

# 'Insiders' plotted concert fraud

Detectives who foiled a "pro-fessional" ticket fraud say the culprits could be concert industry insiders.

The plot to offer tickets for bogus Bruce Springsteen concerts was uncovered when police raided an office in Nottingham. One man was arrested and 10 staff questioned.

Last Wednesday's raid came hours after an ad appeared in two Edinburgh newspapers of fering tickets for a gig at Liv-



ingston's Forum Exhibition Centre on February 28. Callers to the Nottingham numbers listed were told that

Police say the fraudsters planned identical stunts in the South West and Yorkshire Ads had already been booked for dates at Plymouth Pavil Royal Bath Centre and Sheffield City Hall. Reservations had been made at all venues in the name of P Lea Promotions.

nce music is certainly enjoying its most healthy period with sales the best they have been and the standard of product particularly high.

The real winners have been the independent labels. They have found their feet and are giving the majors a run for their money in the Top 40, paying the way forward with fresh ideas on selling records.

In these days of little money, we are forced to keep costs low. But even with a low bottom line you can soon break even and begin to show profit by selling relatively few units The emphasis then lies with actual sales rather than chart positions.

Everybody seems to be chasing Top 40 hits but it's nice to think that if that doesn't happen, then selling five or six thousand units will enffice

With majors, there is a natural emphasis on chart profile and it becomes all too easy to overspend trying to achieve it - you

can forget the bottom line! One of the main problems with dance music is the volume of product on the market

Yes, there are more sales but consequently more artists to share them between. Also, the huge number of white labels. indie and major releases. European and US imports, make DJs' lives a lot harder. But despite the problems,

it is the smaller labels that show more efficiency and effectiveness. It's also the independent distributor that seems more in tune with its market place and the independent retailer who shows more expertise behind the counter. As with other musical

genres, majors often look to the indies for new dance talent and if those acts are not long term, then dance compilations are a good alternative. But that said, I'm sure

1992 will see the best UK dance acts rise to the top and begin to sell albums not just in the UK but around the world. Rob Manley is head of Circa's dance department

# **US tours convert** Alchemy to gold

with over 750,000 album sales to their name who spend their Thursday nights in a residency in a Marylebone tapas bar, but that's the lot of Acoustic Alchemy.

They are a band based not surprisingly on an acoustic guitar duo, Nick Webb and Greg Carmichael. Their last four releases have topped the adult contemporary charts, and they were even nominated for a Grammy last year.

But being British, success in the US is not easy to maintain. Acoustic Alchemy have spent the past four years touring to promote each new album. The first three lost money, but as Nick Webb says, "we sold a hell of a lot of product."

That is the rationale of touring, but there are a lot of problems to overcome. Getting into the US can be difficulty clearance has to be

negotiated by a visa broker, says Webb. You have to prove that you have a body of your own work to promote," he says, "and you

need a contract for the start and finish of the tour." Once in the US, the crew is kept American and to a mini-Tour manager and sound en-

Peninsular organises the date six months in advance, and the band tours after six weeks radio play of their latest re-

Ticket sales are enhanced by local radio sponsorship and The band are paid a flat fee at two-thirds of the gigs and a percentage on the rest. Merchandising sales of several hundred dollars a night helps

The biggest cost, aside from the three session members of the band, is the \$400 per day for tour bus and driver.

It would be cheaper to use local musicians but, as Webb points out, "We've always tried to use the musicians who played on the albums to get a better standard of playing and commitment."

Accommodation, however, is not a problem, because hotels are cheap and often the promoter will foot the bill.

But the key to breaking even is sponsorship. Acoustic Alchemy has a "unique" deal American Airlines, which flies the band and crew business class round the States, and help from hardware manufacturer Pioneer.

This year Acoustic Alchemy vill release two albums on the MCA-subsidiary GRP, one of new material, the other a remaster of their 1982 demo. With tour support the latter should sell more than 100,000 copies, says Webb.

Big sales and jet-borne tours of the US are a world apart from a humble London nightspot, but show that touring of the US is still viable for bands with an independent frame of mind.

essential reading for dealer It comes complete with an index to all 50 CDs in the series and there's no better argument in Line's favour as being the compilation series. Once you know about it, the series sells itself.

The company's plans are ambitious: the current idea is to extend the 50 CDs and 800 tracks to 150 CDs and 2,400 tracks. All the tracks are origrecordings and inal remastering is top class. Obvious people are missing Elvis and Phil Spector, for example - but then they're missing from most compi-lations. The series leans a touch too much on the likes of Connie Francis (who has 24 tracks spread through the series!) and Frankie Avalon (12 tracks).

But, ironically, the omissions are far more positive. It hardly touches on R&B (which is well documented elsewhere) and has no British recordings (again, Brit r'n'r is well represented elsewhere).

There are a few silly inclubut all-in-all, Rockfile series is excellent. If you're planning to recreate 1956-63, it's the only series to go for. Moreover at 16 tracks per CD and a recommended retail price of £11.25 the series is a good deal.



This shift was due in no small part to the economic ills of Britain, which severely curtailed sales in the London/South East area, traditional stronghold of

rap, garage and soul.
The north of England and
Scotland, where rave is
extremely strong, escaped the
depression relatively

depression relatively unscathed, and accounted for an increasing percentage of sales, and therefore, influence. Even if the current rage for rave continues, Gordon sees

the majors making sittle response: "The costs involved for majors releasing rave singles would make them loss leaders which would be fine if rave acts sold albums, but they don't. The scene changes so quickly, while demand for someone like the Shadows or Neil Sedaka remains more or less constant."

It seems likely, therefore, that unless or until the dance scene stabilises and produces some constant reference points and album potential, the independent labels and distributors will continue to prosper at the expense of their larger rivals.



Rave is still going strong but the dance

wo distinct factions are moved on and these days is developing in the dance music market. The rave scene has continued to go from strength to strength and has become the dominant youth culture of the Nineties, with people lapping up vast quantities of techno and hardcore records.

Alongside this mass market. the traditional specialist dance continues almost unaffected. If towards garage and soulful house is a reaction against the

overtly soul-less nature of rave. hardcore/techno tunes. These are normally instrumentals with tempos around 130bpm, typically Atlantic, usually released on independent labels and with the Rave culture developed from the acid house scene which has

mainly dancing to garage and these are US song-based tracks with tempos of around 120bpm generally appearing in the UK on major labels and achieving most sales in the South East.

The real picture is more complicated than this. A relatively small number of Americans made some excellent soulful house tracks, Likewise, the north-south divide is by no means clear cut and many records continue to transcend such geographical and musical barriers. But there is no ignoring the general trend towards a divided music scene.

The audience for garage and soulful house is largely based in London, James Horrocks, director of the hardcore label React Music, has a very precise picture of the audience. "It is people in their late 20s who had

Ffrr is one of the few labels to buck the trend, scoring hits with The Utah Saints and Shaft. It has now launched an offshoot label, ffrreedom, specifically to deal with the rave market. Pete Tong. who runs the labels, says he sees his main rivals as companies like XL and deConstruction

Although garage and soulful house have been the subject of tended to dominate the upper echelons of the Club Chart in recent months, they have failed to achieve the same sales quantities as the rave-oriented tracks, thus missing out on the all-important national Top 40. Everybody seems to agree that rave music will continue to retain the upper hand, but most think more tuneful rave tracks

Steve Long, A&R director for Pulse-8, agrees that things are becoming more melodic. is a move away from really noisy tracks like T99 towards more tuneful techno like SL2. Tong sees outfits like Leftfield.

Pundits argue that the rave scene will eventually burn itself out and be replaced by the next be rock-based. But it is still going

The specialist dance market is less predictable. In recent years it has swung between rap, go-go, rare groove, acid house, garage and balearic sounds. It will doubtless move on from garage and soulful house as soon as it can decide on the next big thing.

However, it could be years before it comes up with anything that will have as far reaching consequences as acid house.



# **Collected for prosperity**

Purists frown, but there's no denying the growing importance of multi-artist compilations, be they grab-bags of oldies, thematic collections, tributes or film soundtracks

soundtracks.

The compilation sector of the market has seen consistent year-on-year growth in recent times, and now accounts for almost a fifth of all releases and sales.

In 1991, the market was curiously fragmented with fewer big sellers emerging, though Now That's What I Call Music 20, released at the death. rapidly racked up double platinum sales. In so doing, it belatedly overhauled Dino's Hardcore Ecstacy. which had been on schedule to become the year's sales champion. The Nov series was launched in 1983, initially by EMI and Virgin, who were later joined by PolyGram, and has yielded the biggest-selling compilation in every year since, save 1984 when the rival Hits series from BMG/Sony/Warner took the honours

BMG/Sony/Warner took the honours The launch of the Now series was significant in that it seized the



initiative from the specialist TV merchandisers who had dominated the compilation market for a decade. In 1991, despite the enterprise shown by the specialists, the balance of power tipped in favour of the traditional record companies - those who originate product, rather than simply market it - who merchandised 29 of the Top 50 compilations, compared with 20 for the TV specialists (the one which fits neither category was The Big Red Tape, a Comic Relief charity special sold only by Our Price) of which Telstar accounted for a dozen, to become the single most successful label from any sector, while Dino was



behind the other eight. Conspicuously absent from the list on its return to the UK market was Holland's Arcade. But there's an honourable mention for Ashley Abram's Box music which was involved in compiling nine of the Top 50—18%— including Now!

performed exceedingly well, providing
11 of the Top 50. Though Dino's
Hardcore Ecstasy was the clear



winner within the idiom, the brand leader was undoubtedly Telstar's Deep Heat series, while the spin-off Thin Ice badge also served it well.

Rock compilations are surprisingly somewhat thinner on the ground, and nostalgia releases are also in remission, though Dino's thoughtful compilations of Fifties and Sixties material were well received, as were the latest instalments in its ongoing series That Loving Feeling, one of several currently running that Compilation of the compilation of the compilation of the Some tracks were severely.

overused, these usually being dance hits that also did well on the pop chart - Rozalla's Faith (In The Power Of Love) and Nomad's (I Wanna Give You) Devotion immediately spring to mind - but the continuing rise of classical music has resulted in several interesting compilations with little or no duplication. No fewer than five of these have turned up in the Top 50, with Decca/PolyGram TV's Essential Opera turning in the best performance, taking a more than respectable fourth place in the rankings. The album, which comprises 19 selections from famous operas, is refreshingly wide-ranging, and spans the years 1962-1990.

Movie soundtracks had a poor year, with only five titles in the Top 50, of which only one was for a 1991 Heatrical release, this being Robin Hood — Prince Of Thieves, which finished a modest 40th, behind The Lost Boys (originally released in 1987); Dirty Dancing (1987), Pretty Woman (1990) and only marginally ahead of 1976's Grease.

These aside, the only albums in the Topo to contain previously unavailable material are the aforementioned Big Red Tape and Two Rooms, the elton John and Bernie Taupin tribute.

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
