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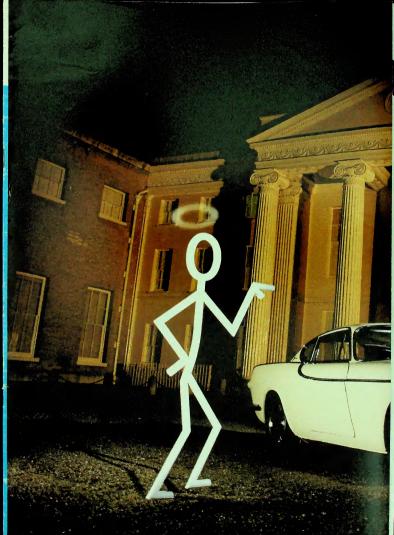
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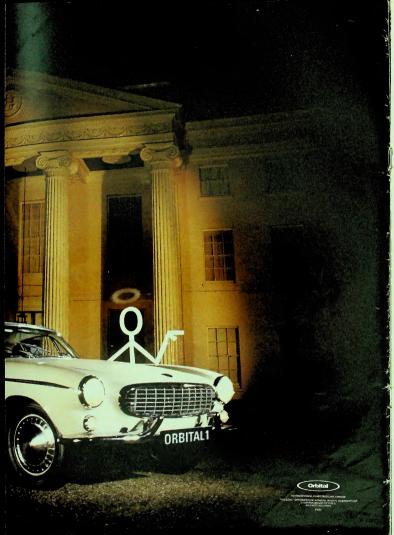

Tesco ads spark price fears

Record companies and retailers fear the industry could be blighted by an allout price war this spring following Tesco's launch last week of one of the most aggressive retail pricing cam-

paigns the industry has yet seen.

Tesco attacked the pricing of WH Smith and Woolworths in a series of newspaper ads last Wednesday, in what is being viewed as the first step in a spring price-cutting offensive.

In the ads - which go under the tagline "Unbeatable value" - Tesco highlighted five top-selling chart albums, quoting its own prices and the higher prices of its two High Street rivals. It is the first time retail price

U2's Pop, Spice by Spice Girls and Manic Street Preachers' Everything Must Go were priced at £11.99, £10.99 and £10.99 respectively. WH Smith and Woolworths price the albums £2

higher, according to the ad. The campaign sparked widespread dismay, with record companies including Sony, Virgin and PolyGram insisting they knew nothing of the promotion until the ads appeared. Tesco declined

Retailers fear Woolworths and WH Smith could be prompted to take retal-iatory action, although Woolworths would not be drawn on its plans week and Smiths says it is not plan-

But one independent retailer says Tesco's campaign could lead to a "bloodbath" this spring, "If this is the way Tesco is setting out its battle lines, by naming other shops, then those shops may respond," he says. "I hope they

won't, but I fear the worst." One sales director describes the campaign as "a disgrace" which further underlines the threat posed by the

Virgin Records sales and marketing director Mark Hutton says, "The cam-paign reflects Tesco's absolute confidence that it is the best-priced out there, but I wouldn't mind betting on ome reaction in the next two weeks

simply aiming to boost its market share to strengthen its bargaining position with record companies. "This could well start a price war with other retailers who can't afford to let them get away with it," he says,

Bard chairman Richard Wootton, of Ainleys in Leicester, says, "It's certainly not helpful for the industry and it's regrettable, but it's difficult to see how such a campaign can be curtailed

News of the campaign, which is iewed as another blow for indie retailers, comes as dealers in Ireland revealed plans to create a joint buying group to help them compete on leve terms with the bigger chains.

MTV sheds staff in continental restructure last year into three programs

MTV Europe has axed around 40 jobs as part of a restructuring of the music channel to localise its output across the continent.

MTV president Brent Hansen says that around 20 production staff have been lost from its London headquarters and sources confirm another 20 jobs have gone in the marketing and com-

munications departments. Hansen says new recruits are being made on the continent to work on new

"It's very sad that jobs have had to go, but what's happening is that we are sitioning our resources to suit the

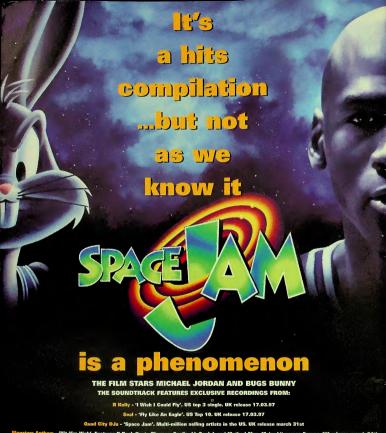

Virgin celebrates eight **MW** Awards victories

Virgin Records dominated Thursday night's Music Week awards, scooping eight of the 17 record company prizes presented on the night.

At the ceremony attended by more than 1,500 industry executives at London's Grosvenor House Hotel, Virgin picked up awards for top classical album, compilations company, singles company, albums company and artist album company.

It also won two judged awards for its success with Spice Girls: Muff Fitzgerald picked up the PR award for his press campaign, while the five-piece won the international breakthrough award for success overseas in 1996 Virgin also won the top sirplay award for George Michael's FastLove.

Virgin managing director Paul Conroy says, "It's very gratifying for us to win so many awards. We've sat here a number of years as also-rans, but last maintain the current level of success with its crop of new artists, he says.

Among its biggest hopes for success is Placebo, whose singer Brian Molko presented Virgin's top albums company prize, adding, "They're a record company who have taken very good care of me over the past year.

Are buying groups the indies' solution? Beleaguered, belittled and battling against the odds, independent retailers sometimes sound like a bunch of manners. The difficulties for small operations trading in an increasingly competitive and cut-throat retail sector are all too soparent. But the question most often asked of those who complain is. "why don't they do something about it?" It is refreshing, then, to report some positive action by independent shops in Ireland, Independent furniture traders woke up to the buying group solution years ago. Three or four such groups sprung up, among them one fittingly called Floreat – let it flourish For small furniture businesses such groups appeared the only way to compete in what was fast becoming a commodity husiness, with small shops up against price-cutting out-of-town sheds. Sound familiar? The initiative worked for the furniture shops, and it could work for independent music retailers. Superior range and service are always noing to be their key ammunition, but they still need to compete on price. Buying groups are an obvious way to ensure they can UK indies would do well to study the progress of the trish initiative very closely.

Positive action is going to be even more essential in the light of last week's diabolical developments on the High Street, Whatever anyone says, Tesco's aggressive new campaign not only deflects music buyers' attention away from the specialists, but is bound to drive prices down even further. The industry must decide for how much longer it wants to pick up the tab for supermarkets' battle for marketshare.

Grammys: a sign of US malaise I, as a lover of American music from Elvis to Babyface,

am saddened by the Grammy Awards. They gave The Beatles three awards, 27 years after they split, including two for the terrible Free As A Bird single and video. Eric 'Slowhand' won best male pop vocalist amazing for the world's greatest guitarist. Who chooses these winners? They must be living in some kind of timewarp. No wonder the US music industry is in bad shape. In the first two months of this year, eight labels closed their doors; 14 changed addresses; 13 A&R people moved jobs; and 41 lost their gig or were fired. To pile on the misery, America's biggest music chain Musicland, is in dire straits brought about, we are told. by a slump in demand. America has to make better music. Thank goodness for the upsurge in UK talent the Spices at number one and Gina G and Mark 'the bad' Morrison in the Top 30. Together with the new wave of acts such as Republica, they give the US something worth buying. Long may it continue.

The most worrying aspect of the Grammys was Hilary Clinton's prize. Maybe next year's Brit Awards might feature Tony & Cherrie Blair getting an award for best duo, if certain key industry figures get their way.

Let's stamp out free product

I'm sure the recent Radio One programme about chart hyping was compulsory listening for most of you. It's amazing that some companies don't care how many records they give away and some don't have any idea how many are being sent out free. Since the programme pointed out how lemming-like most companies are in wing suit, the only solution is new rules to stamp out this practice. Otherwise we'll all be losers in the end - even the general public, whose choice will shrink as all but the majors fall by the wayside (or even the cliff!). Promoters fight for acts in busy summer season

Festival promoters are facing increased competition to sign up top live acts this summer, with a schedule boosted by an expanded Donington and the return of Glastonburn

Nine UK festivals are already confirmed between May and September, excluding one-day events, and all will be vying for the same premier groups

Glastonbury returns after a year off, with Paul Weller, Neil Young, Smashing Pumpkins, The Prodigy, Radiohead and Supergrass expected to perform. And, for the first time in its 16-year

istory, MCP-promoted Donington is ecoming a two-day event and broadening its musical policy to feature alterna tive music as well as its traditional hard

An MCP spokesman says no acts are yet confirmed for Donington, but adds it is targeting mainstream alternative bands such as Ash and The Prodigy. Melvin Benn, festival director for the Mean Fiddler Organisation, says he is not worried by MCP's shift away from Donington's hard rock roots, "I can see SUMMER FUN

It will also feature an Evening Session Stage showcasing the best in new bands.

Stuart Clumpas, managing direct of the event's promoter Big Day Out, says, "It's getting a bit busy now and with everyone now hopping on the bandwagon, the market becomes satuarated, band fees go up and ticket prices

Clumpas, whose Big Day Out also copromotes V97 which will feature Blur and The Prodigy, expects T In The Park to improve on last year's two-day total audience of 66,000 at its new site at Balado, near Kinross in Perthshire, But he believes the newer festivals or ones which have not carried a market niche will suffer: V97 is pitched specifically as a non festival, he says.

Neil Warnock, managing director of booking agents The Agency Group, says he believes the festival circuit is approaching saturation point. "There are just about enough bands to go round at the moment, but I can't sea it is nossible to add any more festivals with the present customer base," he says. "The country is adequately covered and any more would be overkill."

Irish indies link buying in battle with multiples

Independent retailers in Ireland are planning to launch a ground-breaking buying group to help them compete with the music multiples and supermarkete

Up to 50 shops have expressed an interest in joining the group - the Independent Retailers of Ireland. The stores have already raised enough funding to employ a full-time buyer

A meeting with leading wholesalers and distributors took place in Dublin last Tuesday (March 4) to finalise arrangements for a summer launch.

Jo Carroll, owner of five Zhiyago Records stores in Galway, says, *Independent retailers are concerned at the level of discounts available to the multiples and non-specialists and this is one way for us to compete. "The group will not just get deals on CDs but may also share the same shop name in future, run a gift token scheme and bulk-buy goods such as carrier bags

In Ireland, the specialist multiples ate music retailing in large cities HMV claims a market share of 30% with its seven stores, while Virgin Retail has four Megastores around Dublin.

The distribution network serving Irish retailers is markedly different to that in the UK: only Sony Music Operations has a distribution centre in Ireland and its facilities are shared by Warner Music. The other majors supply product direct from the IJK. Most independent product goes through whole-salers such as Dublin-based Record Services, which has Total, V2 and Zomba among its clients, or the growing number of independent distribution companies

The initiative has been greeted with

cautious enthusiasm by British inde

pendent retailers who say they will watch the Irish scheme's progress with Richard Wootton, of independent

Ainleys in Leicester, says, "If it's possible to get an extra 10% discount b as a group, that's a great idea. But if one supplier has to deliver to 25 different locations the extra delivery costs would tend to negate any discount earned."

Dougie Anderson, proprietor of Coda Music in Scotland, says a buying group in the UK would save money, but he adds, "If it operated from a warehouse it would have to hold a lot of stock to cover all different types of music.

Andy Gray, managing director of Andys, says one person would have to take charge and administer the group. Although it would give retailers extra discounts, he says problems could arise if some people in the group did not pay their part of the bill

Moore, who has already signed The Crocketts and Daytona to Blue Dog, will A&R the label with V2 providing the marketing, distribution and other facilities.

Freeman revives Pick Of The Pops

Radio Two has hired Alan Freeman to revive Pick Of The Pops. The show will run from 4-5.30pm on Saturdays from April 5. He will also present a Tuesday evening classical music show, Their Greatest Bits, and continue presenting his Virgin Radio rock show on Friday nights.

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Spice Girls see indie publisher snapping at the majors' heels

Back in the summer of 1995, Windswept Pacific managing director Bob Grace had lunch with Simon Fuller, who told him about a new act he had started to manage. They would be needing a publisher just as soon as the signed a record deal.

A few days later, five girls waltzed into a house at the end of a smart Holland Park cul de sac —Windswept's London offices — and delivered an impromptu rendition of a song called 2 Recome L to Grace and his staff

Grace wasn't the only publisher Fuller talked to but, six months on, it was Windswept Pacific which signed

Spice Girls to a worldwide deal.
As a result, Windowept took a
greater market share than any
independent publisher in 1996. After a
fourth quarter in which it claimed 5.5%
of the market, Windswept is snapping
at the heels of the majors.

Grace describes the Spice Girls signing as, "the richest deal I've ever been involved with." Other publishers may have baulked at the asking price, but Grace did not and feels fully

justified.
"People thought I'd been a bit reckless, but for me it was a considered judgement," says Grace. "I told America and Japan — I couldn't sign them without their approval – that this would be nothing or a total pop

phenomenon."
Founded in 1988 as a co-venture
between Chuck Kaye – the former
president of Rondor and Warner Music
– and Japan's Fujisanake i corporation,
owners of Pacific Music, Windswept's
early strategy was to acquire back
catalogues for exploitation through film

When Windswept's UK division was launched five years later, with former Chrysalis and Rondor managing

director Grace at the helm, its aim was to establish the company as the most successful mid-size publishing company around. "The unashamed

intention was to recreate what had been achieved at Rondor," says Grace Since then, Grace has built a solid team headed by creative director Nick Battle and creative manager Peter McCamley. Battle, whose background is in radio and TV promotion, over the established writers and their catalogues domestically and internationally, with McCamley on the professional side developing the ounger writing talent. It was McCamley who spotted the potential of new boy band sensations 911 and signed their writer John McLoughlin the day their third single Don't Make Me Wait entered the chart

In many ways, Windswept's trump card is its international connections. It was the link with Hollywood which proved one of the bigger selling points for Fuller. "Because of Windswept, we were getting movie offers even before

we broke in America," he says. He also stresses the importance of its Japaness ownership. "The simultaneous launch in Japan was always planned, and the publisher can make a big difference in getting TV ads and airplay there," he says. The Far Eastern connection is also proving important for 911, who are a priority act this year for Teshiba, EMPs isster

act this year for Toshida, EMTS sister record company in Japan. Crucially, Windswept is small enough to give its acts closer attention than the points out. "Windswept also really wanted the girls more than anyone else," he says. "It's small enough to really care, and for the Girls to be their most important act."

Grace stresses that, for all
Windswept's strides in the market
shares, he has no immediate ambitions
to make it the next major. "We are
deliberately a medium-sized company,
because you can't give personal service
to your writers if you have a million

copyrights," he says.
The trim, youthful looking Grace has an improbable 30 years' publishing experience and an enviable record of signings including David Bowie, for Hunky Dory and Ziggy Stardust, Santana, Supertramp, Dire Straits, Squeeze, Joan Armatrading and Red

Temperton.

The Spice Girls are certainly not the limit of Windswept's success. Grace has just signed deals with Burt Bacharach and Joni Mitchell – for almost her entire catalogue – and is now building on the early success of 911.

"We have the next two 911 singles and, with Virgin behind them, it's looking very promising," says Grace. The success of their current single The Day We Find Love suggests Grace's confidence is well-founded.

Indeed, even if Spicemania recedes in 1997 – an unlikely development on current form – Windswept Pacific looks set to remain a permanent fixture in the market share figures. David Knight



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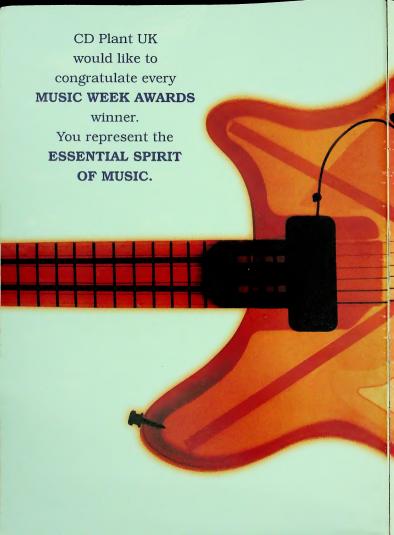


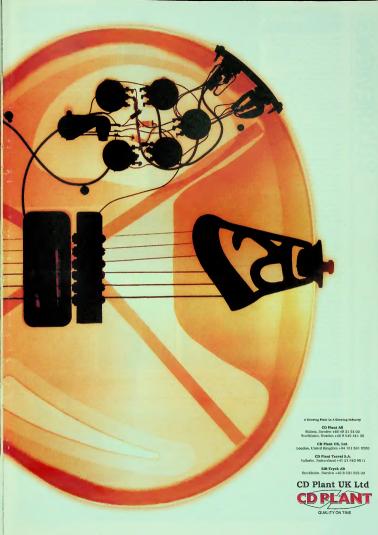

While there's nothing else here quite as good as Alone, it's still a superb album...Hot on the heels of faithful remakes of Seventies club classics like Runaway and Keep On Jumpin', The Braxtons' hustling revamp of the Diana Ross hit The Boss is assured of success. Shaping up as the record most likely to dethrone the Spice Girls' Wannabe in America,

STATION OF THE WEEK

For a station that has seen its weekly reach, market share and audience hours increase significantly in the past nine months, the bosses at Leicester Sound seem a touch nervous.

After two years of discussions with the Radio Authority, the GWR-owned station finally changed frequency from 103.2FM to 105.4FM on January 8 to solve the problem of poor reception in some parts of Leicestershire. The worry now, however, is whether its

The station will not know the answer to that question until the second quarter Rajar figures are published, but it should be confident that its current music format, aimed at the 25-44 age group during the day and 18-24s in the evening, will guarantee its audience's

lovalty Programme controller Steve Fountain has continued to modernise the station's music policy since he was annointed in June He holstered the evening playlist by adding new releases and featuring local bands such as india acts Eusp and Stretch to appeal to Leicester's large student

Leicester Sound's weekly reach in a transmission area of just under 600,000 had jumped from 146,000 in quarter two last year to 156,000 by quarter four as its market share rose from 17.1% to 20.0%. Its listeners are also tuning in for longer, up from 11.6 hours per adult to

The station's commitment to music in the region goes further than the tracks it plays, however

US band No Mercy's Where Do You Go had already achieved top five status in 13 countries, including the US, Australia and Germany, before it vas picked up by UK radio, with North East station TFM the first to play it last

The track had been serviced to redio in time for a September release but Arista delayed the launch after clinching a slot for the trio on BBC1's National Lottery Live for the week before Christmas. The postponement meant it had enjoyed more than 1,100 plays before it was finally released on January 6

City FM in Liverpool was one of the track's early supporters. Between September and November, it played Where Do You Go 300 times and continued its support into the new year. By the time the song entered the igles chart at number 10 on January 18, City FM was still playing it around 43 times a week, while the song itself

was number seven in the Top 10

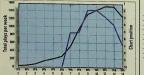

But I'd say that it's impossible that at least 50% of the people that come to the club won't be going 'Fuck, what's this all about?' when they hear it

YOU'VE ALSO STARTED HAVING A CORE OF RESIDENT DJS AT THE

CLUB. HOW'S THAT WORKED OUT?

Well, I've actually worked out that we've been booking more guest DJs in 1997 than we were in 1996. The difference is that they've been bookings of a much more defined nature, whereas in the past we booked less DJs and just rotated them. Overall. it's been a case of more quality, less cheese. I'm pleased with it and I can't believe it's working so quickly. Although not my own bag, Mark presents his usual high quality house style with his own well-tested signature that'll please his followers no end. A&G's mixes are the deep and moody style we have come to expect from them, which build dub-styled intros, crystal clear sounds and well thought out arrangements that will roll along at any stage of the evening. All of these topped off with Future Force's vocals and you can't go far wrong with any of the mixes. OOO

FONDA RAE 'LIVING IN ECSTASY (REMIXES)' (WAVE US)

It's garage stalwart time with Francois Kervorkian's Wave label serving up some tough new mixes of this Mood II Swing-produced tune by Fonda Rae. Jean-Philippe Aviance's MT Mix has hard-hitting beats nationing away beneath the Fonda's full vocal, while his 10-minute Candy Flipped Dub raises the temperature with a relentless rhythm and pumping synths. Listen out for the brief snatch of swirling ambience from Way Out West's 'The Gift'. Louie Balo adds another driving dub that really rocks in a Van Helden kind of way, plus there's a very useful acapella. ○ ○ ○ ○ ○

DJ'S RULE 'GET INTO THE MUSIC' (DISTINCT'IVE)

Second time around for this on Distinct'ive, now forthcoming with loads of mixes on two 12s, An enthusiastic reception last year in its Hybrid and brilliant Goodfellaz (pictured) mix, but for some reason it didn't cross over as it should've done. Rhythm Masters have a couple of mixes on this outing in a club and dub format that are not as rough cut as some of their recent material - somewhat toned down, in fact - and sounding very good indeed. The Skindeep remix is minimal - there are acid effects galore, while still employing the vocal and plano in parts in a specialist field, with the Scott Boys remix dubbed up and underground - very rugged. The 97 remix is the commercial drive, very entertaining and radio friendly, and finally the Goodfellaz mix gets a reprise - a fine uplifting peaktime track that still gets the ultimate vote on this one. O O O O

GRAHAM JERIMIA 'CAN'T STOP NOW

Do not let the dodgy sleeve put you off, because Graham Jerimia's tunes are much less cheesy than his self-produced artwork. The title track of the EP is a useful house workout with a tasty bassline and an extra helping of percussion, 'Anyone For Cocktails' applies the disco pressure with its funky bass, spikey guitars, retro keys and looped chants, while 'When Bernie Sings' is an appealingly odd mix of jazzy Hammond grooves and bluesy harmonica over more four-to-the-floor beats, 'Our Love' raises the tempo at the end and picks up the discoid flavour once again.

THE PROBLEM KIDS 'PARADISE' (III SUN

An old school disco-type groove thang produced by Uschi Classen, Rocky and



Mark Wilkinson that borrows various string, brass and vocal loops from yesteryear and layers them over a 'Love Hangover'-type bassline, There may be additional musical parts or it just may be all samples, but frankly it doesn't matter because the result is a useful piece of retro house that gets more interesting as it goes on. There's also a deeper and sparser Regained mix for those that don't get off on all the disco strings 'n' things.

K-LAB 'IN THE LAB (AGAIN)' (UNDISCOVERED) (H) Both sides of this release are deceptively simple and easily overlooked if you don't give them a close listen.

'In The Lab' starts with a very basic bassline, kick and hats rhythm but builds very gradually as various synths and stabs work their way into the mix before it drops right down to just the bassline halfway through, Very atmospheric, as is the B-side's 'Free Love', which is altogether funkier in style with some strange vocals filtering in and out. ERASURE 'DON'T SAY YOUR LOVE IS KILLING ME' (MUTE) (H)

Standard house mixes of Erasure's latest catchy pop outing. Tall Paul's mix dispenses with virtually any trace of the original and provides a pumping Trade-style NRG trancer while Jon Pleased Wimmin's low-key version does actually feature the full verse and chorus and has some pleasant electronic overtones - a dubbler version of this would have been useful. There are also remixes of their classic 'Oh L'Amour' though the less said about them the better. O O O

AIM 'LOOPDREAMS' (GRAND CENTRAL)

This EP epitomises how UK hip hop has progressed in the past year or so to the point that, creatively, it outshines all else. The lead track - as featured on the label's 'Central Heating' compilation and remixed by Aim and Rae & Christian - is a richly soulful, yet edgy jam that overflows with energy and warmth. Next up, 'Just Passin' Through', features a wonderful organ riff and a mellow vocal hook that's simply blissful. On the flip, 'Phantasm' is slightly harder rhythmically and focuses on more of a sax jazz vibe. The closer, 'Original Stuntmaster' (also from 'Central Heating') is basically an interview with stuntman Evil Knievel over a psychedelic Sixties guitar-meets hip hop soundtrack. REACT 2 RHYTHM 'INTOXICATION' (JACKPOT)

This is the first taste of the updated Guerrilla back catalogue, all of which has been picked up by Jackpot with some high-profile mixes planned. Digweed & Muir's Bedrock have the pleasure of reinventing React 2 Rhythm's classic, and reinvent it they do. Slight snippets of the original drum pattern and a subtle whispered vocal are the only giveaways. The tempo is much faster and the intro is mix friendly, preparing all for the massive wind up and kick in for the meaty part of the track. A huge complication of synth sounds makes up the majority with a scratch-filled break beckoning the gallop to the end. The original is also available - a classic with a massive injection of '97 life.

HHC 'WE'RE NOT ALONE' (PERFECTO)

This will be instantly familiar to any of you who listened to Paul Oakenfold last year. Colin Hudd and

In fact, if there's a criticism to be made it's that all three have taken the track in more or less the same direction - tough tribal percussion, strong synth hooks, deep organ riffs and so on. While US R&B has undoubtedly become one of the most dominant musical styles of the past decade, the genre has never been able to produce artists with the star quality and staying power of the soul greats of the Sixties and Seventies.

Mary J Blige is a rare exception and her third album, Share My World, will undoubtedly confirm her reputation as the modern day Queen of Soul.

Radio One's R&B DJ Trevor Nelson is in little doubt shout Blige's unassailable position. "She's the one," he says emphatically. "Her LP is the one everybody waits for and that sets the benchmark for everyone else to follow. For the kids on the street today, she's literally their Arstha Franklin. She's got that much respect."

Due for release in the UK in mid-April, Share My World won't disappoint Blige's considerable fanbase here.

The album exudes a new confidence and Blige admitted to Music Week – in her first UK interview about the new album – that she is now happier about her career than ever before. This is a significant matter for an artist who has gained a reputation as a tempestuous character in the five years since her debut LP What's The 411?

"I'm just confident and relaxed with Mary now," she says. "I just feel better about myself, because I know me now. I know the things I can and cannot do. Y just have to do the things you want to do and that you're happy with."

The list of production credits on the album reads like a who's who of the US R&B world and underlines the respect in which Blige is held. Those featured include such heavyweights as Jam & Lewis, Babyface, R Kelly and James Mrume, alongside newer names such as Rodney Jarkins and Malik Pendleton.

It is rumoured that D'Angelo produced tracks for the album, but there wasn't room for his contribution. Twas looking for whatever was hot. Whoever had the best stuff went on the album. There was a lot of stuff we didn't use," says Blige.

An indication of just how good the final product is can be gauged by the fact that a George Benson guitar solo was taken off the finished version of one of the LPs highlight tracks Seven Days because, ultimately, it was felt it wasn't needed.

The first single from the album, Love Is All We Need, is one of the few more uptempo numbers and is one of the two tracks on Share My World produced by

CAKE SEEKING A SLICE OF THE UK ACTION

Would it be glib to herald the arrival of Yankpop? This year has so far seen s proliferation of diverse, alternative US rock acts whose tastes stray far beyond the coseted, formulaic world of grunge and its environs

Few bands can claim to have busy at the 1995 Glastonbury festival as Spearhead. Not only did they play on each of the three days, but they opened and closed the festival, stepping in on the Sunday night due to Gil Scott

Looking back, Michael Franti, Spearhead's founder, songwriter and frontman, sees a pleasing synchronicity as his band are one of the few still carrying the torch for social

consciousness in music. "Spearhead's about continuing the work done by people like Gil, Bob Marley, Marvin Gaye, Curtis Mayfield,"

Chocolate Supa Highway, their second album for Capitol Records, demonstrates how far Franti has moved beyond the strident polemic which often featured in his earlier act the Beatnigs and Disposable Heroes Of

'It's different to shit I used to do with the Disposables, because everyone began to forget about the meaning of the slogans, it just became a mad cathartic release," he says. "Sometimes it's better to whisper something than to shout it."

Chocolate Supa Highway, referring to "the other side of the information super highway - the black realm", is an aggressively entertaining album. It weaves Franti's singular style of singing and rapping with sinuous, strident and often sensual rhythms, Act: Spearhead Label: Capitol Songwriters: Franti/Young/Azim/others Producer: Franti Publish



reflecting the diverse elements in the band including Rasta vibesman Ras I Zulu and soulful vocalist Trinna

Franti regularly employs the narrative style of Heron and another inspiration, Linton Kwesi Johnson. For example, Gas Gauge and The Payroll on the new album both examine racial attitudes still unresolved in America. The songs are deliberately open-ended, intended to encourage rather than impose ideas. Franti says, "A song which is too definitive can only be listened to once

Material like U Can't Sing R Song, the soulful second single from the album, and Water Pistol Man also illustrate Spearhead's ability to challenge the urban/R&B ganre with more funkiness and intelligence than most of the material that passes for real "soul" these days.

Ironically though, in the past Spearhead have been tagged as too alternative for the black format and too black for the alternative format. The band's A&R manager at Capitol US, Kim Buie appreciates the problem and, o, she maintains, does Franti

"Michael understands this, Touring is his best weapon as he is not tied to people's prejudices. On this new album there are superb songs, some of which, like U Can't Sing R Song and The Payroll, should blow black radio away,

"Video is fast becoming a supporter of Spearhead and, in terms of Europ where support from the territories has always been excellent, our aims for this record are as in the US - to break into TV and radio," she adds.

Recently, Spearhead have been touring on the Smokin' Grooves ticket

with Fugees, Cypress Hill and Ziggy Marley & the Melody Makers. As a result of the camaraderie spawned with Ziggy's younger brother Stephen, a collaboration took place on Bob Marley's classic 3 O'Clock

Roadblock. Included on the album, it will appear as a single on the Tuff Gong label, as will the album in the Caribbean, a fact which gives Franti

immense pride.

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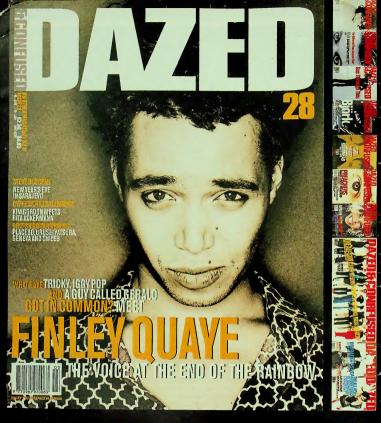
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
