Cable television activities

The following are activities in community-antenna television reported to BROADCASTING through July 7. Reports include applications for permission to install and operate CATV's, grants of CATV franchises and sales of existing installations.

Franchise grants are shown in *italics*.

■ Lake Clarke Shores, Fla.—Teleprompter Corp. (multiple-CATV owner) of New York has applied for a franchise.

■ Sanford, Fla.—Two firms have applied for franchises. Seminole Cablevision of Sanford would make an initial payment to the city of \$45,000. The firm would pay Sanford a total of \$152,000 over a ten-year period. Resident subscribers would be charged \$4.95 per month. Times-Mirror Communication Co. (multiple-CATV owner) Costa Mesa, Calif., offered a non-refundable pre-payment of \$105,000 and a total payment to the city of \$132,000, or 10% of the gross revenues.
