Richard Handover has rejected widespread speculation that the UK's biggest specialist record retailer is to close a large number of stores.

The rumours were circulating among record company sales forces last week after Our Price issued a statement revealing it would be announcing redundancies at the end of the month.

"There is absolutely no question of it," says Handover. Our store closure programme (in which the company replaces underperforming stores with new sites) is no different the past 10 years. In the past month Our Price

has opened new outlets in Cheltenham, Harrow, Tunbridge Wells, Colchester and Heathrow airport, he says.

"Those are not the actions of a company in a crisis. The WH Smith group is committed to investing in the music industry." Redundancies will focused on head office, says

KPMG administrator Phil Wallace says he has proposed

they are entitled to all the money from the account, which was set up to collect RTD's income after KPMC was appointed to handle its affairs in February 1991 The motion is finally being

put after Wallace reached agreement with Rough Trade founder Geoff Travis that both would waive the claims against each other.

It was unclear whether Travis's Rough Trade Records label owed money to RTD or vice versa because the accounts were so muddled, adds Wallace.

If the final settlement motion is now passed, the company's liquidation will be imminent. But if the creditors do not pass the motion, KPMG will appoint an outside liqui-

For the past six weeks most of the Mercury judges have led the sort of mythical life that John Peel lives, listening to music wherever you're going, in the car, on the train or at home.

Everyone had begun the judging process rather jaded and cynical, thinking they knew what would be on the list. But by the end it was really refreshing. We hope consumers will react

We were all struck by a number of things, Because of the Mercury Prize rules we were listening to albums in their own right rather than recordings containing a few wonderful tracks. What surprised me most

in the same way.

was that we found ourselves listening for a distinctive British or Irish musical quality rather than some global appeal.

What was most exciting was that not only does such a thing exist, but within it there's a huge range. As a rock critic you

become adept at putting things into pigeon holes. But it became increasingly clear that today musicians start with a palate of every conceivable type of music ever made. We felt the Mercury Prize

was a celebration of that diversity. We wanted the shortlist to reflect this by choosing quite different sorts of sounds. Personally what I got

most out of the whole process was to be reminded what music is about. As a critic you think you know too well how music is hyped and controlled. But it's not necessarily

like that. Whether groups are famous or unknown they do still want to say something with music that hasn't been said before. It's easy to think,

especially with all the Sgt Pepper nostalgia, that things aren't what they were. But British music is much richer now than it has ever been, precisely because there's such a diversity of material for the artist and consumer to

draw from. Simon Frith, academic, author and journalist, is chair of the Mercury Prize judges.

EMI absorbs slimmed down **Virgin Classics**

EMI's classical division will take over marketing and distribution of Virgin Classics product from next month, writes Phil Sommerich.

The announcement, made by EMI Classics director Roger Lewis at an autumn product presentation to retailers last week, suggests the shake-up of Virgin Classics will be more extensive than was stated when five redundancies were announced last month.

Only two of the original 11 Virgin Classics UK staff are likely to remain with the label, despite EMI offers of redeployment or new jobs for six of them

EMI insists Virgin Classics will remain an independent label with its own A&R although new label chief Jonathan Miall's expertise lies in financial adminis-

Miall was unavailable for comment last week. The label's product will be

distributed from EMI's Leamington depot from next month. Releases from Virgin Records will not be distributed by EMI until April 1993.

Classic FM expects to take as many listeners from Radio One as Radio Three when it launches in September, pro-gramme controller Michael Bukht told the Radio Academy Festival in Birmingham on Tuesday

Radio Four is expected to provide 37% of listenership, followed by Radio One (24%), Radio Three (24%) and Radio Two (16%).

I f you were an indie or worked for Columbia, the second quarter of 1992 was one you could really call

The indies' success was not absolute, of course. PolyGram alone has a bigger share of the singles market than all of the UK's independent labels put together. But in relative terms, UK independent labels have never done better than in the second quarter of 1992

Just take a look at the period's Top 10 titles. A full four out of the top five records - to include both Tug and XL which are independent, though major distributed - emerged from small entrepreneurial labels.

The star among these was undoubtedly Birmingham-based label KWS's cover of Please Don't Go stayed at number one for five weeks, and propelled the label to third in the label rankings.

The key indicator of independents' success in the singles market was the whopping 14.1% of the market accounted for by distributor Pinnacle

its highest ever share.
The independents' share of the market currently stands at 21.6% if distribution is taken as the definition or 29.2% on the company rankings

One force driving that forward is the growth of "third party" distributors like RTM and Rio


Supplementary data from Gallup shows that RTM accounted for 4.9% of the singles market over the period thanks mainly to Mute act Erasure, while Total had around 3%

spearheaded by Tug's Right Said Fred As for Columbia, the second quarter saw the Sony label power from strength to strength in the singles market, with a burst of activity giving it the same double of top singles and albums label it last had in the first quarter of last year.





F ew would have predicted that I'm Too Sexy would be the first of a series of hits for Right Said Fred, and fewer still would have tipped them as Silver Clef Award winners.

The prospect of Tug, their label, becoming the ninth biggest albums company in the UK - with 1.9% of the market - would have seemed even more unlikely a year ago. But with just one album, Tug earned a larger market share than compilation specialist Dino. So much for the trio eing one-hit wonders.

Tug is, of course, still a long way off PolyGram, though. The market leader now has a massive 35.2% share. more than double its nearest rivals Its dominance may be challenged by this time next year, however, when the Virgin distribution contract is due to have shifted to EMI.

Lionel Richie's dominance of the albums chart in June triggered the most spectacular shift in fortunes within the second quarter of 1992.

Motown, so long in the doldrums in the UK, upped its share by over 500% with new licensee Polydor to take seventh place among the leading albums labels.

The albums list is still topped by Columbia, but by a reduced margin. After a quiet three months, its share was down nearly a quarter over the same period last year




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Publishers crack the whip

PRS' and MCPS' rights crusade will send shock waves through Europe, writes Martin Talbot

The news that both PRS and MCPS are moving to put their European partners in their place will give royalty collectors in Germany, Italy and the Netherlands plenty to think about.

After initial probes into the foreign societies' use of royalty income. PRS has refused to renew existing licensing deals pending renegotiation. MCPS, equally keen to cut.

out the double administration costs of record company central licensing deals, is also looking at plans for a central accounting body in partner-ship with the Americans.

Officially, there is no co-ordinated joint attack, but both thrusts have a common thread - they are publisher driven

As PRS council member Stephen James suggests, UK publishers have finally run out of patience with the European societies. "I've thought for years that the European societies have been getting away with blue murder. We haven't been tough enough," he says. Scans of Italian society

SIAE's database have showed an apparent lack of English language songs, raising fears that it has been failing to register — and thus pay for — radio and live plays of many British works.

And the social fund levy. which siphons off 10% of composers' and publishers' royalt-

ies, is also causing concern. Intended among other rea-sons to help pay for European songwriters' pensions, some of the cash is being used more "creatively". Dutch performing right society Buma even attempted to launch a radio station devoted solely to local repertoire two years ago.

Estimates suggest that PRS and MCPS could be losing more than £30m a year because full songwriter royalties

But "technical visits" to societies in Italy, Germany, France and Belgium have

since suggested there is more work to be done. Further excursions to other societies are planned this summer.

Income is being gathered but, according to UK publishers, it is nowhere near enough. The Netherlands - ironically. given the Buma radio fiasco is one of the best overall payers, contributing near the estimated 15%-20% of turnover many publishers believe UK reportoire to be worth in Europe. In reality, most societies pay out nearer 5%.

The MCPS move towards central accounting has been motivated by similar concerns, including a fear that money belonging to UK composers and publishers is used to pay for discounts and special deals which, allegedly, form part of central licensing agreements.

As EMI chief executive Martin Bandier says, "It seems common knowledge that the mechanical rights collection societies throughout Europe are doing whatever they can to attract the major record companies.

Underlying the new publishing industry crusade is the realisation by UK and US companies that they need to take a more active interest in licensing their rights. It is not solely a matter of cash power is at stake

MCPS will inevitably play a pivotal role in any European central accounting system, and not simply because it has the most up-to-date systems. Unlike the songwriter-owned

European organisations, MCPS is publisher-owned like the US Harry Fox Agency. As Warner Chappell worldwide chief Chappell worldwide chief executive Les Bider confirms, keeping any new body in pub-

lishers' hands is vital. Equally, PRS will emerge stronger than ever in Europe if it is successful in standing

up to the European societies. In the long-term it puts the publishers on course for their stated goal — a combined mechanical right/performing right royalty collector

In the meantime they choose to talk in conciliatory tern PRS chief executive Michael Freegard insists he is not holding a knife to the throat of his fellow rights societies

And at MCPS Frans de Wittoo talks of working to gether with the other European organisations, operating a central accounting system in partnership with MCPS. Nobody wants to raise the temperature too much just vet.

Ultimately both MCPS and PRS hold the trump cards, however. The Anglo-American repertoire is hugely valuable to the likes of Gema, Stemra/Buma, STRM/Sesac and SIAE. "A lot of these societies

would not be able to survive without the royalties from British and American songs. says one senior PRS insider.

With ASCAP and the Harry Fox Agency both backing the PRS and MCPS strategies, the UK publishers are at least not forced to go it alone.

How paradoxical that, 1992 the year supposedly of European unity, the UK seems to be realising it has most in common with its American partners.

on radio plays and record sales for UK songs such as I'm Too Sexy and Stay are not finding their way back to the UK. Even though latest figures

show PRS income of £136.9m and MCPS revenue of £113.1m (18 months), the loss of funds cannot be easily dismissed in times of recession

But while the slump motivated the publishers, tackling the European societies has always been on the agenda. MCPS chief executive Frans de Wit says, "Things have simply been accelerated." The year 1992 is, after all,

supposed to herald a new age of European unity. Record companies were

quick to embrace the pan-European ethos: they began running manufacturing and licensing centrally over 10 years ago. But according to former MCPS company secretary Keith Lowde, UK publishers have lagged behind. Even the European licens-

ing bodies - such as Gema, Stemra and Sacem — moved quicker towards central licensing, with Stemra securing one of the first such agreements with PolyGram in 1987 In the UK, MCPS's publish-

er owners were slow to recognise the danger of such deals It took BMG and Warner's subsequent agreements last year to spur them into action. At PRS, too, the publishers

have begun to play a more active role. New faces on the general council such as Steve Lewis (who stepped down last month), Dejamus's Stephen James and PolyGram's David Hockman have, over the last few years, taken a fresh approach towards the society's European dealings. The council was encouraged

by the success of US society ASCAP in renegotiating its continental agreements - led, incidentally, by Frans de Wit before he left for MCPS last In an illustration of the new


