

ACK HUTTON'S journalistic career - on tour with the likes of The Beatles and The Rolling Stones in the heady days of the Sixties - could almost be a far fetched tale from the Hotspur. it weren't true.

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Will it be a compact disc **Christmas cracker?**

RECORD COMPANIES and dealers alike are dreaming of a compact disc Christmas and all the indications are that this will be the festive season that finally sees the format taking off in a big way, with hardware and software sales each triggering mass consumer acceptance of the other. Chris White reports.

AFTER SEVERAL years of steady growth, the compact disc format is about to explode in popularity and all the signs are that it will be detanated this autumn with hardware sales booming, and the various price ranges of softthe vanous price ranges of sort-ware encouraging consumers who were previously committed to buying tape or vinyl, to switch their allegiance.

With literally dozens of new CD titles hitting the market every

week, the majority of big-name ones being released automoti-cally in the format, and smaller, more specialised companies more specialised companies amply covering the MOR/easy listening/nostalgia/classical area, there has never been a wider choice of CD software ovailable. And the public is not been at a series and the public is not been at

ovaitable. And me public is not being slow in rising to the bait.
"It's definitely going to be a CD Christmas," reports Jonathan Morrish, head of corporate press at CBS Records. "You've

only got to look at the growing sales of the hardware — all the indications are that there will have been a 100 per cent growth in sales during the last 12 growth in sales during the last 12 months, and it is anticipated that there will be an even higher percentage of hardware sales between now and Christmas—

which can only mean huge soft-ware sales."

CBS like other majors has in-troduced a mid-price CD line — 20 titles have been released in

the Nice Price range including Billy Joel, ELO, Abba, Simon & Garfunkel, Neil Diamond, REO Speedwagon and Meat Loaf — and Morrish points out: "With and Morrish points out: everyone coming into the mid-price market the pattern of CD prices is downwards although with full-price CD product it is much more complex — my feel-ing is that it's as much a question for dealers as it is for the record companies. New designs for **CD** packaging

CD consumers want software packaaina that is stylish, sophisticated and easy to handle.

Karen Faux reports

HE LOOK of a CD is part and parcel of keeping consumers happy in the know-ige that they've invested isely in sophisticated hardwisely in sophisticated narro-ware, but the challenge of pro-ducing practical and interest-ing packaging within obvious limitations is currently testing both printers and packaging

All jewel boxes have to adhere to the stringent speci-fications laid down by Poly-Gram that enable them to be processed processed by assembly nachines such as the Ilsennan is capable of 60 ssemblies a minute. However, that there is room for innovation within those specifications has recently been proved by American company Shape Technology, which has come up with some interesting design

Kit Lunny, Shape's director of strategic marketing and licensing, says that the new designs have come about by listening to what their customers have to say and by turning round the ideas quickly. Shape's Welsh factory has been up and running for four and a half years — concentrat-ing on audio and video casset-te production — but is now set to produce its standard jewel

Of most interest is Shape's Lift

It has also given him standing as a realso given him standing as a re-cording act in his own right, and the fact that the record has charted now gives further stimulus for other experiments which are entirely Adams-generated.

Adams-generated.

The point is that the Mixdoctor is a man of music. He is far from being just a technicion able to synchronise rhythms with the aid of a bit of electronics and thus shitch records together. He regards an ear, a feel, an instinct for music (even without necessarily having

(even without necessarily having conventional musical training as such) as an essential part of his creative skill. The next stage for Adams is clearly studio production, working with a recording act. He agrees that he now feels ready for this; a brief experiment some years ago with a funk group proved less than uccessful because he didn't feel he had the authority to impose his musical ideas on the act. Few peo-ple in 1987, however, would argue with the advice of Les 'Mixdoctor' Adams at their control

The re-mix requests, of course, pour in nowadays at an ever-increasing rate of knots — to the extent that pressure of this work and his own project with A&M is forcing Adams to hand some on to DMC colleagues. Clearly, howev-er, he will never turn his back on this side of his work, such a satis-fying creative challenge is it to him


