Dutch Music Winner In Private Frequency Awards

Dutch recording artists received a big promotional boost with the licensing of two stations who programme predominantly local talent. Dutch national music station Radio Noordzee Nationaal and ACE Holland FM each received a frequency packet by the Dutch government on January 21. The

terrestrial licences, the first ever to private investors, could forever change the broadcast landscape in Holland. In all, the Dutch Ministry of

Culture and the Ministry of Water and Transportation awarded five packets of frequencies, two FM regional bundles and three AM clusters. Leading private commercial station Radio 10 Gold was awarded an AM frequency previously used by pubcaster and Dutch market leader EHR Radio 3. ACE Holland FM, which transmits 60% national music, was give a small AM packet. The other AM frequency bundle was awarded to a press consortium consisting of Hachette-backed Ouote/Elle and the Dutch press group Dagbladunie, representing NRC Handelsblad and Algemeen Dagblad. FM frequencies went to Radio Noordzee Nationaal and UK-based classical national sta-

France Info, Fun Radio Ratings Increase

Public news/talk France Info posted a leap in national and Parisian audiences in the Médiamétrie ratings for the fourth quarter period in 1993, in a trend which leaves the public stations holding almost a quarter of total audiences in Paris.

While full-service RTL remains the leading national station for the 78th consecutive wave in a row, with a 18.2% audience cume (7.3 points more than its nearest contender), the other big winners of the last wave in 1993 are EHR net Fun, which confirms its growth at 6.3%, a rise of 1.3 points, and ACE Europe 2 (up 0.7 points to 4.6%). The gap between the two leading musical stations is narrowing as Fun is now only 3.7 points away from EHR web (continues on page 32)



NRJ To Invest Ffr50 Million In '94 EUROPE AT A GLANCE **Expansion Bared In Germany**

Following an aggressive strategy initiated two years ago, French radio group NRJ is aiming to raise its international revenues to 50% of the group's total income within five years, with the bulk of its international development efforts on Germany. The group's

investment plan for 1994 is worth FFr50 million (app. US\$8.5 million). The announcement was made by NRJ president Jean-Paul Baudecroux during the presentation of the company's financial results for the 1992-1993 fiscal year.

The strategy of the group, said Baudecroux, is to concentrate on northern Europe countries "where

Warner Germany Names Schmitz **New Promotion Head**

GERMANY

Warner Music Germany has appointed Manfred Schmitz as head of promotion, reporting to deputy MD/marketing director Bernd Dopp, effective February 1, '94. Warner has been without a promotion head for some two years after the departure of Axel Krauser to Mambo Musik.

Now MD Gerd Gebhardt says Warner decided it was time to appoint someone to control the growing radio, TV and press promotion departments. "I think with all the new and upcoming media in Germany we need more strength on the promotion side. On the TV side there's Viva and MTV Europe and many government controlled stations will be returning to music. The press is becoming increasingly complex and we also have all the private radio stations." Until now, all promotion departments reported to deputy MD/marketing director Bernd Dopp. Now that Dopp has taken over control of A&R, Gebhardt says a new person was required to co-ordinate promotional activities at the company.

there is a lot starting with regard to deregulation and where per capita income and advertising expenditures are high." Hence the choice to focus on Germany and also Sweden.

The NRJ group is already present in the four German cities of Berlin, Dresden, Leipsich and Chemnitz, and will re-open a new station in Munich next March (Radio Xanadu). This outlet will become the group's headquarters in Germany.

Baudecroux explained that these development "will not affect the group's profitability" as investments will be "limited." For the fiscal year 1992-1993 ending September 30, NRJ's revenues rose to FFr430 million, a 15% increase on the previous year, with pre-tax profits rising 21% to FFr111.2 million. International investment in 1993 was close to FFr10 million and posted "light losses.

NRJ GM Alain Weill revealed that the goal over the coming years was to "be present in Germany's 15 leading towns" in order to create a full network.

Gérentes New Polydor France MD

PolyGram Disques France president Paul-René Albertini is halfway to filling the MD positions for his two main labels Phonogram and Polydor, with the appointment of Bruno Gérentes as head of Polydor. A chief for Phonogram is expected to be found by June 1.

Gérentes, who will take up his position in mid-March, worked at Polydor in the late '80s as marketing manager under the aegis of Marc Lumbroso and was later in charge of musical products for giant retailer FNAC.

"With Mathieu Loriot-Prévost as marketing and promotion and Didier Varrod as A&R director, I think we have now one of the strongest teams in the industry. The company is in good health, costs are under control and creativity is high. With the new management, I am convinced that we will strengthen and increase Polydor's market share.

Albertini will continue to assume day-to-day management decisions at Phonogram until the arrival of a new MD. Meanwhile, the two former joint-GMs, Michel de Souza and Philippe Vidalenc, have been assigned new tasks. De Souza, now reports to PolyGram Distribution MD Laurent Gallavardin and heads a 12-strong team in charge of artist development for all Poly-Gram labels. Vidalenc will oversee a new unit responsible for developing all PolyGram audiovisual projects linked to music: long-form videos, filmed concert, documentaries, TV specials.

Albertini has also declared plans to restructure Phonogram in small specialised units "which will improve control over the whole process from signing, product management and promotion." A new music/new age label will be headed by Jean-Patrick Teisseire, an artist developmentoriented label, with general services-the "heart of the system"-centred around two key people, Yann Blanc, for marketing and promotion, and Caroline Molko for A&R, taking care of the top national and international

BELGIUM: Radio Contact Writes History On CD

EHR net Radio Contact is celebrating its 13th year in operation with the release of its first CD, entitled Radio Stars, spanning the outlet's existence in 13 songs. The compilation, manufactured and distributed by Indisc Belgium, is part one of a year-long project with a follow-up already planned for this summer. The album features material from Yazoo, King, Jackie Quartz, Snap and Seal, and will be backed by promo spots on all Radio Contact outlets. Marc Maes

IRELAND: Ban On IRA Interviews Lifted

Irish ACE station Classic Hits 98 FM beat the national pubcaster and all other competition in the race to interview Gerry Adams, leader of Sinn Fein—the political wing of the illegal IRA—after a Government ban was lifted on January 19. Both the national pubcaster RTE Television and Radio, as well as all independent radio stations in Ireland, were issued with special guidelines for conducting interviews with the organization. Under the new guidelines interviews with members of Sinn Fein or the breakaway Republican Sinn Fein must be pre-recorded and vetted to prevent breaches of other sections of the broadcasting Act. SPAIN: Flamenco/Jazz Gets Two Out Of Five Grammy Nods

For the first time ever, Spain has received two nominations for the 1994 Grammy Awards thanks to an unusual project combining flamenco and jazz fusion—Jazzpana. Media Control Upgrades Panel

Media Control France (MCF) is going for head-on competition IPSOS/RCS. announced the expansion of its radio panel in the French market.

Last year, MCF lost its airplay monitoring contract with industry organisation SNEP to research body IPSOS, which is using technology developed by US company RCS. IPSOS/RCS has already delivered test runs to SNEP and is said to be operational within a month.

Nevertheless, MCF expects to regain some of the lost business by increasing the number of stations it tracks from 27 to 34. Apart from the already existing five peripheral stations, eight national FM networks and 14 regional FMs, Media Control has added another seven regional broadcasters. With the upgraded database, Media Control claims it is now able to produce new regional charts, listing the mostplayed songs on the nation's provincial broadcasters. In addition, the company intends to start producing mid-week airplay charts the beginning of March.

Media Control is headquartered in Baden Baden, Germany, and is active in France, the GSA market and the UK. It says it has plans to expand further in Italy and the Benelux.

Industry observers, however, are sceptical about Media Control's chances. "If they don't have SNEP," says one executive, "and they're not very likely to get the independent labels, who the hell are they going to sell to?'

China founder and MD Derek Green says, "There simply is no longer a strong independent record company in every major record market that can support China's policy of intensive worldwide artist development across a

ANEM Launches To Represent Indies

Smaller independent record companies and publishers dealing in disco and dance music have formed a new representative body called the National Association of Music Publishers (ANEM).

Twelve independents, all members of the industry group AFI, which represents Italy's indie companies, have formed the new association to lobby for a fairer division of performance rights payments collected from discotheques and radio stations by authors rights organisation SIAE.

Says ANEM secretary general and AFI PR officer Franco Crepax, "There is a real need for this new association. Existing publishing groups such as the Association of Music Publishers [EMA] represent primarily the interests of the majors, whereas up to 80% of the music played in discotheques is produced or distributed by indie companies such as Time and Media

Records, who can have a turnover of up to L25 billion (app. US\$15.6 million).

"We will be negotiating with the SIAE for a fairer share of rights payments reflecting the percentage of indie music played in both discotheques and on radio."

Crepax adds that he is confident that the SIAE, which is undergoing reorganisation, will agree to a more representative distribution of live performance rights payments.

The publication of new statutes for the SIAE is expected shortly. This follows the appointment of Roman Vlad as temporary commissioner of the SIAE. Vlad was president from 1987 until July 1993, when administrative expert Carlo Gessa was appointed temporary commissioner to oversee the implementation of new stations granting fairer voting rights for all SIAE members. Following delays in completing the statutes, Vlad was reappointed to speed up the SIAE's constitutional changes.

Media Concentration Issue Delays RMC Privatisation

Minister of communications Alain Carignon has requested an enquiry into the legality of the possible acquisition for RMC/Nostalgie. In a letter addressed to his colleague from the ministry of economy, Edmond Alphandéry, Carignon asked the Competition Council to evaluate if the acquisition of RMC by giant conglomerate Havas would risk contravening council regulations against "dominant positions."

Bidders Havas, NRJ, Alcatel and VSD have all submitted their proposals, and the new owner is expected to be announced in the next weeks. Havas had made clear that both companies will remain fully separated and that there will be no merger of the two. But the

decision of Carignon is to prevent, any criticism that could follow the attribution of RMC to Havas.

Carignon's move follows complaints from other bidders, in particular NRJ, and non-bidders (Europe 1), who point out that Havas, which owns IP, RTL and Fun's ad sales house, would control over 50% of the French radio ad market if it acquired RMC's sales house GEM. (According to Secodip's survey of ad expenditures this is more likely to be around 56.7%, with IP at 42.1% and GEM at 14.6%.)

Meanwhile, bidders and the government are waiting for audit specialist Cooper & Lybrand to fix the minimum price at which RMC will be sold. The highest bid is currently Havas at FFr540 million, followed by NRJ at Ffr440 million,

Irish PRS Members To Negotiate Split

IRELAND

The London-based **Performing Rights Society**, which collects performance and broadcast royalties for songwriters and publishers, has agreed to allow Irish PRS members to elect an interim board to negotiate independence from the English parent.

Irish songwriters could earn twice as much as they do now if their royalties were collected by an independent Irish music rights organisation, according to one leading Irish publisher.

Income from music publishing and songwriting could double to I£10 million (app. US\$14 million) for Irish songwriters if moves to establish an all-Irish royalty collection society is set up in Ireland, says John Lappin, secretary of Republic of Ireland Music Publishers' Association (RIMPA).

In the past five years income for Irish songwriters has doubled from I£2.55 million to I£5.7 million since the Irish Music Rights Organisation (IMRO) took over the collection of

royalties in Ireland for the PRS.

IMRO now plans to become a separate entity from the PRS and collect royalty income for Irish performers at home and abroad.

It's not just international artists like Chris De Burgh, U2, Hothouse Flowers, Mick Hanly and Enya who stand to benefit. A staggering 80% of Irish songwriters currently earn less than £250 a year, says Lappin, who adds, "I believe every Irish songwriter is losing money because of the present situation."

"The establishment of an independent body for Irish writers will also create jobs and attract major international publishers to Ireland. Irish members currently only get 11% of the royalties collected in Ireland," he says. "We believe that figure should be as much as 25% to 30%.

"There could be as much as another million pounds available from Irish bars playing Irish music in America and the European continent. With our own organisation representing our own members we'd have our eye firmly on our share of the cake."

Music Industry Prepares For VH-1 Launch

The UK record industry is offering a cautious welcome to the news that MTV's music channel for older fans, VH-1, is scheduled to come to the UK in the autumn, and may be expanded into Continental Europe later.

A spokeswoman for MTV Europe says plans to introduce a European version of what is an established service in the US are "still at the strategic stage."

However, by the autumn the service should be available to UK viewers who subscribe to the Sky satellite/cable service. MTV's technology allows it to deliver services to individual countries.

She says that no part of the VH-1 format is fixed except for the fact that it will be aimed at 25 to 49 year olds, and will be different from what VH-1 viewers see in the US. A UK launch, however, will allow the company to experiment with English-language lifestyle mate-

rial, possibly emulating the comedy programming regularly used on the US VH-1. She adds, "The service will be tailored for a UK audience."

The UK industry welcomes the concept of another outlet for its product, but cautions that VH-1's restricted potential audience may not make it a priority for promotion staff. Only about one in 20 UK households can receive Sky.

One senior promotions source says, "I think what the industry

wants from VH-1 is what they say they are going to give, which is a station that will appeal to the more mature viewer with album tracks and new artists who will appeal to that important group of buyers who are disenfranchised by MTV.

"What we want from VH-1 is not that different from what we want from radio; that is, help in the very difficult task of persuading a maturing audience not to stop buying albums."



Mainstream EHR's Alive & Kickin'

To crudely paraphrase Mark Twain, any reports that mainstream EHR will soon die in Europe have been greatly exaggerated. At

least that's what a trio of leading EHR programme directors from Europe's three largest markets believe; and while they have a vested interest in seeing the format thrive, they also have compelling evidence to back them up.



Less competition, newly deregulated markets and advertiser focus on numbers of listeners rather than quality, they say, are just some of the key factors that will keep mainstream healthy during the next few years. That's not to say these programmers think the market will shift in the next few years; in fact, they're preparing for it. But to significantly alter programming now is just not in their best interests.

Useless UK Singles Charts

Comments Mark Story, programme controller for Piccadilly Radio's Key 103/Manchester, "I think announcing the death of EHR in Europe is somewhat premature. I do think there are developments leading us in that way, and some of them are the same as what's happening in the US.

"For instance, there's the limited future for Top 40 chart-based radio. That's true anywhere there's a competitive market and for quite a few reasons, the first one being the singles charts are no longer a reflection of what the listening audience wants. Singles are predominantly bought by people who usually fall out of the demographic that most EHR stations in Britain are pitching to.

"The other thing is that radio is diversifying. The idea that all aspects or all entertainment could be encompassed in one radio station has gone out the window. You're already seeing that in most of the major markets around the country. The targeting is getting more narrow. I don't think we believe now that you can please everybody from ages 10 to 50 on one radio station. The last great proponent of that idea was BBC Radio 1FM, and when you look at what has happened to

them over the past few years, even before the programming changes, you see that is patently not true any more. You cannot be that diverse. It was also true with [national rock station] Virgin 1215 AM in the early days, though they've since narrowed what they're doing."

Because the UK government has been wary of awarding franchises to stations with similar formats during the 20 years of private commercial radio, mainstream EHRs have thrived and will continue to do so in the future.

"Typical metro stations like Key 103/Manchester, Capital Radio/London or Metro Radio/Newcastle, are quite diverse," says Story. "They have pretty broad-based formats. They play oldies that might go back as far as the '60s, but not in great quantity, and they play quite a number of recurrents and current music, some of which may be dance, ACE, and so on."

Slowly, but surely, says Story, the UK

will become more fragmented. "In our own market in Manchester we will be joined by a dance station, an easy listening station, and in a few months by a jazz station," he says. "We already have a national classical station and a rock station. All of those music strands,



and others like big band and country, would have been done on one radio station rather than two back in the '70s. That has changed quite dramatically, although our radio station still has room for one or two specialist programmes, and we're keen to continue doing them. We do them very well, and have won a few awards for programmes on dance and indie music.

"As far as EHR is concerned, I don't think

it will die in the next two or three years, though long-term it probably will."

German Deregulation

For Matthias

"Mainstream is not dead," says Brandes. "It's still early days in Berlin, and mainstream is where the biggest numbers are. The market hasn't settled because of all the new stations that have gone on the air during the past two years. What we know now is that the musical tastes of the listeners, even the younger ones,

are quite conservative and they are not so settled in their tastes.

"Today, we—and all the other stations—have the chance to pick up a lot of listeners at the very beginning. I can't tell you how it's going to be in five or six years. What I know is that the competition will increase in the next couple of years because new stations will be awarded, some will grow and some sta-

tions will vanish. In the end, I think we will have nearly the same level competition as in the US, with more stations offering narrow formats."

Contributing to the popularity of mainstream EHR are advertisers, who are looking at the numbers such a station can deliver. "Most advertisers are looking for big ratings and not the narrower target groups," says Brandes, "but it's changing slowly. I still think you can earn good money with a narrow format and fewer listeners but a very focused, well-identified target group; however, that's not the case now. Advertisers and agencies are thinking very mainstream themselves, even the national advertisers."

Listeners have embraced the ACE and

EHR stations in Berlin, but they're also channel-surfing on the radio dial, being drawn more to image than music. "It hasn't been a matter of your format, because people don't know about those things in Berlin," says Brandes. "They don't know words like Adult Contemporary or European Hit Radio; they don't know how such a station should sound like. Listeners are moving between us, RS 2, RTL and other stations who are serving nearly the same target group. There's not much brand loyalty. It will take about three-to-five years to do that.

"What's going on now is that everybody's trying to build up a personalised image in the eyes and ears of the listeners. They're making sure people can identify with some of the DJs and will remember what kind of promotions were doing. It's not the music yet."

One other thing slowing down change is a lack of timely ratings, which hinders programmers in trying to quantify shifts in listeners' musical tastes. "There's been a lot of movement not only on the listener's side, but on the station side," says Brandes. "We've had stations adjusting their formats and the listeners have reacted; but getting ratings only once a year is a problem, even though in '94 we'll get them twice a year. Right now there's a long time lag. You can't move as fast because you first have to see where you are now before you make changes."

The French Model

In France, all Skyrock programme director Laurent Bouneau has to do is point to the success of NRJ, Fun Radio and his station to prove that mainstream EHR is alive and well, and will continue to thrive in the near future.

"The French market is just 13 years old," says Bouneau. "NRJ was the first network that programmed music for the audience, so that way of music radio is still relatively new. It was only around '87-'88 that stations did that.

"Skyrock, NRJ and Fun target the same market, but we're not the same. I'm not an expert in the US, but it seems that Top 40 stations like KISS FM/Los Angeles and similar stations like that in New York, are still very successful. They are in major difficulties there, but that doesn't mean they are necessarily dead.

"Both EHR and ACE are more mainstream in France than in the US. We play more gold than a US station would. Sometimes ACE stations in France play more new music than a US station would. You can be more mainstream in France and Paris because only 10 of the 40 stations are professionally run."

Also adding a few more years to mainstream EHR's longevity in France could be the introduction of quotas forcing stations to air 40% Francophone product, says Bouneau. "Because of the quotas, I think mainstream EHR has more good days ahead because it

will be difficult to create different radio stations. It's going to protect the market and the market leaders."

In France, the radio battle is being fought more on overall entertainment value than the subtleties in musical tastes, says Bouneau. "In EHR in France you have three battles: the morning show, day-time music, and the evening programme. NRJ was mostly a musical station, but now they

are trying to make a strong evening show, which is totally different from what they've done in the past. The reason Fun is before Skyrock in the ratings is that they have had more success with their evening show."

For Bouneau, the next big challenge facing mainstream EHR is the impact of cable and pay-radio, and Skyrock has prepared for it by launching an all Francophone cable station called **Chante France** in Paris. "The next wave will be those types of stations," he says. "If you want specialised niche stations, you will be able to find it on cable without

DJs and advertising. These stations now have a very small market show, but they will grow.

"I don't think mainstream EHR stations are likely to die in the next few years. They are going to die only if there is new, professionally-run competition."







Things Get Better For D:Ream After Take That Support

How seriously do we take support slots, signed to another company? Be honest, most of you just use the opening act to chat with your business partners and hang around the bar. Fortunately, many teenagers think rather differently. British pop dance duo **D:Ream** was nothing but a footnote in the UK single chart until appearing as the warming-up act at **Take That's** 20-day national tour in December. After a first attempt exactly a year ago, a re-release of the poppy rave anthem *Things* Can Only Get Better catapulted to the top slot. Patience pays double, doesn't it?

The world was turned upside down for **East West** head of international **Ian Grenfell**. "We have spent a whole year on [singles off] their album *D:Ream On Vol. I*, but nothing happened. Okay, we had a solid club base, but we never managed to

cross over. All [four] singles we released only lasted for two or three weeks somewhere halfway the chart, and then went down again. We obviously had to do something about it, and we went 'back' to phase

one of our promo campaign, which we skipped first time round. We hadn't done the teen magazines like *Smash Hits* and *Just 17*."

Singer Peter Cunnah, a Northern Irish lad, is a real hunk—a prime criteria in photo sessions for mags like

these. The jewel on the crown was the Take That support slot, precisely the way Grenfell has had in mind. "We knew that 100.000 kids would go to these arena concerts, and if we only converted 10% out of those, then that would put us high in the top 10. The core young market always

needs another band to write down on their pencil cases. D:Ream is a little bit more mature than most teen bands, but there are always older Take That fans around who are looking for the next thing they'll get

into. That was certainly the case. Also, I think a lot of teenagers took the optimistic song title as their new year's resolution."

The album, originally released in August (on the Sanji Tandan-revamped Magnet label), has now been repackaged

with a bright shot of our pretty boy Cunnah on the front. The old art work looked more like a techno album, which it absolutely isn't. The track *Star* for instance—one of those previous singles—is a ballad in a **George Michael** vein. And didn't the man with the designer stubble start in a poppy

duo too? Al Mackenzie is playing the role Andrew Ridgeley had in Wham!

By the way, Sire president Seymour Stein—the man "who is never wrong" (see Madonna and k.d. lang)—predicts that Cunnah will be the next George Michael, which is a lucrative business since the real G.M. prefers to spend his life these days in court rather than in the recording studios.

Sony Ireland Carefully Markets Moore's Crowd Pleaser

Although Irish folk singer Christy Moore has now made and released over two dozen albums in his 25-year long career—either as a solo artist or with groundbreaking Irish folk groups like Planxty and Moving Hearts—his latest album King Puck had a number of unique features to mark it out for distinction.

First King Puck is Moore's debut as a producer. Second, it contains more Moorepenned songs—seven out of 10—than any of his previous albums; and third, it was his first release for the Columbia label in Ireland. The inclusion of the 13-minutelong Me And The Rose track was the fourth distinguishing feature and the one that has had the most importance for Sony Music Ireland in devising their marketing strate-

gy and selling the record.

The song has long been a concert favourite. It tells the fictitious story of Moore's encounter with the then Rose Of Tralee Festival Queen who was a policewoman in her day job. The song is a masterpiece of Moore's acerbic and witty social commentary. Since he first sang it eight years ago, it has grown from four minutes in length to the 13-minute epic recorded for *King Puck*. As he puts it himself, "I had to record it before it got any longer."

Its presence on the album was both a bonus and a potential drawback for promoting the album, according to Sony Ireland marketing manager Eleanor McCarthy. "We decided not to release a commercial single off the album, but we did release a promo CD of Me And The Rose. The strategy paid off. The reasoning behind it was the song was a major selling

point for the album, but if it had got a commercial single release, it may have affected the album sales."

The deal with Sony was only signed in October and the company was presented with the album as a finished product. Adds McCarthy, "We began a radio and outdoor advertising campaign to launch the album, but Christy was-touring and apart from one promotional visit to the Albert Hall in London, we didn't have him for promotion. By mid-November we began the next stage of our campaign which included a TV campaign and a Superlite campaign [bus stop displays]."

Although King Puck was one of the first Moore albums not to reach the number one album slot in the Irish charts, it has sold more than 50.000 units to date and was only held off the top slot by Bryan Adams' pre-Christmas compilation. "It out-sold

Christy's last studio album and was always neck and neck with Adams," says McCarthy. "It was also the biggest seller in our Christmas catalogue ahead of Billy Joel's *River Of Dreams* and the Michael Bolton album."

Moore's new deal with Sony Music Ireland will stretch to five albums including the re-release of his last album, Smoke And Strong Whiskey, originally out on his own Newberry label. Before that Sony will release Away Ye Broken Heart, the first single from King Puck and include two tracks from Smoke And Strong Whiskey.

Belgians Turn Up The Volume For The Radios

"Radio is a sound salvation, radio is saving the nation," sang Elvis Costello back in the '70s. Multiply one wireless times 50.000 and you get the Radios, the sonic liberators of the Belgian nation. Started off as the hobby project of TV personality Bart Peeters, it has become more serious with every album.

Many eyebrows were raised when he first introduced his pop outfit in 1990, featuring a hell of an axeman on guitar—Danny Lademacher, former sideman of Dutch rocker Herman Brood. The first album No Television had a one-off character, but with its 1992 follow-up The Sound Of Music everything fell into place, including the eyebrows. The ballad She Goes Nana is still one of the best "never-been-apan-European-hit" singles. A year after its release it became top 10 in Holland and

number 1 in Indonesia, best proof of their mega status in the far East. Meanwhile at home they confirmed their position with another platinum album, a live recording.

As an apetiser for the third studio album Baby Yes, the single Teardrops-indeed a tearjerker-has already claimed its legitimate top 10 position in the Belgian chart. EMI Belgium label manager Bart Cools says that for this band everything goes automatically, and that the fans have developed sort of a 'biorhythm.' "We have hardly done anything. In a silent period concerning releases like January, it's relatively easy to draw media attention. In no time the track got playlisted on radio and TVs are queuing After three albums, there's a certain fixed pattern that we follow. From January onwards the single starts creating demand for the album, and when the tension gets 'unbearable" we release the album by the end of March. A new spring means a new

Radios album, so to speak."

For EMI conquering the European market is the next step and by commisioning the mixing of the single to Hugh Padgham (of Sting-fame) the odds are good. By extending the band with two black female singers—Maureen Alberg and Loraine Kammeron—the soul factor is boosted. However, one of the band members Ronny Mosuse has restricted his contributions to the recording side only, because signed to Virgin, he has embarked on a solo career under the name of RonnyMo.





The (temporary) departure of style has done him good, better suiting his Eddie Cochran-styled vocals. Dancefloors in juke joints will crack under his omnipotent version of the '50s stomper Breaking Up The House, best known from Tiny Bradshaw's rendition, whose Train Kept A Rollin' is also present here. And absolutely irresistible is the way he and the horns blow new life into Robert Gordon's Sit Right Here. At such moments the Little Big Band becomes a monument for the blues.

KING'S X

CD-I Takes Over Technology Limelight

If there is a buzz word that will come to dominate technology in the '90s it is multimedia. Everyone is using it, but the exact definition remains a little unclear. One sys-

tem that is very definitely an entrant in the multi-media stakes is **Philips** CD-I, or Compact Disc Interactive. Philips has put together a massive media blitz for its new format, with national TV advertising right across Europe and in America and a huge press campaign running in a number of territories.

The idea is actually quite simple, a CD-I player looks much the same as a conventional CD player with the addition of a video output and is connected to both the hi-fi system and the TV set. As well as the audio signal carried by a

conventional CD, CD-I discs also carry pictures, and, in their simplest form, the user can decide in what order the pictures are played. Although this sounds very simple, by letting the user choose the sound and vision on a random basis, the system opens up a whole world of possibilities.

Although the system has been around for a couple of years now it's only really now—with the release of an add on called a digital video board—that the system is beginning to live up to its initial potential.

The early machines were put onto the market with only a modicum of software and what was available wasn't particularly interesting. The best selling pre digital video (DV) CD-I game was Palm Springs Golf, a superior golf simulator in its own right, but little real improvement over the same software running on a PC or games console. However, with the coming of digital video, Philips has managed to secure a licensing deal with Paramount whereby the company has started to release feature films on five-inch discs. The picture quality is quite remarkable and very close to that of a good VHS tape, and although the first few demonstration discs to be released were plagued by bugs, these should be fairly simple to sort out before the discs reach the shops.

With an asking price of around £15, the film discs are very competitive, with conventional VHS tapes with the added benefits of instant track access and no tape or head wear to worry about. The machines to play the new film CDs start as little as £399, with the digital video cartridge, a slot in board that fits in the back of the machine, adding an extra £150 to the asking price.

Interactive Audio

However, films on five-inch disc is just the start of the multi-media revolution. One of the more interesting projects to come out of CD-I so far is the interactive audio CD. The idea is that a multi-track mix can be sold on the CD-I and it is then up to the user to mix the album as they desire, adding video clips if they wish and even changing the mix every time they play the disc.

Philips has produced a demonstration tape CD-1 in association with **Rhythm King Records** to demonstrate this side of the system. Entitled *World Of Rhythm* it features five different bands. After you have selected which band you want you are presented with a further list of alterna-



tives, ranging from interview clips, music videos, audio tracks and slide shows.

This sort of disc has been causing a lot of interest in the music industry, but CD-I also has a lot of potential as a games machine, as evidenced by the latest set of

"adult" software which reached the shops just before Christmas. Although most of the headlines have been grabbed by the interactive version of the well known Joy of Sex instructional book, the "game" Voyeur is perhaps a better demonstration of the possibilities of the system. As the

'player" you are the owner of a flat opposite the abode of a US candidate presidential through your window, aided by a video camera with a zoom lens, you are privy to a series of wrong doings. The point of the game is to amass enough evidence to convict the corrupt candidate before he twigs what you are doing and incorporates you into the nearest section of freeway. According to your choices, different sections of video are played through your zoom lens, and although the game is ultimately a little limited, and after around a dozen plays you have seen most of

what is on offer, it is still a very interesting pointer to the future of interactive enter-

The good thing about the whole DV format is that it is based upon an agreed world standard, namely MPEG, which

Philips, Sony, Matsushita and others have all agreed will be the way that video pictures are stored on CD. Although there are a few problems at the moment, such as Philips CD-I movies not playing on video CD players from **Technics** and others, one can only hope that this will be sorted out in the near future so that films on five-inch disc will play on any video CD-equipped machine.

While CD-I is certainly a pointer to the future, we are really only at the very beginning of interactive media as a whole. Philips has been hinting that a modem board for the CD-I player will be made available which will enable a CD-I user to access telephone lines and cable service, opening up services such as pay per view video, remote access to various software programmes as they are required, and last but by no means least, the sort of home shopping services which are currently sweeping America. Wherever the future does turn out to lie-and Philips is but by no means alone in pursuing the multimedia path-CD-I certainly provides an interesting insight into the entertainment facilities likely to be on offer in the late '90s shows that perhaps the tide has started to turn against the likes of Nintendo and Sega when it comes to entertaining the general public.

MINIDISC, DCC RACE:

More Advanced Products; Still Few Sales

Approximately a year after their launch, it's still a case of playing the waiting game with MiniDisc and DCC, with the caveat that neither format has exactly set he world alight.

Both Philips and Sony have continued to sign up further licenses for their respective systems, although many such licensees have decided to keep a foot in both camps and obtained a license for both formats. This is particularly true of the blank media suppliers where many have signed up to produce both blank DCC tapes at the same time as announcing their own brand recordable MiniDiscs.

What does seem to have happened in the last 12 months is that the format battle has tended to see different results in different territories. At the Funkaustellung Audio Fair in Berlin this September both Sony and Philips were playing off a fairly level pitch, and it seems that the jury is still out as far as Europe is concerned. In Japan, at the JES in October, by contrast, it seemed as if Mini-Disc was edging slightly ahead. Japan's Akihabara (the leading electronics retail area) had DCC machines selling at a very heavy discount, retailers trying to off-load unwanted stock, and although MiniDisc sales were generally reported as being slower than expected, the smaller MiniDisc recorder was beginning to sell in reasonable quantities. In America, at the Las Vegas CES in January, the picture was that neither format was doing as well as expected. Neither DCC or MiniDisc was a headline story at the show which tended to be dominated by multi-media and home theatre.

So what has happened since Music & Media last looked at DCC and MiniDisc?

Well, both formats are certainly far smaller than they were this time last year. Both Philips and its main DCC partner, Technics/Panasonic, have launched portable machines. Although they are fairly expensive and the first units on the market, typified by the replay-only Philips DCC 130 are about the size of a personal CD player, they are a vast improvement on last year's models.

On the in-car front Philips has led with two new models, the DCC 821 and the DCC 811, both of which are high spec units incorporating RDS (the Pan-European Radio Data System), the 821 can even be operate as the control unit for a remotely situated CD changer. Philips has also pressed forward with a midi-sized deck, the DCC 300 which is included in a couple of fully features midi systems and there is even a new mini system incorporating DCC, the FW 91.

Philips has around 1.000 DCC titles on the market but early reaction is that those users who have adopted DCC have tended to do so for home recording use and that sales of pre-recorded DCC tapes have been slow.

Paul Dunn, Philips marketing manager for audio products admits that the price of DCC products is still too high, but thinks that the situation will improve as pieces of hardware drop during 1994 and also as more software outlets start to stock the pre-recorded tapes.

It's fair to say that Sony has managed to maintain a higher media presence for Mini-Disc than Philips has achieved for DCC and Sony's massive presence at the Berlin Funkaustellung was no exception. Sony brought out the big guns with Norio Ohga, the president and CEO of Sony Corporation on hand to answer questions. He wasn't slow to claim a massive success for Mini-Disc, quoting shipments of 300.000 players shipped so far alongside over 3.000.000 discs. Perhaps more importantly, he was also claiming that Sony would have shipped over 10 million units by 1995. His speech also saw mention of MD Data, a new data storage format based on the operating principles of MiniDisc. This development could be crucially important to the battle; if Sony manages to get MD data established in the computer industry then the economies of scale made possible by manufacturing MD heads and mechanisms in larger quantities could well bring down the price of MD music units to the point at which they would take off as a mass market device. With each MD data disc holding about the same amount of information as 100 3.5 inch floppy discs, it has enormous potential.

While 1993 was perhaps rather less of an event for the new digital media than the main protagonists had hoped, there was certainly a lot of interest from the general public, although the world recession prevented this being turned into the products sales that the main players had projected. In Japan, Sony looks to have edged ahead, while in Europe and America the jury is definitely

When, and if, the US and European markets begin to come out of recession and people go back to the shops, 1994 could well prove to be an interesting year for both products, although it will be at least Christmas 1995 before a real winner begins to emerge on the global markets.

Novus, GRP, Windham Hill: BMG's Extended Jazz Family

With the signing of exclusive international distribution deals with GRP Records in 1991 and Windham Hill Records in 1992, BMG suddenly became one of Europe's jazz powerhouses. Already a major player with their own RCA/Novus and Bluebird labels, as well as the French Vogue catalogue, they could now claim three major contemporary jazz labels in addition to the important Impulse and American Decca catalogues which GRP controls.

These pacts come at a significant moment for Europe's US\$100 million jazz market. Established jazz festivals were growing in popularity and new festivals were springing up all over the continent. Both Jazz FM in the UK and Euro Jazz in Holland began broadcasting during the period, and most of the major record companies were looking hard at their jazz divisions and either reorganising or consolidating their marketing, promotion and A&R activities with regard to jazz. Both demand and supply seemed to be working to the benefit of the music. BMG's expansion in the area, then, can be seen as part of an industry-wide initiative.

That these changes meant a major reorientation as well as, in some cases, a complicated coupling, is suggested by the fact that the process at BMG has yet to take its final form, though the coming months will see the new structures solidifying at last, as a

survey of the three major jazz labels under BMG's helm testifies.

Despite the celebrations, the undeniable achievements of the previous half decade, and an enviable roster of artists, 1993-Novus' fifth anniversary—was a relatively uneventful year for the label, with few releases and a definite sense of a lull in the label's growth. The spring release schedule is promising, with new material from several of the label's major artists, including Roy Hargrove and Antonio Hart's Tokyo Sessions; Mitchell Foreman's tribute to Bill Evans titled Now And Then; and Marion Meadows' Forbidden Fruit, due out in February. In the studio but with no definite release dates are John Pizzarelli, Mulgrew Miller, Vanessa Rubin and Danilo Perez. A new one from pianist Marcus Roberts is planned for June.

GRP. without question the most successful contemporary jazz label, was purchased in 1990 by MCA's Music Entertainment Group, and in the process acquired that company's strongly commercial jazz roster, which included such popular acts as Spyro Gyra, Yellowjackets, and Acoustic Alchemy, thus strengthening an already impressive list of artists, such as Gary Burton, Chick Corea, Lee Ritenour, Diane Schuur and the Rippingtons.

Starting April 1 MCA will open its own marketing and promotion operations in several European territories, including France, Germany, Holland, Italy, Spain and Scandinavia, though it is not yet clear exactly how GRP itself will be handled. Director of European Cartesian Starting April 1 MCA will open its own marketing and promotion of the promotion of the second s

pean operations Frank Hendricks, who joined GRP in the summer of 1992 coincident with their move from Zurich to London, has been promoted to vice-president of international; his place will be taken by Ann Therese O'Neill, formerly manager of marketing and promotion at PolyGram Jazz UK.

In Jazz, the promotional magazine coproduced by GRP and BMG, has proven to be an excellent point-of-sale marketing tool, and will continue to appear three times a year

in five languages. There is even discussion of producing a Southeast Asian edition. This, together with print advertising, artist tours and festival appearances, are the principle avenues for promoting the label's product, given the relatively scant radio support Europewide, despite such outlets as Jazz FM and Italy's Rai Verde.

Among upcoming and current releases are Dr. John's GRP debut Television, British guitarist Tony Remy's hip hop funk album Boof, and new material from Yellowjackets, Billy Taylor, Tom Scott, Gary Burton and Arturo Sandoval.

GM of Windham Hill Europe Frank van Houten's principal challenge is to coordinate his label's interaction with BMG affiliates in 36 countries including Latin America. "We are a marketing challenge," he contends, "with a wide variety of styles each one of which requires special, almost niche marketing approaches." Depending on the peculiari-

ties of a given market, Windham Hill product is handled by pop, jazz, or even classical label managers. "Even the typical Windham Hill fan differs from country to country," explains Van Houten. "In Spain they tend to be students, in Italy the intellectually hip, in other countries the Hi-fi and stereo crowd. These are impressions of course, but in general the European demo is similar to that of the US: 24 to 40 years old, college educated and urban."

Those are statistics the company hopes to broaden with its High Street label, their singer/songwriter adult alternative imprint which as a priority at the moment. With 180 albums in the catalogue and some two dozen releases per year on Windham Hill Jazz, High Street and the original label, the marketing problem is evident. "Even jazz is easier to promote," Van Houten notes, "because there are specific sta-

tions which programme jazz and that is increasing. As radio in Europe becomes more strictly formatted it becomes more difficult for non-mainstream music to get airplay."

Albums to watch for in the coming months: Argentinian guitarist Tocuato Mariano's Paradise Station, the Turtle Island String Quartet's versions of jazz compositions by the likes of McCoy Tyner, Miles Davis and Thelonious Monk, called Who Do We Think We Are, and Yes member Jon Anderson's South American solo outing







M'BLU ET MOI

Precious Spirit - Soulciety/EWM

A very successful hybrid of jazz and funk in the M-Base vein that is less selfconscious and inventive than much of the hip hop jazz on the market. With hints of both Weather Report and Frank Zappa, ju-ju and township music as well as swing, the sound is somehow sparer than any of these and strangely peaceful, as though they were jamming overtop dub versions of Sly Stone. The production admirably avoids stridency by an emphasis on the collective, so that solos seem to form part of the texture of the music. An audacious and auspicious debut of an unusual singer, a vocally, lyrically, and


JOSHUA REDMAN

Pat Metheny sticks to acoustic guitar throughout, and drummer Billy Higgins paints every moment colourfully. Make Sure You're Sure is a lovely ballad which sounds like the melancholy of a former age, and the guitar/tenor duet on Eric Clapton's Tears In Heaven is also striking. The other world of the title is Africa, or more precisely, African music, which is evoked as rich layers of percussion played by Alex Acuna, Luis Conte and Will Kennedy. But the connection is rarely explicit. Rather this is a fusion album which on occasion makes implicit

reference to jazz's African heritage, though on tunes like Griot and Showtime by the album's guiding composer/arranger Armand Sabal-Lecco, the rhythms and chants do finally come to the fore. John Beasley on keyboards and Steve Tavaglione on saxes otherwise lend the album its more evident pleasures, and the interplay of drums and percussion reaches a kind of climax on Jeff Beal's Shanachie. 

Poland Record Industry

With its largely homogeneous population of 40 million, Poland is seen as having the strongest music market in Eastern Europe. And with the introduction of recent tough copyright legislation, the outlook is the best it has ever been. But the crucial factor, as in the West, remains a scarcity in the Eastern market: money.

has been very hard for us to make money," admits Andrzej Puczynuski, president of the Polish producers association and head of local label Isabelin. "The new copyright law will be a real shot in the arm for our music business."

This copyright law and other steps towards an organised market situation has turned Poland into an appetizing playing field for majors

tizing playing field for majors Warner, EMI, Sony, BMG and soon-to-come PolyGram. The fight for a copyright law reached a large milestone last August at the major music festival of the year in Sopot, where the official launch of holograms for all cassettes put teeth into the threat of record producers to do something practical about the theft of artists and producers rights, even before the implementation of copyright legislation.

Then, on January 7, parliament passed the long-awaited copyright mandate, for president **Lech Walesa** to sign into law. Copyright violators will from now on be subject to fines and imprisonment.

Another occurrence in 1993 which brought a smile to the lips of Polish record execs was the political clout the record lobby finally received following the founding of **ZPAV** (the association of Polish audio-video producers) which cooperates with **IFPI**. Well-publicised raids shut down pirate operations. Some quit, some went legit.

Encouraging as these essential steps may have been, Jan Chojnac-

Polton (Warner's Records licensee) maintains that it will still take probably another three years to make the playing field com-pletely level and eradicate illegal cassettes. In addition, CDs are still very marginal in Poland: CD players are present in only about 6-7% of households, while around 50% have VCRs.

"This year we'll probably have our first CD manufacturer in Poland," says Chojnacki. Most CDs come

from Germany or the Czech Republic and cost around US\$15. The average monthly wage in Poland is about US\$200. Vinyl singles do not exist either.

"If you compare us to any Western market, it's still bearish here," he adds, "but cleaning up the pirates is going to help a lot. It's been a tough road, but we're optimistic now."

Poland's Indies

Poland's oldest private record company is **Polton**, begun in 1982. The more than 100 acts on the label encompass the internationally-renowned pianist **Adam Makowicz**, rock group **Illusion**—which beat out over 800 bands to win the 1993 **Marlboro** competition in Poland and was enthusiastically reviewed in **Music & Media**—and **Irek Dudek**, a top Polish blues star. The label manages to concentrate promotion on about 15 acts in any given year. Last year was especially good for Polton and the other three Polish companies whose Western ties

have them bubbling with confidence.

Zic-Zac Records, which has pulled itself up by its own bootstraps, may be the most tightly knit of the nine main local labels. It carries close to 20 acts, in contrast with Polton's 100+. Among them are De Mono, Poland's ubiquitous dance band, and Elektryczene Gitary, a Rolling Stones-type guitar group—two of the top five bands on everyone's list.

The most independent company of all is SP Records, the label of perennial Polish favourite

perennial Polish favourite
Kazik, lead singer of Kult, a
band with punk roots which
recently sought urban credibility
by adopting nihilistic rapper
rhythms.

Aside from calls to burn down parliament (in Burn Down) with roots easily traceable to Poland's anarchic last 200 years, Kazik has been busy building up a loyal record-buy-ing public for 10 years. His recently released collection of torch songs made popular by his father—a Polish legend musician in the Woody Guthrie mouldadd a hitherto unexpected middle-aged audience to Kazik's traditional punk followers. Despite, or perhaps because of his grimy lyrics, Kazik has his grimy cleaned up financially, showing that there is good money to be made on the Polish market from music with strong Polish roots.

Working Future Artists

Practical steps to ensure revenue may have strengthened the Polish companies' ability to turn a profit, but real future strength lies—as any record company executive will admit—with the availability of marketable artists.

Polish executives believe they have these in bucketsful.

Says Isabelin's Puczynski, "Competition is a matter of artists and now there is room for everybody."

best artist potential in the younger generation of anyone in Eastern Europe," claims Polton's Chojnacki, "not only copying Western music, but in developing a Polish style. And of course, we have 40 million people to buy records. Hungary and the Czechs may be more developed, but we've got four times as many bands to choose from."

Another key factor in producing this abundance of artists is that during the communist era, Poland had much more freedom than its

neighbours to play Western records on the radio. Poles were pioneers in the Eastern block in radio airplay of Western music. This was even true in comparison with Eastern Germany, where many western-influenced Polish bands were star performers.

And yet, while the Polish scene may offer potential, the majors have yet to sign any Polish act. Local labels are still the home of local talent. Lesser names and beginners tend to rise on the coat tails of each label's handful of mainstays, such as Izabelin's **Hey** (Seattlestyle grunge with a Polish flavour), which sold nearly 300.000 units last

Of all the bands with a chance to make it in Europe, Hey is at the forefront, it seems. Hey took the spotlight away from Poland's traditional powerhouse '80s band, **Republika**, whose last album *The Seventh Seal* (**Sound-Pol**) has been called one of the best Polish rock records ever. Selling some 300.000 copies in the '80s, the band now attracts the over

Marek Koscikiewicz, one of the three owners of Zic-Zac, is cautiously looking for future acts. "I think our best idea is to go with a new guy, a techno-disco act called **Nazar**. It's hard to believe that people abroad will want to listen to music with Polish lyrics, and Nazar sings in English. It's very difficult to imagine how to promote our bands in

The Art Of Marketing

Public relations and marketing were not part of the Polish vocabulary prior to 1989. Selling acts has had to be learned. Now promotion plans for local labels such as MJM Music (Sony)—who have leading acts Wilki, Mancu and Human on their books—are similar to campaigns used at other leading Polish labels.

For MJM, it is a mixed bag consisting of promotional concerts for press and media, pre-recorded interviews with artists, poster campaigns, live radio and TV interviews, video clips and sample CDs. MJM markets

no more than three acts at one time.

Adding a twist, Pomaton (EMI) concentrates on promotion in shops. They have "first day of sale" promos with artists visiting their network of shops throughout Poland, and use competitions and press campaigns to complement personal appearance. Among their artists is Robert Janowski, one of the leading solo vocalists in the country and star of Poland's first "Broadway-style" musical, Metro.

Marketing in Poland is somewhat easier for Zic-Zac, which was founded to manage the group De Mono. The group gave over 70 concerts last year and appear regularly on TV, even providing the entertainment for the annual New Faces modelling competition in November. The company throws promo parties for new releases, plasters the country with posters for concerts and albums as well as saturating TV with videos

Pepsico and Reebok have been sponsors. Zic-Zac Overall, the situation looks pretty good for company; record sales improved from 20,000 the first year to 200.000 last year, with De Mono selling 170.000 units.

Andrezej Pucynski of Izabelin agrees that good promotion has been an important part of rock group Hey's success.
"We have run many stories on them in the

rock press covering magazines like Tylko Rock ("Only Rock"), Metal Hammer, Broom, Bravo, and Guitar. We also issued special tapes to 30 radio stations we cooperate with concentrating on Wawa and KOLOR in Warsaw and Radio RMF in Krakow [Poland's three most influential

rock stations]. We issued video clips and posters, too."

Hey made a big impression at the Bourge festival in France last year and will be the focus of Izabelin's first big push outside Poland. The company is also trying to promote **Klosterkeller**, a band which sings in

Polish and English, in Germany.
"To be honest," says Izabellin's Puczynski, "The **Music & Media** compilation CD is one of the most important promotions outside Poland for Polish musicians that has ever happened [see pages 18-19 of this

Pomaton exec Tomasz Kopec, concurs on the difficulty of foreign promotion. "No one in Poland has successfully done it yet. Repertoire are too typically Polish. Our situation is similar to that of France. There is a variety of people who can sell thousands of records in Poland, but nothing abroad. We hope this situation will change now that we are the exclusive representatives of EMI in Poland."

Radio's Many Uses

As far as home promo goes, all execs would agree about the importance of radio, though some would argue TV is more important, depending on the type of artist.

"Radio is top of the list for promotion," says Puczynski. "Now with the new private stations [franchises will soon be awarded], the situation is completely different. The new law will improve things. Private stations are already flourishing. Radio gives us our first contact with the audience. This gives us a good idea of the popularity of our

"We are in constant contact with about 30 radio stations," says Zic-Zac's Koscikiewicz. "We send them tapes and they give us regular feedback on the popularity of our musicians.

Although other execs disagree, MJM executive Margaret Maliszewska maintains that not having singles does not affect promotion as radio works adequately with tapes and CDs. MJM was the first Polish company to release a maxi CD sin-

Not having singles is a problem for Zic-Zac, who do not have the international contacts available to the big four companies; Polton, Pomaton, MJM and Izabelin. "To make one-song CDs is simply too expensive. So we make compilation CDs of our various artists and we also put some

music on DAT," says Koscikiewicz.

Several record companies are now in the learning stage, planning campaigns and learning from their mistakes. Republika's latest tour, sponsored locally by **Coca-Cola** and **Sound-Pol**, was half-heartedly managed, with venues chosen too large for the group, and marketing wasn't focused on the target group. "People in their 30s don't go to concerts if the venues are not good. And they were not raised in their youth to go to concerts as people are in the West," says Jan Chojnakci of Polton. "Kids might venture to a stadium to see R.E.M. or Eric Clapton, but they are accustomed to going to gigs, to being uncomfortable. Those over 30 want a comfort-

able venue, and that doesn't exist. That was Republika's problem." Chojnacki also believes that Republika's album went over the head of teenagers.





Invaders Or Friends

For all Polish record labels, the lucrative future is as tantalisingly close as it is slightly discomforting—will Polish artists lose

Izabellin's Puczynski puts it succinctly. "Poles are afraid of Western companies, especially the artists. My conversation with PolyGram stressed that if we work together we must handle both sides of the business, import and export. To justify our existence to Polish artists we have to try to export our homegrown talent." Polish musical artists share the concerns of their compatriots in the movie business that Western products more freely introduced by big companies will crowd them out of their own market.

Perhaps rebellious artist Kazik comes close to the bottom line as far as artists and producers here are concerned. What's in it for them? Money gives him a feeling of independence, Kazik says.

There is plenty of room for optimism, especially for those Polish com-

panies with Western partners. As one of those lucky execs put it, "In the next three to four years we expect beautiful economic results.



Nearly two years after the release of their Greatest Hits album (Warner Brothers) ZZ Top supply us with the first of the new batch, firmly putting the Z's back in Bluezz and the Hot 100 Zingles. Pincushion, their new single and RCA label debut, makes this week's highest entry in the singles chart at number 30. It is their fifth single to enter the singles chart, after Doubleback, My Head's In Mississippi, Rough Boy and Viva Las Vegas. The latter is the one to beat since it went as high as number 11 and charted for 12 consecutive weeks, their longest and highest yet.

Meanwhile, the new Antenna debuts in the Top 100 Albums at number 21 making it their fourth to do so after Afterburner, Recycler and Greatest Hits, which went to number 5, 4 and number 3, charting as long as 37, 21 and 24 weeks respectively.

Returning to the singles chart we find Ace Of Base's The Sign (Mega/ Metronome) gaining another two places in the top 5, climbing to number 2 and maintaining their bullet. Charting in ten countries, the act only slightly loses ground in Denmark and Norway.

However, everybody's favourite musketeers, Bryan Adams, Rod Stewart and Sting, are not to be outdone as they continue to climb the national charts. All For Love (A&M) holds onto the Hot 100 top-spot, not chart-ground relinquishing any gained thus far, still having room to remain upwardly mobile as it has only reached number 1 in Denmark, Ireland, Norway and Sweden as yet.

Irish act Therapy?, meanwhile, see their fourth singles entry in the Hot 100 chart with Nowhere (A&M) entering at number 42. Their most successful entry to date has been their Shortsharpshock E.P. which made two entries last year, charting not only in Ireland and the UK but in Portugal and Sweden as well, peaking at number 40 in the Hot 100

Richard Marx makes his return to the European charts with Now And Forever entering at number 48. The song, which is to be featured on the soundtrack of the upcoming re-make of classic movie The Getaway, is Marx's ninth Eurochart entry since Satisfied (EMI USA) in '89 and his first since Chains Around My Heart (Capitol) which entered in '92. His most successful entries to date have been Right Here Waiting and Hazard which charted for 29 and 18 weeks peaking at numbers 7 and 11 respec-

The Top 100 Albums sees the return of Chaka Demus & Pliers' Tease Me (Mango) which re-enters the chart due to a re-entry at number I in the UK albums chart after initially peaking at number 26 in the UK and at number 85 in the Eurochart. Outselling the UK's current number 2 by 2:1, they are only the fourth reggae artists ever to hold the UK albums top spot. The act's current single Twist And Shout is on the rise again at number 8 (from 10) after already having peaked at number 7. Their most noteworthy single sofar was the albums' title track which charted for 22 weeks and peaked at number 14.





from British bands both at home and abroad.

One indication that the country's A&R departments and record companies may be on the right path is the number of attractive new British acts nominated for this year's **Brit Awards**.

The Brits voting academy was expanded this year to give a voice to retailers and the media for the first time, a move which was almost guaranteed to put the spotlight on new talent. Even considering this factor, the list of acts nominated for the first time is nonetheless impressive. Prominent among them are Apache Indian and Jamiroquai, who are nominated in four categories, and Dina Carroll and the Stereo MC's, who each appear in three. Among those nominated for best British group are M-People, Suede and Take That.

"I don't think record companies ever lost the plot," says Brits chairman Rob Dickins. "All these things are cyclical. And when people give '89 to '92 as an example of the British dropping market share in the world, that's less than the time between Kate Bush albums."

Dickins believes that it is an indication of the inherent A&R and marketing health of the British industry that foreigners such as American Tori Amos and Icelander Björk are using this country as the platform for their international success. The systems are efficient and effective, he states, and it will be the cycle of fortunes that dictates whether native British talent can put them to as good use as Björk and Amos are doing.

The areas those British bands should be pursuing may be defined by what Dickins believes is a system of musical influence that sways back and forth across the Atlantic. "The Beatles were influenced by Chuck Berry, Nirvana were influenced by punk. They give us something and we

build on it and give it back to them and vice-versa."

He contends that it is now the UK's turn to give something both to the US and the rest of the world. "This year and '95 will see the next wave of British talent coming through. The Brits this year just shows how things are coming through, what with Suede and Dina Carroll and the rest.

"I'm very optimistic, and it only takes one or two albums to break internationally for people to really start getting excited about what we can do."

A man who does not share Dickins' optimism, however, is Jeff Smith, chief producer at Europe's biggest music radio station, BBC Radio 1FM. He says, "Unfortunately, I'm depressed that a lot of bands that we as a radio station get behind don't have the impact that we expect them to have. I'm thinking of bands like Suede, who've come through in this country but need to make it in the States."

Smith criticises the record companies—and majors in particular—for what he describes as the "herd mentality." "Everybody seems to go for the same thing at the same time; I would love people to show a little more originality. On top of that, a lot of new bands are packaged in the same way as bands from the past. Once you've had one Simply Red, you get another band later presented in exactly the same way."

Smith contends that all the excitement in British music is being created by the smaller and the independent labels. "I find the output of the major labels depressing. Their new bands tend to be a bit tedious and predictable. Independent stuff is original and exciting and new. I think the majors' A&R people have lost their way a little bit."

Speaking as chairman of Warner Music UK, Dickins counters, "An independent label is always going to be more specialised than a major, but there isn't the them-and-us thing that

some people like to portray.

"I don't think it matters where the talent comes from. There's a lot of creativity in new and establishing talent in record companies of every size."

Julian Close, senior A&R manager at EMI UK, shares Dickins' view that the UK record industry as a whole never lost sight of what it was trying to achieve. Close says, "In the mainstream of the US you have rock typified by bands like Pearl Jam and Nirvana, who have stolen the march on us when it comes to alternative music. It's proved hard for British bands to break through in the face of American competition. A band like Radiohead is one of the few that have bucked the trend

"However, on the dance side, we have done very well. We've broken through with Eternal, which is the first R&B, UK, allgirl group to make a big impact in the charts, and they're paving the way for other British groups.

"It's unfortunate that we've let the Americans have the initiative on alternative rock, but it's so much harder to break rock bands here than there because they have the radio formats that mean rock bands get exposure. Here we have various specialist shows, but it's not like their huge network of college radio."

Close also shares Dickins' view that success goes in cycles and that the UK is on the verge of an upturn. Close says, "There's a new emergence of British groups in the world market." He feels that the possibility of a British talent explosion in rock or dance or another area cannot be discounted. "No one in 1974 would have predicted punk rock—dance music is the punk rock of the '90s."

He argues that a significant similarity between dance and punk is what he calls the "do-it-yourself attitude." Punk was the catalyst for the founding of the whole UK independent record sector which brought with it the realisation that at least some hits could be made

Mills: Indies Not Always Creative Centres

Martin Mills, MD of Beggars Banquet and a doyen of the UK's independent sector, believes it is not entirely accurate to suggest that the indies are more creative than the majors.

"It's very difficult to generalise about these things and it often depends on what musical genre you're talking about," he says. "The problem the majors have is that the market pressure is on them to compete for acts, and then rush their development for the sake of short-term success. That has to militate against great music. The indies

don't face such pressure."

Nonetheless, Mills says he enjoys much of the majors' product, and adds, "There's a lot of great music around."

In terms of the success of UK music overseas, Mills feels that there is a delayed-reaction because other markets tend to lag behind British tastes. "There is great music coming out of this country, but the fact that it's not selling overseas is not a great cause for concern. We've always been years ahead of other markets because we produce things that are radical. Our message gets across eventually."

without massive resources behind them. Dance music has learned from that experience and, because of the availability of computerbased technology in the 90s, people can become record producers without ever having to leave the comfort of their bedroom."

Close welcomes the new generation of dance-based labels that have been spawned in the '90s." The indies are a vital part of our market because they can launch a band for a much smaller budget, which means they can do more dangerous things."

Close is also aware that it is not just the indies who are looking to take the UK majors' market share, but that the developing repertoire base of the continental European nations means that the UK companies now face serious competition.

He believes the success in the UK of acts such as Ace of Base and Culture Beat is to be applauded, but adds, "The classic pop song is something that we have overlooked in this country. If an A&R scout had brought into the office All She Wants a few years ago and I wanted to sign it, I would have been resisted.

"Now I think we've realised that true songs never go out of fashion."

Competition to British music from the Continent is an important factor, agrees Mike Allen, international marketing director at Poly-Gram International. He says, "In many of the Continental countries people are no longer prepared to say 'If it's from the UK or the US it must be good.' They now have their own pop culture that's looking at the world and genuinely represents serious competition. We are no longer the only provider of worldwide repertoire in Europe.

"Historically, the British have been very good at being creative. They're very good at recognising that music is a central part of culture. But something that does disturb me is that I don't think the UK chart culture is a good advertisement for the industry or British

music.

"I know that people are increasingly regarding the UK chart as less meaningful, which is a function of the speed with which records fly in and out. It's now recognised as being very marketing-driven."

"Nonetheless, when you look at the Brits nominations and you see all those new acts listed together, you are clearly looking at a very impressive list of artists. You would hope that in the medium term, most of them will break through on a worldwide basis."

What **Rob Stringer**, MD of **Epic UK**, wants to see more than anything, is "the breakthrough worldwide of a great British fourpiece, because that's got a lineage going back to the Beatles."

In the meantime, he believes the strength of the British A&R system is in its diversity. "This is the country that produced both The Who and Culture Club. I don't think we should try to wrestle rock back from the Americans; we should concentrate on being esoteric and quirky, because what comes out of that is a healthy mixture.

"I don't even think we should be concentrating on dance, because the Continental Europeans have more successful acts on a worldwide basis with the likes of Snap and Haddaway."

Stringer, too, believes that the fortunes of the industry are cyclical, but doubts that an upswing is at hand. "The Brits are encouraging, but there are two or three things to fix. For a start, we need the chart sorting out so that the world sees that it has legitimacy. The albums chart is seen as worthwhile, but at present the singles chart is not."

A significant percentage of the record-buying world will see whether the Brits themselves have legitimacy when the ceremony is broadcast worldwide during the third week of February. At that point, to coin another of Margaret Thatcher's favourite phrases, the market will decide.

VNU To Buy BPI Communications

INTERNATIONAL

VNU, a leading Dutch publishing and information company, has agreed to purchase BPI Communications, the parent company of Music & Media and Billboard.

VNU will pay US\$220 million to acquire 100% of the equity in BPI. Currently, BPI is owned in partnership by Boston Ventures, The New York Times Co., and BPI management. The Times acquired its interest in BPI through its October '93 merger with Affiliated Publications Inc.

Gerald S. Hobbs, CEO of BPI, says, "This transaction will provide BPI with the ownership commitment of a worldwide publishing and information player. This will strengthen BPI's ability to face the challenges of today's rapidly changing marketplace."

Arthur F. Kingsbury, BPI's

president, adds, "VNU's expressed intention to grow further in publishing in the US represents a great opportunity for BPI to be a part of an exciting and expanding enterprise." No changes in the BPI management team are foreseen as a result of the sale.

The move is seen as a positive one for the Billboard Music Group, which consists of Music & Media, Billboard, Amusement Business and Airplay Monitor. The change places BPI in a stable position to focus on long-term growth. Plans are currently underway to launch an on-line service and for further expansion in the international marketplace.

VNU is involved in consumer magazines, regional newspapers, commercial TV, trade and professional magazines, educational books and business information services. The company employs about 10.000 people in Holland, Belgium, the UK, Italy, France, Spain, Eastern Europe and the US. VNU is a public company with shares listed on the Amsterdam Stock Exchange; it generates about US\$1.2 billion annually in revenue.

MTV RIVAL NOT JUST HYPE?: European music industry executives are rapidly coming to the conclusion that there is truth in the rumours that Sony and Time Warner are establishing some kind of rival to MTV. It is not, though, the fact that un-rock 'n' roll things like digital superhighways make establishing a new channel a lot less of a problem than it was a decade ago. No, it's the fact that their respective head offices are saying absolutely nothing that convinces them something is going on.

EGOS COULD LIE BEHIND FINANCIAL PROBLEMS: Who said, "Ego is a terrible menace for the record industry"? Answer: Alain Lévy, CEO of PolyGram in an interview with the magazine Le Nouvel Economiste. Levy added that decisions and signings can be ruined by ego, which is often irrational and "can benefit the acts you are about to sign." Lévy believes the cost of talent is inflating beyond reason. He takes the example of the UK, where "new acts request £1 million in recording advances and £300.000 for publishing.

CARRERE MUSIC MD REPLACED: M&M hears that Carrère Music MD Yvan Taieb has been let go after three years at the reins since the company's acquisition by Warner three years ago. He is said to be replaced by WEA Music's international director Michael Wynen.

pella, charted in the UK with their first release in the late 80's Bauhaus/Push The Beat which entered the Top 50. Subsequent releases also charted, Heylom Halis and Take Me Away both reached the Top 20, while Everybody and U Got 2 Know broke into the Top 10

Cappella started life as a studio project with Media's teams of DJs and producers ganging together, striving for the perfect commercial dance formula. Bortolotti says that since the first release Cappella have become progressively more commercial, and sustained success made it necessary to complete the project with a regular public face.

"We chose a singer, Kelly, and a rapper, Rodney, to create a stable public image for TV and live appearances," he says. "We spent a lot of time finding the right performers as we didn't want just pretty faces but also top professional

British-born Kelly has previously sung with techno/reggae outfit SL2 and was discovered by Bortolotti singing in a London nightclub. Kelly says she didn't mind being bought in on an established act. "It was really nice being chosen for Cappella. It meant cutting out all the hard work at the begin-

Kelly and American-born Rodney have stepped into a high pressure schedule however, as sales of U Got To Let The Music are approaching 250.000 copies in the UK; the company has also been promoting the single throughout Europe. Sales in Germany (through ZYX) are near the 400.000 mark, where the single is currently at number 3. In the Eurochart Hot 100 Singles the track stands at number 6

Cappella's lead singer Kelly says that London A&R director Pete Tong has been vital to their recent UK success. "London gave us lots of backing and Pete's show on BBC Radio 1FM, plus getting playlisted by Capital and Radio One was essential."

Kelly adds that production work on their first album was divided between London and Media's studios in the Northern Italian city of Brescia, The album, called U Got 2 Know, is scheduled for simultaneous European release on March 7, while the follow-up single Move On Baby will be released throughout Europe on February 7.

"We have received so much interest from club DJs," says Bortolotti, "that Move On Baby will be released with a limited edition mix for DJs only with four different versions each on different coloured 12" pressing: the blue, red, yellow and black mixes." The album,

tion Classic FM.

The awards ended a fierce battle by private commercial stations in Holland for access to scarce terrestrial frequencies, but they also left several stations bitter and threatening additional legal skirmishes. Terrestrial access is expected to easily double the market share of Radio Noordzee Nationaal, Holland FM and Radio 10 Gold.

While the decisions were handed down jointly by the two ministries, it was clearly Minister of Culture Hedy D'Ancona who set the guidelines for the awards. D'Ancona is known as a fierce proponent of the public broadcasting system in Holland. The choice to hand out the most coveted of the licences-the two FM bundles of regional frequencies-to a station which supports national Dutch product and a foreign classical/jazz broadcaster, was judged by some critics as a clear move to make sure that no real competition was presented to Radio 3.

Prior to December 1991, Holland's media law forbade private commercial broadcasting on Dutch soil, and terrestrial frequencies were completely monopolised by the pubcasters. The public stations still control all national terrestrial FM frequencies, a sore point with private stations which has caused stormy debate over the last several years in Dutch parliament. Commercial stations had contended that Dutch law and EC regulations entitled them to access to the airwaves. The handout, especially of FM regional frequency bundles, was considered a concession on the part of D'Ancona to these demands.

Broadcasting Radio by

which will include all of Cappella's hit singles, has been licenced to PolyGram in Italy.

Apart from the current Europewide success, Cappella are also charting in Australia, Japan and Southeast Asia, and according to Bortolotti, a breakthrough in the US is imminent.

The song's appeal is not restricted only to clubs. In M&M's Border Breakers chart U Got To Let The Music is at number 10.

Dario Usuelli, PD at EHR Radio Deejay Network/Milan, says that U Got To Let The Music is the type of easy pop/dance that goes down well on radio. "It is a fast danceable pop song without pretention and has a good strong dance rhythm for the clubs," he says. The song is on Radio Deejay's medium rotation list and reached the top spot on their influential chart show "Deejay Parade' for four weeks.

Sasha Marvin, PD at dance web Italia Network/Udine, says Cappella's went down well with their listeners. "It is a very commercial song, and although we format mainly underground dance music, in the afternoons we programme more commercial music and this song is the most requested on the station at the moment.'

Noordzee Nationaal and Classic FM is expected to begin on or before April 1. AM licencees are expected to start up before October 1. although Radio 10 Gold intends to start this week. The FM frequencies were awarded for a three-year period; the AMs for five years.

The new frequency bundle gives cable station Radio Noordzee Nationaal access to 90% of the Dutch population, or some 13 million people. Classic FM's frequency packet covers some 10 million people. In its application, Classic FM promised to broadcast a mix of 60% classical and 40% jazz music.

Classic FM was unavailable for comment at presstime, but Simon Cole, chief executive of leading UK-based syndication company Unique Broadcasting, calls the award significant. "At last a British radio company is doing something on the Continent rather than the other way around," he says.

Despite the Classic FM licence, the awards were a clear vote in support of Dutch national music. 'Radio Noordzee Nationaal is now the only private commercial pop station in Holland which has access to terrestrial FM frequencies," says station director Martin Banga. The station plays the gamut of Dutch pop music from hard rock to easy listening to cabaret.

Banga is predicting a return to Dutch music roots. "From research we have seen, we know that 70% of the Dutch people are interested in hearing Dutch music," he says. "But the music industry in this country is no longer Dutch. It consists of multi-nationals whose only interest is in selling more of Michael Jackson or Madonna."

While Radio 10 Gold had competed heavily for one of the FM frequency bundles, company spokesperson Mark Out says the station was elated with the award of the old Radio 3 frequency. "The FM frequencies only cover part of Holland," he says. "Our AM frequency covers all of Holland and will also reach abroad. We can still be reached by cable at home, and most mobile radios are not stereo anyway. We have the frequency for

five years now, and we're very happy with it." The station will be required to cease broadcasting on temporary terrestrial FM frequencies as of April 1 to make room for the new licence holders.

Perhaps the biggest loser in the licence handout was Rupert Murdoch-backed ACE Sky Radio, which will also have to give up its temporary licence on April 1, a scenario once described by station director Ton Lathouwers as "disastrous." Lathouwers, whose station started up operations in the same year as Radio 10, has vowed to appeal the decision to the highest courts in Holland and the European Parliament.

Lathouwers has charged the awards criteria were arbitrary and ambiguous, and not founded in law. "The decision was both surprising and astonishing," he says. "It proves once again that the Dutch government is acting to protect the public system. The Dutch government doesn't like private commercial radio and Sky Radio is still the biggest threat for public stations Radio 2 and Radio 3." Lathouwers says advertiser and media centre reactions in support of his station have been positive.

The frequency awards were not based on monetary offers. Stations were first and foremost asked to establish that their intended format would add to, rather than duplicate, what already was present in the market. They were also required to prove that they would add to Dutch music culture.

Lathouwers was not alone, however, in expressing dismay over the awards. Lex Harding, head of EHR cabler Radio 538. which in recent months has surged ahead to take a 4% share of the market in just one year of operation, also called the decision making process "a farce."

Harding is also said to be considering legal action against the government. A spokesperson for D'Ancona says the minister's decision was carefully researched legally and she was confident it would hold up against any appeal.

EHR net Skyrock remains stable at 4.9% nationally and 6.3% in Paris, while EHR web M40 confirms it is now part of the 2%-plus club with 2.2% nationally and 2.4% in Paris. IP sales house notes that Fun "is the number one station in France in the 15-24 demographic" and that "for the first time M40 has more than one million listeners.

NRJ notes that its daily audience has increased by 360.000 in a year, 270.000 for NRJ and 90.000 for Gold Chérie FM. The independents group of stations, which are repped by Régie No. 1, have scored a 20% audience increase nationally compared to last September-October wave. Since the creation of the group, their audience rose in September-October '92 from 2.5% to 3.7%.

One fifth of listeners in Paris tune in to Paris-only stations such as NRJ's Rires et Chansons (humour and Gold), FIP (allmusic), Oui FM (rock), Radio Nova (world music, variety) and Montmartre (French Radio Gold).

Amos Active

This week's chart is full of action, with Chaka Demus & Pliers jumping from number 9 to 3 with their revival of Twist And Shout, Enigma earning a well-deserved top 5 position and Richard Marx landing in the top 10 with his new song Now And Forever—also featured in the forthcoming film-remake of "The Getaway" (starring Kim Basinger and Alec Baldwin). All this while, at the very top, Bryan Adams, Rod Stewart & Sting are still expanding their roster with 18 stations.

The most active record of the week, however, is *Cornflake Girl*. It is striking to see European Hit Radio's unanimous response to this idiosyncratic song, the taster for **Tori Amos**' second album *Under The Pink*. The highly talented American, UK-signed singer/songwriter and piano player has not only registered the biggest chart-point gain—earning her this week's **Radio Active** award—she also performs the highest chart leap, as she shoots up 21 places from number 36 to 15, thus marking her top 20 debut. Amos had one EHR hit before, 1992's *Crucify*, which peaked at number 29.

With 19 adds in her pocket (second best of the week), Amos enjoys a 38% spreading angle for her new song, while six upward conversions (e.g. from medium to heavy rotation) produce a 12% conversion ratio, proving that *Cornflake Girl* is a highly "upward mobile" playlist entry. The UK and Holland are showing the widest spread of rotation dedication (67 to 71% penetration), while Italy, Norway, Sweden and Belgium are joining in on a promising but as yet more limited scale.

Two more new appearances in the top 20 are realised this week. British teen act **D:ream** jump from number 34 to 16 in their second charting week, passing up rocking Texans **ZZ Top**, who get hold of number 20. D:ream are attracting major adds in Germany, Italy, Norway, Sweden and Spain. ZZ Top are especially growing in Norway, Poland, Sweden and the UK.

This week's highest new chart entry, at number 24, is scored by new US singer Toni Braxton, whose Breathe Again is her first single to chart on the EHR Top 40. Her self-titled debut album has already sold two million in the US. This side of the Atlantic, Braxton is getting best airplay support on the British airwaves (86% penetration), Denmark, Germany and Spain standing next in line.

Meat Loaf's new single, Rock And Roll Dreams Come Through is enjoying this week's largest number of additions. No less than 24 EHR stations throughout Europe have put the song on rotation for the first time, creating a formidable 69% spreading angle. Germany, Spain and Denmark are leading the pack with penetration levels ranging from 33 to 50%—a very good start.

This week's highest new entry in **Border Breakers**, kicking off at number 15, is claimed by Dutch singer **C.B. Milton's** *It's A Loving Thing*, an accessible pop techno song in a **Haddaway** mould, and the follow-up to earlier hits like *Send*

Me An Angel and No One Else.

It's A Loving Thing is the first single from the Dutch newcomer picking up substantial European airplay. Apart from rotation on a number of Dutch and Flemish Belgian stations, the song has been added to EHR, ACE and Dance stations in Germany, Denmark and Sweden (no less than seven foreign adds this week).

In Germany, platinum EHR programme WDR 1: Schlagerrallye/Cologne and gold-ranked ACE-formatted Radio PSR/Leipzig are embracing the track. On the Scandinavian side, early advocates in the gold category include Danish EHR outlet Radio Viborg/Viborg and Swedish EHR Radio City/Stockholm.

Signed to Belgian independant dance label Byte, the Amsterdam-based artist is licensed to BMG Ariola Munich which has released his record under the Big Bubbles imprint. The Munich-based company is clearly familiar with the genre, as they also handle Coconut, Haddaway's label. For Spain, the act is licensed to Blanco y Negro, and for France to Scorpio. In the Scandinavian territories Milton is dealt by Scandinavian Records (Denmark), CNR Records (Sweden), CNR Nonstop (Norway) and Fazer Music (Finland).

The Regional Crossover charts track the cross-regional movement of product. The Border Breakers chart ranks the 25 most successful Continental European records making airplay impact outside their region of signing lairplay achieved in the original region is excluded from the original region is excluded.

The second chart, Channel Crossovers, registers the airplay penetration of UK-signed artists in mainland Europe, while the third Top 25, the Atlantic Crossover chart, ranks the most successful North

American artists according to regional airploy impact in Europe.

All three charts are non-format specific. "Region Of Origin" is not necessarily an indication of where the artist comes from but, more significantly, where he/she is signed. An increasing number of national artists are signed to "foreign" labels and M&M wants to acknowledge the crossover impact of such deals.

For each record, "Crossover Regions" are listed in order of firsttime airplay appearance.
