national FM full-service commercial radio licences in the new Czech Republic, allocated by the country's new radio and TV broadcasting authority in Prague on February 25.

A total of 15 projects have been submitted to the authority, including Radio City (backed by Luxembourg-based group CLT), Radio Rio, Radio 98, two Australian projects and cultural programme Radio Cobra.

Radio Wins UK **Copyright Battle**

Record companies in the UK have been dealt a major setback in their bid to boost the royalty payments they receive from commercial radio stations, under a ruling handed down March 2 by the Copyright Tribunal.

In an action brought by the Association of Independent Radio Contractors (AIRC) to set new broadcast royalty rates for 79 commercial radio companies, Performance Phonographic Ltd. (PPL), which represents the British record labels, saw its arguments for rates as high as 15% of all broadcast revenue roundly rejected by the tribunal. The current rate is between 4-7% of a station's net advertising income.

In its 63-page ruling, the tribunal instead set the new stanbroadcast royalty rate payable to PPL at 5%. However, the royalty rate now applies to net

income from sponsorship, barter and contra deals for the first time, as well as advertising revenue. The rate for stations with net broadcasting revenue between US\$1.02 million and US\$525.000 will drop to 3% and 2% for those net income below US\$525.000. The royalties are retroactive to April 1, 1991.

The total operating profit of the commercial UK radio industry in 1990-91 was approximately US\$11 million with Capital Radio and the London Broadcasting Company accounting for nearly 80% of that amount, according to the Tribunal.

PPL had argued, among other points, that the value of its repertoire to broadcasters had increased significantly through the elimination in 1990 of restrictions on "needletime," a ninehour daily limit on the use of commercially recorded music. The Tribunal ruled that the lifting (continues on page 25)

PolyGram Operating Income Up 7%

Worldwide music and entertainment group PolyGram reported a 7.3% increase in operating income to Dfl 789 million (app. US\$448 million) on a 4.6% rise in sales to Dfl 6.62 billion last year, despite a severe recession in several of its key European markets.

Net income for the fiscal year ended December 31 was up 13.5% to Dfl 506 million. The company contributed the results to the continued turnaround at its North American operation and to strong performances at several Far Eastern subsidiaries.

European sales slipped nearly 1% to Dfl 3.77 billion while operating income rose 1.6% to Dfl 560 million. The company estimates its European market share at 22% from 22.5%. Operating margins in Europe edged

Bertelsmann Out Of German Viva

Bertelsmann AG has pulled out of discussions to finance the planned German cable TV music channel Viva. The decision comes as no surprise to insiders in the record industry; the media giant is known to have had cold feet about the deal from the start. The German government is also believed to have expressed reser-

vations concerning the company's increasing involvement in various other commercial broadcasting projects. An estimated three-year start-up capital of DM 100 million (US\$63 million) is said to be another reason for the company's U-turn on the deal.

Bertelsmann threatened to pull out of finance discussions at the end of 1992, but was coaxed back (continues on page 25)

MCA/GRP Label Marketed Through MCA/Geffen

The recent launch of the new US label imprint MCA/GRP will not directly impact the modus operandi of MCA/Geffen's European marketing managers, although it might lead to a change of focus. This is how MCA Records International senior VP Stuart Watson believes the creation of GRP Records' new subsidiary will affect MCA/Geffen's European operations.

In the US, GRP has teamed up with parent company MCA to channel its non-jazz artist roster and to facilitate the expansion into the pop area.

"There are certain GRP acts," says Watson, "that we refer to as 'crossover artists,' like Spyro Gyra, Crusaders and Larry Carlton. I'm not saying they are not jazz, but they have appeal across a wider spectrum. In those cases, I want the frontline marketing people to get involved."

This means that the MCA/ Geffen marketing managers can start working the release as opposed to the more strictly jazz-oriented GRP marketing managers, based at the various BMG Ariola companies throughout Europe (apart from the

In the US, MCA/GRP material will be primarily worked by GRP staff. "The last thing I want," says Watson, "is to lock GRP repertoire in a specialist area and prevent it from making a crossover. But it is not just a case of dumping more artists onto the marketing managers.

They will all have their set of priorities and an MCA/GRP release may be one of them. This will be judged case-by-case."

The first release through the new imprint is the debut of Latvianborn artist Laima, a superstar in the former Soviet Union and Eastern European states.

He confirms that the group will be closely involved in bidding for the re-advertisement of the six existing licences, and two new London-wide franchises advertised on March 3. Chrysalis will not disclose what format they are proposing, he said, but affirms it will be "new to the region."

Chrysalis first became involved with UK radio in 1989 when it acquired 20% of group owner Metro Radio.

Other major industry groups expected to apply for the North West region include Emap, Trans World Communications, Granada Television, Border Television, Guardian Manchester Evening News and a consortium led by Colin Walters, former MD of Piccadilly Radio/Manchester.

Radio 3 Joins Fight Against Racism

HOLLAND
Dutch pubcaster Radio 3/Hilversum joined in the concern surrounding the spread of racism in Europe with a one-week antiracism campaign at the start of February to try and help combat the problem. Hourly 30-second spots, some by Dutch rock/pop stars, an "06" phoneline and a special anti-racism brochure were all featured in the campaign, which also received official support from the ministry of culture, the ADO anti-discrimination organisation and the Anne Frank fund.

Station coordinator Paul van der Lugt says the response from the public to the campaign was overwhelming. "This is the first time that Radio 3 has run an action like this and reactions have been very enthusiastic." It went so well that they are planning to do similar things in future, he says. A total of 200.000 stickers were distributed, besides 2.000 T-shirts and 10.000 posters, while the phoneline was jammed with calls, he says.

As Holland's most-listened to station, with a 30% market share and some four million listeners,

Van der Lugt says that Radio 3 has an obvious role to educate young people about issues such as racism. "As a public broadcaster we can help spread awareness that racism is a problem and make it clear to our listeners how unrealistic it is to discriminate against people because of their colour or beliefs."

Radio 3's action followed an incident in Holland where Radio Veronica DJ Jeroen Van Inkel found himself at the centre of an anti-semitic rally when he brought Veronica's Drive-In-Show to central Holland town Achterfeld. During the disco, several youths clubbed together and began shouting "Jew, Jew." Shocked, Van Inkel answered back telling the youths over the microphone that their "IQ's were smaller than their shoe sizes." Van Inkel later thought up the idea of having an anti-racist week on Radio Veronica, which won the immediate support of other Radio 3 members. He says the highlight of the week was the remake of an old '70s Tom Clay song What The World Needs Now, recorded especially for the campaign and including recent news excerpts. There are plans to release the single in the near future.

GERMANY: Musikmarkt Publishers Buy French Trade

The publishing house of German trade magazine *Musikmarkt*, **Josef Keller Verlag**, has bought a share in French company **East Side West Side Publications**, the publishers of French trade *Show Magazine*. Show Magazine is claimed to have a circulation of 6.000.

FRANCE: Bidding For Radio Monte Carlo Kicks Off

Eight companies have made official bids to acquire a majority stake in Radio Monte Carlo, according to Gerard Ganser, president of state-owned company Sofirad, which owns 83% of the RMC-TMC Group. Ganser declined to reveal the names of the bidders, but said in the weekly publication Stratégies, that the privatisation "will not take place before the end of March...for technical reasons." According to Ganser, the only part to be privatised will be the full-service radio station RMC and gold station Nostalgie, as well as ad representative GEM. The audiovisual sector (TMC) will be unaffected by the sale.

EUROPE: Springsteen Returns To Europe

Bruce Springsteen will be touring Europe again this spring. The eightweek tour, starting at the SECC in Glasgow on March 31, will include the UK, Ireland, Germany, Switzerland, France, Holland, Belgium, Portugal, Spain, Italy and Scandinavia.

ITALY: Sting CDs Stolen

Over 100.000 CDs and 8.000 video cassettes of Sting's new album *Ten Summoner's Tales* were stolen from a lorry on its route from Germany, where the product was manufactured. Polydor MD Adrian Berwick believes the theft had international implications, given its closeness to release date. Polydor took out adverts in daily newspapers to warn potential purchasers of the theft, and the incident has received widespread newspaper and TV coverage.

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Dutch Sales Slump 14% over 1992

HOLLAND

The music industry followed the same pattern of decline in 1992 as other key European markets with a 14% slump in unit shipments to 31.2 million and an 11% drop in trade shipment value to Dfl 453.7 (app. US\$252), according to figures just released by Dutch industry body NVPI.

The figures, based on NVPI member companies (approx. 80% of the Dutch market), show the first downward turn in the Dutch market after an eight-year growth period leading to a slow-down in the CD boom. Comments NVPI head of marketing services Olav Vlaar, "Holland was one of the first markets to adapt the CD massively-now it's one of the first markets to show a decline. Everyone who wanted a CD player now has one and we are seeing a return to a normal buying process. Next year I predict the market will continue to decline by around 10%, perhaps more, and in 1994 we will return to a more stable situation."

The decline of the CD began in the second half of 1991 according to the NVPI, as most Dutch consumers had replaced their old vinyl favourites with CDs by this time. With negligible

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vinyl sales and a decline in cassette sales, the Dutch record market is now almost totally centred on the CD however, which accounts for 89.5% of total industry turnover and 96.4% of album sales.

CD sales were down 10% from 1991 to 24.4 million, also down 10% in value to Dfl 406.3. Meanwhile cassette shipments fell 38% to 1.6 million (worth Dfl 14.7 million), while vinyl plunged 77% in units to just 98.000, dropping 79% in value to Dfl 573.000.

The total singles market was down 20% on units to 5 million, decreasing in value by 9% to Dfl 29.9 million (US\$ 16.6 million). Cassette single sales tailed off 18% on 1991 figures to 295.000 (worth Dfl 1 million - US\$ 550.000), while CD single sales levelled out up just 0.5% to 3.5 million units (worth Dfl 25.3 million - US\$14 million).

Vlaar does not think the new DCC and Mini-Disc will replace the CD market. "The new formats will be in addition to the CD and will increase the market share of the cassette in Holland."

Radio Energia Expands Into Porto

PORTUGAL Lisbon's number one EHR station Radio Energia, has begun broadcasting in Porto, adding another 3.4 million people to its reach. The two cities account for nearly 90% of the Esc 8 billion (app. US\$54.5 million) in advertising spent last year in Portugal. The station has also signed on to the MTV Europe Affiliate Network.

The move into Porto helps cement the station's plans to create a mini-network in the country. "Porto was a natural place to expand for us since everybody already knew about us in Lisbon and liked what they heard," says international programme manager Jorge Alexandre Lopes. "It's all part of our step-by-step plan to become a

mini-network. In October-September we really started working in earnest to move into the city. In advertising terms, Porto was the right thing to do."

Adds GM/PD Nuno Santos, "For '93 our aim is to increase the interest in the kids of Porto and develop new approaches to students because they are our main trump card."

Energia is 45% owned by the **Projornal Group**, which in turn is owned by Swiss publishing company **Edipress**. Projournal also owns a majority stake in Energia's sister station, News/Talk net **T.S.F. Radio Jornal/Lisbon**. In the recent Lisbon ratings, Energia earned a 6.0% cume share while T.S.F. Radio Jornal had a 7.9% share, second highest in the city. SW

Irish Minister Calls To Radio To Support Live Music

IRELAND

The Republic of Ireland's new minister for arts and culture Michael D. Higgins called for greater radio airplay for live music at the recent Smithwicks Hot Press music critics' awards ceremony in Dublin. During the event, hosted by Hot Press magazine, for which the minister wrote a political column for five years, Higgins said he was unhappy with the radio time given to live music and hinted at future plans to provide a voice for live music.

"The music industry is a source of energy and magic," said the minister, adding that this should be reflected in the educational system. Meanwhile, IFPI chairman Peter Price of Warner Music Ireland criticised the classic hits format used by Classic Hits 98FM in Dublin and a number of local stations around the country, saying that "Classic hits are not the future—new talent is."

future—new talent is."

He continued, "A recent survey of youth lifestyles shows that 87% of kids between the age of 10-24 listen to music regularly. That's up from 77% in 1990. It amazes me that all those other stations are pumping out classic hits for an audience of 'new buyers' who should listen to new music."

Meanwhile, *Hot Press* editor **Niall Stokes** pointed out that only 13 of 165 tracks listed in a playlist questionnaire in a national evening newspaper were by six Irish artists, while Irish artists accounted for 25% of total music sales in Ireland.

Irish Locals Gain Strength

For the sixth survey running, Irish independent local radio is gaining ground on pubcaster RTE. Local radio's market share has jumped to 43% for the July-December 1992 period, while the last JNLR/ MRBI survey reveals RTE Radio 1 (N/T) network with a 2% drop to 37%.

Michael O' Keefe, CE of the independent radio and television commission, attributes the increase in independent radio listenership to local programming and music output. "The coverage of the recent general election on local radio received praise from advertisers and listeners, and it is now clear the listeners are staying." MMc

Ochenta, Minuto Combine Forces, Formats In M-80

Following SPAIN creation from the merger of private Spanish nets Radio Ochenta and Cadena Minuto in early January, 32-station net M-80 covers virtually the whole country and all major formats, according to new PD José Ramon Pardo.

"In conjunction with our other stations, namely Serie Convencional (N/T), Radio Dial (national

music), Los 40 Principales (EHR), Radio Madrid (EHR) and the small Radio Olé (regional music), we have covered all the

major formats. M-80 is solidly ACEformatted." Says

Pardo, "Our audience learned about music listening to 40 Principales. Now they are older, but they still like to listen to pop music." Typical M-80 artists are Eric Clapton, Paul McCartney and Spanish acts Mecano, El Ultimo de la Fila, Jan Manuel Serrat and Joaquin Sabina, he says, adding, "We currently

programme about 33% old hits, and 35-30% Spanish music, though this depends completely on current releases.

In cities previously covered by both stations, the frequencies were redistributed to other stations in the group according to need. In Madrid, for instance, the new net takes over the old Radio Ochenta frequency, while the old Cadena Minuto is now being used by Radio Madrid. M-80 is using the personnel, programmes and

facilities of both the stations it replaced, under the auspices of new overall director Miguel Angel Pascual from Cadena Minuto. The

merger was a Miguel Angel logical and inevitable step, as

the two nets were owned by the same company, says Pardo. 'Radio Ochenta belonged to Grupo Antena 3, which is in turn owned by the Spanish holding company PRISA. Meanwhile, Cadena Minuto was owned by SER, which is itself part of

PRISA. So we had two stations in the same group competing for the same audience in several markets. However, neither station alone covered all of Spain."

But what may end up distinguishing the net most clearly from competing stations with a similar format, such as Onda Zero and Cadena 100, is the decision to programme more French and Italian music, a move which has historical precedents. "In the '60s and '70s, this music was hugely popular in Spain," says Pardo. "It is relatively ignored now, and we want to recoup this wasted musical capital. Our vision is definitely 'European'."

To promote the new network a campaign was launched using both print media and the resources of sister company Antena 3 TV. Both record company and advertiser response has been positive, with no loss of advertisers in large markets such as Madrid. Pardo is optimistic both that revenue will considerably exceed earlier projections for the year, and that once this early transitional period has passed, that the net's ratings will surpass those of its former components.

Radio CD Rises After Format Change

AUSTRIA In the first ratings conducted since its new look in October, Austrian private station Radio CD followed closely behind Vienna ratings leader Ö3, with 17% compared to the leader's 49%.

The station, which covers east and south Austria from beyond the border in Slovakia, changed its format to broadcast a combination of hot ACE and dance. Following its success in the capital, the station must now work on its national ratings, which it hopes to raise to 5% within the near future.

Says station PD Gotthard Rieger, "We don't have any regulars anymore. Instead of special featuring interest programmes at certain times, we air all interesting news and topics at once. Waiting with a story for the relevant show makes no sense." Besides that, he adds, news coverage has been cut to flash bulletins.

As part of its expansion plan, the station has broadened its target group of 15-25 to also include the 25-35 group.

One of the main FRANCE points discussed on February 11 at the first meeting between broadcasting authority CSA and new music industry association Comité de Liaison Interprofessionnal de la Musique (CLIM) was the current situation of French production on radio stations, particularly on the main FM networks Skyrock, Fun and NRJ.

Among proposals CLIM made to the CSA were:

- to establish through meetings with CSA and CLIM representatives a clear definition of "francophone chanson" and "new talent.
- to bring together the CSA and the industry to create a body to monitor the state of music on radio and TV
- to use the deals signed between radio stations and industry organisation SNEP regarding French music as a basis for forthcoming broadcasting authori-

to consider a "bonus" during the frequency allocations to the stations that give more room to French music and new talents.

CLIM also underlined the need for stations to respect the payment of the authors rights. Although this point doesn't fall under CSA's decision power, SNEP GM Bertrand Delcros said "It is difficult not to consider the global aspects of our relationship with radio stations.'

This call referred to NRJ's decision to introduce a legal action regarding the neighbouring rights paid by radio stations.

In addition, CLIM noted "NRJ's recent cooperation to help artists promote francophone according to the partnership deals it had signed with SNEP" (i.e. 20 % of francophone music between 06.00-23.00, of which 40% are from new talent). CLIM hoped that "this effort can be confirmed for the next months, and that measures be taken to make Fun Skyrock respect their commitments.

Sources also suggest that NRJ was seriously hurt by a petition distributed during the "Victoires De La Musique" ceremony by artists organisation Spedidam claiming NRJ was not meeting with its legal requirements on neighbouring rights.

CLIM regroups organisation SNEP, represented during the meeting by Delcros and its president Gilles Paire. rights performing society SACEM, with its president Jean-Loup Tournier, and artists union SFA, with president Francois Parrot.

Delcros was impressed with the motivation showed at the meeting, only two months after the launch of CLIM, saying, "We really had the impression that [CSA president] Jacques Boutet was interested in seeing the situation change." However. rumours in the industry are spreading that Boutet's position will not be secure for long after the upcoming elections, which might explain this attitude.

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

ame droppers could get a sore throat mentioning all the international stars who have collaborated with PolyGram artist Zucchero "Sugar" Fornaciari, the unrivalled ambassador of Italian rhythm 'n' blues. From Miles Davis, Ray Charles, Eric Clapton and Elvis Costello to Sting, Bono Vox, Tom Robinson and Paul Young, they're all on the list. Zucchero's live performance at the "Freddy Mercury Tribute" concert last year further underlined his international status, Zucchero being the only continental-European artist to receive such an invitation.

The breakthrough of Zucchero Fornaciari on an international level has always been just a matter of time. Admired by the aforementioned crème de la crème of the international scene, he was regarded as a real "musician's musician." The Senza Una Donna ("Without A Woman") duet with Paul Young finally gave him the well deserved pan-European hit single in 1991, and with Zucchero, the album especially prepared for the international market, he broadened his appeal considerably.

Senza Una Donna was his own song, and as a recording it stood on its own with or without Young. It was his first international hit record and gave him a

million-selling album outside of Italy. In the end of last year another half English/half Italian language studio album *Miserere* was released—out on **Polydor** across Europe apart from the UK (**London**).

The title track and first single off this new album is another striking duet, now with opera singer **Luciano Pavarotti**. As you can hear on the extra track of this week's insert CD, Zucchero sings the English lyrics written by **U2**'s Bono and Pavarotti takes care of the Italian part. But that's not even what we're asking your attention for...

It's the lead track off this single—Come Back The Sun—that should be aired now, in support of his current European tour after which he will appear in the "World Music Awards" in Monaco in May. Slightly reminiscent of P.P. Arnold's 1968 hit Angel Of The Morning, this second, somewhat cajun-flavoured single off the again Corrado Rustici-produced album is a true "Zucchero-on-his-own" track. Says PolyGram International marketing director Margarita Scheckel, "This is Zucchero in his own right. People often relate to him as a duet singer only, which is not true at all. We're convinced Come Back The Sun will put that straight."

Banned from the airwayes for several weeks throughout the first half of 1992, Copenhagen's EHR-formatted The Voice quickly became Denmark's most controversial station. However, this not stopped it from keeping its number 1 position for private radio in the country's capital.

Programme director Lars Kjaer claims the reason The Voice station has succeeded above other private stations is its air talent and the crew's view of the role of radio. "We're here for the enjoyment, not just for the money," he says. "You have jocks working for new age stations, for example, who don't even like that type of music. I don't want those kinds of personalities. My DJs choose the music themselves. I just have to make sure that songs don't burn out.

Allowing DJs this freedom and playing the hits for at least 80% of the time keeps Kjaer's hands full, but he claims his staff work well with him in keeping the balance even. "I have a lot of power over the D.Is and we're successful in what we

do. The reason for this is simple: I programme with the people, not with the music.'

Kjaer's relation with the record companies, however, is not as easy to define as that with the DJs, and varies with the different companies, he says. "Some companies such as BMG, EMI and Virgin have very good relations with us, because they see radio as it should be seen: a method for breaking artists, not for selling records. Some of the other larger companies don't understand this. I have told PolyGram, for example, that I don't want to work, with them anymore. When the latest Elton John single came out, they told us we wouldn't get a copy until the single had a place in The Voice's top 5 playlist. We still play songs from them, but I would rather go out and buy their records than work under such pressure.'

The EHR station focuses on the 15-25 age group. A typical hour would feature music from Jellyfish, Brian Ferry, Swedish act Legacy Of Sound, as well as international chartbusters such as Whitney Hous-

ton's I Will Always Love You and P.Bryson/R.Belle's A Whole New World (currently number 1 in US charts). The station plays 15% national talent, which, says Kjaer, "isn't bad, seeing that Denmark produces 100 albums a year.

The Voice took a large fall in audience according to the last Gallup survey, down 38% from 179.000 listeners in 1991 to 111.000 in 1992. For Kjaer, however, these numbers mean very little. "The survey issued by Gallup is only yearly, and is based on information taken from one or two weeks of samplings. If there happens to be a European championship football game on another station the night Gallup decides to conduct its survey, you're out of

After seeing the last Gallup results, Kjaer decided to join with other major commercial stations to create a new radio survey, called the Local Radio Index. The survey is backed by The Voice's sales organisation Scandinavian Radio Commercial and local radio's organisation Radio Booking. Kjaer says the diarybased surveys will be published every month. Radio Uptown and the social democratic stations will not be participating in the new survey.

Kjaer joined the one-year-old Voice in 1985 as a weekend DJ and accepted his current title two years later as programme director.

Austrian Radio Scene Confronts Arrival Of Private Radio

Austria, one of the last countries in Europe to outlaw private radio, appears to be on the verge of changing this regulation. After years of discussion between the parliament and lobby groups, insiders predict that Austrian private radio will be legalized by the end of 1993.

Public radio network ORF currently has a monopoly on the Austrian airwaves with its three stations, classic radio Ö1, volksmusik-formatted Ö2 and EHR Ö3. ORF's Ö3 alone brags a rating of 49% in Austria's capital Vienna, according to research Nielsen Ad-Hoc company Research.

Meanwhile, there are private stations who have found a way around the law by broadcasting from outside the border with the help of foreign partners. For example, EHR/News-talk station Radio CD International (Austria's largest private station, with a 17% rating in Vienna) sends its signal through antennas located in Bratislava, broadcasting on a frequency owned by the Slovak state.


Although a few of these stations enjoy a good reputation with listeners, being able to broadcast legally in Austria would grant them a stronger frequency, a greater distribution area and a better image, being able to call themselves Austrian broadcasters.

The fight to legalize private radio has been led by the several members of the Association of Independent Radios (AIR), lobby-

ing for more liberal broadcasting legislation and doing PR for private radio in Austria. AIR chairman and Radio CD International MD Walter Tributsch says the organization has high hopes for this year. "A proposal for an amendment of the Broadcasting Act of 1993 will be made this spring by relevant groups," he says, "including our association. We expect these discussions to be made by summer 1993, with a proposal ready to be passed through Parliament."

Austria's music industry is also excited at the prospect of private radio, seeing it as an outlet for new product excluded by ORF's format. Warner Music Austria marketing director Manfred Wodara says private radio also has a lot more to offer, if done correctly. "What's happening now is similar to what happened in Germany a few years





ago," he says. "I think we are taking the right step at the right moment, although I hope the privates here learn from mistakes German privates made in the past, by not following in the public's footsteps. The stations will have to find their own format and personality. In this way, private radio can be very helpful for us."

IFPI managing director Franz Medwenitsch says the government's arguments about private radio are reasonable, but can be easily resolved. "Parliament's concern for over-crowding the market is a valid one," says Medwenitsch. "It doesn't make sense to have hundreds of radio stations

in such a small market; they wouldn't survive in the current economic situation. This problem could be solved, however, by awarding only

two licence frequencies for each major city.

Another major argument from the Parliament was the fear of a monopoly over the media scene, with major investors buying large stakes of shares in private stations. Medwenitsch claims this could be avoided by setting limits on share percentages for this

Parliament, however, is now beginning to buckle under the pressure from those fighting for the law's amendment, ranging from the IFPI and private stations to possible future investors. Possibly the only group not excited to see the coming of private radio is public network ORF. ORF MD Rudolf Nagiller says Ö2 and Ö3 would be most affected by the private stations. "You can count on the fact that the new commercial stations will be competing above all with the ORF programmes carrying advertising [Ö2 and Ö3]," says Nagiller. "Because the demand for radio programmes is hardly going to rise, we will loose market share. Our goal as market leader, however, is to stay as number one, and we will achieve this.

One insider claims ORF has continually been successful in using its strong political power to postpone an amendment to the private radio ban. The public station does so by bringing up other issues for discussion before parliament, such as the question of commercial times, which costs time. ORF was not available for comment on this.

If Parliament lifts the ban on private radio by the end of the year as predicted, insiders estimate that another year would be necessary for the preparation of radio's new situation before private stations could begin broadcasting, possibly in 1995.

Charting France's Groove From Club To Radio

An increasing number of dance trax are gaining "direct chart success" as acts such as The Shamen and The Brand New Heavies are finding a place on France's playlists. However, programmers continue to have difficulties keeping pace with the high volumes of titles. Neither the French pop charts nor the radio playlists offer enough support for the specialist music styles found on the nation's dancefloors.

This is where France's principle club returns survey companies come in, Colombes-based Top Dance and Media Control, based

in Strasbourg. Although nothing new—Media Control started its "Club Hit Parade" in 1989, and Top Dance its chart in September 1988—an increasing interest is arising for the national club polling these organizations offer. As one label's club promoter points out, "Knowing and tracking the club life cycle of a track is more and more essential in setting the release date too early or too late.

Both organizations feel the need to report on the performance of tracks in at least two distinct and separate music formats, "dance

"France has been feeling the influence of Belgian and Italian product more and more. I certainly think a Euro-club survey will be of interest to a lot of Ameri-

Although Top Dance agrees that charts outside of France could be profitable, it also has its hesitations for a European-wide chart. We are working towards Belgian club polling, but a 'greater' survey is still a long way off for us," says Top Dance Mikael Ermine.

Jimmy McFoy's voice has that anthemic innocence characteristic of this sort of happy '70s disco thing and the third and fourth mixes are ideal for spacey moments in early evening programming. Don't think, just smile.

Lane Liquid acid notes hang in space, a hard bassline takes up the slack and a warm fuzzy groove tumbles around your head with hardcore interference and haunting wails. Or is that just me. 

MTV Europe Keeps "Unplugged" Club Exclusive

The "MTV Unplugged" sessions have a European cousin. After Annie Lennox, Was (Not Was) and Joe Cocker—all three shot in Montreux last year—Roxette's recent appearance in the show is only the fourth own production of MTV Europe. The future will only see a limited number of acts performing their musical striptease under the star-spangled European flag. Exclusivity will be the keyword and making a TV programme will be a priority, followed by possible releases of the acoustic sets on CD or video.

"Our involvement in 'Unplugged' is also a matter of budget policies. After all, a lot of acts live here and they want to do their

thing here," comments MTV Europe PD Brent Hansen, who stresses that the European influence on rock's history is of course strong. "Some acts would feel much more comfortable shooting in Europe. Also, some artists like Roxette and Joe Cocker are more European screenthey're because friendly more important over here. An added charm is that the Americans can pick it up if

they want. So there's an interesting A&R perspective as well."

Hansen points out that, "over the years MTV's position in the business has changed considerably. The relation with the record industry is much better now, opening up new possibilities like these 'Unplugged' sessions."

The operation is usually very expensive, but record companies' financial input is minimal. Explains Hansen, "In theory the labels can contribute to it moneywise, like paying for the artists travel expenses. The

thing is, the more money comes in from other resources, the less control we have. In general it's an MTV production. The Roxette programme we did in conjunction with Swedish national TV, SVT."

Only one European "Unplugged" session has so far been released on CD, the Annie Lennox set divided over three CD singles, Cold, Colder and Coldest (RCA),

each containing three acoustic songs. Continues Hansen, "That has happened before. A lot of artists use numbers recorded in Ray Cokes' 'Most Wanted' show as B-sides on their singles. Album or video releases are not necessarily planned before the performance, while the benefits of the ensuing projects depend on the deal. I

would hate it if we ended up with an 'Unplugged' wholesale. It should be special. It's more than just swapping an electric for an acoustic guitar. Only if it really works should a release be considered, like in the case of Eric Clapton, as proved by his recent Grammy award."

EMI Sweden head of promo Marie Dimberg agrees with Hansen, saying, "We are not considering a CD release of Roxette's 'Unplugged' session. The reason is that we had a lot of Roxette material out last year. Also, the concept of the *Tourism* album was very similar to 'Unplugged,' but on various locations around the world. You could say that *Tourism* was one of the facts that led to their appearance on the MTV programme."

Hansen wants to keep his "Unplugged" club exclusive, "with only three to four shooting days per year." Unfortunately he can't supply a list of future names to be featured in the show. Instead, he formulates the rules of the game. "It's pretty minimalist. A lot of acts are surprised at themselves when the stacks of Marshall amps are taken away. It's a challenge for the artist, young or old. It's all about proving yourself as a musician. This sense of uniqueness should always be there. Bringing in a sound consultant is allowed—like Steve Lipson for Annie Lennox—but post- production is out of the question."

SHORT TAKES

- Another Generation Of The Blues is the aptly titled album by Zakyia Hooker, daughter of boogie man John Lee. Stylistically she's in the same street as Bonnie Raitt, but slightly more up beat, with a horn section (Silvertone).
- Dutch soul/dance talent **B.B. Queen** has moved from **EMI** to **Polydor**. Her new single (tba) is due for release in the third week of March.
- Billy Preston—not only present at Mick Jagger's Wandering Spirit album—has a solo single out now as well, a cover of David Bowie's Heroes (Carrere).
- Following the use of a line from Tom Waits' Heartattack And Vine in the latest Levi's 501 advert, this title track of the 1980 Asylum album is not only rereleased as a single. Also, along lots of other classic tracks—many not available on CD before—it is featured on the newanthology Boho Days.
- Yes keyboards player Rick Wakeman's 18-year old son Adam has signed a recording and publishing deal with President Records and Edward Kassner Music. Hit teeth-cutting album Soliloquy will be released on April 19. The deals follow an overall package which grants the rights to his dad's back catalogue material on the Ambient label as well as new products for the next three years.

As in the '60s when the Beatles and the Rolling Stones were competing for the people's favour, a "battle of the bands" is currently going on between youngsters Take That (RCA) and East 17 (London). The provisional score is a tie, because the "Takes" are winners on their home market, while the "East Enders" have a stronger following abroad. Just at the moment that Take That has taken the 'plane to conquer the US, East 17 seems to have equalised at home; their dance/pop debut album Walthamstownamed after the London neigbourhood where the band members come from-has shot straight to number 1 in the UK.

London international marketing manager Nick Bron—taking care of East 17—admits that both bands are seen as natural rivals, but that competition is more a media thing than a serious matter he has to deal with. "The bands are different, and they are broken in a different way. I think East 17 has a more streetwise attitude, and is mainly broken through the clubs in the UK, whereas Take That could rely on radio. Clubland is East 17's background, so marketingwise we supplied some good remixes."

Besides the UK, according to Bron, East 17 was broken in various ways abroad. "In Germany it came down to the clubs too. The first single *House Of Love* reached number 6 with no airplay at all. It did not even make

the Media Control-monitored airplay Top 100. The third single *Deep* changed that, with radio coming aboard. In Israel all three singles [including *Gold*] made the top slot because of radio. Okay. it's a small market, but still European. In Sweden East 17 was the second British band in history to have three singles in the Top 20 at the same time."

Before East 17 **Jive Bunny** reached that remarkable feat. The difference, however, is that those singles were released quite closely after each other, while the East 17 singles were put out more widely apart.

Concludes Bron, "We homed into the local needs, but in general we provided a band with a great image. Around New Year's day we realised that we had a little phenomenon in our hands. It was like the boys next door suddenly making it big." It must be said that these adolescents—with only 21 years, band leader Tony Mortimer is the oldest—surely know how to get their image across, because the dog-logo used all through the campaign is all over the place.

Remix Means Bingo

What happens when a former teenage star steps out of retirement? Ask Neumann, singer of Finnish chartbuster Dingo in the mid '80s, and he'll tell you that all the "Dingo-mania" has started all over again. A remixed version of Levoton Tuhkimo, one of the band's biggest hits ever, reclaimed its legitimate position at the top spot in the chart at once.

The band split up in 1986, and ever since there were yearly meetings between Neumann and the staff of the Fazer label, discussing the possibilities of re-releases or compilations. "And every time the answer was negative," says Fazer head of communications Lasse Norres, at the time the band's manager. "We tried to postpone a Dingo revival as long as possible, and now the time is right."

Norres remembers the national shock caused when Dingo split up, only comparable to UK trio the Jam disbanding in 1982, which was regarded as "an even more important event" than the Falklands war. "The exact date of Dingo's split up—October 7, 1986—is still subject of TV or radio quizes. It was front page news."

The band hailed from Pori, the Finnish equivalent of Liverpool—which means a lot of music, water and unemployment. Norres digs deeper in his memory, which is filled with images of girls camping out in the gardens of the band members. "They

were incredibly big. Their 1984 debut album [translated in English, entitled "Our Name Is Dingo"] sold 130.000 copies which is a lot, considering a population of only four million. Its 1985 follow-up ["The Imperium Of The Beggars"] achieved the 200.000 units mark, a record only beaten last year by Kirka. When sales went down to 80.000 for their third album ["The Holy Clan"] in 1986, they stopped, volunteerly giving up a lot of money that they could have earned by gigging. Bearing in mind that 50.000 copies means platinum in Finland, it was not that bad at all."

Whether the band will really re-unite remains to be seen. After the release of the sampler *Tuhkimotarina*, the original line-up will go into the studio with original producer **Pave Maijanen**, "and depending on the chemistry between them, a decision will be made."



The Radio 60-Minute Listen Test

by Bill Clemens

A listener arrives in your town and tunes into your radio station for the first time. How long would it take for this person to form an accurate impression of your station? In a fragmented market, he/she should be able to hear all the ingredients that form your station's primary appeal in an hour.

The time of day that person tunes in to the station could, of course, have an effect on his listening test, although day parting should be less apparent if there are more than four to six music stations in the market. Let's assume he/she had tuned in mid-morning to your well-positioned adult music station. These are the things that would affect that person's judgement of the station:

- The music. Is it unique or focused on one particular audience segment? How many songs in an hour's time are positively familiar? Or are there several neutral or even negative songs? Worse still, how many of these neutral negative songs appear in sequence?
- The presentations style. What is the presenter's impact on the hour?

Is it generally a less talk/more music approach or is the DJ involvement quite heavy? Does the presenter talk over songs or cut songs short? Does the hour sound cluttered, creating the impression of less music? How heavy is the advertising content and how is it distributed around the hour?

- The positioning. Does your station say something about itself or does it leave this up to the listener to form his own impressions? Are the positioning statements consistent with what is programmed?
- Local content/listener involvement. Does your station give the feeling it is part of this city and part of the lives of its listeners? Or does it sound as though it could be a radio station located anywhere?
- Impact. Does your station generally have positive forward momentum or is it a little boring and stop/start? Radio stations with energy and momentum make the same songs other stations are playing sound even better.
- Contests. Is there any contesting or promotional activity? If so, can everyone "play along" or is it restricted to just a few listeners?
- News. Arethere news bulletins

and how much of the news is local?

Image. What is the impact of signal processing? Does your station sound "loud" compared to others, distorted, mellow, bright? Is the processing sympathetic to or fighting against the format?

■ Identity. Finally, how often does the listener hear your station's name and perhaps format description?

Look for those elements in your station that will together create the branding in the listeners' mind. All stations have an image, whether deliberately created or left to the listeners' collective impressions. Over the course of 60 minutes these impressions will have been quite obvious. Every hour of every day is important.

It's important to create a station that's simple for the listener to understand. Picture the average listener in a car with push button tuning—the decision is sometimes made in seconds, not after careful evaluation or extended listening. Chances are you won't receive a 60-minute trial.

Now approach your station from the listener's perspective. Take a step back and try to evaluate what you hear: ■ Think of what listeners would say when describing your station to a friend. It should be a simple, easy to understand statement. This should form the basis of your programming and positioning.

Don't expect your listeners to perform "mental gymnastics," directing their listening as if radio were programmed like a TV station. How many people do you know that still look at a radio listening guide?

■ Consider if the texture of all your station's elements fit with the target audience. Think of the station along two axis: hard or soft, aggressive or conservative. Is the station consistent or does the image become blurred depending on who's on air at the time?


Assume that most listeners lack awareness of what your station does, but never assume they're stupid. They don't know much about toothpaste either, but they know what they like.

■ Finally, imagine you're launching a new format (or relaunching an old one). Listeners will form their impressions very quickly and a bad first impression is usually very difficult to undo. Make every

minute count. Treat the first hour of the new station as a week in real time, the first day as a month.

There are some successful stations to which the 60-minute taste test does not apply, mainly the "heritage" full-service stations which have been around awhile. Their image is based more on longevity, formed when the market was less crowded or complicated. The biggest risk for these stations is fragmentation. But sooner or later they, too, will need to simplify the image they portray to their listeners and concentrate more on a single programming strand.







In North America sales were up some 26% to Dfl 1.46 billion while operating income skyrocketed 267% to Dfl 55 million. In the Far East, sales rose 4.7% to Dfl 1:13 billion and operating income jumped 18.6% to Dfl 166 million. Excluding currency fluctuations, PolyGram says sales growth in 1992 was around 9%.

Comments PolyGram president/CEO Alain Levy, "Given the substantial investments we have made in music, manufacturing and filmed entertainment during continued recession, last year's performance is particularly creditable." Levy, however, says he sees no immediate end in sight to the economic downturn in Europe.

Worldwide sales of pop repertoire increased 3.1% to Dfl 4.57 billion, accounting for 69% of total turnover (70% in '91). Classical revenue declined 13.9% to Dfl 926 million, mostly due to

strong performances last year, which included sales from such records as Three Tenors, Classical music sales comprised 14% of total sales, versus 17% in '91.

PolyGram's CD unit sales increased 13% last year, while cassette and vinyl turnover dropped 11% and 60% respectively. CDs now account for 66% of total album unit sales versus 58% in '91. Cassette unit sales comprised 31% (35% in '91) and vinyl made up 3% (7% in '91).

The company's top-selling record last year was Billy Ray Cyrus's Some Gave All which sold over seven million copies worldwide. Other best-selling albums included Def Leppard's Adrenalize and, via its distribution/licensing deal with Motown, Lionel Richie's greatest hits compilation Back To Front. Twenty four albums each sold over one million copies.

Commenting on the progress of DCC, Levy says it is "still too early to know what the sellthrough is. We'll know more in August." He says the company has already shipped 1.2 million units from its factories. He adds, "With a system launch you have to wait about three years before you see the results."

While he was surprised at the amount of publicity given the launch of DDC and Sony's Mini-Disc system, Levy says he somewhat disappointed that "consumers were not rushing out to buy" after all the publicity.

of those restrictions benefitted the record industry as much as radio stations and should not be grounds for a royalty hike.

While the ruling went largely in its favour, the AIRC copyright committee, which represented broadcasters before the Tribunal, had proposed an even lower flat royalty of 3.5% with reduced rates for start-up stations.

AIRC copyright committee chairman Jimmy Gordon, who testified for several days before the tribunal, says the radio industry is "generally pleased" with the ruling. We hope that it will provide a basis for a good working relationship with the record industry, with which we have so much in common. I intend to seek an early meeting with them to establish practical ways in which we can both help each other."

PPL chairman John Brooks could not be contacted at presstime.

Ironically, the tribunal's decision came on the eve of the annual UK Radio Academy's Music Conference in London. The theme of this year's conference was "Common Ground."

Capital Radio MD Richard Evre, who was instrumental in preparing the case and negotiating for the broadcasters, echoes that theme and Gordon's comments in reacting to the decision. "This is not the time to start shouting victory and gloat," he says. "We should see this as water under the bridge and work together on issues that would benefit both industries. My hand is extended."

called Frequence 1, set up in collaboration with Radio Golem and the Czech National Insurance company. Europe Developpement MD Martin Brisac will be chairman of the board of Frequence 1, while Europe 2 GM Michel Fleischmann will be MD. Frequence 1 was the only project submitted by a French media group.

The other station, Radio Alfa, will be an all-news programme, interspersed with some music and advertising. The project was put forward by former journalists from Czech station Radio Free Europe and the Czech daily Lidove Noviny, with the backing of the Czech Sav-

ings Company and some foreign investors.

Brisac welcomes this new breakthrough on the Eastern Europe market, saying that "It confirmed the long-term strategy set up by Europe Developpement." Commented Brisac, "It really shows that we are not there for the 'coups,' but with a real strategy and the will to increase our presence in association with local partners. In addition, this new station will strengthen our presence on the Eastern market."

The broadcasting authority's unanimous vote for the Frequence 1 project owed a great deal to the success of Evropa 2, according to Brisac. "Evropa 2 in Prague is now a real local programme serving the local needs. So when we came up

with our proposal, there was no need to prove our competence and seriousness. Also I think that both

> good reputation there." The programmes of Frequence which should start in September 1, 1993, will broadcast 24 hours a day. It will consist of 40% talk and 60% music, with a strong 50% national content. The programmes will be hosted by local personalities.

into talks early this year. Bertelsmann press spokesman Helmut Runde claims that the company had never really intended to make a financial commitment to the channel, saving that the company sees no role for itself in Viva. "Bertelsmann isn't interested in specialist TV channels. We would be the perfect company for many such partnerships, but we really have to concentrate our activities.

BMG/UFA president Berndt Schiphorst, in charge of Bertelsmann's TV/radio activities, adds. "There isn't a deal there for us to deny or join. The situation is that a group of people are interested in launching a channel and asked us to join in the project—we haven't

decided either way. Viva is not a high priority for us however."

Although Time Warner and Thorn/EMI are reported to have already made a firm commitment to Viva, a third backer is still needed to get the project off the ground. The original intention to have one national financer behind the project has not yet been realized. Although Viva Medien—the company set up to manage the channel-is reportedly going to contribute to the financing of the channel, this still means that the third investor must come up with a large amount of capital.

Bertelsmann's decision can only come as a set-back to Viva, with industry speculation once again mounting about the channel ever getting off the ground.

Enrico Ruggieri (CGD) came first in the Big section with the song Mistero. Cristiano De André (WEA) came second with Dientro La Porta, followed by female duo Grazia De Michele/ Rossana Casale (CGD). Laura Pausini (CGD) won the Newcomers section with the song La Solitudine, followed by Geraldina Trovato (Insieme) and NEK (Fonit Cetra).

Comments CGD MD Gerolamo Caccia Dominioni, "Such resounding success by CGD and WEA haven't been achieved for years on the domestic market. But it wasn't just a question of individual songs. They are real album artists who are backed by big investment from Time Warner. It's a good example of commitment by multi-nationals to domestic talent

on the local market."

All songs were voted for by 10jury teams positioned throughout Italy. Adds Dominioni, "For the first time in many years the tastes of consumers were expressed. That means we can finally think in terms of record sales.

Pubcaster RAI, which screens the event exclusively, registered audiences of over 14 million in the three competition knock-out stages. Almost 17 million viewers watched the final, which gave RAI an overall 61.17% viewers share—the highest San Remo TV audience since the 1987 edition. RAI claimed this success despite the absence of most international guest artists originally slated to appear. The pull-out was blamed on a dispute between RAI and FIMI, the music industry federation formed by the major companies last year (M&M. February 27).



EHR Gives In To Jackson

While Michael Jackson's previous single Heal The World is still being played frequently on 41 EHR stations—therefore qualifying as Top Recurrents leader of the week—his new one; Give In To Me is this week's fastest moving as well as most added record on European Hit Radio. Having collected another 33 first-time reports, the song is heading the Most Added statistic for the second consecutive time and seizes the sixth position in the EHR Top 40—a strong contender for the top spot.

Competition is heating up in the top 10, with Duran Duran (at number 2) coming very close to beating Sting in terms of chart points, while Whitney Houston's version of I'm Every Woman (4) steadily gains ground. In the Southwest chart of the Regional EHR Top 20, Houston enters straight at number 1, greatly thanks to heavy rotation on both leading networks, Cadena 40 Principales and Cadena 100.

But the battlefield is by no means restricted to the chart's top 10: other good chart jumps are claimed by Depeche Mode (from 30 to 15)

But the battlefield is by no means restricted to the chart's top 10: other good chart jumps are claimed by Depeche Mode (from 30 to 15) and Bryan Ferry (36-21). Depeche Mode is doing extremely well in Portugal (close to 100% penetration), followed by Poland, Sweden, the UK and Italy; Bryan Ferry's revival of *I Put A Spell On You* still gets its best response in the UK, with Holland, Denmark, and now also Sweden, as second-best markets.

The week's highest new chart entry (at 23) is booked by Madonna with Bad Girl, the third single culled from the Erotica album. Initial support is massive in the UK (straight entry at number 9 in the Northwest), and considerable in Sweden, Poland and Belgium. The rest of Europe seems to be hesitating, but is expected to follow soon, when Deeper And Deeper, Madonna's previous single, has finished its life there.

Regarding the current cover trend, it is interesting to notice that two more new versions have entered the chart: the Christians' interpretation of American rap poet Gil Scott-Heron's The Bottle and Michael Bolton's rendition of the Four Tops' Reach Out, I'll Be There. All in all, over one-fifth of the EHR Top 40 consists of cover versions. Last week we named five, but forgot to mention Go West's remake of soul singer Bobby Caldwell's 1978 US top 10 hit What You Won't Do For Love and Rod Stewart's tackling of the Stones classic Ruby Tuesday. Covermania rules.
