Radio One has snatched the radio rights to next year's London Music Week convention from under the noses of its London rivals, in a move which further raises the stakes in the battle for the capital's listeners.

The national station's involvement vill help make London Music Week the UK's highest profile music industry event of the year. As co-partner, Radio One will assist with a programme of gigs under the banner "Radio One Live

At London Music Week". The move highlights increasing com petition for London listeners. A fortnight ago, Capital announced an internal reorganisation, and Virgin

Council decision puts Forum's future in doubt

Vince Power is warning that he may have to close his north London music venue The Forum if a decision by Camden Council to halve its audience capacity is not overturned Power's Mean Fiddler Organization

is currently deciding whether to appeal against a decision by the council's licensing sub-committee to cut its capacity from 2,110 to 1,200 following complaints by local residents.

The new licence also restricts the number of people able to remain in the building after midnight to 300 from Monday to Saturday

MEO owner Power says he is angry at what he calls a maverick committee's ion to render the venue untenable. "I'm pissed off with the council, which "I don't see why we should spend thousands of pounds begging for a licence. At the moment, I'm still furious about such a stupid decision.

The Forum will continue to stage all the gigs advertised as normal until the Power. "There will be no effect on gigs for the time being. We have several options to consider, but there's no way The Forum will stay open if it has a licence for 1,200."

Forthcoming concerts include dates by Gene, Midnight Oil, Maxwell, Jamiroquai and Shed Seven.

The council's licensing sub-committee imposed the new restrictions following a meeting on October 8, when local residents raised complaints about traffic congestion, crime, noise and parking

Music promoters say such a reduc-tion in the licence reduces the Forum's appeal to big name acts. Tony Goldring, promoter at Jef Hanlon Management, says, "It's always been one of the top rock venues and it would be extremely

"There aren't enough venues of that size and it's the only one in north London. If it was cut to a 1,200 capacity, it would make it unsuitable for a lot of acts, putting it more in the league of Break For The Border."

Tim Parsons, director of MCP, says Power has assured him that the forth coming Midnight Oil gig will go ahead as planned. He says he hopes Power and the Mean Fiddler Organization can fight the council decision. "Knowing Vince, he'll manage to pull something off so they can keep it open," he says.

The fifth Music Industry Trusts Dinner has been hailed an outstanding success for the new organising team, headed by PolyGram's senior vice president for pop marketing David Munns. Awards chairman Munns achieved his goal of open-

ing up the dinner as an event for the whole music industry, including publishing and radio. The event culminated in the presentation of the Music Industry Trusts Award to DJ Alan "Fluff" Freeman.

Munns says, "It went off better than I dared hope. We wanted to add a bit of fun into the event. Fluff was hilarious and [presenter] Chris Tarrant was great. It

hilarious and presenter Units I strain was great at was a great excuse to see the DJs through the ages and we raised money for some worthwhile causes."

Recognising the tough task in finding a recipient as warmly received as Freeman, Munns says another rethink may be due next year. "You can't do anything twice, so we will be looking for another angle," he says

Freeman received a standing ovation from the 950 people crammed into London's Grosvenor House Hotel on Monday night as he became the fifth recipient of the award, 36 years after he arrived in London from Australia to launch his British radio career.

Function overload

In a music industry calendar which is becoming ever more crowded, the past few weeks have been a vo weeks ago, it was the IMF and Ascap Awards, last ek it was the (really excellent) Music Industry Trusts ward dinner and, over the next three weeks, th the BMI Awards, the Woman of the Year event and the MTV Europe Video Awards.

Add in conventions like London Music Week and in The use in conventions like Landon waster verse and in the lifty, promotional opportunities, such as Sound City, and eminars, and one cynic suggested to me that ompanies should start hiring people solely to attend try events, so as not to distract people who tually have work to do.

That's a little harsh. Events only really survive if people port them and they fulfil a proper business fu that will strike many as peculiar, however, is the news that we are just four weeks away from the Mobo - Music Of Black Origin Awards - to be televised by London's weekday ITV broadcaster Carlton, barely a th after the Black Music Awards, which was televised by London's weekend ITV broadcaster LWT. There is clearly scope to develop the coverage and identity of black British music. The established M/Best celebrations and British R&B Association

But the proliferation of events in a relatively small area of the business can only weaken rather than strengthen one's efforts.

We'd suggest the organisers of these events get together to ensure that next year there is a sin ordinated event, held with the support of the BPI and Bard. Not only would that help those people who already have more than enough functions to go to: it would certainly better fulfil the brief of exposing black music to a wider public - and selling it.

Getting hip to the Babybird sensation you away and you can't stop playing it. Well it just happened to me with Ugly Beautiful by Babybird. Yes, yes I know every hip and trendy person has been on the ise since the release of the four Lo-Fi albums over the cal lapsed buyer who needs a hit single to awaken heir interest in a new act. So I slotted the tape into the chine with interest, only to find that the pure pop gs I'd been expecting had taken on a darkly hue once the lyrics had been explored. Just what is Cornershop about? But the piece de resistance is the 10-minute rant of King Bing. Sounding like the Doors at their best (and that's some recommendation), leader Stephen Jones gets a lot off his chest - much of it an artists' bewilderment about the state of singles' narketing in this country. Play it, sell it, enjoy it.

Donna Lewis: well played Warners tulations to Warners for a great job done on the Donna Lewis single, It's so rare these days for a no micky record to climb the chart once, let alone five es, that someone deserves a pat on the back. When the record first charted at number 34 I thought they'd wn it because of the "first chart position is the nighest" rule. But perseverance paid off. A classy pop single – let's hope there's a follow up on the album.

Smiths calms fears as key director walks out

WH Smith Retail's new head of entertainment John Cormode moved to calm music industry fears last week after key director Nigel Kenyon Jones unexpectedly quit the company

Kenyon Jones resigned from the retail chain to pursue other business interests. He was promoted only three months ago to director of the newly-created entertainment, interests and relaxation business unit of music, videos and computer products.

Cormode, 44, says that he has no plans to scrap plans to upgrade the company's entertainment business fol-lowing Kenyon Jones's departure. "My arrival and Nigel's departure means no change in our strategy," he says. "It's very much business as usual. We're developing an entertainment strategy to move us forward and to increase our market share

As part of the reorganisation, the retailer has been looking to strengthen the profile of music within its stores, including, in some cases, moving music THE SUMMERTIME BLUES

He was unavailable to comment on his future plans as Music Week

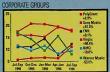

Spiced-up Virgin

It's good news on all fronts for Virgin as it celebrates one of its best perform

SINGLES

Barely four months ago, few people outside the music business had even heard of Spice Girls. Today, they're number one with their second single, after propelling Virgin Records to one of the best singles quarters in its three decade history

By the end of September, the Spice Girls' debut single Wannabe had sold 1.1m units, two-and-a-half times as many as any other title in the quarte

That one single accounted for 6.8% of all singles sales during the period and, therefore, 60% of Virgin's own 11.0% share. Virgin, otherwise, had two other titles among the top 50 best-sellers, George Michael's Spinning The Wheel (number13) and Neneh Cherry's Woman (number 35).

The company's closest rival, Columbia, enjoyed a quarter which was built on two records – both by Fugees. While the act's previous hit, Killing Me Softly, had peaked before the beginning of the period, the track still managed to be the quarter's second biggest single, with Ready Or Not the sixth biggest single of the quarter.

Pugees are not alone in scoring substantial success across the quarter with two different singles: Peter Andre's Mysterious Girl and Flava

both on Mushroom, racked up 500,000 sales in total and were the quarter's fifth and eighth biggest sellers respectively. Interestingly, while the singles do not push Mushroom into the mpanies' Top 10, the company does make seventh place in the corporate share listings At the top of the corporate listings,

continues to be frustrated by PolyGram. With the second and third biggest companies of the quarter in Columbia and Epic, Sony could again have felt confident that it might steal a march on its rival, but it again ends up in second place by the odd tenth of a



Sony's strength in breadth is impressive at the top end of the chart: it can claim eight of the quarter's 25 biggest-selling singles, thanks to Fugees and Kula Shaker on Columbia, Jamiroquai on S2 and the Lightning Seeds, 3T, Celine Dion and Bone Thugsn-Harmony on Epic. PolyGram, in contrast, can claim

only half as many but, as usual, its sheer volume of hits helps it take the top slot for the fifth successive quarter. In total, the company registers 19 singles among the quarter's Top 100 iggest sellers. For all its resilience, PolyGram loses its dominant position

at the top of the distributor league table under the challenge of EMI. With EMI UK, Parlophone and EMI Premier performing solidly, EMI Records is the third biggest corporate group ahead of the EMI-distributed Virgin. And while PolyGram's distribution

share suffers a lull for the second summer in succession, EMI takes the opportunity to overtake it for the second time this year. EMI's 22.8% share is the biggest single haul by any distributor since BMG topped the table with close to 30% in the second quarter of last year, a period boosted by the

arrival of Robson & Jerome. Indeed, PolyGram would have slipped to third place if BMG had been able to add in its fulfilment of physical shipping of both Peter Andre singles (with 3MV as the sales force) and labels such as Telstar, Ginga and All Around The World (with Total). The 3.8% and 1.0% shares would have pushed it into ond place with 18.6%

Meanwhile, the battle among the independent distributors is hotting up in a big way. After a relatively quiet start to the year, Vital leapfrogs Pinnacle to take the title of the biggest indie with 5.4%

But the big surprise is the emergence of Disc since its relaunch last summer. It achieves a 150% increase in share with 5.0% - thanks to its deal with RTM which brought it singles by Ash, Rocket From The Crypt and The Charlatans - ahead of Pinnacle's 4.0% Pinnacle's slump is all the more

surprising because of the strong start it le to the year, with an 8.6% share for January to March and also because it is the first set of figures to include Zomba product following July's takeover. Had Zomba not contributed its 1.1%, Pinnacle would have recorded an even more disappointing quarter. But, then again, ups and downs are a way of life in the singles market Martin Talbot

Say You'll Be There is the 19th

number one of the year, one more than in the whole of 1995. The last time were more number ones by the end of October was in 1988, when 20 ords had taken turns at the top at this stage. With several other ers for number one before the end of the year, 1996 could come close to matching 1965 and 1980, when a record 25 singles reached the summit. So far this year, 13 singles have debuted at number one, beating the record 11 established last year. The previous record was six, in 1991. Of the 61 records which have debuted at mber one in 44 years of chart history, 24 of them have come in the last 22

Bally Sagoo's Dil Cheez equalled a 27 year old chart record last week. Debuting at number 12, it equalled the highest chart position for an Indian language disc, as established by the Radha Krishna Temple's <u>Hare Kri</u>shna Mantra in 1969. The Radha Krishna ensemble followed up with a more subtle and equally ethnic second hit Govinda, but Indian language hits have been thin on the ground since then, though this year has definitely seen a revival, with Kula Shaker using Indian Lyrics in Tattva and in their upcoming single Govinda (no relation to the Radha Krishna hit). The wholly Indian Trickbaby single Indie-Yaru reached number 47 a fortnight ago, while Stereo Nation's Anglo-Indian single I've Been Waiting reached ber 53 in August. For the second time this month

Julie McDermott is in the Top 40 with Don't Go. Julie was the featured vocalist on Third Dimension's version of the song, which reached number 34 a fortnight ago, and she's also the singer on a version of the song by Awesome which debuts this week at number 3, which debuts this week at a 27. Awesome 3 recorded the song first, and previous mixes of the song by them peaked at number 75 (1992) and 49 (1994). The Third Dimension version of the song is back to back on the chart with another three-time hit - Felix's Don't You Want Me. Another record having its third outing is Duke's So In Love With You. older age group, too," says Crawford. The station doesn't use much call-out research. "It's our job to judge whether a record will go down well on radio, rather than play a snatch of a song down the telephone to someone to see what they think," says Crawford.

TRACK OF THE WEEK DONNA LEWIS: I LOVE YOU ALWAYS

East West's Donna Lewis conquered more than the American charts with I Love You Always Forever, which retained number two position on the Hot 100 for nine weeks.

Her success there contributed hugely to UK radio's take-up of the track, which has been vying for the number one airplay spot for the past three weeks and enjoyed more plays than any other record last week, with

Alan McGee, promotions director at East West says, "I'm not saying it wouldn't have been a hit here, but her US success was established in people's minds and Ric Blaxill's decision to have her exclusively on Top Of The Pops before it was released was largely down to that. But, at the end of the day, you can't keep a good record down."

First serviced to radio on August 9, it was released on August 26, by which time Radio One, Capital and most of ILR had come on board. The entire Capital group, GWR and Emap also showed considerable support



As the track continued up the sales charts, moving to a number five peak, its radio plays increased

correspondingly. "When you get a debut like that, it

climbs the chart rather than entering high, because there's no fanhase to begin with end, being a sentimental track, it appeals to a wider audience than a pop record," says McGee.

Due to the longevity of the single East West may not release the follow up single until early next year, although McGee says a new Lewis track will probably be on the airwaves over the Christmas period. Catherine En Catherine Fade

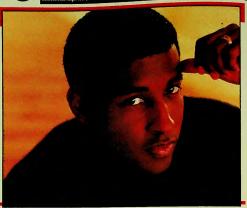

babyface: 'this is for the lover in you' (epic) hip hop

With guest vocals by Howard Hewett, Jody Watley and Jeffrey Daniel, this record is history in the making as Babyface regroups the original members of Shalamar as his backing singers. In fact, Hewett does more than sing backgrounds, he's an integral vocalist on the record alongside Babyface, who revives this old Shalamar classic in a hip hop-soul style with an additional guest appearance by LL Cool J. Sounds like a hit to me and it should set up the new album very nicely for the multi-platinum-selling artist, songwriter and producer.





KICK UP THE VOLUME

GLENN TOBY 'Holiday' (Eightball). Quality garage tune whose real strong point is its pounding kick and tom drum rhythm which, combined with the deep bassline, gives a sublie but very infectious tribal feet. Add some phased-out vocal bits and off-the-wall samples out vocal bits and off-the-wair surrius and you have a real underground groove, particularly in the 'dub mix' which, although 10 minutes long, never runs out of ideas. An Import to

DJ SNEAK 'Keep On Groovin'' (Strictly Rhythm). Two different sides of Sneok emerge on this release. The first and more familiar is the discolled house side with its looped samples of some obscure track flowing in and out. The other mix features a gruch jerkier rhythm arrangement, heavy on the backbeat with tougher percussion sounds. They're very different in style from one another but both are excellent mixer tracks, drawing you in with their hypnolic, repelltive loops. Great for US house devaless.

THE BLACK SAINTS 'The First Day' (Emotive). An American deep garage groove that cozes soul from its superb rhythms and gentle organ and string ports more than its actual vacal. Almost old skool in style with a Robert Owens soundlike singing the lyrics with tremendous possion over a simple arrangement that allows everything plenty of space. Towards the end it really takes off and could do with a little more of the same.

PURE SILENCE 'The Sunset EP'

(Re-Hab). This label has been gradually building its reputation for finely crafted deep house productions that have plenty of atmosphere and this EP will add to that. 'Cool Breeze' is quite mellow and melodic, while "Wanna Luv" is a builder, by which time you're ready for "Cool Shok" which fizzes along with a swinging hi hat rhythm and deep rumbling bass impressive stuff from an act that plans to do all this live soon.

YONI 'Zoolou' (Sugarcube). In the face of major label cheese it's a relief to know that there are still plenty of small UK labels emerging with freshsounding underground house. 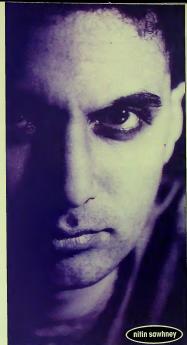

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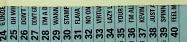

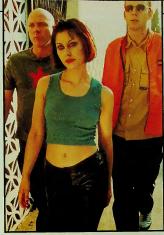

ENIGMA

THE MAN BEHIND THE MYSTERY

Wherever you are in the world, you are likely to hear it: the chant of a Native American, a remote African tribe or an austere religious order backed by the rhythms of Western pop music.

The music of Enigma, and the whole genre it has inspired, has become so widespread it is hard to believe it did not exist before one man conceived it That man, Michael Cretu, remains largely unheralded but, as he refuses to be photographed and styles himself as an enigma, he has little cause for

complaint. Cretu was born in Romania and, after classical training, became a studio musician in the Seventies. His first significant success came in the Eighties with Europe-wide hits for the German pop star Sandra, who later became his

For the past eight years, Cretu ! lived in Ibiza, creating the music of Enigma in almost complete seclusion. However, Cretu has recently opened his doors and permitted a brief glimpse

into his private world by giving the first public airing of the third Enigma album Le Roi Est Mort Vive Le Roil at the place it was recorded, the studio that adjoins his home. Cretu, 39, is genial and hospitable

and certainly no recluse, but he's most comfortable within the confines of the studio he created in 1989, which he describes as his "living room

He says, "After a big Sandra album, I had some free time for the first time in

years and I started to make music for

myself."

Coming out of Europop, Cretu began working on something closer to his own favourite music: the conceptual, albumorientated work of bands like Pink Floyd and Yes. "I always liked music like this, but I could no longer buy it, so

I did it myself," he says. Cretu's use of two very different and highly unfashionable sampled soundsthe Peruvian-style panpipes and monks singing the Gregorian Cantus—over laid-back disco beats was his masterstroke. "The panpipe was one of the basic samples on the old Fairlight and I'd been trying to find a reason to use it for years," he explains.

Cretu took the Enigma project to Virgin Records Germany, where he had already been for several years as an artist/producer, signed by the now managing director Udo Lange. In October 1990, the first Enigma single, Sadeness Part One was followed by the album MCMXC A.D.

Sadeness topped the charts in 23 countries and the album has become the most successful German production internationally of all time: it has sold 12m units, reached number one in 41 countries and was in the US albu

as the musical parents of his latest ork. "The intention was to mix the elements of the first two and to give them a role," he says. The Gregorian chants and panpipes are back, acting as signatures before Cretu moves into new ground.

long way since Sheila Chandra and Monsoon had a hit with Ever So Lonely in 1982. In recent years, it's been possible to hear second generation migrants from India and Pakistan making music informed by Western pop, dance and rock, other cultures and their own traditional ethnic sounds.

To acts like Apache Indian, Bally Sagoo, Kaliphz and Babylon Zoo can now be added the name Nitin Sawhney.

Priest, is a polyglot groove that traverses decades, genres and continents in the space of 10 tracks.

Sawhney's own musical development is so diverse it crushes attempts to create stereotypes. A Hindu Punjabi, he was born in 1964, a year after his parents moved to the UK from Delhi. Musically gifted, he found himself pursuing all sorts of directions and styles from a young age, learning plane

and flamenco guitar and listening to jazz and the traditional classical Indian dancer at home. Having fronted his own jazz group, The Jazztones, he graduated to playing funky licks for The James Taylor Quartet in 1988. before joining with percussionist Talvin Singh to create the Tihai Trio. In the early Nineties, Sawh

began composing for theatre, TV and film before embarking on a solo career with the album Spirit Dance

His two subsequent releases, Migration and Displacing The Priest, are unique-sounding, splicing traditional and electronic instruments. flamenco and jazz sounds, drum and bass and trip hop beats, Indian and soul vocals.

"The whole thing I'm trying to do is show there are no barriers, it's just

about checking other cultures and finding where they meet up," explains Sawhney. "For example, flamenco music came from India originally, it's fusion music and I'm simply developing those kind of roots.

"Asians born here have the same influences as white people plus another set of reference points from our parents and our heritage, so I feel it's an advantageous thing.

"We have more to say and a stronger vocabulary. In that respect, what we're doing is on the cutting edge, which is why Talvin Singh is in demand with people like Björk and Massive Attack." One of the problems Sawhney encountered in forging his own musical direction was getting a record deal. His first solo album appeared through World Circuit with the aid of Arts

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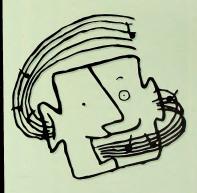

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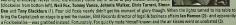

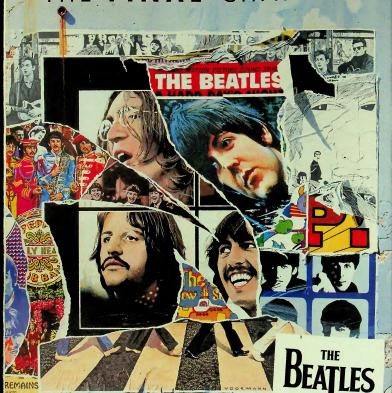
