for not giving interviews but Smith ron his record lobel Reprise for several years), Rosemary Clooney, Margoret Whiting, Frankie Laine and Pattie Page. More contemporary names who hove been willing ta chat have included the Everly Brothers, Bo Diddley, Peter, Paul and Mary, Judy Collins, Bob Dylan, Mick Jagger, Elton John, Paul McCortney, Robert Plant and Pink Floyd's Roger Woters.

mith also had tolks with record producers George Mortin, Phil Spector (a notoble recluse) and Phil Romone, industry figures like Clive Dovis, Dovid Geffen ond Chris Wright, songwriters Leiber ond Stoller, Borry Monn, Gerry Goffin, and Sommy Cohn, and rock monagers like Brion Lone.

Smith storted his music coreer as

Smith storted his music coreer os o DJ back in the Fifties, before moving into promotion and becoming the record promotion monoger for the fledgling Worner Brothers lobel in the very early Sixties. He was three times voted "promotion man of the year". Eventually he become president of Worner Brothers and signed up such names as Rod Stewort, Black Sobboth, Deep Purple, James Toylor and The Doobie Brothers. After becoming choirmon of Elektro/Asylum he helped guide those lobels' expansion into all

areos of contemporary music, and during his era there signings included The Cars, Eddie Rabbitt, Motley Crue and Graver Woshington while The Eagles, Linda Ronstadt and Jackson Browne become rock superstors.

"Yes, obviously the foct that I've been invalved in the music industry for so long has made it much easier for me to get through to many af the names I've interviewed but with some af the older names, ones like Artie Shaw for instance, I've had to use cantacts. Not everybady has been easy to get hold of, because af the logistics involved, but at the end of the day the interviews have made the frustrations all warth-

"Artie Shaw tolked about Billie Holiday and how they used to disguise her in order to get her into hotels and restourants where there was a no-blocks palicy, Mick Jagger talked about haw the Stones' bad-boy image took over the band, and Graham Nash about how Crosby, Stills and Nosh got tagether, and how it all turned sour afterwards.

"There are still a lot of names I've got to get through to, for instance Elvis' old monager, Tom Porker, Bruce Springsteen, Tina Turner, and the other two Beatles, George and Ringo. I'm also trying to tolk to Keith Richard. Unfortunately there have been some disappointments— I'm storting the book from Benny Goodmon's classic Carnegie Hall concert in the Thirties, because that was an important breakthrough for popular music, and I had an appointment to see Goodman in July, but unfortunately he died the month before. Nelson Riddle was another on the list to be interviewed but who sadly died before I could see him"

Smith continues: "Thot's one of the reosons why this book has to be done — we're beginning to lose the older people in the business, ond when they go we olso lose old the great stories that they know."

Ironically he finds many of to-doy's contemporary orists are the most difficult to make contact with — "They build these walls around themselves and they are so difficult to penetrate. On the other hand Paul McCortney was very forth-coming, I expected to meet him in his West End office but I ended up toking a two and a holf hour train journey to his home in Sussex, and our conversations were all the better for being in informal surroundings."

The book will be published either late in 1987 or early the following year, and there will very probably be spin-offs — an ocompanying box-set of records, radio programmes and maybe even TV and wideous

His moin obstacle to completing the book is time — in-between researching and writing We're Talking Music, he's also developing film and TV properties for Paramount Pictures and Geffen Films, and Smith continues to be one of the leaders of the US record industry fight against record and tope

try fight ogoinst record and tope pirocy.

"When I storted the project I thought to myself, "Oh this is going to be easy" but there are times now when I think I'll probobly die before I get it completed!" he jokes.
"However I consider myself privileged to have lived through and worked in the pop music industry during the lost 30 years and I hape that my book will become an important record for future generations."

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
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
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
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
